FLORIDA STATE MAKES TRIP TO SYRACUSE; FACES ORANGE ON SATURDAY AT 3:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has won three of its last four ACC games, travels to play its third ACC road game of the season as it plays at Syracuse in the Carrier Dome on Saturday, January 15, 2022 at 3:00 p.m. The game between the Seminoles and the Orange marks the second meeting of the season between the two teams after Syracuse took a 63-60 win at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on December 4, 2021. Florida State has won four of its last five overall games since a 97-60 win over Lipscomb on December 15 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles arrive in central New York to play Syracuse having won two straight ACC games – a 79-70 win over Louisville and a 65-64 win over Miami – to raise their conference record to 3-2. Following Saturday's game at Syracuse, the Seminoles return to Tallahassee and play three games in five days including No. 8 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Tuesday, January 18 at 9:00 in the first of two meetings between the Seminoles and the Blue Devils.

SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR THE FLORIDA STATE BASKETBALL PROGRAM

Florida State has rescheduled two games which had been postponed from earlier this season. The Seminoles will now play host to UNF on January 20, 2022 at 12 Noon at the Donald L. Tucker Center (rescheduled from December 21) and travel to play at Boston College on February 21, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. (rescheduled from December 29). The Seminoles' game against UNF will be televised on ACC Network Extra while their game against Boston College will air on the ACC Network.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORIES OVER LOUISVILLE AND MIAMI

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Syracuse having won its last two ACC games against teams (Louisville and Miami) who were a combined 9-0 in conference play at the start of their games against the Cardinals and the Hurricanes. The Cardinals were 4-0 and tied for the ACC lead while the Hurricanes were 5-0 and alone in first place in the conference standings. Entering Saturday's game at Syracuse, the first five ACC opponents of the season are a combined 16-13 (Miami, 5-1; Louisville, 4-2; Wake Forest, 3-3; Syracuse, 2-3; NC State, 2-4) in conference play.

SEMINOLES SCORED FIVE POINTS IN FINAL 27 SECONDS TO TOP MIAMI

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne made a 3-point shot from the left elbow with 27 seconds left to play, and redshirt senior RayQuan Evans made two free throw with 0.8 seconds left to play as Florida State scored five points in the final 27 seconds, withstood the games' 11th lead change and defeated Miami, 65-64, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on Tuesday night. Florida State outscored the Hurricanes, 5-3, in the final 27 seconds and 5-3 in the final minute of the contest to gain the win. The game saw 11 lead changes and five ties with the final tie coming at the 6:11 mark of the second half with the score knotted at 55-55.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 386 career wins at Florida State.

...Defeat Syracuse and win its second consecutive game at the Carrier Dome. The Seminoles defeated the Orange, 80-62, February 5, 2019. The Seminoles have won twice in six previous trips to the Carrier Dome (March 12, 1997 and February 5, 2019);

...Defeat Syracuse and win its third straight ACC game. The Seminoles defeated both Louisville (January 8) and Miami (January 11) in their last two games and most recently won three consecutive ACC games during the 2020-21 season with three straight wins over Virginia (February 15, 81-60), at Pittsburgh (February 20, 79-72) and at Miami (February 24, 88-71) as part of a four game winning streak during the month of February during the 2020-21 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 43-15 in ACC regular season play (.741 winning percentage) since the start of the conference schedule in 2018-19. The Seminoles have averaged 13.3 ACC wins per season and are 16-13 in ACC road games during the last three seasons.

FLORIDA STATE FINDING THEIR WINNING WAYS

Florida State has won four of its last five games since December 15 with victories over Lipscomb (December 15, 97-60) at NC State (January 1, 82-81), Louisville (January 8, 79-70) and Miami (January 11, 65-64) and has won three of its last four ACC games with wins over the Wolfpack, the Cardinals and the Hurricanes.

