FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO TOBACCO ROAD TO FACE WAKE FOREST IN WINSTON-SALEM

Florida State, which has won four of its last six games, travels to play Wake Forest on Wednesday January 11, 2023 in the only meeting of the season between the Seminoles and the Deacons. The game is set for a 9:00 p.m. tip on the ACC Network. Florida State has won nine of its last 11 games against the Deacons, including a stretch of nine consecutive victories from February 26, 2013 through February 13, 2021 – a streak that included four wins at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum. The Seminoles defeated Georgia Tech on January 7 in Tallahassee to open 2023 with an ACC victory and begin play Wednesday with a 3-2 mark in ACC play. Following Wednesday's game against Wake Forest, the Seminoles return to Tallahassee for their second game of the season against Virginia on Saturday, January 14 at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

HAMILTON REACHES 600 CAREER VICTORY PLATEAU; ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT FOR 2023

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton won his 600th career game as he directed his Seminoles to their 75-64 win over Georgia Tech on Saturday. In addition to the victory being his 600th overall coaching win, the win was his 400th at Florida State making him only the fifth coach in ACC history to win 400 games as an ACC coach. Hamilton is one of just 17 active collegiate coaches with at least 600 career victories. As Hamilton continues to cement his legacy as one of the nation's top coaches, mentors and teachers in life and basketball, he is on the ballot for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

CLEVELAND PLAYS FOR SIXTH CONSECUTIVE DOUBLE DOUBLE AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland, who has earned a personal-best five consecutive double doubles, enters Wednesday's game at Wake Forest looking to earn his sixth consecutive double double. He is the first Seminole to earn five consecutive double doubles since Douglas Edwards during the 1991-92 season. Cleveland is looking to become the first Seminole since Greg Grady during the 1974-75 season (against Eastern Kentucky, Wisconsin Milwaukee, Biscayne, South Florida, Hofstra and Biscayne) to earn six consecutive double doubles as Florida State plays Wake Forest on Wednesday night. Cleveland also enters Wednesday's game looking to become the first Seminole with double doubles in four consecutive ACC games.

MILLS APPROACHES COVETED 1,000 POINT MARK

Junior Caleb Mills enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest with 984 career points and needs only 16 points to score his 1,000th career point. He scored 448 points in his first two seasons and 35 games at the University of Houston (2019-20, 2020-21) and has scored 536 points in his two seasons and 42 games as a Seminole. Mills averages 12.8 points scored in his 77-game career with his career-high of 27 points coming against Tulsa (February 19, 2020 while at Houston) and against Louisville (January 8, 2022 while at Florida State).

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland is on the Julius Erving Watch List as the nation's top collegiate small forward as named by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. It marks the second consecutive season Cleveland has been named to the initial watch list for the prestigious Julius Erving Award. Cleveland is one of three players from the ACC named to the Julius Erving Watch List. He is joined on the list by Dariq Whitehead of Duke and Leaky Black of North Carolina. The award is named for Julius Erving, who attended the University of Massachusetts (1969-71). He averaged 26.3 points and 20.2 rebounds per game, making him one of only six NCAA men's basketball players to average more than 20 points and 20 rebounds per game during his career.

SEMINOLES TOTAL 23 ASSISTS ON 30 BASKETS IN VICTORY OVER GEORGIA TECH

Led by junior Caleb Mills’ near career-high of seven assists, Florida State totaled a season-high 23 assists (on 30 baskets) in its victory over Georgia Tech on Saturday in Tallahassee. The school record by an individual player in an ACC game is 13 by Delvon Arrington against Georgia Tech on January 9, 1999, while the team record for assists in an ACC game is 26 in three different games (against NC State, January 15, 1995; against Clemson on February 5, 2017, and against Boston College on February 20, 2017. The all-time Florida State record for assists in a single game is 36 against Baptist College on January 14, 1976. Baptist College is now known as Charleston Southern.

FLORIDA STATE SCORCHES THE NETS FOR 10 3-POINT FIELD GOALS IN WIN OVER GEORGIA TECH

Led by four 3-point field goals made by Darin Green Jr, the Seminoles made 10 3-point shots in their victory over Georgia Tech on Saturday. It marked the second time this season the Seminoles made 10 or more 3-point shots this season. Florida State’s season-high for 3-point field goals made in a game is 11 against St. John’s in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 17 in Sunrise, Fla.

SEMINOLES REACH 100 STEALS MARK FOR THE SEASON

Led by two steals each by Darin Green Jr. and Matthew Cleveland, the Seminoles earned five steals against Georgia Tech, and reached the 100 steals plateau for the 45th consecutive season. The Seminoles have earned at least 150 steals in each season since the 1977-78 season when they totaled 276 steals as a team. Florida State has earned at least five steals in 13 of its first 16 games during the 2022-23 season.

