FLORIDA STATE EARNS TOP SEED IN ACC TOURNAMENT; EARNS DOUBLE BYE IN TOURNAMENT

Florida State, which has set school records for regular season wins with 26 and ACC regular season wins with 16, will play either eighth-seeded Clemson or ninth-seeded Miami in the first quarterfinal of the ACC Tournament on Thursday, March 12, 2020 at 12:30 p.m. at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. The Seminoles are the No. 1 seed in the tournament for the first time in program history by virtue of winning the regular season championship with its 16-4 record in ACC play. The Seminoles won six of their last seven ACC games to close the regular season as the only team in the ACC with 16 conference wins during the 2019-20 season. The Seminoles earned winning streaks of 10 games (December 17 through November 30), seven games (November 10 through November 30) and four games (February 15 through February 24). The winner of Thursday's game between Florida State and Miami/Clemson will meet the winner of Thursday's game between either Wake Forest, Pitt, NC State or fourth-seeded Duke on Friday at 7:00 p.m. at the Greensboro Coliseum.

16 GAME WINNERS IN ACC PLAY

Florida State, which won the ACC regular season title with a 16-4 record in league play, is just the sixth team in ACC history to win 16 conference games in the regular season. Most recently, Virginia and North Carolina won 16 games (both the Cavaliers and the Tar Heels finished with identical 16-2 records) during the 2019 season. Virginia won an ACC record 17 games in 2018 and won the ACC Tournament title with a win over North Carolina in the ACC Championship game.

HAMILTON NAMED ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Leonard Hamilton, who led Florida State to its first ever regular season ACC Championship, was named the 2020 ACC Coach of the Year. It marks the third time Hamilton has been named the ACC Coach of the Year. He was also named the ACC Coach of the Year in 2009 and 2012. Hamilton has led the Seminoles to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 record in ACC play. The 26 wins for the Seminoles are a regular season school record, as are the 16 ACC wins. Florida State leads the ACC with four victories over ranked teams this season including two over Louisville, which finished in third place in the league standings. Hamilton is one of nine coaches in ACC history who has won the ACC Coach of the Year honor three or more times.

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HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST COACHES IN ACC

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the 2020 ACC Tournament as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY

With 170 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including the Seminoles' 16 ACC victories this season, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 170 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE PICKED FIFTH IN ACC STANDINGS AT OPERATION BASKETBALL

Florida State was picked to finish in fifth place in the 2019-20 ACC standings by the attending media at ACC Operation Basketball on Oct. 8, 2019 in Charlotte. The Seminoles were projected to finish fifth behind Duke, North Carolina, Louisville and Virginia and did not receive a single first place vote in the preseason predicted order of finish.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES UNDEFEATED AT HOME FOR SECOND TIME IN LAST FOUR YEARS

Florida State finished its season as the only undefeated team at home in the ACC with a 16-0 record. The Seminoles are the first conference team since the 2016-17 season (when Florida State and North Carolina) and the only ACC team to finish undefeated at home in two of the last four seasons. Florida State has won 65 of its last 68 games (.956 winning percentage) at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters the 2020 ACC Tournament ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press and No. 4 in the USA Today's Coaches poll. The Seminoles' No. 4 ranking is their highest of the season and highest for the program since the consecutive weeks of December 5 and December 12, 1972 when they were ranked No. 2 nationally. Florida State is the highest ranked team in the ACC and has spent a school-record nine consecutive weeks this season ranked inside the nation's top-10. The Seminoles' entered the top 10 (at No. 9) for week 11 of the NCAA basketball season – and haven't moved out of the top-10 since.

FLORIDA STATE – FROM UN-RANKED TO NATIONALLY RANKED

Florida State began the 2019-20 season in a familiar position – unranked (28th) and enter the 2020 ACC Tournament in another familiar position – nationally among the nation's top teams. The Seminoles begin play in Thursday's Quarterfinal game of the 2020 ACC Tournament ranked No. 4 in both of the major college basketball polls. Under Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have been ranked within the nation's top 10 in three of the last four seasons and finished the 2018-19 season ranked No. 10 nationally in the final AP Poll of the season.

HAMILTON NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR WERNER LADDER NAISMITH COACH OF THE YEAR

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton has been named a semifinalist for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year Award. He is joined by John Calipari (Kentucky), Patrick Chambers (Penn State), Scott Drew (Baylor), Brian Dutcher (San Diego State), Mark Few (Gonzaga), Anthony Grant (Dayton), Greg McDermott (Creighton), Bruce Pearl (Auburn) and Mark Pope (BYU) as semifinalists for the award.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

Including its 80-75 overtime victory over Louisville on February 9, 2019 in Tallahassee, Florida State has won nine consecutive overtime games. During that stretch of nine consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one from the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last nine overtime foes by a 124-76 margin.