SEMINOLES SHOOTING WELL FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Including two of two free throws made by redshirt senior RayQuan Evans with 0.8 seconds remaining to be played in the Seminoles' 65-64 win over Miami on Tuesday night, the Seminoles shot .813 from the free throw line – the third time this season they had shot 80 percent or better from the line in a single game. The Seminoles were made 12 of their 15 second half free throws in defeating the Hurricanes including each of the final five of the game – two by Evans (with 0.8 seconds remaining in the game), two by Anthony Polite (with 1:27 remaining) and one by Matthew Cleveland (with 2:40 left to be played). Florida State is shooting .725 from the free throw line in their last three games (50 of 69) and enter Saturday's game against Syracuse as one of 12 teams in the ACC that is shooting better than 70 percent from the line as a team.

FLORIDA STATE AS THE ACC STEALS LEADER

With double digit steals in six of its first 14 games of the season, Florida State enters Saturday's game against Syracuse as the ACC team steals leader with a 9.9 steals per game average. The Seminoles totaled eight steals in their first game against Syracuse on December 4 and have earned at least eight steals if four of their first five ACC games of the season. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

SEMINOLES RECEIVING THE EXPECTED PRODUCTION FROM THEIR BENCH

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland has scored 141 points and is averaging 10.8 points scored per game – all coming off the bench. He is the league's leading candidate to win the Seminoles' fourth consecutive ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award. Florida State's bench has outscored its opponents bench in 10 of its first 14 games of the season including by an incredible 25-1 margin against Syracuse on December 4 in Tallahassee and a 25-0 margin on Tuesday night in its 65-64 win over Miami. Cleveland has scored in double figures eight times with each of his appearances coming off of the bench. Florida State's bench has earned 13 double figure scoring efforts with Cleveland (eight), Cam'Ron Fletcher (four) and Wyatt Wilkes (one) leading the way.

Florida State has held seven of its first 14 opponents below 40 percent shooting from the field and enters Saturday's game against Syracuse holding its opponents to a .422 shooting percentage from the field. The Seminoles held Tulane to a .291 shooting percentage (in Florida State's 59-54 win on November 17) and held Syracuse to a .349 shooting mark in the first meeting between the two teams. Florida State has held 12 of its first 14 opponents of the season under 50 percent shooting from the field.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SYRACUSE – THE LAST MEETING

Cole Swider had 16 points, 10 rebounds and two big free throws in the final minute as Syracuse defeated Florida State 63-60 in the ACC opener for both teams at the Donald L. Tucker Center on December 4, 2021. The loss snapped FSU's 25-game homecourt winning streak in ACC play. The conference record is 26, set by Duke from 1997 to 2000. Syracuse led 55-44 with 5:43 left before FSU, which had shot 20% for most of the second half, got hot. The Seminoles made five straight shots, the last a 3-pointer by Malik Osborne, to make it 61-60 with 42 seconds left. After both teams committed turnovers Syracuse had the ball with 12 seconds left. Florida State had to foul twice to force the one-and-one, sending Swider to the line. He made both attempts for a 63-60 lead, then Caleb Mills and Osborne missed 3-pointers in the final 10 seconds. Buddy Boeheim, the Orange's leading scorer at 21 points per game, scored six. The starters scored all but one point for Syracuse. Mills led Florida State with 16 points and Osborne added 10 points and eight rebounds.

Florida State Basketball By the Numbers

.571 Freshman John Butler is shooting .571 from the 3-point line in the last six games. He made his career-high of three from the bonusphere in the Seminoles' victory over Lipscomb (90-67, December 15) and was a perfect two of two from the 3-point line in Florida State's win over Miami on Tuesday.

.700 Sophomore Naheem McLeod is shooting .700 from the field (seven of 10) in the last four games and shooting .667 from the field for the season (16 of 24).

.885 Sophomore Caleb Mills is shooting .885 from the free throw line (23 of 26) in the last eight games. He made six free throws each at Wake Forest (six of six, 1.000) and in Florida State's victory over Louisville (six of eight, .750 percent).

.897 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite is shooting .897 from the free throw line (35 of 39) in the last 12 games.

.909 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite is shooting .909 from the free throw line (10 of 11) in the Seminoles' three ACC wins so far this season. He has made eight straight free throws in Florida State's last two victories over Louisville (four of four) and Miami (four of four).

1 Freshman Matthew Cleveland was named the ACC Freshman of the Week for the first time in his career on January 3 for the 13-point, 10-rebound performance in Florida State's win over NC State.

