FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO DUKE AS ACC RACE HEATS UP IN JANUARY

Florida State, which has won five of its last six games and who has lost only once since December 15, plays host to No. 5/6 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on Tuesday, January 18, 2022 at 9:00 p.m. The games will be televised nationally on ESPN. The Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against the Blue Devils having won three consecutive ACC games with victories over Louisville (when the Cardinals were 4-0 in ACC), Miami (when the Hurricanes were 5-0 in ACC play) as at Syracuse (for the Seminoles second ACC road win of the season). Florida State's game against Duke marks the first of two matchups between the two teams as the Seminoles travel to play at Cameron Indoor Stadium on February 19 at 6:00 p.m. Following Tuesday's game against Duke, the Seminoles play host to UNF in a game rescheduled from earlier this season. The Seminoles' game against the Ospreys will begin at 12 Noon.

SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR THE FLORIDA STATE BASKETBALL PROGRAM

Florida State has rescheduled two games which had been postponed from earlier this season. The Seminoles will now play host to UNF on January 20, 2022 at 12 Noon at the Donald L. Tucker Center (rescheduled from December 21) and travel to play at Boston College on February 21, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. (rescheduled from December 29). The Seminoles' game against UNF will be televised on ACC Network Extra while their game against Boston College will air on the ACC Network.

FLORIDA STATE AT THE DONALD L. TUCKER CENTER IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

Florida State is 83-5 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.943 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 83 of their last 88 home games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 80 of 85 home games (.941 winning percentage) in the last five seasons. The Seminoles have lost just one ACC home game since a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Florida State has won 27 of its last 28 ACC home games since defeating the Tigers and won 25 consecutive ACC home games from January 22, 2019 through March 3, 2021 – the second longest conference winning streak in ACC history. Only Duke, who won 26 straight ACC home games from 1997-2002, has a longer streak than then Seminoles in the history of the greatest conference in college basketball history.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 387 career wins at Florida State.

SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO DUKE WITH THREE-GAME ACC WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Duke having won three consecutive ACC games with victories over Louisville (January 8, 79-71), Miami (January 11, 65-64) and at Syracuse (January 15, 79-70). The Seminoles most recently won four consecutive ACC games during the 2020-21 season with consecutive wins over Wake Forest (February 13, 2021; 92-85 in overtime), Virginia (February 15, 2021; 81-60), at Pittsburgh (February 20, 2021; 79-72) and at Miami (February 24, 2021; 88-71).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Duke and gain a win over a nationally ranked opponent for the first time this season. The Seminoles most recently defeated a top-10 ranked team on February 15, 2021 when it defeated No. 7 Virginia, 80-61, at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

...Defeat Duke and defeat a nationally ranked Duke team for the second time since an 88-72 win over No. 7 Duke on January 10, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

SEMINOLES IN THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Tuesday game against Duke with a 106-37 record in the last four seasons for a .741 winning percentage. The Seminoles are 10-5 this season, were 18-7 last season, 26-5 in the shortened 2019-20 season, won a school record 29 games (29-8) during the 2018-19 season and were 23-12 during the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles averaged 24.0 wins in each of the last four seasons.

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 44-15 in ACC regular season play (.745 winning percentage) since the start of the conference schedule in 2018-19. The Seminoles have averaged 13.3 ACC wins per season and are 17-13 in ACC road games during the last three seasons.

FLORIDA STATE FINDING THEIR WINNING WAYS

Florida State has won five of its last six games since December 15 with victories over Lipscomb (December 15, 97-60) at NC State (January 1, 82-81), Louisville (January 8, 79-70), Miami (January 11, 65-64) and at Syracuse (January 15, 79-71). The Seminoles have won four of its last five ACC games with wins over the Wolfpack, the Cardinals, the Hurricanes and the Orange.

