NO. 25 FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO CLEMSON IN SECOND SEMINOLE/TIGER BATTLE OF THE SEASON

Florida State, which has won its last three ACC games by an average of 17.3 points per game, plays host to No. 20/22 Clemson on Saturday, January 23, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' game against the Tigers marks the second meeting of the teams this season following Clemson's 77-67 victory at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. on December 29. Florida State enters Saturday's game following three consecutive victories at home over NC State (105-73, January 13), at home over North Carolina (82-75, January 16) and at Louisville (78-65, January 18). Florida State's game against Clemson in the first of two consecutive home games before a three-game road swing that begins on January 30 at Georgia Tech. The Seminoles' home game against the Tigers marks their fourth ACC home game of the season with five home games remaining on the schedule (one home game, against Duke, was postponed and has not yet been rescheduled). Following Saturday's game against Clemson, the Seminoles play host to Miami on Wednesday, January 27 at 6:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 20 STRAIGHT ACC HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Clemson having won 20 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' ACC winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent ACC victory at home came as an 82-75 win over North Carolina on Saturday in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 33-10 (.767 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 4-1 this season.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 63-15 (.808 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 8-2 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 85 percent of their games with a record of 25-4 (.862 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON NEARLY 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 73-4 (.948 winning percentage) in its last 77 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Clemson having won .948 percent of their games (73-4) and .929 percent of their ACC games (39-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 7-1 at home this season, were 16-0 at home last season (including 10-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in the 2016-17 season.

HAMILTON WITH 74 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters No. 20/22 Clemson looking for his 75th career win over a nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and 55 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State).

FLORIDA STATE'S WALKER APPROACHING 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Florida State senior M.J. Walker enters Saturday's game against Clemson averaging a career-high high 14.9 points per game this season. He has scored 933 career points and needs only 67 points to become the 47th member of the Seminoles' 1,000 career point club. Walker has scored 51 of his 933 career points and averages 7.3 points scored in seven career games against Clemson.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Clemson and gain a win over a ranked Tigers team for the second time since February 14, 2018 when the Seminoles defeated the No. 11 Tigers by an 81-79 margin in overtime at the Donald L. Tucker Center;

...Defeat Clemson and win its fourth consecutive ACC game for the third time in the last two seasons. The Seminoles enjoyed winning streaks of six and four games during the 2019-20 season. Florida State won a school record 16 ACC regular season games, finished with a 16-4 ACC record and won the ACC Championship for the second time in school history in 2020.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Clemson as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 367 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

HAMILTON ON BALLOT FOR NAISMITH HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2021

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, who has won nearly 600 games and who is the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, was named as an eligible candidate for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2021. Hamilton highlights the list of four first time coaching candidates including Ken Anderson (Wisconsin-Eau Claire), Lou Henson (Hardin-Simmons, New Mexico State, Illinois) and Paul Westhead (NBA and college). Hamilton has been named as the National Coach of the Year four times and by four different national governing bodies. He was named the Clarence "Big House" Gaines National Coach of the Year in 2018, the Basketball Times Coach of the Year in 2009, the BCA National Coach of the Year in 2000 and the UPI National Coach of the Year in 1995. Hamilton has also been named the ACC Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2012 and 2020) and the Big East Coach of the Year twice (1995 and 1999).

FLORIDA STATE OFFENSIVELY IN THE LAST THREE GAMES

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Clemson as the hottest team in the league with three consecutive victories over three teams with a combined 10 ACC wins (Louisville, 4; North Carolina, 4; NC State, 2). During that span of three wins, the Seminoles have moved to within one game of the conference lead, they have shot .536 percent from the field, .527 from the 3-point line and .917 from the free throw line while averaging 88.3 points scored per game.

FLORIDA STATE'S IMPROVED SCORING OFFENSE

Florida State has scored 105, 92 and 78 points in its last three games – an average of 88.3 points scored per games. Since their return from having three consecutive games postponed (Duke at home, January 2; at Syracuse, January 6 and at Pittsburgh, January 9), the Seminoles have increased their scoring average by 13.3 points per game. Florida State has shot nearly 10 percentage points higher and scored more than 13 points per game more in its last three games as compared to its first seven games of the season.