9 Florida State is undefeated, 9-0, when it outscores its opponent.

12 Freshman Jalen Warley has at least one assist in each of the last 12 games and in 13 of his first 14 games as a Seminole. He enters Saturday's game against Syracuse with 27 assists and a 1.9 assists per game average.

15 Redshirt senior Malik Osborne has made 15 consecutive free throws – his current career-longest streak began as he made his final seven free throw attempts (he was seven of 18 in the 83-81 Florida State win) against NC State and was perfect from the free throw line against Wake Forest (two of two), Louisville (four of four) and Miami (two of two).

27 Redshirt senior Malik Osborne made his most important 3-point shot of the season with 27 seconds remaining to be played in Florida State's 65-64 win over Miami. His 3-point shot gave Florida State a 63-61 lead. Though the Hurricanes regained the lead, Florida State win the game on two free throws by RayQuan Evans with 0.8 seconds remaining in the game.

63.4 Sophomore Naheem McLeod has scored 26 of his 41 points this season (.634 percent) in the first five ACC games of his career.

NOTING RAYQUAN EVANS' FREE THROWS

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans has made 80 of 102 free throws and is shooting .784 percent from the free throw line during his three seasons as a Seminole – but none have been bigger than the two he made with 0.8 seconds remaining in Florida State's victory over Miami on Tuesday at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Has made six consecutive free throws and is shooting .739 from the line as a Seminole after shooting his career-high of .848 from the line as a senior during the 2020-21 season when the Seminoles advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans totaled two steals in Florida State's 65-64 win over Miami on Tuesday night and enters Saturday's game at Syracuse ranked 10th in the ACC in steals per games with a career-high 1.6 steals per game average. He has as many steals in his first 12 games of the 2021-22 season (19) as he did in the first two seasons and 53 games of his Florida State career (19).

OSBORNE RANKED IN ACC'S TOP FIVE FOR FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne, who has made 15 consecutive free throws, enters Saturday's against Syracuse game shooting a career-high .839 from the free throw line. After making 12 of his first 17 free throw attempts of the season (.706) he has made 35 of his last 39 attempts (.897) in the last 12 games.

MATTHEW CLEVELAND IN HIS LAST FOUR GAMES...

...He has scored 58 points and is averaging 14.5 points scored per game. He has scored in double figures in four consecutive games;
 ...He is shooting .571 from the field (20 of 35) and made five of seven field goal attempts in Florida States win over Miami;

Gesture From Purdue Fans To Florida State's Grieving RayQuan Evans Shows Hoops World Can Be A Lovely Place

Somewhere in the course of an evening Florida State guard RayQuan Evans might prefer to forget but will always remember, a fan of the team that would dominate the Seminoles that night got the attention of one of FSU's staff members. The fan handed the staffer an envelope and asked that it be passed along to Evans.

He carries it with him everywhere he goes now.

"I can find it really quick," Evans tells Sporting News. "I've got to find my backpack first." Upon retrieving it, he describes the exterior of the card, which is black with a Purdue logo affixed to the front.

And then he reads what is contained inside: "Dear RayQuan, first and foremost we want to send our condolences to you and your family for the loss of your brother. The entire college basketball community is behind you, including your new fans in West Lafayette. Best of luck the rest of the season." And it was signed by 'The Paint Crew.'"

Evans was not in Mackey Arena that evening. It was the second of two games he missed to return to Montana to be with his family and attend the funeral of his brother, Tye Lafranier, who passed away 10 days before, at age 27, from a rare form of leukemia. Lafranier had been a multi-sport athlete in high school and enjoyed watching RayQuan's games with the Seminoles.

There is no gameplan for navigating an athletic season in the midst of immeasurable loss, so Evans has improvised through the past six weeks. He learned of Tye's death while he was across the state playing with the Seminoles in the Jacksonville Classic. He scored 8 points and passed for 6 assists in an 81-58 championship game victory over Missouri.

"During that tournament, my mother called me and told me my brother was going through a little episode of uncertainty, so she was spending time with him.," Evans said. "I just went into that game like any normal game. I got to talk to my other brother and my family who was with my brother in the hospital. And then after the game, I met up with my dad, and he kind of broke the news to me. Of course I was heartbroken, so upset that I didn't get to talk to him or see him one last time.

