NO. 14/14 FLORIDA STATE MAKES EIGHTH NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCE UNDER LEONARD HAMILTON

The Florida State men's basketball has earned the No. 4 seed in the East Region and will play No. 13 seeded UNC Greensboro in its first game of the 2021 NCAA Tournament on Saturday, March 20 at 12:45 p.m. at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind. Florida State is an at-large selection from the ACC while UNC Greensboro is the champion of the Southern Conference. The Seminoles' selection to the 2021 NCAA Tournament marks the 18th time in school history and eighth time under head coach Leonard Hamilton the Seminoles will appear in the NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles selection to the 2021 NCAA Tournament marks the school-record tying fourth consecutive season the Seminoles will play the event (2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021). Florida State has now participated in the postseason in 15 of Hamilton's 19 seasons at Florida State. The Seminoles were primed to participate in 2020 NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled by the NCAA because of the worldwide Coronavirus pandemic. Under Hamilton, the Seminoles have played in the NCAA Tournament in the 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021 seasons.

FLORIDA STATE'S NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

Led by sophomore center Dave Cowens, Florida State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance during the 1967-68 season. Cowens averaged a double-double of 18.8 points and 17.0 rebounds for the 19-8 Seminoles who fell to East Tennessee State, 79-69, in their first ever NCAA Tournament game. The Seminoles have a 21-17 overall record in NCAA Tournament play, played UCLA for the 1972 National Championship, have played in one Final Four (1972), two Elite Eights (1972 and 2018) and in the Sweet 16 six times (1972, 1992, 1993, 2011, 2018 and 2019).

FLORIDA STATE HAS PLAYED IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT IN EIGHT OF THE LAST 12 YEARS

With its selection to play in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, Florida State has now been chosen to play in eight of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments – marking the most successful run of playing in the NCAA Tournament over an 12-year period in school history. The Seminoles have now appeared in eight of the last 12 NCAA tournaments in the last decade (plus) beginning with their selection into the 2009 NCAA men's basketball championship. The Seminoles have played in the NCAA Tournament in the 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021.

FLORIDA STATE ENJOYS SUCCESSFUL 2020-21 SEASON

Earning success in the most unique seasons in the history of college athletics, Florida State has won 16 overall games, 11 ACC games, finished second in the ACC standings, played in the ACC Tournament Championship game and is playing in the NCAA Tournament for the school-record tying fourth consecutive season. The Seminoles are seeded fourth in the East Region of the 2021 NCAA Tournament – the second consecutive year and third time in school history – they are a No. 4 seed. The Seminoles began the season ranked No. 21 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the Coaches Poll and spent all but two weeks of the season ranked nationally by the AP. Florida State was ranked as high as No. 11 in the AP Poll (February 22 and March 1) and as high as No. 9 in the Coaches Poll (February 22). The Seminoles earned victories over three nationally ranked teams (No. 25 Florida, No. 22 Clemson and No. 7 Virginia) and enter the 2021 NCAA Tournament as the highest ranked ACC team at No. 14 in both polls.

WALKER, GRAY AND BARNES EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

Florida State's M.J. Walker (All-ACC Second-Team, RaiQuan Gray (All-ACC Third-Team) and Scottie Barnes (All-ACC Third team) earned All-ACC honors while Barnes was named as the ACC Freshman of the Year, the ACC Sixth Man of the Year and to the All-Freshman Team as the individual conference honors were announced for the 2021 season by the ACC. Barnes is just the second player in Florida State history to be named the ACC Freshman of the Year joining Bob Sura (1992) and is the 12th Seminole to be named to the All-Freshman team.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the 2021 ACC Tournament as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 376 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation’s best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles’ victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE ANNOUNCES CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR BASKETBALL COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State University Vice President and Director of Athletics David Coburn announced on March 1 that Florida State has extended the contract with head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton through the 2024-25 season. “Coach Hamilton has done so much for this basketball program and this university that it is hard to express in words,” said Coburn. “What he does with his young men, both on and off the court, is truly remarkable. I know both the President and I regard him as a university treasure, and he is just now getting the national recognition he has deserved for so long.” Hamilton’s student-athlete graduation rate of just over 95 percent at FSU will improve even more as eight members of his current team will earn degrees (seven as undergraduate degrees and one as a graduate degree) this spring.

