FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT DUKE ON SATURDAY

Florida State, who defeated No. 5 Duke by a 79-78 score in overtime in Tallahassee on January 18, travels to face the Blue Devils on Saturday, February 19, 2022 at 6:00 at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The Seminoles enter their game against Duke having defeated Clemson by an 81-80 margin on Tuesday night at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles face Duke looking to earn consecutive victories over the Blue Devils for the third time in school history. Following Saturday's game against Duke, Florida State travels to play at Boston College on Monday, February 21 at 7:00 p.m. in a game rescheduled from December 29.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on January 18, 2022 with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over No. 5 Duke on January 18.

ACC BLOWOUTS ACCORDING TO FLORIDA STATE HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Duke with five one-point victories this season – 81-80 over Boston University (November 24), 65-64 over Miami (January 11), 79-78 over No. 5 Duke (January 18), 61-60 at Miami (January 22) and 81-80 over Clemson (February 15). The Seminoles' five one-point wins are the most by any team in the nation. The Seminoles are the third team in the ACC since 1980 with at least four one point wins in a season – joining Duke in 1981-82 and Maryland in 1982-83.

PRIETO NAMED TO THE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto, who earned a double double of 13 points and 13 rebounds against Wake Forest on February 5t, has been named to the 2022 Academic All-District 4 Men's Basketball team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) of America. The 2021-22 Academic All-District Men's Basketball recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the court and in the classroom. Prieto earned a 3.61 GPA as an undergraduate in Meteorology and holds a 3.58 GPA as a graduate student in Meteorology. Prieto and RJ Davis of North Carolina were the only two players from the ACC to earn Academic All-District honors.

FLORIDA STATE DEFENSIVELY

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Duke ranked first in the ACC in steals (9.1 spg) and third in the ACC in blocked shots (4.4 bpg). The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC that is ranked in the top five for both steals and blocked shots.

...Defeat Duke for the second time this season. The Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils, 79-78 in overtime on January 18 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee;

...Defeat Duke and gain a second win over the Blue Devils in the same season for the second time in program history. The Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils twice during the 2012 season with a buzzer-beating win in Cameron Indoor Stadium (76-73 on January 21, 2012) and in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament in Atlanta (62-59 on March 10, 2021). Florida State defeated North Carolina the next day to win its first ever ACC Tournament championship;

...Defeat Duke and gain a win against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium for the first time since January 21, 2012 when the Seminoles won 76-73 on a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by Michael Snaer.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 391 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 174 career ACC wins at Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 14 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against No. 5/9 Duke with 14 victories over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 58 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton.

THE SEMINOLE STEP-UP AGAINST CLEMSON

Florida State started its ninth different lineup of the season (John Butler, Wyatt Wilkes, Tanor Ngom, RayQuan Evans, and Matthew Cleveland) in its 81-80 victory over Clemson on Wednesday in Tallahassee. In scoring 81 points in their victory over the Tigers, Florida State scored nearly nine points (+8.7) higher than its season scoring average of 71.3 points and scored at least 80 points in an ACC game for the first time since scoring 83 in an 83-81 win over NC State on January 1. Led by RayQuan Evans, who scored his career-high of 28 points (+20.5 points above his scoring average entering their game against Clemson), a total of four Seminoles eclipsed their season-long scoring averages in their seventh ACC victory of the year.

WHAT THE SEMINOLES ARE MISSING BECAUSE OF INJURIES TO THREE STARTERS

With three starters sidelined for either the remainder of the season, or much of the remainder of the season, the Seminoles will be without Malik Osborne (10.0 ppg, 6.9 rpg, 20 3-point shots made), Anthony Polite (9.7 ppg, 5.5 rpg, 22 3-point shots made) and Naheem McLeod (4.5 ppg, 2.1 rpg) in Saturday's game against Duke – a total of 24.2 points, 14.5 rebounds and 42 3-point shots made.

THE FLORIDA STATE TURNOVER STORY AGAINST CLEMSON

Florida State totaled 14 assists (on 24 baskets) and a near-season low eight turnovers in its 81-80 win over Clemson on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. It marked the fourth time this season (and fourth time in ACC play) that the Seminoles had committed less than 10 turnovers in a single game. The Seminoles are 3-1 when they commit less than 10 turnovers in a game this season – a list of victories that includes their win over Duke on January 18 in Tallahassee. In that overtime win, Florida State committed a season-low five turnovers which were turned into only seven point by the Blue Devils.

FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING IN ITS LAST TWO GAMES

Florida State has scored a total of 155 points (77.5 points per game) in its last two games – an average of 77.5 points scored against North Carolina (74 points) and Clemson (81 points scored). The Seminoles are averaging nearly six points more scored per game in their last two games (77.5 ppg) than they are for the entire season (71.7 ppg).

SEMINOLES GET TO THE FREE THROW LINE AND MAKE THEIR SHOTS IN WIN OVER CLEMSON

Florida State made a season-high 25 free throws, finished with it second-highest number of free throw shots attempted (30) and shot .833 percent from the free throw line in its 81-80 victory over Clemson on Tuesday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' 25 free throws eclipsed the 24 free throws made in their win over Penn (105-70, November 10). Their 30 free throws attempted marked their second highest total of the season (34 against Penn) and their .833 shooting mark is tie for their second free throw shooting mark of the season (behind their 15 of 17, .882 percent against Virginia Tech on January 29).

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Florida State is shooting .447 from the 3-point line (17 of 38) in their last two games against North Carolina (nine-of-19, .474 percent) and Clemson (eight of 19, .421 percent).

FLORIDA STATE VS. DUKE – THE LAST MEETING

RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 12 seconds remaining and John Butler blocked a jump shot by Wendell Moore, Jr., with two seconds remaining, and Florida State won its NCAA record 13th consecutive overtime decision with a 79-78 win over No. 5 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center on January 18, 2022. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak. The win was Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton's eighth all-time win over Duke. The win was also the Seminoles' first over a top-5 ranked team since a 69-68 win over Virginia on March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Florida State gained its first win over a nationally ranked opponent this season and snapped a five-game losing streak to the Blue Devils. The Seminoles started the second half in a 38-33 hole at half but turned it around at the under 16-minute media timeout to lead by a 44-34 margin.

.543 Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto is has made 19 field goals and is shooting .543 from the field (19 of 35) this season. He made a total of 11 field goals and shot .611 from the field in the first four seasons of his career.

.714 Freshman Jalen Warley is shooting .714 from the free throw line (five of seven) in the last four games. He was a perfect two of two at North Carolina on February 12.

.833 Redshirt senior Tanor Ngom is shooting .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) since Florida State's victory over Miami on January 22. He has a perfect two of two from the free throw line against the Hurricanes and has missed only two free throws in the last eight games.

EVANS RUNNING THE SEMINOLES' OFFENSE

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans, who has started 22 of the Seminoles' 25 games this season, enters Saturday's game against Duke with a career-best 2:1 assist:turnover ratio. He has played especially well recently with eight assists and zero turnovers in his last two games and 58 minutes played against North Carolina and Clemson. In his last five games played (at Clemson, against Wake Forest, against Pittsburgh, at North Carolina, and against Clemson), Evans has earned 15 assists against only three turnovers (5:1 ratio) in 139 minutes played. Evans is also averaging 13.0 points scored in the last five games. Matthew Cleveland: Academics Matter

Academic success matters to Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland. Always has. Always will.

Cleveland graduated from Pace Academy in Atlanta with a 4.16 grade point average in the spring of 2021. He quickly transitioned to life as a college student and earned a perfect 4.0 grade point average during his first summer at Florida State.

Cleveland begins his first full semester having earned eight credits towards his degree in Sport Management – and most classes for freshmen have barely even begun.

“Academics have always been a priority in my family since I started kindergarten,” said Cleveland. “Our parents would always reward my siblings and me for doing well in school.”

While Cleveland has been heralded for his success on the basketball court, it’s in the classroom where he has really made his mark. Throughout his high school academic career, he earned only three grades below an A grade and never below a C grade.

Upon his arrival at Florida State, Cleveland made up his mind that he would work to ensure there are no grades less than an A.

“Many times in high school I was borderline of having all A grades and all 100 percent scores, but I would short cut some assignments,” said Cleveland. “I made sure that once I got to Florida State, I completed every assignment to the best of my abilities.”

The academic transition from high school to college is one of the biggest obstacles for every student.

“One of the greatest challenges in a student’s academic career is the adjustment in their first term from the structure of high school to the necessity of individual time management in the college environment,” said Charlie Hogan, the Associate Director of the Academic Support Unit for Athletics at Florida State. “Matthew’s ability to excel in the fast-paced summer session at Florida State while juggling a full schedule of academic and athletic requirements bodes well for his future academic pursuits.”

