### TOP 10 SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO PITT IN SECOND GAME OF SEASON BETWEEN SEMINOLES AND PANTHERS

Florida State, which has won 21 of its last 24 games, plays host to Pittsburgh on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 at 8:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The game is the second meeting this season between the two teams – the Panthers took a 63-61 victory over the Seminoles in the 2019-20 season opener for both teams at the Peterson Events Center on November 6, 2019. The Seminoles enter their game against Pitt fresh from an 80-77 victory over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee – the 20<sup>th</sup> consecutive win for Florida State in the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State's game against Pittsburgh marks the first time since February 18, 2018 that the Seminoles will play host to the Panthers because of the unbalanced 20-game ACC schedule. The Seminoles defeated the Panthers, 88-75, on February 18, 2018, the last time Pittsburgh ventured south to Tallahassee. In addition to winning 21 of their last 24 games since these two teams met, the Seminoles have won four of their last five and 14 of their last 16 overall games. Following Tuesday's game against Pittsburgh, the Seminoles travel to play at NC State on February 22, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. in their first (and only) game of the regular season against the Wolfpack.

### HAMILTON AMONG THE TOP-FIVE ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACHES IN THE HISTORY OF THE ACC

With Florida State's victory over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee, Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton moved into sole possession of fifth place as the all-time winningest coach in ACC history. Hamilton now has 355 career victories at the helm of the Seminole program – the fifth highest total in ACC history. He is also the fifth winningest coach in ACC games (ACC regular season and tournament games) with 166 all-time ACC wins.

### FORREST CHASING CHARLIE WARD AS THE NO. 1 CHIEF THIEF IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Senior Trent Forrest, who totaled 10 steals in two games last week at Duke (a career-high eight steals) and against Syracuse (two steals) enters Tuesday's game against Pittsburgh with 217 career steals. He is chasing Florida State's all-time career steals leader Charlie Ward who totaled 238 career steals.

### FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 62-3 (.954 winning percentage) in its last 65 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against Pittsburgh having won .954 percent of their games (62-3) and .917 percent of their ACC games (33-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 13-0 at home this season (including 7-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in 2016-17 season.

### FLORIDA STATE IS THE ACC'S ONLY UNDEFEATED TEAM AT HOME THIS SEASON

Florida State enters Tuesday's game as the only undefeated team at home in the ACC this season with a 13-0 record.

### FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 20 CONSECUTIVE HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Pittsburgh having won 20 consecutive games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019; their most recent victory in Tallahassee came as an 80-77 win over Syracuse on February 15, 2020. Florida State has won 14 consecutive ACC games and each of its 6 non-conference home games to begin the 2019-20 season.

### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Pittsburgh and win its 22<sup>nd</sup> game of the season. It would mark the fourth consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least 22 games in a season for the school-record fourth consecutive season;

...Defeat Pittsburgh and win its 12<sup>th</sup> ACC game of the season. It would mark the second consecutive season and fifth time in school history the Seminoles would have won at least 12 ACC games in a single season;

...Defeat Pittsburgh wins its 21<sup>st</sup> consecutive game played in the Donald L. Tucker Center – the Seminoles have won each of their games at home since January 22, 2019;

...Defeat Pittsburgh and win its 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive ACC game home game – an ongoing school record.

**HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST COACHES IN ACC**

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Tuesday's game against Pittsburgh as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

**HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY**

With 166 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including the Seminoles' 11 ACC victories this season, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 166 ACC wins during his career.

**FLORIDA STATE IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA**

Florida State has won 25 consecutive games that have been played in the state of Florida – each game since a 77-68 win at home over Clemson on January 22, 2019.

**NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S 20 WIN SEASONS**

Florida State enters Tuesday's game with a 21-4 record in its first 25 games of the 2019-20 season. The Seminoles' 21 wins already this season marks the school-record fifth consecutive season the Seminoles have won at least 20 games. Hamilton, who averages 19.7 wins per season at Florida State has led the Seminoles to at least 20 wins in 12 of his 18 seasons leading the program. Prior to his arrival at Florida State, the Seminoles had won 20 or more games 11 times since the program's first season (1947-48). He has led the Seminoles to at least 20 wins in 12 of the last 15 seasons. Hamilton guided the Seminoles to a single-season school record 29 wins during the 2018-19 season.

