NO. 8 SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO NO 11 LOUISVILLE IN LATE SEASON POWER GAME FOR BOTH TEAMS

No. 8 Florida State, which has tied its school-record for ACC wins in a season with 13, plays host to No. 11 Louisville on Monday, February 24, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. It marks the second game between the two teams this season after Florida State took a 78-65 win over the Cardinals at the KFC Yum! Center on January 4. Florida State enters Monday's game having won three straight (since February 15), six of their last seven (since February 1), 16 of their last 18 (since December 8) and 23 of their last 26 games (since November 20). The Seminoles have lost only two games since defeating Clemson at home on December 8 (72-53). Following Monday's game against Louisville, the Seminoles will travel to play their second game of the season against Clemson on Saturday, February 29 at 2:00 p.m.

LOOKING AT FLORIDA STATE'S CURRENT STREAKS...

...Florida State has won 21 consecutive overall games at home at the Donald L. Tucker Center;

...Florida State has won 15 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center;

...Florida State has won three consecutive overall games with wins at home against Syracuse (80-77, February 15) and Pittsburgh (82-67, February 18) and one the road at NC State (67-61, February 22).

...Florida State has earned the coveted double-bye in the ACC Tournament for the second consecutive season. Only Florida State and Duke (so far) have earned the double-bye in the ACC Tournament in both of the last two seasons.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 63-3 (.955 winning percentage) in its last 66 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Louisville having won .955 percent of their games (63-3) and .919 percent of their ACC games (34-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 14-0 at home this season (including 8-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE IS THE ACC'S ONLY UNDEFEATED TEAM AT HOME THIS SEASON

Florida State enters Monday's game as the only undefeated team at home in the ACC this season with a 14-0 record.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 21 CONSECUTIVE HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Monday's game against Louisville having won 21 consecutive games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019; their most recent victory in Tallahassee came as an 82-67 win over Pittsburgh on February 18, 2020. Florida State has won 16 consecutive ACC games and each of its six non-conference home games to begin the 2019-20 season.

FLORIDA STATE'S 13 ACC WINS

Florida State enters Monday's game against Louisville with a 13-3 record in ACC play. It marks the second consecutive season the Seminoles have won 13 ACC regular season games and earned a double bye in the ACC Tournament. The Seminoles' 13 regular season ACC wins ties the school record for regular season conference wins in school history. The Seminoles won at least 10 games three times while a member of the Metro Conference (1977-91) and have now won at least 10 games 10 times as a member of the ACC. Leonard Hamilton has guided Florida State to double figure ACC wins seven times in the last 12 seasons (including this year).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Louisville and win its school-record 14th ACC game of the season. The Seminoles won 13 ACC games last season (2018-19) and have a 26-8 overall record (.765 winning percentage) in the last two seasons;

...Defeat Louisville and win their 24th game of the season. It would mark the first time in school history the Seminoles would have won at least 24 games in consecutive seasons. The Seminoles were 29-8 last season;

...Defeat Louisville and gain a two-game regular season sweep of the Cardinals for the first time in ACC play. The Seminoles defeated the Cardinals twice in the same year during the 1977-78 season when both teams were members of the Metro Conference.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST COACHES IN ACC

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game against Louisville as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY

With 167 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including the Seminoles' 13 ACC victories this season, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 167 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA

Florida State has won 26 consecutive games that have been played in the state of Florida – each game since a 77-68 win at home over Clemson on January 22, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 50 WINS IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 52-12 overall (.813 winning percentage) and 26-8 in ACC play (.765 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. It marks the second time in school history the Seminoles have won a combined 52 games in back to back seasons with both times coming in the last three seasons: 23-12 (in 2017-18) and 29-8 (in 2018-19) for a total of 52 wins and 29-8 (in 2018-19) and 23-4 (in 2019-20) for a total of 52 wins.

FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES

Including its 80-77 win over Syracuse on February 18, 2020 in Tallahassee, Florida State is 39-8 (.830 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS

Florida State has an overall record of 101-33 and a winning percentage of .754 since the start of the 2016-17 season. The Seminoles average 25.3 wins per season and have won 26-23-29-23 games in the last four seasons. Florida State is 47-23 in ACC play and averages 11.8 wins per season in that same time span.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

Including its 80-75 overtime victory over Louisville on February 9, 2019 in Tallahassee, Florida State has won nine consecutive overtime games. During that stretch of nine consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one from the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last nine overtime opponents by a 124-76 margin.

SEMINOLES IN OVERTIME IN ACC PLAY

Florida State has won 10 consecutive overtime games against teams from the ACC. In addition to its streak of nine consecutive overtime wins, Florida State defeated Maryland, 73-70, on January 17, 2009 to begin its streak of 10 consecutive wins in overtime against teams from the ACC.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 23 WINS THIS SEASON

Florida State has won its 23 games this season by an average of 12.7 points per game (1,786 points to 1,493 points) while its average margin in its loss is just seven points. The Seminoles lost at Pittsburgh in the season opener for both teams by a 61-63 margin (-2) and lost at Virginia by a 56-61 margin (-5) and at Duke by a 65-70 margin (-5). Florida State has lost its three ACC games by a total of 12 points.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LOUISVILLE – THE LAST GAME

M.J. Walker scored 23 points for Florida State as the 18th-ranked Seminoles beat No. 7 Louisville 78-65 at the KFC YUM! Center in Louisville on January 4, 2020. The Seminoles endured a big game from Louisville's Jordan Nwora to pull the upset. The preseason All-American scored 32 points, matching a career high. But the Cardinals could not overcome a 55.2% shooting performance by the Seminoles in losing their second straight. Florida State made 11 of 23 3-pointers. Nwora had a hot hand early for Louisville, scoring 21 points in the first half. The junior shot 6 of 9 from the floor, but the Cardinals combined to make just 10 of 37. They went the last 5:04 without a field goal as the Seminoles took 39-32 lead into the break. Walker helped offset Nwora's early barrage. The junior came off the bench to score 15 points in the first half on 6-of-8 shooting, including 3 of 5 from 3-point range. Walker finished one point short of his career high. Trent Forrest added 20 points on 9-of-11 shooting, and Devin Vassell scored 14. Florida State led 52-42 with 13:43 remaining. Louisville cut that to 54-51 on Nwora's putback, but that was as close as the Cardinals would get.

HAMILTON WITH 72 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game against No. 11/11 Louisville looking for his 73rd career win over a nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and 53 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State). The Seminoles have seven wins over nationally ranked Louisville – including three under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. Florida State has won two consecutive games against Louisville – both wins have come when both teams have been ranked.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State, which has made 80 percent of its free throws in nine games this season, enters Monday's game against Louisville as the ACC leaders in team free throw shooting percentage with a mark of .759. The Seminoles shot only five free throws (their season low) in their victory at Louisville on January 4. Despite attempting only five free throws earlier this season against the Cardinals in the first meeting between the two teams, all three of their made free throws came in the second half as the Seminoles outscored Louisville, 39-33, to win the game. All three of the Seminoles' made free throws came in the final 2:02 of the ACC road win.

SEMINOLES GOING TO THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

Florida State totaled 15 offensive rebounds in its 67-61 win over NC State on Saturday in Raleigh marking the fifth consecutive game during which they have pulled down 15 or more offensive rebounds. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Louisville ranked fourth in the ACC with an 11.5 offensive rebounds per game average and as one of only five teams in the ACC averaging 11 or more offensive rebounds per game.

PATRICK WILLIAMS SCORING IN HIS LAST SIX GAMES

Freshman Patrick Williams has scored 80 points and is averaging 13.3 points scored per game in the last six games. During that span of games, as he continues to grow more comfortable as a Seminole, he has scored in double figures five times with 17 points coming in Florida State's victory over Syracuse on February 15 in Tallahassee. Williams enters Monday's game against Louisville as Florida State's fourth leading scorer with a 9.3 points per game scoring average and with 11 double figure scoring games – five of which have come in his last six games.

