FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO WAKE FOREST FOLLOWING ROAD WIN AT NC STATE

Florida State, which has a winning record on the road in ACC play in the last four seasons (16-12), travels to play Wake Forest at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum on Tuesday, January 4, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles arrive in Winston-Salem fresh from an 83-81 win at NC State at the PNC Arena in Raleigh on Saturday. The Seminoles have won three of their last five ACC road games since a 79-72 win at Pittsburgh on February 20, 2021. Florida State enters its game at Wake Forest riding a streak of four consecutive wins over Wake Forest – a string of decisions that includes two straight wins over the Deacons at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum. Following Tuesday's game at Wake Forest, the Seminoles play host to Louisville on Saturday, January 8 at 8:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE'S CLEVELAND NAMED ACC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Seminole freshman Matthew Cleveland, who enters Tuesday's game averaging 9.6 points scored per games, was named the ACC Freshman of the Week on January 3, 2022. He earned his first career double double of 13 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State's 83-81 win over NC State on Saturday. He pushed himself to the double double with three points in the final 11 seconds and two offensive rebounds in the final 18 seconds of the Seminoles' victory. Cleveland totaled nine points, seven rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot in the second half of the Seminoles' victory over the Wolfpack.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 80-24 (.769 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and were 18-7 during the 2020-21 season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won more than 75 percent of their games with a record of 44-14 (.759 percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 41-14 in ACC regular season play (.745 winning percentage) since the start of the conference schedule in 2018-19. The Seminoles have averaged 13.3 ACC wins per season in the last three seasons and are 16-12 in ACC road games during the last three seasons.

MILLS RETURNS TO HIS HOME STATE

Caleb Mills, who is Florida State's leader in steals and who ranks second in scoring, will play in front of quite a few family members and friends as the Seminoles travel to play Wake Forest in his home state of North Carolina. Mills grew up in Arden, N.C. – and will play collegiately in his home state for the first time against the Deacons.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 384 career wins at Florida State.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Wake Forest and win their fifth consecutive game against the Demon Deacons. A win would mark the second five-game winning streak by the Seminoles over the Deacons in the series between the two teams that began during the 1958-59 season;

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its second consecutive ACC road game after winning at NC State on January 1. The Seminoles won consecutive games, both ACC road games, at Pittsburgh (February 20, 2021) and at Miami (February 24, 2021) last season in earning three ACC road wins during the shortened 2020-21 season;

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its third games in its last four games played in the state of North Carolina. The Seminoles defeated North Carolina in the semifinals of the 2021 ACC Tournament (in Greensboro), fell to Georgia Tech in the 2021 ACC Tournament Championship game (in Greensboro) and defeated NC State in Raleigh on Saturday.

SEMINOLES SHOOTING THE BALL WELL IN LAST TWO VICTORIES

Florida State, which ranks sixth in the ACC in field goal shooting percentage, has shot better than 50 percent in both of its last two games – victories over Lipscomb (December 15) and NC State (January 1). The Seminoles are shooting .520 from the field, are averaging 90.0 points scored per game and are 2-0 in their last two games. Florida State has shot 50 percent or better from the field in four wins this season (Loyola Marymount, Missouri, Lipscomb and NC State) and are averaging 81.8 points scored in those games. The Seminoles shot a season-high .611 in their 81-58 win over Missouri in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic.

SEMINOLES SCORING

Florida State has scored 180 points in their last two games – an average of 90.0 points scored per game. The Seminoles scored 97 points in their win over Lipscomb (December 15) and 80 in Saturday's win over NC State. It marks the most points they have scored in a two-game span this season. Florida State scored its season-high of 105 points in its season-opening 105-70 win over Penn in Tallahassee (November 10).

SEMINOLES PROVING HAMILTON CORRECT; SHOOTING THE BALL WELL FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Throughout the season, Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has said the Seminoles are a good 3-point shooting team. His players have begun to prove him correct and are shooting nearly 50 percent from the 3-point line in the last two games (20 of 41, .488 percent). Florida State averages nearly 7.5 made 3-point shots in their first 11 games of the season and have made double figures in long range shots in two wins – against Missouri (10 of 24, .417 percent) and Lipscomb (14 of 26, .538 percent). Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest averaging 11.0 steals per game (22 total steals) in its last two games.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN STEALS

