#### FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO CLEMSON IN ACC BATTLE AT THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State, which has won two of its last three games, plays host to No. 23/24 Clemson on Saturday, January 28, 2023, at the Donald L. Tucker Center at 5:00 p.m. The game will be televised on the ACC Network. Florida State's game against the Tigers marks the first of two regular season ACC games between the two teams, as Florida State travels to play at Clemson on February 15. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game having won seven consecutive home games against Clemson – a streak that began with a 76-65 win at The Tuck on January 30, 2016. Florida State won both regular season meetings between the two teams in 2017 and 2019, and won the last meeting between the Seminoles and the Tigers by an 81-80 score on February 15, 2022 at the Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Following Saturday's game against Clemson, the Seminoles play two consecutive games on the road at NC State (February 1, 9:00 p.m.) and at Louisville (February 4, 2:00 p.m.) before returning to The Tuck for two home games on February 8 (Syracuse) and February 11 (Pittsburgh).

# **CLEVELAND HAS SCORED IN DOUBLE-FIGURES IN 14 CONSECUTIVE GAMES**

Al-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland, who is averaging a career-high 14.0 points scored per games, enters Saturday's game against Clemson having scored in double figures in a career-best 14 consecutive games. He has scored 221 points and is averaging 15.8 points scored per game since totaling 17 points against Nebraska on November 27 in the final game of the ESPN Events Invitational at Disney.

# MILLS ENTERS SATURDAY'S GAME WITH AN 11-GAME DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAK

Junior Caleb Mills, the Seminoles' third-leading scorer, enters Saturday's game against Clemson with a career-best 11 game double figure scoring streak which began with a 16-point performance in Florida State's victory over Louisville on December 10. He has scored 146 points and is averaging 13.3 points scored per game during the streak, with 19 points coming in the Seminoles' game at Wake Forest (January 11).

# FLORIDA STATE'S RECENT ACC SUCCESS AT THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State has won 52 of its last 60 ACC home games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. With a 3-2 record at home in ACC play this season, the Seminoles have won nearly 87 percent of their conference home games since the start of the 2016-17 season. Florida State has lost only eight ACC home games since the start of the 2016-17 ACC schedule through the Seminoles' game against nationally ranked Miami on January 24. To extrapolate Florida State's winning ways even further, the Seminoles won their final two ACC home games of the 2015-16 season against Notre Dame (77-56 on February 27, 2016) and Syracuse (78-73 on March 5, 2016) to raise their recent conference record at home to 54-8 for a winning percentage of .871 percent.

- ....Defeat Clemson and win its eighth consecutive home game against Clemson. The Seminoles have topped the Tigers at home in 2016 (76-65), 2017 (109-61), 2018 (81-79), 2019 (77-68), 2020 (72-53), 2021 (80-61) and 2022 (81-80) and hold a 26-9 series advantage over Clemson in games played in Tallahassee;
- ...Defeat Clemson and up its record to 6-3 when playing a ranked Clemson team. Most recently, the Seminoles defeated No. 15/20 Clemson, 81-79, on February 14, 2018, in Tallahassee. The Seminoles are 3-1 and have won three consecutive home games against nationally ranked Clemson teams, with wins in 2008 (64-55 over No. 22 Clemson), 2009 (73-66 over No. 24 Clemson) and most recently in 2018 (81-79 over No 15/20 Clemson).

# HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018.

# FLORIDA STATE WITH 14 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against nationally ranked Clemson with 14 victories over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season, and have defeated a school-record 58 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Included in the list of victories over nationally ranked teams since the beginning of the 2018-19 season is a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

# FLORIDA STATE WITH SEASON-HIGH TYING 11 STEALS MIAMI

Florida State totaled a season-high tying 11 steals against Miami on Tuesday— the fourth time this season the Seminoles have earned double-figure steals. The Seminoles' 11 steals against the Hurricanes marked the ninth time in the last two seasons they have earned double-digit steals, and the third time the Seminoles have earned double figures steals in an ACC game in the last two seasons. The Seminoles totaled 16 steals at Wake Forest on January 4, 2022, 15 at home against Wake Forest on February 5, 2022 and 10 at Boston College on February 21, 2022. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Clemson averaging 5.9 steals per game for the season.