SEMINOLES IN OVERTIME IN ACC PLAY

Florida State has won 10 consecutive overtime games against teams from the ACC. In addition to its streak of nine consecutive overtime wins, Florida State defeated Maryland, 73-70, on January 17, 2009 to begin its streak of 10 consecutive wins in overtime against teams from the ACC. The Seminoles have won two straight ACC Tournament overtime games with wins over Clemson (87-85) on March 4, 1999 and more recently over Virginia Tech (65-63) on March 14, 2019 at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte)

As the best month of the year begins and Florida State plays its third game in March, the Seminoles have played well in the third month of March in recent years. The Seminoles are 2-0 this year in March, and are 13-4 in the last three seasons in March. The Seminoles are 6-0 in the month of March in regular season ACC games in the last three seasons.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.455 Junior M.J. Walker is shooting .455 from the 3-point line (five of 11) in the last two games.

.786 Freshman Balsa Koprivica is shooting .786 percent from the field (11 of 14) in the last seven games. He was a perfect six of six from the field and scored his career-high of 15 points in Florida State's victory over Boston College on Saturday.

.833 Graduate student and All-ACC Second-Team selection Trent Forrest is shooting .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) in the last five games. He was a perfect three of three in Florida State's victory over Louisville on February 24.

1 Graduate student Trent Forrest will be presented with the Skip Prosser Award as the ACC's Outstanding Men's Basketball Student Athlete prior to the Seminoles' game on Thursday in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament.

1 Graduate student Trent Forrest is the only player to start every game for the Seminoles during the 2019-20 season.

1 Graduate student Trent Forrest has been celebrated nationally for his one handed slam dunk with 1:58 remaining in Florida State's victory over Louisville on February 24. Forrest's dunk was named as the No. 1 Play of the Day on ESPN's SportsCenter on February 24.

6 Junior RayQuan Evans was credited with a career-high six assists in Florida State's victory over Boston College on Saturday in Tallahassee.

11.5 Freshman Patrick Williams has scored 115 points in the last 10 games and is averaging 11.5 points scored per game since scoring 14 points in Florida State's victory over North Carolina. He has scored in double figures in seven of his last 10 games.

13 Florida State enters the 2020 ACC Tournament with victories over 13 ACC Teams: Boston College, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Louisville, Miami, North Carolina, NC State, Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Syracuse, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.

14 Redshirt sophomore Malik Osborne enters the 2020 ACC Tournament with 23 blocked shots – just one below his career-high of 24 which he set during his freshman season at Rice (2017-18).

TRENT FORREST BY THE REALLY, REALLY GREAT NUMBERS

Senior Trent Forrest enters the 2020 ACC Tournament with 1,143 points (33rd in Florida State history), 562 rebounds (20th in school history), 455 assists (fifth in school history) and 224 steals (third in school history). And when Forrest hit a short jumper with 8.4 seconds left for Florida State's last lead, Dawes' basket gave Clemson the win.

Florida State's Men's Basketball Coach Leonard Hamilton: 'I Was Built For This.'

Leonard Hamilton doesn't consider himself a trailblazer.

This shouldn't come off as a surprise to those who know the Florida State men's basketball coach well.

Throughout his extensive career, the 71-year-old Hamilton has played a critical role in breaking the color barrier both as a player and a coach.

He prefers to look at what he's accomplished in a different way, though.

"I've always been reluctant to put labels. Some kinds of labels mean certain things to different people," Hamilton told the *Democrat*.

"I just think I was very fortunate to come along at a time when opportunities were not as available for African-American guys, but I always seemed to have been able to slide into situations that were available.

"I've always felt a hedge of protection around me. I've always felt that my steps have always been ordered...I was built for this."

Hamilton enters No. 6 FSU's (24-4, 14-3 in ACC) road game at Clemson (14-13, 8-9 in ACC) Saturday at 2 p.m. with 558 career wins. He's actually won 580 games but lost 22 wins from FSU's 2006-07 season as part of an academic scandal.

Of those 558 wins, 358 have come at FSU during his 18 seasons.

Should Hamilton reach the 600-win mark over the coming seasons, he'll join rare company as just 37 Division-I coaches have won 600-plus games in college basketball history. A far smaller subset of that 37-person group are minority coaches.