FLORIDA STATE’S HAMILTON ASEMIFINALIST FOR THE WERNER LADDER NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR AWARD

Leonard Hamilton, who led the Florida State Basketball Team to a second place finish in the ACC standings is a semifinalist for the Werner Ladder National Coach of the Year award. Hamilton is one of ten semifinalists for the National Coach of the Year award and the only coach on the semifinal list from the ACC. The four finalists will be announced on March 17.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE’S LEONARD HAMILTON

...He is a finalist for the 2020-21 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award as presented by collegeinsider.com. The Skip Prosser Man of the Year award honors those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off the floor as well;

...He is a finalist for the Ben Jobe Coach of the Year Award as presented by collegeinsider.com. The Ben Jobe Award, which is presented annually to the top Division I minority coach, is named in honor of one of the finest men to ever coach college basketball.

SEMINOLES IN THE TOP FOUR OF THE ACC STANDINGS

Florida State’s second place finish in the 2021 ACC Standings marked the second time in school history the Seminoles have finished in the top two in the ACC standings in consecutive seasons (they second in both 1992 and 1993). The runner-up finish also marks the school-record eighth time Hamilton has guided his Seminoles to a top-four finish in the ACC standings. Florida State has won double digit ACC games in three consecutive and five of the last six seasons. Prior to Hamilton’s arrival at Florida State for the 2002-03 season, Florida State had won 10 or more games in ACC play five times; he and his staff have led the Seminoles to at least 10 ACC wins eight times since the 2008-09 season.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 71-19 (.789 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 16-6 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won more than 80 percent of their games with a record of 33-8 (.805 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 40-13 (.755 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and were 11-4 this season.

SEMINOLES LEAD ALL WITH THREE SELECTIONS TO ALL-ACC TEAMS

Florida State, with three selections to the All-ACC First, Second and Third teams, is the only team with three selections to the 2021 All-ACC teams. The Seminoles’ three selections (M.J. Walker, RaiQuan Gray and Scottie Barnes) were the most by any one school and made Florida State one of just three teams (Georgia Tech, 2; Virginia, 2) with multiple selections.

SEMINOLES’ NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 13, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96)

FLORIDA STATE VS. UNC GREENSBORO – THE LAST GAME

Michael Snaer scored 14 points and Bernard James pulled down 12 rebounds as Florida State moved to 6-0 at home with a 75-60 win over UNC Greensboro at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on December 11, 2011. The Seminoles still shot 52 percent from the field in the win. Junior forward Xavier Gibson added 11 points to go along with six rebounds and two blocks and senior guard Luke Loucks had eight points, four rebounds and three assists. James nearly registered his fifth double-double of the year with nine points and 10 rebounds. James also added a game's-best four blocks. John Kreft, Deividas Dulkys and Okaro White had six points apiece for a Seminoles team that shot 40 percent from 3-point range and had 17 assists. Defensively, the 'Noles forced 21 turnovers and totaled nine blocks. The Spartans shot just 35.5-percent from the field and were out-rebounded 33-28.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.400 Junior Sardaar Calhoun is shooting .400 from the 3-point line (10 of 25) in the last eight games. He has made at least one 3-point shot in seven of the last eight games dating back to Florida State's victory over No. 7 Virginia on February 15.

.857 Senior RayQuan Evans is shooting .857 from the free throw line (18 of 21) in the last seven games. He made his career-high of 10 free throws on a career-high 12 free throw attempts in Florida State's victory at Pittsburgh on February 20.

.875 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is shooting .875 from the free throw line in the last four games (14 of 16). He was a perfect seven of seven from the free throw line at Notre Dame on March 6.

.900 Freshman Scottie Barnes is shooting .900 from the free throw line (nine of 10) in the last three games. He enters Saturday's game against UNC Greensboro having made nine consecutive free throws.

3 Florida State's three All-ACC selections (M.J. Walker, Second-Team; RaiQuan Gray, Third-Team and Scottie Barnes, Third-Team) gave Florida State three of the 16 All-ACC selections in 2021 – the most by any of the 15 schools in the ACC.

4 Redshirt junior Malik Osborne has started four games this season – all victories – over Wake Forest (February 13), No. 7 Virginia (February 15), at Pittsburgh (February 20) and at Miami (February 24).

6 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica has blocked six shots in the last two games including his career-high of four in Florida State's victory over North Carolina in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament.

