FINAL: FSU 26, BOSTON COLLEGE 23

- » Florida State improved to 14-5 (.737) all-time against Boston College and 8-3 (.727) in Chestnut Hill. The Noles have won the last two games at Boston College and three straight in the series.
- » Quarterback Jordan Travis tied a career high with three passing touchdowns, finishing 20-for-34 with 251 yards. The game was Travis's sixth this season with multiple passing touchdowns and he has now thrown 108 consecutive passes without an interception.
- » Travis's 20 completions are the second-most allowed by Boston College this season. The Eagles entered the week with 139 completions allowed, fewest in the nation. His 251 passing yards are the second-most allowed this year by BC (the Eagles entered Saturday 3rd in the nation, allowing 159.5 passing yards per game).
- » All 24 of FSU's offensive points were scored in the Red Zone as the Seminoles finished 4-for-4 scoring inside the 20. FSU has converted 29 straight Red Zone trips, scoring a total of 174 points on those drives. The Seminoles entered Saturday with the 3rd-longest active streak in the nation.
- » The Seminoles have scored a touchdown on 28-of-39 Red Zone drives in 2021.
- » Three Noles caught a touchdown Saturday, led by Ontaria Wilson's team-high fourth of the year. Lawrance Toafili and Malik McClain both caught their second of the year.
- » Defensive end Keir Thomas set a career high with 3.0 tackles for loss and tied a career high with 2.0 sacks. Thomas has 5.5 sacks over the past four games. His 12.0 tackles for loss trail Jermaine Johnson II (17.0) for the team lead. Johnson had one TFL Saturday and leads the ACC.
- » Derrick McLendon II and Fabien Lovett both had 1.0 sacks at BC. McLendon is third on the team with 3.5 for the season, behind Johnson (11.0) and Thomas (6.5).
- » As a team, FSU set a season high with 11.0 tackles for loss. Linebacker Kalen DeLoach had 2.0, including FSU's first safety of the season on a 6-yard loss in the second quarter.
- » Akeem Dent's interception with 1:42 remaining in the fourth quarter was the first of his career and extended FSU's streak of games with an interception to seven, the longest since 2007. Florida State has recorded 13 total takeaways in the last seven games.
- » Florida State's starting offensive line was LT Robert Scott Jr., LG Dillan Gibbons, C Maurice Smith, RG Brady Scott (in place of Devontay Love-Taylor) and RT Darius Washington. It was FSU's eighth different starting offensive line combination this year.
- » Defensive back Jarques McClellion set a career-high with a team-high eight tackles.
- » Defensive tackle Robert Cooper had a pair of tackles and now has 100 for his Seminole career.
- » FSU's three first-half points allowed were the fewest first-half points allowed in an ACC road game since 2017 against Duke (also 3)
- » Punter Alex Mastromanno had four punts downed inside the 20, including three inside the 10. Mastromanno has 87 consecutive punts without a touchback (the only touchback of his career was vs. Georgia Tech in 2020, his first collegiate game)
- » Tight end Preston Daniel caught a five-yard pass in the second quarter, his first of the year. On the season, 15 Seminoles have caught a pass and 11 have at least one receiving touchdown.
- » Jadarius Green-McKnight made his first appearance of the season.
- » Saturday's loss was BC's first this season started by quarterback Phil Jurkovec (now 4-1).
