NO. 19/20 FLORIDA STATE OPENS 21-22 SEASON AT HOME AGAINST PENN ON NOVEMBER 10

Florida State opens its 2021-22 season as it plays host to Penn from the Ivy League on Wednesday, November 10, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles are one of just three teams (Florida State, Gonzaga, Michigan) to have advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 in the 2018, 2019 and 2021 NCAA Tournaments. The Seminoles advanced to the Elite Eight in 2018 and the Sweet 16 in both 2019 and 2021. Florida State has won seven of its last eight season openers including each of its last eight home openers. Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has won 24 season openers in the last 26 years. Following Wednesday's game against Penn, the Seminoles play at Florida on November 14 at 1:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. PENN – CONNECTIONS

Florida State opens its 2021-22 season at the Donald L. Tucker Center against the University of Pennsylvania – a first-time opponent on the Seminoles' schedule. The Seminoles' game against the Quakers marks the first time they will open a season against an Ivy League team. Steve Donahue is in his sixth season as the Penn coach and in his second stint as a head coach at an Ivy League School. He was the head coach at Cornell from 2001-10. Donahue knows the Seminoles well as he was the head coach at Boston College from 2011-14 – a total of four seasons. Florida State was 3-1 against Donahue and Boston College including a 2-0 record at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Nat Graham, the associated head coach at Penn, was an assistant coach under Donahue at Boston College for four seasons and coached against the Seminoles four times. He is a Florida native, having graduated from Coral Gables High School in Miami. Trey Montgomery, an assistant coach, played collegiately at Samford. During his playing career as a Bulldog, (December 2, 2007) he faced the Seminoles at the Donald L. Tucker Center – he scored a game-high 16 points and pulled down four rebounds in a 61-45 Florida State win.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE AS IT OPENS THE 2021-22 SEASON

Since the start of the 2016 season, Florida State is the third winningest team in ACC play with a 115-38 record (.752 winning percentage)...Florida State averages 24.8 wins per season in the last five seasons with a school-record 29 wins coming during the 2019 season...The Seminoles have won at least 23 games in four of the last five seasons...Florida State has won eight games in the last four NCAA Tournaments. The Seminoles are 8-4 with at least one win in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments...Florida State led the ACC in scoring offense, scoring margin, field goal percentage shooting and 3-point field goal percentage shooting during the 2020-21 season...Florida State is 77-4 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.951 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 77 of their last 81 games since February 27, 2015...Florida State has won 25 consecutive ACC home games – the second longest streak in ACC history...the Seminoles are just one ACC win from tying the all-time ACC record for consecutive ACC wins at home (26 by Duke 1997-2000).

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 77-4 (.951 winning percentage) in its last 81 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Penn having won .951 percent of their games (77-4) and .936 percent of their ACC games (44-3) at home since the 2015-16 season.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Penn and win its seventh consecutive home opening game. The Seminoles have won their home opener each season since opening their 2013-14 home season with a 91-67 win over Jacksonville;

...Defeat Penn and gain a win over the Quakers for the first time in school history in the first meeting between the two teams;

...Defeat Penn and gain a win over a team from the Ivy League for the first time in program history. The Seminoles are 0-4 all-time against teams from the Ivy League (0-1 vs. Harvard and 0-3 vs. Princeton). Florida State's most recent games against a team from the Ivy League was a triple overtime loss to Princeton (73-75, December 30, 2011) at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

SEMINOLES RANKED NO. 20 BY ASSOCIATED PRESS TO BEGIN 2021-22 SEASON

Florida State is ranked No. 20 nationally in the preseason Associated Press College Basketball poll – the third time in the last four seasons the Seminoles have been ranked in the nation’s preseason top 25. The Seminoles are one of four teams from the ACC in the top 25, which is topped by No 1 Gonzaga. Florida State is ranked along with No. 9 Duke, No. 19 North Carolina and No. 25 Virginia from the ACC. Florida State finished the 2020-21 season with an 18-7 overall record and an 11-4 mark in ACC play. The Seminoles finished in second place in the ACC regular season standings and played Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament Championship game last season. Florida State opened the 2018-19 season ranked No. 17 (and finished the season at No. 10), began the 2019-20 season just outside the top 25 (and finished the year at No. 4) and began the 2020-21 season ranked No. 21 (and finished the season ranked No. 14). Florida State has been ranked in the final national poll in each of the last five seasons (2021, No. 10; 2020, No. 4; 2019, No. 10; 2018, No. 18; 2017, No. 16). The Seminoles are one of only two teams in the ACC to be ranked in the final poll by either the AP or USA Today in each of the last five seasons. The Seminoles are ranked among the nation’s top 25 despite losing an ACC-high three players to the 2021 NBA Draft – Scottie Barnes (No. 4, Toronto Raptors), Balsa Koprivica (No. 56, Detroit Pistons) and RaiQuan Gray (No. 58, Brooklyn Nets).