SEMINOLES AT HOME IN THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State has won 27 of its last 28 ACC home games since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019. Since the beginning of the 2016-17 season, the Seminoles have won 44 of their last 48 ACC home games (.917 winning percentage) including 20 of their last 21 (.952 winning percentage) since the start of their 2019-20 conference schedule.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 13 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against No. 5/6 Duke with 13 victories over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 57 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE VS. DUKE – THE LAST MEETING

Tre Jones had 13 points for the Blue Devils, who shot 45 percent and hit seven of 17 3-pointers to overcome 21 turnovers to defeat Florida State, 70-65, on February 10, 2020 at Cameron Indoor Stadium. Duke's defense also gave Florida State tough looks and forced Trent Forrest to carry the offensive burden for much of the night for the Seminoles. Forrest finished with 18 points, nine rebounds and eight steals to lead the Seminoles, who shot just 38 percent from the field. Contributions came from throughout the Duke lineup on a quiet night for big man Vernon Carey Jr. Junior guard Jordan Goldwire matched his career high with 13 points on 5-for-5 shooting -- including three 3s -- after coming in averaging 4.0 points. Alex O'Connell had five straight points during a key second-half sequence after FSU had gone up 52-50, then freshman Matthew Hurt went 4 for 4 at the line in the final 11.7 seconds as a clincher.

Caleb Mills: One-Time Kickball Star Now Excelling On The Basketball Court

Caleb Mills was a light-hitting outfielder with a great glove as a Little League baseball player. He was a fast and nimble wide receiver when he played Pee Wee football. He developed into a skillful scoring guard with great dribbling skills when he began playing basketball at age nine.

So, who would have guessed that he wanted to be a professional kickball player while growing up in the mountains of North Carolina?

“Playing kickball was something I really enjoyed when I was in middle school,” Mills said. “I loved being outside and competing against the other kids. Kickball was a sport I felt I was really good at – better than all of the kids in my class. While the other kids wanted to be firemen and police officers, I wanted to play kickball my whole life. It was fun and I enjoyed how fast-paced it was.”

For Mills, playing for the Seminoles in the Jacksonville Classic is exactly where he wants to be. He’s in his first season at Florida State, he’s worked himself into the Seminoles’ starting lineup, and he is thriving as one of the top players on one of the top teams in the nation. Mills scored 14 points in his Florida State debut against Penn and was a standout in the Seminoles’ victory over the Green Wave.

“Florida State was the right decision to make,” said Mills of his decision to transfer from the University Houston to Florida State in January of 2021. “The coaches do a great job (here at Florida State). I grow every day as a player and a man. That’s all you can hope for.”

The college basketball world began to take notice of Mills as a high school star. He was ranked as the No. 6 overall player and the No. 17 combo guard in the state of North Carolina as a senior. He was named to the NCSAA Large-School Division All-State First-Team as a sophomore in 2017 and to the Southeast Super-Region Team as a junior in 2018.

As a highly recruited prep star, Mills chose to attend Houston out of high school. He was the Cougars’ leading scorer as a redshirt freshman in 2020, was named the American Athletic Conference Player of the Week twice during his freshman season and was named as the 2021 preseason AAC Player of the Year. In two seasons and 35 games at Houston, he averaged 12.8 points, 2.9 rebounds and shot better than 36 percent from the 3-point line.

His transition from Houston to Florida State has been easy according to Mills.

MILLS LEADS SEMINOLES TO DOUBLE DIGIT 3-POINT SHOTS MADE IN VICTORY OVER SYRACUSE

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills made five three-point shots in leading the Seminoles to their ACC season-high of 12 made 3-point shots and a .600 percent 3-point shooting percentage in the Seminoles’ 76-71 over Syracuse on Saturday. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles had made double digit 3-point field goals this season. The Seminoles’ 12 3-point field goals against Syracuse were the most for Florida State in an ACC game since they made 13 in a 93-64 win over Boston College on March 3, 2021. Florida State’s 3-point shooting percentage of .600 marks the 10th time in the Seminoles’ ACC history that they have shot 60 percent or better from the bonusphere in a conference game.