Florida State, which earned eight steals in Saturday's victory over NC State, enters Tuesday's game at Wake Forest as the ACC leaders in steals with 110 steals and a 10.0 steals per game average. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC who are averaging 10 or more steals per game. The Seminoles have earned 10 or more steals in five different games (15 against Penn, 14 against Loyola Marymount, 12 against Boston University, 10 against Missouri and 10 against Lipscomb) and are undefeated in each of those five games. Florida State has earned 17 steals in its first two ACC games (nine against NC State and eight against Syracuse) and have no fewer than seven steals in any one game this season. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

FLORIDA STATE'S STEALS TOTAL IN ITS WIN OVER NC STATE

Led by Cam'Ron Fletcher three steals in Florida State's 83-81 win over NC State, a total of six different Seminole players earned at least one steal against the Wolfpack. The Seminoles had a season-high 10 players earn at least one steal in their win over Loyola Marymount in the Jacksonville Classic (Nov. 21). Eight different players totaled at least one steal in victories over Penn and Missouri. Florida State has had at least four players earn at least one steal in each of its first 11 games of the season -- Loyola Marymount, 10; Penn, eight; Missouri, eight; NC State, six; Boston University, six; South Carolina, six; Lipscomb, six; Florida, five; Purdie, five; Syracuse, five and Tulane four.

SEMINOLES ARE THE ONLY ACC TEAM WITH THREE IN THE TOP 10 FOR STEALS

As the ACC steals leaders, Florida State is the only team in the overall conference statistics with three players (Caleb Mills, second, 2.0 spg; Anthony Polite, seventh, 1.71 spg; RayQuan Evans 10th, 1.67 spg ranked among the top 15 individuals for average steals per game.

FLORIDA STATE'S BENCH PRODUCTION IN ITS WIN OVER NC STATE

Florida State's bench outscored NC State's bench by a 35-9 margin in the Seminoles' victory over the Wolfpack in Raleigh on Saturday. Led by freshman Matthew Cleveland's first career double double of 13 points and 10 rebounds, Florida State was led in scoring by Malik Osborne (19 points, starter), in rebounding by Cleveland (10 rebounds, bench), assists by Jalen Warley (four assists, bench) and in steals by Cam'Ron Fletcher (three, bench). Fletcher led the Seminoles from the field as he made six of eight field goal attempts (.750 percent).

FLORIDA STATE VS. WAKE FOREST – THE LAST MEETING

RaiQuan Gray had career highs in points (24) and rebounds (12) as No. 17 Florida State defeated Wake Forest 92-85 in overtime on February 13, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles tied it at 80 with under a second to go in regulation when Scottie Barnes drove the length of the floor and made a reverse layup. That set up Florida State in the extra period; the Seminoles tied a national record by winning their 11th straight overtime game. Gray made all 10 of his free-throw attempts and scored the Seminoles' first four points in overtime. The redshirt junior forward scored in double figures for the sixth straight game and had his second double double in a month for the Seminoles who were playing their first game in two weeks due to coronavirus issues. Jonah Antonio scored a career-high 23 points, drilling 7 of 8 shots from 3-point range, for Wake Forest. Ian DuBose, one of three Wake players who fouled out, added 18 points on 6 of 9 shooting. Barnes had 11 of his 13 points for Florida State in the second half or overtime. M.J. Walker scored 14 points for Florida State.

.400 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite is shooting .400 from the 3-point line (four of 10) in the last three games.

.875 Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans is shooting .875 from the free throw line (seven of eight) in the last four games and has made five consecutive free throws entering Tuesday's game at Wake Forest.

.688 Sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher is shooting .688 from the field (11 of 16) and averaging 13.0 points scored per game. He scored his career-high of 14 points in Florida State's victory over NC State.

.909 Redshirt senior Malik Osborne is shooting .909 from the free throw line (25 of 28) in the last eight games. He was a near perfect seven of eight from the free throw line and scored 19 points in Florida State's victory over NC State in Raleigh on Saturday.

3 Three Seminoles – Caleb Mills, Malik Osborne and Anthony Polite, have started each of the Seminoles' 11 games this season.

5 Freshman Matthew Cleveland has scored in double figures in five of the first 10 games of his career – 17 against Boston University, 13 against NC State, 13 against Loyola Marymount, 11 at Florida and 10 against Missouri.

7 Florida State is undefeated, 7-0, when it outscores its opponent.

8 Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans has at least one steal in eight of the nine games he has played this season and enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest with 15 steals. Evans had 19 steals in the first two seasons and 53 games of his Florida State career.

9 Redshirt senior Malik Osborne has scored in double figures nine times in the first 11 games of the season and is just five points shy of scoring in double figures in each of Florida State's 11 games. He enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest averaging a career-high 12.5 points scored per game.

