SEMINOLES TO PLAY SYRACUSE IN ACC TOURNAMENT WEDNESDAY IN BROOKLYN

Florida State, which won each of its final three games of the season, plays Syracuse in the second round of the 2022 ACC Tournament at 12 Noon on Wednesday, March 9, at the Barclay's Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. The Seminoles' game against the Orange marks the first meeting between the two teams in ACC Tournament play. Florida State and Syracuse met twice during the 2022 regular season with each team winning on the other's home court. The Seminoles won in Syracuse (76-71, January 15) and the Orange won in Tallahassee (63-60, December 4). The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Syracuse having won four of their last five games played against the Orange including a series-best three-game winning streak which included wins on January 13, 2018 (101-90, in double overtime in Tallahassee), February 5, 2019 (80-62 at Syracuse) and February 15, 2020 (80-77 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee). The winner of Wednesday's game between Florida State and Syracuse will face No. 1 seeded Duke on Thursday, March 10 at 12 Noon at the Barclay's Center.

SEMINOLES' CLEVELAND NAMED ACC MEN'S BASKETBALL SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR

Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland, the only player in the ACC to average in double figure scoring while starting fewer than 10 games, has been named the ACC Men's Basketball Sixth Man of the Year by a blue ribbon voting panel and announced by the Atlantic Coast Conference. Cleveland becomes the fourth consecutive Seminole to win the award as he follows in footsteps of NBA first round draft picks Mfiondu Kabengele (2019), Patrick Williams (2020) and Scottie Barnes (2021). The ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award was established in 2014 and has been won by a Seminole player in four of the nine years it has been awarded. Cleveland has come off the bench in 20 of 28 games, with eight starting assignments. He was moved into Florida State's starting lineup on February 2 because of injuries to each member of the Seminoles' starting five. Injuries and illnesses have caused eight different Seminole players to miss a total of 50 games.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 394 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 175 career ACC wins at Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE EARNS 10 ACC WINS – WINNINGEST 4-YEAR PERIOD IN ACC PLAY IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Florida State defeated NC State on Saturday to win its 10th ACC game of the season. It marks the school record tying fourth consecutive season the Seminoles have reached double digits in regular season ACC wins. Florida State earned at least 10 ACC wins from 2009-12 (43 total regular season ACC wins) and have won at least 10 ACC regular season games from 2019-22 (50 ACC wins).

HAMILTON TO BE INDUCTED INTO FLORIDA STATE HALL OF FAME

The Florida State University's Athletics Hall of Fame will induct nine new members on Friday, April 8, including men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton and All-Americans from six different sports. Hamilton, who is the Seminoles' all-time winningest basketball coach and currently the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, will be inducted along with one of his former players in star point guard Toney Douglas.

FLORIDA STATE'S 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF ITS 2012 ACC TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State won its first ACC Tournament Championship in 2012. Tournament MVP Michael Snaer scored 18 points and 17th-ranked Florida State used a barrage of 3-pointers to beat No. 4 North Carolina 85-82 for the ACC championship on March 11, 2022 at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. Snaer, Deividas Dulkys (16 points), Luke Loucks (10 points and 13 rebounds) and Ian Miller (10 points) all scored in double figures for Florida State. The Seminoles led 49-42 at halftime, shot .589 from the field (33 of 56) and .500 from the 3-point line (11 of 22) in defeating the Tar Heels for the second time during the season. Harrison Barnes led North Carolina with 23 points. Tyler Zeller totaled 19 points and 12 rebounds for North Carolina

SEMINOLES NOW WITH SIX ONE-POINT VICTORIES

Florida State won its sixth game of the 2021-22 season which was decided by one point with its 64-63 win over Virginia on February 26 in Charlottesville. The Seminoles have defeated five ACC teams by one point (Miami, 65-64 on January 11; Duke, 79-78 in overtime on January 18; at Miami, 61-60, January 22; Clemson, 81-80, February 15 and at Virginia, 64-63, on February 26) and defeated Boston University in a non-conference game (81-80, November 24). The Seminoles are the first team in ACC history to win each of their five ACC games that were decided by exactly one point. The ACC record for games decided by one point for any ACC team is six by Notre Dame during the 2019-20 season. The Fighting Irish were 3-3 in one-point decisions during the 2019-20 season.

