"When Leonard Hamilton came to Tallahassee in 2002, he took over a program that had been to one NCAA Tournament in the previous nine years. After reaching the Elite Eight in 2018 and the Sweet 16 in 2019, the Seminoles won their first ACC regular-season title last season. Despite losing their top two scorers plus freshman forward Patrick Williams, who was picked fourth in the 2020 NBA Draft, the Seminoles are ranked No. 11 in the AP poll and closing in on another league title. FSU also has the nation's No. 2-rated recruiting class according to 247 Sports, and because Hamilton usually plays 10 or 11 guys there are plenty of minutes to go around. This week the school rewarded him with a five-year contract extension. In some ways it feels like he's just getting started."

FLORIDA STATE TO FACE NORTH CAROLINA IN ACC TOURNAMENT SEMIFINALS

Florida State, the defending ACC Champion, will make its first appearance in the 2021 ACC Tournament when it faces No. 6 seed North Carolina in the semifinals of the tournament on Friday, March 12, 2021 at 9:00 p.m. at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. The Seminoles are 3-2 in the semifinal round of the ACC Tournament with its most recent victory coming against No. 1 seeded Virginia, 69-59, in the 2019 ACC Tournament in Charlotte. Florida State is 1-1 against North Carolina in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament with a 73-70 win over Tar Heels in 2009 and an 80-76 loss to the Tar Heels in 1992. The Seminoles have been in the semifinals in three of the last four ACC Tournaments (2017, 2019 and 2021). Florida State has played in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament now six times (1992, 2009, 2012, 2017, 2019 and 2021) and have won three of their last four semifinal games leading the Seminoles to the ACC Tournament Championship game for the first three times in the history of the program. The Seminoles have played in the ACC Tournament semifinals now six times with five of those appearances coming under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton (2009, 2012, 2017, 2021). Florida State has advanced to the ACC Tournament championship game three times under Hamilton and claimed the first ACC Tournament championship in school history in 2012.

STRAIGHT TO THE ACC TOURNAMENT SEMIFINALS

When South Carolina left the ACC after the 1971 season and before Georgia Tech joined the ACC for the 1980 season, there were seven teams in the ACC. During that period of eight years, the regular season champion began tournament play in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Prior to the 70's – in 1961 (when North Carolina was on probation) Wake advanced to the semifinals and again in 1991 (when Maryland was on probation) Duke was the regular season champion and advanced directly to the ACC Tournament semifinals. The 2021 Seminoles are just the 11th team in ACC history to begin play in the ACC Tournament in the semifinals.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters the 2021 ACC Tournament ranked No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 15 in the Associated Press poll. It marks the third consecutive week and fifth week this season that the Seminoles are the highest ranked ACC team in both of the major college basketball polls. The Seminoles began the season ranked No. 18 in the Coaches Poll and No. 21 in the AP poll.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the 2021 ACC Tournament as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 375 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE ANNOUNCES CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR BASKETBALL COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State University Vice President and Director of Athletics David Coburn announced on March 1 that Florida State has extended the contract with head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton through the 2024-25 season. "Coach Hamilton has done so much for this basketball program and this university that it is hard to express in words," said Coburn. "What he does with his young men, both on and off the court, is truly remarkable. I know both the President and I regard him as a university treasure, and he is just now getting the national recognition he has deserved for so long. He embodies all the qualities that make a great leader, and we are proud and thrilled to have him as our coach as long as he wishes." Hamilton's student-athlete graduation rate of just over 95 percent at FSU will improve even more as eight members of his current team will earn degrees (seven as undergraduate degrees and one as a graduate degree) this spring. Two more players will earn graduate degrees in the summer of 2021. "I've known Coach Hamilton since he was hired in 2002 when I was chair of the FSU Board of Trustees," said Florida State President John Thrasher. "He exemplifies the best of college basketball in terms of developing outstanding players and great citizens. His ability to perform his job at such a high level of excellence is appreciated by the Seminole faithful, and we're thrilled Coach Hamilton will continue to lead our program."

