FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT NOTRE DAME ON TUESDAY AT 7:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has won five of its last six games against Notre Dame, travels to play the Fighting Irish at the Joyce Center at Purcell Pavilion on Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at the Joyce Center at Purcell Pavilion in Notre Dame, Ind. It's the second meeting of the season between the Seminoles and the fighting Irish, as the Florida State took a 73-72 win at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on December 21, 2022, for its second ACC win of the season. Florida State's most recent win on the road against Notre Dame came on March 4, 2020, as it took home a 73-71 win at the Joyce Center. The Seminoles' game against Notre Dame, is their first of two consecutive ACC road games, as they travel to play at Pittsburgh on Saturday, January 21, 2023 at 3:00 p.m. The Seminoles next home game comes against Miami on January 24 at 7:00 p.m.

SEMINOLES' CLEVELAND PLAYING FOR EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE DOUBLE DOUBLE AT NOTRE DAME

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland enters Tuesday's game against Notre Dame looking to secure his eighth consecutive double double in points and rebounds. He has totaled consecutive double doubles against USC Upstate (December 13), St. John's (December 17), Notre Dame (December 21), at Duke (December 31), against Georgia Tech (January 7), at Wake Forest (January 11) and against Virginia. His current streak of double doubles has come against teams from three different conferences (ACC, Big East and Big South) and against one nationally ranked team (No. 12/13 Virginia) with four coming at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center, one coming in Cameron Indoor Stadium, one coming in the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum and one coming in the FLA Live Arena in Sunrise. The FLA Live Arena is the home of the Orange Bowl Basketball Classic and the Florida Panthers of the NHL. Cleveland is currently chasing Reggie Royals – the last Seminole to earn eight consecutive double doubles during the 1970-71 season. Royals finished the 1970-71 season with nine consecutive double doubles and totaled 23 double doubles that season. The school record for double doubles in a single season is 24 by Dave Cowens during the 1968-69 season.

HAMILTON REACHES 600 CAREER VICTORY PLATEAU; ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT FOR 2023

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton won his 600th career game as he directed his Seminoles to their 75-64 win over Georgia Tech on January 7. In addition to the victory being his 600th overall coaching win, the win was his 400th at Florida State making him only the fifth coach in ACC history to win 400 games as an ACC coach. Hamilton is one of just 17 active collegiate coaches with at least 600 career victories. As Hamilton continues to cement his legacy as one of the nation's top coaches, mentors and teachers in life and basketball, he is on the ballot for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland is on the Julius Erving Watch List as the nation's top collegiate small forward as named by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. It marks the second consecutive season Cleveland has been named to the initial watch list for the prestigious Julius Erving Award. Cleveland is one of three players from the ACC named to the Julius Erving Watch List. He is joined on the list by Dariq Whitehead of Duke and Leaky Black of North Carolina. The award is named for Julius Erving, who attended the University of Massachusetts (1969-71).

The Seminoles win both games of the home-and-home series against the Fighting Irish during the 2020 season with wins in Tallahassee (Jan. 25, 2020, 85-84) and in Notre Dame (March 4, 2020, 73-71;

FLORIDA STATE ON THE BLOCKS

Three members of Florida State's starting five (Matthew Cleveland, 3; Caleb Mills, 2; Darin Green, 1) totaled all six of Florida State's blocked shots against Virginia on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles have blocked 10 shots in the last two games (5.0 bpg) and enter Tuesday's game against Notre Dame averaging 3.6 blocks per game. Florida State blocked its ACC season-high of seven shots in its victory over Louisville (December 10), totaled six against Virginia on January 14 and four each against Wake Forest (January 11) and Virginia (December 3). Florida State blocked its season-high of 11 shots in its victory over Mercer on November 21.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO BE CAREFUL WITH THE BASKETBALL

Florida State committed nine turnovers against Virginia on Saturday as the continued to keep the turnover margin to a minimum. It marked the seventh time in 18 games this season that Florida State committed nine or fewer turnovers in a game, with its season low of five turnovers coming in its victory over Notre Dame on December 21 in Tallahassee.

