FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY IN NO ROOM FOR RACISM CLASSIC IN ROCK HILL, S.C.

Florida State, which has won four of its last six games, travels to play South Carolina on December 12, 2021 at 12 noon in the No Room for Racism Classic at the Sports and Event Center in Rock Hill, S.C. The Seminoles' game against the Gamecocks marks a return to the court after more than a week away from competition for the final exam period at Florida State University. The Seminoles' game against the Gamecocks marks the first game between the two teams since the 2016 NIT and the first scheduled game between the two teams since the 1990-91 season when both schools were members of the Metro Conference. Following Sunday's game against South Carolina, the Seminoles play host to Lipscomb on December 15, 2021 at 9:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SOUTH CAROLINA – CONNECTIONS

Florida State faces South Carolina in the No Room for Racism Classic in Rock Hill, S.C. on December 12, 2021 at the Rock Hill Sports and Event Center. The Seminoles' game against South Carolina marks the first game between the two teams since a 69-68 overtime win for the Gamecocks in the second round of the NIT on March 21, 2006. Prior to that, the two teams meet at least twice each season from 1980 through 1991 when both teams were in the Metro Conference. South Carolina is coached by Frank Martin, who is in his ninth season as the Gamecocks' head coach. Martin, a native of Miami, will coach against the Seminoles for the first time in his career. Will Bailey, an assistant coach on the South Carolina staff, will coach against Florida State for the second time in four seasons. He was an assistant coach at Saint Louis when Florida State took an 81-59 win over the Billikens at the Orange Bowl Classic on December 22, 2018. Douglas Edwards, one of the greatest players in Florida State history, is the Director of Student-Athlete Development for the Gamecocks, a position he has held for the last 10 seasons. Edwards played in three NCAA Tournaments and is ranked sixth in school history in scoring with 1,604 points. He was a player at Florida State during the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons and was inducted into the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008.

MILLS LEADS SEMINOLES IN SCORING AND STEALS

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills enters Sunday's game against South Carolina as the Seminoles' leader in scoring (101 points / 12.6 ppg) and steals (19 steals / 2.4 spg). He has scored in double figures in five of Florida State's first eight games with his season-high of 22 points coming at Purdue. Mills enters the No Room for Racism Classic against South Carolina as the ACC leader in steals with a career-high 2.4 steals per game average. He has earned at least two steals in seven of Florida State's first eight games of the season with his career-high of five steals coming in Florida State's victory over Boston University on November 24.

FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC'S TOP DEFENSIVE TEAMS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against South Carolina as one of the top defensive teams in the ACC. The Seminoles are ranked first in the ACC in steals (82 steals / 10.3 spg), second in blocked shots (40 blocked shots / 5.0 bpg) and fifth in field goal percentage defense (.407). The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC to rank in the top five of each of those defensive statistics. Florida State is ranked ninth among the ACC's 15 teams in scoring defense (66.8 points allowed per game).

SEMINOLES' OWN COLLEGE BASKETBALL'S OVERTIME WINNING STREAK RECORD

Florida State defeated Boston University, 81-80, in overtime on November 24, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 12th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat South Carolina and gain a win over the Gamecocks for the first time since March 7, 1991 – the last year the Seminoles and the Gamecocks were members of the Metro Conference and the season before Florida State joined the ACC;

...Defeat South Carolina and gain a win over a team from the SEC for the second time this season. The Seminoles defeated Missouri, 81-58, in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic on November 22.

SEMINOLES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN ACC RACE

Florida State, which has finished in fourth place or higher in the ACC Basketball standings in the last three seasons, has been selected to finish in second place in the 2022 league standings by the attending media at the annual ACC Tip-Off. It's the highest the Seminoles have been predicted to finish a season since joining the league for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles received the second highest point total (1,034) and the second highest total of first place votes in the voting during which 81 total votes were counted. The Seminoles were picked to finish in second place in the ACC standings for the first time in school history. The Seminoles have been picked to finish third in three different seasons (1993, 2012 and 2021) and fourth on two occasions (2009 and 2019). Most recently, the Seminoles were picked to finish in third place in 2021 — they finished in second place in the ACC standings and advanced to play in the ACC Tournament Championship game. Florida State was picked to finish in the fifth spot in 2020 and won the ACC Championship with a 16-4 record. In 2019, the Seminoles were picked to finish in seventh place; they finished fourth and advanced to the ACC Championship game.

SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY SOUTH CAROLINA AT A NEUTRAL SITE

Florida State travels to Rock Hill, S.C. to play the South Carolina Gamecocks from the SEC. The game marks the Seminoles' third neutral site game of the season with it first two coming at the Arena at the University of North Florida in the Jacksonville Classic. The Seminoles defeated both Loyola Marymount (73-45, November 21) and Missouri (81-58, November 22) in the Jacksonville Classic and are 2-0 in game played at neutral sites this season. Florida State is 22-7 in the last five seasons on neutral site courts with seven NCAA Tournament wins.

WITH A DOUBLE DIGIT STEALS AVERAGE, FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN STEALS

With a 10.3 steals per game average, Florida State enters Sunday's game against South Carolina as the ACC leaders in steals. The Seminoles have earned at least seven steals in each of their first eight games of the season with a season-high 15 steals coming in their season-opening win over Penn. Florida State has earned at least 10 steals in four different games and totaled just seven against Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

THE REASON FOR THE SEASON – SEMINOLES GIVING AT A HIGH RATE

Florida State enters Sunday's game against South Carolina ranked fourth in the ACC with a 14.9 assists per game average. The Seminoles have earned double figure assists in each of their first eight games with a season-high 21 assists coming in their win over Loyola Marymount in the Jacksonville Classic. Florida State is ranked fifth in the ACC in team assists despite not having a single player ranked in the top 15 of the ACC's individual assist rankings. Rather, the Seminoles have five players with double-digit assists and are led by redshirt senior Anthony Polite with a career-high 3.1 assists per game average.

SEMINOLES HEATING UP FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Led by Malik Osborne, who is ranked 10th in the ACC in the team free throw shooting category, Florida State is shooting .762 from the line in their last three games. The Seminoles have increased their free throw shooting percentage by nearly 25 percentage points in the last five games.

FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC BLOCKED SHOTS LEADERS – AGAIN

Florida State is tied for second in the ACC in blocked shots with 40 and a 5.0 blocked shots per game average. RayQuan Evans – a guard – is ranked ninth in the ACC in blocked shots with seven and a career-high 1.2 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles have ranked in the top 2 in the ACC in each of the last three seasons and average more than five blocked shots per game in each of the last three seasons. Florida State has blocked at least six shots in four of its eight games including a season-high nine blocks in its victory over Tulane on November 17.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SOUTH CAROLINA – THE LAST MEETING

Tarence Kinsey hit three free throws in the final 26 seconds of overtime and South Carolina beat Florida State 69-68 on March 21, 2006 at the Donald L. Tucker Center to keep its hopes alive of repeating as the National Invitation Tournament champions. Todd Galloway's two free throws got Florida State within one with five seconds left and the Seminoles stole the inbounds pass, but Galloway's desperation jumper was blocked by Rocky Trice as the game ended. Balkman's tip-in and Tre Kelley's layup gave South Carolina a quick 62-58 lead in the overtime but Alexander Johnson hit a pair of free throws and Al Thornton scored underneath to tie it at 62. Kelley then drove the lane again for a layup and South Carolina didn't trail again. Kelley scored 17 points for the Gamecocks. Kinsey finished with 14 points, Trice 12, and Brandon Wallace 11 while Balkman had eight points and a game-high 13 rebounds. Johnson led Florida State (20-10) with 22 points and 10 rebounds.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 384 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the fifth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 375 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Boston College on March 3, 2021.

SEMINOLES HAVE FOUR DIFFERENT LEADING SCORERS IN FIRST EIGHT GAMES

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills has led the Seminoles in scoring a team-leading four times this season including in the Seminoles' ACC opener against Syracuse. A total of four different players have led the Florida State in scoring in the first eight games of the 2021-22 season. The Seminoles totaled nine different leading scorers in 25 games during the 2020-21 season. Matthew Cleveland led the Seminoles in scoring with 13 points against Loyola Marymount as he became the first freshman to lead Florida State in scoring since Scottie Barnes led the Seminoles with 21 points in the 2021 ACC Tournament Championship game against Georgia Tech.

Malik Osborne Fitting The Pieces Together By Chuck Walsh, seminole.com

If you were to ask any of his Seminole teammates for a couple of words to describe redshirt senior Malik Osborne, most would immediately come up with the words "great teammate."

They would talk about his abilities in the post, the big 3-point shots he has made during his career, and the blocked shots he is famous for.