# FLORIDA STATE PILING UP ITS BLOCKED SHOTS TOTALS

Florida State has blocked 26 shots in its last five games and enters Saturday's game against Clemson ranked sixth in the ACC in blocked shots. The Seminoles blocked their ACC season-high of seven shots in their win over Louisville on December 10 and totaled six blocked shots against both Virginia (January 14) at home and against Miami (January 24) at home. Florida State is averaging 5.2 blocked shots (26 total blocked shots) in its last five games, as compared to averaging 3.8 blocked shots (61 total blocked shots) in the first 16 games of the season.

# FLORIDA STATE'S IMPROVED BENCH PLAY

Florida State is averaging 20.5 points from its bench players and outscored both Pitt (17-4) and Miami (24-12) from the bench in its last two games. The Seminoles' increased bench production marked the sixth time this season (Mercer, Virginia1, Louisville, Wake Forest, Pitt1, and Miami1) that their bench players had outscored their opponents' bench players. Florida State's bench players have outscored its opponents' bench player 41-16 and are shooting a combined .708 from the field (17 of 28) in the last two games. In the first four games of his career, freshman Baba Miller is shooting .563 from the field.

### FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON - THE LAST GAME

RayQuan Evans made the game-winning free throw with 14 seconds left to lead the Seminoles to an 81-80 win over Clemson on February 15, 2022, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Evans scored a career-high 28 points. Florida State was down 78-74 with 1:19 remaining when Nick Honor was called for his fourth foul of the game for Clemson. Evans made both free throws to cut the Seminoles' deficit to two, at 78-76. Clemson's PJ Hall was fouled and made bot of his free throws to put the Tigers up by four points at 80-76. Florida State then scored five consecutive unanswered points to win the game and gain their nation's-leading fifth one-point win of the season. After another set of made free throws by Evans, Florida State was down by two at 80-78 with 0:52 remaining. Evans tied the game on a jumper, and was fouled by Honor and marched back to the line with 0:14 to go. His shot from the line was good, and the Seminoles gained the win. Clemson's Alex Hemingway missed a contested look at a potential game-winning corner 3 that bounced off the back of the iron as time expired.

How Steph Curry, An Unorthodox Shooting Method Prepared FSU Men's Basketball Star Darin Green Jr. By Ehsan Kassim

Darin Green Jr. remembers loving basketball since he was young.

His father played college basketball at George Washington University, while his mom was a high school star. So the basketball gene runs rampant through him.

But how early Green showed his love for basketball surprised even his father, Darin Green Sr.

Green Sr. finished playing in a YMCA basketball game when his son was just 3 years old. He was about to experience his son's ability and love for the game.

"After one of my games, my wife put Darin down on the ground and he ran over to the bench," Green Sr. told the Democrat.

"And at three years old, you are still kind of clumsy. I rolled the basketball out to try to slow him down because he was running so fast. And unbeknownst to me, he actually picked the basketball up and started dribbling with his left hand and ran over to me.

"And I was like, 'Whoa, I didn't even know he could do it.' And from that day, on, all the way to the point where we got in the car until we got home, he literally slept with that basketball. The ball was probably bigger than he was. It was certainly bigger than his head."

Green Jr., who is coming off a 24-point performance in an upset road victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday, will look to push the Seminoles' (7-13, 5-4 ACC) win streak to a season-high three games when they square off against rival Miami (15-4, 6-3) at 7 p.m. Tuesday at Donald L. Tucker Civic Center.

The younger Green is in his first year with the Seminoles after transferring from UCF. He is averaging 14.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists. He is shooting 42% from 3-point range and 90% from the free throw line, all while averaging 34.1 minutes per game.