THE MINUTES PLAYED CHART UNDER HAMILTON

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is not at all accustomed to his players playing as many minutes as they have been asked to this season. With two Seminoles (Darin Green, Jr. and Matthew Cleveland) averaging more than 33.0 minutes played per game, it marks just the third time in Hamilton's 21 seasons at Florida State, that multiple Seminoles are averaging 30 minutes or more played per game for a full season. In addition to Green Jr and Cleveland averaging over 33 minutes played per game, Caleb Mills i averaging 29.3 minutes played per game and Jalen Warley 27.6 minutes played per game. Hamilton asked Seminole great Trent Forrest what he felt the optimum number of minutes a player could play each game, and play well in the Florida State system, at the end of his All-ACC career – Forrest replied in the 23-24 minute range.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO SHOOT WELL FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Led by a perfect six of six free throw shooting percentage by junior Caleb Mills against Virginia on Saturday, Florida State shot .786 from the line (11 of 14). It marked the seventh time this season the Seminoles shot 78 percent or better from the line in a single game. In their two games against the Cavaliers this season, the Seminoles shot an outstanding .870 from the line (20 of 23). In its victory over Notre Dame on December 21, Florida State was a near perfect 12 of 14 from the free throw line, including a perfect six of six in the first half. The Seminoles made six more free throws in the second half in outscoring the Fighting Irish, 35-33 to gain the win.

SEMINOLES OUTREBOUND VIRGINIA FOR THE SECOND TIME THIS SEASON

Florida State held 33-32 rebounding edge against Virginia on Saturday in Tallahassee – the second time the Seminoles outrebounded the Cavaliers this season. The Seminoles outrebounded the Cavalier in Charlottesville on December 3 by a 40-38 margin. Florida State enters its game against Notre Dame on Tuesday night having outrebounded six of its first seven ACC opponents and having a +2.1 rebounding margin in ACC play. Florida State outrebounded the Fighting Irish by a 29-28 margin in its win in Tallahassee earlier this season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NOTRE DAME – THE LAST GAME

Matthew Cleveland scored a team-high 19 points on six made field goals and four free throws, and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to a 73-72 victory over Notre Dame on December 21, 2022 in the Donald L Tucker Center. The win upped the Seminoles record in conference play to 2-1. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring — Caleb Mills (18 points) and Cam Corhen (18 points) — as Florida State won for the third time in four games. Corhen eclipsed his career high as he scored on a jumper with 11:39 remaining in the second half to give him 16 points. Corhen finished the game with 18 points while also adding seven rebounds. Cleveland totaled his 19 points on six of 10 shooting from the field, 12 rebounds. Cleveland is the first Seminole since Corey Louis in 1995 to have three-straight double-doubles. This was Cleveland's fourth double-double of the season and sixth of this career. Cleveland scored in double figures for the seventh straight game. Caleb Mills scored 18 points on six of 13 shooting from the field, with four free throws. Mill's perfect night from the charity stripe (four for four) further improved his Florida State record free throw percentage.

.973 Under Leonard Hamilton, 73 of 75 four-year players (.973 percent) have earned their degrees from Florida State. Caleb Mills is the most recent degree recipient; he earned his degree in July of 2022.

1.6 Darin Green Jr. has five steals in the last three games, including his season-high of three against Wake Forest, and averages 1.6 steals per game in that stretch of three games.

2 Sophomore Matthew Cleveland is two rebounds shy of having earned nine consecutive double doubles. After totaling 11 points and 10 rebounds at Virginia on December 3, Cleveland totaled 12 points and eight rebounds in the Seminoles' victory over Louisville on December 10. Beginning with Florida State's victory over USC Upstate on December 13, he has reeled off seven consecutive double double performances.

10 Junior Caleb Mills is a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line in the last two games. He was a perfect four of four against Wake Forest and a perfect six of six against Virginia.

10.1 Freshman Cam Corhen is averaging 10.1 points (81 total points scored) in the last eight games – since a 15 point total in Florida State's victory over Louisville on December 10.

17 Junior Caleb Mills has made 17 consecutive free throw shots entering Tuesday's game against Notre Dame. He has not missed from the free throw line since the first half of Florida State's game against Duke on December 31.