Hamilton may downplay it, but his career has put him among the winningest black coaches in college basketball history.

Considering Hamilton's background, this would be an accomplishment that is almost impossible to believe.

MEAGER BEGINNINGS

Hamilton grew up in segregated Gastonia, North Carolina, the oldest child of two parents who both dropped out of high school by 10th grade.

While this was his parents' lot, they made sure to demand better of their children.

"Because of the lack of opportunity for them because they didn't have the education, they were always emphasizing that I needed to get my education," Hamilton said.

"They had absolutely no money to participate so I had to figure out a way how to get it done myself."

Hamilton explored the possibility of an athletic scholarship but ended up set on joining the Army after graduating from Highland High School. An encounter with a persistent basketball coach in his hometown changed this, sending Hamilton down the path he's paved.

"Right before I enlisted in the Army, they decided to start a basketball program at the community college right outside of Gastonia in Dallas, North Carolina, about five, six miles from my home," Hamilton said.

"A guy named Pete Brooks, they'd given him the responsibility of starting a basketball program so he was trying to get as many of the local guys in the area that he thought was pretty good players to come to school and obviously, I was one of them.

"I really had made my mind up I was joining the Army. I really had. He kept running around the town looking for me and I actually was avoiding him because I was going to the Army, I didn't need to talk about going to Gaston Community College. But then when he finally caught up with me, he kind of convinced me this was the way to go. So, we started that basketball program, the first basketball program at Gaston Community College."

Hamilton was one of a few black players selected to help break the color barrier as a member of the Gaston basketball team in 1966.

With this responsibility came unfortunate adversity.

"There were a lot of issues during that time. It was a lot more challenging than what people probably would think.

Specifically, I don't think it's healthy for us to get into all the stuff," Hamilton said.

"For me, that was part of just the sign of the times. Colored bathrooms, colored water fountains, certain restaurants you couldn't eat at."

Despite this, Hamilton did well enough in his two years at Gaston -- setting a program-record with 54 points in a single game -- that he was granted the opportunity to break the color barrier among athletes at another school, University of Tennessee Martin.

MR. UTM

Hamilton's second time playing a role in breaking the color barrier among athletes was a far more enjoyable one. It may have helped that there was already a growing population of African American students enrolled at UTM before he arrived in 1969. It also may have helped that a big deal wasn't made of it, so much so that Hamilton didn't even know.

"For me to have an opportunity to go to UT Martin, at the time I went there I didn't even know I was going to be the first black player," Hamilton said.

"I didn't have any idea. I just wanted to go to school, get my education so I didn't know that was the case."

Hamilton played at UTM for just two seasons, but he set a school record that has since been broken with 206 career assists over his time as a Skyhawk. As a senior, he averaged 11.7 points per game and was named a first-team all-conference player.

Perhaps in a showing of how the times were already changing, Hamilton was voted Mr. UTM during his time on campus.

"There was a campus-wide election. The interesting thing is I didn't run for it," Hamilton said

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"It was one of those things that people campaigned for. I didn't even know somebody wrote me in as a candidate. I was a write-in candidate.

"Needless to say, I enjoyed (my time at UTM), it was good for me and I like to think I was good for the program."

EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

Looking back now, Hamilton sees now how these experiences some five decades ago did a great deal in shaping him into the man and coach he became.

"All the experiences that I've had, the good, the bad, have helped me grow, be aware of things and be more qualified to be successful," Hamilton said.

"I've gained a lot of wisdom through the process, the journey. I think it prepared me to be more understanding, more patient, more tolerable of people. I've had a great experience in coaching, dealing with different kids from different homes, different ways of life. It's been a very unique ride for me."

Those around him on a daily basis will tell you he was, in many ways, the perfect person to blaze the path he did.

"He's kind of that guy right now that people kind of look up to, that last bastion of those people that had to pull themselves up by their bootstraps, become a self-made man in this business," FSU assistant coach Stan Jones told the *Democrat*.

"I don't think we have enough of that in our society today in all walks of life. I don't think we have enough people teaching people how to build a life right. Everybody expects they're entitled to it. A lot of people need to study coach Hamilton an awful lot more than they're doing."

Another FSU assistant, Charlton "C.Y." Young, credits Hamilton with a trait he has a great appreciation for as he looks to build it in himself.

"I've always been in a situation where I was fighting for respect as a player, fighting for respect as a coach. When you come out of that environment where you gotta fight for everything, you take a lot of things personal and you don't have control of your emotional intelligence at all times," Young told the *Democrat*.