Cleveland received 27 high major scholarship offers when he was choosing which college he wanted to attend. He earned offers from Stanford, Michigan, Georgia Tech and North Carolina before ultimately choosing Florida State and Head Coach Leonard Hamilton.

“I attribute my academic success to the discipline and lessons my parents taught me at a young age,” said Cleveland. “They taught me about keeping your priorities in order. School is high on my list of priorities, so I always make sure that I finish my work on time and that I do it to the best of my ability.”

CLEVELAND IS FLORIDA STATE’S SECOND LEADING SCORER

Freshman Matthew Cleveland enters Saturday’s game as Florida State’s second leading scorer with a 10.6 points per game scoring average. He has averaged in double figures for the season since his 17-point scoring performance in Florida State’s victory over Louisville on January 8 pushed his scoring average to 19.8 points per game. He has scored in double figures in nine of his last 13 games and is averaging 13.2 points per games since scoring 13 points in Florida State’s victory over NC State on New Year’s Day.

He is looking to become the first player at Florida State to lead the Seminoles in all three categories since Toney Douglas accomplished the feat in consecutive seasons (2008 and 2009) before becoming an NBA first-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Lakers.

MILLS FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills enters Saturday’s game against Duke as the Seminoles’ leader in 3-point shots made with 25 – including 16 in 14 ACC games. Including, one 3-point shot made in each of the last two games, Mills has made 80 career 3-point shots.

Freshman John Butler, who has started a team-best 19 consecutive games entering Saturday’s game at Duke, has established himself as one of the top freshmen in the ACC. In addition to having started each of the Seminoles’ last 19 games since November 30 against Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge, Butler leads the Seminoles in blocked shots with 22 and is the only Seminole regular who is shooting 40 percent or better from the 3-point line (.403).

HARRISON PRIETO BY THE NUMBERS

Redshirt sixth-year senior Harrison Prieto recorded what is believed to be the first double (13 points and 13 rebounds) by walk-on in school history in Florida State’s game against Wake Forest on February 5. The “Weatherman” as he was dubbed by former Seminole assistant coach Dennis Gates early in his career because of his meteorology major at Florida State, enjoyed one of the finest nights by a Seminole in ACC play. No Seminole has grabbed more rebounds in an ACC game since Jarquez Smith and Dwayne Bacon (14 each) in 2016. His 13 rebounds is tied for the 11th highest single game total in an ACC game by a Florida State player and equals the 13 rebounds pulled down by RaiQuan Gray against Miami on February 24, 2021.

Native American RayQuan Evans Feeling Right At Home Playing For Florida State Seminoles

On that night, wearing that jersey, no one other than RayQuan Evans was destined to be standing at the free throw line for Florida State with the game on the line.

The 6-foot-4 senior point guard and the first member of a Native American tribe to play for the Seminoles men's team calmly dropped both free throws with less than a second remaining to secure the one point win over Miami.

And this wasn't just another moment to be celebrated and forgotten.

Evans, the son of Lavern OldElk and Israel Evans and a member of the Crow Tribe in Montana, stood at that foul line wearing the Seminoles' N7 turquoise jersey, which honors Native American culture.

"To have the moment as a team and me understanding what those jerseys represent, what a huge moment," Evans said. "I'm very thankful I was able to be put in that moment because there's a bunch of little kids at home who look up to me. I feel like it was a real surreal moment."

The man given the Indian name 'Young Man With Blessed Days' naturally secured the 65-64 victory, handing Miami its first ACC loss. That game played just more than a week ago sets up Saturday's 2 p.m. rematch between the top two teams in the ACC when the Seminoles (12-5, 5-2 ACC) travel to Miami (14-4, 6-1).

And Evans was not done making clutch shots. Four nights later at Syracuse, his two free throws with three seconds remaining sealed the win. Tuesday was a double-dose of Ice Water Evans against Duke. He sent the game into overtime with a layup high off the glass over two defenders just before the buzzer, and then made the winning free throws with 12.3 seconds left in OT for the 79-78 win.

"We feel safe when he's going to the line," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said. "There's no doubt that he's very mature, he's given us tremendous leadership. Whenever the game's on the line, he seems to always make the right decisions."

