SEMINOLES FACE MICHIGAN IN SWEET 16 AT BANKERS LIFE FIELDHOUSE SUNDAY AT 5:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has defeated UNC Greensboro and Colorado in the first two rounds of the 2021 NCAA Tournament, plays Michigan in the East Regional Semifinals of the NCAA Tournament in Sunday, March 28, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. The game will be played at the Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind., and televised nationally on CBS. The Seminoles are making the seventh Sweet 16 appearance in school history and third in the last three seasons. The Seminoles are playing Michigan for a place in the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament – the East Regional Finals. The Seminoles have advanced as far as the final eight teams in the NCAA Tournament three times in school history – 1972 (played in NCAA National Championship Game), 1993 (lost in Elite Eight) and 2018 (lost in Elite Eight). In Sunday's game, the Seminoles are facing the Wolverines in the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the last three years – the two teams met in the Elite Eight in 2018 at the Staples Center in Los Angeles.

FLORIDA STATE IN SELECT NCAA TOURNAMENT SWEET 16 COMPANY

Florida State is one of three teams that has advanced to the Sweet 16 of each of the last three NCAA Tournaments. The Seminoles are joined by only Gonzaga and Michigan as the three teams who have advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 in 2018, 2019 and 2021)

FLORIDA STATE'S SWEET 16 APPEARANCES

Florida State will play Michigan in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament on Sunday, March 28, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. It marks the seventh time (fourth time under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton that Florida State has advanced to the regional semifinal round of the NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles have advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 in each of the last three NCAA Tournaments (2018, 2019 and 2021).

FLORIDA STATE'S ELITE 8 APPEARANCES

Florida State faces Michigan in the East Regional Semifinals of the 2021 NCAA Tournament with a spot in the Elite 8 on the line. The Seminoles have advanced to the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament three times in the history of the program with their most recent appearance coming under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton in 2018.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT UNDER HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has led the Seminoles to eight NCAA Tournament appearances in the last 13 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021). He has led the Seminoles to nine of the 18 NCAA Tournament appearances in school history. Florida State made its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament during the 1968 season and made three appearances under Hugh Durham (1968, 1972 and 1978), one under Joe Williams (1980), five under Pat Kennedy (1988, 1989, 1991, 1992, 1993) and now eight under Hamilton. Hamilton is the Seminoles' leader in victories (378), NCAA Tournament appearances (eight) and NCAA Tournament victories (11).

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game against Colorado in the NCAA Tournament as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 378 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the fifth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 375 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Boston College on March 3, 2021.

FLORIDA STATE ANNOUNCES CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR BASKETBALL COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State University Vice President and Director of Athletics David Coburn announced on March 1 that Florida State has extended the contract with head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton through the 2024-25 season. "Coach Hamilton has done so much for this basketball program and this university that it is hard to express in words," said Coburn. "What he does with his young men, both on and off the court, is truly remarkable. I know both the President and I regard him as a university treasure, and he is just now getting the national recognition he has deserved for so long." Hamilton's student-athlete graduation rate of just over 95 percent at FSU will improve even more as eight members of his current team will earn degrees (seven as undergraduate degrees and one as a graduate degree) this spring.

SEMINOLES IN THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Michigan with a 96-31 record in the last four seasons for a .756 winning percentage. The Seminoles are 18-6 this season, were 26-5 in the shortened 2019-20 season, won a school record 29 games (29-8) during the 2018-19 season and were 23-12 during the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles are averaging 24.0 wins in each of the last four seasons.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters its game against Michigan ranked No. 14 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 14 in the Associated Press poll. It marks the fifth consecutive week and seventh week this season that the Seminoles are the highest ranked ACC team in both of the major college basketball polls. The Seminoles began the season ranked No. 18 in the Coaches Poll and No. 21 in the AP poll.

SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 23 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96)

FLORIDA STATE WITH 13 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against No. 4 Michigan with three victories over nationally ranked opponents this season and 13 wins over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 57 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MICHIGAN – THE LAST GAME

Charles Matthews scored 17 points and Michigan earned its first Final Four berth since 2013 with a 58-54 victory over Florida State at the Staples Center on March 24, 2018. Phil Cofer scored 16 points for the ninth-seeded Seminoles who missed advancing to the second Final Four in school history by mere seconds. The Wolverines held off a late charge from the Seminoles, who had already knocked off three higher-seeded opponents on their school's longest NCAA Tournament run since 1993. Seminole junior PJ Savoy trimmed the Wolverines' lead to 55-52 on a 3-pointer with 1:17 to play. With UM fans holding their breath, Savoy then missed a potential game-tying 3-pointer under pressure with 12 seconds left.

IT'S ALL ABOUT THE PRE AND POSTSEASON FOR FLORIDA STATE AND MICHIGAN

The Seminoles and the Wolverines have met four times: in the championship finals of the 1997 NIT; in the second round of the 2007 NIT; in the second round of the 2013 Puerto Rico Tip Off Classic, and in the Elite Eight of the 2018 NCAA Tournament.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.857 Redshirt junior Malik Osborne is shooting .857 from the free throw line (six of seven) in the last two games

.857 Freshman Scottie Barnes is shooting .857 from the field (12 of 14) in the last three games. He was a near perfect eight of 10 from the field against Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament Championship game.

3 Florida State's three All-ACC selections (M.J. Walker, Second-Team; RaiQuan Gray, Third-Team and Scottie Barnes, Third-Team) gave the Seminoles three of the 16 All-ACC selections in 2021 – the most by any of the 15 schools in the ACC.

Walker, Wyatt Wilkes, RayQuan Evans, Malik Osborne, Harrison Prieto, Justin Lindner, Will Miles and Travis Light) who all have experience as starters during their careers as Seminoles.

14 Senior Tanor Ngom has made 14 consecutive free throws entering Sunday's game against Michigan. He streak began in the first half of Florida State's victory over Gardner-Webb on December 21.

18 Florida State is undefeated, 18-0, when it outscores its opponent.

24 Three different Seminoles (M.J. Walker vs. Virginia Tech on January 20 2018; RaiQuan Gray vs. Wake Forest on February 13, 2021 and RayQuan Evans vs. NC State on January 13, 2021) all count 24 points as their career-high scoring totals.

120 Senior M.J. Walker will play in his 120th career game against Michigan in the Sweet 16 of the 2021 NCAA Tournament. He has helped Florida State win 94 games during his career.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 73-19 (.793 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 18-6 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 85 percent of their games with a record of 35-8 (.814 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 40-13 (.755 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and were 11-4 this season.

WALKER, GRAY AND BARNES EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

Florida State's M.J. Walker (All-ACC Second-Team, RaiQuan Gray (All-ACC Third-Team) and Scottie Barnes (All-ACC Third team) earned All-ACC honors while Barnes was named as the ACC Freshman of the Year, the ACC Sixth Man of the Year and to the All-Freshman Team as the individual conference honors were announced for the 2021 season by the ACC. Barnes is just the second player in Florida State history to be named the ACC Freshman of the Year joining Bob Sura (1992) and is the 12th Seminole to be named to the All-Freshman team.

SEMINOLES LEAD ALL WITH THREE SELECTIONS TO ALL-ACC TEAMS

Florida State, with three selections to the All-ACC First, Second and Third teams, is the only team with three selections to the 2021 All-ACC teams. The Seminoles' three selections (M.J. Walker, RaiQuan Gray and Scottie Barnes) were the most by any one school and made Florida State one of just three teams (Georgia Tech, 2; Virginia, 2) with multiple selections listed among the top 16 players in the nation's best conference

FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSE IN THE FIRST TWO GAMES OF THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Florida State has limited its first two opponents in the 2021 NCAA Tournament to .336 combined shooting percentage from the field (39 and 116) and to a total of 107 points. The Seminoles held UNC Greensboro to 19 field goals (the Spartans averages 27.7 field goals made per game for the season) and to a .317 shooting mark from the field (the shot .424 from the field for the season). Florida State then limited Colorado to a .357 shooting mark (the Buffaloes shot .45 for the season) and to 53 points (they averaged 73.1 points scored per game for the season).