"J. Leonard Hamilton is a man that is always in control of his emotional intelligence. That's amazing. I still have a long way to go, I'm not there yet. He is so special and so good that he doesn't take anything personal."

FROM MENTEE TO MENTOR

Hamilton creates a number of his predecessors among black coaches for paving the path to him being where he is today.

Hamilton got his start in coaching as an assistant coach at Austin Peay from 1971 through 1974 and then at Kentucky -- as the school's first African-American coach -- from 1974 through 1986.

While growing through the ranks, he idolized the likes of John Thompson -- the first black coach to win a major collegiate national championship at Georgetown in 1984 -- and George Raveling, who won 335 games between 1972 and 1994 at Washington State, Iowa and USC.

"They influenced me from afar and then later on, as I got to know them, they were my mentors," Hamilton said.

"Guys who helped me whenever I got stuck in situations, they kind of nurtured me along and gave me the benefit of their wisdom they'd gained from experience."

As Hamilton has become one of the veteran African-American college basketball coaches, he's become one of the premier coaches the next generation of minority coaches admires.

"I've told a lot of young minority coaches, 'You need to make sure you get to know coach Hamilton because he understands this business better than anybody I've ever seen or heard from all perspectives,'" Jones said.

"I certainly think his demeanor and competitive spirit, but also his humility (have allowed him to be successful.) And then you throw in the high level of intelligence he has, I think all those things wrapped into one has allowed him to be the success he's been at every level that he's been at."

LOOKING AHEAD

Asked about his window for a possible retirement on a recent ACC coaches teleconference, Hamilton laughed, saying that he plans on sticking around for a while.

However, whenever he does decide to hang it up, he'll be leaving a much different college basketball than the one he got involved with back in the 1960s.

At the beginning of the 2019-20 season, 14 of the 75 (18.7%) of the head coaches in the six power conferences were black.

This number is an example of where Hamilton believes there's still room for more progress. He hopes his example - and the success he's found -- paves the way for a greater diversity.

"There's no doubt that things have progressed tremendously and we've still got a long ways to go," Hamilton said.

"I was just very fortunate to have myself ordered where I got into situations that that were healthy for me to progress and be prepared to do what I do. I think all the experiences that I've had, good, bad and different, have prepared me to be understanding and patient with people, but also be thorough and also be aware that you can't take things for granted.

"I've had a lot of experiences that sometimes I think I was prepared to deal with where I think God put me in the right spot to deal with some issues, to open up doors for more people."

Kentucky, Joe B. Hall And 'Divine Intervention' Saved Leonard Hamilton's Coaching Career

Leonard Hamilton's ties to the Bluegrass State run deep.

It's not just Joe B. Hall, although the former Kentucky coach is the biggest reason why it all happened. When you spend as long as he did in one place, he said, part of you never leaves.

"I was there for 12 years," Hamilton said last week, ahead of Monday's game between his Florida State team and Louisville. "I still have friends and relatives. My brother just moved from Lexington down here with me, but I have nephews and family members that still live in Lexington. Some of my longtime friends are there, and I stay in contact with quite a few of them on a regular basis — not only in Lexington, but friends all over the state of Kentucky."

Hamilton, now 71, caught up with Hall last time he was in town in January, spending an evening with him and FSU's assistant coaches at a hotel lobby where the team was staying.

They had plenty to talk about — Hamilton spent 12 years as an assistant coach on Hall's staff at UK, from 1974 to 1986, and hasn't had enough opportunities to catch up with him since he left Kentucky. He'd come on the Joe B. and Denny Show when Hall and former Louisville coach Denny Crum hosted a radio show before it ended in 2014, but life as a college basketball coach is busy. There just hasn't been much time.

Still, Hamilton will tell you he wouldn't be where he is today — in his 19th season as head coach at FSU, and leading an Atlantic Coast Conference contender — if "divine intervention" and a call from Hall just days after he'd taken a job as a salesman at Dow Chemical hadn't brought him to the commonwealth 46 years ago.

It was a Monday, his first day at Dow, when his wife let him know Hall had called while he was at work. Hamilton called back that night, and Hall told him he'd been recommended for an assistant coach opening on his staff at UK (Hall had just been hired after Adolph Rupp was forced into retirement).

Hall was out of town but would be in Lexington on Tuesday afternoon and suggested Hamilton come by for an interview Wednesday — Hamilton booked a flight to Lexington out of Charlotte, North Carolina, on Monday, met with Hall that Tuesday evening and was back at work at Dow Wednesday.

When Hall offered the job the next Monday, Hamilton said, he didn't wait. It was lunchtime, but UK's newest assistant coach had somewhere to be.

