FLORIDA STATE BACK TO TOBACCO ROAD TO FACE NC STATE AT PNC ARENA

Florida State, which has won five consecutive game against NC State, travels to play the Wolfpack at PNC Arena in Raleigh, N.C., on Wednesday at 9:00 p.m. The Seminoles' game against the Wolfpack is the only game between the two teams during the regular season. Florida State arrives in Raleigh having won two consecutive ACC road games with wins at both Notre Dame (January 17, 84-71) and Pittsburgh (January 21, 71-64). The Seminoles have won two of their last four overall games and six of their last 12 games since their 73-55 victory over Louisville on December 10 in Tallahassee. Following Wednesday's game against NC State, the Seminoles travel to play at Louisville (February 4, 2:00 p.m.) in the second meeting between the two teams. Florida State defeated the Cardinals, 73-55, in Tallahassee (December 10).

HAMILTON ON NAISMITH HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, is on the 2023 ballot for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

CLEVELAND'S DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAK REACHES 15 GAMES

All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland enters Wednesday's game against NC State having scored in double figures in a career-best 15 consecutive games. He's averaging 15.9 points scored per game since totaling 17 points against Nebraska on November 27 in the final game of the 2022 ESPN Events Invitational. Cleveland's double-figure scoring streak the longest by a Seminole since Dwayne Bacon scored in double figures in the first 26 games of the 2016-17 season. Bacon averaged 17.2 points in 35 games during the 2016-17 season and was a second round pick of the New Orleans Pelicans in the 2017 NBA Draft.

MILLS SURPASSES 100 MARK FOR CAREER 3-POINT SHOTS MADE

Junior Caleb Mills made four 3-point field goals on his way to scoring 15 points against Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee. He surpassed the 100-mark for career 3-point shots made in that game, and enters Wednesday's game at NC State with 103 career 3-point shots made.

MILLS ENTERS SATURDAY'S GAME WITH AN 11-GAME DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAK

Junior Caleb Mills, the Seminoles' third-leading scorer, enters Wednesday's game against NC State with a career-best 12-game double figure scoring streak which began with a 16-point performance in Florida State's victory over Louisville on December 10. He has scored 171 points and is averaging 14.3 points scored per game during the streak, with 19 points coming in the Seminoles' game at Wake Forest (January 11).

GREEN POISED TO MOVE INTO SINGLE-SEASON TOP-10 FOR 3-POINT SHOTS MADE

Darin Green Jr. enters Wednesday's game against NC State with 66 3-point shots made in his first season as a Seminole. He needs just six made 3-point field goals to move into Florida State's single-season top-10.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat NC State and win its third consecutive ACC road game. The Seminoles won their two most recent road games at Notre Dame (January 17) and at Pittsburgh (January 21) and are looking to win their third consecutive ACC road game for the first time since winning at Syracuse (February 5, 2019, 80-62), at Georgia Tech (February 16, 2019, 69-47) and at Clemson (February 19, 2019, 77-64) in consecutive ACC road games, and finishing with a 13-5 ACC record during the 2018-19 season;

...Defeat NC State and win its sixth consecutive game against the Wolfpack. The Seminoles have two winning streaks of five games against NC State (January 25, 1992 through February 17, 1993 and March 2, 2019 through March 5, 2022) that rank as Florida States' longest winning streaks in its series against NC State which dates back to the 1955-56 season.

FLORIDA STATE PLAYS WELL ON THE ROAD UNDER HAMILTON

Florida State has been one of the better road teams in the ACC in the last five seasons under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff. The Seminoles have won 20 of their last 41 ACC road games, with wins on 10 different ACC road courts. The Seminoles most recently won at both Notre Dame (January 17, 2023) and Pittsburgh (January 21, 2023) during the month of January.

FLORIDA STATE ON FIRE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE AGAINST CLEMSON

Led by four 3-point shots each made by Caleb Mills and Darin Green Jr., Florida State made a season-high 13 3-point field goals in its game against Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee. A total of six Seminoles (Mills, Green Jr., Matthew Cleveland, Baba Miller, and Chandler Jackson) made at least one shot from the bonusphere for the Seminoles. It marked the second time this season – also in the Seminoles' victory against Louisville on December 10 – that six Seminoles made at least one 3-point shot in a game. It marked the 12th time in school history the Seminoles made 13 or more 3-point shots in an ACC game and the most since the Seminoles also made 13 in a 93-64 win over Boston College on March 3, 2021. Florida State's school record for 3-point shots made in an ACC game is 17 during a 109-61 win over Clemson on February 5, 2017. The Seminoles made a school-record 20 3-points shots in a 95-55 win over Maine on December 8, 2007.

...Florida State enters Wednesday's game against NC State with 88 blocked shots (4.0 blocked shots per game) and has earned 25 blocked shots more than its opponents through the first 22 games of the 2022-23 season.