**FLORIDA STATE WITH 50 WINS IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS**

Florida State is 50-12 overall (.806 winning percentage) and 24-8 in ACC play (.750 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. It marks the second time in school history the Seminoles have won a combined 50 games in back to back seasons with both time coming in the last three seasons: 23 -12 (in 2017-18) and 29-8 (in 2018-19) for a total of 52 wins and 29-8 (in 2018-19) and 21-4 (in 2019-20) for a total of 50 wins.

**FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES**

Including its 80-77 win over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee, Florida State is 39-8 (.830 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship.

**FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS**

Florida State has an overall record of 99-33 and a winning percentage of .750 since the start of the 2016-17 season. The Seminoles average 24.8 wins per season and have won 26-23-29-21 games in the last four seasons. Florida State is 45-23 in ACC play and averages 11.3 wins per season in that same time span.

**FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME**

With its overtime victory over Miami in Coral Gables on January 18, Florida State has won nine consecutive overtime games. During that stretch of nine consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one of the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last nine overtime opponents by a 124-76 margin.

**SEMINOLES IN OVERTIME IN ACC PLAY**

Florida State has won 10 consecutive overtime games against teams from the ACC. In addition to its streak of nine consecutive overtime wins, Florida State defeated Maryland, 73-70, on January 17, 2009 to begin its streak of 10 consecutive wins in overtime against teams from the ACC.

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

Led by M.J. Walker's five 3-point field goals made on Saturday, the Seminoles made 11 shots from the bonusphere in their 80-77 win over Syracuse. With its ninth double figure 3-point field goal performance against the Orange, Florida State maintained its position as the No. 2 ranked 3-point shooting team in the ACC with a .362 mark for the first 25 games of the season. Florida State is also ranked second in the ACC statistics in ACC games only with a .395 mark from long range.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. PITTSBURGH – THE LAST GAME**

Reserves Ryan Murphy and Terrell Brown scored 13 points to lead Pitt to a 63-61 win over Florida State in the season opener for both teams at the Peterson Events Center in Pittsburgh on November 6, 2019. The Panthers won despite shooting just 31 percent (16 of 51) from the field. Pitt survived by getting into the lane relentlessly against the bigger Seminoles, an approach that helped them outscore Florida State 22-13 at the free throw line. Senior guard Trent Forrest led Florida State with 19 points. Devin Vassell added 14 but the Seminoles couldn't survive 14 turnovers and 27 fouls. RaiQuan Gray, Malik Osborne and Balsa Koprivica all fouled out for Florida State. Florida State went up 40-31 on a layup by Osborne with 13:37 to play. The Panthers, however, responded. The Seminoles had a chance to tie it at the end of regulation but Patrick Williams missed a jumper with two seconds to go. Anthony Polite grabbed the offensive rebound but couldn't get a shot off before the buzzer. Florida State shot 40 percent (21 of 53) from the floor.

**RaiQuan Gray** – “My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.”

**Anthony Polite** – “My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather.”

**Trent Forrest** – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

## Florida State's Hamilton a Top Five All-Time ACC Coach

You want to win a bar bet?

Ask someone to name the top five winningest coaches in Atlantic Coast Conference history.

Odds are they'll get three right off the bat. Mike Krzyzewski, Dean Smith and Roy Williams are pretty obvious choices.

If they're a college basketball fan, they might get former Maryland coach Gary Williams, who is at No. 4.

But unless you're at a bar in Tallahassee, Fla., you're about to win some money or at least a beer.

Leonard Hamilton has one more ACC games than all but those four names mentioned above.

Yes, Leonard Hamilton. The Florida State coach has won 165 games against ACC competition. More than Lefty Driesell. More than Bobby Cremins. More than Terry Holland or Tony Bennett.

He has turned Florida State into a Top 25 program, leading the Seminoles to the Elite 8 in 2018 and the Sweet 16 last year.

This year, Florida State, even after losing two NBA players in Terrance Mann and Mfiondu Kabengele off last year's squad, is ranked in the Top 10 and challenging for the ACC's regular season title.

Ask around about what makes Hamilton so successful and you get a variety of answers.

"He's a great teacher and he doesn't get a lot of credit for it," North Carolina State coach Kevin Keatts said.

"People always question whether he's an X-and-O guy. That's false. He's really good at everything he does. You're not that successful without being able to do that."

"He's got this very deep faith," former Georgia Tech coach Paul Hewitt said. "He's a very religious man. It brings a calm to him. He keeps going along and working and things are going to work out."

And then there's the guy who might know Hamilton the best.

Stan Jones has been on Hamilton's coaching staff at both Miami and Florida State.

