"Florida State is the No. 10 team with the committee, No. 13 in the NET. The Seminoles are 10-2 in the league, with that big win at Louisville on the résumé. This is a classic Leonard Hamilton team of long, athletic defenders, leading the nation in blocked shot percentage and ranking in the top 10 in steal percentage. But the 'Noles can also shoot it from the three-point line and the foul line better than they have in years. Florida State also has an injury it can enter into the seeding argument: freshman Patrick Williams missed two games with a sprained toe, one of them a loss at Virginia. He's averaged 14 points and seven rebounds the past two games."

NO. 8 SEMINOLES RETURN HOME; PLAY HOST TO SYRACUSE SATURDAY AT NOON

Florida State, which has won 19 consecutive home games and 13 straight ACC games at home, plays host to Syracuse on Saturday, February 15, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center at 12 Noon. The Seminoles have won each of their last 19 games in Tallahassee (13-0 in ACC games and 6-0 in non-conference games) since a 77-68 victory over Clemson on January 22, 2019. When its game against Syracuse tips, it will be 399 days since the Seminoles last did not win at home (January 12, 2019 vs. Duke). Florida State plays the Orange in the only regular season meeting between the two teams during the 2020 season marking the fourth consecutive season the two teams have met only once during the season – each year since 2017. The Seminoles and the Orange last met twice in a season during the 2015-16 when the teams split the two contests with each team winning on their home court. Saturday's meeting of the Seminoles and the Orange marks only the eighth time the two have met since Syracuse joined the ACC for the 2013-14 season. Following Saturday's game against Syracuse, the Seminoles play host to Pittsburgh on Tuesday, February 18 at 8:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

FORREST ENJOYS RECORD DAY WITH EIGHT STEALS AT DUKE

Senior Trent Forrest earned a career-high eight steals in Florida State's game at Duke on Monday night – the most steals ever by an opponent against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium. His total is tied for the fifth best single game effort in school history, is tied for the third best single game effort in school history in an ACC game and is tied for the 10th highest single game total in ACC history. Forrest's eight steals against Duke were the most by a Seminole since Chris Singleton totaled 10 in a win over UNC Greensboro in the Greensboro Coliseum on Nov. 14, 2010. Forrest enters Saturday's game against Syracuse ranked third in school history with 215 career steals. He needs only 24 steals to move ahead of Charlie Ward (238 career steals) to become the all-time Chief Thief at Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 61-3 (.953 winning percentage) in its last 64 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Syracuse having won .953 percent of their games (61-3) and .914 percent of their ACC games (32-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 12-0 at home this season, were 15-1 at home during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE IS THE ACC'S ONLY UNDEFEATED TEAM AT HOME THIS SEASON

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Syracuse as the only undefeated team at home in the ACC this season with a 12-0 record.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN THE ACC

Florida State is 22-4 in regular season ACC games (.846 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson (77-68) on January 22, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles won 12 of their final 13 regular season ACC games of the 2018-19 season and have won 10 of their first 13 ACC games of the 2019-20 season. During that stretch of games, Florida State is 13-0 at home and 9-4 on the road in ACC play.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Syracuse and win its 21st game of the season. It would mark the school record fourth consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least 21 games. Florida State averages 24.5 wins per season in the last four years;

...Defeat Syracuse and raise its record to 11-3 in ACC play. It would mark the seventh time in school history the Seminoles have won 11 ACC games in a season. Florida State set its school record with 13 ACC wins in finishing fourth in the conference standings during the 2018-19 season;

...Defeat Syracuse and win its school-record third consecutive game against the Orange.

