FLORIDA STATE TO FACE MISSOURI FOR CHAMPIONSHIP OF JACKSONVILLE CLASSIC

Florida State, which defeated Loyola Marymount by a 73-45 score on Sunday, faces Missouri of the SEC in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic by Fabletics on Monday, November 22, 2021 at 8:30 p.m. The Seminoles are looking to earn their sixth in-season tournament championship under 20th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles most recently won the championship of the Emerald Coast Classic in Destin, Fla., with wins over Chattanooga, Chicago State, Tennessee and Purdue. With victories over Tulane (November 17) and Loyola Marymount (November 21), the Seminoles play in Monday's game against Missouri having won two straight and three of their first four games of the season. Following Monday's game against Missouri, the Seminoles will return home to face Boston University on Wednesday, November 24 at 7:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MISSOURI – CONNECTIONS

Florida State will face Missouri in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic on November 22, 2021 at the UNF Arena. The game will mark the fifth meeting between the two teams with Florida State holding a 3-1 advantage and having won three consecutive games in the series entering the game in the Jacksonville Classic. The Seminoles and Tigers most recently met in the 2018 NCAA Tournament – a 67-54 Seminole win at the Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tenn., on March 16, 2018. The Tigers are coached by Cuonzo Martin who is in his fifth season as the Tigers' head coach. He is 0-1 against Florida State with his lone game as a head coach coming in the 2018 NCAA Tournament. Cornell Mann, an assistant on Martin's staff, was on the Missouri staff in 2018 when Florida State defeated Missouri in the NCAA Tournament. Chris Hollender, also an assistant coach on the Missouri staff, has coached against Florida State at two stops: Missouri (in the 2018 NCAA Tournament) and at Mississippi State (a regular season win for the Bulldogs on January 2, 2015). Assistant Coach Marco-Harris-Stevens was the Tigers' Director of Player Development in 2018 when the two teams met in the NCAA Tournament, as was Paul Rorvig – Missouri's Director of Basketball Operations.

FLORIDA STATE DEFENSIVELY IN ITS WIN OVER LOYOLA MARYMOUNT

Florida State limited Loyola Marymount to 45 points on .364 shooting from the field and .273 shooting from the 3-point line on Sunday in the semifinals of the Jacksonville Classic. The Seminoles limited the Lions to 17 first half points on six made field goals (six of 19, .316 percent). The Lions scored eight points in the first 1:36 of the first half and were limited to a total of nine points in the final 18:24 of the half. Florida State's defense limited the Lions to their nine points on three made field goals while outscoring the team from California by a 30-9 margin to close the half. The Seminoles forced Loyola in 24 turnovers and totaled 33 points off their 24 turnovers. Florida State forced Penn into a season-high 26 turnovers in its 105-70 win over the Quakers in Tallahassee on November 10.

FLORIDA STATE SHARES THE BASKETBALL AGAINST LOYOLA MARYMOUNT

Led by four assists each from redshirt senior Anthony Polite and freshman Jalen Warley, Florida State recorded 21 turnovers on its 29 baskets (.724 percent) in its win over Loyola Marymount. It marked the second consecutive game the Seminoles totaled at least 15 assists, and they enter Monday's game against Missouri averaging 15.5 assists per game as a team. Florida State earned assists from 11 of the 14 Seminoles who earned playing time on Sunday.

SEMINOLES HAVE THREE DIFFERENT LEADING SCORERS IN FIRST FOUR GAMES

Freshman Matthew Cleveland led the Seminoles in scoring in Florida State's win over Loyola Marymount to mark their third different leading scoring in their first four games of the season. The Seminoles totaled nine different leading scorers in 25 games during the 2020-21 season. Cleveland is the first freshman to lead Florida State in scoring since Scottie Barnes led the Seminoles with 21 points in the 2021 ACC Tournament Championship game against Georgia Tech.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 14 STEALS IN WIN OVER LOYOLA MARYMOUNT

With at least one steal from 10 different players, Florida State totaled 14 steals in its win over Loyola Marymount on Sunday night. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Missouri averaging 11.3 steals per game, 19.5 forced turnovers per game and an average of 25.3 points off turnovers per game. RayQuan Evans, who has at least two steals in each of the Seminoles' first four games of the season, leads Florida State with nine steals (2.3 spg).

HAMILTON'S FAVORITE STATISTIC IS FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's favorite all-time analytic is the defensive field goal percentage statistic. When the Seminoles are really good in Hamilton's system, they generally hold their opponents to a low field goal shooting percentage. Case in point: in Sunday night's victory over Loyola Marymount, the Seminoles held the Lions to 16 total field goals and a .364 shooting percentage. The Seminoles have held three of their first four opponents under 40 percent shooting from the field, have held their last two opponents (Tulane and Loyola Marymount) to 16 total field goals, and limited Tulane to 22 second half points and Loyola Marymount to 17 first half points.

FLORIDA STATE HOLDS LOYOLA MARYMOUNT TO 17 FIRST HALF POINTS

Florida State limited Loyola Marymount to 17 first half points in its 73-45 win over the Lions in the semifinals of the Jacksonville Classic on Sunday night. It was the fewest first half points the Seminoles allowed since holding Chicago State to 15 first half points on December 20, 2003 in a 47-42 win over the Cougars at the Pittsburgh Holiday Hoops Classic.

FLORIDA STATE GOES UNBLOCKED

Florida State went without having a shot blocked for the first time this season in its victory over Loyola Marymount.

OSBORNE CONTINUES TO SHINE AS A 3-POINT SHOOTER

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne was a perfect two of two from the 3-point line against Loyola Marymount and enters Monday's game against Missouri shooting 70 percent (seven of 10) from the bonusphere through the first four games of the season. Osborne is shooting .419 percent from the 3-point line in the last two seasons (26 of 62). He has made six consecutive 3-point shot attempts since the first half of Florida State's game against Florida on November 14, 2021.

