SEMINOLES OPEN MONTH OF FEBRUARY AT BOSTON COLLEGE

Florida State, which has won five of its last six games, travels to play Boston College on Tuesday, February 2, 2021 at 9:00 p.m. at the Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Seminoles' game against the Eagles is the second of four consecutive road games. The road swing began at Georgia Tech, continues on Tuesday at Boston College and concludes with games at Pittsburgh (February 6) and at Virginia Tech (February 9). The Seminoles play at home on Saturday, February 13 against Wake Forest. Florida State's four-game road swing marks the first time in its ACC history the Seminoles will play four consecutive regular season conference games away from home. It also marks the first time since the 1982-83 season they will play four consecutive conference road games. While a member of the Metro Conference, the Seminoles played four consecutive road games at Southern Miss (January 29, 1983, 71-65 win), at South Carolina (February 2, 1983, 90-85 overtime win), at Cincinnati (February 5, 1983, 63-48 loss) and at Louisville (February 7, 1983, 89-63 loss). The Seminoles were members of the famed Metro Conference from the 1976-77 season through the 1990-91 season. The Charlie Ward-led Seminoles won the Metro Conference Tournament championship in 1991 and became members of the ACC to begin the 1991-92 season. Following Tuesday's game at Boston College, the Seminoles travel to play at Pittsburgh on February 6, 2021 at 2:00 p.m.

RESCHEDULED GAME AT PITT GIVES FLORIDA STATE FOUR CONSECUTIVE ROAD GAMES

Florida State will play four consecutive road games after having its game at Pittsburgh rescheduled from January 9 to February 6.

FLORIDA STATE HAS FOUND SUCCESS ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

As one of the top two winningest programs in the ACC in the last two seasons, Florida State has a 7-6 record in 13 conference road games during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons. The Seminoles won the ACC Championship with a 16-record during the 2019-20 season – a record which included a 6-4 mark on the road in ACC play. The Seminoles won at Louisville earlier this season (January 18, 78-65) and have five remaining ACC road games scheduled for the 2020-21 season beginning with Tuesday's night's game at Boston College.

HAMILTON ON BALLOT FOR NAISMITH HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2021

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, who has won nearly 600 games and who is the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, was named as an eligible candidate for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2021. Hamilton highlights the list of four first time coaching candidates including Ken Anderson (Wisconsin-Eau Claire), Lou Henson (Hardin-Simmons, New Mexico State, Illinois) and Paul Westhead (NBA and college). Hamilton has been named as the National Coach of the Year four times and by four different national governing bodies. He was named the Clarence "Big House" Gaines National Coach of the Year in 2018, the Basketball Times Coach of the Year in 2009, the BCA National Coach of the Year in 2000 and the UPI National Coach of the Year in 1995. Hamilton has also been named the ACC Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2012 and 2020) and the Big East Coach of the Year twice (1995 and 1999).

FLORIDA STATE'S GRAY IS ON QUITE A TEAR

Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray has scored in double figures in a career-high five consecutive games. He is averaging 15.2 points per game and 6.8 rebounds per game during that span of six games. Gray has scored his career-high of 19 points twice – against North Carolina (January 16) and at Georgia Tech (January 20) during the Seminoles' most recent two week tear in which they won five of six games.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Boston College and win its second consecutive game against the Eagles. The Seminoles defeated the Eagles, 80-62, on March 7, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker in Tallahassee to clinch their first ever ACC regular season championship in the most recent meeting between the two teams;

...Defeat Boston College and win its ninth game in the last 11 meetings against the Eagles. The Seminoles earned a series best six-game winning streak from February 16, 2013 (69-66 in Tallahassee) through February 20, 2017 (104-72 in Tallahassee) and have only lost to the Eagles twice since the 2012-13 season;

...Defeat Boston College and win its seventh ACC game of the season. It would mark the 16th consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at last seven ACC games. Florida State averages 9.8 ACC wins per season since the start of the 2005-06 season which has helped make Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton the fifth winningest coach in ACC history.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game at Georgia Tech as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 370 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Boston College ranked No. 20 in this week's Associated Press poll and No. 19 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Seminoles were ranked No. 15 in both of the major polls during the week of December 14, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 65-16 (.802 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 10-3 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won more than 84 percent of their games with a record of 27-5 (.844 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 35-11 (.761 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 6-2 this season.

SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN SCORING

Florida State, which averages 81.8 points scored in its last eight games, enters Tuesday's game at Boston College ranked first in the ACC in scoring offense -- both in all games (78.2 points per game) and in ACC games only (79.0 points per game). In averaging just under 80 points scored per game a total of six members of the Seminoles' rotation have scored their career-highs for points in a game during the first 13 games of 2020-21 season -- RayQuan Evans (24 against NC State), RaiQuan Gray (19 against North Carolina and Georgia Tech), Anthony Polite (15 against Gardner-Webb), Scottie Barnes (17 against Florida), Nathanael Jack (18 against NC State) and Sardaar Calhoun (15 against Clemson).

SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Indiana, 69-67, in overtime on December 9, 2020 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge for its 10th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories is 11 by Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96).

WALKER ONLY 38 POINTS FROM 1,000 FOR HIS CAREER

Senior M.J. Walker, who has scored in double figures in 10 of Florida State's first 13 games, enters Tuesday's game against Boston College with 962 career points and needs only 38 to become the 47th member of the Seminoles' 1,000 point club.

WALKER IN FLORIDA STATE'S RECORD BOOK

Senior M.J. Walker enters Tuesday's game against Boston College ranked in the top 11 of three different statistical categories in Florida State's record book. He is one of nine players in school history to shoot 80 percent or better from the free throw line; is one of 10 players in school history to have made 150 or more 3-point field goals and is one of only 11 players to attempt 430 or more 3-point field goals.

BARNES A MIDSEASON CANDIDATE FOR THE LUTE OLSON AWARD

Freshman Scottie Barnes, Florida State's leader in assists and its second leading scorer, has been announced as one of 35 midseason candidates for the Lute Olson Award as presented by collegeinsider.com. He is one of five players from the ACC (Barnes; Justin Champagnie, Pittsburgh; Sam Hauser, Virginia; Matthew Hurt, Duke; Carlik Jones, Louisville) and one of only four freshman from across the nation (Barnes; Cade Cunningham, Oklahoma State; Evan Mobley, USC; Jalen Suggs, Gonzaga) in the Olson Award Midseason List. Barnes is also a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards as the National Player of the Year and the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard.

BARNES AS FLORIDA STATE'S FRESHMAN ASSISTS LEADER

Freshman Scottie Barnes leads the Seminoles and ranks eighth in the ACC with a 3.4 assists per game average. He is looking to become the first Florida State freshman to lead the Seminoles in assists since Todd Galloway accomplished the feat during the 2002-03 season. Galloway started only one game on Leonard Hamilton's first Florida State team and averaged 3.3 assists per game. Barnes totaled his career-high of seven assists against Clemson as he continues to prove Head Coach Leonard Hamilton correct -- it doesn't matter if you start, it's how finish.

FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON COLLEGE – THE LAST GAME

Balsa Koprivica scored 15 points, and No. 7 Florida State won its first Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title in school history with an 80-62 victory over Boston College on March 7, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Dominik Olejniczak added a season-high 14 points as the Seminoles had a banner ready to celebrate their accomplishment, which was secured with Virginia's victory over No. 10 Louisville. Koprivica matched his season high in points as both of FSU's 7-footers scored in double figures for the first time in ACC play. Patrick Williams had 10 points and six rebounds. Derrryck Thornton scored 13 points for Boston College. The Eagles shot just 9-of-33 (27%) from 3-point range.

KOPRIVICA NAMED TO ACADEMIC DEAN'S LIST FOR FALL 2020

Sophomore Balsa Koprivica, a Sport Management major, was named to the Academic Dean's List for his work in the classroom during the fall of 2020. It's the second time in his career that he has earned academic honors.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.588 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica shot .538 from the field (20 of 34) and averaged 8.3 points scored per game in six games during the month of January. The Seminoles earned a 5-1 record during the first month of 2021.

.900 Redshirt junior Malik Osborne has made nine of his last 10 free throws and is shooting .900 from the free throw line in the last five games.

.909 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica has made 10 of his last 11 free throw attempts in the last four games. He was a perfect four of four from the line and scored 10 points against NC State and was a perfect three of three and scored nine points against Georgia Tech.