HAMILTON TIED AS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 354 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game at Duke on Monday tied for fifth among the all-time winningest coaches in ACC history. He is tied with Georgia Tech's legend Bobby Cremins. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY

With 165 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020, at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, against Virginia on January 15, 2020, at Miami on January 18, 2020, against Notre Dame on January 25, 2020, at Virginia Tech on February 1, 2020, against North Carolina on February 3, 2020 and against Miami on February 8, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 165 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 19 CONSECUTIVE HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Syracuse having won 19 consecutive games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019; their most recent victory in Tallahassee came as a 99-81 win over Miami on February 8, 2020. Florida State has won 13 consecutive ACC games and each of its 6 non-conference home games to begin the 2019-20 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 49-13 overall (.790 winning percentage) and 23-8 in ACC play (.742 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA

Florida State has won 25 consecutive games that have been played in the state of Florida – each game since a 77-68 win at home over Clemson on January 22, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES

Including its 85-84 win over Notre Dame on January 25 in Tallahassee, Florida State is 38-8 (.826 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship. Florida State's overtime victory over Miami on January 18 was the Seminoles' ninth consecutive overtime win and 10th consecutive overtime win in ACC play.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST 5 YEARS

Florida State has an overall record of 98-33 and a winning percentage of .748 since the start of the 2016-17 season. The Seminoles average 24.5 wins per season and have won 26-23-29-20 games in the last four seasons. Florida State is 44-23 in ACC play and averages 11.0 wins per season in that same time span.

SEMINOLES LEAD ACC IN STEALS; EARN SEASON-HIGH TYING 16 STEALS AGAINST DUKE

Led by a career-high eight steals by senior Trent Forrest against Duke on Monday, the Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Syracuse as the ACC team leader for total steals and average steals per game. Florida State's 16 steals at Duke tied for second the school mark for steals in an ACC game and tied for first as the highest number of steals in a game for the Seminoles' this season. Florida State has earned double figures in steals in 12 of its 24 games this season (.500 percent) and in five of its 13 ACC games (.385 percent). The Seminoles led the ACC in steals during the 2012 season with a 7.6 steals per game average – the same season they won the first ACC Tournament Championship in school history.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SYRACUSE – THE LAST GAME

Terance Mann scored 22 points, Mfiondu Kabengele added 18 and No. 22 Florida State beat Syracuse 80-62, blasting the Orange early and late at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. on February 5, 2019. Florida State won its fourth straight after starting conference play with four losses in five games. The Orange fell 22 points behind early against the Seminoles, rallied to within a point in the second half and then fizzled at the end, worn out from the press they used to rally. Florida State outscored Syracuse 38-18 in the paint, its defense repeatedly thwarting attempted drives to the basket, and hit 11 of 22 from beyond the arc in a solid display against Syracuse's vaunted 2/3 zone. Kabengele has scored in double figures in 15 of the team's 22 games, all as a reserve. M.J. Walker and Phil Cofer each scored 11 points as 10 players scored for the Seminoles. Trailing 39-31 at halftime after a furious rally, Syracuse started the second with a 7-3 spurt, pulling within 42-38 on Battle's steal and fast-break layup. The Orange drew within a point on Brissett's putback with 13:34 to go, and the game remained tight for the next three minutes before the Seminoles reeled off 12 straight points.

11 Senior Trent Forrest has earned at least one steal in 11 consecutive games – each game since Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech on December 31. He has a total of 32 steals for an average of 2.9 steals per game during that span.

12 Senior Trent Forrest enters Saturday's game against Syracuse having made 12 consecutive free throws. He was a perfect four of four in Florida State's win over Miami on February 8 and a perfect six of six against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium on Monday night.

17 Florida State earned a season-high 17 offensive rebounds against Duke on Monday night. It marked the fourth time this season the Seminoles have pulled down at least 15 offensive rebounds in a single game.

20 Florida State is undefeated, 20-0, when it outscores its opponent.

65.1 Florida State is holding its opponents to an average of 65.1 points scored per game – the lowest per game average allowed by the Seminoles since allowing only 62.0 points scored per game during the 2011-12 season. Florida State won its first ACC Tournament championship that season.

223 Florida State has earned 223 steals in its first 24 games of the season. The Seminoles have 101 steals more than Wake Forest who has earned a total of 122 steals in its first 24 games of the season.

99 Senior Trent Forrest enters Saturday's game against Syracuse looking to become the winningest senior in school history with 99 wins during his career. Terance Mann (2016-19) currently holds the school record for wins as four-year senior with 98.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN...