Hamilton Named To Naismith Coach of the Year Watch List

Leonard Hamilton, who has guided Florida State to a 23-4 overall record and a 13-3 mark in ACC play, has been named to the Werner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year Late Season Watch List by the Atlanta Tip Off Club. A list of 10 semifinalists for the award is announced on March 6 with the list of finalists released on March 18. The Naismith Men's Coach of the Year will be presented on April 5 at the Naismith Awards Brunch in Atlanta.

Hamilton and the Seminoles are enjoying one of the finest seasons in school history. Florida State has won at least 20 games for the fifth consecutive season and have tied the school record with 13 ACC victories. The Seminoles have defeated three nationally ranked teams (No. 6 Florida, No. 17 Tennessee and No. 6 Louisville) and are currently tied for second in the ACC standings.

Florida State is ranked No. 8 nationally in the both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls for the school-record fourth consecutive week. The Seminoles have been ranked in the nation's top 10 for a school-record seven consecutive weeks and were ranked No. 5 for two weeks in January.

Hamilton's Seminoles enter Monday's game against Louisville having won 23 of their last 26 games including a 10-game winning streak (December 8 through January 25) and six wins in their last seven games since winning at Virginia Tech on February 1. The Seminoles are 3-1 against nationally ranked teams and have five wins against teams who were in the Preseason AP Poll (Louisville, Florida, North Carolina, Virginia and Purdue).

Hamilton is the fifth all-time winningest coach in school history with 357 career wins in his 18 seasons at Florida State and the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history with 167 ACC wins (ACC regular season and ACC Tournament). He became the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history as he guided the Seminoles past Syracuse on February 15, 2020.

With 357 wins at Florida State, he is the all-time winningest coach in Seminole history.

Hamilton has earned three National Coach of the Year awards, two Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year awards, two Big East Coach of the Year awards, has led his teams to nine NCAA Tournament appearances and 20 postseason appearances, to the 2012 ACC Championship (as the head coach at Florida State) and to the 1978 National Championship (as an assistant coach at Kentucky). He is the only person to earn Coach of the Year honors multiple times in both the ACC and the Big East. He was named the Clarence "Big House" Gaines National Coach of the Year in 2018 by the National Sports Media Association.

WILLIAMS AGAINST TEAMS FROM HIS HOME STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA FROM THE LINE

Freshman Patrick Williams is shooting .846 from the free throw line (22 of 26) against the five teams the Seminoles have played from his home state of North Carolina. He was a perfect seven of seven from the line in Florida State's win over Western Carolina (November 15), six of six in the Seminoles' win over North Carolina (February 3), three of five in his first visit to Cameron Indoor Stadium against Duke and was six of eight from the line in Saturday's win over NC State. Williams did not get to the line in Florida State's win over Wake Forest (January 8).

WALKER COMES OFF THE BENCH TO SCORE 23 AGAINST LOUISVILLE

Junior M.J. Walker came off of the bench to score a near career-high 23 points in Florida State's 78-65 victory at Louisville on January 4, 2020. Walker, who substituted into the game after the first media timeout of the game, made nine of 13 shots from the field (69.2 percent) including five of seven (71.4 percent) from the 3-point line. He was credited with three assists (which led directly to eight points) and blocked one shot as the Seminoles defeated their third nationally ranked team of the season. Walker scored a team-high 15 first half points (on three made 3-point shots and three made 2-point shots) to stake the Seminoles to a 39-32 halftime lead. He entered the game and the 15:45 mark of the first half and immediately scored five points in a 36 second span to give the Seminoles an early lead on the road. He added 10 more first half points including a lay-up at the 2:46 mark that gave Florida State a 31-30 lead – a lead it never relinquished in winning the game.

VASSELL CONTINUES TO BUILD HIS STEALS TOTAL

Sophomore Devin Vassell, who is ranked 10th in the ACC with 28 steals and a career-high 1.5 steals per game average, earned a career high tying three steals in Florida State's victory over NC State on Saturday. It marked the fifth time this season (against Chicago State, Tennessee, North Florida, at Miami and at NC State) and the sixth time in his career that he has totaled three steals.

