FLORIDA STATE BACK HOME TO FACE BOSTON UNIVERSITY IN TUCKER CENTER

Florida State, which won the championship of the Inaugural Jacksonville Classic with victories over Loyola Marymount (73-45, Nov. 21) and Missouri (81-58, Nov. 22) plays host to Boston University on Wednesday, November 24, 2021 at 7:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The game between the Seminoles and the Terriers matches the two bracket champions (Florida State / Duval Bracket and Boston University / Jax Bracket) from the Jacksonville Classic, which was held at the UNF Arena in Jacksonville, Fla. With a 2-0 record the Seminoles emerged as the Duval Bracket Champions (Missouri, 1-1, Loyola Marymount, 1-1, SMU 0-2). With a 2-0 record, the Terriers won the Jax Bracket (Boston University, 2-0, Sam Houston, 1-1, Arkansas Little Rock, 1-1, Northern Illinois, 0-2). Both the Seminoles and the Terriers were awarded trophies as the champions from their respective brackets. Wednesday's game is not a winner-take-all contest. Following Wednesday's game against Boston University, the Seminoles travel top play at Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge on Tuesday, November 30 at 7:30 p.m.

SEMINOLES' OSBORNE NAMED JACKSONVILLE CLASSIC MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne, who led the Seminoles to victories over Loyola Marymount and Missouri, was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Duval Bracket of the Jacksonville Classic. He averaged 10.0 points and 5.5 rebounds while shooting .600 percent from the field (six of 10) and .800 percent from the 3-point line (four of five). He was also perfect from the free throw line as he was four of four in the Seminoles' victory over Missouri in Monday's championship game. The Seminoles defeated Loyola Marymount (73-45, +28) and Missouri (81-58, +23) as they enjoyed a +25.5 margin of victory in the two games of the Jacksonville Classic played at the UNF Arena.

FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON UNIVERSITY – CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays host to Boston University in the final round of the Jacksonville Classic on November 24, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles are 1-1 all-time against the Terriers with both games – an 86-52 win on December 20, 1955 coming at the Carousel Classic in Charlotte, N.C. and an 84-69 loss on December 28, 2002 coming in the Fiesta Bowl Classic in Tempe, Ariz. The Terriers are coached by Joe Jones who is in his 11th season at Boston University. He was the Associate Head Coach at Boston College for two seasons (2010-11) – the Seminoles were 3-0 against the Eagles (including 2-0 at the Donald L. Tucker Center) while Jones was on the Eagles' staff. Walt Corbean, an assistant coach on Jones' staff is familiar with Florida State as he spent six seasons (2008-13) at Wake Forest, first as the Director of Operations and his final two as an assistant coach. The Seminoles were 6-4 overall (2-1 at the Donald L. Tucker Center) against the Deacons with Corbean on their staff.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 79-4 (.952 winning percentage) in its last 83 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Boston University having won .951 percent of their overall games (79-4) and .935 percent of their ACC games (43-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season.

FLORIDA STATE'S NOVEMBER HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State plays host to Boston University looking to win its 21st consecutive home game on the month of November. The Seminoles' winning streak includes: 2014-15 (The Citadel, Charleston Southern), 2015-16 (Nicholls State, Jacksonville), 2016-17 (Charleston Southern, Iona, Winthrop, Detroit Mercy, and Minnesota), 2017-18 (George Washington, Kennesaw State, The Citadel), 2018-19 (Florida, Canisius), 2019-20 (Western Carolina, Chattanooga, Saint Francis, Chicago State) and 2021-22 (Penn and Tulane).

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS

With 28 blocked shots in its first five games of the season, Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Boston University as the ACC leaders in blocked shots with a 5.6 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles have received blocked shots from 12 different players and are led by freshman John Butler who has blocked six shots. The Seminoles have blocked at least three shots in each of their first five games and blocked a season-high nine shots in their victory over Tulane on November 17.