...Free throw shooting percentage with a .769 mark through its first 24 games of the season. The Seminoles led the ACC in free throw shooting in both the 2007 (.758) and 2008 (.773) seasons;

...Steals with a 9.3 steals per game average through its first 24 games of the season. The Seminoles led the ACC in steals in 2012 with a 7.6 steals per game average;

...Turnover margin with a +4.2 margin through its first 24 games of the season. The Seminoles are looking to lead the ACC in turnover margin for the first time since joining the league for the 1991-92 season.

NOTING ANTHONY POLITE FROM THE BOBUSPHERE

Redshirt junior Anthony Polite enters Saturday's game against Syracuse ranked third amongst his Florida State teammates with his career-high 27 made 3-point field goals. He made his career-high of four shots from long distance in Florida State's victories over Clemson (December 8) and at home against Virginia (January 15). Polite has already made 16 more 3-point field goal and is shooting 10 percentage points higher from the 3-point line than he did as a redshirt freshman.

RayQuan Evans – “My full name is RayQuan Ethan Evans. My dad took the name of one of the singers, Raekwon, from the 1990's band Wu Tang Clan, and put his own spin on the spelling for my first name. Ethan, from the Bible, came from my mom. The name Ethan means strong, firm and long-lived.”

RaiQuan Gray – “My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.”

Anthony Polite – “My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather.”

Trent Forrest – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

Balsa Koprivica – “My name comes from the ancient Serbian King Balšić and his family. The Balšićs were a noble family that ruled from 1362 to 1421, during and after the fall of the Serbian Empire. Balsa also means strong and well built.”

Malik Osborne – “My full name is Malik James Osborne. Malik comes from a close friend of my father and James from my father.”

M.J Walker – “My full name is James Michael Walker, Jr. I am named after my father who is James Michael Walker, Sr.”

Devin Vassell – “My full name is Devin Anthony Vassell. I got my first name from my grandmother. My parents were going to name me Anthony, but my grandmother preferred Devin, so that's what my family went with.”

Harrison Prieto – “My full name is Harrison Hansbrough Prieto. I'm named after my great-grandfather, Peter Harrison Hansbrough, but my mom liked the named Harrison more than she did Peter, so she chose to name me Harrison.”

DURHAM, N.C. -- Tre Jones had 13 points for the Blue Devils, who shot 45 percent and hit seven of 17 3-pointers to overcome 21 turnovers to defeat Florida State, 70-65. Duke's defense also gave FSU tough looks and forced Trent Forrest to carry the offensive burden for much of the night for the Seminoles. Forrest finished with 18 points, nine rebounds and eight steals to lead the Seminoles, who shot just 38 percent form the field. Contributions came from throughout the Duke lineup on a quiet night for big man Vernon Carey Jr. Junior guard Jordan Goldwire matched his career high with 13 points on 5-for-5 shooting -- including three 3s -- after coming in averaging 4.0 points. Alex O'Connell had five straight points during a key second-half sequence after FSU had gone up 52-50, then freshman Matthew Hurt went 4 for 4 at the line in the final 11.7 seconds as a clincher.

Early Graduate Trent Forrest Achieving On And Off The Court For Florida State

Trent Forrest has achieved a lot on the court in his Florida State basketball career.

The senior point guard has played a crucial role in the rejuvenation of the FSU basketball program. He's come up big in FSU's deep runs in the NCAA Tournament runs in each of the last two seasons while catapulting his way into the Top 10 in the program record books in career steals (181, eighth) and assists (371, 10th).

If Forrest plays in 34 games this season, he'll surpass former teammate Terance Mann for the most games played in program history.

While accomplishing great feats on the court, Forrest has also been ahead of schedule in the classroom. He's set to graduate Friday with his bachelor's degree in sports management. He'll do so with a 3.46 GPA and in less than four years considering he arrived at FSU in the summer of 2016.

It's a plan that has been in the works dating back to his high school career in Chipley.

"In high school earlier, in ninth or tenth grade, I didn't really think I would be in college classes in high school," Forrest said.

"I had good grades so my teachers and advisors, they went ahead and just put me in those AP classes and I kind of did good in them. It just kind of went from there. My junior year, I had a couple AP classes and then senior year, I had another AP class and I dual-enrolled that year so that put me ahead. When I got here, I was already ahead and now I'm graduating in (three and a half) years so it paid off for sure."