THE MINUTES PLAYED CHART UNDER HAMILTON

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is not at all accustomed to his players playing as many minutes as they have been asked to this season. With two Seminoles (Darin Green, Jr. and Matthew Cleveland) averaging more than 33.0 minutes played per game, it marks just the third time in Hamilton’s 21 seasons at Florida State, that multiple Seminoles are averaging 30 minutes or more played per game for a full season. Hamilton asked Seminole great Trent Forrest what he felt the optimum number of minutes a player could play each game, and play well in the Florida State system, at the end of his All-ACC career – Forrest replied in the 23-24 minute range.

FLORIDA STATE VS. WAKE FOREST – THE LAST GAME

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto scored a career-high 13 points and pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds to secure his first-ever double-double as the Seminoles fell to Wake Forest 68-60 on February 5, 2022 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State played the game without starters Naheem McLeod, Malik Osborne and Anthony Polite who were averaging a combined 24.2 points and 14.5 rebounds. Jake LaRavia had a near triple-double, Alondes Williams scored 23 points, Damari Monsanto hit a clutch 3-pointer, and the Deacons held on to gain their fourth ACC road win of the season. LaRavia had 18 points, 13 rebounds and nine assists, missing out on a triple-double by one assist. Isaiah Mucius added 10 points for Wake Forest. After falling behind by 11 with 11:58 remaining to be played in the second half, a 3-pointer by Caleb Mills drew Florida State within 57-56 with 3:51 remaining. Mucius struck back with a 3-pointer to give the Demon Deacons a 60-56 lead. Cam'Ron Fletcher's layup kept Florida State within at 64-60 with 53 seconds remaining before Monsanto's clutch 3-pointer.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.438 Darin Green Jr. is shooting .438 from the 3-point line in the last eight games (28 of 64) and averaging 3.5 3-point field goals made per game since making four against Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on November 30 in Tallahassee.

.833 Freshman Cam Corhen is shooting .833 from the free throw line (20 of 24) in his last 10 games. He began his current streak with a two of two performance from the free throw line against Nebraska on November 27, 2022.

.840 Junior Caleb Mills enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest as Florida State's all-time leader in the free throw percentage category. He is shooting .840 from the free throw line (110 of 131) during his two seasons at Florida State.

.973 Under Leonard Hamilton, 73 of 75 four-year players (.973 percent) have earned their degrees from Florida State. Caleb Mills is the most recent degree recipient; he earned his degree in July of 2022.

1.5 Sophomore Matthew Cleveland is averaging 1.5 steals in the last five games with two steals coming in victories over Notre Dame and Georgia Tech.

2.0 Junior Caleb Mills is averaging 2.0 steals (six total steals) in the last three games with his ACC season-high of four steals coming against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium on December 31.

5 Junior Caleb Mills is ranked fifth in the ACC in steals with 28 and a 1.8 steals per game average.

5.4 Sophomore Jalen Warley enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest averaging a career-high 5.4 points scored per game. He has scored at least eight points in nine of Florida State's 16 games this season.

6 Sophomore Naheem McLeod is tied for sixth in the ACC with a career-high 1.6 blocked shots per game average. He totaled his career-high of six blocked shots in Florida State's victory over Louisville on December 10.

9 Sophomore Matthew Cleveland enters Wednesday's game against Georgia Tech having scored in double figures in nine consecutive games. He is averaging 17.4 points scored per game since totaling 17 points against Nebraska on November 27.

15 Darin Green Jr. has made at least one 3-point field goal in 15 of Florida State's 16 games this season and enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest shooting a career-high .420 from the bonusphere.

18 Darin Green Jr. scored 18 points in Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech on Saturday in Tallahassee. Each of his 18 points came in the second half of the win over the Yellow Jackets.

FLORIDA STATE'S GAME-ENDING RUN AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Florida State closed Saturday's victory over Georgia Tech on a 69-48 run in the final 35:16 of game time. The Seminoles trailed 16-7 following a made 3-pointer by Miles Kelly at the 15:48 mark of the first half – their largest deficit of the game. Beginning with a 3-point shot by Jalen Warley at the 15:16 mark after a Florida State timeout, the Seminoles finished the first half on a 32-20 run, and outscored the Yellow Jackets by a 36-28 mark in the second half.

MATTHEW CLEVELAND'S DOUBLE DOUBLES

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland is averaging a double-double of 19.4 points 11.4 rebounds in the last five Florida State games. Cleveland scored his career-high of 23 points and pulled down his career-high of 13 rebounds against St. John's in the Orange Bowl Classic December 17. He has scored in double figures and pulled down double figure rebounds in each of Seminoles' last five games.