Evans' 7.1 points and 2.6 assists per game do not come close to depicting his value to the Seminoles. He had five assists and one turnover in the Syracuse and Duke wins.

"He has to be on the floor in a lot of ways," ESPN basketball analyst Seth Greenberg said. "He's almost their compass."

And Evans will tell you he's had a lot of help when it comes to this season.

Evans has been playing with a heavy heart ever since his brother, Tye Lafranier, died Nov. 21. Tye, 27, suffered a seizure about six months prior to his death and was diagnosed with a rare and aggressive form of leukemia.

"Every game now and just the way I walk in my life is for my brother," Evans said. "Every game I've been playing harder because he fought to the end with his cancer. Not a day went by where he didn't fight. If he can fight at a time like that, I can fight on the court, I can fight in life ... I'm representing my brother through that."

Evans proud to be a Seminole

RayQuan Ethan Evans is in the perfect place. Working on his third college degree, Evans as much as anyone understands the respect and reverence given to Native Americans by a school whose nickname has drawn criticism and calls to be changed.

Instead, Evans could not be prouder of the university he represents.

"There's been times where organizations have used Native American names and other cultures, names and mascots and didn't pay any attention to or give credit to those tribes," Evans said. "But here, it's awesome. Especially because it's not going unnoticed and (brings attention to the Seminole Tribe) and I'm using it to bring recognition to my tribe back home and tribes all over Montana.

"People need to take more time in understanding that there is no disrespect going on here at all."

Evans spent part of his childhood on the Crow Indian Reservation, located about an hour east of Billings. He learned basketball from his dad, who played for the University of Montana. He said basketball is an important part of his large family.

Evans spent two years at North Idaho College before being signed by Hamilton in 2019. He was aware of Florida State and its history with the Seminole Tribe, but never envisioned playing in Tallahassee.

Until that surprise phone call.

"When coach Hamilton called, I was shocked and amazed because the culture behind Florida State, what this culture represents, this program, the building blocks this program has set," he said. "I thought this is my opportunity. I get to play at the highest level of college basketball but also I get to share my culture and give kids a reason back home to look up to me, and give kids a reason to chase their dreams.

"I feel like I was brought here for something bigger and something more (than just basketball)."

Playing game after brother's death

Which is why Evans felt he was in a good enough place to play in a game the day after being told his brother's battle with leukemia had ended. RayQuan scored eight points and had a game-high six assists in 16 minutes of FSU's 81-58 win over Missouri in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic on Nov. 22.

While Evan broke down in tears following the game, Hamilton was emotional when describing what he had seen.

"There are true Seminoles," Hamilton said. "But then there's whatever kind of Seminole Ray Evans is. For him to step up and want to do that ... not very many people can do that and play as well as he played tonight."

Hamilton, who is in his 52nd year of coaching, called it "one of the best performances I've ever seen in my coaching career."

What happened eight days later topped any clutch moment on the court. Evans was home in Montana that night to attend Tye's funeral. FSU was playing at Purdue in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Before the game, a Purdue student sent an envelope to Hamilton and said it was for RayQuan.

When he finally got to open it, RayQuan found a black card with the Purdue logo and a note inside from the student body saying how sorry they were for his loss and that the entire college basketball community "including your new fans in West Lafayette" were behind him. The Boilermakers' basketball program also tweeted out a link to a GoFundMe page that was set up to cover funeral expenses.

Evans got emotional reading the card.

"I couldn't believe it," he said. "It's competition, teams may not like each other, the crowd may not like you and for them to take the time before a big game and acknowledge what I went through even though I was not there, really meant a lot to me.

"That shows the character of people. That shows no matter how competitive the basketball world is I feel like we're all a family."

Nobal Days’ layup brought Tulane within 49-46 with 6:11 left, but Fletcher threw down a dunk as part of a three-point play, Malik Osborne added a dunk and Fletcher flushed another for a 56-46 Seminoles (2-1) lead. The Green Wave rallied with an 8-1 run and closed within 57-54 with 1:56 left but missed their last three shots after Anthony Polite’s layup closed the scoring. Smith hit his seventh 3-pointer as the game ended. Seabron was 12-of-14 shooting. His only 2-point miss came with NC State up by a point with a minute to go and led to a held-ball and an FSU possession that began the Seminoles' 9-6 game-ending run. Neither team led by more than seven points and there were 14 lead changes.