VASSELL FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Sophomore Devin Vassell is shooting .545 from the 3-point line (12 of 22) in the last six games and enters Monday's game against Louisville as the Seminoles' leader with 40 3-point shots made this season. Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 95, Barry 66

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Florida State's exhibition opener provided a glimpse of what lies ahead for the Seminoles -- both in the upcoming season and beyond. It also showed coach Leonard Hamilton a few things he'd like for his team to tighten up between now and the Seminoles' season opener on November 6. So, in that sense, it was a near-perfect evening for FSU, which got 19 points and five assists from senior Trent Forrest in a 95-66 victory over Barry University at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Forrest, the central figure for an FSU team that lost its top two scorers from a year ago, was one of six Seminoles to finish in double-figures. How Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, The ACC's Overlooked Coaching Mainstay, Has Stayed Relevant

It was several years ago, he guesses it was 10 or 15, that Leonard Hamilton was asked a well-intentioned but loaded question.

How long are you going to do this?

The Florida State men's basketball coach was taken aback, even insulted. Now 71 years old and in his 18th season with the Seminoles, Hamilton is occasionally faced with questions about what keeps him energized in a profession that drains and overwhelms men much younger than him. Such queries, rife with implications and rooted in stereotypes, are irrelevant in Hamilton's eyes.

"I don't relate to what they're asking me," he said. "How do I keep going? I've never stopped."

On Tuesday, Pitt will travel south to face Hamilton's Florida State team, which is ranked No. 8 in the Associated Press poll, marking the third time in the past four seasons it has cracked the top 10.

In a conference with three Hall of Fame coaches — Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, North Carolina's Roy Williams and Syracuse's Jim Boeheim — and a fourth seemingly destined to end up there (Virginia's Tony Bennett), Hamilton is often and perhaps unfairly overlooked. But like many of the ACC's luminaries, he has found a way to stay relevant and thrive in an ever-evolving sport.

"A lot of coaches, once they get a system they're comfortable with, they just believe that their players have to adapt to that," said Stan Jones, who has worked as an assistant coach under Hamilton every year but one since 1996. "He tends to adapt more to what it takes for his team to be successful and for the kids he gets to have the best chance to develop so that not only can they play well for us at Florida State, but they'll give themselves their best chance to succeed at the next level."

At 21-4 and one game out of first place in the ACC standings, the Seminoles are a virtual lock to make the NCAA tournament for the eighth time in the past 12 years at a program that had made it just 10 times in its first 61 years of existence. A team that lost six of its top eight scorers from the previous season could very well make it to the Sweet 16 for the third-consecutive year.

Hamilton is fifth in career victories at an ACC school, trailing only Krzyzewski, Dean Smith, Roy Williams and Gary Williams. Though a Final Four appearance has eluded him, he has made a career out of winning at places where few have — at Oklahoma State, which hadn't had back-to-back postseason appearances in more than 30 years; at Miami, which had reintroduced its program only five years before his arrival; and now at Florida State, a school where football is unquestionably king. Hamilton's career path reflects the personality of a man who has long believed he is best suited for more challenging jobs.

Obstacles, after all, are nothing new to him. Born in segregated North Carolina, Hamilton became the first black player ever at Tennessee-Martin. When he was hired as an assistant coach at Kentucky in 1974, he was the first black coach in the history of a storied program that had integrated only five years earlier. At Oklahoma State, he was the first ever black head coach in the Big Eight Conference.

In being a trailblazer, he didn't find pressure, but a sense of responsibility, leaning heavily on the lessons passed on to him by his father.

"I always felt from an early age that I had to work harder than everybody else," Hamilton said. "That was an important part of my DNA. Never having anybody to complain or make excuses to, like so many people have, only gave me one potential outcome — I either had to be successful or had to keep working until I became successful."

By excelling in those positions, he helped provide inspiration to other black coaches, including the man who will be on the opposite sideline Tuesday night.

"When I was younger, when I was a player and things like that, you looked around and you didn't see a lot of people that looked like me on the sidelines in positions of leadership," Pitt coach Jeff Capel said. "When I did, I immediately became a fan of them because my dad was in this profession and he was trying to climb that ladder."