"I tell this all the time to families and prospects we're recruiting," Jones said, "as good a basketball coach that he is, he's a far greater molder and developer of people. He's the genuine article. He deals with people; from his players to his staff, to make sure they are successful."

Hamilton's coaching ability has been pooh-poohed in the past. Like many former assistants; he was an assistant to Joe B. Hall at Kentucky from 1974 to 1986, he was seen as a recruiter for a long time.

"It really bothers me when people just label him as a recruiter," Keatts said. "Recruiting can only go so far. It's about recruiting and developing and coaching these guys."

It's hard to measure in-game coaching, but let's focus on some end-game numbers.

Did you know that Florida State has won nine straight overtime games?

In one-possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime, Florida State has a record of 38-8 (.826 winning percentage) over the last eight years.

Jones said the Seminoles are prepared for late-game situations.

Hamilton goes over scenarios in practice, but there's more to FSU's success in close games than that.

"Coach Hamilton has a demeanor that when more pressure comes on him, the calmer he gets," Jones said. "You never see him in a panic. In a timeout, he says 'I want this' and maybe I'm the one drawing it on the board. He's very calm in those situations. Our kids feed off his demeanor."

While other coaches draw attention to themselves as they rant and rave, or throw their suit jackets, Hamilton's countenance hardly changes.

"People think he's got a death stare, but he's just very focused," Jones said. "He sees everything that's going on. But within that focus, he's also a very receptive guy. He lets the staff speak up and share ideas. He's truly a team guy."

There are reasons that Hamilton's success has been largely unnoticed.

First, if you're the basketball coach at Florida State, you're going to be overshadowed by North Carolina and Duke and even your own school's football program.

Second, while his teams have been relatively successful, Hamilton has yet to lead the Seminoles to the Final Four.

At three different college coaching stops, Hamilton has turned losing programs into winners.

He suffered through two losing seasons in his first head coaching gig at Oklahoma State and then had winning seasons in his last two years. His Miami tenure started with three straight losing seasons, but concluded with consecutive winning seasons.

At Florida State, Hamilton had losing seasons in two of his first three years, but the Seminoles are on a 15-year win streak, including 20-plus wins in each of the last five years.

But Hamilton has never been able to take that last, long step to the Final Four.

Is that fair? Should the lack of one or two wins in the NCAA tournament keep Hamilton from getting the credit he's due?

Keatts doesn't think so.

"He's a really good coach," Keatts said. "He's been to the mountain-top."

Jones says Hamilton doesn't care about credit or accolades.

"He's such an ego-less guy," Jones said. "He just care about his players."

Perhaps this could be the year that Hamilton breaks through to the Final Four.

Florida State has incredible depth with 10 players averaging at least 10 minutes per game.

There's experience with veterans Trent Forrest and M.J. Walker. Devin Vassell, a 6-7 sophomore, is quietly having an All-ACC type of season, leading the Seminoles in points, rebounds and blocks.

And then maybe Hamilton will no longer be the answer to a trivia question.

"You know what? I don't think it bothers him," Hewitt said. "I don't think it bothers him at all. I think he's going to keep toiling away and doing what he does and win his games. Hopefully, it'll happen for him one day and he'll pop up and win a national championship and he'll keep doing his thing."

## Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 95, Barry 66

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Florida State's exhibition opener provided a glimpse of what lies ahead for the Seminoles -- both in the upcoming season and beyond. It also showed coach Leonard Hamilton a few things he'd like for his team to tighten up between now and the Seminoles' season opener on November 6. So, in that sense, it was a near-perfect evening for FSU, which got 19 points and five assists from senior Trent Forrest in a 95-66 victory over Barry University at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Forrest, the central figure for an FSU team that lost its top two scorers from a year ago, was one of six Seminoles to finish in double-figures. Anthony Polite added 18 -- including 16 in the second half -- while RaiQuan Gray (10 points) and newcomers Patrick Williams (12, nine rebounds), Nathanael Jack (10), Dominik Olejniczak (10 points, seven rebounds) and Malik Osborne (seven points, seven boards) all enjoyed productive outings.

## Florida State's Hamilton a Top Five All-Time ACC Coach

You want to win a bar bet?

Ask someone to name the top five winningest coaches in Atlantic Coast Conference history.

Odds are they'll get three right off the bat. Mike Krzyzewski, Dean Smith and Roy Williams are pretty obvious choices.

If they're a college basketball fan, they might get former Maryland coach Gary Williams, who is at No. 4.