FLORIDA STATE'S HAMILTON ASEMIFINALST FOR THE WERNER LADDER NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR AWARD

Leonard Hamilton, who has led the Florida State Basketball Team to a second place finish in the ACC standings, has been named as a semifinalist for the Werner Ladder National Coach of the Year award. Hamilton is one of ten semifinalists for the National Coach of the Year award and the only coach on the semifinal list from the ACC. The four finalists will be announced on March 17.

SEMINOLES IN THE TOP FOUR OF THE ACC STANDINGS

Florida State's second place finish in the 2021 ACC Standings marks the second time in school history the Seminoles have finished in the top two in the ACC standings in consecutive seasons (also second in both 1992 and 1993). The runner-up finish also marks the school-record eighth time Hamilton has guided his Seminoles to a top-four finish in the ACC standings. Florida State has won double digit ACC games in three consecutive and five of the last six seasons. Prior to Hamilton's arrival at Florida State for the 2002-03 season, Florida State had won 10 or more games in ACC play five times; he and his staff have led the Seminoles to at least 10 ACC wins eight times since the 2008-09 season.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 70-18 (.795 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 15-5 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 85 percent of their games with a record of 32-7 (.821 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 40-13 (.755 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 11-4 this season.

WALKER, GRAY AND BARNES EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

Florida State's M.J. Walker (All-ACC Second-Team, RaiQuan Gray (All-ACC Third-Team) and Scottie Barnes (All-ACC Third team) earned All-ACC honors while Barnes was named as the ACC Freshman of the Year, the ACC Sixth Man of the Year and to the All-Freshman Team as the individual conference honors were announced for the 2021 season by the ACC. Barnes is just the second player in Florida State history to be named the ACC Freshman of the Year joining Bob Sura (1992) and is the 12th Seminole to be named to the All-Freshman team.

SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 13, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96)

FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH CAROLINA – THE LAST MEETING

Walker Kessler scored a season-high 20 points to help North Carolina beat No. 11 Florida State 78-70 on February 27, 2021 at the Dean Smith Center in Chapel Hill, N.C. The Tar Heels' win gave Roy Williams his 900th career win. Kessler had scored 10 points in each of his last three games, then surpassed that by going 9 for 10 from the field with 14 points after halftime. He also had season highs of eight rebounds and four blocks for the Tar Heels. Trailing 41-29 at halftime, the Tar Heels shot 50 percent after the break. But more importantly, they rode Kessler's production to better production in the paint while cutting down on the turnovers that undercut any offensive flow in the opening half. Kerwin Walton added 13 points for North Carolina, which made all 10 of its free throws in the final 2:15 to stay in control. RaiQuan Gray scored 17 points for Florida State.

SEMINOLES LEAD ALL WITH THREE SELECTIONS TO ALL-ACC TEAMS

Florida State, with three selections to the All-ACC First, Second and Third teams, is the only team with three selections to the 2021 All-ACC teams. The Seminoles' three selections (M.J. Walker, RaiQuan Gray and Scottie Barnes) were the most by any one school and made Florida State one of just three teams (Georgia Tech, 2; Virginia, 2) with multiple selections listed among the top 16 players in the nation's best conference.

Florida State By The Numbers

.402 Senior Nathanael Jack is shooting .402 from the bonusphere (six of 13) in the last four games. He was three of six from long range in Florida State's victory over Miami on February 24.

.778 All-ACC Third Team selection RaiQuan Gray is shooting .778 from the free throw line (14 of 18) in the last three games. He enters the 2021 ACC Tournament shooting a career-high .792 from the free throw line.

2 Freshman Scottie Barnes became just the second Florida State player to earn ACC Freshman of the Year honors. He joined Bob Sura (in 1992) as the only Florida State players to earn the award. Sura earned the ACC Freshman of the Year award in the Seminoles' first season in the ACC (1991-92).

3 Florida State's three All-ACC selections (M.J. Walker, second-team; RaiQuan Gray, third-team and Scottie Barnes, third-team) gave Florida State three of the 16 All-ACC selections in 2021 – the most by any of the 15 schools in the ACC.

3 Freshman Scottie Barnes was named the ACC Sixth Man of the Year in 2021. He became the third consecutive Seminole player to earn the award – Mfiondu Kabengele in 2019 and Pat Williams in 2020 -- both Kabengele and Williams were first round NBA Draft picks.