17 Darin Green Jr. has made at least one 3-point field goal in 17 of Florida State's 18 games this season and enters Tuesday's game against Notre Dame shooting .403 from the bonusphere.

32 Sophomore Matthew Cleveland has scored in double figures in 32 of his 47 career games.

79 Junior Caleb Mills has played in 79 career games – 35 at the University of Houston and 34 at Florida State.

100 Darin Green Jr. played in his 100th career game against Virginia.

CLEVELAND HAS SCORED IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN 11 CONSECUTIVE GAMES

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland has scored in double figures in a career-high 11 consecutive games entering Tuesday's game against Notre Dame. His streak began with a 17-point performance against Nebraska on November 27, 2022 in the final game of the ESPN Events Invitational in Orlando. Cleveland has totaled 186 points in his last 11 games of a 16.9 points per game scoring average. He enters Tuesday's game against Notre Dame averaging a career-high 14.7 points scored per game.

CLEVELAND IN THE LAST NINE GAMES

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland enters Tuesday's game against Notre Dame averaging a double double of 14.9 points and 10.7 rebounds in the last nine games. He is two rebound shy of nine consecutive doubles as he totaled 12 points and eight rebounds in Florida State's victory over Louisville on December 10 – the last time he pulled down less than 10 rebounds in a single game.

CLEVELAND'S REBOUNDING NUMBERS

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland averaged 5.1 rebounds in the Seminoles' first 10 games of the season. Cam'Ron Fletcher averaged a team leading 7.5 rebounds per game in the first 10 games of the 2022-23 season. When Fletcher was lost for the season with a knee injury with 14 seconds remaining in the Seminoles' game against Virginia on December 3, 2022, Cleveland has become Florida State's rebounding leader. In the 10 games (and 14 seconds) since Fletcher was lost to Florida State for the season, Cleveland has averaged 10.8 rebounds per game (87 rebounds in eight games) and enters Tuesday's game against Notre Dame averaging a team-leading and career-high 7.7 rebounds per game.

CLEVELAND ON THE BLOCKS

Matthew Cleveland, who played his career-high of 40 minutes against Virginia on Saturday in Tallahassee, was Florida State's leader against the Cavaliers with a career-high three blocked shots. He now has nine blocked shots in the first 18 games of the 2022-23 season, after totaling 10 blocked shots in 29 games as a freshman at Florida State.

MILLER MAKES HIS DEBUT AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Acclaimed freshman Baba Miller made his Florida State debut as he scored four points and totaled four rebounds in Florida State's game at Wake Forest on Wednesday night. He was the first Seminole substituted into the game at the 16:07 mark of the first half. He played a total of 17 minutes – nine in the first half and eight in the second half. Miller played a total of 2:21 on his initial substitution into the game.

CORHEN IN DOUBLES FIGURE SCORING FOR THE SIXTH TIME

Freshman Cam Corhen totaled 15 points against Virginia on Saturday, marking the sixth time his has scored in double figures. He scored his career-high of 18 points as a starter in Florida State's 73-72 victory over Notre Dame on December 21, and has scored in double figures in three ACC games – 18 against the Fighting Irish, 15 against Louisville and 15 against Virginia.

CAM CORHEN IN THE LAST FIVE GAMES

Freshman Cam Corhen is averaging 10.8 points (54 total points) while shooting .618 from the field (21 of 34) and .900 from the free throw line (nine of 10) in the last five games. He has scored in double figures twice – his career-high of 18 points against Notre Dame and 15 points against Virginia on January 14.

WARLEY'S IMPROVED ACC ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO

Sophomore Jalen Warley has started each of the Seminoles' last eight games (all seven ACC games) and has an assist:turnover ratio of nearly 3.5:1 per game. He totaled his career-high of seven assists in Florida State's game against Virginia on Saturday, and has earned at least five assists in three of his last four games. Warley's recent numbers are very much like the numbers Randolph Childress put up when he played at Wake Forest.

