FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD TO FACE BOSTON COLLEGE

In the middle of a three-game road swing, Florida State travels to play at Boston College at the Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass., on Monday February 21, 2022 at 7:00. The Seminoles' game against the Eagles, the only game between the two teams during the regular season, was rescheduled to Monday night after the original date for the game (December 29, 2021) had to be postponed. Florida State enters Monday's game having won two consecutive games against the Eagles with both wins at home in Tallahassee (93-64, March 3, 2021 and 80-62, March 7, 2020). The Seminoles were schedule to play at Boston College on February 2, 2021 but that game was cancelled. Following Monday's game against Boston College, the Seminoles will return home before travelling over the weekend to play at Virginia on Saturday February 26 at 4:00 p.m. in their final regular season road game of the 2021-22 season.

PRIETO NAMED TO THE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto, who earned a double double of 13 points and 13 rebounds against Wake Forest on February 5, has been named to the 2022 Academic All-District 4 Men's Basketball team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) of America. The 2021-22 Academic All-District Men's Basketball recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the court and in the classroom. Prieto earned a 3.61 GPA as an undergraduate in Meteorology and holds a 3.58 GPA as a graduate student.

CLEVELAND ENTERS MONDAY'S GAME WITH DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING STREAK

Freshman Matthew Cleveland enters Monday's game at Boston College having scored in double figures in five consecutive games. He has scored in double figures in each Seminole game since totaling 11 points against Wake Forest on February 5 and is averaging 13.0 points scored per game in those five games. Cleveland is averaging 12.2 points per game in six games during the month of February.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN STEALS

With 232 steals and an 8.9 steals per game average, Florida State enters Monday's game at Boston College as the ACC leader in steals and steals per game.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on January 18, 2022 with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;
...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over No. 5 Duke on January 18.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 391 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 174 career ACC wins at Florida State.

HAMILTON TO BE INDUCTED INTO FLORIDA STATE HALL OF FAME

The Florida State University's Athletics Hall of Fame will induct nine new members on Friday, April 8, including men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton and All-Americans from six different sports. Hamilton, who is the Seminoles' all-time winningest basketball coach and currently the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, will be inducted along with one of his former players in star point guard Toney Douglas.

FLORIDA STATE'S OVERTIME STREAK

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak including Clemson on February 14, 2018. The Seminoles are 2-0 in OT games this year.

SEMINOLES SHOOT 50 PERCENT FROM THE FIELD AGAINST DUKE

Florida State shot 50 percent from the field as it made 28 of 56 shots in its game against Duke on Saturday night in Cameron Indoor Stadium. The Seminoles' 50 percent shooting mark marked the fourth time they have shot 50 percent or better from the field in ACC play this season. Florida State shot its ACC season-high of .549 from the field in its 76-71 win at the Dome in Syracuse on January 15, 2022. The Seminoles shot a season-best .611 from the field in its 81-58 win over Missouri in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic on November 22, 2021.

FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON COLLEGE – THE LAST MEETING

Senior guard M.J. Walker scored 18 points, hitting six 3-pointers, and junior forward RaiQuan Gray added 16 points to help No. 11 Florida State win its 25th straight ACC home game, 93-64, over Boston College on March 3, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker in Tallahassee. Fifteen Seminoles played and 14 scored on a night when six seniors were honored. RaiQuan Gray scored in double figures for an 11th straight game for the Seminoles, who are in position to win the league's regular-season title with a win at Notre Dame. Jay Heath scored a career-high 28 points and Makai Ashton-Langford added 14 points for BC. Heath shot 8 of 14 from 3-point range. But the Eagles clearly missed senior forward Steffon Mitchell, who averaged 9.1 points and 7.3 rebounds per game. Walker scored 12 points in the first half as the Seminoles cruised to a 53-35 lead at the break and were never challenged. Florida State started five seniors in what was their final home game. Senior guard RayQuan Evans scored six points and because of the unique lineup the Seminoles' bench had a 78-15 advantage over BC's reserves.

1 Redshirt senior Tanor Ngom made his first career 3-point shot in his Florida State career on Saturday against Duke. He has attempted four 3-point shots in the last four games after attempting one shot from the bonusphere in his first 13 games of the 2021-22 season.

