SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO WAKE FOREST ON ALUMNI DAY AT THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State, which has won 85 of its last 91 games at the Donald L. Tucker Center, plays host to Wake Forest on Saturday, February 5, 2022 at 12 Noon on Basketball Alumni Reunion Weekend in Tallahassee. The Seminole men's basketball program welcomes back nearly 100 Florida State Basketball Alumni including members of the 1972 NCAA National Runner-Up team as well as its 1991 Metro Conference Championship team. George McCloud, the 1989 Metro Conference Player of the Year, will have his No. 21 Florida State jersey honored and hung from the rafters of the Tucker Center at halftime of the Seminoles' game against the Demon Deacons. Florida State faces Wake Forest in the second game of the season between the two teams and enters the contest with a seven-game home winning streak against the Deacons – a streak that began with a 51-47 Seminole victory on March 8, 2010. Following Saturday's game against Wake Forest, the Seminoles play host to Pittsburgh on February 9, at 9:00 p.m.

HAMILTON TO BE INDUCTED INTO FLORIDA STATE HALL OF FAME

The Florida State University's Athletics Hall of Fame will induct nine new members on Friday, April 8, including men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton and All-Americans from six different sports. Hamilton, who is the Seminoles' all-time winningest basketball coach and currently the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, will be inducted along with one of his former players in star point guard Toney Douglas. Joining the pair from men's basketball will be the induction of ACC volleyball player of the year Brianna Barry (posthumously), All-America golfer Jonas Blixt, soccer All-American Becky Edwards, 2008 Lou Groza Award winner and current NFL star Graham Gano, track and field sensations Ngoni Makusha and Kimberly Williams and former athletic trainer Randy Oravetz.

ALUMNI WEEKEND SET FOR FEBRUARY 4-6, 2022

Florida State will honor its illustrious history and past players as it welcomes back former coaches, players, managers and administrators to its bi-annual Men's Basketball Reunion February 4-6, 2022. Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, his staff and the FSU Varsity Club welcomes back approximately 100 former Seminoles for a weekend of friendship and remembrance.

SEMINOLES TO HONOR GEORGE MCCLOUD WITH JERSEY CELEBRATION

George McCloud, the first NBA Draft Lottery selection in school history in 1989, will become the seventh player in school history to have his jersey (No. 21) honored and hung prominently displayed in the Donald L. Tucker Center on February 5 during the Seminoles' game against Wake Forest. McCloud was twice named to the All-Metro Conference First Team and was named the Metro Conference Most Valuable Player in 1989. He averaged 13.5 points during his career as a Seminole (1986-89) and was a finalist for the John R. Wooden Award which recognizes the nation's top player. McCloud enjoyed a productive 11-year career in the NBA.

FLORIDA STATE AT THE DONALD L. TUCKER CENTER IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

Florida State is 82-6 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.932 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 85 of their last 91 home games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 82 of 87 home games (.943 winning percentage) in the last five seasons. The Seminoles have lost just two ACC home game since a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Florida State has won 28 of its last 30 ACC home games since defeating the Tigers and won 25 consecutive ACC home games from January 22, 2019 through March 3, 2021 – the second longest conference winning streak in ACC history. Only Duke, who won 26 straight ACC home games from 1997-2002, has a longer streak than then Seminoles in the history of the greatest conference in college basketball history.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 390 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 173 career ACC wins at Florida State.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its eight consecutive home game against Wake Forest. The Seminoles have defeated the Deacons in each game between the two teams since a 51-47 win on March 8, 2010;
...Defeat Wake Forest and win its seventh ACC game of the season. It would mark the school-record 17th consecutive season the Seminoles have won at least seven conference games under Leonard Hamilton.

SEMINOLES AT HOME IN THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State has won 28 of its last 30 ACC home games since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019. Since the beginning of the 2016-17 season, the Seminoles have won 45 of their last 50 ACC home games (.918 winning percentage) including 21 of their last 24 since the start of their 2019-20 conference schedule.

SINCE THE LAST TIME THE SEMINOLES PLAYED WAKE FOREST

Florida State has won six of its last nine games – including a season-best five-game ACC winning streak – since the Seminoles' first game of the season against Wake Forest. The Seminoles defeated ACC opponents Louisville (79-70, January 8), Miami (65-64, January 11), Syracuse (76-71, January 15), Duke (79-78 in overtime, January 18), and Miami (61-60, January 22) while also defeating UNF (86-73, January 20).