"But I just felt, since we were playing a tournament and had another game the next day, that tournament was something I needed to finish. But I also wanted to represent and honor my brother in that moment the best that I could."

Evans is a 6-4 senior guard from Billings, Mont. He has traveled a long way both geographically and personally to be a regular for a third straight season in one of college basketball's most consistent programs.

He began his career at North Idaho College, which he acknowledges was a direction forced by inadequate academic performance while in high school.

"I had a mind of my own," Evans said. "I didn't really focus on school as much. I kind of thought the basketball was going to take care of itself and I could go play anywhere."

Evans said he did not listen to those who advised him about the importance of his school work, but junior college was all the convincing he needed. He earned an associates degree in Graphic Design while at North Idaho, was spotted by FSU in part because former Seminole Braian Angola-Rodas had played there, and made the decision to travel 2,000 miles from home to complete his college career. Evans now has a degree in Social Science and is working on a second bachelor's in International Affairs.

With FSU's ACC championship team in 2019-20, he averaged 11 minutes and 3.1 points but did not get the experience of pursuing a Final Four bid because the NCAA Tournament was canceled at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. Last season, when the Seminoles reached the Sweet 16 but missed a chance to win the ACC regular season and fell in the ACC Tournament final, he started and averaged 5.1 points and 1.4 assists.

With FSU basketball now on a COVID pause, he has not had the distraction of playing or practicing basketball since a Dec. 18 game against UCF was canceled – “Of course I want to play games,” he said – but there has been a benefit to the absence of activity.

“It’s kind of good for me, in all honesty. After my brother’s funeral, I had to come back the next day and kind of jump right back into playing games. So I didn’t really get time to comprehend and sit with my emotions and really accept what had happened,” Evans said. “In a way, this is what I needed to kind of come to peace with myself and also the fact my brother’s gone up to Heaven and the afterlife.

“Obviously, when I get to play games it helps, because I get to honor him. Every game I play is for him. But I feel like the break is a little blessing in disguise for me.”

In his first game back after attending his brother’s funeral, a narrow ACC defeat against Syracuse in which he came off the bench to score 9 points and grab 6 rebounds, Evans took a marking pen and wrote a short message on the white strip of his maroon Nike sneakers: “For you Tye ...” with a small heart emoji drawn at the end of that ellipsis.

To say it’s been a difficult start to the season because the Seminoles have lost four of their six games against high-major opponents is rather missing the point. There have been losses that matter much more, but also triumphs that go beyond the final score.

“The Purdue student section – I’ll forever be grateful for them,” Evans told SN. “That was an amazing feeling. I’m very thankful they took the time to do that and acknowledge that, going into a big game. They didn’t have to. It’s something I think about every day. It means a lot to me. It just shows that the basketball community -- as much as we compete and stuff – everyone’s together. For them to go out of their way to do that, that was big for me. It shows that it’s bigger than basketball.”

Malik Osborne Is Looking To Create Change On FSU's Anti-Racism Task Force

The intersection between sports and political issues is not a brand new landscape.

In the past, sports figures such as Muhammad Ali, Bill Russell, Jim Brown made their voices heard in the 1960s with the hopes of bringing change to a variety of different social issues.

Recently, Lakers star LeBron James has become an activist on police brutality and racial injustice after the police shooting of Jacob Blake in Wisconsin last summer.

Florida State junior forward Malik Osborne is looking to follow in Ali, Russell, Brown, and James' footsteps as he is already bringing change to the school's campus.

Osborne is one of the 30 members on FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force, which engages the faculty, staff, and student communities to have open dialogues about racism, diversity, and inclusion at the university. The purpose of the Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force is to identify sources of systemic racism and other areas of need and ways to improve the diversity climate around the campus.

FSU President John Thrasher asked Osborne if he wanted to be part of the committee, and he quickly accepted the prestigious honor.

"It was an extreme honor, and I told my parents about it, and my parents were so happy and proud of me," Osborne told the *Democrat*. "I told Coach Ham how thankful I was and President Thrasher to be a part of such an exclusive committee and be a part of a group of members who can insight change around the campus that's been around since before I've been around. So it was such a special honor to be a part of, and it is special to be around a group that has such a strong voice around campus."

