#### SEMINOLES CONTINUE ACC SCHEDULE AT DUKE ON NEW YEARS EVE

Florida State, which has won three of his last four games, resumes play following the holiday break as it travels to play at No. 14/7 Duke on Saturday, December 31, 2022, at 1:00 p.m. at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The Seminoles enter their game against Duke with a 2-1 record in ACC play – a win total that includes a victories over Louisville (December 10, 73-55) and Notre Dame (December 21, 73-72). Florida State's game against the Blue Devils is its third of the season against a nationally ranked opponent following games against current No. 1/1 Purdue (November 30, 59-69) and No. 12/13 Virginia (December 3, 57-62). The Seminoles games against the Boilermakers and Cavaliers came when both teams were ranked in the top five in the nation in both national polls. The Seminoles have played, or are scheduled to play six teams who are currently ranked or receiving votes in this week's Associated Press Top-25 poll. Following Saturday's game at Duke, the Seminoles play host to Georgia Tech on January 7 at 1:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

#### HAMILTON ON THE CUSP OF 400 FLORIDA STATE WINS; 600 OVERALL WINS

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Duke on the verge of winning his 400<sup>th</sup> game as Florida State's Head Coach, and his 600<sup>th</sup> game overall as a head coach. He is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 399 career wins and ranks fifth in ACC history with 179 career ACC wins at Florida State. Hamilton is just one shy of becoming the fifth coach in ACC history with 400 or more wins as a coach in the nation's top conference for basketball. Hamilton is looking to join a select group that consists of Mike Krzyzewski, Duke (1,129 wins), Dean Smith of North Carolina (879 wins), Roy Williams of North Carolina (485 wins) and Gary Williams of Maryland (461 wins).

#### FLORIDA STATE'S CORHEN NAMED ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Florida State freshman Cam Corhen, who helped lead Florida State to a win over Notre Dame in its only game last week, was named the ACC Rookie of the Week by the conference office. Corhen scored his career-high of 18 points in leading Florida State to its second ACC win of the season over the Fighting Irish. The Seminoles are now 2-1 in league play heading into a New Year's Eve matchup against No. 14/17 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium with the tip time set for 1:00 p.m. It's the first ACC Rookie of the Week honor for Corhen, who has earned three starting assignments, including in Florida State's victory over Notre Dame. Corhen totaled eight of his 18 points in the second half against Notre Dame on a near-perfect shooting half from the field (4 of 5) in 16 of 20 minutes played. He also totaled seven rebounds (one off of his career high) and added a career-high 2 assists in the win over Notre Dame. Corhen's 18 points and seven rebounds rank as his career-best statistics during the first three ACC games of his career.

#### CLEVELAND ENTERS GAME AT DUKE WITH THREE CONSECUTIVE DOUBLE DOUBLE EFFORTS

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland, a nominee for the prestigious Julius Erving Award as the nation's top shooting forward, enters Saturday's game against Duke with three consecutive double double scoring and rebounding efforts (16-10 against USC Upstate on December 13; 23-13 against St. John's on December 17 and 19 and 12 against Notre Dame. He is looking to become the first Seminole with four consecutive double double efforts since Douglas Edwards totaled four consecutive double doubles during the 1992-93 season.

#### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Duke and gain a win against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium for the first time since January 21, 2012 when the Seminoles won 76-73 on a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by Michael Snaer;

...Defeat Duke and gain a win over a nationally ranked Duke team for the 10<sup>th</sup> time in school history. The Seminole most recently defeated a Duke team ranked in the top 25 on January 18, 2022 with a 79-78 win in overtime at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

**HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS**

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018;

**FLORIDA STATE WITH 14 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST FOUR SEASONS**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against No. 14/17 Duke with 14 victories over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 58 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Included in the list of victories over nationally ranked teams since the beginning of the 2018-19 season is a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022. Florida State's most recent win over a nationally ranked team on the road came on January 4, 2020 at Louisville.

**SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against No. 14/17 Duke having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

**NOTING FLORIDA STATE**

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Duke having won three of its last four games and two consecutive ACC games. The Seminoles play their fourth ACC game of the month of December – only Florida State, Miami and NC State played (or will play) four ACC games in the month of December to begin the 2022-23 season.

**FLORIDA STATE HANDLES THE BASKETBALL IN VICTORY OVER NOTRE DAME**

Florida State limited its' turnovers to a season-low five in its victory over Notre Dame on December 21 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' five turnovers (two in the first half and three in the second half) helped Florida State limit the Fighting Irish to just seven points off of turnovers and to just six fast break points. Florida State's five turnovers in his victory over Notre Dame were the freest by a Florida State team since also totaling five turnovers in its 79-78 overtime victory over Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center on January 18, 2022.

**SEMINOLES WITH DOUBLE FIGURE ASISTS TOTAL IN WIN OVER NOTRE DAME**

Florida State totaled 15 assists against only five turnovers for a season-best 3:1 assist:turnover ratio in its 73-72 win over Notre Dame on December 21. The Seminoles have earned double figure assists in 13 of their first 14 games with single figure turnovers in five of their 14 games.

**FLORIDA STATE SCORING**

Florida State has scored at least 73 points and is averaging 76.8 points scored per game in its last four games (307 total points) as compared to averaging 65.5 points per game in their first 10 games of the season (655 total points). The Seminoles reached the 70 point plateau in just three of their first 10 games with 81 points coming in their 81-72 win over Mercer on November 21, 2022.

**SEMINOLES EXCELLING FROM THE FREE THROW LINE**

Florida State shot .857 from the free throw line (12 of 14) in its 73-72 win over Notre Dame on December 21. The Seminoles made more free throws (12) than the Fighting Irish attempted (nine) and outscored the Irish from the free throw line (12-7) in earning the victory. The Seminoles are shooting .810 percent from the free throw line – and have shot better than 70 percent – in their last six games.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. DUKE – THE LAST GAME**

Jalen Warley scored a career-high 15 points and pulled down a career-high seven rebounds as the Seminoles fell to No. 9 Duke, 88-70, on February 18, 2022 at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The Seminoles were without five starters against the Blue Devils including Malik Osborne, Anthony Polite, RayQuan Evans, Caleb Mills and Naheem McLeod. Warley shot .600 percent from the field (six of 10) and .667 from beyond the arc (two of three). His two triples mark a career-high for the freshman. He is ranked second on the team with a 2.0:1 assist to turnover ratio, third on the team with 62 assists, and fourth on the team with 28 steals. Freshman Matthew Cleveland led with 16 points on seven of 13 shooting from the field (.538 percent). Florida State was down by just one point late in the first half after a three-point shot from Wyatt Wilkes with 3:26 to go. However, a 12-2 run by the Blue Devils put them up 52-41 going into the locker room.

High socks, 15 minutes of silence, fruits and Taylor Swift?

Coming from a baseball background, Florida State's Matthew Cleveland feels he is more superstitious than many of his basketball counterparts during pregame.

No one with the Seminoles is complaining about how the sophomore gets ready for a basketball game, as he is coming off a highly successful freshman season.

Cleveland averaged 11.5 points and 4.6 rebounds per game as a freshman, earning ACC Sixth Man of the Year last season.

"You go back and watch the season last year. There are so many times even as a freshman, we needed the play and he came through. He has that "factor you can't really describe," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"He makes the big plays at the end. He's not afraid of the moment. And we expect him to continue to keep getting better and better."

Cleveland and fellow guard Caleb Mills are representing FSU at the 2022 ACC Tipoff on Tuesday and Wednesday at the Westin in Charlotte, N.C.

Mills (12.7 PPG) was the team's leading scorer last season. Two weeks into practice, and Mills has already seen Cleveland improve.

"He's shooting the ball a lot better," Mills said. "Free throws, a lot better. He's starting to understand the game.

That's the biggest and best thing. He's starting to see what's open and reading the game of basketball. I am guessing it's starting to slow down for him."

### Pregame routine

Below are Cleveland's various pregame routines.