SEMINOLES ADJUST TO THE DOME’S DEPTH PERCEPTION; SHOOT SEASON-HIGH .549 FROM THE FIELD

Florida State broke the shooting curse in the Carrier Dome on Saturday as they shot a season-high .549 from the field (28 of 51) and a season-high .600 from the 3-point line (12 of 20). The Seminoles’ .549 shooting percentage against the Orange was the highest shooting percentage by an opponent in the Dome this season. Florida State and Virginia (.526, 30-57) are the only two teams to shoot 50 percent or better from the field in the Dome this season. The Seminoles have shot better than 50 percent from the field during four games this season.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 21 ASSISTS IN WIN OVER SYRACUSE

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills totaled a game-high five assists in leading the Seminoles over Syracuse on Saturday. As a team, Florida State totaled 21 assists on 28 baskets – against only 10 turnovers – for a better than 2:1 assist:turnover ratio. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles earned an A:TO ratio of better than 2:1 – with two of those performances coming in ACC play.

SEMINOLES ARE THE ACC STEALS LEADERS

With three players (Caleb Mills, fourth; RayQuan Evans, 10th, and Anthony Polite, 11th) ranked in the top 15 in the ACC for steals, the Seminoles are the top ranked team in the ACC for steals with 145 and a 9.7 steals per game average. The Seminoles lead the ACC in both total steals and steals per game. Florida State has earned double figures steals in six different games with its season-high of 16 steals coming at Wake Forest. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE’S 16 STEALS AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Florida State’s 16 steals against Wake Forest on January 4 in Winston-Salem is the second highest team steals total of the 2021-22 season for any ACC team. Pittsburgh totaled an ACC-high 17 steals against West Virginia on November 12, 2021.

SEMINOLES SURRENDER ONLY TWO STEALS AGAINST SYRACUSE

Florida State surrendered only two steals in its victory over Syracuse – the fewest steals allowed by the Seminoles in a game this season. The Orange are ranked fourth in the ACC with 133 steals and a 7.8 steals per game average. Florida State allowed only 12 points off of turnovers in Saturday’s victory over the Orange and held Syracuse to a total of seven steals in the two games between the teams this season – five on December 4 in Tallahassee and two on January 15 at Syracuse.

FLORIDA STATE’S BENCH BUNCH AVERAGING

Led by freshman Matthew Cleveland’s 10.7 points per game scoring average, Florida State’s bench averages 29.3 (439 points in 15 games) points scored per game. Cleveland is the league’s leading candidate to win the Seminoles’ fourth consecutive ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award. Florida State’s bench has outscored its opponents bench in 11 of its first 15 games of the season including by an incredible 25-1 margin against Syracuse on December 4 in Tallahassee and a 25-0 margin on January 11 in its 65-64 win over Miami. Cleveland has scored in double figures eight times with each of his appearances coming off of the bench. Florida State’s bench has earned 14 double figure scoring efforts with Cleveland (eight), Cam’Ron Fletcher (four) and Wyatt Wilkes (two) leading the way. Florida State’s bench has outscored its opponents’ benches by a nearly 3:1 scoring total in the last six games.

.800 Freshman Matthew Cleveland is shooting 80 percent from the field (16 of 20) in the last three games. During that span of three games he has scored 41 points and is averaging 13.7 points scored per game.

1.00 RayQuan Evans is perfect from the free throw line (nine of nine) in the Seminoles' last seven games. He has made each of his free throw attempts since December 12 against South Carolina.

1.00 Anthony Polite is a perfect from the free throw line (10 of 10) in the last three games and is shooting a career-high .810 from the free throw line entering Tuesday's game against Duke.

1 Freshman Naheem McLeod earned his first career start in the Seminoles' victory over Syracuse on Saturday. He totaled four points in 12 minutes of playing time.

3 Redshirt senior Wyatt Wilkes made his season-high of three 3-point shots in Florida State's 76-71 win over Syracuse. He has made multiple 3-point shots in three of the last four games and has doubled his 3-point field goals made total for the season in those games.