Part of the reason Green Jr. chose FSU as his destination is the hope to take his game to the next level and reach the NBA.

"(Head) coach (Leonard) Hamilton and (associate head) coach (Stan) Jones trust me, and they don't hold me back," Green Jr. told the Democrat. "I'm not saying UCF held me back, but I'm in a situation where this offensive system allows more.

"And then of course on the defensive end, we play 94 feet and pressure, everything. So, that allows me to show

# 3-point shooting first

Green Sr. played at George Washington from 1994-98. He averaged 3.1 points per game in 89 career games. The elder Green saw his playing career impacted by leg injuries. He was an athletic player who made his name with dunks and later developed a jump shot.

So for Green Sr., he wanted his son to develop his jump shot before anything else.

"That's why he taught me how to shoot first so early," Green Jr. said. "Because the athleticism will come as I grow. And then that your athleticism can be taken away from you, but my shot I have that for much longer."

The first lesson for shooting form came early and with an out-of-the-box idea.

A few days following Jr.'s birthday, a few helium balloons that went to the ceiling started losing air and fell to the ground. Green Sr. found an innovative game for him and his son to play.

"What I did was, I actually took one of those balloons and I used it as a basketball. I would shoot it to him right and do the motion so that he could see the arc and the follow through and wait for the balloon to come down, and he had to catch it. And he had to shoot it to me the same way," Green Sr. said.

"So that's how he worked on his form, which is pretty interesting. What is so funny is I never knew that that was

# Kicked out by father/coach

It wasn't always fun and games between father and son. Green Jr. will never argue with referees during a game, but that's due to a consequence of a mistake he made when he was 9 during an AAU game.

"My dad threw me out of the gym, in the middle of a game." Green Jr. said. "He literally kicked me out of the gym. I was talking back to a referee. He didn't like it. I remember I tried to say something back to one of the assistant coaches. He kicked me out and told me to go sit in the stands with my mom.

"He gave it to me young, so that way I know not to do it now. That's why I don't say much too much to the refs now."

Green Sr. said a couple of his players were complaining about calls from the refs during the first half, so he told them anyone who spoke back would be thrown out.

"And lo and behold, it's my son that comes out in the second half who had never done anything like this before," Green Sr. said. "I had to make the decision, right, like, I can't go back on that. So I said, 'No, not only do you go in the stands, you go up in the stands with mommy and then you go sit outside the car.'

"Needless to say my wife was pretty mad at me, but the good thing is he's never talked back to a referee ever. Ever since we can laugh at it now but he certainly wasn't laughing."

# **Meeting Steph Curry**

Following a move from North Carolina to Florida, Green Jr. fell behind in his grades in the sixth grade. Green Sr. came up with a motivational idea to get his son to perform better in the classroom.

Green Sr. worked with former NBA players Dell Curry and Muggsy Bogues at their summer basketball camps in Charlotte. He also coached a youth team, one which featured current NBA star, Stephen Curry.

That gave the father an incentive idea.

"I told him, 'Hey man if you do well, you start getting straight A's, I'll take you out to a game and we'll get you to go and actually meet Steph Curry since that's your favorite player," Green Sr. said. "And so he basically cashed in on it. So he went from making lower C's and B's to all A's."

The game turned out to be a Warriors game against the Miami Heat, featuring LeBron James and Dwyane Wade. Following the game, Green Jr. got a chance to talk to his favorite player.

"Every shooter could say that they learned from (Curry's) mechanics and shot, how quick he releases his footwork, getting into his shot from different areas on the court," Green Jr. said. "He's known as the greatest

Green Jr. took only one visit after he entered the transfer portal: Florida State.

"I tell this joke all the time, coach Ham, he didn't ask me to take a visit. He said, 'You are going to take a visit this weekend,'" Green Jr. said. "So I had no choice. So, I just came on my visit, and I liked what I saw."