9 Florida State played nine games against teams who were selected to play in the 2021 NCAA Tournament and earned wins over Florida, Clemson, North Carolina (twice), Georgia Tech and Virginia.

10 Senior Tanor Ngom has made 10 consecutive free throws entering Florida State's game against UNC Greensboro in the 2021 NCAA Tournament. He has made each of his free throw attempts since Florida State's victory over North Carolina on January 16.

16 Florida State is undefeated, 16-0, when it outscores its opponent.

19 Redshirt junior Anthony Polite has made at least one 3-point shot in 19 consecutive games (each of his 18 games this season and the final game of the 2019-20 season).

118 Senior M.J. Walker will play in his 118th career game in the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament. He has helped Florida State win 94 games during his career.

LEONARD HAMILTON'S COACHING TREE

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's coaching tree extends across the nation as 12 of his former assistant coaches have moved on to become head coaches at the Division I level. Included on the list are **Dennis Gates (Cleveland State)**, **Corey Williams (Stetson)**, Tim Carter (South Carolina State), **Andy Enfield (Southern California)**, Tony Sheals (Virginia Union), Mike Jaskulski (Cardinal St. Vincent's), Dwight Freeman (Norfolk State), Randy Lee (Tennessee Temple), **Dickey Nutt (Southeast Missouri)**, John Phillips (Tulsa) and **Bill Self (Kansas)**. Former Hamilton assistants Gates, Williams (assistant at Arkansas), Enfield, Nutt (assistant at Cleveland State) and Self and coaching in the 2021 NCAA Tournament.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN SCORING OFFENSE AND SCORING MARGIN

Florida State enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament as the ACC leader in both scoring offense and scoring margin. The Seminoles are averaging a league-best 78.9 points scored per game and with a +8.6 scoring margin. The Seminoles have outscored their first 22 opponents of the season by 189 points (1,736-1,547). Florida State is looking to lead the ACC in both statistical categories for the first time since joining the league for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles averaged 75.4 points scored per game and owned a +9.7 points per game scoring margin during the 2019-20 season. Florida State's school record for points scored per game is 91.7 during the 1969-70 season – the senior season of Dave Cowens who was the No. 4 overall pick of the 1970 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

With six players who have made at least 10 3-point field goals this season, Florida State enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament as the ACC leaders with a .390 team 3-point field goal shooting percentage. With only two Seminole teams in school history shooting better than 40 percent from the 3-point line, the current Seminoles would rank third in school history for 3-point shooting percentage.

SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State, which has blocked at least four shots in 19 of its 22 games, enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament as the ACC leaders in blocked shots. The Seminoles have blocked 50 shots more than their opponents (103-63, +50) and are looking to lead the ACC in blocked shots for the second time in their ACC history. Led by Rodney Dobard's single-season school record 111 blocked shots the Seminoles led the ACC with a 6.0 blocked shots per game average during the 1992-93 season. Florida State has now blocked at least 100 shots in each of the last 15 seasons.

WALKER CONTINUES TO MOVE UP FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME SCORING LIST

All-ACC Second Team selection M.J. Walker, who surpassed the 1,000 career point mark on January 27 at North Carolina, will play in his third career NCAA Tournament in Indianapolis beginning Saturday against UNC Greensboro. He has helped the Seminoles to the Elite Eight of the 2018 NCAA Tournament and to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. As Walker continues to climb the Seminoles' all-time scoring list, he is just 15 points from surpassing Michael Polite for 39th place on that list. Michael Polite is the father of current Seminole teammate Anthony Polite.

All-ACC Second-Team selection M.J. Walker enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament ranked ninth in school history with 173 career 3-point field goals made. He is looking to become just the ninth player in school history to make 175 or more career 3-point shots. Walker averages 1.5 3-point field goals made per game in his 117-game Florida State career. Walker has made a career-high tying 44 3-point field goals and is shooting a career-high .444 from the 3-point line this season. He has made 44 3-point field goals in each of the last three seasons (including this season).

Florida State Basketball What's In A Name

Quincy Ballard – My full name is Quincy Tyshon Ballard. My mom and dad have always been fans of the name Quincy. We always felt that people who were named Quincy were destined for big things. One of my parents' most favorite people named Quincy is Quincy Jones. Tyshon, my middle name, was given to him by my older brother, Kay'ron, who wanted to be a part of naming Quincy.