The benefit of being from Chipley, only about 90 minutes west of Tallahassee? Forrest is expecting a big crowd of supporters in attendance for Friday's ceremony.

"I have 20 graduation tickets right now and I may need more, hopefully by Friday," Forrest said.

"It'll probably be a good bit of family and friends there."

None of them may be prouder than his mother, Barbara Lee. Due to her displeasure for traveling, she didn't complain about the fact that her son fell in love with the nearby Seminoles during his recruitment.

"It was indeed such a blessing," Lee told the *Democrat*.

"I did not try to interfere. I pretty much just left it up to him because I didn't want him, down the road, to say he missed out on anything or my intervention and helping him make a decision may lead to regret. I just said you decide where you want to go, we'll pray about that and see if we come up with the same thing and whatever you want to do then I'm supporting you with whatever your decision is.

"When we went over for his official visit. I was really pleased with all of the things that they had to help them as far as academics, personal life...It just seemed to be the total package."

At their busiest, Forrest's school days -- jam-packed with class, studying, projects, workouts, practice and film study -- can exceed 16 hours of constant work.

His mother credits his intrinsic work ethic that has allowed him to perform so admirably on the court and in the classroom.

"With Trent, it just came real natural. To this day, I'm amazed at his discipline academically as well as his work ethic with sports and all," Lee said.

"He still studied, you know, he put the time in studying and preparing for tests and different things, but it really did come naturally for him."

Forrest also credits the ideals instilled into him from childhood about the importance of education. He believes this has played a role in him being an ACC Academic Basketball Team honoree in each of his first three seasons with the Seminoles.

"Sometimes (my family is) more proud of that than anything I do on the court because they stressed to me that's one thing no one will be able to take from you is your education," Forrest said.

"My family, they're very proud of me graduating and all the academic awards I have received."
Lee is equally proud of the things she hears about Forrest from FSU fans each time she visits Tallahassee.

"It never fails when I'm at FSU that someone comes up to me and asks if I'm his mom and just compliments him on how humble he is and how respectful he is," Lee said.

"That makes parents really proud because I knew what he was here, but sometimes kids, they tend to change when they leave home and that has stayed with him."

Forrest's head start and early graduation will allow him to get a jump start on a Master's degree even though he didn't redshirt and will spend just four years at FSU.

Forrest was admitted to FSU's highly-regarded Master's in Sports Management program -- rated the best in the country by *College Choice* -- and will complete one semester of graduate classes in the spring before pursuing his professional career.

"It's definitely hard to get into," Forrest said of the program.

"You have to have the right GPA and then have the right references for people to help you get in. It's definitely a hard group to get in, but our advisors and even having (FSU basketball coach Leonard Hamilton) on my side kind of helped me with that."

He won't finish his Master's before leaving, but he plans to complete it gradually over his professional career through online classes.

That will give Forrest a boost on his post-playing-career plans. He wants to stay around basketball and follow in the footsteps of a few FSU graduates like Jeff Peterson, assistant general manager for the Brooklyn Nets, and Luke Loucks, player development coach for the Golden State Warriors.

"Either GM or coach, just something to keep me around basketball definitely would be the plan."

The Art Of The Scout: The Work Behind Florida State Basketball's Run Of Success

NCAA Tournaments, which has only happened one other time in program history (1991-1993). If FSU wins a NCAA Tournament game this season, it would be the first time FSU has done so in four straight seasons.

Since the beginning of the 2016-2017 season, FSU has the second best winning percentage in program history (75.2%) behind the four-year run from 1969-1972 (76.6%).

The Seminoles have only been to the NCAA Tournament in four straight seasons one time (2009-2012), which also came under FSU coach Leonard Hamilton. It's almost a guarantee that FSU will tie that record this season.

FSU's success has come from how connected every part of the program is.

The players that have been at FSU the past few years -- such as Terance Mann, Dwayne Bacon, and Mfiondu Kabengele -- have helped take FSU's program from an after-thought in the college basketball world to a major contender.

But most people don't realize the importance of the men behind the players.

The assistant coaches put in an incredible amount of work at FSU to make sure the players have everything they need to succeed to be prepared for every opponent they face.