Along the way, he has continuously adapted. After getting to Florida State, he abandoned the three-out two-in motion offense he used in the rugged Big East to something more fitting for the up-tempo ACC. When the Seminoles went on a foreign tour in Greece in 2013, he saw the way the game was changing overseas and implemented a scheme utilizing more spacing.

Hamilton insists very little about him has changed over the years, and in some ways, he's right. His fundamental principles and beliefs have remained unchanged, namely in how he interacts with and treats those with whom he works. Jones recalls how in Hamilton's lone season as an NBA coach, with the Washington Wizards in 2000-01, he surprised an assistant coach by calling his wife to ask how their children were adjusting to their new school. Last year, he stood strongly by the side of forward Phil Cofer, whose father died as the team played in the NCAA tournament.

"Coaches at our level, they say they do those things, but sometimes, their actions don't speak the same as their words," Jones said. "He's a guy that does more and says less."

Through it all, he has managed to stay young in an industry that has a nasty habit of rapidly aging many. In his early 70s, Hamilton — in what has become something of a running, awe-inspiring joke — could pass for 45, making him the closest thing college basketball has to Benjamin Button.

It's not due to a lack of effort. Hamilton said he still works the same number of long hours, makes the same number of phone calls and sleeps the same number of hours as he did decades ago. He doesn't hunt, fish or play golf. One of his only diversions, in fact, is listening to hours of gospel music late at night after he has finished watching film.

Hamilton has even, after initially agreeing to it reluctantly, embraced social media. His Twitter profile is an active source of humor, from posting a video of him and his players signing "Silent Night" in Santa hats in the team's locker room to joking about his resemblance to actor Robert Wisdom, who played police major Howard "Bunny" Colvin on the HBO series "The Wire."

For Hamilton, it's a way to provide a glimpse at the jovial personality many close to him know well, a sharp break from his stoic, almost distant demeanor in games.

"I've seen people in the airport and they'll say 'Gosh, do you ever smile?'" he said. "It has become so comical because nobody likes to have more fun than me."

It's a way to stay relevant and accessible 280 characters at a time. More than anything, though, it's a window into a man who is, nearly 50 years into his career, living his best life and producing his best teams.

Kentucky, Joe B. Hall And 'Divine Intervention' Saved Leonard Hamilton's Coaching Career

Leonard Hamilton's ties to the Bluegrass State run deep.

It's not just Joe B. Hall, although the former Kentucky coach is the biggest reason why it all happened. When you spend as long as he did in one place, he said, part of you never leaves.

"I was there for 12 years," Hamilton said last week, ahead of Monday's game between his Florida State team and Louisville. "I still have friends and relatives. My brother just moved from Lexington down here with me, but I have nephews and family members that still live in Lexington. Some of my longtime friends are there, and I stay in contact with quite a few of them on a regular basis — not only in Lexington, but friends all over the state of Kentucky."

Hamilton, now 71, caught up with Hall last time he was in town in January, spending an evening with him and FSU's assistant coaches at a hotel lobby where the team was staying.

They had plenty to talk about — Hamilton spent 12 years as an assistant coach on Hall's staff at UK, from 1974 to 1986, and hasn't had enough opportunities to catch up with him since he left Kentucky. He'd come on the Joe B. and Denny Show when Hall and former Louisville coach Denny Crum hosted a radio show before it ended in 2014, but life as a college basketball coach is busy. There just hasn't been much time.

Still, Hamilton will tell you he wouldn't be where he is today — in his 19th season as head coach at FSU, and leading an Atlantic Coast Conference contender — if "divine intervention" and a call from Hall just days after he'd taken a job as a salesman at Dow Chemical hadn't brought him to the commonwealth 46 years ago.

It was a Monday, his first day at Dow, when his wife let him know Hall had called while he was at work. Hamilton called back that night, and Hall told him he'd been recommended for an assistant coach opening on his staff at UK (Hall had just been hired after Adolph Rupp was forced into retirement).

Hall was out of town but would be in Lexington on Tuesday afternoon and suggested Hamilton come by for an interview Wednesday — Hamilton booked a flight to Lexington out of Charlotte, North Carolina, on Monday, met with Hall that Tuesday evening and was back at work at Dow Wednesday.