With his three 3-point shots made against Virginia on Saturday, Darin Green Jr. has hit the 260 mark for career 3-point shots made. He is currently averaging 2.9 made 3-point field goals per game in his first season as a Seminole -- just above his career average of 2.6 3-point field goals made in his 10-game career. His career-high eight 3-point field goals made against St. John's on December 17 is tied for the third-highest single game total in school history, while his seven made 3-point shots against Troy on November 14 is tied for the sixth-highest single game total in school history.

FSU Men's Basketball: Matthew Cleveland Showing Confidence In Latest Surge

When Matthew Cleveland is not on the hardwood, the Florida State men's basketball star likes to play chess.

Even when traveling to road games, Cleveland will sometimes bring his own chessboard with him on the Seminoles' plane and challenge teammates.

"Just constantly thinking," said Cleveland on what he enjoys about chess. "One move could affect the rest of the game, and it could be the first move in the game. So constantly thinking ahead, that helps a lot with real-life situations."

So much of what fascinates Cleveland tends to be related to the mind. It is why he majors in criminology and wants to be a child psychologist or FBI agent. It is why he enjoys watching YouTube videos from critical thinkers like astrophysicist Neil deGrasse Tyson.

And it is why his recent surge can be mostly attributed to his burgeoning confidence and overall mentality.

"Toughness is a talent. Playing hard is a talent. You have to work as hard in those areas as you do with shooting free throws and shooting a jump shot. Matthew has that," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"He is a competitive youngster. He rises to the occasion. And you never have to be concerned about whether or not he is giving you complete effort to exhaustion."

Compared to last season, the 6-foot-7, 200-pound Cleveland now looks like a much different player offensively. As a true freshman, Cleveland shined and earned ACC Sixth Man of the Year honors. But his shooting struggles and tentativeness at times clearly held him back. He went just 6 of 34 (17.6%) from 3-point range and 61 of 110 (55.6%) from the free throw line.

Through 15 games this season, though, Cleveland has shown significant improvement as a shooter. He is 8 of 19 (42.1%) from beyond the arc and 50 of 66 (75.8%) from the free throw line while leading the Seminoles with 14 points per game and 6.9 rebounds per game.

"I definitely feel like I have earned some respect," Cleveland said. "The way I have been getting guarded recently is completely different to the way I was getting guarded last year. So it has added a dimension to my game that I can use if they are going to press really far up."

To start the season, Cleveland needed to adjust to assuming more responsibilities while FSU had multiple players unavailable.

But in the Seminoles' last eight games, Cleveland has finally taken his game to another level. He has averaged 17 points and 9.4 rebounds during that span, shooting 48% from the field, 50% from 3-point range and 83.8% from the free throw line while being a double-double machine.

Cleveland will look to record his fifth straight double-double when FSU (4-11, 2-2 ACC) hosts Georgia Tech (8-6, 1-3) at 1 p.m. Saturday in the Donald L. Tucker Civic Center (TV: Bally Sports Sun).

Not since Douglas Edwards in the 1991-92 season has a Seminole player tallied five consecutive double-doubles.

"He has a lot more confidence," Hamilton said. "He is not hesitant with his ability to shoot a jump shot when he is down. He shot an airball from the free throw line the last time we played Duke up there. And now he is shooting about 40% from three.

"But that is because of his focus and determination. His toughness, mentally and physically, that is who he is. You can expect him to get better and better."

'I have a lot of confidence in my shot now'

Cleveland knew he needed a change.

Because of his shooting woes, Cleveland looked hesitant at times when he was outside of the paint last season. He also never shot more than three 3-pointers in a game and only averaged 1.2 attempts per game from beyond the arc.

"I always wanted to take the good, safe shots, like if they were wide, wide open," Cleveland said. "As people told me, you are not going to get a wide, wide open shot in college basketball."

FSU associate head coach Stan Jones identified a solution, suggesting to Cleveland that he should tweak his shooting form. How Cleveland placed his off-hand on the ball, he explained, tended to mess up his shot.

So Cleveland spent all offseason perfecting a new way to shoot, placing his off-hand on more of the side of the basketball.

"Three times a day, I would come in and really work on it from up close (to the basket)," Cleveland said. "For like a month, I didn't really shoot a jump shot until I felt really comfortable with how it felt and until it became muscle memory.