On his visit, Hamilton and Green Jr. bonded over the fact both his mom and Hamilton came from the same city: Gastonia, N.C.

Tony's Ice Cream, a local favorite in Gastonia, was one of the common places both Hamilton and Green Jr. had frequented.

"My grandparents still live in Gastonia," Green Jr. said. "So, he and my grandfather actually met each other and they know some of the same people. It's just crazy."

Green Jr.'s maternal grandfather, Fred Smith, ran into Hamilton early in the season and the two had a chance to catch up.

"From the area we grew up in, it was kind of a tough area," Hamilton said. "Those experiences kind of make who you are. I enjoyed talking with his grandfather because we related so much to the same circumstances. I think a lot of that toughness and a lot of that grit that you had to exhibit to get through that era and that location it causes you to have a different mindset.

"That's the kind of mindset he has. He's a tough guy. He accepts challenges, he makes sacrifices. He's always

# **NBA** aspirations

Following the 2020 season, Green Jr. entered his name in the NBA draft to hear feedback about his chances to take the leap. He was coming off a season averaging 10.1 points per game on 41% 3-point shooting as a freshman with the Knights.

It was an opportunity to earn feedback from the league to see what his next steps needed to be.

"They wanted to see more passing and want to see my defensive ability and more creating for myself. They know I can shoot the ball well," Green Jr. said.

Outside of the comfortability factor, Green Jr. said getting to the NBA played a factor in his decision to come to Tallahassee.

Both father and son said two players Green Jr. has molded his game after are current NBA stars: the Washington Wizards' Bradley Beal and New Orleans Pelicans' CJ McCollum.

Green Jr. said he's putting his faith in the coaching staff, which has helped many players get to the league.

"(Coach Hamilton) is always saying we're trying to get somewhere we've never been," Green Jr. said. "But he's been there, we have just put it in his hands, and I feel like he can get me where I need to be."



# Game 11 -- Florida State 75, Louisville 53

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Caleb Mills scored a game-high 16 points on six made field goals to lead the Seminoles in a 75-53 victory over the Louisville Cardinals at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Matthew Cleveland pulled down eight rebounds and Naheem McLeod added a career-high six blocks as the Seminoles secured their first ACC win of the season. # Game 12 -- Florida State 80, USC Upstate 63

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Matthew Cleveland earned his fourth career double double with 16 points and 10 rebounds on seven made field goals to lead the Seminoles to an 80-63 victory over the USC Upstate Spartans at the Donald L. Tucker Center, Cleveland led five Seminoles in double figure scoring. Darin Green Jr. (15 points), Caleb Mills (13 points), Naheem McLeod (12 points), and Cam Corhen (10 points) to earn their second consecutive home win of the season. Cleveland gained his second double double of the season and fourth of his career against USC Upstate. It marked his fifth consecutive game scoring in double figures. # Game 13 -- St. John's 93, Florida State 79

SUNRISE, Fla. - Joel Soriano scored a team-high 23 points and pulled down 12 rebounds on six made field goals and 11 made free throws to lead St. John's to a 93-79 victory over Florida State in the Orange Bowl Classic at the FLA Live Arena. Soriano led four Red Storm players in double figure scoring — Dylan Addae-Wusu (20 points), David Jones (16 points), and Andre Curbelo (14 points) as St. John's won its eleventh game of the season. Junior Darin Green led Florida State with a career-high 30 points on a career-high and Orange Bowl Classic record eight made 3-point field goals. He became the first Seminole to score 30 points in a game since Terance Mann totaled 30 against Georgia Tech on January 24, 2018. His 8 3-point field goals are tied for the third most made in a single game by a Seminole. The last Seminole to make eight 3-point field goals in a game was Deividas Dulkys against North Carolina on January 14, 2012. The school record for 3-point field goals made in a single game is 10 by George McCloud against La Salle on February 23, 1989. Sophomore Matthew Cleveland scored his career-high of 23 points and totaled his career-high of 13 rebounds for his second consecutive, third double double of the season and fifth double double of his career. Cleveland totaled a career-high 12 defensive rebounds as he scored in double figures for the sixth consecutive game.