6 Junior Sardaar Calhoun has made at least one 3-point field goal in six straight games. He is shooting .429 from distance (nine of 21) during that time frame and has made at least two 3-point field goals in three different games (against Virginia, at Miami and at Notre Dame).

8 Redshirt junior Anthony Polite has scored in double figures in a single-season career-high eight games this year including his career-high of 15 points in Florida State's victory over Gardner-Webb on December 21. He has scored in double figures more times this season (eight) than he did in the first two seasons of his career (seven).

9 ACC Freshman of the Year Scottie Barnes has earned nine steals in the last three games (3.0 spg) including his career-high of six steals against North Carolina in the Smith Center in Chapel Hill on February 27.

15 Florida State is undefeated, 15-0, when it outscored its opponent.

23 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica has blocked more than three times as many shots as a sophomore (23) in 19 games than he did as a freshman (seven) in 27 games.

116 Senior M.J. Walker will play in his 116th career game in the quarterfinal round of the 2021 ACC Tournament. He has helped Florida State win 93 games during his career.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S LEONARD HAMILTON

...He is a finalist for the 2020-21 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award as presented by collegeinsider.com. The Skip Prosser Man of the Year award honors those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off the floor as well;

...He is a finalist for the Ben Jobe Coach of the Year Award as presented by collegeinsider.com. The Ben Jobe Award, which is presented annually to the top Division I minority coach, is named in honor of one of the finest men to ever college basketball.

HAMILTON WITH 76 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters the 2021 ACC Tournament with 76 career wins over nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and has 57 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State).

CALHOUN, KOPRIVICA NAMED TO ACC ALL-ACADEMIC BASKETBALL TEAM

Florida State junior Sardaar Calhoun and sophomore Balsa Koprivica has been named to the All-ACC Academic Basketball Team as the No. 2 seeded Seminoles prepare to play in the 68th Annual ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum. It marks the first time both players have been honored as a member of the ACC Academic Team which requires players to maintain a 3.0 academic grade point average for both of the last two semesters and for the players' career.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Florida State, which has held four of its last five opponents below 39 percent shooting from the field, enters the 2021 ACC Tournament as the ACC leader in field goal percentage defense. The Seminoles have allowed only on opponent (UCF) to shoot better than .450 percent from the field during the entire 2020-21 season

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN SCORING OFFENSE AND SCORING MARGIN

Florida State enters the 2021 ACC Tournament leading the ACC in both scoring offense and scoring margin. The Seminoles are averaging a league-best 79.6 points scored per game and with a +9.5 scoring margin. The Seminoles have outscored their first 20 opponents of the season by 191 points (1,592-1,401). Florida State is looking to lead the ACC in both statistical categories for the first time since joining the league for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles averaged 75.4 points scored per game and owned a +9.7 points per game scoring margin during the 2019-20 season. Florida State's school record for points scored per game is 91.7 during the 1969-70 season – the senior season of Dave Cowens who was the No. 4 overall pick of the 1970 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics.

SEMINOLES TAKE OVER ACC BLOCKED SHOTS LEAD

Florida State, which has blocked at least four shots in 17 of its 20 games, enters the ACC Tournament as the ACC leaders in blocked shots. The Seminoles have blocked nearly 50 shots more than their opponents (101-55, +46) and are looking to lead the ACC in blocked shots for the second time in their ACC history.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

With six players who have made at least 10 3-point field goals this season, Florida State enters the 2021 ACC Tournament ranked second in the ACC with a .385 team 3-point field goal shooting percentage. With only two Seminole teams in school history shooting better than 40 percent from the 3-point line, the current Seminoles would rank third in school history for 3-point shooting percentage.

GRAY SCORING AT TORRID PACE

Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray enters the 2021 ACC Tournament having scored in double figures in a personal career-best 12 consecutive games. His streak began with a 19-point performance in Florida State's victory over North Carolina on January 16 and includes double figure performances against 10 different ACC teams – he scored in double figures twice each against both Miami and North Carolina. Gray scored his career-high of 24 points in Florida State's over Wake Forest on February 20 and has scored at least 17 in five different games.

