NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO TOBACCO ROAD TO FACE WAKE FOREST

Florida State, which has won six straight and 13 of its last 14 games, travels to play Wake Forest at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem on Wednesday, January 8, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. The game marks the Seminoles' second consecutive road game after they defeated No. 7/8 Louisville at the KFC Yum! Center on Saturday (78-65). Florida State's victory over the Cardinals marked their third consecutive double digit ACC win of the season with a +19-point win over Clemson (72-53, December 8), a +12-point victory over Georgia Tech (70-58, December 31) and their +13-point win at Louisville (78-65). Florida State's 3-1 start in the ACC is its best since beginning the 2016-17 season with a 4-0 record in ACC play – the Seminoles finished that season with a 12-6 conference record and in second place in the final ACC standings. The Seminoles are 3-1 or better (4-0 in 2017) in ACC play for the sixth time in school history (1993, 1999, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2017 and 2020) and have improved to 4-1 or better (5-0) in 1993, 2011, 2012 and 2017. Following Wednesday's game against Wake Forest, the Seminoles return home on January 15 to play host to nationally ranked Virginia at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 42-10 overall (.808 winning percentage) and 16-6 in ACC play (.727 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. With its' 3-1 record in the 2018 NCAA Tournament the Seminoles, are 45-11 since defeating Missouri on March 16, 2018.

FLORIDA STATE ENTERS WEDNESDAY'S GAME WITH A 13-2 OVERALL RECORD

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Wake Forest with a 13-2 record and a .867 winning percentage. The Seminoles have won six consecutive and 13 of their last 14 games since a 63-51 win over No. 6 Florida November 10, 2019 in Gainesville.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN THE ACC

Florida State is 15-2 in regular season ACC games (.882 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson (77-68) on January 22, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles won 12 of their final 13 regular season ACC games of the 2018-19 season and have won three of their first four ACC games of the 2019-20 season. During that stretch of games, Florida State is 9-0 at home and 6-2 on the road in ACC play with victories at Miami (January 27, 2019), at Syracuse (February 5, 2019), at Georgia Tech (February 16, 2019), at Clemson (February 19, 2019), at Wake Forest (March 9, 2019) and at Louisville (January 4, 2020).

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN THE ACC – NOTE II

Florida State has a 15-2 record in its last 17 ACC games since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019 – the best record in the ACC since that date. Duke is second with a 14-3 record in their last 17 ACC games since a 79-64 win over Pittsburgh on January 22, 2019.

HAMILTON NEEDS JUST ONE WIN TO MOVE INTO SIXTH PLACE FOR VICTORIES IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton needs just one victory to move into a tie for sixth place in ACC history with for overall career wins. Hamilton enters Wednesday's game at Wake Forest with 347 wins as Florida State's head coach; he is only one win from tying former Maryland head coach Lefty Driesell (348 career wins) as one of the top six winningest coaches in the history of the greatest basketball conference in the history of the game.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its seventh consecutive game. It would mark the second consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least four consecutive games – they won eight consecutive games (January 22 through February 19, 2019) and won seven consecutive games (November 28, 2018 through January 1, 2019) – in finishing with a 29-8 record during the 2018-19 season;

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its fourth consecutive ACC contest. It would mark the second time in the last two seasons the Seminoles have won at least four consecutive ACC games. Florida State won a school record eight consecutive ACC games during the 2018-19 season (January 22 through February 19) in finishing with a school-record 13 conference wins and a 13-5 record in ACC play;

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its third consecutive game against the Demon Deacons.

HAMILTON MOVES CLOSER TO SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 347 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game at Wake Forest as the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He needs just one win to move into a tie for sixth place in ACC history (tying Maryland's Lefty Driesell) and only three wins to become the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

HAMILTON ONLY TWO WINS FROM TOP FIVE ACC RANKING

With 158 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton needs only three ACC wins to become the fifth all-time winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019 and at Louisville on January 4, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 158 ACC wins during his career, and needs only three conference wins to move sole possession of fifth place in ACC history with 161 all-time ACC wins.

FLORIDA STATE WITH THREE VICTORIES OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State has won three games against ranked teams – all in games away from Tallahassee. The Seminoles have won two true road games against top-10 ranked teams – at No. 6/6 Florida and at No. 7/8 Louisville. They defeated No. 16/17 Tennessee on a neutral site in the third round of the Emerald Coast Classic at the Arena at Northwest Florida State College. Florida State's Leonard Hamilton has now led the Seminoles to victories over 24 teams ranked in the nation's top 10 with 13 of those wins coming away from Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES FROM LONG RANGE

Led by a season-high tying five 3-point field goals made by junior M.J. Walker, Florida State shot a season-best .478 from the 3-point line in its 78-65 win at Louisville on Saturday. It marked the fourth time this season the Seminoles have shot above 40 percent from the 3-point line and the fourth time this season they had made double figures in 3-point shots (11 against the Cardinals).

