FLORIDA STATE OPENS ACC PLAY AGAINST SYRACUSE ON SATURDAY

Florida State, which was selected to finish in second place in the ACC standings at ACC Tip-Off, opens its 2021-22 conference schedule as it plays host to Syracuse on Saturday, December 4, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles begin their 31st season of ACC play after finishing in second place in the regular season standings and advancing to the championship game of the ACC Tournament during the 2020-21 season. Florida State has played in both of the last two ACC Tournament championship games (2019 and 2021) and won the 2020 ACC Championship – its second in school history. The Seminoles also won the ACC Championship in 2012. Since the start of the 2016 season, Florida State is the third winningest team in ACC play (behind only Duke and Virginia) with a 115-38 record (.752 winning percentage). Following Saturday's game against Syracuse, the Seminoles will spend the next week taking final exams (which begin on December 6) and play next against South Carolina in the No Room for Racism Classic in Rock Hill, S.C. on December 12.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE CUSP OF ACC HISTORY

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Syracuse having won 25 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Only Duke from 1997 to 2000 has won more ACC home games consecutively (26) in the incredible history of the ACC. The Seminoles' ACC winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent ACC victory at home came as a 91-64 win over Boston College on March 3, 2021.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 80-4 (.952 winning percentage) in its last 84 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Syracuse having won .952 percent of their games (79-4) and .935 percent of their ACC games (43-3) at home since February 27, 2015. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame. The Seminoles are 3-0 at home this season, were 12-1 at home during the 2020-21 season, were 16-0 at in 2019-20 (including 10-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SYRACUSE IN ITS ACC SEASON OPENER

Florida State, which defeated Georgia Tech to open its ACC schedule to begin the 2020-21 season, plays host to Syracuse to begin its 2021-22 conference slate of games. Syracuse represents the Seminoles' 11th different ACC Opening Day opponent with Virginia (seven times) coming in as Florida State's most popular first conference game of the season opponent.

FLORIDA STATE WON ITS FIRST EVER ACC GAME

Florida State defeated No. 5 North Carolina, 86-74, at the Dean E. Smith Center on December 15, 1991 – the famous Whine and Cheese game as characterized by the great Sam Cassell – in its first ever ACC game.

...Defeat Syracuse and win its ACC record-tying 26th consecutive ACC home game. The Seminoles have won each of their ACC home games since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019;

...Defeat Syracuse and win its fourth consecutive game against the Orange. The Seminoles have won each of their games against Syracuse since a 101-90 double overtime victory in Tallahassee on January 13, 2018. Florida State enters Saturday's game against Syracuse holding their longest winning streak in the series history, which dates back to February 3, 1990;

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland has been named to the 20-player watch list for the 2022 Julius Erving Award by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The award highlights the best small forward in college basketball. The award will be presented to the nation's top small forward on April 8, 2022 at the College Basketball Awards Show in Los Angeles. Cleveland, who averaged 22.8 points, 10.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 2.0 steals as a senior at Pace High School in Atlanta, is one of seven freshmen and one of only two players from the ACC on the Julius Erving watch list. Cleveland led his team to back-to-back state championships his junior and senior seasons. He was named the 2021 Atlanta area Player of the Year and was selected as the Georgia 2A Player of the Year.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SYRACUSE – THE LAST MEETING

Patrick Williams scored 17 points and pulled down seven rebounds as No. 8 Florida State defeated Syracuse 80-77 on February 15, 2020 at the Donald L Tucker Center in Tallahassee. M.J. Walker scored 16 points, including five 3-pointers, as the Seminoles won their 20th straight home game. Elijah Hughes added 25 points and four rebounds, playing all 40 minutes as he returned from a groin injury that limited him to three minutes earlier this week against NC State. Hughes missed a 25-footer that went off the rim and would have tied the game in the final seconds. Trent Forrest scored 13 points, making two free-throw attempts with 8.5 seconds to go for Florida State. RaiQuan Gray also had 10 rebounds as the Seminoles has a 47-29 edge on the boards. Led by Williams' 17 points, Florida State's bench outscored Syracuse's reserves 41-13

1 Redshirt senior Malik Osborne was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Jacksonville Classic in leading the Seminoles to the championship with wins over Loyola Marymount and Missouri. It marked his first MOP award from a tournament as a Seminole.

It marked the first time two true freshman were in the same starting lineup for Leonard Hamilton since the 2015-16 season when Dwayne Bacon (33 starts that season) and Malik Beasley (34 starts that season) were starters together in all but one of the Seminoles' games that season. The only game the pair did not start was in Florida State's 78-73 win over Syracuse on March 5, 2016 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Both Beasley (in 2016) and Bacon (in 2017) were NBA Draft picks following their Florida State careers.

WARLEY IN HIS LAST THREE GAMES

Freshman Jalen Warley has scored 13 points and is averaging 4.3 points per game in his last three games. He has been in the Seminoles' starting lineup in each of the last two games against Boston University and Purdue.

After transferring from the University of Kentucky into the Seminoles' program this season, Fletcher has certainly illustrated why Hamilton and his staff recruited him to come to Tallahassee this past spring. Fletcher has already played more than twice as many minutes (124-60), scored more than three times as many points (50-15), pulled down more rebounds (16-15), earned three times as many assists (9-3), made nearly three times as many field goals (20-7), made eight times as many 3-point shots (8-1) and made more free throws (3-0) in seven games that he did in nine games in his only season at Kentucky.