FSU's Anti-Racism, Diversity & Inclusion Task Force usually has Zoom meetings a few times each month. The main objectives of the task force are to have an open forum where they hear from the student body or just locals around Tallahassee who have issues or complaints or just concerns about things on campus that might be racially insensitive.

One of the controversial decisions made in the task force meetings was removing Francis W. Eppes' name from the College of Criminology building and permanently removing the Eppes statue from campus. They also recommended the removal of B.K. Roberts' name from a College of Law building.

While some maybe have questioned why FSU would remove old names and statues from buildings, Osborne said it is important to make the campus as safe and comfortable as possible for the students.

"I believe it's critical because you don't want people to come to your school and feel like it's an uncomfortable learning environment because it shoves them away and limits their potential as well," Osborne said. I feel like listening to everyone's concerns, no matter if we agree with it or not is vital because you don't know if someone has the same viewpoint or the same perceive because they're not speaking up.

"So with the removal of the Eppes statue and the name on the building, that's a big step just to show how serious this task is and how serious we are about making change. We want people to know when they come to us; it is going to be a meaningful interaction. When they say something, they're going to be heard, and we are the voice of the student body and bring this to President Thrasher, who has a lot of other responsibilities, but this is just another responsibility that we bring to him.

"This is where a lot of people in the student body have been saying, and we should probably look into it because we are a top 20 university in the nation, so we want to uphold this reputation and continue to strive to be higher because we want to create a comfortable work environment and we want to have a great student life as well because that's what makes Florida State, Florida State."

Osborne started becoming aware of the social issues around him back when he was going up in Matteson, Illinois. He would listen to stories from not only his parents but his grandparents about all of the racial issues surrounding them from when they were kids. After listening to those stories, Osborne wanted to be part of the change. Even on a gameday, Osborne took part in an anti-racism task force conference call just hours before the Seminoles played Miami on Feb. 24.

Not only does Osborne have the support of his teammates, but also the FSU coaches.

"Malik is an extremely intelligent youngster, extremely competitive," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "He has a deep respect for doing what's right. He's the kind of guy that does well in the classroom and is also a leader on the team."

"He has that ability to make the right decisions about things. And he stands for the things that are right. I'm very proud of the fact that he's matured enough to want to be a part of the solution and not one of those guys interested in being part of the problem. He knows if he isn't doing anything, then he's not contributing."

Not only does Osborne want to walk in James' footsteps as a basketball player, but he also admires what the NBA All-Star does off the court.

That's why Osborne has been meeting with Thrasher on his own time about social issues that are bothering Osborne and other students around campus. Thrasher hopes he and Osborne can continue to create change for the diverse student body at FSU.

"It's been a pleasure to get to know Malik over the past couple of years," Thrasher said in a statement. "While Malik may be well-known for his basketball talents, he's also an outstanding young man."

"I'm so proud of his commitment to tackle issues of racial inequity and injustice. His service on Florida State's anti-racism task force will help ensure a more diverse and inclusive campus for future generations."

While Osborne wants to continue to play basketball at a high level as long as he can, he also wants to continue to bring about change to the FSU campus even after he leaves Tallahassee. He plans on not only influencing the students there at FSU now but into the future.

The deaths of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, had a major effect on Osborne. While some have told athletes to "shut up and dribble," Osborne hopes he continues to make his mark as a student-athlete on and off of the court.

"I want to be able to voice these opinions because I know it is my opinion, but these are the opinions of others as well. I just wanted to share my opinion and other's opinions of how demoralizing, hurtful, and how shocking it is to continue to see this as it almost seems like a trend of police brutality, especially when minorities and African-Americans."

"These stories of racial inequality and police brutality have affected me but has motivated me to go harder for the task force and not be afraid to speak up. If I don't speak up about social issues, then no one is going to know."

"The campus has been around for so long it is not going to be a percent, and it is going to be some changes that need to be made along the way. If this group stays around, who knows, there might be some more changes that may be implemented even after I leave from Florida State."