1 Sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher earned his first career double double with 16 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State's game at North Carolina on January 12.

2.7 Sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher has eight steals in the last three games – an average of 2.7 steals per game. He totaled his ACC career-high of four steals at North Carolina on February 12.

6 Six different Seminoles (Caleb Mills, Wyatt Wilkes, John Butler, Anthony Polite, Cam'Ron Fletcher and Malik Osborne) have all made at least 20 3-point field goals this season.

8 Redshirt senior Justin Lindner has a single-season career-high tying eight assists in eight games played this season. He totaled two assists against Duke on Saturday – falling just one shy of his career-high of three assists which came against NC State on January 13, 2021.

14 Florida State is undefeated, 14-0, when it outscores its opponent.

20 Freshman John Butler has started a team-high 20 consecutive games – each game since November 30 against Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge.

28 Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans scored his career-high and ACC career-high of 28 points in Florida State's 81-80 victory over Clemson on Feb. 15.

100 Redshirt senior Wyatt Wilkes played in his 100th career game on Saturday night against Duke.

MATTHEW CLEVELAND'S SCORING TOTALS

Freshman Matthew Cleveland enters Monday's game against Boston College as Florida State's second-leading scorer with a 19.8 points per game scoring average. With his team-high 16-point performance against Duke on Saturday in Durham, he has scored in double figures in a career-best five consecutive games. Cleveland has scored in double figures in each game since an 11-point performance against Wake Forest on February 5. During that span, he has scored 65 points and is averaging 13.0 points scored per game.

NOTING CLEVELAND'S SCORING STREAKS

...He has scored in double figures in five consecutive games (65 points / 13.0 ppg) since totaling 11 points against Wake Forest on February 5, 2022;

...He scored in double figures in four consecutive games (58 points / 14.5 ppg) from January 1 against NC State through January 11 at Louisville;

...He has scored in double figures in 11 of his last 16 games (188 points / 11.8 points per game) – a streak that began on January 1 with 13 points in an ACC road win over NC State.

WARLEY'S BIG NIGHT AGAINST DUKE

Freshman Jalen Warley totaled his career-highs of 15 points and seven rebounds while tying his career-high with six assists as a starter in a career-high 35 minutes of playing time against Duke on Saturday night. He played excellent basketball in the second half of the game against the Blue Devils with seven of his 15 points, six of his seven rebounds and two assists in 18 minutes of playing time.

He scored his career-high of 15 points in the Seminoles' game against Duke to mark the first time in his career that he had scored in double figures. Warley's previous career-high was eight points against South Carolina on December 15 in the No Room for Racism Classic;

...He has pulled down eight rebounds and is averaging 4.0 rebounds per game. His career-high of seven rebound against Duke was as many rebounds he had totaled in last sis games (seven total);

...He totaled six assists against just two turnovers in 35 minutes of playing time. He has a total of 15 assists and seven turnovers (2.1:1 ratio) n the last four games.

LINDNER EARNNG PLAYING TIME

Redshirt senior Justin Lindner played in his career-high of eight minutes against Duke on Saturday night in Durham. His total number of minutes played against the Blue Devils was twice as many minutes of playing time that he earned in his three previous games (four minutes dating to January 4 against Wake Forest).

BALLARD AGAINST DUKE

Sophomore Quincy Ballard totaled four points in eight minutes played against Duke. He was a perfect two of two from the field against the Blue Devils. Ballard scored a total of eight points in 13 previous games in his second season as a Seminole.

FLETCHER COMING ON AS A LATE

Sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher has scored in double figures in a career-high three games and is averaging 15.0 points since totaling 16 points at North Carolina on February 12. He has scored 16 points (against North Carolina), 17 points (his career-high against Clemson) and totaled 12 points against Duke on Saturday in Cameron Indoor Stadium. Fletcher is averaging more than eight points above his season scoring average and nearly five rebounds above his season average in leading the Seminoles though an injury-filled part of the 2021-22 season.

Sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher has scored in double figures in a career-high three consecutive games and is averaging 15.0 points scored per game since scoring 16 points at North Carolina on February 12. He scored his career-high of 16 points against North Carolina, then set a new career-high for scoring one game later with 17 points in Florida State's win over Clemson on February 15 in Tallahassee. He is shooting .455 from the field (15 of 33), .357 from the 3-point line (five of 14) and .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) during his 3-game scoring run in the last eight days.

PRIETO IN DOUBLE FIGURE MNUTES PLAYED

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto has played in double figure minutes (109 total minutes) in each of the last six games and averages 18.2 minutes played per game since earning 16 minutes of playing time at Clemson on February 2. He had played in double figures minutes (10 against Wake Forest on January 8, 2020) only once in his career prior to this season. Prieto has played in double figure minutes in six consecutive and nine games this season.

How Florida State Basketball Has An NCAA-Record 13 Straight Wins In Overtime

Trent Forrest could have easily fouled Ryan Cline.

With 20 seconds remaining in the 2018 game, Florida State trailed Purdue by a point. The Seminoles fouling the Boilermakers would have awarded them two free throws, an amount they could afford to concede.

Forrest didn't see it that way. He wanted to win the game right then.

Not later.

So after Cline picked up his dribble, Forrest swarmed him. He tugged at the ball without fouling for a tie-up, which gave FSU the possession.

Then Forrest did what Forrest did – he delivered one of the many clutch shots of his Seminole career. Forrest's floater in the paint with 5.2 seconds left helped FSU clinch the 73-72 victory.

Forrest causing that jump ball may have seemed entirely instinctual. The Seminoles, though, had been practicing that specific situation – tying the ball up without fouling – all week. And that's not a coincidence.

"Any situation like that in crunch time, we had already practiced it," Forrest, who is now in his second season in the NBA with the Utah Jazz, told the Democrat. "So once we get to the game, it's easy for us to know what we are supposed to do and not get overwhelmed with what's going on. That helped us a lot."

The way FSU meticulously prepares for late-game situations under head coach Leonard Hamilton can make those intense moments almost feel ordinary. It's maybe the biggest reason why the Seminoles hold the longest overtime winning streak in NCAA history at 13 games, which began with their 101-90 victory over Syracuse in double overtime on Jan. 13, 2018.

"And it's not like we do it just before the game," senior guard Anthony Polite said. "We have this in our system. It's why everybody knows where to be, when to be without making any mistakes. That helps the team be successful."

This FSU season will likely be remembered by the key injuries that derailed its chances. But when they were at full strength, the Seminoles showed they were capable of rising to the occasion in close games.

Like when FSU defeated Duke in a 79-78 overtime thriller on Jan. 18. The Seminoles face the No. 5 Blue Devils again in their next game, which is on the road and begins at 6 p.m. Saturday (ESPN).

"As a result of how much we prepare for situations, our guys are a little more confident when we get in the game and real, live situations," Hamilton said. "They pretty much know what to expect, because we've gone over and over it. Sometimes, it's full court plays. Sometimes, it's half-court plays. Short-clock plays. We work on them on a consistent basis."

Stan Jones' impact

Before having a decorated four-year career for FSU, Terance Mann remembers needing to adjust as a freshman in 2015.

"I never had to prepare like that before. It was difficult," said Mann, who now has a significant role on the Los Angeles Clippers. "It's a lot of preparation that you aren't used to in high school. It wasn't easy, but I got through it."

The crunch-time situations that the Seminoles routinely practice can be a new experience for first-year players. This segment of practice looks to emulate the tensest moments from the end of close games.

Mann credited Stan Jones, the longtime Hamilton assistant and current associate head coach, as the mastermind behind FSU's crunch time brilliance. Because they seemingly never saw something late in a game that he didn't imagine for them to practice.

If there's even a small chance something could happen, Jones does not want to overlook that possibility. He takes this philosophy so far that he teaches his players how to miss free throws. Because maybe FSU will need to miss a free throw if it trails by more than one with little time remaining.

"Any situation he can think of, he prepared us for it," Mann said. "He keeps everybody locked in on a whole bunch of different situations. When we get down two with five seconds. When we are up three with five seconds. Whatever it is, you name it, we've been prepared and locked in to try to win the game."