"I have a lot of confidence in my shot now, so it has really helped a lot."

It took time before Cleveland seemed confident about his new form in a game setting.

In the Seminoles' exhibition against Newberry College, Cleveland went scoreless on 0 of 9 shooting across 31 minutes. He then scored five points or fewer in three of his first seven games this season, shooting 41.5% (27 of 65) from the field, 16.7% (1 of 6) from 3-point range and 65.5% (19 of 29) from the free throw line during that stretch. Now, Cleveland has clearly put his shooting struggles behind him.

"I would say USC Upstate (on Dec. 13)," said Cleveland on the turning point for him. "The one I hit in the right corner, the dude was really closing out. I did not hesitate to shoot it, but I shot it. I was like, I would not have shot this last year at all."

Rebounding machine

As a new player for the AAU team Georgia Xclusive, an eighth-grade Cleveland learned the importance of rebounding.

Cleveland remembers the team having a surplus of talented, experienced guards. So even though Cleveland stood 6-1 and had yet to hit his six-inch growth spurt, he pushed his way to securing a featured role at power forward and center.

"When I was younger and shorter, I was not always the best player," Cleveland said. "So I had to find a way to get myself involved in the game, and offensive rebounding was the way to do it. So I definitely feel like that has been something that I have been good at for a long time."

With leading rebounder Cam'Ron Fletcher (season-ending injury) and fellow forwards Jaylan Gainey (season-ending injury) and Baba Miller (16-game suspension) unavailable, the Seminoles badly needed better production on the boards.

Since Fletcher went down with his injury at Virginia on Dec. 3, Cleveland has led FSU in rebounding in six straight games. He has recorded double-digit rebounds in four straight games and five of his last six.

"I would definitely say there is an art to it," said Cleveland on rebounding. "You can see by the trajectory of the shot if it is going to bounce long or bounce short. So just playing with that in my mind and also trying to be the first one off the floor to get the rebound."

Cleveland facing his favorite childhood team

As the son of two Georgia Tech alums, Cleveland grew up rooting for the Yellow Jackets.

FSU played Georgia Tech once last season, falling 75-61 on the road. Cleveland tallied five points on 2 of 10 shooting while adding seven rebounds and three assists.

"Last year, it was surreal playing at Georgia Tech," Cleveland said. "It's definitely the game I mark on my calendar, being a diehard Georgia Tech fan growing up. It is very cool to play against them."

After the Seminoles play the Yellow Jackets, Miller will be able to make his long-awaited return from suspension at Wake Forest next Wednesday.

Barring a miracle in the ACC Tournament, FSU is in too deep of a hole to earn an NCAA Tournament appearance. But with Cleveland playing well and Miller coming back soon, the Seminoles have to feel more optimistic about how the second half of their season will play out.

"Like one-game national championships," said Cleveland on how he wants to approach the rest of the season. "We know we can't get everything that we lost from the beginning of the season back in one game."

"So if we take it game by game, do our work game by game and treat it like it is our last game of the season, then by the end of the year, we will be in a completely different position than we are now."

Hildreth led four Demon Deacons in double figure scoring – Hildreth, Damari Monsanto (22 points), Andrew Carr (22 points), and Tyree Appleby (16 points) to improve Wake Forest's ACC record to 4-2. Florida State is now 3-3 in ACC play. Matthew Cleveland scored 19 points and 12 rebounds to earn his sixth

consecutive double double, a Seminole milestone that was last achieved by Greg Grady during the 1974-75 season. Cleveland made Florida State Men's Basketball history by becoming the first Seminole to have a double double in four consecutive ACC games. Caleb Mills passed the coveted 1,000 point mark in his collegiate career in Wednesday night's game, scoring 19 points on three 3-pointers, six field goals, and four for four free throws. Six of the 19 points were scored in less than a minute, allowing Florida State a 6-0 scoring run over the Demon Deacons in the closing minutes of the game. Freshman Baba Miller made his long-awaited Seminole debut against the Deacons. He totaled four points and four rebounds in 17 minutes of playing time.