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak. The Seminoles are 2-0 in OT games this year.

Florida State finished the 2022 regular season with a 4-2 record against the top four seeds in the ACC Tournament with victories over Duke (1-1), Notre Dame (1-0) and Miami (2-0).

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on January 18, 2022 with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18.

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto, who earned a double double of 13 points and 13 rebounds against Wake Forest on February 5, has been named to the 2022 Academic All-District 4 Men's Basketball team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) of America. The 2021-22 Academic All-District Men's Basketball recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the court and in the classroom. Prieto earned a 3.61 GPA as an undergraduate in Meteorology and holds a 3.58 GPA as a graduate student.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SYRACUSE – THE LAST MEETING

Caleb Mills knocked down 5 of 6 3-point shots to score 19 points and Florida State denied Syracuse in the final minutes to take a 76-71 decision for its third straight victory on January 15 at the Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. The teams each won on the road in the Atlantic Coast Conference series during the 2021-22 regular season. Syracuse earned a 63-60 win at Florida State December 4. Mills hit back-to-back 3-pointers, the second with just under five minutes to go, to put Florida State in front 67-64. Wyatt Wilkes knocked down a 3 with 2:35 left to push the lead to four, 72-68, but Jesse Edwards hit the second of two free throws and Jimmy Boeheim put back an offensive rebound to get the Orange within one. Syracuse forced the Seminoles into a turnover with 34 seconds left, but Boeheim's shot rimmed off and Florida State's Anthony Polite chased down the rebound and fed Matthew Cleveland for a dunk when Syracuse opted not to foul. RayQuan Evans added 15 points and five assists, and his two free throws in the last seconds set the final margin. Wilkes added 11 points off the bench. Buddy Boeheim paced Syracuse with 18 points. Cole Swider and Edwards contributed 17 and 15 points and Joseph Girard III added 11.

.549 Florida State shot .549 percent from the field (28 of 51) in its 76-71 win at Syracuse on January 15. The Seminoles' .549 shooting percentage against the Orange was its highest field goal shooting percentage in their 20 ACC games during the regular season.

1 Redshirt senior Anthony Polite totaled his first career double double of 14 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State's victory over NC State on Saturday in Tallahassee.

6 Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills scored 19 points in Florida State's victory over NC State on Saturday in Tallahassee. He has scored 19 or more points in six games this season for the Seminoles.

During their current winning streak, Florida State gained victories over the No. 3 seed Notre Dame (74-70, March 5) and the No. 6 seed Virginia on the road (64-63, February 26).

CLEVELAND NAMED ACC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FOR SECOND TIME

Freshman Matthew Cleveland, who made the shot heard around the college basketball world against Virginia on February 26, was named the ACC Freshman of the Week for the second time in his career on February 28. Cleveland averaged 19.0 points and 5.5 rebounds as he led Florida State to its fourth ACC road win of the season. He scored the game winning 3-point basket with no time remaining in Florida State's come-from-behind road win at Virginia after the Seminoles were down by 11 points with under 11 minutes left to be played in the Seminoles' 64-63 win over the Cavaliers. He scored nine points in the final 2:06 of the Seminoles' victory over Virginia to rally the Seminoles from a nine point deficit (59-50 at the 2:41 mark) to a one point advantage (and win) at the buzzer. He scored 14 of his 20 points in the second half as Florida State came back from a 34-28 halftime disadvantage.

CLEVELAND'S EIGHT-GAME DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING STREAK

Including his 20-point performance in the Seminoles' victory over Virginia on February 26, freshman Matthew Cleveland has scored in double figures in a personal record eight consecutive games and is averaging 14.7 points scored per game since an 11-point performance against Wake Forest on February 5.