ACC BLOWOUTS ACCORDING TO FLORIDA STATE HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Wake Forest with four one-point victories this season – 81-80 over Boston University (November 24), 65-64 over Miami (January 11), 79-78 over No. 5 Duke (January 18) and 61-60 at Miami (January 22). The Seminoles' four one-point wins are the most by any team in the nation. The Seminoles are the third team in the ACC since 1980 with four one point wins in a season – joining Duke in 1981-82 and Maryland in 1982-83.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST TEAMS IN THE CURRENT ASSOCIATED PRESS TOP 25

Florida State is 1-1 against opponents who are currently ranked in the top 25 of the Associated Press poll (for the week of January 31, 2022). The Seminoles defeated No. 9 Duke by a 79-78 score in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee and fell at No. 4Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge on November 30 in West Lafayette.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on Tuesday with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55 win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak including Wake Forest on February 13, 2021 (92-85 in overtime) in Tallahassee. The Seminoles shared the record with five other schools coming into the year, but are 2-0 in OT games this year.

NEEDING ONLY SEVEN STEALS TO REACH 200, SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO LEAD ACC IN STEALS

With nine steals against Clemson on Wednesday night, Florida State added to its' league-leading total and enters Saturday's game against Wake Forest with 193 steals and a 9.2 steals per game average. The Seminoles need only seven steals to reach the 200 steals mark for the seventh time in the last eight years under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. Florida State has earned at least nine steals in 10 different games (four games in ACC play). The Seminoles totaled 182 steals (7.3 spg) in the shortened 2020-21 season. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

FLORIDA STATE VS. WAKE FOREST – THE LAST MEETING

Jake LaRavia scored 22 points, Alondes Williams added 20 and Wake Forest pulled away early in the first half and defeated Florida State, 76-54, at Lawrence Joel Coliseum on January 4, 2022. Wake Forest beat the Seminoles for the first time since Jan. 31, 2018. Matthew Cleveland scored 13 points and Caleb Mills had 10 for Florida State. Wake Forest used a 17-0 run to help build a 35-22 halftime advantage. Sy sparked the surge with seven straight points and Isaiah Mucius scored eight of his nine points during the stretch. LaRavia's fast-break layup pushed the lead to 61-36 with about 10 minutes remaining.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S STEALS TOTAL

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Wake Forest with 193 steals this season – the Seminoles have 70 steals more (193-123) than their opponents through their first 21 games of the season.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.455 Freshman John Butler is shooting .455 from the 3-point line (five of 11) in the last three games. He made two shots from the bonusphere against both Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech.

.583 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite is shooting .583 percent from the 3-point line (seven of 12) and averaging 12.0 points (48 total points) in Florida State's last four games.

.727 Freshman Jalen Warley is shooting .727 from the free throw line (eight of 11) in the last six games. He was a perfect three of three in Florida State's game against Virginia Tech.

.857 Redshirt senior Tanor Ngom is shooting .857 from the field (12 of 14) in the last five games. He enters Saturday's game against Wake Forest shooting .826 from the field for the season.

.857 Freshman Matthew Cleveland is shooting .857 from the free throw line in the last two games (six of seven).

.944 Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills is shooting .944 from the free throw line (17 of 18) in the last seven games. He was a perfect six of six from the free throw line in Florida State's 79-78 overtime win over Duke in Tallahassee on January 18.

.950 Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans is shooting .950 percent from the free throw line (19 of 20) since December 12 against South Carolina.

1.1 Freshman Jalen Warley is averaging 1.1 steals per game (22 steals in 21 games) and is one of four Seminoles (Caleb Mills, Anthony Polite, RayQuan Evans and Warley) who is averaging more than one full steal per game entering Saturday's game against Wake Forest.

7.3 Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans is averaging a career-high 7.3 points per game this season. He has scored in double figures four times – with three double figure scoring efforts coming in ACC play (11 against Miami on January 11, 15 at Syracuse on January 15 and 11 at Clemson on February 2).

13 Florida State is undefeated, 13-0, when it outscores its opponent.

15 Freshman John Butler has started 15 consecutive games – every game since November 30 at Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge. Only redshirt senior Anthony Polite (27 consecutive starts in a streak that began at Notre Dame on March 6, 2021) has a longer consecutive starts streak than Butler.

18 Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills leads Florida State in steals with 36 and a 1.7 steals per game average. He has at least one steal in 18 of Florida State's 21 games.

EVANS AMONG ACC STEALS LEADERS

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 12 seconds remaining and John Butler blocked a jump shot by Wendell More, Jr., with two seconds remaining, and Florida State won its NCAA record 13th consecutive overtime decision with a 79-78 win over No. 5 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak. The win was Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton's eighth all-time win over Duke. The win was also the Seminoles' first over a top-5 ranked team since a 69-69 win over Virginia on March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament.