FLORIDA STATE'S DOUBLE FIGURE 3-POINT SHOTS

Florida State made 11 3-point field goals in its victory at Louisville on Saturday – the fourth time this season (15 in its victory over Clemson, 11 in its win over Louisville and 10 each in its victories over Chattanooga and Chicago State) the Seminoles have made double digits in 3-point field goals in a single game.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN FREE THROW PERCENTAGE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest as the ACC leader in team free throw shooting percentage with a .760 mark. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC shooting 76 percent or better from the free throw line. Including a school-record 17-of-17 performance from the free throw line in its 88-71 win over North Alabama on December 28, the Seminoles shot a combined .784 percent from the free throw line in its last six games.

FLORIDA STATE VS. WAKE FOREST – THE LAST GAME

No. 14 Florida State staged a second-half surge -- 18 straight points -- and took a 65-57 victory over Wake Forest at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum in Winston-Salem, N.C. on March 9, 2019. Florida State won for the 12th time in 13 games, to finish fourth in conference. The Seminoles never led until grabbing the lead at 47-45 on Trent Forrest's basket with 7:28 left. Phil Cofer followed with an easy basket, then M.J. Walker supplied the knockout with a 3-pointer. The Deacons frequently switched defenses, making it hard for the Seminoles to get the ball inside to 7-foot-4 Christ Koumadje and 6-10 Mfiondu Kabengele. Forrest led a balanced FSU attack -- 11 players scored -- with 11 points. Koumadje had 8 points and 10 rebounds. After a cold-shooting first half by both teams, FSU shot 54 percent in the second half. Brandon Childress, who scored three baskets to spark the Deacons to their early 12-point lead, finished with 13 points and Chaundee Brown added 11 -- all in the first half. The Deacons, who shot just 26 percent, went scoreless for nearly six minutes as the Seminoles erased a 45-40 deficit with their 18-0 run.

RayQuan Evans – “My full name is RayQuan Ethan Evans. My dad took the name of one of the singers, Raekwon, from the 1990's band Wu Tang Clan, and put his own spin on the spelling for my first name. Ethan, from the Bible, came from my mom. The name Ethan means strong, firm and long-lived.”

RaiQuan Gray – “My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.”

Anthony Polite – “My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather.”

Trent Forrest – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

Florida State freshman Patrick Williams 'Scratching The Surface' Of His Potential

Florida State's Patrick Williams isn't a typical freshman.

The 6-foot-8, 225-pound forward from Charlotte, N.C. comes to Tallahassee with enormous expectations.

Williams was ranked as a five-star prospect out of West Charlotte High by the 247Sports composite rankings in the 2019 class, and he's already been projected as a first round pick in a 2020 mock draft by ESPN.

"He has all the tools to be a very, very special player at Florida State," FSU associate head coach Stan Jones told the *Democrat*.

"He's just scratching the surface of what he's going to become. I think he's the youngest freshman we've ever had come in. He's from a great family and he's got he's got great character. I'll be shocked if he doesn't just continue to grow and grow and do some spectacular things during the course of the season."

There's usually an adjustment period for highly-ranked prospects as they transition from high school to the college level.

Being able to take plays off on the defensive end, getting the ball every time down the court, and being the vocal point for the team is something many talented high school players get used to.

When they get to the college level, those things go away for most players and it can be a tough adjustment.

But FSU's coaches and players all agree that's not the case with Williams. He's got a team-first mentality and doesn't expect anything to be given to him.

"He is very similar in humility as Jonathan Isaac was, in the fact that he doesn't think he's good enough yet, which is a great characteristic," Jones said.

"When you have that healthy fear of where you are and what you want to become, I think that escalates your growth and development. He's never come in with any premonitions of where he should be playing or how much he should be playing. He just wants to become a better player like Jonathan was.

"He lets you coach him. He responds to coaching. He accepts instructions at an extremely at a high level and can give it back to you."

Isaac wasn't the only comparison that Jones made for Williams. He also said that he's a lot like former FSU forward Chris Singleton, who was also a first-round pick by the Washington Wizards.

He compared him to Singleton because of his ability on the defensive end of the court, though he also said Williams is further along offensively than Singleton was when he arrived at FSU.