ACC SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE MATTHEW CLEVELAND

Freshman Matthew Cleveland, who scored his first game-winning basket of his career in Florida State's overtime victory over Boston University on November 24, is already the leading candidate for the prestigious ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award. Too early to start an honors campaign, you ask? Not when the last three ACC Sixth Men of the Year have all come from Florida State's rotation (Mfondu Kabengele, 2019; Patrick Williams, 2020; Scottie Barnes, 2021) and all three were first round NBA Draft selections. Cleveland enters Saturday's game against Syracuse as Florida State's third leading scorer (10.3 ppg) and as its third leading rebounder (4.4 rpg) while coming off of the bench and averaging 22.7 minutes played per game.

Quincy Ballard: Lover of Fine Arts and Fairs

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (seminoles.com) -- Growing up in Syracuse is where Quincy Ballard's journey in his ongoing basketball career began.

Ballard will realize a bit of nostalgia on Saturday when the Seminoles play host to Syracuse in their first ACC game of the season. The tip off comes at 4 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State's game against Syracuse will be the first time Ballard will face the Orange after the one game scheduled between the two teams was cancelled last season.

A Seminole victory over the Orange will allow Florida State to grab a piece of Atlantic Coast Conference history. A win by the Garnet and Gold would match the longest home winning streak in conference play in ACC history at 26 straight games.

In the suburbs of New York, at the age of only five years old, Ballard picked up a basketball for the first time. Being the only athlete in the family, he didn't realize the lengths the sport would take him to until he started playing seriously at Hanninger High School.

After his one season at the Hanninger -- leading his team to the sectional playoffs in the state championship -- he moved to Quality Education Academy in North Carolina. It was at QEA is where he showed his true potential as a rising basketball star. He averaged 14.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 6.0 blocked shots during his postgraduate season.

"My mom got a call from the school in North Carolina [QEA]," said Ballard. "She thought it would be a great idea to visit there. The next weekend we visited. I started practicing and playing games with them. Both schools were fun to play with, they were both winning schools, and we had winning seasons. I think that I improved a lot when I went to the school in North Carolina [QEA]. I had a great coach. He was smart; he really knew how to use the players on all occasions."

His decision to play basketball at Florida State was not one that came lightly, as he had four other offers including from the hometown school -- Syracuse University -- as well as Cincinnati, Maryland, and N.C. State.

"It was a pretty hard pick, but I chose Florida State because there is a great atmosphere here," said Ballard. "Coach Hamilton, he is a great coach, he really knows how to develop his big man. It was a great pick coming here."

Ballard is one of four seven-footers on the Florida State basketball team. After growing five inches in the past four years, he has reached his current frame of exactly seven feet tall.

"Developing their big man," in the words of Ballard, has taken hard work and dedication from not only himself, but all his coaches as well.

"In basketball, it (height) is definitely a great advantage," said Ballard. "It feels good to be this tall. You can be the tallest in your city sometimes, especially in Syracuse. I don't see as (many) tall people there, or in North Carolina."

For Ballard, much of his improvement since his arrival at Florida State has come on the defensive end of the court.

“I thank the coaches for that (his improvement defensively),” said Ballard. “They worked me throughout the spring and summer seasons; they’ve helped me with my stance, moving laterally, position, and just moving fast in general.”

Along with his year-round training, Ballard is currently studying in the field of humanities for his major. He hopes to focus on his true passion of Fine Arts and planning to pursue a master’s degree at Florida State.

“I really want to get in to Fine Arts,” said Ballard. “I am trying to get into graphic design. I’ve had that interest for a long time. I love drawing comics. I’ve started to get into computer arts and graphic design. Whatever comes my way with graphic design, I would be happy with it.”

Ballard gets the opportunity to visit home [Syracuse] quite often, not only seeing his family, but attending the Great New York State Fair as well.

The fair is a multi-day summer celebration held in Syracuse. As if the festivities weren’t enough, Ballard’s younger self couldn’t get enough of the food and rides that accompany the fair each year.

“I did like the rides when I was younger,” said Ballard. “I grew out of that because I am really tall. I haven’t been on a rollercoaster in so long. My favorite ride is the Fireball; that is probably just the craziest fair ride and my favorite at the same time. I do like the food as well, and just walking around; just having a great time. There’s so much good stuff there. My favorite food is the huge turkey leg, that’s so good.”

Game 1 -- Florida State 105, Penn 70

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Malik Osborne had 18 points and a career-best 13 rebounds, Anthony Polite scored 17 points, and No. 20 Florida State won its seventh straight home opener, routing Pennsylvania 105-70 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Osborne recorded his fourth career double-double and third at Florida State. The 6-foot-9 forward shot 4 of 6 from the floor and 9 of 12 from the free-throw line in 22 minutes, spending much of the game playing center as the Seminoles went with a smaller lineup. Senior guard RayQuan Evans added 14 points and four assists, while Houston transfer Caleb Mills scored 10 of his 14 points in the second half in his debut with the Seminoles.