Origin of Florida State's Moniker -- The NewBloods

You see it emblazoned on their facemasks. You hear it when they take to the court. You read it on their social media posts. Like any good mantra, the coaches and players live, speak and embrace it all of the time. It's everywhere. The national media has adopted the phrase. It just might end up being the Webster Dictionary's newest entry.

NewBlood.

It's the term coined by Florida State Assistant Coach Charlton "CY" Young to describe the ascent by the Seminole Men's Basketball team into the hierarchy of the college basketball world. The defending ACC Champions have displayed the consistency and the staying power to have their name spoken definitively among the BlueBloods who have put their stamp on the sport since James Naismith first shot a ball through a peach basket more than 100 years ago.

Historically speaking, there are six BlueBloods: Kentucky, North Carolina, Indiana, Duke, UCLA and Kansas.

The term NewBlood was actually born during a recruiting visit by Young and Head Coach Leonard Hamilton in 2017.

While they were in the home of an official visit with one of the top five players in the nation, Young could feel the recruit's emotions trending to one of the nation's BlueBlood teams.

"For so many years, the term "BlueBlood" has controlled the minds of high school players as well as high school and AAU coaches," said Young. "Coach Hamilton and I were in a players' home, and we both felt that Florida State was the best fit for this young man, and that he was the best fit for Florida State.

"I said to the player, 'everybody is going to tell you to go play for BlueBlood program. I said, come play for Florida State, we are a NewBlood program.'"

When the two coaches walked out of the recruits' home that night, Hamilton knew Young was on to something big.

Though the term became mostly dormant following that recruiting visit, it became an integral part of the Seminoles' program on a team run on the Duke University campus on the morning of December 30, 2017. As Young and strength and conditioning coach Mike Bradley led a group of Seminoles through the packed tent city of Krzyzewskiville and past the famed Cameron Indoor Stadium, he let out a yell that certainly woke up the sleeping Duke students and was loud enough for the entire college basketball world to hear.

He earned his season-high four steals in Florida State's season-opening victory over North Florida (December 2) and has totaled three or more steals four times this year.

BlueBloods? Yelled Young.

NewBloods! Responded the group of Seminoles running in lockstep with the Seminoles now eighth-year assistant coach.

Since that run on the campus of one of the BlueBloods, the cry of NewBloods is as much a part of the Seminoles as their winning culture or desire to be one of the best teams in the best college basketball conference in the nation. It has become a very emotional mantra for the Seminoles; one that serves as a rallying cry that carries them into every game.

The term absolutely evokes emotion from the Seminole players.

"It means that we have established ourselves as a prominent program in college basketball," said redshirt junior Malik Osborne. "It means that we have earned the right to be considered among the top dogs in college basketball, and we're going to fight to the end to protect what we have built."

In the months following the Seminoles' run through the Duke campus, the Seminoles advanced to within seconds of playing in just the second Final Four in school history.

In the two full seasons since Young proclaimed the Seminoles as college basketball NewBlood, Florida State has a 56-13 record, one regular season ACC Championship, two top four ACC finishes and school records for overall wins in a season (29 in 2019) and ACC wins in a season (16 in 2020).

Hamilton is as excited today to lead the Seminoles to a national championship as he has ever been.

"We are motivated by the challenge of wanting to carve out your niche," said Hamilton. "We have decided to coin our phrase -- NewBlood. We are going to carve out our own distinction. We are going to carve out our own path of success. We cannot do anything about the 80-year head start the BlueBloods have on us. We can do something moving forward to carve out our own niche, and we are motivated by that."

The national media has certainly taken notice of the NewBloods in Tallahassee.

"Florida State is officially an ACC power, a 'NewBlood' as Head Coach Leonard Hamilton says, a program that has averaged 26 wins over the last four seasons while competing with Duke, Virginia and North Carolina atop the conference," said Matthew Gutierrez of The Athletic. "Since 2018, FSU has appeared in an Elite Eight and Sweet 16, and the Seminoles were a projected No. 2 seed in the 2020 NCAA Tournament after winning the first ACC regular-season title in program history."