- **Fruits in pregame meal:** Road or home, it doesn't matter what the pregame meal is for Cleveland. It varies game to game. But there is something he needs to make sure he's ready for the game.

"I always make sure I get fruit, no matter what the meal is," Cleveland said. "Strawberries, grapes and bananas."

- **Ninety minutes to game time:** This is "Matthew Cleveland time." The 6-foot-7 guard comes onto the court alone to shoot around.

- **Uniform:** As a freshman in high school, Cleveland started wearing a sock on his right foot inside out. He said he did it once, and it became routine following a strong game.

## CORHEN IN THE LAST FOUR GAMES

Cam Corhen, the current ACC Rookie of the Week, is averaging 11.3 points (45 total points) and 5.0 rebounds (20 total rebounds) while shooting .517 from the field (15 of 29) and .824 from the free throw line (14 of 17). Corhen became the 19<sup>th</sup> Seminole to earn ACC Rookie of the Week honors earlier this week. Bob Sura, who has named the 1991-92 ACC Rookie of the Year was the first Seminole to earn the award during Florida State's first year in the ACC. Dwayne Bacon was named the ACC Rookie of the Week a school-record five times during his freshman season (2015-16).

***Coach Leonard Hamilton: 'The Worse the Program, the More I Became Interested'***

*Hamilton, the Florida State men's basketball coach, was presented with the Joe Lapchick Character Award in New York last week.*

Leonard Hamilton was on the ninth floor of the stately New York Athletic Club with its million-dollar views over Central Park, accepting the Joe Lapchick Character Award at a luncheon on Friday. Outside, a chauffeur waited to whisk him across the Hudson River to a private plane that would deliver the Florida State men's basketball coach back to Tallahassee, Fla.

It was quite the departure from his first visit to New York.

That came 50 years ago, when Hamilton was a wet-behind-the-ears assistant coach at Austin Peay State University in Tennessee. Hamilton walked to the La Guardia Airport car rental counter only to discover that he could not pay cash for a car — and he did not have a credit card. So he jumped in a cab and asked the driver to take him to the cheapest hotel he could find near a gym in Brooklyn.

When Hamilton got to the gym, he heard other coaches talking about a hot prospect from the neighborhood. So he pulled aside Rodney Parker, a street basketball consigliere whom any recruiter in the city had better get to know, and asked if he could introduce him to this phenom. The next night, they went to the prospect's apartment a little before he was expected home at 7. His mother answered the door. They talked and talked, Hamilton turning on the charm.

After a while, Parker left, and they talked some more.

Sometime after midnight, when the mother excused herself to use the bathroom, Hamilton turned the clock back a couple of hours lest she ask him to leave. When she went to the bathroom again, he pulled the blinds down, lest she discover the sun would soon be peeking through. Finally, just around 7 a.m., in walked a sinewy 6-foot-5 teenager with a bushy Afro and a sly grin.

Immediately, Hamilton hit it off with James Williams, whom everyone knew as Fly.

"I was following him around playing All-Star games," Hamilton said. "Nobody knew me, and I never wore anything with Austin Peay on it, so Fly, being the jokester that he was, told everybody I was his cousin. I actually sat in on two recruiting meetings with other schools. He said, 'I can't talk with anybody without my cuz.'"

Austin Peay, which had finished last in the Ohio Valley Conference the previous season, nearly reached the Mideast regional final of the N.C.A.A. men's tournament in 1973, losing in overtime to Kentucky.

Hamilton, 74, was the first Black player at the University of Tennessee at Martin and the first Black coach in the Southeastern Conference when he was hired as an assistant at Kentucky in 1974. He is getting ready for his 21st season at Florida State, where he has coached six first-round draft picks since 2016 — including the reigning N.B.A. rookie of the year, Scottie Barnes — and where 73 of the 75 players who have completed their eligibility have graduated.

He spoke to The New York Times last week about growing up in the segregated South, taking on reclamation projects, why he doesn't think about the what-ifs of the pandemic and when he'll retire.