13 Redshirt senior Wyatt Wilkes scored his season-high of 13 points in Florida State's 97-60 win over Lipscomb. He made a season-high five field goals (three from the 3-point line) and tied his career-high with four rebounds against the Bisons.

22 Forward Harrison Prieto has scored 22 points in the first 11 games of the 2021-22 season. He totaled 24 points in the first 22 games and five years of his career.

97 In 20 years as Florida State's head coach, Leonard Hamilton has seen to it that more than 97 percent of his seniors have graduated. Three players – Tanor Ngom (Bachelor's Degree), Wyatt Wilkes (second Bachelor's Degree), and Harrison Prieto (Master's Degree in Meteorology) are set to graduate during the spring of 2022.

CLEVELAND AVERAGING NEARLY 10 POINTS PER GAME IN THE SCORING COLUMN

Freshman Matthew Cleveland enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest ranked fourth on the team with a 9.6 points per game scoring average. He has scored in double figures five times with his season-high of 17 coming in the Seminoles' 81-80 win over Boston University – in a game during which he scored the game-winning basket with 2.1 seconds remaining in overtime. Cleveland is the ACC leader in scoring (9.6 ppg) amongst all players who have not started a game this season. That bodes well for Cleveland, as each of the last three ACC Sixth Men of the Year (Mfiondu Kabengele, 2019; Patrick Williams, 2020 and Scottie Barnes, 2021) all played at Florida State and were all first round draft picks in that season's NBA Draft.

THE AMAZING THING ABOUT CLEVELAND'S DOUBLE DOUBLE AGAINST NC STATE

Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland totaled a double double of 13 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State's victory over NC State on Saturday in Raleigh. Not only did his double double performance come in Cleveland's first ACC road game of his career, but it came in his first game since December 12. Cleveland missed Florida State's game against Lipscomb and the Seminoles' games against UCF (December 18), North Florida (December 21) and Boston College (December 29) were all either cancelled or postponed.

SEMINOLES' EVANS HAVING A GREAT DEFENSIVE YEAR

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans enters Tuesday's game at Wake Forest as one of only two players in the ACC who is ranked in the top 15 for steals (10th, 15 steals, 1.67 spg) and blocked shots (13th, eight blocked shots, 0.9 bpg). Only Evans and Malik Evans of Louisville (11th in steals and 12th in blocked shots) are among the top defenders in the ACC entering the second full week of conference play.

POLITE RANKS SEVENTH IN THE ACC IN STEALS

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite enters Tuesday's game at Wake Forest ranked seventh in the ACC with 19 steals and a 1.7 steals per game average. After totaling 19 steals in his first 31 games and two seasons of his career, Polite is averaging 1.4 steals per game (86 steals in 63 games) in the last three seasons of his career.

Florida State's Caleb Mills enters Tuesday's game ranked as Florida State's leader and ranked second in the ACC with 22 steals and a 20 steals per game average. In the first 11 games of his Florida State career, he has more steals (22) than he did during his 35-game career at Houston (21). Mills has at least one steal in eight of the last nine games with his career-high of five steals coming in the Seminoles' 81-80 win over Boston University on November 24 in Tallahassee.

OSBORNE IS SHOOTING 50 PERCENT FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne enters Tuesday's game at Wake Forest shooting 50 percent from the 3-point line (18 of 36). He was a perfect two of two from the bonusphere in the second half of Florida State's victory over NC State on Saturday with both of his made shots from long range serving as catalysts for the Seminoles' come from behind victory. Osborne's second half 3-point shots came within 38 seconds of each of each other and helped the Seminoles go from a five-point deficit to a three-point victory.

RayQuan Evans: Academic And Athletic Success At Florida State

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (seminoles.com) – During the spring of 2021, Florida State’s RayQuan Evans was working through a life-changing decision.

Evans had just earned his bachelor’s degree in Social Science and successfully completed his college education. He had walked across the graduation stage and shook the hand of then Florida State University President, John Thrasher.

Only a month before, he had played in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in his career and participated in Senior Day ceremonies with his Seminole teammates. He had walked to center court at the Donald L. Tucker Center and shook the hand of Florida State’s Leonard Hamilton, the winningest basketball coach in school history.

In October of 2020, the NCAA had granted fall and winter sport athletes an extra year of eligibility, whether they had competed during their 2020-21 seasons or not. What the rule meant was that student-athletes now had the flexibility to compete during their 2020-21 seasons, as well as to return for an additional year of competition.

Evans continues his “super senior” season on Tuesday night at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum as the Seminoles travel to play at Wake Forest in an important ACC contest. The game is set to begin at 7:00 p.m. and will be broadcast nationally on Bally Sports and Bally Sport Sun in Tallahassee.