1 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray leads the Seminoles in total rebounds with 79 and a career-high 6.1 rebounds per game. He ranked fifth on the team in rebounds as a redshirt sophomore (3.8 rpg) and was sixth on the team as a redshirt freshman (2.8 rpg).

2 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is averaging a near double double of 14.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in the last two games.

3 Three Seminoles – M.J. Walker, Balsa Koprivica and RaiQuan Gray – are the only Seminoles who have started in each of Florida State's first 12 games of the 2020-21 season.

5 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray has five steals in the last five games including his ACC career-high of three steals against Georgia Tech on Saturday. He enters Tuesday's game against Boston College with 79 steals in 78 career games (1.1 spg).

6 Redshirt junior Wyatt Wilkes has blocked six shots this season including two in Florida State's victories over North Florida and Clemson in Tallahassee. He blocked a total of five shots in his first three seasons and 49 games as a Seminole.

8 Florida State has eight players in its rotation (RaiQuan Gray, Balsa Koprivica, Anthony Polite, Scottie Barnes, M.J. Walker, Wyatt Wilkes, Malik Osborne and RayQuan Evans) who all have experience as starters.

8 Junior Sardaar Calhoun remained perfect from the free throw line for his career during the last three games making all four of his attempts. Calhoun is a perfect eight of eight from the free throw line in the first 13 games of his Florida State career.

10 Florida State is undefeated, 10-0, when it outscores its opponent.

14 Florida State's 105 points against NC State on January 13 marked the 14th time in school history the Seminoles have scored 100 points or more in an ACC game.

GRAY IS QUITE HOT

Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is one of the hottest players in the ACC as he has scored in double figures in five consecutive games and has led the Seminoles to victories in five of their last six contests. His hot streak began with a career-high 19 points in Florida State's victory over North Carolina (January 16) and continued as he matched his career high with 19 points on the road at Georgia Tech on Saturday.

Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray, who totaled a career-high tying five assists to go along with his career-high 19 points in Florida State's victory over North Carolina (January 16), enters Tuesday's game at Boston College averaging a career-high 2.2 assists per game. He totaled two assists on Saturday against Georgia Tech and has earned at least one assists in 12 of Florida State's 13 games this season. Gray already has more assists in 13 games this season (28) than he did in 36 games as a redshirt freshman (27) and is approaching his single-season career-high total of 40 assists in 29 games (1.4 apg) that came as a redshirt sophomore. Gray has totaled 11 assists in the last five games (2.2 apg).

EVANS TAKING A LIKING TO THE STARTERS ROLE

Senior RayQuan Evans is averaging 10.5 points and 23.2 minutes played since being inserted into Florida State's starting lineup on January 13 against NC State. He responded with his career-high of 24 points in the Seminoles' 105-73 win over the Wolfpack. Evans is averaging nearly six points more and exactly five minutes more per game as a starter in six games than he did in six games as a reserve.

RaiQuan Gray Enjoying Breakout Season

There were moments early on when RaiQuan Gray questioned whether he could truly play at this level.

As he redshirted as a freshman, Gray watched the Florida State men's basketball team make an Elite Eight run without him ever stepping foot on the court.

He was too heavy. And in practices, he was routinely having to go up against the likes of Phil Cofer and Mfiondu Kabengele on a daily basis.

It wasn't a great confidence boost.

"It was tough," Gray said. "I'm not going to say it was easy. Redshirting is definitely not an easy thing. I think only the strong survive throughout that process. It was difficult. Some nights, I questioned was I good enough to play at this level."

Gray, now a redshirt junior, remembers struggling with it for a few weeks: "Maybe even a month."

Florida State associate head coach Stan Jones believes it might have been even longer.

"The first third of it, he didn't handle it very well at all," Jones said. "In fact, one day, late December or early January, we were doing our pregame [drills for redshirts] ... and I started the workout and said, 'Dude, you waste 25 percent of the workout before you start buying in because you've got your head [somewhere else]. ... You're wasting my time.'"

Jones told the young forward that if he didn't want to invest in himself, he could just go warm up with the rest of the team before games and not go through the extra developmental drills.

He told him it was up to him if he wanted to get better.