...A total of nine players are averaging 11.8 minutes or more played per game through the first 10 games of the season;
 ...A total of four players are shooting 40 percent or better from the field through the first 10 games of the season;
 ...A total of 10 players are averaging 4.0 points or more scored per game through the first 10 games of the season;
 ...A total of 16 players have earned playing time for the Seminoles with 14 having scored at least two points in the first 10 games of the season;
 ...In ACC games only (five of 10 games) the Seminoles have blocked more than three times as many shots as their opponents (25-8);
 ...In ACC games only (five of 10 games) the Seminoles are shooting .849 percent from the free throw line and have missed only 11 free throws in ACC play.

SEMINOLES GOING TO THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

Florida State has won (or been tied) in the rebounding advantage category in each game during its three game winning streak. The Seminoles are averaging 11.1 offensive rebounds and hold an offensive and defensive rebounding advantage during their first 10 games of the season. Florida State pulled down 11 offensive rebounds in its victory over Louisville and pulled down its season-high of 19 offensive rebounds in its overtime victory over Indiana in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (69-67 in overtime, December 9).

SEMINOLES WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF

Florida State has lead each of its first 10 games at the half and has been outscored in only four of 20 halves of basketball in the first 10 games of the season. The Seminoles scored a season-high 57 points in the first half of its 105-73 win over NC State (January 13), scored 50 points in the second half of its season-opening win over North Florida (December 2) and have scored at least 40 points in eight different halves this season.

FLORIDA STATE DEFENSIVELY IN THE LAST FIVE GAMES

Florida State has earned 38 steals (7.6 spg) and blocked 32 shots (3.8 per game) in the last five games. The Seminoles totaled 10 steals in their win over North Carolina (January 16) and blocked eight shots in their win over Gardner-Webb (December 21).

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST GAME

Nick Honor scored all of his 13 points in the second half, including a 3-pointer with 7:01 to play that gave Clemson the lead for good as the Tigers defeated Florida State, 77-67 on December 29, 2020 at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. Clyde Trapp led Clemson with 15 points and Al-Amir Dawes had 11. The Tigers were down 36-29 when Balsa Koprivica had a layup to start the second half. That's when things began to turn for Clemson, as Al-Amir Dawes hit a 3-pointer and Trapp scored three points, tightening the game. The teams traded the lead 13 times over the next 10 minutes, and Koprivica tied things at 54-all. Honor, broke the tie and put Clemson ahead for good with a 3-pointer with 7:01 to play. After John Newman III hit a basket, Honor stole the ball in the backcourt, was fouled and hit both foul shots as Clemson moved ahead 60-54. Florida State (5-2, 1-1) got within 71-65 on Anthony Polite's 3-pointer with 1:45 to go. But the Seminoles could not catch Clemson and lost for the second time in three games. Scottie Barnes led Florida State with 14 points.

Former Billings Skyview Standout RayQuan Evans Thriving On Big Stage At Florida State

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — RayQuan Evans didn't receive much notice before making his first start in the ACC.

"I found out I was going to be starting a couple minutes before the game," Evans told MTN Sports. "It didn't change my mindset. I just had to play my role, move the ball, score when I need to, bring energy, be that glue guy, so that's what I tried to do, just play my role and tried not to change anything."

Maybe the short notice was for the best. The former Billings Skyview High School basketball standout had his best NCAA Division I game, scoring 24 points — on 9-of-11 shooting, no less — to help his Florida State squad roll to a 105-73 win over North Carolina State on Wednesday.

It might have been Evans' first start for the Seminoles since joining the program in 2019, but it was a long time in the making. He said he used last season "like a learning year," and that experience is paying dividends this year. Evans has played in all eight of Florida State's games and is averaging 7.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game. He's doing it efficiently, too, shooting 47.4% from the floor, 45.5% from 3-point range and 91.7% from the free throw line.

"It's been a great journey. Last year I got the opportunity to learn from a bunch of veterans here. Trent Forrest, he's a great point guard, I got to watch him every day, compete with him and be able just to learn," Evans said. "... This year I've been able to apply everything I've learned, just embrace my role and do what I have to do for this team. It's been a great journey, it's been a challenging journey, but it's led me to become the player that I am today."