BARNES' ASSISTS TOTALS RISING

Freshman Scottie Barnes totaled his career-high of eight assists in Florida State's victory over Miami on February 24 and enters the 2021 ACC Tournament as the ACC's assists leader among freshmen, averaging 4.3 assists. Barnes totaled seven assists in Florida State's victory over Boston College and has totaled five or more assists in 10 of his 19 games.

Florida State "Newblood" Hoops Program Has Become A National Force

The coach orchestrating one of the nation's most transformational college basketball programs over the last five years can't remember exactly who came up with the term "newblood," but it's a perfect description to illustrate the evolution of Florida State.

Leonard Hamilton certainly didn't wave a magic wand and instantly turn the Seminoles into an ACC or national heavyweight. FSU struggled mightily for what seemed like forever.

It didn't reach the NCAA tournament until Hamilton's seventh season or claim a Big Dance victory until his ninth year. He was labeled an underachieving coach, a criticism not totally without merit, for his first decade in Tallahassee.

But the venerable Hamilton, now in his 19th season, has elevated previously non-descript FSU into the college basketball upper tier. Not where the 'Noles have blueblood status like Duke, North Carolina, Kentucky or Villanova, but he has raised its profile enough where his team is becoming a consistent threat to those traditional powers.

FSU is a relatively fresh face on the national scene, thus its self-proclaimed identity as a "newblood."

"I don't remember exactly where it came from, it might have been [eight-year FSU assistant coach] Charlton Young," said Hamilton. "We're a program that has found ways to emerge in the upper echelon of schools around the country that's being discussed.

"What happens is programs like Florida State, we're still trying to get invited to the party. We have to crash the party, we don't get an invitation. . . . We realize that it's hard to even think that you can overcome 75 or 80 years of successful earned tradition. It gives us a little bit of identity. It's a catch phrase."

For Hamilton, as in similar circumstances with longtime coaches Scott Drew at Baylor and Matt Painter at Purdue, his program has been a gradual build. But it has emerged into an ACC force, with a .685 winning percentage (61-28) in conference play the past five years that is eclipsed only by Virginia (72-19).

During the previous four seasons, Hamilton's team missed the NCAA tournament and never finished above .500 in league play. Since then, FSU has sent eight players to the NBA (five first-round picks) and had it not been for Saturday's 83-73 loss at Notre Dame, the 'Noles would have repeated as ACC regular-season champions despite losing NBA players Patrick Williams, Devin Vassell and Trent Forrest off last year's squad.

It cannot be overstated how rare it is, particularly in a league like the ACC, for a Power 5 school to make that kind of jump in relevance. You also have to credit FSU's administration for showing patience with Hamilton that would have never happened for its football coach.

"What you have to understand is it takes a while," Hamilton said about building credibility in the ACC. "There's a reason why programs need to be rebuilt or rejuvenated or established – whatever the terms you want to use – but they didn't get to be that way overnight.

"Everybody wants to make progress, but nobody wants to go through the process."

Hamilton has raised FSU's profile with a rather unconventional blueprint, often giving significant minutes to nine or ten players. While there's more NBA-caliber talent now coming through the program, the best players are willing to accept reduced playing time and statistics for team success in Hamilton's by-committee system of up-tempo, suffocating defense.

Senior guard M.J. Walker is a prime example of the program evolution. A McDonald's All-American, he signed with FSU after Malik Beasley was a 2016 NBA first-round pick and knowing Jonathan Isaac was on the verge of achieving the same stature. The team's leading scorer (13.1 points per game) didn't start his first year and would probably take more shots playing elsewhere, but Walker likes being in a program where the team's depth and athleticism can wear opponents out.

Last year, before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the ACC and NCAA tournaments, FSU was ranked No. 4 in the country and primed for a shot at reaching its first Final Four since 1972. Missing out on back-to-back league championships hasn't altered that narrative.

"No telling what we could have done if the COVID situation hadn't happened," Walker said. "We had a really good one through five on the floor and a lot of firepower coming off the bench. I felt like we were a Final Four team that could win a national championship.

