NO. 8 FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT NO. 7 DUKE IN MATCH-UP OF TOP 10 TEAMS

No. 8 Florida State, which is ranked in the nation's top-10 for the school-record fifth consecutive week, travels to play at Duke on Monday, February 10, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. at Cameron Indoor Stadium in Durham, N.C. The Seminoles arrive in Durham fresh off their 99-81 win over Miami on Saturday in Tallahassee. Florida State has won three straight, three of its last four, 13 of its last 14 and 20 of its last 22 games and enters Monday's game against Duke with a 20-3 overall record and a 10-2 mark in ACC play. The Seminoles are 22-3 in their last 25 regular season ACC games. Florida State is 20-3 for the second time in school history – the Seminoles' 1969-70 team (which was led in scoring by the great Dave Cowens) also began their season with a 20-3 record. The Seminoles are 10-2 in ACC play for the second time in school history – the second time in school history they have won 10 of their first 12 ACC games. Florida State (which was led in scoring by Michael Snaer) finished 12-4 in ACC play and won its first ever ACC Tournament Championship in 2012. Following Monday's game at Duke, the Seminoles play host to Syracuse on Saturday, February 15 at Noon at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee – a building in which they have won 61 of their last 64 games.

MONDAY'S GAME IS A MATCH-UP OF TWO OF THE TOP FIVE WINNINGEST COACHES IN ACC HISTORY

Two of the top-five winningest coaches in ACC history go head to head in Monday's game – the Seminoles' Leonard Hamilton (tied for fifth for all-time wins as an ACC coach and fifth in history for ACC wins) and the Blue Devils' Mike Krzyzewski (first in all-time wins as an ACC coach and first in the ACC for conference wins).

FLORIDA STATE'S TOP-10 MATCH-UPS

Florida State travels to play at No. 7/7 Duke in the 12th game in program history when both teams are ranked in the nation's top-10 at the time of the game. The No. 9 Seminoles defeated No. 7 Duke, 88-72, on January 10, 2017 in their most recent game played between two teams ranked in the top-10 at the time.

HAMILTON WITH 72 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game at No. 7/7 Duke looking for his 73rd career win over a nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and 53 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Duke and win its 21st game of the season. It would mark the school record fourth consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least 21 games. Florida State averages 24.5 wins per season in the last four years;

...Defeat Duke and raise its record to 11-2 in ACC play. It would be the first time (since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season) that Florida State would have won 11 of its first 13 conference games and the seventh time in school history it would have won at least 11 ACC regular season games in a season. The Seminoles' school record for ACC wins in a season is 13 – during the 2018-19 season;

HAMILTON TIED AS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 354 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game at Duke on Monday tied for fifth among the all-time winningest coaches in ACC history. He is tied with Georgia Tech's legend Bobby Cremins. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY

With 165 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020, at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, against Virginia on January 15, 2020, at Miami on January 18, 2020, against Notre Dame on January 25, 2020, at Virginia Tech on February 1, 2020, against North Carolina on February 3, 2020 and against Miami on February 8, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 165 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE WITH NINE VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State enters its game against No. 7/7 Duke with three victories over nationally ranked teams this season and six wins over nationally ranked opponents during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 53 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

With its overtime victory over Miami on January 18, 2019 in Coral Gables, the Seminoles have now won nine consecutive overtime games. During that stretch of nine consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated eight ACC opponents, one of the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last nine overtime opponents by a 124-76 margin including its 14-10 margin over Miami on January 18, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE VS. DUKE -- THE LAST GAME

Zion Williamson had 21 points in Duke's 73-63 victory over No. 12 Florida State in the ACC Championship game on March 16, 2019 at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, N.C. Mfiondu Kabengele scored 14 points for the Seminoles. The Blue Devils won their 21st tournament title. Williamson became only the sixth freshman in the event's 66-year history to win MVP honors, and the first in a dozen years after averaging 27 points and 10 rebounds, and making 33 of 43 shots in the three games. Florida State shot just 32 percent, including 8 for 32 after halftime (25 percent). It was the Seminoles' third appearance in the ACC Tournament Championship game in school history. Florida State won its first ACC Championship in school history in 2012.