When Hall offered the job the next Monday, Hamilton said, he didn't wait. It was lunchtime, but UK's newest assistant coach had somewhere to be.

"I wrote a note — 'to whom it may concern, I resign my position effective immediately. Thank you very much for the opportunity.' I got in my car and moved out of my hotel," he said. "My wife said to me 'I am not driving.' She said 'if you want me to go, I'm riding.' I left one of my cars there in Gastonia (North Carolina) at my family's house and I drove to Lexington."

It was a quick exit, but working at Dow wasn't Hamilton's dream job. Taking a job as an assistant at UK, though, was a step in the right direction. He wanted to be a head coach of a college basketball team — he just didn't think it would be possible.

Hamilton had spent three years as an assistant at Austin Peay in Clarksville, Tennessee, but he said when he asked administration officials if he'd be considered for the head coach opening years later when coach Lake Kelly retired, he was told no.

"The reason I resigned at Austin Peay is I became discouraged that I would not have an opportunity to become the head coach because I was an African American," Hamilton explained. "I just got discouraged and decided that if I

wasn't going to have an opportunity to be a head coach, I needed to go where I could earn my own stripes. I thought that selling chemicals was the way for me to go — and needless to say, God had another plan for me."

"That was a real concern in that era," Stan Jones, FSU's associate head coach who has worked with Hamilton for nearly 25 years, said. "... Coach Hall called him before he got embedded into that job at Dow Chemical, and he immediately traveled up there to meet with Coach Hall and take that job."

Jones didn't work with Hamilton during his 12 years in Lexington. He joined Hamilton's staff during his time as head coach of Miami, following his years at UK, and has been with him nearly nonstop since then — Jones spent one year on Rick Stansbury's staff at Mississippi State, when Hamilton was out of basketball in 2001, but rejoined him when FSU hired him in 2002.

He was with Hamilton when he met with Hall last month. Those years meant a lot to Hamilton, Jones said, and he's spoken about them often as the two have been on the same staff in years since at Miami and Florida State, with a season in between coaching the NBA's Washington Wizards. (Hamilton also served as head coach at Oklahoma State from 1986-90.)

"So many of those players still come through and see him," Jones said. "He talks to them, he talks about them, they call him and ask him for advice on business decisions, on family issues — Melvin Turpin's son Kiel Turpin played for us for four years back in the early part of the last decade. He's just such a great people person. He never let's anybody go that's been part of his life."

Those years in Kentucky shaped Hamilton as a coach. Hall taught him how to handle the limelight, from TV and radio interviews to "preparing for some of the most high-profile games you can think of," and Hamilton watched how he'd connect with recruits and with his players off the court.

"That whole intensity of being in the fishbowl existence and making sure that you're aware of the challenges of being in that position — all those things helped prepare me for whenever the opportunity became available for me to become a head coach and have my own program," Hamilton said.

He learned about the biggest rivalry in the Bluegrass State, too.

Hamilton was on staff with Hall when the Wildcats met Louisville with a berth in the Final Four on the line in 1983. Hamilton and UK lost "the Dream Game," as it's become known, but would go 3-1 in four other games against the Cardinals before he left for Oklahoma State in 1986.

Hamilton knew there was a rivalry between the two schools — his head coach and two players at Austin Peay were from Lexington. But his focus was on the scoreboard, not the name on the other jersey.

"Now, those people who had grown up in Kentucky, they took those games to a whole 'nother emotional level," Hamilton said. "They took it to heights on steroids. It was unbelievable how much emotions went into that game. But for me personally, I had to maintain what I thought was the right focus to not get enamored with the emotional part and just try to be prepared."

"During those days, Louisville had a really, really good team. Coach Crum was doing an outstanding job, and they were unbelievably successful. It was a big game for people in the state, and it took on an almost outstanding intense rivalry that I'm sure people enjoy to this day."

Of course, there's a different rivalry that has Hamilton's focus this week. Florida State hosts Louisville at 7 p.m. Monday night in a clash between two top ACC contenders that will have a big impact on how seeding shakes out in next month's conference tournament.

