FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO AUTONATION ORANGE BOWL CLASSIC TO FACE ST. JOHN'S

Florida State, which has won nine of 11 games while playing in the Orange Bowl Classic, travels to Sunrise, Fla., to face St. John's of the Big East in the 2022 AutoNation Orange Bowl Classic on Saturday, December 17, 2022 at 2:30 p.m. at the FLA Live Arena. The game marks the Seminoles' first-ever meeting against the Red Storm, and its first game against a member of the Big East since facing Villanova in the championship game of the 2019 AdvoCare Invitational in Lake Buena Vista, Fla., on November 25, 2019. Following Saturday's game against St. John's, the Seminoles play host to Notre Dame in its third ACC game of the season at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on December 21, 2022 at 8:30.

FLORIDA STATE VS. ST. JOHN'S -- CONNECTIONS

Florida State will face St. John's in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 17 at the FLA Live Arena in Sunrise, Fla. The Seminoles game against the Red Storm marks the 12th appearance in the classic for the Seminoles and their first ever meeting against St. John's. Mike Anderson is in his fourth season as St. John's Head Coach. Florida State is 2-1 against Anderson coached-teams. The Seminoles first faced Anderson as an assistant coach at Tulsa in a 96-80 Florida State victory in the second round of the Cabrillo Classic in San Diego. Florida State was 1-1 against Anderson while he was an assistant coach at Arkansas (a victory for the Seminoles on January 18, 1989 and a loss to the Razorbacks on January 21, 1991). The Seminoles faced Red Storm assistant coach Van Macon (while an assistant at St. Louis) in the 2018 Orange Bowl Classic -- an 81-59 Florida State win on December 22, 2018. Greg Vetrone, an assistant coach on Anderson's staff, was the Director of Player Development at Rutgers when the Seminoles defeated the Scarlet Knights, 78-73, on November 23, 2017 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge at the RAC in New Brunswick, N.J. Mike Cragg -- the Athletics Director at St. John's -- was the Sports Information Director and Deputy Associate Director of Athletics at Duke for more than 30 years and faced the Seminoles numerous times as a Blue Devil administrator.

SEMINOLES TO WEAR SPECIAL TURQUOISE UNIFORMS AGAINST RED STORM

Florida State will wear its distinctive Nike N7 turquoise uniforms in its game against St. John's in the 2022 AutoNation Orange Bowl Classic. It marks the eighth consecutive appearance in the Orange Bowl Classic that the Seminoles have worn the uniform color. Florida State first wore the uniform at the Orange Bowl Classic in a 60-55 win over UMass on December 21, 2013, and are 6-1 while wearing the uniform in the Orange Bowl Classic.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 398 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 178 career ACC wins at Florida State.

HAMILTON APPROACHING ACC MILESTONE

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Tuesday's game against USC Upstate with 398 career wins as the Seminoles' Head Coach in the ACC. He is just two wins shy of becoming the fifth coach in ACC history with 400 or more wins as a coach in the nation's top conference for basketball. Hamilton is looking to join a select group that consists of Mike Krzyzewski, Duke (1,129 wins), Dean Smith of North Carolina (879 wins), Roy Williams of North Carolina (485 wins) and Gary Williams of Maryland (461 wins).

HAMILTON PRESENTED WITH PRESTIGIOUS JOE LAPCHICK AWARD IN NEW YOUR CITY

Florida State men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton received the Joe Lapchick Character Award presented by the Joe Lapchick Foundation during a ceremony at the New York Athletic Club on September 16, 2022. Hamilton was honored with the award which celebrates the life and career of Joe Lapchick, a Hall of Fame coach at St. John's University (1936-47) and the New York Knicks (1947-56). St. John's Head Coach Mike Anderson attended the ceremony and helped Hamilton celebrate the very special award.

SEMINOLES' SCORING

Florida State enters Saturday's game against St. John's averaging 77.5 points scored in its last two games -- 80 in its win over USC Upstate and 75 in its ACC victory over Louisville.