SEMINOLES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN ACC RACE

Florida State, which has finished in fourth place or higher in the ACC Basketball standings in the last three seasons, has been selected to finish in second place in the 2022 league standings by the attending media at the annual ACC Tip-Off. It’s the highest the Seminoles have been predicted to finish a season since joining the league for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles received the second highest point total (1,034) and the second highest total of first place votes in the voting during which 81 total votes were counted. The Seminoles were picked to finish in second place in the ACC standings for the first time in school history. The Seminoles have been picked to finish third in three different seasons (1993, 2012 and 2021) and fourth on two occasions (2009 and 2019). Most recently, the Seminoles were picked to finish in third place in 2021 — they finished in second place in the ACC standings and advanced to play in the ACC Tournament Championship game. Florida State was picked to finish in the fifth spot in 2020 and won the ACC Championship with a 16-4 record. In 2019, the Seminoles were picked to finish in seventh place; they finished fourth and advanced to the ACC Championship game.

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland has been named to the 20-player watch list for the 2022 Julius Erving Award by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The award highlights the best small forward in college basketball. The award will be presented to the nation’s top small forward on April 8, 2022 at the College Basketball Awards Show in Los Angeles. Cleveland, who averaged 22.8 points, 10.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 2.0 steals as a senior at Pace High School in Atlanta, is one of seven freshmen and one of only two players from the ACC on the Julius Erving watch list. Cleveland led his team to back-to-back state championships his junior and senior seasons. He was named the 2021 Atlanta area Player of the Year and was selected as the Georgia 2A Player of the Year. Cleveland has joined a growing list of Seminoles placed on preseason award lists under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Scottie Barnes was named to the Bob Cousy Award watch list as the nation’s top point guard and M.J. Walker was placed on the Jerry West Award watch list as the nation’s top shooting guard for the 2021 season. In 2019, Trent Forrest was named to the Cousy Award watch list. Dwayne Bacon was named to the Jerry West watch list, and Xavier Rathan-Mayes was named to the Cousy watch list in 2016.

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME SINCE 2015

Florida State is 77-4 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.951 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 77 of their last 81 games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles on their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 74 of 78 home games (.949 winning percentage) in the last five seasons.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 73-20 (.785 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and were 18-7 during the 2020-21 season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 85 percent of their games with a record of 34-8 (.810 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 40-13 (.769 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and were 11-4 during the 2020-21 season.

SEMINOLES’ NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 13, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO ACC CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES

Florida State has appeared in both of the last two ACC Championship games (2019 against Duke and 2021 against Georgia Tech) and won the 2020 ACC Championship.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 379 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the fifth coach in the illustrious history of the nation’s best basketball conference to win 375 career games with the Seminoles’ victory over Boston College on March 3, 2021.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 25 STRAIGHT ACC HOME GAMES

Florida State enters the 2020-21 season having won 25 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Only Duke from 1997 to 2000 has won more ACC home games consecutively (26) in the incredible history of the ACC. The Seminoles' ACC winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent ACC victory at home came as an 94-63 win over Boston College on March 3, 2021. Florida State plays host to Syracuse in its ACC opener on December 4, 2021.

Malik Osborne: Fitting The Pieces Together

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CHARLOTTE, N.C. (seminole.com) – If you were to ask any of his Seminole teammates for a couple of words to describe redshirt senior Malik Osborne, most would immediately come up with the words “great teammate.” They would talk about his abilities in the post, the big 3-point shots he has made during his career, and the blocked shots he is famous for. They would also talk about what a winner he is, and that he always has a future as a broadcaster if he decides to go that way after his basketball career. Some of his teammates would also probably talk about his abilities as a dancer.

However, it’s a skill that he picked up during the pandemic that has helped him in his role as one of Florida State’s leaders: he has become an expert in building jigsaw puzzles.

It’s one of the many topics Osborne touched upon as he and teammate Anthony Polite participated in the ACC Tip-Off at the Charlotte Downtown Marriott. The two Seminoles, along with players from each of the 15 schools in the ACC, enjoyed an exciting day of answering questions from many media outlets, posing for pictures, appearing on the set of “Nothing But Net” on the ACC Network and talking Florida State basketball.

Osborne and Polite even engaged (successfully) in an ongoing game of Jenga where both Seminoles skillfully pulled wooden blocks from the tower that was constructed by players and coaches throughout the day.

Puzzle building is something Osborne became interested in during the pandemic and is something he enjoys doing when he is not studying or practicing. He earned his degree in Criminology in April of 2021 and is currently pursuing a second degree in Humanities.

“I really enjoy the mindset it takes to put puzzles together,” said Osborne. “Building a puzzle takes discipline, recognition, memory and a strong will to complete a project over a period of time. Time is one thing we all had during the pandemic, and building puzzles gave me the opportunity to keep my mind sharp when we really weren’t allowed to do much outside of our apartments and parents’ homes during those many months of lockdown.”

“Finishing a puzzle is a great sense of accomplishment,” said Osborne. “It’s something I can do to put my mind in a good place.”

With the start of the regular season less than one month away, Osborne is concentrating solely on the Seminoles’ preparations for their opening game against the University of Pennsylvania on November 10 at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

The most important puzzle Osborne is looking to master is that of the Seminoles’ upcoming schedule, which once again includes 20 ACC games. Florida State begins its ACC schedule as it plays host to Syracuse on December 4. The Seminoles will look to tie the ACC record of 26 consecutive home ACC wins against the Orange.

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