Florida State Men's Basketball Walk-On Harrison Prieto Eyeing Career In Meteorology

As a senior at St. Paul's School in the New Orleans suburb of Covington, La., Harrison Prieto was named the district's Most Valuable Player and to nola.com's first-team All-Metro team. Several Division III colleges recruited Prieto, and the 6-foot-8 forward received offers from a few Division I coaches to walk-on at their programs.

Still, Prieto had no intention of playing college basketball. Instead, he chose to attend Florida State, where he would pursue his long-held dream of becoming a meteorologist. The Seminoles' men's basketball staff had not shown interest in Prieto, which was fine with him.

Now, Prieto already has his undergraduate degree in meteorology and is scheduled to earn his master's degree in July. And, rather than being a forgotten high school star who gave up the game, Prieto is in his sixth season as a walk-on at Florida State, having decided when he enrolled in the fall of 2016 that he indeed would give basketball another shot. He made the team as a walk-on as a freshman and has remained in that role ever since.

"Ultimately, I was like, 'I'm going to choose where I go to college for meteorology and if the basketball thing worked it, it worked out,'" Prieto said. "And it did. I have no regrets about that decision to come here and do that as opposed to going elsewhere."

Indeed, things have turned out better than Prieto ever expected. During his tenure with the Seminoles, Prieto has been given a catchy nickname ("The Weatherman"), been a two-time captain and been a part of four NCAA tournament teams. The Seminoles are not expected to make the NCAA tournament this season barring a deep run in this week's ACC tournament at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. The No. 8 seed Seminoles (17-13 overall, 10-10 in the ACC) open league tournament play on Wednesday against No. 9 seed Syracuse with the winner facing No. 1 seed Duke on Thursday afternoon.

Still, this season Prieto has received the most playing time of his career and shown that he can compete in high-level college basketball. Prieto only scored 24 points and played 65 total minutes in his first five seasons, but this season he has played 251 minutes and scored 76 points in 20 games, including a career-high 14 points and 26 minutes against Virginia on Feb. 26. During that game, Prieto also threw an inbounds pass with a second left to Matthew Cleveland, who caught the ball and made an off-balance 3-pointer at the buzzer for a 64-63 victory.

Afterward, a few of Prieto's former coaches at St. Paul's exchanged text messages.

"We were like, 'Man, that kid just never ceases to amaze us. He's always doing something. He's unbelievable,'" said Greg Waguespack, a St. Paul's assistant.

Waguespack remembers Prieto as a talented athlete who was also an All-State swimmer, but even more so he admires Prieto's smarts and work ethic. Even in high school, Waguespack could tell Prieto had the brains and fortitude to stick it out with meteorology, a challenging major, especially for a Division 1 athlete who practices, plays or trains several hours each day.

"We try to tell our kids now, 'Look, you can accomplish whatever you want in life. Just look at him,'" Waguespack said. "I just try to use him as an example for the other kids that are still in our program as someone to look up to."

Prieto said he first was drawn to meteorology when Hurricane Katrina hit the New Orleans area in August 2005. Back then, Prieto was seven years old and in second grade. His family lost power for several days, so they stayed with a neighbor rather than flee the area, but all things considered they were very fortunate as the hurricane ended up leading to more than 1,800 deaths and \$125 billion in damages.

"I very distinctly remember when Hurricane Katrina hit and we had stayed through it, I remember going through a period of like, 'I've got to figure out what just happened, how that worked,'" Prieto said. "Honestly, my whole college experience has been fulfilling that situation that happened so long ago. I've got to figure out how the weather works because of what happened with Hurricane Katrina."

As Prieto got older, he focused on science and math, two areas that were of the utmost importance when it came to fulfilling his goal of becoming a meteorologist. No one in his family had ever been a meteorologist, but that didn't deter Prieto.

"My parents did a really good job nurturing that interest I had, constantly being like, 'OK, you can put on the Weather Channel,'" he said. "(Meteorology) books and anything nature-related they would let me look at whenever I wanted to. They pushed me in that direction and said, 'You've got this natural inclination towards this thing. Let's see where it goes.'"