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland has been named to the Julius Erving Watch List as the nation's top collegiate small forward by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. It marks the second consecutive season that Cleveland has been named to the initial watch list for the prestigious Julius Erving Award. Cleveland is one of three players from the ACC named to the Julius Erving Watch List. He is joined on the list by Dariq Whitehead of Duke and Leaky Black of North Carolina.

FLORIDA STATE'S HISTORY IN THE ORANGE BOWL CLASSIC

Florida State owns an 9-2 record in 11 previous Orange Bowl Classic appearances and enters the 2022 Classic having won nine of their last 10 games with victories over Nebraska (2005), Western Kentucky (2008), Tulsa (2012), UMass (2013), USF (2014), Florida Atlantic (2016), Manhattan (2017), Saint Louis (2018) and USF (2019). The Seminoles are 3-0 in the Orange Bowl Classic against teams from the state of Florida. Florida State defeated Manhattan College (83-67) on December 17, 2016 – making St. John's the second team from New York the Seminoles have played in the event.

SEMINOLES TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE AGAINST ST. JOHN'S

The Florida State men's basketball team will continue its tradition and wear its special turquoise Nike N7 uniforms in Saturday's game against St. John's to raise awareness for bringing sport to Native American and Aboriginal youth. It marks the 23rd time (and second time this season) the Seminoles will wear the special uniforms. The Seminoles wore the special uniforms three times during the 2021-22 season (against Miami, Pittsburgh and Notre Dame at home). This season (2022-23) marks the 10th consecutive season the Seminoles will wear the turquoise uniforms. Florida State makes a distinct departure from its traditional school colors to don turquoise Nike N7 uniforms to stand for the importance of bringing sport and physical activity to Native American and Aboriginal youth. "The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program, and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms," said head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles first wore the turquoise uniforms in their 89-61 win over UT-Martin in Tallahassee on November 17, 2013. The Seminoles are 18-4 when wearing the special N7 turquoise uniforms.

SEMINOLES WITH FIVE IN DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING AGAINST USC UPSTATE

Florida State was led five players in double figure scoring – topped by Mathew Cleveland's team-leading 16 points – in its 80-63 win victory over USC Upstate on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. It marked the first time since the Seminoles' 89-76 win over NC State on March 5, 2022, that five Seminoles had scored in double figures in the same game. Against the Wolfpack on Senior Day in Tallahassee, Caleb Mills led five Seminoles in double figure scoring with 19 point. Also in double figure scoring for the Seminoles were Anthony Polite (14 points), John Butler (11 points), Matthew Cleveland (11 points) and Tanor Ngom (10 points).

FLORIDA STATE'S STARTING LINEUP AGAINST USC UPSTATE

Florida State's starting lineup in the Seminoles' 80-63 win over USC Upstate on Tuesday night in Tallahassee scored 65 of the Seminoles' 80 points (.813 percent), shot a combined .489 from the field (23 of 47), a combined .875 from the field (14 of 16), a combined .417 from the 3-point line (5 of 12), pulled down 25 of Florida State's 38 rebounds (.658 percent) and were credited with all 13 of the Seminoles' assists during the victory.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Saturday's game against St. John's having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES AGAINST THE NO. 1 AND NO. 2 TEAMS IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Florida State is the only team in college basketball who has played both the current No. 1 (Purdue) and No. 2 (Virginia) teams in the Associated Press and USA Today polls. The Seminoles fell to Purdue at home at the Donald L. Dwayne Bacon led his Greek team Panathinaikos to a victory over one Milano 90-77 in the Euroleague. He was MVP of the game. Bacon scored 31 points and grabbed 7 rebounds in 38 minutes. It's Bacon's first season with the team. He averages 20.5 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.5 assists in eight games this year.

Malik Beasley of the Utah Jazz scored 23 points and added four rebounds against the Minnesota Timberwolves. In Beasley's first season with the team, he's averaging 14.2 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists.