"You're only as good as your staff," FSU assistant coach Charlton Young told the *Democrat*.

"If you're going to win at this level, you can't do it by yourself. That's recruiting, coaching, player development. We got a whole team of people working together here in every aspect of the program. That's the way he has it set up."

The work done to prepare a game plan for an opponent is commonly referred to as a "scout."

Hamilton comes from the Joe B. Hall school of scouting from his time as an assistant coach under the legendary Kentucky head coach. There, Hamilton learned to split up the scouting between his assistant coaches, which he has carried over to his time at FSU.

This form of scouting requires a lot of trust in the assistant coaches, but pays off immensely due to the level of detail that it allows the coaches to bring for each game.

Assistant coaches Stan Jones, Young, and Steve Smith all get 10 games to scout for each to share the load during the season.

How much work goes into a scout?

The amount of work each coach spends on a scout differs for each coach.

Jones has worked with Hamilton for almost the entirety of his career and was recently inducted in the College Basketball Assistant Coach Hall of Fame for his efforts.

One of the reasons why he's been so successful as an assistant coach is his ability to scout opponents. Jones always has the scout when the Seminoles play Virginia. FSU has won four of the last six meetings against the Cavaliers, and gave UVA its last loss of the season before their national championship run in the ACC Tournament last year.

He has a folder a few inches thick with notes for FSU's upcoming game against the Cavaliers on Jan. 28. Then there's the notebook that he has with drawings from FSU's win against UVA on Jan. 15.

"Usually it's as a four to five game thing for me and, sometimes, if it's a team I'm not used to having scouted out, I go seven, eight, or nine times just to make sure I'm not missing anything with what they're trying to do to make sure I'm getting an accurate evaluation with my eyes," Jones said.

It's not much different for Young, who has coached at FSU since 2013.

He watches their previous five games prior to playing FSU and the games that they played against FSU this season or last season. He also watches any big losses that they've had this season.

"That may give us their kryptonite," Young said.

"You know, this is the way to play this team, but within our system. It has a big impact on the game."

Smith is the newest addition to the FSU staff taking over for Dennis Gates, who is now the head coach at Cleveland State.

Smith had the scout for the Seminoles' game against Notre Dame at 8 p.m. Saturday at the Tucker Civic Center. He goes in-depth when scouting an opponent, but all games are not created equal for him. Notre Dame played Syracuse Wednesday, but watching that game wasn't much help scouting the Fighting Irish because of how fundamentally different the Orange are from FSU in terms of scheme. Syracuse is known for its zone defense, while FSU plays man-on-man.

"I'll probably watch every game they've played this year," Smith said.

"And I'll watch the games that they played against us last year. And, if there's another team maybe they played in a tournament or something that plays similar to our style of play, I'll try to watch that. So, it could be anywhere from 10 to 15-20 games that you try to watch to really get a feel for what they're doing and how they try to do with their tendencies...

"You try to spend more time on something else with a team that's going to defend more like you're going to defend."

What do they look for?

Each coach has a different idea of what the most important thing that they look for is when they're scouting an opponent. But they all lead back to the same point.

Figuring out a way to exploit what the opponent is doing and find a way to beat it.

"You first have to figure out what they do really well and what they don't do really well," Jones said.

"So when I got to a scout, I try to watch a game that they won that they probably shouldn't have and a game where they lost and probably shouldn't have lost. Watch games that play similar to how we play to try to formulate the tendencies and frequencies of what they're going to try to do."

Young's first look is all about finding different ways that FSU's system can exploit what the opponent's system likes to do.

Most teams have a fundamental style of play that they adhere to, and it's his job to break down ways to make the Seminoles' offensive and defensive systems work against them.

"It's very important that you try to make sure people don't beat you with what they practice," Young said.

"That's the most important thing about putting a scout together because most of these guys in the ACC are big-time programs with big-time coaches, and they have a system. If you allow them to do what they do, most likely you're going to lose. So you got to make sure that you stay within what you do because you don't want to be doing something totally different for each game."

Notre Dame has made the 31st most three-point shots in the country so far this season (180) on 529 attempts. The Fighting Irish live by the three.

