SEMINOLES CONTINUE ACC PLAY AS THEY PLAY HOST TO NOTRE DAME ON WEDNESDAY AT 8:30 P.M.

Florida State, which holds an undefeated 6-0 record at home against Notre Dame, plays host to the Fighting Irish on Wednesday, December 21, 2022 at 8:30 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The game will be televised on the ACC Network, and is the Seminoles' final game of the fall semester. Florida State's players and coaches will be off until beginning preparations for its next ACC game at Duke. The Seminoles are 1-1 in ACC play after traveling to play at Virginia (December 3) and gaining a victory in their ACC home opener against Louisville (73-55, December 10). The Seminoles' game against Notre Dame is their third ACC game of the season and first of 18 consecutive conference games to close out the regular season. Following Wednesday's game at home against Notre Dame, the Seminoles travel to play at Duke on December 31, 2022 at 1:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE'S RECENT ACC SUCCESS AT THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State is 50-6 in ACC play at the Donald L. Tucker Center in the last seven seasons. The Seminoles' winning percentage of nearly 90 percent in conference play since the start of the 2016-17 season has made the Tucker Center one of the toughest places to play for ACC opponents. Florida State lost only two ACC home games (73-69 to Louisville on January 10, 2018 and 80-78 to Duke on January 12, 2019) from the start of the 2016-17 ACC schedule through the end of the 2020-21 ACC schedule. To extrapolate the Seminoles' winning ways even further, the Seminoles won their final two ACC home games of the 2015-16 season against Notre Dame (77-56 on February 27, 2016) and Syracuse (78-73 on March 5, 2016) to raise their recent conference record at home to 52-6 for a winning percentage to .897.

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME SINCE 2015

Florida State is 91-12 at home in the last six (plus) seasons (.883 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 91 of their last 103 home games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 88 of 101 home games (.871 winning percentage) in the last six seasons (2018 through 2022).

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 398 career wins and ranks fifth in ACC history with 178 career ACC wins at Florida State.

HAMILTON APPROACHING ACC MILESTONE

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game with 398 career wins as the Seminoles' Head Coach in the ACC. He is just two wins shy of becoming the fifth coach in ACC history with 400 or more wins as a coach in the nation's top conference for basketball. Hamilton is looking to join a select group that consists of Mike Krzyzewski, Duke (1,129 wins), Dean Smith of North Carolina (879 wins), Roy Williams of North Carolina (485 wins) and Gary Williams of Maryland (461 wins).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its seventh consecutive home game against the Fighting Irish. The Seminoles defeated Notre Dame, 76-74, on January 24, 2014 in Tallahassee in the first meeting between the two teams as members of the ACC and have won each game play in the capital city of Florida since the series began;
...Defeat Notre Dame and gain its fifth win in the last six meetings in the series between the two teams.

FLORIDA STATE MAKES SEASON-HIGH 11 3-POINT FIELD GOALS AGAINST ST. JOHN'S

Led by Darin Green's career-high eight 3-point field goals made, Florida State made a season-high 11 3-point field goals against St. John's in its Orange Bowl Classic game on Saturday in Sunrise, Fla. Florida State's 11 3-point field goals made against the Johnnies were the most made by the Seminoles since making 12 in their 74-70 win over Notre Dame on March 2, 2022 at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State is averaging 7.4 3-point field goals made and shooting .394 from the bonusphere in its last five games.

DARIN GREEN FROM 3-POINT RANGE IN THE ACC STATISTICS

Darin Green, Jr, enters Wednesday's game against Notre Dame ranked tied for first in the ACC with 39 3-point shots made and ranked second in the ACC in the 3-point field goal shooting category with a career-high .459 mark. He is tied for the ACC lead for total 3-point shots made (39) and 3-point shots made per game (3.0) with NC State's Terquavion Smith and ranks second in the ACC to Casey Morsell of Virginia in the 3-point field goal shooting percentage category. Morsell is shooting .466 from the 3-point line.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO CONNECT FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State has shot better than 73 percent and is shooting a combined .802 percent from the free throw line in its last five games. The Seminoles were a perfect nine of nine from the line at Virginia on December 3 and made 18 free throws in their win over USC Upstate on December 13.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE BLOCKS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Notre Dame with 58 blocked shots and a 4.5 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles have blocked at least one shot in each of their 13 games this season. Florida State is ranked third in the ACC in total blocked shots with 58 and sixth in the ACC with an average of 4.5 blocked shots per game.