The player today is living out the dream of the player from years prior.

Evans was a high school star in Montana, bursting onto the scene as a sophomore at Skyview in 2015. As a junior, he helped the Falcons win their second consecutive Class AA state basketball championship. As a senior, he was one of the best players in the state, averaging 18.2 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game and helping the Falcons to a third-place finish at the state tournament.

Evans originally committed to play college basketball at Rocky Mountain College, but he was a non-academic qualifier, which ultimately led him to North Idaho College, one of the premier junior college basketball programs in the Pacific Northwest. He had a stellar two-year career at NIC and became a big-time recruit on the transfer market. The likes of Georgetown, Washington State and Gonzaga showed their interest, but Evans was all-in on Florida State and the ACC.

Now in Tallahassee, Evans has shown he belongs — Wednesday's breakout game being the final point of affirmation. "It felt good. I felt like I showed my teammates and the ACC what I'm capable of as a player, but more importantly we got the win, and that's what I was more excited about," said Evans, a 6-foot-4 senior point guard. "One of our teammates came off the bench, had 18 points, Nate Jack, so I was really just proud of our team and the way we performed. I was just happy for everyone else."

Florida State is 6-2 this season after last year's remarkable 26-5 season where they won the ACC regular-season championship. The Seminoles never got to finish out their postseason, though, as the coronavirus pandemic shut down the ACC and NCAA tournaments.

Since then, the pandemic has continued to take its toll on sports across the country, but college basketball teams are persevering through the season. FSU has had three games postponed, with Wednesday's matchup with NC State marking their return to action and first game of 2021. The Seminoles are slated to host North Carolina at 10 a.m. (MT) Saturday.

"It's been kind of difficult," Evans said of playing during the pandemic. "You're so used to your home environment and on-the-road environments with just loud noises and crowds, and now you're going into environments with no fans at all and all you can hear is each other. It's quite an adjustment, but as long as you just lock in mentally, I feel like you kind of avoid all that, you kind of don't really pay attention to it, and I feel like that's what our team has been doing pretty well, just getting locked into the game and focusing on each other. Whether there's fans or not, we're just going to continue to play how we've been playing."

And all of those games are still broadcast to a national audience, usually on ESPN or the ACC Network.

"At first, it was a different feeling just knowing that this game might be on ESPN, because that's what you dream of as a kid, just playing on TV," Evans said, before adding that that no longer registers.

In fact, having his games available on national broadcasts has become a big benefit of playing at Florida State. Evans' family back in Montana can watch and cheer from afar, and he receives plenty of support from the Treasure State. Social media buzzes whenever he's in action — especially when he has a big game like he did against NC State — though he's not likely to see it.

"I've felt the support ... through high school to now," Evans said. "My mom's always calling me, talking about people are supporting you at home, and you really don't realize until you hear it from other people, because I'm not really on social media much so I don't see it. But I hear it all the time, and it's just a good feeling to know that there's support back home."

The pride works both ways, too. Evans receives the support from back home, but he's embraced the opportunity to showcase his Native American heritage on some of college basketball's biggest stages.

"All of my family back home in Montana are Native Americans. To be able to show people that I'm proud of where I come from, where my heritage is, and to see that this program really takes pride in that as well — like, we have jerseys dedicated to that — it's a great feeling," he said. "I'm very prideful when I wear those jerseys and just wear my Native American culture on my sleeve, so it's a great feeling to be able to represent my home that way."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game. It was the program's fifth-best percentage, spanning all contests, behind a 72.7% shooting performance against Minnesota in the 1979–80 season. Florida State trailed 9-8 before scoring 31 of the next 37 points to take control. Ten different Seminoles scored during the stretch — led by Nathanael Jack's five points. The Seminoles made 20 of 28 field goals (71.4 percent) in the opening 20 minutes, going 7 of 10 from 3-point range. Jack missed just one of his eight field goals and finished with 18 points for Florida State (6-2, 2-1), which also made all 11 of its free throws. The Seminoles have won 19 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Thomas Allen scored 16 points with four 3-pointers for N.C. State (6-4, 2-3). Devon Daniels added 14 points and Jericole Hellems had 12 points and six rebounds.