But when do they take those shots? Do they run ball screens to get guys open? Is it all about driving the lane to pass it back out to the open shooter when a defender comes to help in the paint?

All of that and much more are things that the coaches have to look for when it comes to a scout.

"I try to figure out how do we guard them differently to take them out of that," Smith said.

"How are they going to try to expose us defensively because they're going to watch film too, and they're going to see our defensive tendencies? So, I've got to try to come up with a sort of a chess game, so to speak. What are they going to do to us to try to get those threes?"

"How can I have our guys prepared and know what to look for, even though it may be something that they hadn't shown yet but they're going to show it against us?"

Can't be cookie-cutter

The offensive and defensive systems that FSU runs are set, but that doesn't mean that they can't be flexible to allow for changes in opponents.

The Seminoles are going to have to change the way they play defense against Notre Dame because its offense isn't about driving to the basket to get layups. It's about driving to draw defenders to open up the shooters on the perimeter.

FSU plays a lot of help defense, which would play right into the Notre Dame's strategy. So the Seminoles will have to go against their tendencies at times to adapt to the opponent.

"Every scout and every game plan has a very organic nature to itself," Jones said.

"You've got to figure out what the soil is, you've got to figure out what the weather is going to be, and you've got to put that seed in the ground and cultivate it to make it grow and take on its own identity. I really think if you try to cookie cutter and just have one set style of things you're going to do every game, I think you become very predictable and then you're easy to scout against."

FSU's ability to adapt is one of the main reasons for the success that the program has had over the years.

The Seminoles have played against some of the best players in college basketball in recent years in the ACC or NCAA Tournaments.

Sometimes a player is so good and so important to a team that the game plan requires a lot of focus on that player. When FSU played Murray State in the NCAA Tournament last season, the game plan was to focus on the players around guard Ja Morant. It worked and FSU routed MSU on the way to the Sweet 16, even though Morant had 28 points.

Then there are other players like former North Carolina State guard Dennis Smith. FSU took the strategy of making it very difficult for him to touch the ball anywhere in the half-court.

Both strategies worked because they were specifically tailored to the other team, while also allowing FSU to stick to what it does best.

"With Morant, he was so ball dominant that it was almost impossible to keep the ball out of his hands," Young said.

"With Dennis Smith, the game plan was, 'They're Dennis Smith and the miracles, but they will be just the miracles tonight.' We short-stopped the ball. We made every catch tough. We played no catch in the half court. If he got it in the frontcourt we went back and trapped him.

"Some teams play with a quarterback like Tom Brady or Eli Manning. So you go into those teams that play with a ball-dominant guy. And you make the quarterback play wide receiver and we're going to make the running back the quarterback. That type of mentality. Make somebody else facilitate and initiate the offense."

Taking the plan to the man in charge

Just because the assistant coaches are in charge of each scout doesn't mean that Hamilton isn't involved.

"He watches it on his own, just as much as we do," Young said.

"So if I watch 10 games two to three times, he probably watched at least six to eight. So he has a pretty good feel also."

The coach in charge of the scout has to bring it to Hamilton for the final review. Sometimes Hamilton will make changes or take things out entirely.

But he's always willing to listen to his assistants when they feel strongly about something.

"Chief is the guy when you put your game plan together, you have to go sit in front of the professor and he's going to put the red ink on it. 'We aren't doing at that. Nope. Like this. Do we need to change that?'" Young said.

"And most of the time he wants to be in a debate. He wants to see how strong you feel on a subject. Because if you stand on your soapbox he'll go with it. Sometimes even if he doesn't want to. But you better have a lot of data and you better have a strong conviction about why we're playing this team this way."

Once Hamilton approves the scout, only then will the coach be able to present it to the team.

It takes hours and hours of work to even get to this stage, and then the coaches have to be able to teach it in a way that the players can understand and execute it.

But the results have paid off with the success that the Seminoles have had in recent years.

"If you look at what we've done in terms of overtime games, close games, our record at home, or versus the league, all this because our staff," Young said.

"All down the line, coach Jones, coach Smith, myself, coach Gates when he was here. It shows you we are very strong in terms of put together game plans."