**You quit coaching when you were told Austin Peay would not hire a Black head coach, right?**

It wasn't quite like that. I went to talk to the university president when I thought Coach (Lake) Kelly might leave to see if there was a chance I could replace him. He said he was retiring in a couple years and nothing would make him happier than for me to be the coach at Austin Peay. Politically, he said he didn't know if he was strong enough to get it done. He was being honest with me, but that cut my guts out.

**So you quit?**

I got a job at Dow Chemicals. My first day on the job, I got a call from Joe Hall (the Kentucky coach), who had become aware of me because we almost beat them. Near the end of my interview, I said, "I'm going to tell you four things: I'll be loyal to you, nobody will outwork me, you'll have players, and I won't get you in trouble. But if you're not going to offer me the job, I'm going to go back to Charlotte and be the No. 1 chemicals salesman in the country."

**You spent 12 years as an assistant at Kentucky (winning the 1978 championship with the team), but your head coaching jobs have been at places that were not exactly blue bloods. Oklahoma State hadn't won an N.C.A.A. tournament game in more than two decades; Miami had recently resurrected its program 15 years after dropping it; and Florida State had always been a football school. Is that a coincidence?**

As an assistant coach, like most young coaches, I was dreaming. I wanted to be somewhere that had good facilities, was in the vicinity of good players and that had won. I wanted to find one of those good, cushy jobs where I could really go to work. But then it's almost like God slapped me on both sides of my face and said, "Those programs don't need you." It was almost like a vision — if you're going to make a name in this business, you're going to have to go somewhere that is extremely challenging. The worse the program, the more I became interested. That would be a way for me to earn my stripes.

**How much did your upbringing in Gastonia, N.C., prepare you for that, having to make do with less?**

There were eight of us living in a two-bedroom house. Our bathroom was on the back porch, there was no hot and cold running water. I took my bath in a tin tub. Everybody in our neighborhood lived that way. This was an era when we were still drinking out of a colored water fountain, using a colored bathroom, sitting in the back of the bus. We lived 30 or 40 yards from my church — Mount Zion Baptist, at the corner of Allison and Morris, where everybody is somebody and Christ is all. I could hear the piano from our back porch, and if the doors were open, we were there. It gave me a moral compass. All of those circumstances, even the negative part of segregation, prepared me mentally. It gave me a toughness, a desire, a will to fight and a determination to try to overcome challenges.

**Last year, Gaston College, the community college you attended in your hometown, resurrected its athletic program after 50 years, bringing back five sports, including men's basketball. You urged the college's board of trustees to do this. Why?**

Most Blacks in that time got their education through the G.I. Bill, so that's what I was going to do in 1966 — join the Army. My mother went to school up to the seventh grade, my father went to the ninth grade. The coach convinced me I could always join the Army but this would be a good experience. And he was right. Gaston College meant so much to me because I was a guy who needed some direction. I needed small classrooms. I needed the relationships. I needed that environment. Every Wednesday night, my coach would take me to Howard Johnson's. He was teaching me how to eat pasta. He wanted me to take the fork and the spoon and curl it up, which made no sense to me. It helped prepare me to go to Tennessee-Martin. I had three younger brothers and a sister who looked to me for leadership. Getting my degree set the table for them.

**In 2020, Florida State was 26-5, A.C.C. champions, ranked fourth and picked by some to get to the Final Four, where you have never been. Then the pandemic hit and the N.C.A.A. tournament was canceled. How often do you think about what might have been?**

I don't. When you think about the negative effect that continuing to play those games could have had on a lot of people, me standing up there saying "I'm No. 1" pales in comparison. I would have loved to have played for a championship, but the most important thing is it was the right decision to make.

**In the past two years, Roy Williams retired at North Carolina, Mike Krzyzewski retired at Duke and Jay Wright retired at Villanova. You turned 74 last month, you just had hip replacement surgery, and you coached with a ruptured Achilles' tendon in last year's N.C.A.A. tournament. How long do you want to coach?**

This is my ministry. This is my calling. This is what I'm built for — to help young people fulfill their dreams. I don't play golf. I don't hunt. I don't fish. I'm boring. I always tell my staff that if I don't come out of the locker room and go to the wrong bench, then I'm going to stay here.