Jones said his time as an NBA assistant under Hamilton helped develop his in-game strategies. Hamilton's one year as head coach of the Washington Wizards ended in his resignation following the 2000-01 season.

Still, Jones partly attributes that experiment to their end-of-game success.

"There are some things we have in our in-game package that we stole from playing against other teams and having stuff run against us while we were in the NBA," Jones said. "That was a really big resource, a learning laboratory for us that year in the NBA to see.

"And if you are really good in the last six minutes of a game in those after-timeout plays, that's when NBA players have great respect for the coaching staff. So we really had to up our game and study it."

One teaching Jones uses is to prepare FSU to be unprepared. In those simulated crunch time settings, the Seminoles sometimes practice plays that their players haven't seen. That way, if a similar circumstance presents itself in the future, they will have a better chance of executing a new play the coaches developed during a timeout.

The 2019 ACC Tournament quarterfinal against Virginia Tech is one notable example of how FSU benefited from that concept. Trailing by three with 6.7 seconds left, the Seminoles needed to concoct a specific play out of a timeout before inbound from underneath its basket.

The Hokies likely would have fouled them to prevent a game-tying three-pointer. So FSU looked to create room for one of its players to be in position for a catch-and-shoot three-pointer after handling the inbound pass.

"We drew something off the board, came right out of it and executed it perfectly," Jones said. "In fact, we had two guys open."

Devin Vassell and Phil Cofer were those two open players. They generated enough space after rubbing their defenders from a crossing action, bringing them to the opposite corners. Vassell caught Forrest's entry pass and connected on a shot that sent the game to overtime.

A game-winning jumper from Mann with 1.8 seconds left in overtime advanced the Seminoles with a 65-63 victory.

"It helps to have guys like Trent Forrest and some of the other guys who like those moments," Jones said. "All the way back to Michael Snaer, who set the record for most game-winning baskets. He loved having that opportunity.

"So if you have some simple designs, it puts those guys in the best spot and helps your chances as a coach."

The Trent Forrest effect

This overtime streak can't be discussed without mentioning Forrest.

There's a reason FSU boasted a 9-0 overtime record across Forrest's four-year Seminole career. Clutch shots almost became a routine for him.

"In those situations, I always wanted to have the ball and be the one to decide whether we won or lost," said Forrest. "That's how I looked at it during those situations. I always wanted to be the one to decide that for us."

There was the circus-shot runner to even the score after being down 18 to Clemson. Then there was the game-tying layup against LSU. Then there was the game-tying jumper against Louisville. Each of those buckets from Forrest came in the final minute of regulation and helped send those games to overtime. And there were plenty of other big moments from Forrest's career.

No, may never be another Seminole like Forrest. But in hopes to keep delivering during those end-of-game moments, FSU looks for players who have the intangibles Forrest brought.

"I would love to be able to take credit for his intelligence, his savvy, his ability to communicate. But he had that it-factor," Hamilton said. "Along with some other players that we've had over the years, the system seems to have created that mindset with guys on our team.

"He brought a maturity level to our team. A calmness. But a level of confidence that when the game is on the line, he really, really rose to the occasion. And he made good decisions.

"But we've had players like that. I can look back to Luke Loucks. I can look back to many of our guys in the past. Toney Douglas, Terance Mann, they just make good decisions.

"We've been very fortunate to bring guys in like that who have been eager to learn, have that unselfish spirit, that unconquered spirit. That's why we always say that we win by committee.

"Trent represents the prominent president of that committee."

Calm, cool, Leonard Hamilton

Hamilton also deserves plenty of credit for FSU's overtime success.

Intense moments don't seem to stress Hamilton. His calm demeanor during those stretches can be impactful for his players.

"When things get hotter, he gets calmer and quiet. That is a reflection on how our teams play in those situations," Jones said. "When they believe if they do what we've been working on, and if we play the game the right way, we are going to find a way to win. ...

"The one thing coach Hamilton is about is, he's always that consistent sunshine. He's going to shine on the guys and make them believe that they are going to kill a mosquito with a sledgehammer."

And Hamilton looks to approach in-game strategy without an ego. Everything doesn't have to be his idea. He's not afraid to share concepts. Or steal them. Hamilton joked on Friday that he has ripped off so many ideas from other coaches that he should be in jail.

