NO. 19/20 SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO GAINESVILLE TO FACE FLORIDA AT EXACTECH ARENA

No. 19/20 Florida State, which earned a resounding 105-70 win over Penn on Wednesday in its season-opener in Tallahassee, travels to play at Florida on Sunday November 14, 2021. The Seminoles enter their first road game of the season having won a school-record seven consecutive games in the series – each game since the 2014-15 season. The Seminoles' seven game winning streak ties the all-time series record for consecutive wins by one team. Florida won seven consecutive times against Florida State from February 23, 1965 through February 21, 1968. Following Sunday's game against Florida, the Seminoles play host to Tulane at 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 17 in Tallahassee at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

FLORIDA STATE VS. FLORIDA – CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays its first road game of the season on November 14, 2021 at the University of Florida – one of five regular season games scheduled against teams from the state of Florida. The Seminoles have won a school record seven consecutive games against the Gators a streak that includes a win in each game of the series since December 30, 2014. During their current seven-game winning streak (which began in Tallahassee in 2014), the Seminoles have won four games in Tallahassee and three games in Gainesville. With the Seminoles' 83-71 win over the Gators in Tallahassee in 2020, Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton has won a school-record 11 games against Florida. The Gators are coached by Mike White, who is in his seventh season at Florida. White is 1-7 against Florida State during his career with a 1-2 record against the Seminoles while he was at Louisiana Tech (two NIT games) and an 0-5 record as the head coach at Florida. Al Pinkins, who is in his fourth season as Florida's associate head coach is 0-3 as a member of the Gators' staff against Florida State. Pinkins played for two seasons at NC State (1996 and 1997) against Florida State in the ACC. The Wolfpack and Pinkins were 3-2 against the Seminoles during his playing career.

HAMILTON IS FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME WININGEST COACH AGAINST FLORIDA

With 11 wins against Florida as the Seminoles' Head Coach, Leonard Hamilton is Florida State's winningest coach against the Gators. The Seminoles' current head coach is 11-8 (.579 winning percentage) against the Gators during his career in Tallahassee and has earned 11 of Florida State's 29 all-time wins against the Gators.

LONGEST WINNING STREAK BY A FLORIDA STATE TEAM AGAINST FLORIDA

The Florida State Women's Volleyball team holds the all-time Seminole record with a 13-game winning streak against the Gators. The current seven-game winning streak by the Seminole men's basketball team is tied for the fifth longest winning streak by any Florida State team against any Florida team in the history of the competition between the two school which are separated by roughly 152 miles.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 380 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the fifth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 375 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Boston College on March 3, 2021.

SEMINOLES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN ACC RACE

Florida State, which has finished in fourth place or higher in the ACC Basketball standings in the last three seasons, has been selected to finish in second place in the 2022 league standings by the attending media at the annual ACC Tip-Off. It's the highest the Seminoles have been predicted to finish a season since joining the league for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles received the second highest point total (1,034) and the second highest total of first place votes in the voting during which 81 total votes were counted. The Seminoles were picked to finish in second place in the ACC standings for the first time in school history. The Seminoles have been picked to finish third in three different seasons (1993, 2012 and 2021) and fourth on two occasions (2009 and 2019). Most recently, the Seminoles were picked to finish in third place in 2021 — they finished in second place in the ACC standings and advanced to play in the ACC Tournament Championship game. Florida State was picked to finish in the fifth spot in 2020 and won the ACC Championship with a 16-4 record. In 2019, the Seminoles were picked to finish in seventh place; they finished fourth and advanced to the ACC Championship game.

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland has been named to the 20-player watch list for the 2022 Julius Erving Award by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The award highlights the best small forward in college basketball. The award will be presented to the nation's top small forward on April 8, 2022 at the College Basketball Awards Show in Los Angeles. Cleveland, who averaged 22.8 points, 10.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 2.0 steals as a senior at Pace High School in Atlanta, is one of seven freshmen and one of only two players from the ACC on the Julius Erving watch list. Cleveland led his team to back-to-back state championships his junior and senior seasons. He was named the 2021 Atlanta area Player of the Year and was selected as the Georgia 2A Player of the Year. Cleveland has joined a growing list of Seminoles placed on preseason award lists under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Scottie Barnes was named to the Bob Cousy Award watch list as the nation's top point guard and M.J. Walker was placed on the Jerry West Award watch list as the nation's top shooting guard for the 2021 season. In 2019, Trent Forrest was named to the Cousy Award watch list. Dwayne Bacon was named to the Jerry West watch list, and Xavier Rathan-Mayes was named to the Cousy watch list in 2016.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 74-20 (.787 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20, were 18-7 during the 2020-21 season and are 1-0 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won more than 81 percent of their games with a record of 35-8 (.814 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 40-13 (.769 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and were 11-4 during the 2020-21 season.

SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 13, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96).

FIRST-TIME SEMINOLES IN FLORIDA STATE'S SEASON-OPENING WIN OVER PENN

Eight different players made their career debuts as Seminoles in Florida State's victory over Penn on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. Caleb Mills earned his first start as a Seminole and totaled 14 points and five rebounds. The Seminoles' pair of transfers — Mills (Houston) and Cam'Ron Fletcher (Kentucky) totaled 23 points, nine rebounds, eight steals and three assists.

FLORIDA STATE VS. FLORIDA – THE LAST MEETING

No. 20 Florida State extended its winning streak to seven over Florida with an 83-71 victory over the Gators at the Donald L. Tucker Center on December 12, 2020. Freshman Scottie Barnes led the team with a career-high 17 points including several highlight reel dunks. Barnes also had five assists, two rebounds, and one steal as he finished as the Seminoles' leader in assists in his only career game against the Gators. The Seminoles recovered from an early eight-point deficit as they closed the first half on a 42-24 run to take a 45-35 lead at the break. Both Barnes (13 first half points) and Anthony Polite (12 first half points) scored in double figures for Florida State in the first half. The Seminoles utilized 12 different players in the first half with eight scoring at least two points.

FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSE EARNS 15 STEALS IN WIN OVER PENN

Led by a career-high five steals by Cam'Ron Fletcher, the Seminoles' defense earned 15 steals in their opening night win over Penn. Florida State's 15 steals led the 26 turnovers by the Quakers. For the Seminoles, eight of the 16 players who earned playing time totaled at least one steal with three players – Fletcher (five), RayQuan Evans (three), and Caleb Mills (two) – earned multiple steals. The Seminoles' 15 steals were their most in a single game since earning 16 steals at North Carolina on February 27, 2021.

LOOKING AT THE MINUTES PLAYED CHART FOR THE SEMINOLES AGAINST PENN

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite scored 17 points in 24 minutes played in the Seminoles' 105-70 win over Penn on Wednesday. He (24 minutes played), Malik Osborne (23 minutes played), Caleb Mills (21 minutes played), and Matthew Cleveland (20 minutes played) were the only players who earned 20 or more minutes of playing time against the Quakers. A total of 10 Seminoles earned 10 or more minutes of playing time (with each of them scoring at least three points) as head coach Leonard Hamilton utilized 16 players in Florida's State's opening night victory.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE AGAINST PENN...

...Florida State's starting lineup (Malik Osborne, Wyatt Wilkes, RayQuan Evans, Anthony Polite, Caleb Mills) shot a combined .512 from the field (22 of 43) and combined to score 67 of Florida State's 105 points (.538 percent);

...Led by Malik Osborne's career-high of seven offensive rebounds, Florida State pulled down 24 offensive rebounds – leading to 27 second chance points;

...Florida State's pair of transfers (Caleb Mills from Houston and Cam'Ron Fletcher from Kentucky) combined to score 23 points, shoot .476 from the field (10 of 21), pull down 10 rebounds and earn seven steals;

MALIK OSBORNE EARNS HIS FLORIDA STATE CAREER NIGHT AGAINST PENN

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne totaled his fourth career double double of 18 points and 13 rebounds in Florida State's victory over Penn. His 18 points rank as his Florida State career-high while his 13 rebounds tied his overall career-high. Osborne scored his career-high of 22 points against Marshall as a freshman at Rice during his freshman season (2017-18).

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne's double double of 18 points and 13 rebounds was the first opening day double double for the Seminoles since Okaro White earned an 18-point, 11 rebound double double in Florida State's 91-67 season-opening win over Jacksonville on November 8, 2013.

