



2021 FLORIDA STATE FOOTBALL



FINAL: FLORIDA 24, FSU 21

- » Quarterback Jordan Travis finished 18-for-29 for 202 yards and a touchdown pass and added 102 rushing yards and a touchdown on the ground. His 9-yard touchdown run tied the game in the second quarter and was his 17th career rushing touchdown, tied for 16th on FSU's career list.
- » With 102 rushing yards, Travis now ranks 19th in ACC history for career rushing yards by a quarterback with 1,357. Travis had three 100-yard rushing games this season.
- » Jermaine Johnson II had 6 tackles, including 1.0 sack, his 12th of the year. Johnson II leads the ACC in sacks (12.0) and ranks 9th in FSU history in a single season (tied with Jamal Reynolds in 2000 and Ron Simmons in 1977).
- » Florida State forced three interceptions on three straight drives in the first half. The three interceptions are the Seminoles' most this season.
- » Florida State has grabbed an interception in eight straight games, FSU's longest streak with an interception since 2003-04 (10; bowl game in 2003, first nine games of 2004). Entering Saturday, FSU's seven-game streak was the 3rd-longest active in the country, trailing only Vanderbilt and Pitt with 8.
- » Jammie Robinson earned his team-high fourth interception to go along with career-high and game-high 18 tackles. It was Robinson's fourth game this year with at least 10 tackles, tied for the most in the ACC, and the most for a Seminole since Hamsah Nasirildeen had 22 at Boston College in 2019.
- » Kalen DeLoach notched his first career interception, the first for a Seminole linebacker since Dontavious Jackson at Notre Dame in 2018. Jarvis Brownlee Jr. intercepted his second pass of the season and third of his career.
- » Florida State has recorded 16 total takeaways over the last eight games.
- » Robinson (18), DeLoach (8), Omarion Cooper (5) and Quashon Fuller (3) all set or matched their career-high tackles.
- » Florida State has converted 32 straight Red Zone trips, scoring a total of 195 points on those drives. The Noles have the longest active streak in the country and the 2nd-longest this season (Oklahoma 44). FSU last converted 32 straight Red Zone chances in 2014.
- » The Seminoles scored a touchdown on 31-of-42 Red Zone drives in 2021. FSU's 73.8 Red Zone touchdown percentage ranks first in the ACC.
- » Ontaria Wilson caught three passes for 50 yards and a touchdown. His 36-yard reception in the third quarter pushed him past 1,000 for his career (now has 1,026). He led FSU with five touchdown catches in 2021.
- » Treshaun Ward scored on a 19-yard run in the fourth quarter, his fourth rushing touchdown of the year.
- » Florida State allowed just 3.0 yards per rush Saturday (46 carries for 139 yards). Florida entered the game averaging 215.4 rushing yards per game and 5.7 yards per carry.
- » Alex Mastromanno's 62-yard punt in the first quarter, downed at the four-yard line, was the second-longest of his career (65 vs. Jacksonville State, 2021). Mastromanno also had a 35-yard punt that was downed at the one-yard line.
- » Mastromanno has 93 consecutive punts without a touchback. The only touchback of his career was vs. Georgia Tech in 2020, his first collegiate game.