.545 Redshirt sophomore Wyatt Wilkes is shooting .545 from the 3-point line (12 of 22) in the last five games. He made his career-high of five 3-point field goals in scoring his career-high of 19 points in Florida State's victory over Norte Dame on January 25.

.841 As a team, Florida State is shooting .841 from the free throw line (74 of 88) in its last six games. The Seminoles have made 31 of 34 free throws (.912) in their last two wins over North Carolina and Miami.

1.7 Graduate student Dominik Olejniczak has blocked five shots and is averaging 1.7 blocked shots per game in the last five games. He blocked two shots in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech on February 1 and two more in its win over Miami on Saturday in Tallahassee.

2 Two Seminoles – Trent Forrest and Devin Vassell – have started all 23 games for Florida State this season.

3 Redshirt sophomore Malik Osborne has made three consecutive 3-point field goal attempts. He made one in the Seminoles' victory over North Carolina on February 3 and was a perfect two of two in the Seminoles' win over Miami on Saturday in Tallahassee.

8 Redshirt sophomore Anthony Polite pulled down his career-high of eight rebounds in Florida State's victory over Miami. He totaled a career-high seven defensive rebounds in the Seminoles 10th ACC win of the season.

10 Sophomore Devin Vassell has made 10 consecutive free throws entering Monday's game at Duke. His consecutive free throws made streak began in the overtime period in Florida State's 83-79 extra time win over Miami in Coral Gables on January 18.

SEMINOLES MAKE 13 3-POINT FIELD GOALS AND SHOOT 50 PERCENT FROM THE 3-POINT LINE AGAINST MIAMI

Led by Wyatt Wilkes, who made three 3-point shots in Florida State's victory over Miami, the Seminoles made 13 3-point field goals in scoring their ACC season-high of 99 points against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles made a season-high 15 3-point shots in their 72-53 win over Clemson December 8, 2019 in Tallahassee. Florida State Men's Basketball What's In a Seminoles' Name

RayQuan Evans – “My full name is RayQuan Ethan Evans. My dad took the name of one of the singers, Raekwon, from the 1990's band Wu Tang Clan, and put his own spin on the spelling for my first name. Ethan, from the Bible, came from my mom. The name Ethan means strong, firm and long-lived.”

RaiQuan Gray – “My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.”

Anthony Polite – “My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather.”

Trent Forrest – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

Balsa Koprivica – “My name comes from the ancient Serbian King Balšić and his family. The Balšićs were a noble family that ruled from 1362 to 1421, during and after the fall of the Serbian Empire. Balsa also means strong and well built.”

Malik Osborne – “My full name is Malik James Osborne. Malik comes from a close friend of my father and James from my father.”

M.J Walker – “My full name is James Michael Walker, Jr. I am named after my father who is James Michael Walker, Sr.”

Devin Vassell – “My full name is Devin Anthony Vassell. I got my first name from my grandmother. My parents were going to name me Anthony, but my grandmother preferred Devin, so that's what my family went with.”

Once Again, FSU Basketball's Trent Forrest Finds A Way To Win

Rarely will Trent Forrest overwhelm you with his offensive output.

He has his moments to be sure. The second half against Gonzaga in the Sweet 16 last year. Those possessions late in games — and there have been several in his career — where he gets in the paint and hits a clutch shot. The flying-down-the-court dunks.

Those have been a part of Forrest's game at FSU since he arrived at FSU.

But games like Wednesday night against Virginia ... that's what makes Trent Forrest so special. That's why he will likely end his career as the all-time winningest player in Florida State history (sorry, Terance Mann).

Forrest hit one basket from the floor the entire night. And that came in the first minute.