POLITE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite scored 17 points in Florida State's season-opening win over Penn – with nine of his points coming via the 3-point line with three made 3-point shots. It marked the eighth time in his career that he has made three or more 3-point field goals in a single game. In his past three games (against Penn this season and against Colorado and Michigan in the 2021 NCAA Tournament), Polite is shooting .571 from the 3-point line (11 of 14) and averaging 16.0 points scored per game.

POLITE INTO FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME TOP 20 FOR CAREER 3-POINTT PERCENTAGE

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite, who is shooting 45 percent from the 3-point line in the last two seasons (37 of 82, .451 percent) enters Sunday's game against Florida ranked 18th in school history with a career long range shooting percentage of .366. Freshman Jalen Warley was a perfect four of four from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over Penn and enters Sunday's game against Florida having made four consecutive free throws.

Anthony Polite's FSU Journey Has Led Him To His Current Role As A Team Leader

TALLAHASSEE -- **Florida State** officially tips off the 2021-22 season on Wednesday evening at 9 p.m. when they host **Penn.** It will mark the start of the fifth season in a Seminole uniform for guard Anthony Polite.

"It's been a long journey. It's been fun. It's been a process of learning a lot. Now I feel like I'm the vet," Polite said recently. "I'm teaching somebody that is just coming in, like I once was, what it is to go through the process and what it is to be a Florida State player and to just keep building the culture."

Polite, who has already earned his degree, is a student on the court as much as he is off of it. He has played alongside many talented players in his time at FSU. He took their advice, worked hard at his craft, and now it is his turn to be one of the guys at the forefront of FSU's consistent success.

The Switzerland native averaged a career-high 10.1 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.4 steals per game last season. He hit 34 3-point shots in a season for the second time in his career, while shooting 43.6% from beyond the arc. His best ball came late in FSU's season and during the NCAA Tournament. Most of all during 2021, Polite learned to find his own voice. He became more vocal in games, practices, and with how FSU went about their business. Being vocal and direct with his teammates is something that Polite has had to become comfortable with doing.

"It's something I've developed. Obviously when I was a new guy here, that's not who I am, to just go up and start telling other people what to do. I've learned. I've seen other guys help me out when I was struggling," Polite said. "I feel like I'm doing the same here, right now, when I see somebody that could correct some stuff, or improve, or do some things better. I'll go up to them and let them know what they can do better and how to improve."

FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton has seen the growth in the 6-foot-6, 214-pound guard.

"He is a leader in so many different ways," Hamilton said. "He understands our system as well as anybody. He knows what we're looking for. Being that we have such a large amount of first-year players that we need to have integrated into our system, he has been invaluable with his knowledge and his consistent voice in their ears on a consistent basis.

"As far as his contribution on the basketball court, I mean he just gives you whatever you need," Hamilton continued. "He's a confident, knockdown 3-point shooter. He's probably our best on-the-ball defender. He's consistently executing in our system. He very seldom ever makes a mistake."

Back in 2019, Polite was averaging just 2.7 points as an end of the bench reserve. In 2020, he was called upon more as a reserve, averaging 5.8 points per game, while he also became known as a 3-and-D type player that season. That role only further expanded last season. It is all part of his evolution as a Seminole.

"I feel like you just have to find your niche, that which kind of defines you, and then from there you can expand your role as things go," Polite said. "I feel like my niche has been playing defense, hard defense.

"As I had an opportunity to get into games my first year and my second year, I had a chance to show the coaches they can trust me. From there, I worked to expand my game and it's shown through the years. I've developed my game from just playing defense to shooting the ball to play-making and becoming more and more of a complete player," Polite added.

Polite adds that during last season, he watched more film than ever before and lived in the gym constantly. That extra time and effort, combined with being as healthy as he had been in his career, led to a breakout season.

"I knew I was becoming more and more confident," Polite said. "It just makes it to where you don't think too much during the games. You just go out there, just focus on the little details, and the offense takes care of itself." He is hoping to carry his success over to 2021-22. Polite is one of the faces of the team, even if he doesn't desire such a spotlight. More importantly though, he is an unquestioned leader.

"When he is in those huddles with our guys, and when he is in the locker room, or back in the apartment, he's speaking with wisdom and experience," Hamilton said. "I'm excited for him and for us."

"I feel very fortunate that we have a guy with his character, his abilities and his experience, as being part of our leadership crew."