Scottie Barnes – My full name is Scott Williams Barnes, Jr. I was named after my dad. People have called me Scottie as long as I can remember; I guess because it's catchy.

Sardar Calhoun – My full name is Sardar Khadir Calhoun. Sardar means Commander in Chief, and my middle name Khadir means one of the faithful.

RayQuan Evans -- My full name is RayQuan Ethan Evans. My dad took the name of one of the singers, Raekwon, from the 1990's band Wu Tang Clan, and put his own spin on the spelling for my first name. Ethan, from the Bible, came from my mom. The name Ethan means strong, firm and long-lived.

RaiQuan Gray -- My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.

Balsa Koprivica -- My name comes from the ancient Serbian King Balšić and his family. The Balšićs were a noble family that ruled from 1362 to 1421, during and after the fall of the Serbian Empire. Balsa also means strong and well built.

Tanor Ngom -- My full name is Abdoulaye Tanor Ngom. Both my grandfathers from my mom's and my dad's side were called Abdoulaye. My father's dad was called Tanor as well and that's where I got my name from. I ask people to call me Tanor because they usually butcher the name Abdoulaye (lol). Tanor is usually easier for people to pronounce.

Malik Osborne -- "My full name is Malik James Osborne. Malik comes from a close friend of my father and James from my father."

Anthony Polite -- My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather."

WALKER IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

All-ACC Second-Team selection M.J. Walker scored 24 points (12.0 ppg) in two ACC Tournament games last week including a 15-point performance in the ACC Championship game against fellow NCAA Tournament participant Georgia Tech. He shot .500 percent from the field (nine of 18), and made three 3-point shots against the Yellow Jackets.

WALKER IN THE SEMINOLES' STARTING LINEUP

All-ACC Second-Team selection M.J. Walker, who will start his fourth career NCAA Tournament game against UNC Greensboro on Saturday, has been a starter in 78 of the Seminoles last 82 games over the last three seasons. The Seminoles have won 71 of those games in the last three seasons. Walker has started 20 of 21 games this season – his only non-starting assignment was on senior day in Florida State's victory over Boston College on March 3 in Tallahassee. Walker was a reserve against the Eagles as Head Coach Leonard Hamilton started four walk-ons (Travis Light, Justin Lindner, Will Miles and Harrison Prieto) who are all in their fifth seasons as Seminoles.

WALKER IN FLORIDA STATE'S RECORD BOOK

Senior M.J. Walker enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament ranked in the top 16 of three different statistical categories in Florida State's record book. He is shooting .786 for his career from the free throw line; is one of 10 players in school history to have made 150 or more 3-point field goals and is one of only seven players to attempt 470 or more 3-point field goals.

Senior RaiQuan Evans enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament shooting a career-high .857 from the free throw line. He is one of six regular in Florida State's rotation who is shooting .800 percent or better from the free throw line.

Florida State Basketball What's My Number

Scottie Barnes – I chose to wear No. 4 at Florida State because of the many great players before me who played at Florida State and wore No. 4, including most recently Dwayne Bacon and Patrick Williams. Both players were great Seminoles and both were drafted into the NBA.

RayQuan Evans – There is no particular reason why I wear No. 0 at Florida State. I wore the same number at Northern Idaho and I really like the way it looks. It's a very unique number and I feel that I'm a unique player.

RaiQuan Gray – I chose to wear No. 1 at Florida State because I wanted to wear a number that was completely different from any number that I have ever worn before. I wore double digit numbers throughout my career. I wore No. 41 in high school.

Nathanael Jack – I chose to wear No. 11 at Florida State because my younger brother Joshua wears that number as a football player at St. Mary's University in Nova Scotia, Canada. He has been a huge influence on my life and has defied many odds to get where he is in his career. I sincerely admire him for all of the challenges he has been able to overcome.

Balsa Koprivica – I wear No. 5 because I have worn the number throughout my high school and AAU career. I feel like it's been a good number, so I asked for it when I committed to Florida State and was lucky to get it.

Tanor Ngom -- I try to model my game after AD (Anthony Davis) and all the bigs in the league that can do more than just dunk. Giannis is who I eventually want to play like and his number is 34; I also wear the No. 34 because of Shaquille O'Neal in his Laker days – who along with Anthony Davis – are two of the most dominant players ever to play this game.