5.6 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite is averaging a career-high 5.6 rebounds this season. He has 23 rebounds in the last three games for a 7.7 rebounds per game average and totaled eight rebounds in victories over both Louisville and Miami last week.

9 Freshman John Butler has started nine consecutive games (each game since November 30 against Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge) and leads the Seminoles in blocked shots with 10. He has blocked multiple shots in four different games (three against Loyola Marymount and two each against Florida, Lipscomb and Miami).

10 Florida State is undefeated, 10-0, when it outscores its opponent.

13 Freshman Jalen Warley has at least one assist in each of the last 13 Seminole games. He is ranked fourth on the team in assists with 26 assists and a 1.9 assists per game average.

70 Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills has made 70 3-point field goals in the first 50 games of his career – an average of 1.3 3-point field goals made per game. He made 50 3-point field goals as a true freshman (2019-20) at the University of Houston.

99 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite will play in his 99th career game on Tuesday night against Duke. He will tie his father, Michael, for the most games played as a Seminole among members of the Polite family. Michael played in 99 games for the Seminoles from 1988-91. He averaged 10.8 points and 6.8 rebounds during his career at Florida State.

ON HARRISON PRIETO – THE WEATHERMAN

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto scored four points and earned a career-high three steals in 15 minutes of playing time in Florida State's victory over Syracuse on Saturday in the Carrier Dome. He has now scored more points (26) and earned more steals (four) in eight games this season than he did in the first 27 games and five years of his career (24 points and 1 steal). His three steals in the Seminoles' victory over the Orange rank as a career-high.

RAYQUAN EVANS IN HIS LAST TWO GAMES...

...Has scored 26 points and is averaging 13.0 points per game. He has scored in double figures against both Miami (11 points) and Syracuse (15 points) in leading the Seminoles to wins over Miami and Syracuse;
...Is shooting .529 from the field (nine of 17). He made five field goals in scoring 15 points against Syracuse and totaled four field goals and scored 11 points against Miami;
...Is shooting .429 from the 3-point line with two 3-point shots made in the Seminoles' win over Syracuse;
...Is shooting 1.00 from the free throw line with two-of-two free throws coming against Miami and three-of-three free throws coming in Saturday's win over Syracuse.

EVANS FREE THROWS AGAINST MIAMI AND SYRACUSE

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans enters Tuesday's game against Duke shooting .769 from the free throw line for the season. He helped his free throw shooting percentage in two games last week with a perfect five of five performance from the line with each of his free throws having a direct impact on the Seminoles' two wins over Miami and Louisville. He made two free throws with 0.08 seconds remaining to score the game-winning points against Miami then made two free throws with three seconds left to give the Seminoles an insurmountable lead against Syracuse.

The intersection between sports and political issues is not a brand new landscape.

In the past, sports figures such as Muhammad Ali, Bill Russell, Jim Brown made their voices heard in the 1960s with the hopes of bringing change to a variety of different social issues.

Recently, Lakers star LeBron James has become an activist on police brutality and racial injustice after the police shooting of Jacob Blake in Wisconsin last summer.

Florida State junior forward Malik Osborne is looking to follow in Ali, Russell, Brown, and James' footsteps as he is already bringing change to the school's campus.

Osborne is one of the 30 members on FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force, which engages the faculty, staff, and student communities to have open dialogues about racism, diversity, and inclusion at the university. The purpose of the Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force is to identify sources of systemic racism and other areas of need and ways to improve the diversity climate around the campus.

FSU President John Thrasher asked Osborne if he wanted to be part of the committee, and he quickly accepted the prestigious honor.

"It was an extreme honor, and I told my parents about it, and my parents were so happy and proud of me," Osborne told the *Democrat*. "I told Coach Ham how thankful I was and President Thrasher to be a part of such an exclusive committee and be a part of a group of members who can insight change around the campus that's been around since before I've been around. So it was such a special honor to be a part of, and it is special to be around a group that has such a strong voice around campus."

FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force usually has Zoom meetings a few times each month. The main objectives of the task force are to have an open forum where they hear from the student body or just locals around Tallahassee who have issues or complaints or just concerns about things on campus that might be racially insensitive.

One of the controversial decisions made in the task force meetings was removing Francis W. Eppes' name from the College of Criminology building and permanently removing the Eppes statue from campus. They also recommended the removal of B.K. Roberts' name from a College of Law building.

While some maybe have questioned why FSU would remove old names and statues from buildings, Osborne said it is important to make the campus as safe and comfortable as possible for the students.

"I believe it's critical because you don't want people to come to your school and feel like it's an uncomfortable learning environment because it shoves them away and limits their potential as well," Osborne said. I feel like listening to everyone's concerns, no matter if we agree with it or not is vital because you don't know if someone has the same viewpoint or the same perceive because they're not speaking up.

"So with the removal of the Eppes statue and the name on the building, that's a big step just to show how serious this task is and how serious we are about making change. We want people to know when they come to us; it is going to be a meaningful interaction. When they say something, they're going to be heard, and we are the voice of the student body and bring this to President Thrasher, who has a lot of other responsibilities, but this is just another responsibility that we bring to him.

"This is where a lot of people in the student body have been saying, and we should probably look into it because we are a top 20 university in the nation, so we want to uphold this reputation and continue to strive to be higher because we want to create a comfortable work environment and we want to have a great student life as well because that's what makes Florida State, Florida State."

Osborne started becoming aware of the social issues around him back when he was going up in Matteson, Illinois. He would listen to stories from not only his parents but his grandparents about all of the racial issues surrounding them from when they were kids. After listening to those stories, Osborne wanted to be part of the change. Even on a gameday, Osborne took part in an anti-racism task force conference call just hours before the Seminoles played Miami on Feb. 24.

Not only does Osborne have the support of his teammates, but also the FSU coaches.

"Malik is an extremely intelligent youngster, extremely competitive," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "He has a deep respect for doing what's right. He's the kind of guy that does well in the classroom and is also a leader on the team."

"He has that ability to make the right decisions about things. And he stands for the things that are right. I'm very proud of the fact that he's matured enough to want to be a part of the solution and not one of those guys interested in being part of the problem. He knows if he isn't doing anything, then he's not contributing."

Not only does Osborne want to walk in James' footsteps as a basketball player, but he also admires what the NBA All-Star does off the court.

That's why Osborne has been meeting with Thrasher on his own time about social issues that are bothering Osborne and other students around campus. Thrasher hopes he and Osborne can continue to create change for the diverse student body at FSU.

"It's been a pleasure to get to know Malik over the past couple of years," Thrasher said in a statement. "While Malik may be well-known for his basketball talents, he's also an outstanding young man."

"I'm so proud of his commitment to tackle issues of racial inequity and injustice. His service on Florida State's anti-racism task force will help ensure a more diverse and inclusive campus for future generations."

While Osborne wants to continue to play basketball at a high level as long as he can, he also wants to continue to bring about change to the FSU campus even after he leaves Tallahassee. He plans on not only influencing the students there at FSU now but into the future.

The deaths of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, had a major effect on Osborne. While some have told athletes to "shut up and dribble," Osborne hopes he continues to make his mark as a student-athlete on and off of the court.

"I want to be able to voice these opinions because I know it is my opinion, but these are the opinions of others as well. I just wanted to share my opinion and other's opinions of how demoralizing, hurtful, and how shocking it is to continue to see this as it almost seems like a trend of police brutality, especially when minorities and African-Americans."

"These stories of racial inequality and police brutality have affected me but has motivated me to go harder for the task force and not be afraid to speak up. If I don't speak up about social issues, then no one is going to know."

"The campus has been around for so long it is not going to be a percent, and it is going to be some changes that need to be made along the way. If this group stays around, who knows, there might be some more changes that may be implemented even after I leave from Florida State."