"We continue to get better. We've put ourselves in a position to be better than last year's team. We have the ability to win it all. What's different about this group is the circumstance. There's a ceiling we still haven't tapped into yet." RaiQuan Gray, Scottie Barnes and Walker might be the biggest FSU scoring threats, but there's no telling on any given night who might emerge. Eight different players have been the leading scorer or tied for it this season, including four on a minimum three occasions.

FSU distributing playing time could bode well during March Madness with more rested starters. The ACC tournament, where the No. 2-seeded 'Noles have a double bye and begin play Thursday, is often tougher to navigate because of familiarity everyone has with each other. But the NCAA tournament format, where FSU's style of play and quality depth makes for a tough matchup against teams outside the league, works in its favor.

The biggest problem for opponents is the Seminoles have found a groove. FSU (15-5, 11-4) has developed a system under Hamilton where players understand their roles and fit the team-first approach coveted by the 72-year-old coach.

"One of the reasons we've been successful is they legitimately don't care who gets the credit," said Hamilton. "We're comfortable now. We're attracting guys who want to be part of the way we play. I'm not trying to put a square peg in a round hole."

Scanning the prospective NCAA field, it's hard to convince anyone that Gonzaga, Baylor or somebody from the Big Ten won't be cutting down the nets.

Just don't overlook a certain ACC newblood. The days of Florida State being a basketball underachiever is a thing of the past.

FSU's Hamilton Belongs In Hall Of Fame

GREENSBORO, N.C. -- North Carolina's victory over No. 11 Florida State last month was notable on two fronts. The performance was the Tar Heels' most impressive of an erratic season and marked the 900th win in Roy Williams' coaching career.

But rather than extol his team or crack wise about his longevity, Williams opened his postgame news conference with a heartfelt endorsement of Seminoles coach Leonard Hamilton for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

The gesture spoke volumes about Williams' grace and the coaching fraternity's esteem and affection for Hamilton. That admiration extends far beyond Hamilton's peers. His professional accomplishments and personal journey are that compelling.

"My path has been different," Hamilton said, "so for me to even be in the [Hall of Fame] conversation is far greater than anything I expected."

This week, for the 19th consecutive season, Hamilton's path brings him to the ACC tournament, an event FSU won in 2012 and was favored to win last year before the global pandemic intervened. Such endurance alone is remarkable, especially in the sport's premier conference, an unsurpassed collection of ruthless programs that have exhausted many a coach's patience and resolve.

The only men to coach in the ACC longer than Hamilton are Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (41 seasons and counting), North Carolina's Dean Smith (36) and Maryland's Gary Williams (22), Hall of Famers all.

Hamilton debuted on the Hall ballot this year but was not among the 14 finalists announced Tuesday. His day should come.

"Leonard Hamilton deserves to be in the Hall of Fame," said Williams, a 2007 inductee. "He's a good friend; he's been a friend for a long time. When I was starting out [as an assistant to Dean Smith] at North Carolina, he was at Kentucky [under Joe B. Hall]. What he's done and his record ..."

Hamilton, 72, grew up poor in Gastonia, N.C., and played two seasons at Gaston Community College before transferring to Tennessee-Martin, where he was the program's first Black player. He transitioned to coaching immediately after graduation, first at Austin Peay as an assistant.

As Hamilton relayed to ESPN's Andrea Adelson two years ago, he began to regret his decision when in 1974 Austin Peay's president told him the university was not ready for an African-American head basketball coach. Hamilton resigned and eventually landed at Kentucky, where in 12 years, the last six as associate head coach, he helped the Wildcats reach three Final Fours and win the 1978 national championship.

Kentucky's success and status led Hamilton to believe that he, too, could lead a ready-made blue blood. A man of deep faith blessed with a wonderful singing voice, Hamilton soon learned God had charted a different course.

"It's almost like the Lord reached down from heaven and slapped me on both sides of my face and said, 'Those well-established, traditional, successful programs with great facilities don't need you. You need to go be a part of building something that's been challenging for other people to build,'" Hamilton said.

A two-time national champion during the 1940s, Oklahoma State had reached one NCAA tournament in the previous 25 years when Hamilton arrived as head coach in 1986. He didn't end that drought, but two NIT appearances in four years earned him another daunting rebuilding task.

Hamilton inherited a Miami program in 1990 with one NCAA appearance in its history, 1960. Even more challenging, the independent Hurricanes were poised to join the Big East.

