FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO UNF ON THURSDAY AT NOON

Florida State, which has won four consecutive games, plays host to UNF on Thursday, January 20, 2022 at 12 Noon at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The game between the Seminoles and the Ospreys was postponed on December 21, 2021 and was rescheduled to be played on Thursday. Florida State's game against UNF is one of two rescheduled games for the Seminoles who also saw their game against Boston College change to February 20, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. from December 29, 2021. That game will be played in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The game between the Seminoles and the Ospreys marks the seventh meeting between the two teams with the most recent coming during the 2020-21 season – an 86-58 victory. Following Thursday's game against UNF, the Seminoles travel to play at Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla., on Saturday, January 22 at 2:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. UNF – CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays host to North Florida on January 20, 2022 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles' game against the Osprey's marks the seventh meeting between the two teams – with each of the first six games coming during the tenure of Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and each coming as Florida State victories. North Florida Head Coach Matt Driscoll has coached the Ospreys in each of the first six games of the series and knows the Seminoles and Hamilton well. Driscoll spent six seasons as an assistant to Larry Shyatt at Clemson (1998-2003) – a time period when the Seminoles were 9-7 against the Tigers, including four wins in the ACC Tournament. Bobby Keenan, the associate head coach at North Florida, served on Seminole playing and coaching legend Hugh Durham's coaching staff at Jacksonville for five years (2000-05). Bruce Evans, also an assistant coach on the UNF staff, was the Director of Player Development at Georgia Tech (2012-16) when the Seminoles earned a 3-1 mark against the Yellow Jackets.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on Tuesday with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked.

FLORIDA STATE AT THE DONALD L. TUCKER CENTER IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

Florida State is 84-5 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.944 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 84 of their last 89 home games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 81 of 86 home games (.942MADISON winning percentage) in the last five seasons. The Seminoles have lost just one ACC home game since a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Florida State has won 28 of its last 29 ACC home games since defeating the Tigers and won 25 consecutive ACC home games from January 22, 2019 through March 3, 2021 – the second longest conference winning streak in ACC history. Only Duke, who won 26 straight ACC home games from 1997-2002, has a longer streak than then Seminoles in the history of the greatest conference in college basketball history.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 388 career wins at Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE BY THE NUMBERS AGAINST DUKE...

...Florida State limited Duke to two steals – the Blue Devils entered Tuesday's game ranked third in the ACC with an 8.3 steals per game average;

...Florida State forced Duke into 15 turnovers – far more than their 9.9 turnovers per game average entering Tuesday's game. The Seminoles scored 14 points off turnovers including 11 off of eight Duke turnovers in the first half;

...Florida State outrebounded Duke by a 42-37 margin including 19-7 on the offensive glass. The Blue Devils entered Tuesday's game with a +3 rebounding margin for the season;

...Duke entered Tuesday's game in Tallahassee ranked first in the ACC in scoring offense (83.1) points scored per game and were limited to 78 points. It was defensively, where the Blue Devils entered the game surrendering 65.2 points per game that the Seminoles gained an advantage as they scored 79 points – nearly 14 points above Duke's season-scoring average;

...Florida State's bench outscored Duke's bench by a 23-13 margin – the sixth time in the last seven games the Seminoles' bench has outscored its opponents' bench.

SEMINOLES AT HOME IN THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State has won 36 of its last 37 non-conference home game including its 97-60 win over Lipscomb on December 15, 2021. As they play host to UNF on Thursday in its rescheduled game against the Ospreys, the Seminoles will play a non-conference game during their conference schedule for the first time since the 2007-08 season when they played host to LaSalle after starting the bulk of their conference schedule on January 5, 2008.

SEMINOLES WITH SEASON-LOW FIVE TURNOVERS IN WIN OVER DUKE

With no one player being charged with more than one turnover, Florida State committed a season low five turnovers in its 79-78 overtime win over Duke on Tuesday night. The Seminoles have finished with six or fewer turnovers in two of their last four games and average 9.0 turnovers per game during their current four game winning streak. Florida State committed zero turnovers in outscoring Duke 12-11 in the overtime period in defeating the Blue Devils.

