NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES OPEN SEASON AT HOME AGAINST NORTH FLORIDA

No. 18/22 Florida State, the defending ACC Champion, opens its 2020-21 season as it plays host to North Florida on Wednesday December 2, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' season-opener against the Ospreys marks their latest start since the 1975-76 season when they opened their season on December 2 with a victory over Rollins College. Florida State has won six of its last seven season openers including each of its last seven home openers. Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has won 23 season openers in the last 25 years. Following Wednesday's home game against North Florida, the Seminoles play host to Indiana on December 9 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH FLORIDA – CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays host to North Florida on December 2, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. One of only five games scheduled against teams from the state of Florida during the regular season, the Seminoles are renewing a series that began in 2010 with four games (all Florida State wins) having been played in the series. All four games played by the Seminoles under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton have been played in Tallahassee at the Tucker Center. North Florida Head Coach Matt Driscoll has coached the Ospreys in each of the first four games of the series and knows the Seminoles and Hamilton well. Driscoll spent six seasons as an assistant to Larry Shyatt at Clemson (1998-2003) – a time period when the Seminoles were 9-7 against the Tigers, including four wins in the ACC Tournament. Bobby Keenan, the associate head coach at North Florida, served on Seminole playing and coaching legend Hugh Durham's coaching staff at Jacksonville for five years (2000-05). Bruce Evans, also an assistant coach on the UNF staff, was the Director of Player Development at Georgia Tech (2012-16) when the Seminoles earned a 3-1 mark against the Yellow Jackets.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 65-3 (.956 winning percentage) in its last 68 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against North Florida having won .956 percent of their games (65-3) and .923 percent of their ACC games (36-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles were 16-0 at home last season (including 10-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 23 CONSECUTIVE HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against North Florida having won 23 consecutive games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent victory in Tallahassee came as an 80-62 win over Boston College on March 17 2020. Florida State has won 17 consecutive ACC home games.

SEMINOLES NON-CONFERENCE HOME WINNING STREAK IS NATION'S SECOND LONGEST

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against North Florida having won 38 consecutive non-conference home games – the second longest active streak in the nation. Butler, which has won 58 straight non-conference home games, has the longest streak in the nation.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES SEASON AT 26-5, ACC CHAMPIONS AND RANKED NO. 4 IN ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL

Florida State finished the 2019-20 season with a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 mark in ACC play. The Seminoles' 26 wins is a school record for wins in a regular season while their five losses were the fewest in a season since the 1969-70 season. Florida State finished the season with a school record 16 ACC wins and won the regular season ACC Championship for the first time in school history. The Seminoles' 16 wins is the most wins in an ACC season in Florida State history as they became just the sixth team in ACC history to win at least 16 ACC games in a single regular season. Florida State was ranked No. 4 nationally in the final Associated Press poll and No. 5 nationally in the final USA Today Coaches poll.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE IN THE ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL

Only eight teams since 2000 (including Florida State in 2020) have started a season unranked and finished the regular season ranked in the top five. The Seminoles began the 2019-20 season ranked 30th (also receiving votes) in the preseason before knocking off No. 6 ranked Florida in Gainesville during the first week of the season.

SEMINOLES WIN ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State won the regular season ACC Championship for the first time in school history and was the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament for the first time in school history. The Seminoles were picked to finish fifth in the ACC standings at ACC Basketball Media Day on October 8, 2019 in Charlotte. Florida State defeated 14 ACC opponents in winning 16 ACC games and earned the coveted double-bye in the ACC Tournament. The Seminoles are one of only three teams (Florida State, Duke, Virginia) to have earned the double bye in the ACC Tournament in both 2019 and 2020.

SEMINOLES LAUDED AT ACC OPERATION BASKETBALL

Defending ACC Champion Florida State is picked to finish third in the 2020-21 league standings and newcomer Scottie Barnes was chosen as the Preseason ACC Freshman of the Year in a vote by the attending media at ACC Operation Basketball which was held virtually for the first time. Barnes is a Preseason All-ACC First Team Selection and senior M.J. Walker is a Preseason All-ACC Second-Team selection. Florida State's preseason selection of third in the ACC standings matches the highest in school history. The Seminoles were predicted to finish third in the standings in 1993 (and finished second) and 2012 (and won the ACC Tournament Championship). Florida State was picked to finish in fifth place in 2020 and won its first ever Regular Season ACC Championship with a 16-4 record. The Seminoles' 16 wins set a school record for ACC regular season victories. In earning the third place selection, the Seminoles were awarded 15 first place votes – the third highest first place vote total as one of five teams to earn a first place vote in the voting of 155 media members.