Prieto is now one of only 24 people enrolled in Florida State's two-year master's meteorology program, and he serves as a teaching assistant for two undergraduate classes. He has been named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll each year he's played at Florida State, and for the past three years, he won the Golden Torch award that's given to one Florida State men's basketball player for academic achievements.

During his time at Florida State, Prieto has worked as an on-air weatherman for the student television station, and he's even appeared on the Weather Channel and on the network's Weather Geeks podcast. Still, Prieto does not intend on working in television. Instead, he plans on pursuing a job with an energy, financial or insurance company, which employ meteorologists on staff and appreciate their data analytics, computer programming and forecasting skills that could make a huge difference when it comes to profits.

"If you think about it, weather really impacts everything," Prieto said. "It impacts whether the food's going to grow, where you're going to need more natural gas for energy plants, insurance companies need to know where natural disasters are more likely to happen. There's tons of things like that everywhere."

For this week, at least, Prieto's full-time foray into meteorology has to wait as the Seminoles begin play in the ACC tournament. Florida State has battled injuries all season and lost eight of nine games before winning the past three.

Prieto has been one of the lone bright spots, as he has improved in all facets of his game since the fall of 2016 when he reached out to Seminoles assistant coach Stan Jones, who oversees the walk-on tryouts. A few others vouched for Prieto, as well, hoping they could put a good word in for him when he decided to give basketball another shot.

"People kept talking about what a good leader he was for his high school team and how good of condition he was in from being a former swimmer and he'd be able to handle the rigors and psychology of being a non-scholarship player," Jones said. "To his credit, those people probably undersold him. He's been a fabulous part of our program in terms of leadership and practice effort and preparation effort. We'll miss that in our locker room when he's gone after this year."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 12 seconds remaining and John Butler blocked a jump shot by Wendell More, Jr., with two seconds remaining, and Florida State won its NCAA record 13th consecutive overtime decision with a 79-78 win over No. 5 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak. The win was Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton's eighth all-time win over Duke. The win was also the Seminoles' first over a top-5 ranked team since a 69-69 win over Virginia on March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Florida State gained its first win over a nationally ranked opponent this season and snapped a five-game losing streak to the Blue Devils. The Seminoles started the second half in a 38-33 hole at half but turned it around at the under 16-minute media timeout to lead by a 44-34 margin. Sophomore Naheem McLeod started for the second time in his season and finished with a near a double-double with a career-high nine points and 10 rebounds.

Game 29 -- Florida State 74, Notre Dame 70

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — John Butler had 16 points, eight rebounds and four blocks — all career highs — to lead Florida State to a 74-70 win over Notre Dame. Butler, a freshman, also had a career-best four 3-pointers for Florida State to keep the Fighting Irish (21-9, 14-5) from clinching the No. 2 seed in the ACC tournament and their first-ever victory in Tallahassee in six visits. RayQuan Evans, Anthony Polite and Tanor Ngom scored 12 points each for the Seminoles with Evans adding seven rebounds and five assists. Blake Wesley scored 21 points, Paul Atkinson Jr. had 17 points and 10 rebounds for his seventh double-double this season and Prentiss Hubb added 10 points for Notre Dame. The Seminoles were without ACC freshman of the week and second-leading scorer Matthew Cleveland, sidelined by a non-COVID illness. Cleveland had a last-second 3-pointer to beat Virginia 64-63 in FSU's previous game. FSU did get Polite back after he missed the last seven games following surgery for a fractured wrist and he came through with a 3-pointer for a five-point lead with 46.8 seconds left. Atkinson responded with a three-point play before Evans made two free throws with 9.7 seconds left. Butler blocked Wesley on the other end as time expired. The Seminoles, who opened the game with five 3-pointers in the first four minutes but trailed 44-39 at halftime, made four in the first five minutes of the second half to grab a 53-48 edge after trailing by five at halftime and clung to the lead. FSU made 12 of 29 from the arc, matching its best in ACC action this season. Notre Dame missed all 10 of its second-half 3-point tries.