They would also talk about what a winner he is, and that he always has a future as a broadcaster if he decides to go that way after his basketball career. Some of his teammates would also probably talk about his abilities as a dancer. However, it's a skill that he picked up during the pandemic that has helped him in his role as one of Florida State's leaders: he has become an expert in building jigsaw puzzles.

It's one of the many topics Osborne touched upon as he and teammate Anthony Polite participated in the ACC Tip-Off at the Charlotte Downtown Marriott.

The two Seminoles, along with players from each of the 15 schools in the ACC, enjoyed an exciting day of answering questions from many media outlets, posing for pictures, appearing on the set of "Nothing But Net" on the ACC Network and talking Florida State basketball.

Osborne and Polite even engaged (successfully) in an ongoing game of Jenga where both Seminoles skillfully pulled wooden blocks from the tower that was constructed by players and coaches throughout the day. Puzzle building is something Osborne became interested in during the pandemic and is something he enjoys doing when he is not studying or practicing.

He earned his degree in Criminology in April of 2021 and is currently pursuing a second degree in Humanities.

"I really enjoy the mindset it takes to put puzzles together," said Osborne. "Building a puzzle takes discipline, recognition, memory and a strong will to complete a project over a period of time. Time is one thing we all had during the pandemic, and building puzzles gave me the opportunity to keep my mind sharp when we really weren't allowed to do much outside of our apartments and parents' homes during those many months of lockdown."

Osborne has constructed a number of puzzles, from small ones to 1000-plus pieces. One of the first puzzles he completed was of the NCAA Tournament logo that he and his teammates received for playing in the 2021 NCAA tournament.

"Finishing a puzzle is a great sense of accomplishment," said Osborne. "It's something I can do to put my mind in a good place."

POLITE APPROACHING 100 CAREER STEALS MARK

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite enters Sunday's game against South Carolina with 13 steals in the first eight games of the 2021-22 season – he has at least one steal in every game this season. He has totaled multiple steals in four of eight games (two each against Tulane, Loyola Marymount, Missouri and Boston University). Polite has 99 career steals in 91 career games – an average of 1.1 steals per game for his entire career.

ACC SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE MATTHEW CLEVELAND

Freshman Matthew Cleveland, who scored his first game-winning basket of his career in Florida State's overtime victory over Boston University on November 24, is already the leading candidate for the prestigious ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award. Too early to start an honors campaign, you ask? Not when the last three ACC Sixth Men of the Year have all come from Florida State's rotation (Mfiondu Kabengele, 2019; Patrick Williams, 2020; Scottie Barnes, 2021) and all three were first round NBA Draft selections. Cleveland enters Sunday's game against South Carolina as Florida State's third leading scorer (9.8 ppg) and as its third leading rebounder (4.0 rpg) while coming off of the bench and averaging 22.0 minutes played per game.

NOTING CAM'RON FLETCHER

In eight games as a Seminole, Cam'Ron Fletcher has played more than twice as many minutes (130-60), scored more than three times as many points (51-15), pulled down more rebounds (17-15), earned more steals (7-5), totaled more assists (9-3), made nearly three times as many field goals (20-7) and made eight times as many 3-point field goals (8-1) than he did in nine games as a true freshman at the University of Kentucky during the 2020-21 season.

NOTING HARRISON PRIETO...

...He is shooting .818 from the field (nine of 11) and is a perfect three of three from the field in the last two games;
...He is shooting .750 from the 3-point line (three of four) and has already made more 3-point shots this season (three) than he did in the first five seasons of his career (one);
...He is shooting .857 from two point range (six of seven) with his only miss from inside of the arc coming as he scored four points in Florida State's victory over Boston University on November 24;

Florida State Plays South Carolina In No Room For Racism Classic

ROCK HILL, S.C. (seminoles.com) – South Carolina Head Coach Frank Martin quickly remembered what he thought when his Gamecock squad was asked to play in Sunday's game against Florida State in the Inaugural No Room for Racism Classic at the Rock Hill Sports and Event Center.

When asked if he wanted to play in the event, Martin said, "If you want me to play, I need to play a good opponent. Then they called me and said Florida State. I said, 'are you kidding me', they're probably the best ACC team in the last four or five years."

The Seminoles have appeared in each of the last two ACC Championship games (2019 vs. Duke and 2021 vs. Georgia Tech) and won the ACC title in 2020. With Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's success in Tallahassee, Florida State is one of the top three winningest teams in the ACC in the last 12 years.

But Sunday's game is so much more than two teams renewing a rivalry that blossomed during the old Metro Conference days.