Their first three Big East seasons were predictably grim, an 8-46 conference aggregate that included an 0-18 finish in 1993-94. During the next six years, Miami went 65-41 in the league, won a regular-season title, earned three consecutive NCAA bids and reached the 2000 Sweet 16.

After an ill-advised, one-year foray into the NBA with the Washington Wizards in 2001, Hamilton returned to the college ranks at Florida State.

"For him to be 72 and still doing it on this level, and how committed he is, just shows who he is as a person and how much he cares about this program and us as human beings," said M.J. Walker, the Seminoles' all-ACC guard. "Age isn't a factor with Coach Ham."

Indeed, we should all look as good at 52 as Hamilton does two decades older. Renowned for size, defense and depth, his program is aging just as well, and he recently signed a contract extension through 2025.

This will be FSU's fourth straight NCAA bid and eighth in the last 12 tournaments. Seeded second this week behind Virginia, the Seminoles have won nine games combined in their last five NCAA appearances.

Hamilton lacks the Final Four affirmation of most college coaches enshrined in the Hall, but so, too, do recent inductees John Chaney and Lefty Driesell. Moreover, his .569 career winning percentage (575-436) and ACC record (165-146) are beyond distinguished given where he's worked.

"He didn't have basketball schools," Roy Williams said, "... but he made every one of them better." He made Walker a better man, jolting the young man from an academic malaise two years ago with a stern-yet-loving confrontation.

"That changed my whole life and mindset," Walker said. "... He wants the best for us in life, so we can be successful young men. That's the thing I respect about Coach Ham."

Hamilton shrugs off praise with a humility rooted in his youth, crediting players, their parents and assistant coaches. "I'm not worried about it," he said of the Hall of Fame. "I enjoy what I do, working with youngsters, trying to create the atmosphere that helps them prepare themselves for life after basketball."

Malik Osborne Is Looking To Create Change On FSU's Anti-Racism Task Force

The intersection between sports and political issues is not a brand new landscape.

In the past, sports figures such as Muhammad Ali, Bill Russell, Jim Brown made their voices heard in the 1960s with the hopes of bringing change to a variety of different social issues.

Recently, Lakers star LeBron James has become an activist on police brutality and racial injustice after the police shooting of Jacob Blake in Wisconsin last summer.

Florida State junior forward Malik Osborne is looking to follow in Ali, Russell, Brown, and James' footsteps as he is already bringing change to the school's campus.

Osborne is one of the 30 members on FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force, which engages the faculty, staff, and student communities to have open dialogues about racism, diversity, and inclusion at the university. The purpose of the Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force is to identify sources of systemic racism and other areas of need and ways to improve the diversity climate around the campus.

FSU President John Thrasher asked Osborne if he wanted to be part of the committee, and he quickly accepted the prestigious honor.

"It was an extreme honor, and I told my parents about it, and my parents were so happy and proud of me," Osborne told the *Democrat*. "I told Coach Ham how thankful I was and President Thrasher to be a part of such an exclusive committee and be a part of a group of members who can insight change around the campus that's been around since before I've been around. So it was such a special honor to be a part of, and it is special to be around a group that has such a strong voice around campus."

FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force usually has Zoom meetings a few times each month. The main objectives of the task force are to have an open forum where they hear from the student body or just locals around Tallahassee who have issues or complaints or just concerns about things on campus that might be racially insensitive.

One of the controversial decisions made in the task force meetings was removing Francis W. Eppes' name from the College of Criminology building and permanently removing the Eppes statue from campus. They also recommended the removal of B.K. Roberts' name from a College of Law building.

While some maybe have questioned why FSU would remove old names and statues from buildings, Osborne said it is important to make the campus as safe and comfortable as possible for the students.

"I believe it's critical because you don't want people to come to your school and feel like it's an uncomfortable learning environment because it shoves them away and limits their potential as well," Osborne said. I feel like listening to everyone's concerns, no matter if we agree with it or not is vital because you don't know if someone has the same viewpoint or the same perceive because they're not speaking up.