FLORIDA STATE STEALING

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Notre Dame with 83 steals and a 6.4 steals per game average. The Seminoles totaled a season-high 11 steals against Siena in the first round of the ESPN Events Invitational on November 24, and have earned at least five steals in 12 of their 13 games.

FLORIDA STATE SCORING

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Notre Dame averaging 78.0 points scored in its last three games – 80 in its win over USC Upstate, 79 against St. John's, and 75 in its ACC victory over Louisville. The Seminoles are averaging 78.0 points scored in their last three games as compared to having averaged 65.5 points scored in the first 10 games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NOTRE DAME – THE LAST GAME

Freshman John Butler scored a career-high 16 points and pulled down a career-high eight rebounds as the Seminoles defeated Notre Dame 74-70 on March 2, 2022, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. RayQuan Evans made two free throws with nine seconds remaining to seal the victory for the Seminoles. Florida State's victory marked its sixth consecutive home win against the Fighting Irish. The Seminoles have not lost a game to Notre Dame in Tallahassee in the history of the series. The Seminoles were without ACC Freshman of the Week and second-leading scorer Matthew Cleveland, who was sidelined by a non-COVID illness. Cleveland had a last-second 3-pointer to beat Virginia 64-63 in FSU's previous game. FSU did get Polite back after he missed the last seven games following surgery for a fractured wrist, and he came through with a 3-pointer for a five-point lead with 46.8 seconds left. Four Seminoles scored in double figures, including Evans (12 points), Polite (12 points), and Tanor Ngom (12 points).

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.441 Junior Darin Green, Jr. is shooting a career-high .441 from the 3-point line (39 of 85) and averaging 3.0 made 3-point field goals per game in the first 13 games of his Florida State career.

.540 Junior Darin Green is shooting .540 from the 3-point line (20 of 37) in the last five games. He is averaging 4.0 made 3-point field goals since making four against Purdue on November 30 in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge.

.568 Sophomore Matthew Cleveland is shooting .568 from the field (42 of 74) in the last six games.

.813 Freshman Cam Corhen is shooting .813 from the free throw line (13 of 16) in the last four games.

.846 Junior Darin Green Jr. is shooting .846 from the free throw line (11 of 13) in the last five games. He has been perfect against Virginia (two of two), USC Upstate (two of two) and St. John's (two of two) during that span of games.

.875 Sophomore Jalen Warley is shooting .875 from the free throw line (seven of eight) in the last four games.

.973 Under Leonard Hamilton, 73 of 75 four-year players (.973 percent) have earned their degrees from Florida State. Caleb Mills is the most recent degree recipient; he earned his degree in July of 2022.

FLORIDA STATE'S CLEVELAND GOING TO THE BOARDS

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland enters Wednesday's game against Notre Dame as Florida State's leading rebounder with a career-high 6.3 rebound per game average. His emphasis on rebounding has become even more important to the Seminoles' rotation following the loss of forward Cam'Ron Fletcher for the season to a knee injury in Florida State's game against Virginia (December 3). Fletcher was Florida State's leading rebounder with a career-high 7.5 rebounds per game average when he was hurt against the Cavaliers. With Fletcher out of the Seminoles' lineup, rebounding has become much more of a team orientated necessity. Cleveland is averaging 10.3 rebounds per game in the last four games (at Virginia, Louisville, USC Upstate and St. John's) – a jump of 4.0 rebounds per game – from his career-high season-long average of 6.3 rebounds per game. He has totaled double figures in rebounds in three of the last four games after not reaching double figures in the first nine games of the season.

Green Finds Success On The Basketball Court

Darin Green's love for basketball came at an early age.

It was hard not to, growing up in a basketball family with both parents having played the sport: Mom in high school and Dad at George Washington University.

His father first put a basketball in his 3-year-old son's hands and eventually taught him how to shoot.

"He played guard as well, but he was more an athlete — a slasher and dunker — who could get above the rim," said Green. "He got hurt and that's when he learned to shoot, so he taught me to shoot early on because he knew that would last longer than your athleticism."

Those shooting skills have helped Green Jr. as he's made his way from high school to college.

Green transferred to Florida State after spending three seasons at UCF, averaging 11.6 points in 82 games for the Knights.

"It just felt like home," Green said of the decision to transfer to FSU. "They preach the same things my parents preach. The discipline part of this program and the attention to detail. The ability to come off ball screens and show I can do more than just shoot."

Injuries and a suspension have reduced FSU's lineup to seven scholarship players, led by Green, averaging 16.3 points and 35.5 minutes per game. It's not an ideal situation, admits coach Leonard Hamilton, who has been forced to lean on the transfer guard more than anticipated.