"I wrote a note — 'to whom it may concern, I resign my position effective immediately. Thank you very much for the opportunity.' I got in my car and moved out of my hotel," he said. "My wife said to me 'I am not driving.' She said 'if you want me to go, I'm riding.' I left one of my cars there in Gastonia (North Carolina) at my family's house and I drove to Lexington."

It was a quick exit, but working at Dow wasn't Hamilton's dream job. Taking a job as an assistant at UK, though, was a step in the right direction. He wanted to be a head coach of a college basketball team — he just didn't think it would be possible.

Hamilton had spent three years as an assistant at Austin Peay in Clarksville, Tennessee, but he said when he asked administration officials if he'd be considered for the head coach opening years later when coach Lake Kelly retired, he was told no.

"The reason I resigned at Austin Peay is I became discouraged that I would not have an opportunity to become the head coach because I was an African American," Hamilton explained. "I just got discouraged and decided that if I

wasn't going to have an opportunity to be a head coach, I needed to go where I could earn my own stripes. I thought that selling chemicals was the way for me to go — and needless to say, God had another plan for me."

"That was a real concern in that era," Stan Jones, FSU's associate head coach who has worked with Hamilton for nearly 25 years, said. "... Coach Hall called him before he got embedded into that job at Dow Chemical, and he immediately traveled up there to meet with Coach Hall and take that job."

Jones didn't work with Hamilton during his 12 years in Lexington. He joined Hamilton's staff during his time as head coach of Miami, following his years at UK, and has been with him nearly nonstop since then — Jones spent one year on Rick Stansbury's staff at Mississippi State, when Hamilton was out of basketball in 2001, but rejoined him when FSU hired him in 2002.

He was with Hamilton when he met with Hall last month. Those years meant a lot to Hamilton, Jones said, and he's spoken about them often as the two have been on the same staff in years since at Miami and Florida State, with a season in between coaching the NBA's Washington Wizards. (Hamilton also served as head coach at Oklahoma State from 1986-90.)

"So many of those players still come through and see him," Jones said. "He talks to them, he talks about them, they call him and ask him for advice on business decisions, on family issues — Melvin Turpin's son Kiel Turpin played for us for four years back in the early part of the last decade. He's just such a great people person. He never let's anybody go that's been part of his life."

Those years in Kentucky shaped Hamilton as a coach. Hall taught him how to handle the limelight, from TV and radio interviews to "preparing for some of the most high-profile games you can think of," and Hamilton watched how he'd connect with recruits and with his players off the court.

"That whole intensity of being in the fishbowl existence and making sure that you're aware of the challenges of being in that position — all those things helped prepare me for whenever the opportunity became available for me to become a head coach and have my own program," Hamilton said.

He learned about the biggest rivalry in the Bluegrass State, too.

Hamilton was on staff with Hall when the Wildcats met Louisville with a berth in the Final Four on the line in 1983. Hamilton and UK lost "the Dream Game," as it's become known, but would go 3-1 in four other games against the Cardinals before he left for Oklahoma State in 1986.

Hamilton knew there was a rivalry between the two schools — his head coach and two players at Austin Peay were from Lexington. But his focus was on the scoreboard, not the name on the other jersey.

"Now, those people who had grown up in Kentucky, they took those games to a whole 'nother emotional level," Hamilton said. "They took it to heights on steroids. It was unbelievable how much emotions went into that game. But for me personally, I had to maintain what I thought was the right focus to not get enamored with the emotional part and just try to be prepared."

"During those days, Louisville had a really, really good team. Coach Crum was doing an outstanding job, and they were unbelievably successful. It was a big game for people in the state, and it took on an almost outstanding intense rivalry that I'm sure people enjoy to this day."

Of course, there's a different rivalry that has Hamilton's focus this week. Florida State hosts Louisville at 7 p.m. Monday night in a clash between two top ACC contenders that will have a big impact on how seeding shakes out in next month's conference tournament.

The Seminoles beat Louisville handily six weeks ago, but the Cardinals showed what they're capable of when they ripped off 10 wins in their next 10 games. Monday's showdown is a heavyweight fight between two teams that could meet again deep in the ACC Tournament.

Win, lose or draw, though, Hamilton said he won't get too high or too low. He's taken the court against Louisville plenty of times over the years — one night won't make or break him.

"I'm not stressed because I realize that my calling is not necessarily to win basketball games as it is to develop young people to their fullest potential," Hamilton said.

"The wins and losses pretty much take care of themselves."