"It kind of clicked home with him," Jones remembered. "And from that point on, he really started locking in and being ready for the workout and squeezing everything he could get out of each workout. And he started seeing results in practice."

Three years later, everyone is seeing the results.

The 6-foot-8 Gray has become one of the most versatile and productive players in the ACC.

There might not be another player in the conference this season that has led his team in scoring (twice), rebounding (six times), assists (twice), steals (six times) and blocks (five times) like Gray has.

"As the young people say in today's basketball jargon, he has a lot of stuff in his bag," Jones said. "He's able to do a lot of things that impact winning. And as he continues to go forward, and if he continues to maximize his development, he's going to be another guy that is going to surprise some people and give himself an opportunity at the next level to carve out a career."

"Because he can fill so many roles for a team."

Gray finished with 19 points, eight rebounds and three steals in the No. 16 Seminoles' loss at Georgia Tech on Saturday. In his last five games overall, Gray is averaging 15.2 points on 58.3 percent shooting from the floor.

He has become an indispensable player for the Seminoles at both ends of the floor, and he's having the type of impact he expected when he arrived at FSU after winning a state championship at Dillard High in Fort Lauderdale.

"It was a lot of thoughts," Gray says of that tough freshman season. "Emotions up and down as far as questioning if I'm good enough or did I make the right choice. Stuff like that. But my coaches, they had a plan for me. And we stuck to that plan, and we just followed it. They guided me.

"It was extremely hard, seeing my teammates and the success we were having (making the Elite Eight). ... I just wanted to be a part of that."

There were many lessons to be learned along the way.

One of the first was understanding the type of effort that would be required to compete against guys like Cofer and Kabengele in practice.

"Phil is a super physical guy. Mfiondu is a super physical guy," Gray said. "If you're not being physical, [then] you're going to get eaten alive. So that kind of helped me change my mentality.

"They brought that fire and passion every day, and I think that kind of trickled down on me. That's what I try to do now."

As a redshirt freshman in 2019, Gray averaged 3.9 points and 2.3 rebounds. As a sophomore, he averaged 6.0 points and 3.8 rebounds. This year, he's averaging 10.2 points, 6.1 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.5 steals.

He's gone from role player to vital starter, while continuing to elevate his game.

Gray admits that he didn't talk much to his friends back home while he was redshirting. He didn't want to answer their questions about why he wasn't playing ... over and over and over again.

"I kept my circle super small," Gray said. "And I focused on what I needed to focus on."

Which was getting in better shape and just, "sharpening everything. Because Coach Ham (Leonard Hamilton) wanted me to play all positions."

And that's exactly what he does.

Gray has played everything from point guard to center this season. He has blossomed into a team leader, and he's become a great teaching tool for other guys who come through the program and may not be happy with their early playing time.

He's a major reason why the Seminoles are 10-3 overall, 6-2 in the ACC and a threat to repeat as ACC champions. Looking back, Gray gives a great deal of credit to Hamilton, Jones and the rest of the Florida State coaching staff. He says they played an enormous role in his development.

He even mentioned former FSU assistant Dennis Gates, who is now the head coach at Cleveland State, for helping him grow.

But, as Jones points out, the lion's share of credit has to go to Gray himself.

"I think RaiQuan Gray is going to be a winner in whatever he decides to do," Jones said. "Because he has a good mind, he has a great heart, and he wants to win. When you put those kind of things into a competitive spirit, you allow yourself to maximize yourself in whatever setting you choose to be in.

"And a few more years down the road, when he's through with his playing career, I'll look back with a lot of pride in how he's taken himself and transformed himself from an unsure young kid into a young man who's going to make a great impact on his family."

Former Billings Skyview Standout RayQuan Evans Thriving On Big Stage At Florida State

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — RayQuan Evans didn't receive much notice before making his first start in the ACC.

"I found out I was going to be starting a couple minutes before the game," Evans told MTN Sports. "It didn't change my mindset. I just had to play my role, move the ball, score when I need to, bring energy, be that glue guy, so that's what I tried to do, just play my role and tried not to change anything."

Maybe the short notice was for the best. The former Billings Skyview High School basketball standout had his best NCAA Division I game, scoring 24 points — on 9-of-11 shooting, no less — to help his Florida State squad roll to a 105-73 win over North Carolina State on Wednesday.