A KEY TO THE SEMINOLE'S OVERTIME SUCCESS

Florida State won its 13th consecutive overtime game with its 79-78 win Duke on Tuesday in Tallahassee – the Seminoles' second overtime win of the season. One of the common denominators in Florida State's overtime wins over Boston University and Duke was the absence of turnovers by the Seminoles in the overtime periods. The Seminoles outscored BU by a 10-9 margin with zero overtime turnovers and outscored Duke with a 12-11 margin with zero turnovers in the overtime period.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE STRANGLEHOLD ON ACC STEALS LEAD

Led by RayQuan Evans' three steals in Florida State's 79-78 overtime win over Duke, the Seminoles totaled nine steals and maintained their status as the ACC leader in steals with a 9.6 steals per game average. Florida State not only leads the ACC in steals with 154, it leads the ACC in steals per game with a 9.6 average. The Seminoles have earned at least five steals in every game this season, have earned in double figures in steals in six different games and earned a season-high 16 steals in their game at Wake Forest on January 4. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 21 ASSISTS IN WIN OVER SYRACUSE

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans totaled a team-high five assists in the Seminoles 79-78 win over Duke on Tuesday in Tallahassee. As a team, Florida State totaled 13 assists on 26 baskets – against only five turnovers – for 2:1 assist:turnover ratio. It marked the fourth time this this season the Seminoles earned an A:TO ratio 2:1 – with three of those performances coming in ACC play.

SEMINOLES HOLDING TEAMS OUT OF THE PASSING LANES

Florida State surrendered only two steals in its victories over Syracuse and Duke – for a total of four steals allowed. The two steals the Seminoles allowed by the Orange and the Blue Devils are the fewest steals allowed by the Seminoles in a game this season. Florida State allowed only 12 points off of turnovers in Saturday's victory over the Orange and held Syracuse to a total of seven steals in the two games between the teams this season – five on December 4 in Tallahassee and two on January 15 at Syracuse. Florida State limited Duke to seven points off turnovers in its win over the Blue Devils.

FLORIDA STATE VS. UNF – THE LAST MEETING

Senior M.J. Walker scored a game-high 17 points and No. 18 Florida State opened its 2020-21 season with an 86-58 win against North Florida at the Donald L. Tucker Center on December 2, 2020. The Seminoles maintained a steady lead throughout the game in winning its 24th consecutive game at home. The win was the Seminoles' sixth consecutive in the series against North Florida. The Seminoles dominated the first half, as they closed it out with a 36-21 lead over the Ospreys. The Seminoles utilized eight players throughout the first half who all played eight or more minutes and had 12 players play within the first seven minutes. Before the halftime buzzer, North Florida was able to close in on their deficit with back-to-back 3-pointers by sophomore Jose Placer. Florida State out-rebounded the Ospreys 21-12 the first half. The Seminoles also had six steals in the first half and 12 steals overall, surpassing their average of 7.9 steals per game last year. Walker finished with 17 points, four rebounds, and two assists. He added to his total of 132 career 3-point shots made.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Cole Swider had 16 points, 10 rebounds and two big free throws in the final minute as Syracuse defeated Florida State 63-60 in the ACC opener for both teams. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 12 seconds remaining and John Butler blocked a jump shot by Wendell More, Jr., with two seconds remaining, and Florida State won its NCAA record 13th consecutive overtime decision with a 79-78 win over No. 5 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak. The win was Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton's eighth all-time win over Duke. The win was also the Seminoles' first over a top-5 ranked team since a 69-69 win over Virginia on March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. The Seminoles started the second half in a 38-33 hole at half but turned it around at the under 16-minute media timeout to lead by a 44-34 margin. Sophomore Naheem McLeod started for the second time in his season and finished with a near a double-double with a career-high nine points and 10 rebounds.