Anthony Polite – I wear No. 2 at Florida State because I am the second member of my family to play at Florida State. My dad, Michael, wore No. 45 during his career as a Seminole. (1988, 1989, 1991).

M.J. Walker -- I wear No. 23 because LeBron James has been my favorite player for as long as I can remember. I was about four years old when he began playing in the NBA and I have patterned my game after him. I wore No. 23 throughout high school and during AAU ball.

Wyatt Wilkes -- When I signed to play at Florida State and the coaches asked me which number I wanted to wear, I told them I care about wins and not about uniform numbers. There is no significance to the No. 31 that I will wear during my Florida State career. I wore No. 21 in high school.

...He has started each of the Seminoles' last three games including both of Florida State's games against North Carolina and Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament. He has started a career-high 13 games this season and 21 games in the last two seasons (and his career);

...He has earned nine steals (1.8 spg) and has at least one steal in each of the last five games. He totaled is season-high of four steals in Florida State's victory over Boston College on March 3 in Tallahassee;

...He has blocked a single-season of career-high nine shots this season – he blocked a total of eight shots in in the first three seasons and 62 games of his career;

...He has totaled 26 rebounds in the last three four games (6.5 rpg) – he totaled six rebounds against both Boston College and at Notre Dame to close the regular season and pulled down seven in both of Florida State's games in the ACC Tournament against North Carolina and Georgia Tech.

CALHOUN DOING WHAT HE DOES FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Junior Sardaar Calhoun enters Saturday's game against UNC Greensboro in the 2021 NCAA Tournament shooting .418 from the 3-point line in his first season as a Seminole. Including his two junior college season Missouri State University West Plains, Calhoun is shooting .439 from the bonusphere (206 of 469) as a collegiate player.

SARDAAR CALHOUN BY THE NUMBERS...

...He has eight steals in the last eight games (1.0 spg) including two each in victories at Miami (February 27) and against North Carolina in the ACC Tournament (March 12);

...He enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament tied for third among his teammates with 23 3-point field goals made – an average of more than one made per game. Calhoun made his career-high of four 3-point field goals in Florida State's victory over Clemson on January 23;

...He blocked the first two shots of is Seminole career in Florida State's victory over North Carolina in the ACC Tournament;

...He totaled his career-high of three assists in Florida State's victory over Miami in Coral Gables on February 24. In addition to his three assists against the Hurricanes, he scored his career-high of 16 points in the Seminoles' ACC road victory;

...He is one of only three Seminoles (also RaiQuan Gray and Wyatt Wilkes) who have played in all 22 games for the Seminoles this season. He enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament averaging 14.8 minutes played in his first season as a Seminole.

BARNES' BUZZER BEATERS

Freshman Scottie Barnes beat the second half buzzer for the second time in his Seminole career as he made a reverse layup with 0.05 seconds left to play to tie Florida State's game against Wake Forest at 80-80, sending the game into overtime on February 13. Barnes hit a contested running jumper for the game winning basket against Indiana in the ACC/Big 10 Challenge on December 9 with 1.8 seconds remaining in overtime to give the Seminoles the 69-67 win in Tallahassee.

BARNES AS FLORIDA STATE'S THIRD CONSECUTIVE ACC SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR

Freshman Scottie Barnes was named the ACC Sixth Man of The Year, and in doing so, became the third consecutive Seminole player to earn the award. He joins Mfiondu Kabengele (2019) and Patrick Williams (2020) as the only three Seminoles who have won the award. Both Kabengele (28th by the New Jersey Nets and traded on draft night to the Los Angeles Clippers) and Williams (4th overall by the Chicago Bulls) were both first round draft choices and are playing in the NBA. Neither Kabengele nor Williams ever started a game during their Florida State careers.

BARNES FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Freshman Scottie Barnes is a perfect six of six from the free throw line in the last two games and enters the 2021 NCAA Tournament having made nine of his last 10 free throw attempts (.900 percent) since March 6 against Notre Dame. He is 14 of 16 from the free throw line (.875 percent) in the last seven games.

BALSA'S DOUBLE DOUBLES

Sophomore Balsa Koprivica averaged 14.0 points and 10.5 rebounds and he totaled a double double in both of Florida State's game against North Carolina and Georgia Tech. It marked the first time in his career that he totaled double doubles in consecutive games with all three of his double doubles coming against ACC competition.