The No Room for Racism tournament is being played as a commitment to fostering relationships among diverse social, cultural, and racial backgrounds. It's being played to honor the Friendship Nine – a group of nine college students who chose to spend 30 days in jail rather than bail themselves out for \$100 because the nine men knew what they were standing for was the correct thing to do.

The Friendship Nine was a group of African-America men (eight who played basketball at Rock Hill's Friendship Junior College) who went to jail for staging a sit-in at the segregated McCrory's lunch counter in Rock Hill.

Both Florida State's Hamilton and South Carolina's Martin are advocates for this event and the conversations that it will spark.

"There's not a coach in America that gets less credit for the person that he is than Leonard Hamilton," said Martin. "The amount of people that he has helped to open doors to grow as human beings is the perfect example."

Martin has had his career flourish with the help of current members of the Florida State coaching staff.

"I was a 22-23 year old high school assistant coach that knew nothing," said Martin. "He (Leonard) led me into his office and showed me what it was like to be a college basketball coach. No one else ever did that for me. And even Charlton Young (an assistant on the Seminoles' staff) is the reason I am in college basketball right now. Charlton (C.Y.) is who opened the door for me by getting his former boss at Northeastern to hire me."

Martin is from Miami and of Cuban heritage. He serves as co-chair for the National Association of Basketball Coaches Committee on Racial Reconciliation. The committee's mission is to educate teams, campuses, and communities on the issues of racial injustice and to promote college basketball as a leader in change.

"If it's not for this event, I would have never found out about the Friendship Nine," says Martin. "I would have never found out about the impact that those guys made in that community and the stance that they took to do what's right and to bring attention. I'm a true believer that anytime you work to make progress, the second you stop working, you go back further than where you started."

"We have a responsibility to do right, to open up doors."

Hamilton also values the goals and discussions that this tournament supports. Without agreeing to participate in this event, he also would not have known about the Friendship Nine.

While growing up in a segregated community in Gastonia, N.C. (just 25 miles from Rock Hill, S.C.), Hamilton is a proponent for fighting racial injustices. Hamilton broke the color barrier in college basketball at both Gaston Community College and Austin Peay before becoming the first black assistant coach in Kentucky basketball history in 1974.

"It was brought to my attention the emphasis placed on this tournament, (and) I became more and more excited," said Hamilton. "I'm hoping that there is something that we can do or say that will help move the needle in terms of the climate that we're dealing with.

"I want to look at the big picture. We need to come together, we need to have conversations, we need to have a serious approach to how we are going to deal with this. We need to identify not only racism, but all the other issues that we have in our society."

Both Hamilton and Martin accomplish this with their own teams, making certain they are aware of racial injustices and how to approach them in their own lives.

Florida State's redshirt senior and leading 3-point shooter, Malik Osborne has shown initiative on campus through his membership on Florida State's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force. The purpose of the Task Force is to identify sources of systemic racism and find ways to improve diversity on the Florida State campus.

Hamilton wants his players to be educated on these issues.

"I want to encourage people to have dialogue, communication, and a clear understanding that there's enough of this good life that we have in America, all of us," said Hamilton. "We can share the water, we can share the air, we can share the sunshine, and we should be able to share relationships."

Florida State's RayQuan Evans certainly understands the magnitude of the reason for the three-day event.

"This is (a subject) that could have easily been brushed under the rug," said Evans. "People could have discussed it, and not talked about it anymore. For our team to continue to be educated on it, it's amazing. For us to be able to play in a tournament that represents it is also awesome because I think it's going to bring a lot of awareness that these things are still happening. I'm thankful that we get to participate (in this tournament) and I'm thankful that this is still a topic of discussion."

Eight college basketball teams will face off in the Inaugural No Room for Racism Classic, which began on Friday night as South Carolina State defeated High Point. Winthrop plays Carver College and Clinton College challenges Edward Waters University on Saturday. The Seminoles and the Gamecocks close out the historical event on Sunday.

Sunday's game marks the first time that the Seminoles will face the Gamecocks since the 2006 NIT. It's the first regularly scheduled game between the two teams since the 1990-91 season when both were members of the Metro Conference. Following Sunday's game against South Carolina, the Seminoles play host to Lipscomb on December 15, 2021 at 9:00 p.m.

Florida State's game against the Gamecocks will be at 12 noon Sunday and is televised on ESPN2.

The loss snapped FSU's 25-game home-court winning streak in ACC play. The conference record is 26, set by Duke from 1997 to 2000.