SEMINOLES SET PROGRAM'S DEFENSIVE SCORING MARK AGAINST COLORADO

Florida State set a program record for fewest points allowed in an NCAA Tournament game when it limited Colorado to 53 points in its 71-53 win over the Buffaloes in the second round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament. It marked the fourth time in Florida State's NCAA Tournament history that it had allowed as 54 points or less – against Colorado and UNC Greensboro in 2021, Missouri in 2018 and in a 73-54 win over Kentucky on its way to the NCAA Championship game in 1972. The Seminoles' defensive scoring effort in holding UNC Greensboro to 54 points was the fewest points allowed by the Seminoles this season and the third time they had allowed 60 points or less.

FLORIDA STATE WITH THREE WINS IN ITS LAST FOUR GAMES

Florida State has won three of its last four games entering Sunday's game against Michigan with all three wins coming against 2021 NCAA Tournament teams – North Carolina in the ACC Tournament, UNC Greensboro and Colorado.

Origin of Florida State's Moniker -- The NewBloods

You see it emblazoned on their facemasks. You hear it when they take to the court. You read it on their social media posts. Like any good mantra, the coaches and players live, speak and embrace it all of the time. It's everywhere. The national media has adopted the phrase. It just might end up being the Webster Dictionary's newest entry.

NewBlood.

It's the term coined by Florida State Assistant Coach Charlton "CY" Young to describe the ascent by the Seminole Men's Basketball team into the hierarchy of the college basketball world. The defending ACC Champions have displayed the consistency and the staying power to have their name spoken definitively among the BlueBloods who have put their stamp on the sport since James Naismith first shot a ball through a peach basket more than 100 years ago.

Historically speaking, there are six BlueBloods: Kentucky, North Carolina, Indiana, Duke, UCLA and Kansas.

The term NewBlood was actually born during a recruiting visit by Young and Head Coach Leonard Hamilton in 2017.

While they were in the home of an official visit with one of the top five players in the nation, Young could feel the recruit's emotions trending to one of the nation's BlueBlood teams.

"For so many years, the term "BlueBlood" has controlled the minds of high school players as well as high school and AAU coaches," said Young. "Coach Hamilton and I were in a players' home, and we both felt that Florida State was the best fit for this young man, and that he was the best fit for Florida State.

"I said to the player, 'everybody is going to tell you to go play for BlueBlood program. I said, come play for Florida State, we are a NewBlood program.'"

When the two coaches walked out of the recruits' home that night, Hamilton knew Young was on to something big.

Though the term became mostly dormant following that recruiting visit, it became an integral part of the Seminoles' program on a team run on the Duke University campus on the morning of December 30, 2017. As Young and strength and conditioning coach Mike Bradley led a group of Seminoles through the packed tent city of Krzyzewskiville and past the famed Cameron Indoor Stadium, he let out a yell that certainly woke up the sleeping Duke students and was loud enough for the entire college basketball world to hear.

BlueBloods? Yelled Young.

NewBloods! Responded the group of Seminoles running in lockstep with the Seminoles now eighth-year assistant coach.

Since that run on the campus of one of the BlueBloods, the cry of NewBloods is as much a part of the Seminoles as their winning culture or desire to be one of the best teams in the best college basketball conference in the nation. It has become a very emotional mantra for the Seminoles; one that serves as a rallying cry that carries them into every game.

The term absolutely evokes emotion from the Seminole players.

"It means that we have established ourselves as a prominent program in college basketball," said redshirt junior Malik Osborne. "It means that we have earned the right to be considered to be among the top dogs in college basketball, and we're going to fight to the end to protect what we have built."