FLORIDA STATE STEALING

Florida State totaled seven steals against Clemson and has 18 steals in its last two games (9.0 steals per game). The Seminoles tied their season-high of 11 steals against Miami on January 24 in Tallahassee. Florida State's 11 steals against Miami marked the fourth time this season it has totaled in double figure steals in a single game. A season-high total of seven different Seminoles totaled steals (Jalen Warley, 3; Caleb Mills, 2; Matthew Cleveland, 2; Cam Corhen, 1; Darin Green Jr, 1; Baba Miller, 1; Chandler Jackson, 1) against Miami last Tuesday in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State shot .700 percent from the free throw line against Clemson on Saturday – the 13th time in its first 22 games of the season that the Seminoles have shot 70 percent or better from the line in a game. The Seminoles shot a season-high and were perfect from the free throw line against Virginia in Charlottesville (nine of nine, 1.000 percent) and were nearly perfect against Florida (14 of 15, .933 percent) and in their win over Notre Dame on December 21 (12 of 14, .857 percent).

FLORIDA STATE'S IMPROVED BENCH PLAY

Florida State is averaging 21.0 points from its bench players and outscored Pitt (17-4), Miami (24-12) and Clemson (22-11) from the bench in its last three games. The Seminoles' increased bench production marks seven times this season (Mercer, Virginia1, Louisville, Wake Forest, Pitt1, Miami1, Clemson1) that their bench players had outscored their opponents' bench players. Florida State's bench players have outscored its opponents' bench player 63-27 and are shooting a combined .610 from the field (25 of 41) in the last two games. In the first four games of his career, freshman Baba Miller is shooting .565 from the field.

Florida State scored its season-high of 84 points in its win at Notre Dame on January 17, and totaled 81 points against Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles are averaging 74.8 points scored per game in their last four games (299 total points) as compared to averaging 68.7 points per game (1237 total points) in their first 18 games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NC STATE – THE LAST GAME

Caleb Mills scored 19 points and Anthony Polite earned a double-double of 14 points and 10 rebounds to lead Florida State to an 89-76 win over NC State on Senior Day at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on March 5, 2022. Florida State never trailed as it closed out its regular season with a 10-10 mark in ACC play. Florida State scored the first four points of the game and never trailed. The game was tied on two different occasions (6-6 at the 16:17 mark of the first half and 8-8 at the 15:21 mark of the first half). A fast break lay-up by Florida State's Matthew Cleveland (11 points) at the 14:11 mark put the Seminoles ahead for good. The Seminoles led by as many as 17 with just under eight minutes to play in the game (73-56) as they did not surrender the lead in the second half. Mills, Polite, and Matthew Cleveland played against NC State after recent injuries and illnesses. Cleveland scored 11 points, had two blocked shots, and one steal.

.441 All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland is shooting .471 from the 3-point line (15 of 34) since December 10 against Louisville and is shooting a career-best .405 from the 3-point line.

.448 Junior Caleb Mills is shooting .448 from the 3-point line (13 of 29) in the last seven games. He made his season-high of four 3-point field goals and scored 15 points against Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee.

.722 Sophomore Jalen Warley is shooting .722 from the free throw line (13 of 18) in the last seven games. His total includes his career-high of eight free throws made on his career-high of 10 free throws attempted in Florida State's victory at Notre Dame (January 17).

.857 All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland is shooting .857 from the free throw line (six of seven) in the last three games, and enters Wednesday's game against NC State having made four consecutive free throws.

He also made three 3-point shots for 19 points in Florida State's win over Notre Dame on December 21 in Tallahassee. Cleveland has made at least one 3-point shot in each of the last seven games (nine of 23, .391 percent) and has made at least one 3-point shot in 11 of the last 12 games (15 of 34, .441 percent) since Florida State's victory over Louisville on December 10. Cleveland blocked his career-high of three shots in consecutive Florida State games against Virginia (January 14) and at Notre Dame (January 17).

WARLEY IN THE STARTING LINE-UP

Sophomore Jalen Warley enters Wednesday's game against NC State having started each of the Seminoles' last 12 games at the point guard position. He has already started more games this season (12) than he did in 31 games as a freshman (five).

WARLEY IMPROVING HIS ASSISTS TOTAL

Sophomore Jalen Warley, who has totaled six assists in his last two games including five against Miami on January 24, has more assists in 22 games this season (81 / 3.7 apg) than he did in 31 games as a freshman (78 / 2.0 apg). With the score tied at 56-56, Green scored four consecutive points to give Florida State a 60-56 lead. Green's first basket (on an assist from Caleb Mills) gave the Seminoles a two-point lead (58-56) while his second basket (on a second assist from Mills) gave the Seminoles a four-point lead (60-56). The Seminoles never relinquished the lead, and gained the 71-64 victory.