Coach Leonard Hamilton: 'The Worse the Program, the More I Became Interested'

Hamilton, the Florida State men's basketball coach, was presented with the Joe Lapchick Character Award in New York last week.

Leonard Hamilton was on the ninth floor of the stately New York Athletic Club with its million-dollar views over Central Park, accepting the Joe Lapchick Character Award at a luncheon on Friday. Outside, a chauffeur waited to whisk him across the Hudson River to a private plane that would deliver the Florida State men's basketball coach back to Tallahassee, Fla.

It was quite the departure from his first visit to New York.

That came 50 years ago, when Hamilton was a wet-behind-the-ears assistant coach at Austin Peay State University in Tennessee. Hamilton walked to the La Guardia Airport car rental counter only to discover that he could not pay cash for a car — and he did not have a credit card. So he jumped in a cab and asked the driver to take him to the cheapest hotel he could find near a gym in Brooklyn.

When Hamilton got to the gym, he heard other coaches talking about a hot prospect from the neighborhood. So he pulled aside Rodney Parker, a street basketball consigliere whom any recruiter in the city had better get to know, and asked if he could introduce him to this phenom. The next night, they went to the prospect's apartment a little before he was expected home at 7. His mother answered the door. They talked and talked, Hamilton turning on the charm.

After a while, Parker left, and they talked some more.

Sometime after midnight, when the mother excused herself to use the bathroom, Hamilton turned the clock back a couple of hours lest she ask him to leave. When she went to the bathroom again, he pulled the blinds down, lest she discover the sun would soon be peeking through. Finally, just around 7 a.m., in walked a sinewy 6-foot-5 teenager with a bushy Afro and a sly grin.

Immediately, Hamilton hit it off with James Williams, whom everyone knew as Fly.

"I was following him around playing All-Star games," Hamilton said. "Nobody knew me, and I never wore anything with Austin Peay on it, so Fly, being the jokester that he was, told everybody I was his cousin. I actually sat in on two recruiting meetings with other schools. He said, 'I can't talk with anybody without my cuz.'"

Austin Peay, which had finished last in the Ohio Valley Conference the previous season, nearly reached the Mideast regional final of the N.C.A.A. men's tournament in 1973, losing in overtime to Kentucky.

Hamilton, 74, was the first Black player at the University of Tennessee at Martin and the first Black coach in the Southeastern Conference when he was hired as an assistant at Kentucky in 1974. He is getting ready for his 21st season at Florida State, where he has coached six first-round draft picks since 2016 — including the reigning N.B.A. rookie of the year, Scottie Barnes — and where 73 of the 75 players who have completed their eligibility have graduated.

He spoke to The New York Times last week about growing up in the segregated South, taking on reclamation projects, why he doesn't think about the what-ifs of the pandemic and when he'll retire.

You quit coaching when you were told Austin Peay would not hire a Black head coach, right?

It wasn't quite like that. I went to talk to the university president when I thought Coach (Lake) Kelly might leave to see if there was a chance I could replace him. He said he was retiring in a couple years and nothing would make him happier than for me to be the coach at Austin Peay. Politically, he said he didn't know if he was strong enough to get it done. He was being honest with me, but that cut my guts out.

So you quit?

I got a job at Dow Chemicals. My first day on the job, I got a call from Joe Hall (the Kentucky coach), who had become aware of me because we almost beat them. Near the end of my interview, I said, "I'm going to tell you four things: I'll be loyal to you, nobody will outwork me, you'll have players, and I won't get you in trouble. But if you're not going to offer me the job, I'm going to go back to Charlotte and be the No. 1 chemicals salesman in the country."

You spent 12 years as an assistant at Kentucky (winning the 1978 championship with the team), but your head coaching jobs have been at places that were not exactly blue bloods. Oklahoma State hadn't won an N.C.A.A. tournament game in more than two decades; Miami had recently resurrected its program 15 years after dropping it; and Florida State had always been a football school. Is that a coincidence?