He finished with five points against the reigning national champions. And five turnovers.

And yet he managed to have a huge impact on the Seminoles' 54-50 win over the Cavaliers.

Forrest recorded seven rebounds, seven assists, four steals and two blocks.

"He's a stat-stuffer," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "That's Trent's M.O. since he was a freshman. He's such an unselfish guy. He never loses his poise. He's confident. He knows he's capable of scoring. He scored 3,000 points in high school.

"But he makes winning plays."

Like Mann before him, Forrest is one of the main reasons why this FSU program has become so special.

They aren't the flashiest of offensive players — like Dwayne Bacon or Jonathan Isaac or even Devin Vassell. They don't typically take over games with an array of shots from all over the court.

They just do the little things, ALL of the little things to win games.

Take for instance Wednesday night.

Forrest was having a woeful night offensively. He missed his final five shots from the floor. He missed a number of driving layups, which are shots that he normally hits. He also got stripped multiple times driving to the paint. Big deal.

With the game on the line, Trent Forrest did what Trent Forrest does. He made winning plays.

With the Seminoles trailing 47-44 with 2:37 remaining, Virginia got the ball down low to Braxton Key. He pump-faked. Both FSU defenders went up. It looked for all the world like he going to be free for another layup to give the Cavaliers a late five-point lead.

Instead, Forrest blocked him from behind. Ten seconds later, Anthony Polite was burying a 3-pointer from the corner to tie the game.

"That was huge," Polite said of the Forrest block. "We look for defense. That's what we preach every day. And he was able to make it happen."

Forrest wasn't done, though.

On the Cavaliers' next possession, with the game tied, his pressure defense forced a 10-second call on Virginia. Florida State got the ball back. Forrest attacked the rim again, was fouled and calmly made both free throws.

The fact that he missed the front end of a one-and-one a few moments later — it rimmed out and Forrest, who has made numerous clutch free throws in his career at FSU, seemed genuinely stunned — didn't matter at all. Vassell hit a dagger 3 from the corner on the next possession.

"Trent's our leader offensively and defensively," Vassell said. "I mean, you could tell he started to get frustrated a little bit, but he didn't let that affect him on the defensive end. He kept getting stops. He had some big stops for us, getting that 10-second count and just getting some steals."

It's been said and written a lot: Great teams find a way to win even when they don't play well.

The same applies for players: The great ones find a way to impact a game, find a way to leave an imprint, even when they don't shoot well.

Trent Forrest won't go down in the record books as an all-time great scorer for FSU. He's definitely not an all-time great 3-point shooter.

But he's an all-time great Seminole. And he's a terrific college basketball player.

He proved that again on Wednesday night in helping No. 9 FSU improve to 15-2 overall and 5-1 in the ACC. Even though he made only one basket.

"Nothing that he does surprises me," Hamilton said with a smile. "We kind of go how he goes."

And in case you haven't noticed, FSU has been going pretty well here lately.

Seminole Windfall: Billings Skyview Grad RayQuan Evans Fitting In At Florida State

BILLINGS — When RayQuan Evans committed to play basketball at Florida State last April, he wasn't naïve to the fact he was embarking on a significant period of transition.

Evans was transferring from North Idaho College, where he led the Cardinals to a combined two-year record of 56-10 and a pair of Northwest Athletic Conference titles. Evans was dominant in his sophomore year as a junior college player, averaging 18.2 points, 7.4 rebounds and 4.9 assists.

But this was something altogether different.

Moving up to play for the Seminoles in an elite Division I power league like the Atlantic Coast Conference was no small leap. Remember: Just two years earlier, the 6-foot-4, 210-pound Evans was a star guard at Skyview High School in Billings.

"I think the adjustment the first couple weeks I was here was really hard, just because the pace is a lot different from junior college and you're playing against more athletic and more skilled players," Evans told 406mtsports.com during a phone conversation this week.