It might have been Evans' first start for the Seminoles since joining the program in 2019, but it was a long time in the making. He said he used last season "like a learning year," and that experience is paying dividends this year. Evans has played in all eight of Florida State's games and is averaging 7.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game. He's doing it efficiently, too, shooting 47.4% from the floor, 45.5% from 3-point range and 91.7% from the free throw line.

"It's been a great journey. Last year I got the opportunity to learn from a bunch of veterans here. Trent Forrest, he's a great point guard, I got to watch him every day, compete with him and be able just to learn," Evans said. "... This year I've been able to apply everything I've learned, just embrace my role and do what I have to do for this team. It's been a great journey, it's been a challenging journey, but it's led me to become the player that I am today."

The player today is living out the dream of the player from years prior.

Evans was a high school star in Montana, bursting onto the scene as a sophomore at Skyview in 2015. As a junior, he helped the Falcons win their second consecutive Class AA state basketball championship. As a senior, he was one of the best players in the state, averaging 18.2 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game and helping the Falcons to a third-place finish at the state tournament.

Evans originally committed to play college basketball at Rocky Mountain College, but he was a non-academic qualifier, which ultimately led him to North Idaho College, one of the premier junior college basketball programs in the Pacific Northwest. He had a stellar two-year career at NIC and became a big-time recruit on the transfer market. The likes of Georgetown, Washington State and Gonzaga showed their interest, but Evans was all-in on Florida State and the ACC.

Now in Tallahassee, Evans has shown he belongs — Wednesday's breakout game being the final point of affirmation. "It felt good. I felt like I showed my teammates and the ACC what I'm capable of as a player, but more importantly we got the win, and that's what I was more excited about," said Evans, a 6-foot-4 senior point guard. "One of our teammates came off the bench, had 18 points, Nate Jack, so I was really just proud of our team and the way we performed. I was just happy for everyone else."

Florida State is 6-2 this season after last year's remarkable 26-5 season where they won the ACC regular-season championship. The Seminoles never got to finish out their postseason, though, as the coronavirus pandemic shut down the ACC and NCAA tournaments.

Since then, the pandemic has continued to take its toll on sports across the country, but college basketball teams are persevering through the season. FSU has had three games postponed, with Wednesday's matchup with NC State marking their return to action and first game of 2021. The Seminoles are slated to host North Carolina at 10 a.m. (MT) Saturday.

"It's been kind of difficult," Evans said of playing during the pandemic. "You're so used to your home environment and on-the-road environments with just loud noises and crowds, and now you're going into environments with no fans at all and all you can hear is each other. It's quite an adjustment, but as long as you just lock in mentally, I feel like you kind of avoid all that, you kind of don't really pay attention to it, and I feel like that's what our team has been doing pretty well, just getting locked into the game and focusing on each other. Whether there's fans or not, we're just going to continue to play how we've been playing."

And all of those games are still broadcast to a national audience, usually on ESPN or the ACC Network.

"At first, it was a different feeling just knowing that this game might be on ESPN, because that's what you dream of as a kid, just playing on TV," Evans said, before adding that that no longer registers.

In fact, having his games available on national broadcasts has become a big benefit of playing at Florida State. Evans' family back in Montana can watch and cheer from afar, and he receives plenty of support from the Treasure State. Social media buzzes whenever he's in action — especially when he has a big game like he did against NC State — though he's not likely to see it.

"I've felt the support ... through high school to now," Evans said. "My mom's always calling me, talking about people are supporting you at home, and you really don't realize until you hear it from other people, because I'm not really on social media much so I don't see it. But I hear it all the time, and it's just a good feeling to know that there's support back home."

The pride works both ways, too. Evans receives the support from back home, but he's embraced the opportunity to showcase his Native American heritage on some of college basketball's biggest stages.

"All of my family back home in Montana are Native Americans. To be able to show people that I'm proud of where I come from, where my heritage is, and to see that this program really takes pride in that as well — like, we have jerseys dedicated to that — it's a great feeling," he said. "I'm very prideful when I wear those jerseys and just wear my Native American culture on my sleeve, so it's a great feeling to be able to represent my home that way."