In the months following the Seminoles' run through the Duke campus, the Seminoles advanced to within seconds of playing in just the second Final Four in school history.

In the two full seasons since Young proclaimed the Seminoles as college basketball NewBlood, Florida State has a 56-13 record, one regular season ACC Championship, two top four ACC finishes and school records for overall wins in a season (29 in 2019) and ACC wins in a season (16 in 2020).

Hamilton is as excited today to lead the Seminoles to a national championship as he has ever been.

"We are motivated by the challenge of wanting to carve out your niche," said Hamilton. "We have decided to coin our phrase -- NewBlood. We are going to carve out our own distinction. We are going to carve out our own path of success. We cannot do anything about the 80-year head start the BlueBloods have on us. We can do something moving forward to carve out our own niche, and we are motivated by that."

The national media has certainly taken notice of the NewBloods in Tallahassee.

"Florida State is officially an ACC power, a 'NewBlood' as Head Coach Leonard Hamilton says, a program that has averaged 26 wins over the last four seasons while competing with Duke, Virginia and North Carolina atop the conference," said Matthew Gutierrez of The Athletic. "Since 2018, FSU has appeared in an Elite Eight and Sweet 16, and the Seminoles were a projected No. 2 seed in the 2020 NCAA Tournament after winning the first ACC regular-season title in program history."

Leonard Hamilton's Quest For The Respect He Deserves In The College Basketball World

Twenty-one years ago, a Miami columnist detailed 20 questions with Miami head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton.

The first question of that 1999 interview immediately jumped out. Would Hamilton shave three years off his life in order to win a national championship?

At the time, Hamilton was in his ninth year of what would be 10 years spent atop the Hurricanes' program. He had led Miami's transition from independence into the Big East. Hamilton built the program from a 1-17 Big East record in its first year in the conference to what would be a second-place finish in the conference (15-3 record) and a spot as high as No. 9 in the Associated Press poll during the 1998-99 season.

The question wasn't especially farfetched as the Hurricanes would enter that year's NCAA Tournament as a No. 2 seed, although they made a second-round exit after being upset by No. 10 seed Purdue.

The answer Hamilton gave after a 30-second pause says a lot about the type of person he is.

"It's sad when that's a hard question," Hamilton said.

"I know I should say that I want to keep the three years of my life, but to win would mean so much to so many other people in our program that I'd have to say shave the three years off my life. It would be worth the sacrifice."

In the two decades plus since this interview, Hamilton left the Miami job for a brief stint coaching Michael Jordan and the Washington Wizards before landing at Florida State. He enters the 2020-21 basketball season leading an FSU basketball program coming off one of the best seasons in program history.

On a more personal note, he passed longtime Georgia Tech coach Bobby Cremins for fifth-most wins in ACC men's basketball history this past February. He enters this season with 582 career wins as a head coach, although the NCAA recognizes just 560 as FSU had all 22 wins from its 2006-07 season vacated due to an academic fraud scandal.

Regardless of which win total you subscribe to, he's expected to join an elite group of college basketball coaches that have amassed 600 career Division-I wins within the next few years. There are only 39 members of that club currently, although a few more coaches will beat Hamilton to the historic landmark.

"The bottom line is I don't think he's ever gotten the national publicity he deserves," ESPN college basketball analyst Dick Vitale said of Hamilton.

"When you think about the ACC, that's not cupcake city, man. You think about that league and what he's achieved, I believe he ranks in the top five all-time in wins in the conference. There are some great coaches in that league. That is an incredible achievement. Leonard just goes about his business, he works his butt off, he's a recruiting genius and he's also a very solid tactician. I don't think people give him credit for the job he does."

And if you talk to anyone who knows Hamilton well, they'll tell you he's done it the right way.

"This guy has always been a winner. He's always been successful and he's always won because of his heart," FSU assistant coach Charlton "C.Y." Young told the *Democrat*.