But unless you're at a bar in Tallahassee, Fla., you're about to win some money or at least a beer.

Leonard Hamilton has one more ACC games than all but those four names mentioned above.

Yes, Leonard Hamilton. The Florida State coach has won 165 games against ACC competition. More than Lefty Driesell. More than Bobby Cremins. More than Terry Holland or Tony Bennett.

He has turned Florida State into a Top 25 program, leading the Seminoles to the Elite 8 in 2018 and the Sweet 16 last year.

This year, Florida State, even after losing two NBA players in Terrance Mann and Mfiondu Kabengele off last year's squad, is ranked in the Top 10 and challenging for the ACC's regular season title.

Ask around about what makes Hamilton so successful and you get a variety of answers.

"He's a great teacher and he doesn't get a lot of credit for it," North Carolina State coach Kevin Keatts said.

"People always question whether he's an X-and-O guy. That's false. He's really good at everything he does. You're not that successful without being able to do that."

"He's got this very deep faith," former Georgia Tech coach Paul Hewitt said. "He's a very religious man. It brings a calm to him. He keeps going along and working and things are going to work out."

And then there's the guy who might know Hamilton the best.

Stan Jones has been on Hamilton's coaching staff at both Miami and Florida State.

"I tell this all the time to families and prospects we're recruiting," Jones said, "as good a basketball coach that he is, he's a far greater molder and developer of people. He's the genuine article. He deals with people; from his players to his staff, to make sure they are successful."

Hamilton's coaching ability has been pooh-poohed in the past. Like many former assistants; he was an assistant to Joe B. Hall at Kentucky from 1974 to 1986, he was seen as a recruiter for a long time.

"It really bothers me when people just label him as a recruiter," Keatts said. "Recruiting can only go so far. It's about recruiting and developing and coaching these guys."

It's hard to measure in-game coaching, but let's focus on some end-game numbers.

Did you know that Florida State has won nine straight overtime games?

In one-possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime, Florida State has a record of 38-8 (.826 winning percentage) over the last eight years.

Jones said the Seminoles are prepared for late-game situations.

Hamilton goes over scenarios in practice, but there's more to FSU's success in close games than that.

"Coach Hamilton has a demeanor that when more pressure comes on him, the calmer he gets," Jones said. "You never see him in a panic. In a timeout, he says 'I want this' and maybe I'm the one drawing it on the board. He's very calm in those situations. Our kids feed off his demeanor."

While other coaches draw attention to themselves as they rant and rave, or throw their suit jackets, Hamilton's countenance hardly changes.

"People think he's got a death stare, but he's just very focused," Jones said. "He sees everything that's going on. But within that focus, he's also a very receptive guy. He lets the staff speak up and share ideas. He's truly a team guy."

There are reasons that Hamilton's success has been largely unnoticed.

First, if you're the basketball coach at Florida State, you're going to be overshadowed by North Carolina and Duke and even your own school's football program.

Second, while his teams have been relatively successful, Hamilton has yet to lead the Seminoles to the Final Four.

At three different college coaching stops, Hamilton has turned losing programs into winners.

He suffered through two losing seasons in his first head coaching gig at Oklahoma State and then had winning seasons in his last two years. His Miami tenure started with three straight losing seasons, but concluded with consecutive winning seasons.

At Florida State, Hamilton had losing seasons in two of his first three years, but the Seminoles are on a 15-year win streak, including 20-plus wins in each of the last five years.

But Hamilton has never been able to take that last, long step to the Final Four.

Is that fair? Should the lack of one or two wins in the NCAA tournament keep Hamilton from getting the credit he's due?

Keatts doesn't think so.

"He's a really good coach," Keatts said. "He's been to the mountain-top."

Jones says Hamilton doesn't care about credit or accolades.

"He's such an ego-less guy," Jones said. "He just care about his players."

Perhaps this could be the year that Hamilton breaks through to the Final Four.

Florida State has incredible depth with 10 players averaging at least 10 minutes per game.

There's experience with veterans Trent Forrest and M.J. Walker. Devin Vassell, a 6-7 sophomore, is quietly having an All-ACC type of season, leading the Seminoles in points, rebounds and blocks.

And then maybe Hamilton will no longer be the answer to a trivia question.

"You know what? I don't think it bothers him," Hewitt said. "I don't think it bothers him at all. I think he's going to keep toiling away and doing what he does and win his games. Hopefully, it'll happen for him one day and he'll pop up and win a national championship and he'll keep doing his thing."