"So with the removal of the Eppes statue and the name on the building, that's a big step just to show how serious this task is and how serious we are about making change. We want people to know when they come to us; it is going to be a meaningful interaction. When they say something, they're going to be heard, and we are the voice of the student body and bring this to President Thrasher, who has a lot of other responsibilities, but this is just another responsibility that we bring to him.

"This is where a lot of people in the student body have been saying, and we should probably look into it because we are a top 20 university in the nation, so we want to uphold this reputation and continue to strive to be higher because we want to create a comfortable work environment and we want to have a great student life as well because that's what makes Florida State, Florida State."

Osborne started becoming aware of the social issues around him back when he was going up in Matteson, Illinois. He would listen to stories from not only his parents but his grandparents about all of the racial issues surrounding them from when they were kids. After listening to those stories, Osborne wanted to be part of the change. Even on a gameday, Osborne took part in an anti-racism task force conference call just hours before the Seminoles played Miami on Feb. 24.

Not only does Osborne have the support of his teammates, but also the FSU coaches.

"Malik is an extremely intelligent youngster, extremely competitive," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "He has a deep respect for doing what's right. He's the kind of guy that does well in the classroom and is also a leader on the team."

"He has that ability to make the right decisions about things. And he stands for the things that are right. I'm very proud of the fact that he's matured enough to want to be a part of the solution and not one of those guys interested in being part of the problem. He knows if he isn't doing anything, then he's not contributing."

Not only does Osborne want to walk in James' footsteps as a basketball player, but he also admires what the NBA All-Star does off the court.

That's why Osborne has been meeting with Thrasher on his own time about social issues that are bothering Osborne and other students around campus. Thrasher hopes he and Osborne can continue to create change for the diverse student body at FSU.

"It's been a pleasure to get to know Malik over the past couple of years," Thrasher said in a statement. "While Malik may be well-known for his basketball talents, he's also an outstanding young man."

"I'm so proud of his commitment to tackle issues of racial inequity and injustice. His service on Florida State's anti-racism task force will help ensure a more diverse and inclusive campus for future generations."

While Osborne wants to continue to play basketball at a high level as long as he can, he also wants to continue to bring about change to the FSU campus even after he leaves Tallahassee. He plans on not only influencing the students there at FSU now but into the future.

The deaths of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, had a major effect on Osborne. While some have told athletes to "shut up and dribble," Osborne hopes he continues to make his mark as a student-athlete on and off of the court.

"I want to be able to voice these opinions because I know it is my opinion, but these are the opinions of others as well. I just wanted to share my opinion and other's opinions of how demoralizing, hurtful, and how shocking it is to continue to see this as it almost seems like a trend of police brutality, especially when minorities and African-Americans."

"These stories of racial inequality and police brutality have affected me but has motivated me to go harder for the task force and not be afraid to speak up. If I don't speak up about social issues, then no one is going to know."

"The campus has been around for so long it is not going to be a percent, and it is going to be some changes that need to be made along the way. If this group stays around, who knows, there might be some more changes that may be implemented even after I leave from Florida State."

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – Junior Sardaar Calhoun scored a career-high 16 points to lead four Seminoles in double figure scoring and No. 9 ranked Florida State earned an 88-71 win over Miami at the Watsco Center. Balsa Koprivica scored 13 points while RaiQuan Gray and Anthony Polite scored 12 each as the Seminoles rolled to their 10th ACC victory of the season. The Seminoles have reached the 10-win mark in ACC play for the third consecutive season. Gray earned his third career double double with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. His 12 points marks the ninth straight game he has scored in double figures. He was 6 of 11 (.545 percent) from the field and contributed six assists for the Seminoles. He finished the game just four assists shy of a triple double. Koprivica also achieved double-figure scoring with 13 points and was five of 10 (.500 percent) from the field. Koprivica is averaging a career-high 10.1 points per game and has scored at least six points in each of Florida State's 16 games this season. With 12 points and three rebounds, Polite was another of four double-figure scoring Seminoles this evening. Polite was four of nine (.444 percent) from the field and two of six (.333 percent) from beyond the arc. He has scored at least one 3-point field goal in each of the 13 games he has played in this season. Freshman Scottie Barnes had a game-high and a career-high of eight assists in contributing eight points.