"First thing you learned in the Bible is the more you give, the more you receive. He has given so much to people and it comes back threefold."

'Wake Up, Knucklehead'

Hamilton twice helped break the color barrier during his collegiate basketball career, arriving as one of the first Black student-athletes both at Gaston Community College and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

He parlayed his playing career into a role on the Austin Peay coaching staff, first as a graduate assistant from 1971 through 1973 and then as an assistant coach for the 1973-74 season, helping the Governors to the program's first two NCAA Tournament appearances in program history.

This success made Austin Peay head coach Lake Kelly a coaching commodity who began to attract attention from a number of larger programs. Despite having just one season as a full-time coach at that point, Hamilton channeled courage and walked into the office of the Austin Peay president, asking if he would be considered for the head coach position should Kelly go elsewhere.

The president, citing his pending retirement within the next few years, told Hamilton that he couldn't bring himself to make him the first Black coach in the history of the Ohio Valley Conference, although he personally wanted to give him the job.

After this discouraging development, Hamilton briefly left coaching before he was convinced to return when legendary Kentucky coach Joe B. Hall offered him a spot on his staff, making him the first Black coach in the program's extensive history.

Although he still had aspirations of eventually becoming the head coach of a traditional basketball power early in his time in Kentucky, he looks back now with that fateful meeting with the Austin Peay President as divine intervention which led him down the path he's paved.

"It's almost like God reached down in heaven and slapped me on both sides of the face (and said), 'Wake up, knucklehead. Those programs that are already in great shape with great facilities and great tradition don't need you,'" Hamilton told the *Democrat*.

"It was almost like I came to the realization that with the type of personality I have, I would be better served by taking jobs that were not in metropolitan areas, jobs that had consistently been challenging for other people to be consistent at winning.

"Those jobs would offer me the motivation and the challenge that I needed to go in and prove that I was capable of doing something that had not been done. Those types of opportunities really became what motivated me and I was excited and I started looking for jobs that needed to be rebuilt."

A Career Spent At "Football Schools"

Hamilton spent 12 years as an assistant at Kentucky, the final six of those as the associate head coach. He helped lead the Wildcats to the program's fifth NCAA Tournament Championship in 1978, Kentucky's first national title in 20 years at the time.

When the time came for Hamilton to take his first head coaching position, however, it wasn't with nearly as prolific a basketball program. He took over the reins at Oklahoma State ahead of the 1986-87 season, inheriting a program that had made the NCAA Tournament just once in the previous 21 seasons.

In the 21 years before he arrived in Stillwater, the Cowboys had finished above .500 in Big 8 play just twice.

Hamilton never took OSU to the NCAA Tournament -- the Cowboys made the NIT in each of his final two seasons -- but his tenure laid the groundwork for the success that followed years after his departure. OSU made the NCAA Tournament each of the next five years and 13 of the ensuing 15 years after his departure.

He moved on from OSU to accept the head coach position at Miami. He arrived ahead of the program's sixth year back in existence after Miami was without a basketball team from 1971 until 1985.

Once again, he found himself coaching a basketball team at a football school. The Hurricanes' football program won its third national championship the year before Hamilton arrived and won another in Hamilton's second season at UM in 1991.

There's something about this exact situation that aligns well with Hamilton's unique self-motivation.

"He had to investigate and evaluate programs where if he didn't let anybody outwork him, which is one of his big mantras, he could go in there and people would know that if he could turn it around then it was because of his effort and his talent and his focus that other people couldn't get it done," Stan Jones, a longtime assistant coach on Hamilton's staff, told the *Democrat*.

"That would be the way he would have to build his head coaching career. I think he's always looked at it that way, as I've got to take a program that needs a lot of restoration and if I do the restoration then nobody could say that it was given to me, nobody can say I didn't earn it. I think he's proven that at every stop along his journey."