Leonard Hamilton's Naismith Hall of Fame Candidacy An Interesting Case

North Carolina basketball coach Roy Williams could have started his postgame press conference after last Saturday's win over Florida State on any number of topics.

He could have addressed the importance of the victory, a signature upset of the Seminoles that greatly improved his team's NCAA Tournament standing.

He could have discussed how the win made him the fastest Division-I coach to reach 900 wins in college basketball history.

Instead, he chose to first sing the praises of the man he coached against that day, FSU Coach Leonard Hamilton.

"Leonard Hamilton deserves to be in the Hall of Fame," Williams said to begin his postgame press conference.

"He's a good friend, has been a friend for a long time, when I was starting out at North Carolina, he was at Kentucky, but what he's done and his record. Guys, more than likely he's gonna win the league again this year, second year in a row. It's hard, there's 15 teams in this league. That right there is really, really hard.

"He lost two or three guys that were drafted, two I know at least in the first round, but he came back again. He's playing 10, 11 guys all the time. He is a Hall of Fame coach and I feel very honored and blessed to call him a friend. We got lucky today, they didn't do what he normally does in the second half, but that's a Hall of Fame coach out there and I hope that that works out for him in the voting because he really deserves it."

Will Leonard Hamilton make the Hall of Fame?

Hamilton is on the ballot for the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame for the first time this year. He was announced as one of the 55 male nominees for the 2021 class -- a list that includes players, coaches and referees -- in December.

He's expected to find out this month if he's a finalist.

A number of active college coaches have already been inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame. This list includes three ACC coaches in Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (inducted in 2001), Syracuse's Jim Boeheim (2005) and Williams (2007). The last active coaches to be inducted while still coaching were Kansas head coach Bill Self and then-Notre Dame women's basketball coach Muffet McGraw in 2017.

Hamilton realized early in his career that he would likely never get a chance to run a top-notch, elite-level program. He's made his living building programs up from scratch at football schools.

In large part because of this, the Hall of Fame viability of his career is something Hamilton never saw being a real consideration.

"Going to Oklahoma State, I think they might have not been to a postseason tournament in 27 years. Miami hadn't been to the NCAA Tournament since 1962 and I don't know exactly where Florida State was in the hierarchy of the ACC," Hamilton said on this week's ACC conference call.

"So in my wildest dreams, I never thought my name would ever be associated with anything that has anything to do with the Hall of Fame, other than maybe someone leaving me a ticket at will call when I go to the ceremony."

The debate surrounding Hamilton and his Hall of Fame case is an interesting one. He's the winningest coach in FSU history and the fifth-winningest coach in ACC history, trailing only Krzyzewski, UNC's Dean Smith, Williams and Maryland's Gary Williams.

Pretty soon into the five-year extension FSU announced it had agreed to with Hamilton this week, he'll join an elite club of college basketball coaches. He's currently at 596 career wins (574 by the NCAA's count due to losing all 22 wins from the 2006-07 season due to an FSU academic fraud scandal).

Within the next few years, he'll reach 600 career wins, something only 41 D-I coaches have done in college basketball history.

In true Hamilton form, he credits much of what he's accomplished throughout his lengthy coaching career to those around him.

"If I'm fortunate enough to have that (Hall of Fame) honor, I will cherish it because I realize it won't be as much me as it would have been the parents who trusted me with their players, the assistant coaches that I've had with me who have been loyal and worked hard and put up with my idiosyncrasies, my somewhat aloof, sometimes intense personality," Hamilton said.

"I'm sure sometimes they look back saying, 'Oh my god, how's he gonna be today?' For the families of the coaches that have been with me, tolerating the times away from home and my family, all those people, this is what it would be for. Whatever the award looks like, I need to cut it up, give everybody a piece because they would have worked just as hard to be a part of whatever accomplishments that I achieved.

"I'm flattered, I appreciate what Roy said, but I really don't have a real thought other than it would mean an awful lot to everybody whose shoulders I stand on, the families the players, my assistant coaches and their families. They've been a part of the journey as much as I have been."

What could keep Hamilton out of the Hall of Fame?

A potential knock against Hamilton's Hall of Fame candidacy is that he's never led one of his teams to even a Final Four. He helped lead Kentucky to four Final Fours and an NCAA Championship in 1978 as an assistant coach and has led his teams to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, but he's never gotten one of his teams to a Final Four.

