



2021 FLORIDA STATE FOOTBALL



FINAL: CLEMSON 30, FSU 20

- » Florida State finished with a season-high 11 tackles for loss, with three sacks. Jermaine Johnson II had 2.0 TFL and a 12-yard strip-sack fumble that he recovered and returned six yards for a touchdown. It was FSU's first fumble return for a touchdown since 2017 and Johnson is the first Nole since Reggie Northrup in 2014 against Wake Forest to force and recover a fumble and return it for a touchdown.
- » Johnson is the first FSU player with a sack, forced fumble, fumble recovery and a touchdown on the same play since Chris Casher in 2013 against Syracuse.
- » Johnson's 11.0 tackles for loss this season lead the team and are the most for a Seminole since Brian Burns had 15.5 in 2018.
- » Redshirt freshman Lawrance Toafili caught a 75-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Travis. It was the longest catch of his career; the longest pass of Travis's career; and the longest pass for FSU since the 2019 Sun Bowl (91 yards).
- » Florida State has three touchdowns this year of at least 75 yards and six plays of 60 or more yards.
- » FSU scored on its lone Red Zone opportunity, a one-yard touchdown pass from Travis to Jashaun Corbin. FSU has converted 17 consecutive Red Zone opportunities, scoring a total of 105 points on those drives.
- » It is the longest streak for the Seminoles since converting the final 30 Red Zone tries to end the 2016 season.
- » It was the first time this season Clemson has allowed multiple offensive touchdowns at home.
- » Linebacker DJ Lundy led FSU with a career-high 11 tackles. Keir Thomas added six tackles, with a career-high 2.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks. Malcolm Ray entered Saturday with 1.0 TFL in his career and had 1.5 against the Tigers and assisted on his first career sack. In total, nine Noles had at least 0.5 tackles for loss.
- » Omarion Cooper nabbed his first career interception. He is the first true freshman with an interception for FSU since AJ Lytton in 2018.
- » Jammie Robinson forced his second fumble of the season - and third of his career - and Amari Gainer fell on the fumble, his third career recovery. FSU has three takeaways in consecutive games.
- » Florida State held Clemson to a 3-and-out on the opening drive, pushing the Noles streak of scoreless drives to 12.
- » In the last 18 quarters, FSU's defense has held opponents to 17-of-59 (.288) on 3rd-down conversion attempts. Clemson was 4-of-14 Saturday.
- » FSU has not thrown an interception in three straight games for the first time since 2019.