BABA MILLER AGAINST CLEMSON

Freshman Baba Miller played his career-high of 21 minutes, scored his career-high of 11 points and pulled down four rebounds against Clemson on Saturday -- the fifth appearance of his Florida State career. His 11 points marked the first time in his career that he scored in double figures. Miller's 21 minutes played marked the fourth time in five games that he played at least 16 minutes in a game.

IT'S PRONOUNCED SH-OLA ADD-DU-BEE-SEE

Junior Sola Adebisi earned playing time for the fourth time in his career as a Seminole and certainly made the most of his playing time against Clemson on Saturday. In his seven minutes of playing time, Adebisi totaled four points and two rebounds. On the plus/minus chart, Adebisi was a +12 -- the second best plus/minus rating in the game behind only Clemson's Chase Hunter who finished at +15. His first two points came at the 3:43 mark of the first half as he drew a foul against Chauncey Wiggins of Clemson. He then made his first two career free throws to close Florida State's deficit to eight at 30-22. He then grabbed his first career offensive rebound, went back up with the ball, and scored his first career field goal at the 2:37 mark to draw Florida State to within four at 31-27. From the time he was inserted into the game at the 5:14 mark of the first half and through the remainder of the first half -- Florida State went from a nine-point deficit (30-21) to a one-point advantage (34-33) at halftime.

...His eight 3-point shots made against St. John's on December 17, 2022 in the Orange Bowl Classic are tied for the third highest single-game total in school history;

How Steph Curry, An Unorthodox Shooting Method Prepared FSU Men's Basketball Star Darin Green Jr.

Darin Green Jr. remembers loving basketball since he was young.

His father played college basketball at George Washington University, while his mom was a high school star. So the basketball gene runs rampant through him.

But how early Green showed his love for basketball surprised even his father, Darin Green Sr.

Green Sr. finished playing in a YMCA basketball game when his son was just 3 years old. He was about to experience his son's ability and love for the game.

"After one of my games, my wife put Darin down on the ground and he ran over to the bench," Green Sr. told the Democrat.

"And at three years old, you are still kind of clumsy. I rolled the basketball out to try to slow him down because he was running so fast. And unbeknownst to me, he actually picked the basketball up and started dribbling with his left hand and ran over to me.

"And I was like, 'Whoa, I didn't even know he could do it.' And from that day, on, all the way to the point where we got in the car until we got home, he literally slept with that basketball. The ball was probably bigger than he was. It was certainly bigger than his head."

Green Jr., who is coming off a 24-point performance in an upset road victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday, will look to push the Seminoles' (7-13, 5-4 ACC) win streak to a season-high three games when they square off against rival Miami (15-4, 6-3) at 7 p.m. Tuesday at Donald L. Tucker Civic Center.

The younger Green is in his first year with the Seminoles after transferring from UCF. He is averaging 14.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists. He is shooting 42% from 3-point range and 90% from the free throw line, all while averaging 34.1 minutes per game.

Part of the reason Green Jr. chose FSU as his destination is the hope to take his game to the next level and reach the NBA.

"(Head) coach (Leonard) Hamilton and (associate head) coach (Stan) Jones trust me, and they don't hold me back," Green Jr. told the Democrat. "I'm not saying UCF held me back, but I'm in a situation where this offensive system allows more.

"And then of course on the defensive end, we play 94 feet and pressure, everything. So, that allows me to show

3-point shooting first

Green Sr. played at George Washington from 1994-98. He averaged 3.1 points per game in 89 career games. The elder Green saw his playing career impacted by leg injuries. He was an athletic player who made his name with dunks and later developed a jump shot.

So for Green Sr., he wanted his son to develop his jump shot before anything else.

"That's why he taught me how to shoot first so early," Green Jr. said. "Because the athleticism will come as I grow. And then that your athleticism can be taken away from you, but my shot I have that for much longer."

The first lesson for shooting form came early and with an out-of-the-box idea.

A few days following Jr.'s birthday, a few helium balloons that went to the ceiling started losing air and fell to the ground. Green Sr. found an innovative game for him and his son to play.

"What I did was, I actually took one of those balloons and I used it as a basketball. I would shoot it to him right and do the motion so that he could see the arc and the follow through and wait for the balloon to come down, and he had to catch it. And he had to shoot it to me the same way," Green Sr. said.

"So that's how he worked on his form, which is pretty interesting. What is so funny is I never knew that that was

Kicked out by father/coach

It wasn't always fun and games between father and son. Green Jr. will never argue with referees during a game, but that's due to a consequence of a mistake he made when he was 9 during an AAU game.