"It is almost virtually impossible to play 36 minutes a game and live with it," said Hamilton. "But we're doing what we have to do to compete at this level."

Hamilton believes the last time a Seminole player averaged 36 minutes was Toney Douglas, the former guard who logged 36.5 minutes in 2008-09.

"That's almost abusive, and it might get me arrested," he joked. "My point is that's not healthy, but that's where we are right now."

The extra minutes haven't bothered Green, who is willing to do whatever it takes to help the Seminoles win.

"If I've got to play 36 minutes or if I've got to play three minutes, I'll do whatever coach asks, at least to the best of my ability," said Green. "I'm not focused on how long I've had to play. I don't get tired out there, so I didn't notice it was 36 minutes until after."

MATTHEW CLEVELAND AGAINST ST. JOHN'S

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland scored his career-high of 23 points, pulled down his career-high of 13 rebounds (including his career-high of 12 defensive rebounds) in Florida State's game against St. John's on Saturday.

TRIPLE DOUBLE DOUBLES

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland enters Wednesday's game against Notre Dame have earned consecutive double-doubles against USC Upstate (16 points and 10 rebounds) and St. John's (23 points and 13 rebounds). The last Florida State player to earn three consecutive double doubles was Corey Louis against UNC Greensboro (15 points and 12 rebounds, February 1, 1995), Virginia (13 points and 12 rebounds, February 4, 1995) and Wake Forest (13 points and 10 rebounds, February 8, 1995).

JACKSON'S ASSISTS

Freshman Chandler Jackson totaled two assists and a career-high five points in Florida State's game against St. John's on Saturday in the Orange Bowl Classic. He now has nine assists in the first nine games of his collegiate career, including his career-high of three in the Seminoles' game against Stanford in the ESPN Events Invitational.

WARLEY LEADING THE SEMINOLES FROM THE POINT GUARD POSITION

Sophomore Jalen Warley, who has started each of the Seminoles last three games as the point guard position, is enjoying the best span of games handling and distributing the basketball of his second season in Tallahassee. With only three turnovers in his three games as a starter, Warley has an assist:turnover ratio of 3.7:1 and is averaging just one turnover for each his last 27.7 minutes played. During the span of his most recent three games, Warley is averaging 6.7 points per game — exactly 1.5 points per game more than his season average of 5.2 points per game.

Coming from a baseball background, Florida State's Matthew Cleveland feels he is more superstitious than many of his basketball counterparts during pregame.

No one with the Seminoles is complaining about how the sophomore gets ready for a basketball game, as he is coming off a highly successful freshman season.

Cleveland averaged 11.5 points and 4.6 rebounds per game as a freshman, earning ACC Sixth Man of the Year last season.

"You go back and watch the season last year. There are so many times even as a freshman, we needed the play and he came through. He has that "factor you can't really describe," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said.

The Seminoles open their season against Stetson on Nov. 7.

Mills (12.7 PPG) was the team's leading scorer last season. Two weeks into practice, and Mills has already seen Cleveland improve.

"He's shooting the ball a lot better," Mills said. "Free throws, a lot better. He's starting to understand the game.

That's the biggest and best thing. He's starting to see what's open and reading the game of basketball. I am guessing it's starting to slow down for him."

Pregame routine

Below are Cleveland's various pregame routines.

- **Fruits in pregame meal:** Road or home, it doesn't matter what the pregame meal is for Cleveland. It varies game to game. But there is something he needs to make sure he's ready for the game.

"I always make sure I get fruit, no matter what the meal is," Cleveland said. "Strawberries, grapes and bananas."

- **Ninety minutes to game time:** This is "Matthew Cleveland time." The 6-foot-7 guard comes onto the court alone to shoot around.

While the time is helping his body get warmed up for the game, it is also an opportunity for him to examine the court pregame.

"I definitely take into account the corners and the depth perception," Cleveland said. "And what is behind the goal, and it's different in every arena. So I familiarize myself with that before the game."

While every court is generally the same size and length, it doesn't mean they are all the same.

"Dark arenas, light arenas, bigger arenas, they are all different," Cleveland said.

North Carolina and Purdue were his favorite arenas to play in on the road last season. The sea of blue at UNC was new, but it was the Boilmakers' arena he said that required adjustments.

"It was dark and it just seemed like the fans were right on top of you," Cleveland said. "Like you can look up and you're looking at fans in the stands."

- **Uniform:** As a freshman in high school, Cleveland started wearing a sock on his right foot inside out. He said he did it once, and it became routine following a strong game.