"I've put him in a category with a couple pretty good Florida State players in Chris Singleton and Jonathan Isaac and he meets all the criteria that both those guys have done while they were here," Jones said.

FSU fans got their first introduction to Williams during the Seminoles' 95-66 exhibition win over Barry University.

It took him a little time to find his rhythm, but after he threw down his first dunk of the game, he settled in nicely.

Williams finished the game with 12 points, nine rebounds, and a block in just under 18 minutes of play. All five of his baskets came on dunks and he knocked down both of his free throw attempts.

"We expect a lot from him," redshirt sophomore forward RaiQuan Gray said.

"He's a great athlete. He has a high basketball IQ. He fits right into our system. He can run, jump, and shoot. We treat him like one of the vets so he's earned a lot of respect."

His athleticism was on full display as he flew through the air on his dunks as well as his effort rebounding and blocking shots.

Williams effort on the defensive end was something else that stood out about his game, but it didn't surprise his teammates.

If a player doesn't give the same effort on the defensive end of the court as he does on the offensive end, then that player isn't going to see the court much under FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton.

Williams has worked hard to be a good defender for the Seminoles and his efforts haven't gone unnoticed.

"He does good and with his athleticism, he can you guard one through five if he had to and one through four easily," senior point guard Trent Forrest said.

"He can block shots one through five and clean up the glass like probably one of the best on the team. I'll say he's probably one of our best shot blockers that we have, even with our seven footers. So just his athleticism and his ability to kind of get around the court with quick burst like he does is going to help us a lot."

Williams does have things that he needs to work on, including being more self-assertive when he has the ball. That's something he's been working on during fall practice and he's already made progress in that regard.

FSU knows that Williams is going to make some freshman mistakes this season. That comes with the territory no matter how talented a player is.

But there's a lot of confidence that when Williams does make a mistake, he won't make it twice.

"We've always kind of prided ourselves on having those kind of guys that can cover a lot of ground quickly and can cover a lot of space up high that other people can't get to and he certainly fits the mold in all those categories," Jones said.

"He'll just grow in confidence offensively once he starts figuring his spots out a little bit more and realizing where he is okay making mistakes and where he's going to learn from his mistakes and not make that one again."

The Unconquered Spirit of Trent Forrest

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Imagine racing around on a hardwood basketball court, dribbling the ball at top speed and trying to beat players to the basket while experiencing excruciating pain in your big toe. Now think about doing that in 31 more games, over 900 minutes of playing time against elite talent in America's top basketball conference---the Atlantic Coast Conference---with that big toe throbbing all the time.

Got the picture? Then you are looking at FSU's Trent Forrest who coach Leonard Hamilton says: "represents what the Unconquered Spirit means." Playing with a bum toe last year Forrest averaged 9.3 points, had 138 assists and 69 steals in 37 games.

It is no wonder that a healthy Forrest's return as a senior leader precipitates high expectations that 2019-20 will be a stellar season for Florida State basketball.

Asked about his leadership role Coach Hamilton explains that it is a no-brainer: "Trent has always had the same role he had as a freshman. He came here as a leader and he displayed stronger, better and wiser leadership every year that he has been here. So, we are expecting more of the same."

In the 6th game of his junior season, playing Villanova, an on-court collision caused his big toe to bend way up, far beyond normal. It hurt a lot and at first seemed to be bad case of "turf toe" that was eventually determined to be torn cartilage. Every step hurt. Disdaining mid-season surgery that would have ended his season Forrest elected to play through the pain.

How could he manage that?

He says: "Kinda just wanting to play so bad for my teammates. I guess it's just a high pain tolerance is all I can say." Amazing! And the good news is, after off-season surgery, Trent is back, pain free and as he says; "ready to rock."

You gotta love the game to go through all that. It's obvious Trent loves basketball. As a baby, when his parents put different small balls in his crib he reached for the basketball.

Later, as a youngster he slept with his basketball every night.

Even though Forest grew up in the small town of Chipley, population 3,526, his talents did not go unnoticed despite playing in the state's smallest high school classification. When you score over 3,000 points the scouts will find you. He received offers from Georgia, Ga. Tech, Alabama, Wake Forest, Miami, Tennessee, Providence and Wichita State.

He elected to go to Florida State, just 86 miles from home via I-10, because he says: "I felt like I could relate a lot with the things Coach Ham was doing. It was just the relationship I had with the coaches. I was able to trust them, and they were able to trust me about things in their program and even things outside of the program."

Forrest says his biggest adjustment to college basketball was "the speed of the game and understanding the college game. It's more in-depth and teams are going to have scouting reports on you."