He missed the best chance of his career to lead a team to the Final Four last year when the coronavirus pandemic canceled the tournament after he led the Seminoles to the program's first ACC regular-season championship.

But here is FSU -- despite plenty of departures from last year's team -- once more positioned for an ACC Championship and a deep run in March Madness.

"For me to be even in the conversation is far greater than anything I had ever expected to be. What I'm not going to do is change my thought process and my focus, just try to keep doing what we've done," Hamilton said.

"Because I'm flattered that my name is being associated with some of the greatest coaches in the history of college basketball, but my number is not going to be the same because I haven't had the luxury of being at (elite) programs. And I'm not worried about it. I enjoy what I do, working with youngsters, trying to create the atmosphere that helps them prepare themselves for life after basketball. That's what I enjoy doing."

Hamilton will find out if he's a finalist this weekend in conjunction with NBA All-Star Weekend in Atlanta.

If a finalist, he'll find out if he will be a part of the 2021 Hall of Fame class in conjunction with the Final Four in early April.

How perfect a moment would it be if Hamilton learned this news while leading a team to the Final Four for the first time?

We'll just have to see if Cinderella's slipper -- an analogy befitting both March madness and Hamilton's career -- fits.

Malik Osborne Is Looking To Create Change On FSU's Anti-Racism Task Force

The intersection between sports and political issues is not a brand new landscape.

In the past, sports figures such as Muhammad Ali, Bill Russell, Jim Brown made their voices heard in the 1960s with the hopes of bringing change to a variety of different social issues.

Recently, Lakers star LeBron James has become an activist on police brutality and racial injustice after the police shooting of Jacob Blake in Wisconsin last summer.

Florida State junior forward Malik Osborne is looking to follow in Ali, Russell, Brown, and James' footsteps as he is already bringing change to the school's campus.

Osborne is one of the 30 members on FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force, which engages the faculty, staff, and student communities to have open dialogues about racism, diversity, and inclusion at the university. The purpose of the Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force is to identify sources of systemic racism and other areas of need and ways to improve the diversity climate around the campus.

FSU President John Thrasher asked Osborne if he wanted to be part of the committee, and he quickly accepted the prestigious honor.

"It was an extreme honor, and I told my parents about it, and my parents were so happy and proud of me," Osborne told the *Democrat*. "I told Coach Ham how thankful I was and President Thrasher to be a part of such an exclusive committee and be a part of a group of members who can insight change around the campus that's been around since before I've been around. So it was such a special honor to be a part of, and it is special to be around a group that has such a strong voice around campus."

FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force usually has Zoom meetings a few times each month. The main objectives of the task force are to have an open forum where they hear from the student body or just locals around Tallahassee who have issues or complaints or just concerns about things on campus that might be racially insensitive.

One of the controversial decisions made in the task force meetings was removing Francis W. Eppes' name from the College of Criminology building and permanently removing the Eppes statue from campus. They also recommended the removal of B.K. Roberts' name from a College of Law building.

While some maybe have questioned why FSU would remove old names and statues from buildings, Osborne said it is important to make the campus as safe and comfortable as possible for the students.

"I believe it's critical because you don't want people to come to your school and feel like it's an uncomfortable learning environment because it shoves them away and limits their potential as well," Osborne said. I feel like listening to everyone's concerns, no matter if we agree with it or not is vital because you don't know if someone has the same viewpoint or the same perceive because they're not speaking up.

"So with the removal of the Eppes statue and the name on the building, that's a big step just to show how serious this task is and how serious we are about making change. We want people to know when they come to us; it is going to be a meaningful interaction. When they say something, they're going to be heard, and we are the voice of the student body and bring this to President Thrasher, who has a lot of other responsibilities, but this is just another responsibility that we bring to him.

"This is where a lot of people in the student body have been saying, and we should probably look into it because we are a top 20 university in the nation, so we want to uphold this reputation and continue to strive to be higher because we want to create a comfortable work environment and we want to have a great student life as well because that's what makes Florida State, Florida State."

Osborne started becoming aware of the social issues around him back when he was going up in Matteson, Illinois. He would listen to stories from not only his parents but his grandparents about all of the racial issues surrounding them from when they were kids. After listening to those stories, Osborne wanted to be part of the change. Even on a gameday, Osborne took part in an anti-racism task force conference call just hours before the Seminoles played Miami on Feb. 24.