The Seminoles beat Louisville handily six weeks ago, but the Cardinals showed what they're capable of when they ripped off 10 wins in their next 10 games. Monday's showdown is a heavyweight fight between two teams that could meet again deep in the ACC Tournament.

Win, lose or draw, though, Hamilton said he won't get too high or too low. He's taken the court against Louisville plenty of times over the years — one night won't make or break him.

"I'm not stressed because I realize that my calling is not necessarily to win basketball games as it is to develop young people to their fullest potential," Hamilton said.

"The wins and losses pretty much take care of themselves."

Leonard Hamilton Has A Secret Vice That Keeps The Florida State Basketball Coach Young

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After hiding it for all these years, keeping his dark secret, Leonard Hamilton will admit to one bad habit that keeps him up at night. In the wee hours, when he has finished watching film and should be getting his rest, the Florida State coach indulges in his secret late-night life.

"I start surfing through YouTube listening to gospel music," Hamilton said last week, while his team shot around at Duke. "Gospel videos, that's my vice. It's 11:30, and I need to get to bed, but let me enjoy some gospel videos. And I look up and it's 1 a.m. That happens a lot."

There, perhaps, is the answer to how a man pushing 72 doesn't look like he has aged a day for a decade. Or the answer to how he has survived, and thrived, for so long at a school that is too often singularly focused on football.

Hamilton, at least, has won an ACC title in the past two decades, which is more than 10 other ACC teams can say.

This is all very much in keeping with the Hamilton ethos, a man whose entire career has been built on finding ways to win in the quieter corners of the basketball world, a philosophy of giving kids a chance and then not giving up on them, a teacher at heart. The story of his childhood, growing up in a crowded house in Gastonia, clawing his way out, has been told many times. The story of his successful adulthood, not so much.

A week ago, Hamilton passed Bobby Cremins with his 355th win at an ACC school, and Tuesday's win at Pittsburgh was No. 356. Only four ACC coaches have won more: Mike Krzyzewski, Dean Smith, Roy Williams and Gary Williams. Hamilton has won more conference games than Frank McGuire. And with 554 Division I wins overall, he's in the top 100 of all time, in the midst of his fifth consecutive 20-win season.

With the exception of a brief and lamentable NBA stint with Michael Jordan's misguided Washington Wizards — too good to turn down — Hamilton has won everywhere he has been, from a rebuilding job at Oklahoma State to a building-from-scratch job at Miami, where the Hurricanes didn't even have a practice gym when Hamilton helped reboot the program in 1990. This is his 18th season at Florida State, a long time for a guy who considers himself a program-builder, but the wins keep piling up, even if he isn't counting. What he counts: Only three of his players haven't graduated in those 18 years.

"When I hang up my whistle, if all I got to show is records and trophies and personal recognition, then I don't think I would have accomplished very much in terms of what our mission should be and what our job should be as a coach," Hamilton said. "I'm taking a teenager and urging him into young adulthood. That responsibility is the most important thing we do."

He has done that his own way, recruiting all kinds of different players, from 7-foot-and-beyond projects like Michael Ojo to one-and-dones like Jonathan Isaac to do-it-all stars who could play anywhere like Michael Snaer. He has turned raw athletes into basketball players and coaxed athleticism from finesse players. And he has played them all, fueling his frenetic defense with waves of substitutions.

There's no such thing as the end of Florida State's bench, only the Leonard Hamilton Roulette wheel that could land on anyone on any given night. Nine different players have led the Seminoles in scoring this year, although it's most often been Devin Vassell, their leading all-ACC candidate.

"We played 11 kids last night," Hamilton said. "Eleven kids scored."

"Only 11?"

A beat. Hamilton laughed, deeply.

Hamilton is back in North Carolina on Saturday to play N.C. State, and he'll be back next month for the ACC tournament in Greensboro, a year after his team played Duke for the title in Charlotte. Hamilton said he doesn't really think of himself as a North Carolinian or a Floridian at this point, just a citizen of the basketball world, trying to make it better, one player at a time, sneaking away to watch one gospel video at a time.

That, not winning and losing, is what keeps him up at night.

"There's just a peace that comes over you," Hamilton said, "when you feel good about what you do every day."
