## FINAL: FSU 56, DUKE 35

- » Quarterback **Jordan Travis** rushed for 90 yards, setting FSU's single-season record for rushing yards by a quarterback (504, Charlie Ward in 1992) with 559.
- » FSU leads the all-time series with Duke 21-0, the most wins without a loss of any current conference matchup in the country.
- » The Seminoles are now 306-99-4 (.748) all-time in Doak Campbell Stadium, including 95-22 (.811) against ACC teams since joining the conference in 1992.
- » Florida State finished the 2020 season with a 3-2 record in Doak Campbell Stadium and now has 45 straight non-losing seasons at home, a streak that began in 1976.
- » The Seminoles' 56 points are the most against an ACC opponent since defeating North Carolina State 56-41 on Sept. 27, 2014.
- » Florida State ran for six touchdowns, which is the most since rushing for six at USF on Sept. 24, 2016. The Seminoles' 346 rushing yards tonight were also the most for the Noles since that perfomance (478).
- » FSU scored 28 points in the first quarter. It was the most in a quarter since scoring 35 points in the second quarter against Delaware State in 2017. It was the most against an ACC opponent in any quarter since 2013 vs. Syracuse, which was also 28 points scored in the first quarter.
- » Florida State grabbed three interceptions, one each by Hamsah Nasirildeen, Brendan Gant and Travis Jay. The three interceptions are the most against an ACC team since snagging three against Syracuse in 2014.
- » Tonight's game marked the seventh time since 2000 the Noles had three interceptions and a fumble recovery in the same game.
- » FSU has 15 successful 4th-down conversions this season, tied with the 2004 team for the most in program records dating back to 1996.
- » Florida State has scored on 11 of its 18 opening drives of a half this season and scored a total of 68 points on those drives.
- » Travis ran for a 27-yard touchdown in the third quarter. He has scored at least one rushing touchdown in six straight games played, the longest streak by a quarterback in school history. In five of his six starts in 2020, Travis has rushed and passed for at least one touchdown.
- » Travis' touchdown pass of 68 yards to running back **Ja'Khi Douglas** was the longest of his career.
- » Douglas scored his first career touchdown on a 7-yard pass in the first quarter. He added a 68-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter, the longest of his career.
- » Running back **Lawrance Toafili** ran for a career-long 73-yard touchdown. He led the Noles in rushing with a career best of 117 yards on seven carries. It was his first collegiate 100-yard rushing game.
- » Running back **Jashaun Corbin** rushed for a career-high three touchdowns, the first multi-rushing touchdown game in his career. With three rushing touchdowns, he finished one shy of the school record, which was done six times, most recently by Cam Akers in 2019 against Syracuse. Corbin finished with 72 yards on a season-high 16 carries.
- » Running back **Treshaun Ward**'s first carry of the season went for a 26-yard touchdown in the first quarter. It was his first career touchdown and longest rush of his career.
- » Safety **Hamsah Nasirildeen** snagged his first interception of the season and now leads the team with four career picks. On the next play, Corbin rushed for a 14-yard touchdown, which tied the shortest touchdown drive of the season in plays and time and was the shortest in yards.
- » Nasirildeen led the Noles in tackles with nine, including 1.0 TFL.

- » Defensive backs **Brendan Gant** and **Travis Jay** each made their first career interceptions. Gant grabbed his in the second quarter, while Jay's was on a spectacular play in the third quarter.
- » Gant also forced his first career fumble on Duke's first drive of the third quarter, recovered by linebacker **Amari Gainer**, which was his first of the season and second of his career.
- » Linebacker Emmett Rice had at least 1.0 tackles for loss for the seventh straight game, finishing with six tackles.
- » Defensive back **Sidney Williams** matched his career high in tackles with eight.
- » Defensive end **Jarrett Jackson**, offensive lineman **Lloyd Willis**, linebacker **Jayion McCluster** and tight end **Carter Boatwright** made their first career appearances as Seminoles. For the season 34 different players have made their FSU debut.