CONVERSLY, SEMINOLES ARE TOUGH TO BLOCK

Florida State has had only 16 of their 293 shots blocked so far this season (less than five percent) and did not have a blocked shot in either of its two games in the Jacksonville Classic.

FLORIDA STATE HEATING UP FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State was as hot as Jacksonville in the summer-time from the 3-point line against Loyola Marymount (eight of 19) and Missouri (10 of 24) in the Jacksonville Classic. The Seminoles shot a combined .419 from the 3-point line (18 of 43) in Jacksonville (their last two games) as compared to .338 in their first three games of the season. Three Seminoles – Malik Osborne (nine), Antony Polite (six) and Caleb Mills (five) – have made at least five shots from the bonusphere in the first five games of the season. Florida Stats has made nearly as many 3-point shots in its last two games (18) as it did in its first three games (20) on 16 fewer attempts.

FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSE FORCING TURNOVERS

Florida State forced 24 turnovers in its victory over Loyola Marymount on Sunday in the Jacksonville Classic – the second time this season it has forced 24 or more turnovers in a games. The Seminoles' defense forced Penn into 26 turnovers in their 105-70 season-opening victory over the Quakers. Florida State is forcing an average of 19.0 turnovers and scoring an average of 25.0 points per game off of those turnovers in its first five games of the season.

SEMINOLES HAVE THREE DIFFERENT LEADING SCORERS IN FIRST FOUR GAMES

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite led the Seminoles in scoring in Florida State's win over Missouri to mark their fourth different leading scorer in their first five games of the season. The Seminoles totaled nine different leading scorers in 25 games during the 2020-21 season. Matthew Cleveland led the Seminoles in scoring in the their win over Loyola Marymount – he became the first freshman to lead Florida State in scoring since Scottie Barnes led the Seminoles with 21 points in the 2021 ACC Tournament Championship game against Georgia Tech.

SEMINOLES IN THE SPIRIT OF THE GIVING SEASON

Florida State has earned 81 assists (16.2 apg), has a positive assist:turnover ratio (1.1:1), has nearly twice as many assists as its opponents (81-46) and has earned an assist on more than half of its baskets (81 of 141) through its first five games of the season. Florida State earned a season-high of 21 assists (on 29 baskets) in its 73-45 win over Loyola Marymount on November 21. As individuals, 15 of Florida State's 17 players who have earned action in the five first games of the season have at least one assist, with thee already in double figures for assists (RayQuan Evans, 17; Caleb Mills, 12; Anthony Polite, 11).

FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON UNIVERSITY – THE LAST MEETING

Matt Turner, Billy Collins and Chaz Carr each sank four 3-pointers and Boston University pulled away to beat Florida State 84-69 on December 20, 2002 in the opening of the Fiesta Bowl Classic. Boston University sank four consecutive 3-pointers - two each by Carr and Collins - in 12-2 surge to take control for good 68-58 with 5:54 left in the game. Florida State was playing its first season under coach Leonard Hamilton. The Terriers made a season-high 14 3-pointers in 33 attempts, compared with Florida State's 4-for-14. Turner led Boston with 18 points, including 4-of-10 3's. Collins added 15 points and six assists and sank 4-of-8 3-pointers. Carr was 0-for-5 inside the 3-point line, but 4-for-7 outside it for 12 points. He also had six assists. Anthony Richardson scored 13 and Michael Joiner 11 for the Seminoles.

Tanor Ngom: Much To Be Thankful For At Thanksgiving

TALLAHASSEE, Fla (seminole.com) -- After spending three years in Canada on Ryerson University's basketball team, Tanor Ngom is ready to make his mark in his second season as a member of the Florida State basketball team.

Ngom is as thankful as any player on the Seminoles' roster for his teammates and coaches during this season of giving. As Florida State takes the court on the night before Thanksgiving against Boston University at the Donald L. Tucker Center at 7:00 p.m., Ngom knows that he has so many people to thank for his successes, not just as a basketball player but academically as well.

Ngom was named to the 2021 ACC Academic Honor Roll and will earn his bachelor's degree in Social Science this spring. While earning his degree from Florida State, he will help the Seminoles compete for ACC and national championships.