"Honestly, coming into the year I thought I would be able to just play like normal. But I kind of had to get myself out of that and mature in terms of realizing that everything we do is for a reason. Before, it wasn't like that.

"I had to focus on every play and every detail that we go through."

A hamstring injury, as reported by the Tallahassee (Fla.) Democrat, forced the junior guard to miss five weeks of preseason practice as well as the Seminoles' first two games of the season.

Still, Evans' long-term potential is what endeared him to FSU coach Leonard Hamilton, and he soon began working his way into the lineup, playing 13 minutes against Chattanooga on Nov. 20, 17 more against Saint Francis three days later and a season-high 21 minutes against Chicago State two days after that.

Most recently, Evans played 12 minutes and scored four points in an 83-79 win over ACC rival Miami last week. Entering Saturday's contest against Notre Dame, Evans is averaging 10 minutes per game. His 22 assists are tied for fourth-most on a team that rotates as many as 11 players.

"I just try to come in and contribute as much as possible," Evans said, "whether that's finding my teammates, running the offense, running the floor, keeping good energy ... just being one of the glue guys and just helping maintain when we have a lead and just helping the flow of our game and being a good teammate."

"RayQuan's improvement in his first year in our system has been exciting to watch. His maturity and basketball IQ have allowed him to become a very important part of our rotation," Hamilton said via FSU's sports information office. "He has just begun to scratch the surface of his potential and that's very good for our program."

In terms of the big picture, Florida State (16-2, 6-1 ACC) is ranked No. 5 in the latest AP Top 25 poll, having won nine in a row, including an impressive 78-65 triumph at Louisville on Jan. 4.

A highlight of the season for Evans came against Saint Francis, a game in which Florida State kept with tradition by honoring Native American heritage by wearing commemorative regalia.

The turquoise Nike “N7” uniforms, according to FSU, are worn periodically to raise awareness toward the goal of increasing sports opportunities for Native American and Indigenous youth.

“The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program,” Hamilton said in a recent press release, “and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms.”

The Seminoles have worn the uniforms 14 times dating back to 2013, including in a game against South Florida in December.

Evans played well in those games, scoring 10 combined points in 29 total minutes.

For Evans — the son of Israel Evans and LaVern Old Elk, and himself a member of the Crow tribe — the tributes struck a chord.

“I loved every bit of it. I thought it was really cool,” said Evans, who is majoring in social sciences at FSU. “For this program to take that seriously and have uniforms dedicated to it, I thought it was a big deal.”

Evans originally committed to play at Rocky Mountain College during his senior year at Skyview but instead matriculated to North Idaho, where he earned a two-year degree in graphic design and was named the 2019 Player of the Year in the Northwest Athletic Conference.

He planned to attend Utah State, but later de-committed to keep his options open. When the opportunity to play at Florida State arose — “I got a call from coach Ham and they were all about me,” Evans said — it was too much for him to pass up.

“I’m new to this team and new to this level. Every day is a learning day,” said the well-built Evans said. “I don’t really play as much as I’m used to but it doesn’t really frustrate me because I understand the position I’m in. I’m thankful to be here. I just try to learn every game, every practice.”

The Seminoles were an Elite Eight team two years ago and made the Sweet Sixteen last season. Led by the trio of Trent Forrest, Devin Vassell and M.J. Walker, they are on a similar track again this year.

But there are some big games coming up. FSU travels to play Virginia on Tuesday, a rematch up the Seminoles’ 54-50 win earlier in the year. There is also a looming matchup with Duke on Feb. 10 in Durham, North Carolina.

Meanwhile, improvement is at the forefront of Evans’ mind — for himself and the team.

“My expectation is that we keep getting better and not get complacent,” Evans said. “The guys we have on the team are very determined. We understand the position that we’re in but this is the time to step it up more — be more engaged in practice and more engaged mentally.”

“I think as long as I keep working every day and be a student of the game, I think my potential can keep growing,” he said. “I don’t think I’m at my best right now.”