As an assistant coach, like most young coaches, I was dreaming. I wanted to be somewhere that had good facilities, was in the vicinity of good players and that had won. I wanted to find one of those good, cushy jobs where I could really go to work. But then it's almost like God slapped me on both sides of my face and said, "Those programs don't need you." It was almost like a vision — if you're going to make a name in this business, you're going to have to go somewhere that is extremely challenging. The worse the program, the more I became interested. That would be a way for me to earn my stripes.

How much did your upbringing in Gastonia, N.C., prepare you for that, having to make do with less?

There were eight of us living in a two-bedroom house. Our bathroom was on the back porch, there was no hot and cold running water. I took my bath in a tin tub. Everybody in our neighborhood lived that way. This was an era when we were still drinking out of a colored water fountain, using a colored bathroom, sitting in the back of the bus. We lived 30 or 40 yards from my church — Mount Zion Baptist, at the corner of Allison and Morris, where everybody is somebody and Christ is all. I could hear the piano from our back porch, and if the doors were open, we were there. It gave me a moral compass. All of those circumstances, even the negative part of segregation, prepared me mentally. It gave me a toughness, a desire, a will to fight and a determination to try to overcome challenges.

Last year, Gaston College, the community college you attended in your hometown, resurrected its athletic program after 50 years, bringing back five sports, including men's basketball. You urged the college's board of trustees to do this. Why?

Most Blacks in that time got their education through the G.I. Bill, so that's what I was going to do in 1966 — join the Army. My mother went to school up to the seventh grade, my father went to the ninth grade. The coach convinced me I could always join the Army but this would be a good experience. And he was right. Gaston College meant so much to me because I was a guy who needed some direction. I needed small classrooms. I needed the relationships. I needed that environment. Every Wednesday night, my coach would take me to Howard Johnson's. He was teaching me how to eat pasta. He wanted me to take the fork and the spoon and curl it up, which made no sense to me. It helped prepare me to go to Tennessee-Martin. I had three younger brothers and a sister who looked to me for leadership. Getting my degree set the table for them.

In 2020, Florida State was 26-5, A.C.C. champions, ranked fourth and picked by some to get to the Final Four, where you have never been. Then the pandemic hit and the N.C.A.A. tournament was canceled. How often do you think about what might have been?

I don't. When you think about the negative effect that continuing to play those games could have had on a lot of people, me standing up there saying "I'm No. 1" pales in comparison. I would have loved to have played for a championship, but the most important thing is it was the right decision to make.

In the past two years, Roy Williams retired at North Carolina, Mike Krzyzewski retired at Duke and Jay Wright retired at Villanova. You turned 74 last month, you just had hip replacement surgery, and you coached with a ruptured Achilles' tendon in last year's N.C.A.A. tournament. How long do you want to coach?

This is my ministry. This is my calling. This is what I'm built for — to help young people fulfill their dreams. I don't play golf. I don't hunt. I don't fish. I'm boring. I always tell my staff that if I don't come out of the locker room and go to the wrong bench, then I'm going to stay here.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Caleb Mills scored a game-high 16 points on six made field goals to lead the Seminoles in a 75-53 victory over the Louisville Cardinals at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Matthew Cleveland pulled down eight rebounds and Naheem McLeod added a career-high six blocks as the Seminoles secured their first ACC win of the season. It was a career-high night for multiple Seminoles. McLeod blocked a career-high six shots, tied for sixth most in school history and ACC play. Cam Corhen scored a career-high 15 points one four made field goals and six made free throws.

Florida State's lead never wavered against Louisville. The Seminoles opened the game with a 5-0 lead, progressively widening the gap with a 13-3 scoring run that led Florida State to their largest lead of the first half (34-18). Florida State had a .424 (14-33) shooting percentage from the field in the first half and shot four for 10 (.400) to enter the intermission with a 36-24 lead over the Cardinals, which marked their second straight halftime lead (Virginia, 22-21). Corhen had a perfect night from the free-throw line, shooting six for six. Over the last three games, Florida State is shooting 85 percent (33 of 39) from the free throw line.