"My dad threw me out of the gym, in the middle of a game." Green Jr. said. "He literally kicked me out of the gym. I was talking back to a referee. He didn't like it. I remember I tried to say something back to one of the assistant coaches. He kicked me out and told me to go sit in the stands with my mom.

"He gave it to me young, so that way I know not to do it now. That's why I don't say much too much to the refs now."

Green Sr. said a couple of his players were complaining about calls from the refs during the first half, so he told them anyone who spoke back would be thrown out.

"And lo and behold, it's my son that comes out in the second half who had never done anything like this before," Green Sr. said. "I had to make the decision, right, like, I can't go back on that. So I said, 'No, not only do you go in the stands, you go up in the stands with mommy and then you go sit outside the car.'

"Needless to say my wife was pretty mad at me, but the good thing is he's never talked back to a referee ever. Ever since we can laugh at it now but he certainly wasn't laughing."

The call in question was a blocking foul call on Green Jr. He however felt he was in a good position to pick up a

Meeting Steph Curry

Following a move from North Carolina to Florida, Green Jr. fell behind in his grades in the sixth grade. Green Sr. came up with a motivational idea to get his son to perform better in the classroom.

Green Sr. worked with former NBA players Dell Curry and Muggsy Bogues at their summer basketball camps in Charlotte. He also coached a youth team, one which featured current NBA star, Stephen Curry.

That gave the father an incentive idea.

"I told him, 'Hey man if you do well, you start getting straight A's, I'll take you out to a game and we'll get you to go and actually meet Steph Curry since that's your favorite player,'" Green Sr. said. "And so he basically cashed in on it. So he went from making lower C's and B's to all A's."

The game turned out to be a Warriors game against the Miami Heat, featuring LeBron James and Dwyane Wade. Following the game, Green Jr. got a chance to talk to his favorite player.

"Every shooter could say that they learned from (Curry's) mechanics and shot, how quick he releases his footwork, getting into his shot from different areas on the court," Green Jr. said. "He's known as the greatest

Tony's Ice Cream

Green Jr. took only one visit after he entered the transfer portal: Florida State.

"I tell this joke all the time, coach Ham, he didn't ask me to take a visit. He said, 'You are going to take a visit this weekend,'" Green Jr. said. "So I had no choice. So, I just came on my visit, and I liked what I saw."

On his visit, Hamilton and Green Jr. bonded over the fact both his mom and Hamilton came from the same city: Gastonia, N.C.

Tony's Ice Cream, a local favorite in Gastonia, was one of the common places both Hamilton and Green Jr. had frequented.

"My grandparents still live in Gastonia," Green Jr. said. "So, he and my grandfather actually met each other and they know some of the same people. It's just crazy."

Green Jr.'s maternal grandfather, Fred Smith, ran into Hamilton early in the season and the two had a chance to catch up.

"From the area we grew up in, it was kind of a tough area," Hamilton said. "Those experiences kind of make who you are. I enjoyed talking with his grandfather because we related so much to the same circumstances. I think a lot of that toughness and a lot of that grit that you had to exhibit to get through that era and that location it causes you to have a different mindset.

"That's the kind of mindset he has. He's a tough guy. He accepts challenges, he makes sacrifices. He's always

NBA aspirations

Following the 2020 season, Green Jr. entered his name in the NBA draft to hear feedback about his chances to take the leap. He was coming off a season averaging 10.1 points per game on 41% 3-point shooting as a freshman with the Knights.

It was an opportunity to earn feedback from the league to see what his next steps needed to be.

"They wanted to see more passing and want to see my defensive ability and more creating for myself. They know I can shoot the ball well," Green Jr. said.

Outside of the comfortability factor, Green Jr. said getting to the NBA played a factor in his decision to come to Tallahassee.

Both father and son said two players Green Jr. has molded his game after are current NBA stars: the Washington Wizards' Bradley Beal and New Orleans Pelicans' CJ McCollum.

Green Jr. said he's putting his faith in the coaching staff, which has helped many players get to the league.

"(Coach Hamilton) is always saying we're trying to get somewhere we've never been," Green Jr. said. "But he's been there, we have just put it in his hands, and I feel like he can get me where I need to be."

NOTRE DAME, Ind. — Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 20 points on six made field goals, four 3-pointers, and four free throws to lead Florida State to an 84-71 victory over Notre Dame at the Joyce Center. Green Jr. led five Seminoles in double figure scoring, Green, Jalen Warley (17 points), Matthew Cleveland (14 points), Caleb Mills (11 points), and Cameron Corhen (10 points) to improve Florida State's ACC record to 4-4. Matthew Cleveland secured his eighth consecutive double double against Notre Dame with 14 points and a career-high 16 rebounds. The last Seminole to reach the milestone was Reggie Royals who finished the 1970-71 season with nine consecutive double doubles. Cleveland will have the chance to join Royals in Saturday afternoon's game against Pittsburgh.