It took him time to build the program up, but the gradual growth paid off when the Hurricanes made the NCAA Tournament in his eighth season in 1997-98. That snapped a skid of nearly 40 years since Miami's last NCAA Tournament appearance in 1960.

After a one-year stint coaching Michael Jordan and the Washington Wizards in the NBA, Hamilton landed back in the college game, this time at Florida State.

Taking over at FSU ahead of the 2002-03 season, Hamilton again took over a basketball program at a football powerhouse. He got to FSU just after the football program's record streak of 14 consecutive top-five finishes was snapped in 2001.

Similar to his previous stops, he again inherited a program in desperate need of strong leadership. The Seminoles, after a strong start upon their arrival in the basketball-heavy ACC, had fallen on hard times. In the nine years before his arrival, FSU had failed to win more than six ACC games in any season and finished above .500 just twice.

It again took him time to build the program his way, but he found quicker success this time. After a pair of losing seasons in his first three years at FSU, Hamilton has since led the Seminoles to winning seasons in each of the last 15 years.

He took FSU to its first Elite Eight since 1992 in 2018 and achieved perhaps the least likely accomplishment this past season, bringing home the program's first ACC regular-season championship.

"Leonard really has built programs, not just taken over programs at so-called football schools. As a result of that, especially if you're building, you don't have tradition there for basketball," Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski told the *Democrat*.

"It's not that easy. It's not easy anywhere, but it's especially hard in those situations. Because he's a tireless worker, good guy, great coach, he's been able to do that at all these locations. His most recent success story is Florida State and it's a huge one."

Were it not for the cancellation of the NCAA Tournament this past March due to the coronavirus pandemic, Hamilton could have very well made his first Final Four as a head coach. Even better, his Seminoles were one of the trendiest picks to win the entire tournament.

The ascension of the FSU basketball program to another tier has been well-timed as the FSU football program has fallen on hard times unlike any over the last 40 years.

"He's never had an easy job. Let's face it, he's had jobs where football has been dominant. Miami, Florida State, especially the times he arrived," Vitale said.

"When he arrived, they were (football) giants. Right now, the people at Florida State are talking about, I guarantee it, when does basketball start? You've never heard that cry before."

Rightful Perspective

Nolan Richardson knows what it takes to succeed as a basketball coach at a football school.

He inherited a similar situation as Hamilton at FSU and Miami when he took over the Arkansas basketball program in 1985. Nearly a decade later, he became just the second Black head coach to win an NCAA basketball championship when he led the Razorbacks to the 1993-94 title, joining Georgetown's John Thompson Jr., who became the first in 1984.

Only two more Black coaches have joined this short list since Richardson, Kentucky coach Tubby Smith in 1998 and Connecticut's Kevin Ollie in 2014. Although these four all have titles while Hamilton has never made a Final Four, he's got more career wins than all of them except for Smith.

Even though Hamilton is far older than one would believe from looking at him -- he turned 72 in August -- he remains one of the likeliest coaches to join this elite club of Black coaches who have reached the pinnacle of college basketball.

"I don't really think he gets the kind of respect that he would get if he was a white coach with those kind of victories," Richardson told the *Democrat*.

"I think that's the thing that I've always said. You have to prove yourself more than once, twice, three or four or five times and it's a constant. For him to be able to win 600 games, that's quite an accomplishment. I understand what it means simply because I was in the same arena that he's in and sometimes you don't play on a level playing field that the others are playing on."

Now entering his 33rd season as a college basketball head coach, Hamilton has been one of the bridges from the last generation of Black coaches to the next generation. A mild-mannered person, especially in public settings, its taken Hamilton time to get used to being a mentor to that next generation like Thompson and Richardson were to him.

"I try to encourage him more that he needs to be more of a voice out there in this winter of his career because he has so much to give and he has so much knowledge and he has so much savvy on how to navigate an athletic department, dealing with the media, dealing with recruiting, dealing with all the things that go on with being a successful head coach for anybody," Jones said.