Evans had 19 steals in his first 53 games as a Seminole and nine in four games already this season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MISSOURI – THE LAST MEETING

Mfiodu Kabengele scored a team-high 14 points, including four straight free-throws, during a decisive 15-0 second half run to lead the Seminoles to a 67-54 win over Missouri in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the Bridgestone Arena in Nashville on March 16, 2018. P.J. Savoy added 12 points and Phil Cofer chipped in 11 for the Seminoles, who reached the second round in their fourth consecutive NCAA tournament appearances with the win. Florida State went into the break leading 42-20 and having scored its most points in the first half of an NCAA tournament game in 20 years. But Missouri did everything it could to extend its stay in the tournament. In less than two minutes of game time early in the second half, Florida State's 22-point lead had been cut to 13. The Tigers got to within 50-44 with nearly 10 minutes still left to play. The Seminoles held off the charging Tigers and won by 13 to advance to the Round of 32.

Malik Osborne: Football Prospect To Basketball Prodigy

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (seminoles.com) -- Long before Malik Osborne became the phenomenal Florida State college basketball star that he is known as today, he was a boy from Matteson, Ill. who grew up with two parents who played collegiate athletics and supported him along his journey of doing the same.

Osborne always knew was destined to be an athlete at the collegiate level, with his dad being a football player at Iowa State and his mom running track at Lewis College. As if having two athletic parents growing up wasn't enough, his whole family seemed to be involved in sports, which only made his dedication to it easier.

Osborne leads the Seminoles against Missouri in the championship game of the Inaugural Jacksonville Classic on Monday at 8:30. He scored 10 points in the Seminoles' 73-45 victory over Loyola Marymount on Sunday to advance the Seminoles to the game against the Tigers from the SEC. The CBS Sports Network will televise the game.

"At first I really wanted to be a football player like my dad," said Osborne. "A majority of my dad's side (of the family) played football. He played at Iowa State, his brother played at Miami at Ohio, and then his other brother also played; they all played college football. My grandpa, my dad's dad played for the Chicago Bears, so all of these things motivated me to play football. And then knowing that my mom ran track, and her sister ran track and almost qualified for the Olympics, and her other sister, her twin, ran track and I felt like sports was right up my alley, it was something I was made for."

James Osborne, his grandfather, played for the Bears from 1972-84, and is still one of the organizations' leaders in career sacks. He played in 186 career NFL games after starring at Southern University.

For so long it looked like Osborne was going to follow in his father's side of the family footsteps. It wasn't until he reached his frame of 6'8 and his then 200 pounds, that he knew basketball was his true fortune.

"As I was pursuing football, I kind of grew taller than anyone in my family," said Osborne. "So I picked up the basketball and I made my own way in our little sports family tree and started the whole basketball thing. They definitely had a huge influence on me playing basketball and just playing sports in general."

From that point on, Osborne truly flourished in his basketball career. After playing at the Bosco Institute in Indiana, his true talent came to light when he began his collegiate career at Rice University.

His move to Florida State from Rice checked off all the boxes that Osborne was looking for when he decided to transfer schools. Along with his offer from Florida State, Osborne had other offers from Northwestern, Wisconsin, Kansas State, San Diego State, Seton Hall, and Virginia Tech. Although these schools carried a lot of talent, Osborne, and his grandma, knew that his own talents belonged at Florida State.

"When I was at Rice, I watched Florida State when they made their Elite Eight run (in 2018)," said Osborne. "I was thinking (Florida State's) is a great system, I could really see myself thriving in that system. The system showcases a bunch of athletes who are just able to get up and down the court and play transition. They all look like they are having fun, they all look comfortable, everybody got a piece of the pie."

"Then my grandma called me after the game and said 'were you watching the Florida State game? Because I could really see you playing at Florida State.'"

The pieces all seemed to be coming together for Osborne. He not only transferred to a nationally ranked college basketball program, but he also has the luxury of family living nearby in Florida.

Osborne is also taking advantage of Florida State's national status as one of the United States' most highly regarded academic institutions.

Because Florida State is a top 20 national public university, Osborne took advantage of his opportunities and earned a bachelor's degree in Social Science in 2021. He is currently working on his second degree in broadcast journalism, which he believes will be his most beneficial move yet.

"I really want to be a sports broadcaster or sports analyst after my career is over with the opportunity to be around basketball, still talk the sport, still have my personality mesh with my knowledge of sports and be able to display that on the big screen."

Osborne shouldn't have any difficulty in his future career of broadcasting, as his experience in the field on and off the court is plentiful.

"I've already had experiences talking in front of cameras ever since playing college basketball," said Osborne. "That's just something I'm really looking forward to having a degree in as well. I feel like that is something that will help me in my development as a speaker, as an advocate for people and players if I get that opportunity. That's really my academic focus right now."

His excellence has not only been academically, but on the court recently as well. He recorded a double double of 18 points and 13 rebounds during the Seminoles season opener against Penn, and equaled his Florida State career-high of 18 points against Florida.

With these stats, it is hopeful that the star athlete will one day compete in the NBA. Along with that big day comes a big contract, which he will accept with open arms, but not only for himself.

"I want to take care of my family; whatever my family wants or what they need," said Osborne. "I want to be able to deliver that because they have been with me through this entire journey, and it's been a very hectic journey. My journey is a testament to them having faith in me, them sticking by my side. When I am able to sign that first contract, I want to give back to them."

"I feel like I've already been taken care of -- now it's my turn to take care of my family."