"I was looking for a place to better my basketball career," said Ngom. "I couldn't say no to a bigger platform to showcase what I could do," he said about his 2020 transfer to Tallahassee and Florida State.

Competing as a member of the Florida State basketball team has helped the redshirt senior become a better player.

During the 2020-21 season, he worked to adapt to the level of play, talent on the team, and speed of the game at Florida State and in the Atlantic Coast Conference. It was a huge step-up and the way he saw the game changed drastically.

Last season, Ngom averaged less than eight minutes of playing time per game as part of the plan to change his body.

Ngom is tall and long and gaining weight has been difficult throughout his life. He worked on being consistent in the weight room and gained twenty pounds in the last year.

This season Ngom is working to be a defensive anchor for the Seminoles.

Coming from Canada, he felt that he was always the underdog as a basketball player.

"People said I was crazy signing at Florida State and was never going to see the court here," said Ngom. "That sentiment is insane because of the time and skill I have and work I've put in to becoming a better player. This is my season to pay off."

Ngom is working this season to be the best leader possible. He has goals to win championships and get three rings.

"I am not one of the young guys anymore as a fifth year senior," said Ngom. "I want to be the best example for the guys and so many others. In a game, I know how to talk to certain players and get the best out of them. I like bringing energy."

Ngom knows that being part of a team sport helps you learn how to become a team player.

For Ngom, playing basketball is about the friendships and people you meet. He speaks five languages and enjoys teaching each one to his teammates.

Competing in a team sport opens your mind and helps you grow as a person by learning from others.

“The relationships you make are something different,” said Ngom. “Seeing different personalities come together for one common goal by people that would never normally be friends is an amazing feeling.”

In Ngom’s eyes, there are three qualities that are important for a team: honesty, maturity, humility.

“If I’m not doing my job, tell me I’m not doing my job but be mature about the way you tell me I’m not doing my job,” said Ngom.

Going from being the guy to one of the guys was challenging for Ngom following his transfer from an NAIA school (Ryerson) to an NCAA school (Florida State). Learning to take criticism from his teammates was a huge part of last year.

When he began to understand what they said over how they said it, he started to play better and earned a spot in the starting five this season.

Ngom was not always in love with the game of basketball. After his sister came back home to Senegal from her pro basketball season in France, she terrorized him on the basketball court.

“I was getting better and started training,” said Ngom. “It all began from there. People started seeing me. I was 7 foot already at 15 years old. I had the talent and height.”

Realizing he was good at the game, he kept going.

Ngom has grown to love playing the game of basketball. He wants to continue playing at the next level after college to become a pro basketball player.

“I want to help my family, help my mom and give her the best life possible,” said Ngom.

In the future, he aspires to continue his education in law school.

Coming from a humble household, he wants to be smart with his money.

“I am going to make my money and take care of my people,” Ngom said.

On the court, Ngom is committed to the game but off the court he is dedicated to his family.

A typical day for him back home in Senegal revolves around getting breakfast with his four sisters and hanging out with his little brother.

“I tried to teach him some basketball and even had a little hoop for him,” said Ngom.

It has been five and half years since Ngom has gone home. He is now an entirely new person and knows a different lifestyle but still looks forward to returning back to Senegal. He is hoping to return after he graduates this summer and before he settles into his new path next year.

The hardest part of flourishing in America for Ngom is being away from his mom. Growing up, they did not have much but she was always there for him. He recalls that most people in Senegal did not have freezers, but his mom worked hard to buy one. She then sold ice on the streets in Senegal so the family could eat every day.

“I did not know I was poor as a kid,” said Ngom. “My mom would go hungry and I didn’t know. She managed everything and did the most for me.”

Ngom’s mom is his biggest inspiration and why he wants to excel.

“I am doing this for her,” Ngom said.

As Ngom competes in the 2021-2022 season, it is anticipated that his hard work will pay off making his family even more proud of him.