Not only does Osborne have the support of his teammates, but also the FSU coaches.

"Malik is an extremely intelligent youngster, extremely competitive," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "He has a deep respect for doing what's right. He's the kind of guy that does well in the classroom and is also a leader on the team."

"He has that ability to make the right decisions about things. And he stands for the things that are right. I'm very proud of the fact that he's matured enough to want to be a part of the solution and not one of those guys interested in being part of the problem. He knows if he isn't doing anything, then he's not contributing."

Not only does Osborne want to walk in James' footsteps as a basketball player, but he also admires what the NBA All-Star does off the court.

That's why Osborne has been meeting with Thrasher on his own time about social issues that are bothering Osborne and other students around campus. Thrasher hopes he and Osborne can continue to create change for the diverse student body at FSU.

"It's been a pleasure to get to know Malik over the past couple of years," Thrasher said in a statement. "While Malik may be well-known for his basketball talents, he's also an outstanding young man."

"I'm so proud of his commitment to tackle issues of racial inequity and injustice. His service on Florida State's anti-racism task force will help ensure a more diverse and inclusive campus for future generations."

While Osborne wants to continue to play basketball at a high level as long as he can, he also wants to continue to bring about change to the FSU campus even after he leaves Tallahassee. He plans on not only influencing the students there at FSU now but into the future.

The deaths of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, had a major effect on Osborne. While some have told athletes to "shut up and dribble," Osborne hopes he continues to make his mark as a student-athlete on and off of the court.

"I want to be able to voice these opinions because I know it is my opinion, but these are the opinions of others as well. I just wanted to share my opinion and other's opinions of how demoralizing, hurtful, and how shocking it is to continue to see this as it almost seems like a trend of police brutality, especially when minorities and African-Americans."

"These stories of racial inequality and police brutality have affected me but has motivated me to go harder for the task force and not be afraid to speak up. If I don't speak up about social issues, then no one is going to know."

"The campus has been around for so long it is not going to be a percent, and it is going to be some changes that need to be made along the way. If this group stays around, who knows, there might be some more changes that may be implemented even after I leave from Florida State."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game. NOTRE DAME, Ind. -- Prentiss Hubb scored 22 points, Dane Goodwin had 15 and Notre Dame beat No. 11 Florida State 83-73. The Fighting Irish had five players score in double figures in the program's first win against a ranked team since a 67-66 victory over Wichita State in November 2017. Cormac Ryan, Nikola Djogo and Nate Laszewski had 11 points apiece for Notre Dame, which had dropped four in a row. Juwan Durham had nine points and nine rebounds. The Fighting Irish went 28 for 34 at the free-throw line, compared to 15 for 20 for the Seminoles. Scottie Barnes led Florida State with 17 points. RaiQuan Gray added 15 points and 10 rebounds. M.J. Walker had 12 points on 4-for-16 shooting. Notre Dame led by as many as 20 on its way to a 47-31 halftime lead. Florida State closed to 74-70 on Anthony Polite's 3-pointer with 2:34 left. But Laszewski hit four foul shots down the stretch to help the Irish close it out.

Game 21 -- Florida State 69, North Carolina 66

GREENSBORO, N.C. -- Anthony Polite hit the go-ahead 3-pointer with 2:06 left, and Florida State defeated the Tar Heels 69-66 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament and earned a matchup with Georgia Tech in the ACC Championship game. Balsa Koprivica had career highs of 17 points and 11 rebounds for his second career double-double to lead the second-seeded Seminoles. The Seminoles clamped down defensively late, holding the Tar Heels to one field goal over the final four minutes. The sixth-seeded Tar Heels had a chance for a desperation play to tie it with one second left, but Anthony Harris couldn't catch Leaky Black's half-court pass to get up a tying 3-pointer. That set up Florida State's matchup with Georgia Tech, which advanced when its semifinal game against No. 16 Virginia was canceled due to a positive COVID-19 test, quarantining and contact tracing within the Cavaliers program. Caleb Love scored 13 points to lead the Tar Heels, who shot 34 percent for the

game and made just 1 of 8 shots as this one slipped away. Fellow freshman Kerwin Walton scored all 11 of his points after halftime. North Carolina led 64-62 on three free throws by RJ Davis with 3:14 left, but didn't score again until trailing by four in the final five seconds.