# Game 14 -- Florida State 73, Notre Dame 72

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Matthew Cleveland scored a teamhigh 19 points on six made field goals and four free throws, and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to a 73-72 victory over Notre Dame in the Donald L Tucker Center. The win upped the Seminoles record in conference play to 2-1. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring - Caleb Mills (18 points) and Cam Corhen (18 points) - as Florida State won for the third time in four games. Freshman Cam Corhen eclipsed his career high as he scored on a jumper with 11:39 remaining in the second half to give him 16 points. Corhen finished the game with 18 points while also adding seven rebounds. Cleveland totaled his 19 points on six of 10 shooting from the field and added 12 rebounds. Cleveland is the first Seminole since Corey Louis in 1995 to have three-straight double-doubles. This was Cleveland's fourth double-double of the season and sixth of this career. # Game 16 -- Florida State 75, Georgia Tech 64

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Matthew Cleveland earned his fifth consecutive double double of the season with 21 points and 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to its third ACC win of the season with a 75-64 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring with Darin Green Jr. (18 points) and Caleb Mills (13 points) with all three scoring 13 points or more. Florida State's victory against Georgia Tech marked Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's 600th career win, and 400th at Florida State. He is the active wins leader in the ACC, and only the fifth coach to win at least 400 games as an ACC head coach. # Game 20 -- Florida State 71, Pitt 64

PITTSBURGH, Pa. - Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 24 points on seven made field goals, five three pointers and five free throws to lead Florida State to a 71-64 victory over Pittsburgh at the Peterson Events Center. Green Jr led three Seminoles in double figure scoring; Green, Matthew Cleveland (11 points), and Caleb Mills (11 points) to improve the Seminoles' ACC record to 5-4. Green Jr. scored 24 points on 7-12 shooting from the field and shot 5-8 from the bonusphere. He was perfect from the free-throw line, making all five of his free-throw attempts. Green's success at the charity stripe helped propel the Seminoles to shooting over 73% from the line in today's game. Cleveland scored 11 points on 4-7 shooting from the field, but fell two rebounds short of securing his ninth consecutive double-double and matching Reggie Royal's streak during the 1970-71 season. Cleveland finished the game with 11 points and collected eight rebounds - all on the defensive end of the court. Both Mills and Cleveland finished the game with 11 points and four made field goals apiece. Mills' 11 points marked his tenth consecutive game scoring in double figures. Greg Elliot's early seven points on two-of-two 3-point field goals, helped Pitt jump out to an early 15-5 lead before a 17-2 run by the Seminoles fueled by Mills scoring eight points, and Green Jr scoring five to put the Seminoles ahead 22-17.

# Game 21 -- Miami 86, Florida State 63

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Miami's Nijel Pack scored a gamehigh 18 points on six made field goals and two free throws to lead No. 20 Miami to an 86-63 victory over Florida State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Pack led five Hurricanes in double figure scoring, Isaiah Wong (18 points), Wooga Poplar (14 points), Jordan Miller (12 points), and Norchad Omier (12 points) to improve Miami's ACC record to 7-3. Matthew Cleveland and Naheem McLeod led the Seminoles with seven points each in the first half, along with Darin Green Jr. pulling down three rebounds to lead Florida State into the intermission. Miami shot 9-14 (.643) from beyond the arc in the first half, making 20 of their 33 attempts from the field (.606) to include a 28-5 scoring run over six minutes. The Hurricanes made five of their last seven field goals to end the half with a 54-28 lead over Florida State. Caleb Mills was the Seminoles' top scorer against Miami with 12 points on four made field goals and three made free throws. Naheem McLeod scored in double digits, adding 11 points of his own on five out of five made field goals. Green Jr. and Cleveland led Florida State in rebounds, pulling down five each.