SEMINOLES RANKED NO. 21 IN PRESEASON AP POLL

Florida State, the defending ACC Champion, is ranked No. 21 in the preseason Division I College Basketball poll as released by the Associated Press. It marks the second consecutive season the Seminoles are set to begin the season ranked among the nation's top-25 after starting the 2019-20 season ranked No. 17 in the preseason poll of broadcasters and writers. Florida State is one of four ACC teams in the preseason poll which includes Virginia (No. 4), Duke, (No. 9) and North Carolina (No. 16). Florida State finished the 2019-20 season ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press and No. 5 in the USA Today Coaches poll. The Seminoles' No. 4 ranking was their highest of the 2019-20 season and highest for the program since the consecutive weeks of December 5 and December 12, 1972 when they were ranked No. 2 nationally. Florida State finished the 2019-20 season as the highest ranked team in the ACC and spent a school-record nine consecutive weeks inside the nation's top-10. The Seminoles entered the top 10 (at No. 9) for week 11 of the NCAA basketball season – and did not move out of the top-10 during the remainder of the season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH FLORIDA – THE LAST GAME

Freshman Balsa Koprivica scored a 15 points and was one of seven Seminoles to reach double figures in a 98-81 victory over North Florida on December 17, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. A native of Belgrade, Serbia, Koprivica finished 6-of-8 from the floor and grabbed three rebounds. The Seminoles shot 56.9 percent from the floor, got enough from distance (6-of-19) and outrebounded the Ospreys 39-27. That helped FSU to score 19 second-chance points and finish with 15 more baskets than UNF. North Florida's Ivan Gandia-Rosa accounted for two first-half triples, and he'd go on to finish with four 3s and a game-high 23 points. With 11 players logging at least 10 minutes of game action – and six with at least 18 – the Seminoles led by as many as 21 points in the second half and kept the Ospreys at a comfortable distance during much of the second half.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.774 Florida State has a winning percentage of .774 (24-7 record) in games after a loss in the last four seasons. Only Duke with a .808 winning percentage (21-5) is better than Florida State in the ACC in that category since the start of the 2015-16 season.

.809 Florida State has a winning percentage of .809 (55-13) in the last two seasons. The Seminoles won 29 games during the 2018-19 season and 26 games during the 2019-20 season.

.954 Florida State has a home court winning percentage of .954 (62-3) in the last four seasons – the highest among Power 5 schools and second in the nation only to Gonzaga (.970, 64-2).

4 Florida State is the fourth winningest program in the ACC since the start of the 2005-06 season (Duke (437-104), North Carolina (416-137), Virginia (341-157) and Florida State (337-173). Florida State is just THREE wins behind Virginia in terms of cumulative overall wins since the start of the 2005-06 season.

5 Florida State has earned a school record five consecutive 20+ win seasons (26 wins in 2020, 29 wins in 2019, 23 wins in 2018, 26 wins in 2017 and 20 wins in 2016).

9 Florida State has won nine consecutive overtime games entering the 2020-21 season.

10 Florida State has won 10 consecutive overtime games in ACC play entering the 2020-21 season.

11 With 11 NBA Draft selections, Florida State is among the top 10 schools nationally for total NBA selections since 2010.

WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST TOP SHOOTING GUARD WATCH LIST

M.J. Walker, who helped lead Florida State to the second ACC Championship in school history in 2020, has been named to the prestigious Jerry West Award Watch List by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The award is presented annually to the top shooting guard in college basketball. Walker is one of 20 players – and one of only two from the Atlantic Coast Conference – who will vie for the award. For Walker, it's the second time in his career that he has been named to the Jerry West Award Watch List. He also began his freshman season of 2018 as a candidate for the award.

BARNES NAMED TO BOB COUSY TOP POINT GUARD WATCH LIST

Scottie Barnes, who is set to begin his freshman season at Florida State on Wednesday against North Florida, has been named as one of 20 candidates for the prestigious Bob Cousy Award which is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate point guard by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Barnes is one of only two players from the ACC and is one of only three freshmen in the nation named as preseason candidates for the award. Florida State has been well represented on the Cousy Award Watch List under Hamilton and is staff. Toney Douglas (2009), Xavier Rathan-Mayes (2016) and most recently Trent Forrest (2020) were also candidates for the award.

BARNES NAMED TO NAISMITH AWARD WATCH LIST

Scottie Barnes, who averaged 11.6 points, 6.5 rebounds and 4.6 assists in leading Montverde Academy to a 25-0 record as a senior in 2020, has been named to the watch list for the 2021 Naismith Trophy. The Naismith Trophy has been awarded to the top college basketball player in the nation since 1969. Barnes is one of eight players from the ACC and one of nine freshmen from around the nation on the watch list to begin the 2020-21 season.

BASKETBALL SIGNING CLASS STANDS TALL

Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and the Florida State Men's Basketball team has signed the nation's No. 2 ranked recruiting class which includes five-star guards Matthew Cleveland (6-6, Atlanta, Ga.), and Jalen Warley (6-5, Norristown, Pa.), along with four-star center John Butler (7-1, Greenville, S.C.) and the No 2 ranked junior college player in the nation center Naheem McLeod (7-4, Plymouth Meeting, Pa.). The blue-chip class includes two of the top 24 (Cleveland, No. 20 and Warley, No. 24), three of the nation's top 60 high school players (Butler, No. 60) and a top-two ranked junior college player (McLeod, No. 2). Hamilton and his staff have now attracted seven top-20 recruiting classes since becoming head coach at Florida State to begin the 2002-03 season. These recruiting classes have helped him build the fourth-winningest program in the ACC since the start of the 2005-2006 season. The only three ACC members that have won more in that span are Duke, North Carolina and Virginia, three schools coached by men who have combined to win nine national championships.