That was with low socks. With higher socks at FSU, he has begun to wear both of them high and not inside out. "The new superstition I have is with 75 minutes, I'll (wear) low socks or the high socks low," he said. "And then we'll go in at 45 (minutes) and come back. I'll make sure I put them both high is my new superstition."

There are a couple more uniform related rituals before he's ready to play.

"I always like to put the left shoe on first and then the right shoe," he said. "And then I rolled my shorts once and then make sure my nails are cut before games. No long nails."

None of the pregame routines are surprising to Hamilton.

"Matthew is a very focused youngster, great student," Hamilton said. "He is a very consciences about everything he does, how he eats and sleeps. How much what he drinks. He's a very high-IQ basketball player."

"Obviously he's intelligent because he made academic All-ACC, and he's just as conscientious on the basketball court as he is about his whole life."

Banned from the AUX

Cleveland isn't as strict as listening to just one artist pregame, but there is one that he singled out as a must-listen pregame.

"It really depends on the day," Cleveland said. "I listen to anything. Country, rap, Taylor Swift. It just depends." His go-to Swift song? "Enchanted" off her 2010 "Speak Now" album.

While his musical choices help him get ready to play, it is not for everyone.

Mills said Cleveland has been banned from controlling the music at practice.

"We usually don't let him get on the AUX," Mills said. "Personally, I cannot get with country."

"He does (get control) at times, but I'm usually not in the room. I'll put my headphones on."

Growing as leader

Cleveland has plenty of room for growth, even following a strong freshman season. But what has been the biggest improvement for him heading into the new season?

"He's stepped up in the role of being a better leader," Mills said. "Last year, he wasn't asked to be one. But this year it's been mandatory. He's had to be one. He's one of the guys who is most experienced here. Not as far as experience in college, but we don't have as much experience at Florida State."

"So he's had to step into that role kind of early as a sophomore. But he's been pretty good at it. Of course, there's room for improvement."

Cleveland knows the importance of his leadership role this season with six true freshmen, two transfers and a total of just five returning scholarship players.

He is especially focused on helping the incoming freshmen.

"Just giving them the information I was given last year," Cleveland said. "And really giving them more information on what it's like to play at this level. Making sure they are coming ready every day ready to play, ready to practice. It's different, especially for the guys coming from high school. It's different. It's physical. Just trying to get them mentally ready for their first game so when they see it, it's nothing new to them."

Finding comfort

As a freshman, Cleveland said it wasn't until the new year when he got settled in at the college level.

"It was really not until January, February," he said. "Just learning our system and how we play. Learning even like the other team's system and how they play, because you can play a different system in different team every night. So like mid-January is when I got comfortable."

The decision to focus on basketball over baseball came in part due to Cleveland seeing a path for a brighter future in basketball.

The sophomore is already projected to be the No. 23 overall pick in the 2023 NBA Draft, per [ClutchPoints](#).

Cleveland did test the waters for the draft last season, but he ultimately decided to come back for another year.

Cleveland shot 17.6% from three-point range and 55.5% from the free-throw line last season. Those are among the things he said he's working on this season to make sure he can play at the next level.

"My confidence in shooting has grown a lot since last year," Cleveland said.

Atlanta Braves World Series

Basketball wasn't Cleveland's first love. Growing up in a household where his mother and sister's all played softball, he started playing baseball at a young age.

Cleveland was a star center fielder until his freshman season, when he decided he saw a brighter future for himself in basketball.

The Braves last World Series championship before last season came in 1995, seven years before Cleveland was born.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Caleb Mills scored a game-high 16 points on six made field goals to lead the Seminoles in a 75-53 victory over the Louisville Cardinals at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Matthew Cleveland pulled down eight re-bounds and Naheem McLeod added a career-high six blocks as the Seminoles secured their first ACC win of the season. It was a career-high night for multiple Seminoles. McLeod blocked a career-high six shots, tied for sixth most in school history and ACC play. Cam Corhen scored a career-high 15 points one four made field goals and six made free throws.

Florida State's lead never wavered against Louisville. The Seminoles opened the game with a 5-0 lead, progressively widening the gap with a 13-3 scoring run that led Florida State to their largest lead of the first half (34-18). Florida State had a .424 (14-33) shooting percentage from the field in the first half and shot four for 10 (.400) to enter the intermission with a 36-24 lead over the Cardinals, which marked their second straight halftime lead (Virginia, 22-21). Corhen had a perfect night from the free-throw line, shooting six for six. Over the last three games, Florida State is shooting 85 percent (33 of 39) from the free throw line.