So if Jones or another assistant engineers a promising plan, Hamilton is not afraid to run with it.

"Whatever the moment is that we worked on, he's OK with turning the ownership of that to whoever needs the ownership of it," Jones said.

Hamilton shares credit for the 13 consecutive overtime victories, too. That doesn't happen without the in-game savant that is Jones. That doesn't happen without players like Forrest. And maybe that doesn't happen without some luck, too.

The Seminoles were not prepared for the bevy of injuries they suffered this season. But if any of their remaining games go to overtime, they will be ready.

"This is an art. It's not a science," Jones said. "You've got to go with feel, and you've got to orchestrate it.

"Most importantly, and this is a big strength of our staff, the biggest thing is the continued confidence in the players we recruit. And the confidence we try to instill in them while we have them here. And the confidence they see when we go back and show them film of things we were putting in, in practice.

"We will do that sometimes. We will pull clips from the past before we put something in, so they can see that this is not just something that just popped in our head last night while we were sleeping. This is something that's pretty good if everybody executes their job."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 12 seconds remaining and John Butler blocked a jump shot by Wendell More, Jr., with two seconds remaining, and Florida State won its NCAA record 13th consecutive overtime decision with a 79-78 win over No. 5 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak. The win was Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton's eighth all-time win over Duke. The win was also the Seminoles' first over a top-5 ranked team since a 69-69 win over Virginia on March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Game 25 -- Florida State 81, Clemson 80

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- RayQuan Evans scored 17 of his career-high 28 points in the second half, including the go-ahead three-point play with 14 seconds left, and Florida State beat Clemson 81-80. Evans shot 7 of 13 from the field, 2 of 3 from the 3-point line and 12 of 13 from the free-throw line and scored Florida State's last seven points over the final 79 seconds. Evans was fouled by Nick Honor as he hit a jumper to tie it with 14 seconds left and the free throw capped scoring. Alex Hemingway missed a clean look at a potential game-winning corner 3 that bounced off the back of the iron as time expired. Cam'Ron Fletcher scored 12 of his 17 points in the second half and Matthew Cleveland added 13 points for Florida State. PJ Hall had a career-high 28 points for points for Clemson. Al-Amir Dawes scored 18 points and Hemenway added 12. Dawes, who went into the game 4-of-10 shooting from beyond the arc, hit a career-high four 3-pointers on 11 attempts. Dawes scored all of Clemson's points in a 10-5 spurt that pulled the Tigers within a point, but Fletcher hit a 3-pointer and added two free throws before he converted a three-point play in a 100-second span to give Florida State a 67-58 lead — the largest of the game by either team — with 8:34 remaining. Evans has scored the winning points in three games this season. The senior hit two free throws with 0.8 seconds left to lift the Seminoles to a 65-64 win over Miami on Jan. 11 and made a layup with 2 seconds left in regulation to make it 67-67 and force overtime before he hit two free throws with 12 seconds left in OT that gave FSU a 79-78 victory over then-No. 6 Duke on Jan. 18.

DURHAM, N.C. -- Freshman forward Paolo Banchemo scored 17 points and Joey Baker had 12 first-half points to help Duke beat Florida State 88-70. Baker's points came on four 3-pointers. That included back-to-back shots from each corner during the Blue Devils' game-changing push, which turned a one-point lead into a 52-41 halftime margin and ultimately a 24-point lead late. The Blue Devils closed the half on a 12-2 burst to take a 52-41 lead against the injury-depleted Seminoles, then did a better job containing FSU's drivers after halftime. Duke shot 52 percent for the game, including 11 of 28 from 3-point range. The win allowed Duke to avenge last month's 79-78 overtime road loss to Florida State, as well as push into sole possession of first place in the ACC with Notre Dame's loss at Wake Forest earlier Saturday. Freshman guard Matthew Cleveland scored 16 points to lead the Seminoles, who played yet again with a shorthanded roster. They still had a strong start by penetrating into the paint and making 16 of 23 shots (69.6 percent) to offset Duke's own strong offense in rowdy Cameron Indoor Stadium.