Four years later the Seminoles are looking to Forrest to lead a team that has made it to the NCAA Playoffs three years in a row. In 2018-19 Seminole Basketball had a sparkling, best-ever 29-8 record. This coming off two other stellar 26-win seasons that been topped only once (27 wins in 1971-72).

"Just that past experience, especially last year will definitely help me be a better leader this year," Forrest said.

Forward RaiQuan Gray, who played in 36 games as a freshman agrees: "Last year Trent was one of our leaders and we looked up to him. I feel like this year he will have an even bigger role. I think he will be a vocal leader who brings everybody together."

The late President Ronald Reagan once said: "There is no limit to the amount of good you can do, if you don't care who gets the credit." Except for the fact it was before his time the President accurately described Trent Forrest.

Coach Hamilton says: "Even though he scored close to 3,000 points in high school, he is such an unselfish player that he plays to win not to get statistics."

Even though he might not light up the scoreboard in his points column he does even better. Corey Clark explained on Warchant.com: "Forrest is one of those rare players who can dominate an opponent without taking shots. That's the beauty of his game. He puts his imprint on games in every way imaginable."

The basketball court is not the only place where Forrest makes an impact. Ashton Henderson, FSU's Assistant Athletic Director for Student-Athlete Development, says: "Trent hit the ground running when he matriculated to Florida State University. He has been doing everything with my office for community service. He constantly shows up for everything we have going on. He is there. I send him the text and he brings all the guys with him."

Henderson has been impressed with the way Trent relates with everyone and becomes just one of the group; "He's a guy who has all that attached to his name and seeing how humble he remains, his meekness and then he still remains so competitive on the court. He will speak to the janitor. He will speak to anybody who needs their day to be brightened. I have always respected that about him. Trent Forrest is somebody you want to model your program after."

Gene Deckerhoff, the Radio Voice of the Seminoles, for over 40 years calls Forrest "a tremendous basketball player" but is equally impressed with his off-court presence. "He's always got a smile when you see him. Not a moody kind of guy. His teammates love him. He's the real deal."

Forrest's upbringing accounts for many of his admirable personality traits. He grew up in a Christian home. His mother, Barbara Lee, is the pastor of *All Things New Worship Center* and Forrest played drums in the church. Both his mom and dad, Lester Forrest, played basketball for Chipola Junior College.

In the mornings when his mom got up at 5:30 a.m., Trent got up and started working on basketball drills. Then after school he worked out as well. That committed work ethic continues. This summer after having the foot operation, before he could walk around again, he would lift weights and practicing dribbling while sitting down. He was determined to be in shape when fall basketball practice rolled around.

The things he learned in the backyard, the playgrounds and high school gyms came with Forrest to college. Raquan Gray says: "Trent is a great driver. He is able to move around and find an opening and when he drives he sees everybody. You have to be ready."

In early 2018 the Seminoles were in possession on a 27-game home-winning streak against non-conference foes. That was in jeopardy in an ACC-Big 10 matchup with 19th ranked Purdue leading 72-71 when Forest caught a pass in the lane from Terance Mann, drove in and floated a shot into the basket with 5.2 seconds left to put FSU up 73-72. Not content to admire the shot, Forrest raced back down the court and stole a pass to seal the win and make it 28 in a row for FSU.

Those are the kinds of plays Seminole fans have come to expect from Trent Forrest. When the game gets tough Forrest rises to the occasion.

He said that he draws some strength from his coach when panic is about to set in: "In pressure situations you look over and Coach Ham has the same face he had at the beginning of the game. He is not showing any panic or

anything,” Forrest said. “You get a timeout, in the crucial time and he is always calm and collected. You see that, and you know there is no need to panic.”

Forrest is happy to be able to play basketball close to his home town where family and friends can come to the games. One favor he can do for his friends is to help keep the streak alive against their arch-rivals, the Gators. The Seminoles have won five in a row against them.

In 2018, a year that Forrest scored in double-figures 15 times, Forrest scored 13 points and had five assists in FSU’s 81-60 win over Florida. “I definitely want to be able to say I never lost to the Gators. Winning that game gives me lots of ammunition to take back home.”

Looking back on his college career Forrest feels like he has maximized the benefits and was able to give back. He is thankful that his scholarship made that possible. Forrest says: “The scholarship means a lot. You can’t thank the Boosters enough because they are investing in the student athletes here. It’s beneficial to people like me to be able to come here and chase their dreams.”

Trent Forrest’s scholarship was a sound investment by the Boosters for as Ashton Henderson said: “I am sure that Trent is going to be very successful and will make FSU proud.”

After all he embodies the true Seminole Unconquered spirit.