"Whether you're a minority or not, he's a guy that really understands this business and he's incredibly smart and thinks through everything at a level that a lot of people that just play off of their emotions don't realize that's the key to success is how deep you're able to think. He is that guy."

Young is one coach who has taken advantage of that mentorship. He's now in his eighth season as an assistant coach under Hamilton at FSU. Although he didn't have much of a relationship with Hamilton before joining his staff, Young now views getting him the respect he feels he's deserved in the college basketball world as one of his biggest goals.

"Everybody is always asking, 'Why's he still doing it at his age?' Because he wants to walk out letting people know (he) was the best," Young said.

"One day, they're all going to say it. If you don't want to say it, we're going to make you say it. My goal for J. Leonard Hamilton is to get him in the Hall of Fame, to win a national title...I want his name to be synonymous with winning. Winning on the court, off the court, in life."

While Hamilton may not be a household name to the average college basketball fan, he's well-respected by the major figures in the coaching world.

"He does not get the attention and the recognition that he so richly deserves. Especially in this last decade at Florida State where Florida State is one of the top programs in the United States," Krzyzewski said.

"Our conference has some of the top programs in the United States and Florida State is one of them and it's a result of Leonard and his staff doing incredible work there."

Added North Carolina head coach Roy Williams, "Leonard really cares about his players. He's not only concerned with what they do on the court. He does a great job making sure his players do well off the court, in the classroom, and he helps them get ready for life after basketball. I admire him tremendously. He is one of the people that I would be very pleased if he coached my son."

Hamilton may never reach the top of the college basketball world. He hasn't discussed how many years of coaching he may have left, but it's a number that is dwindling whatever it is.

This may prevent Hamilton from getting the respect many in the college basketball world feel he deserves while he's still coaching. But George Raveling, another mentor to Hamilton who won 337 games as the head coach at Washington State, Iowa and Southern California between 1972 and 1994, is confident that Hamilton will get his due in time.

"Many years ago in a speech, Malcolm X said that history is best situated to reward a man's deeds. My interpretation of that is that ultimately history will put things into their rightful perspective," Raveling told the *Democrat*.

"If the story's not told today, it will be told tomorrow. History will put him in his rightful context at some point be it today, tomorrow or in the distant future. His contributions to life and the profession and the race and his family, those chapters are still being written right now.

"We're probably 20 chapters into a 30-chapter book right now. But at some point, history will take over and it will put him in his rightful perspective. Even if we as human beings can't do it or accept it or want to do it, history will do it for us."

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- Junior Sardaar Calhoun scored a career-high 16 points to lead four Seminoles in double figure scoring and No. 9 ranked Florida State earned an 88-71 win over Miami at the Watsco Center. Balsa Koprivica scored 13 points while RaiQuan Gray and Anthony Polite scored 12 each as the Seminoles rolled to their 10th ACC victory of the season. The Seminoles have reached the 10-win mark in ACC play for the third consecutive season. Gray earned his third career double double with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. His 12 points marks the ninth straight game he has scored in double figures. He was 6 of 11 (.545 percent) from the field and contributed six assists for the Seminoles. He finished the game just four assists shy of a triple double. Koprivica also achieved double-figure scoring with 13 points and was five of 10 (.500 percent) from the field. Koprivica is averaging a career-high 10.1 points per game and has scored at least six points in each of Florida State's 16 games this season. With 12 points and three rebounds, Polite was another of four double-figure scoring Seminoles this evening. Polite was four of nine (.444 percent) from the field and two of six (.333 percent) from beyond the arc. He has scored at least one 3-point field goal in each of the 13 games he has played in this season. Freshman Scottie Barnes had a game-high and a career-high of eight assists in contributing eight points.

Langley's 3-pointer in the opening seconds of the second half tied the game at 29, but Florida State responded with a 12-0 run. Greensboro surged again. A pair of free throws by Miller cut Florida State's lead to one point, but two quick baskets by Gray got the Seminoles back on track.