For Evans, who had started 18 games, and led the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament along with to the ACC Tournament Championship game and completed his degree requirements, the decision to return for an extra year of education and basketball was an easy one to make.

“I came back to continue to grow as a player and as a man,” said Evans. “Being at Florida State University has helped me develop my character, but most importantly has taught me about life.”

Evans arrived at Florida State in the summer of 2019 after having earned his Associates Degree in Graphic Design at North Idaho College.

He helped the Seminoles to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 record in ACC play in his first season in Tallahassee. Evans averaged nearly 12 minutes played per game in leading the Seminoles to the first regular season ACC Championship in school history. The Seminoles’ 16 wins in ACC play established a school record for ACC regular season wins.

Before ACC Tournament play for the Seminoles began in 2020, the tournament was over because of the onset of the Covid pandemic. Though Florida State won the ACC Championship, its hopes at a national championship were dashed when the NCAA Tournament was also cancelled before it began.

Thinking that his collegiate playing days were over, Evans turned a tough situation into one that will benefit him for the rest of his life.

“Another reason I came back to Florida State for another year was to pursue another degree,” said Evans.

Evans is now working on completing his third college degree and is growing close to earning a second Bachelor’s Degree from Florida State in International Affairs.

"It's very important to be able to set an example for younger kids that school is very important," said Evans. "If all else fails with sports, you have your degrees to rely on. It's very important to me. I'm very thankful to have the opportunity to have multiple degrees. It means a lot to me and my family."

Evans, who admittedly didn't focus on academics in high school because he thought basketball would get him to where he wanted to be, is now in charge of his own destiny as he works towards his third college degree.

The idea of earning a third degree will be a significant accomplishment to present to his mother, Lavern Old Elk.

"I've always told my boys to be better than me, to go further than me," said Old Elk. "With a degree, doors will open for you. RayQuan has exceeded that and accomplished so much more (than I ever prayed he would). It's astounding how the love of basketball has provided my son an opportunity to attend one of the top universities in the nation and play for a highly respected person in Coach Hamilton."

Evans has continued to embrace one of the tenets set forth by Hamilton for his program. Nearly all of the Seminole players Hamilton has coached through four years of college (72 of 74, .973 percent) have earned their degrees.

"RayQuan is a very humble, hard-working player who has been an added bonus to our team this season," said Hamilton. "As one of our older and more mature players, he exhibits a great influence over the younger players on our team. His influence was a significant help during the summer and early part of our season in helping our newcomers become acclimated to our system and to our culture. I expect that influence to continue to grow as we get deeper into our ACC schedule."

Old Elk echoes Hamilton's sentiments.

"The coaches work the team athletically but also instill the importance of academics, and because of that, they leave with degrees. I'm so proud of my son. He's a great role model not only for my family but others as well."

As Florida State's starting point guard again this season, Evans has realized an increase in overall statistics as well as influence on the success of the team.

Evans is ranked among the top-15 in the ACC in steals (a career-high 1.7 spg) and among the top 15 in blocked shots (a career-high 0.9 bpg) while averaging a career-high 6.9 points scored per game. He already has a single-season career-high 15 steals through just his first nine games of the season along with a single-season career-high eight blocked shots.

As he reflects on his decision during the spring of 2021, it turns out that his decision was an easy one.

"I have great teammates and a great coaching staff, so the decision to come back was not a hard one at all."

Game 11 -- Florida State 83, NC State 81

RALEIGH, N.C. -- Malik Osborne scored 12 of his 19 points in the second half and Cam'Ron Fletcher and Matthew Cleveland made big plays in the final seconds to help Florida State edge NC State. Fletcher scored 14 points and Cleveland and Caleb Mills 13 each as the Seminoles survived a 32-point performance by Dereon Seabron. After Terquavion Smith hit a 3-pointer off a Seabron assist to cut FSU's lead to 79-78, Cleveland was fouled after an offensive rebound and made 1 of 2 free throws. NC State called timeout with 8.4 seconds remaining but Fletcher stole the inbounds pass meant for Seabron and was fouled. He made the first free throw and missed the second but NC State's Jericole Hellems was called for a foul going for the rebound and Cleveland sank two more free throws. Smith hit his seventh 3-pointer as the game ended. Seabron was 12-of-14 shooting. His only 2-point miss came with NC State up by a point with a minute to go and led to a held-ball and an FSU possession that began the Seminoles' 9-6 game-ending run. Neither team led by more than seven points and there were 14 lead changes.