CLEVELAND WITH THREE CONSECUTIVE ACC DOUBLE DOUBLES

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland has earned a double double in each of the Seminoles' last three ACC games against Notre Dame (19 points and 12 rebounds), at Duke (18 points and 10 rebounds) and against Georgia Tech (21 points and 12 rebounds). He the first Seminole player to earn double doubles in three consecutive ACC games since Douglas Edwards also earned three straight against Clemson (12 points and 10 rebounds), Duke (21 points and 12 rebounds) and North Carolina (16 points and 12 rebounds). Cleveland enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest looking to become the first Seminole with double doubles in four consecutive ACC games.

CLEVELAND'S INCREASED NUMBERS

Sophomore Matthew Cleveland enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest as Florida State's leading rebounder with a career-high average of 7.3 rebounds per game. Since the unfortunate injury to Florida State's Cam Fletcher (who averaged 10.8 points and 7.5 rebounds in Florida State's first 10 games of the season) against Virginia on December 3, Cleveland has increased his scoring (+6.0 ppg) and rebounds (+5.7 rpg) while averaging more than 37 minutes per game.

Freshman Cam Corhen, who has started each of the last three games, enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest shooting .809 percent from the free throw line. He ranks third on the team in free throws made (38) and free throws attempted (47) in just his first collegiate season. Corhen has made eight of his last nine free throw attempts (.889 percent) since the second half of Florida State's victory over USC Upstate on December 13.

CORHEN SCORING IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Freshman Cam Corhen enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest averaging 7.5 points per game and having scored in double figures five times (10 against Stetson in his collegiate debut, 12 at UCF, 15 points in his second career-ACC game against Louisville, 10 against St. John's in the Orange Bowl Classic, and his career-high of 18 points in Florida State's victory over Notre Dame). During that stretch of games, he has scored in double figures four times, totaled his career-high of 30 points against St. John's in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 17, is averaging 17.4 points scored per game and is shooting .422 from the 3-point line (19 of 45). Green leads the Seminoles in minutes played and has played at least 36 minutes in seven of the Seminoles' first 16 games of the season.

Leonard Hamilton Will Never Be Defined Simply By Wins; Not Even 600* Of Them

Leonard Hamilton said Saturday he had no idea until the game was over, and it was announced over the public address system inside the Tucker Center, that he had just won his 600th career game as a head coach.

That might seem hard to believe if it was coming from another coach.

But when it comes to this particular one, the guy who has been running this program for the last 20 years, well, it's not that hard to believe at all, is it?

Hamilton's time as the Florida State men's basketball coach is going to come to an end relatively soon. He's 74. And even though he still looks younger than me, we all realize that he's probably not going to be leading this program until he's 80.

Nobody knows when or how it will end, but it's undeniable that we're closer to the end of his FSU career than the beginning. Which is why it was so cool for him to have this moment on Saturday, when he not only got to celebrate the 600th* win of his career but the 400th* at Florida State as well.

(These numbers have asterisks next to them because in reality, he's won 622 and 422, respectively, but the NCAA nonsensically took away 22 of his wins back during the tutor-gate fiasco in the 2000s).

This season, clearly, has not gone great. It's going to end up being one of the worst records he has had as a head coach. Because of another rash of injuries, and a half-year suspension to his most talented player, Leonard Hamilton's 21st season as the Florida State head coach has not gone according to anyone's plan.

Unless there's some miracle run led by Baba Miller, who will make his first appearance Wednesday at Wake Forest, the Seminoles (5-11, 3-2 ACC) likely are not going to make the NCAA Tournament; they're probably not going to have a winning record either.

No, this is a column, and really a celebration, of a man who has done so much for so many. A man who has been a consummate professional, a consummate ambassador, a consummate leader for Florida State University.

Leonard Hamilton is a winner. I want that to always be remembered by Florida State fans. Yes, he has his faults. Just like every other coach in the world. He's not perfect. But he made Florida State basketball relevant.

He made it fun.

He put together a program that has given us so many great memories over the last two decades — including the best multi-year run in the history of the school — and I'm glad he got his video tribute after the win over the Yellow Jackets on Saturday. And the loud ovation from the few thousand fans who were still in the building. He deserves it.

Getting to 600* wins is a great accomplishment. Getting to 400* at FSU is, too. Only four other ACC coaches have won more. It's a bummer, truly, that one of his last seasons started like this one did, with losses mounting at a rate we had never seen around here before.

But let's not lose sight of what he's done in Tallahassee, what he's done for the sport, what he's done for so many people. Let's not lose sight of who he is as a person.

Getting to Win No. 600*, in the middle of a maddeningly difficult season, gives us a chance to celebrate Hamilton again.

It will probably come to nobody's surprise that when I asked him about reaching the milestone he talked a whole lot more about the people he coached, and coached with, than he talked about himself. He gave them a lot of credit for that 600* number.

And in typical Hamilton fashion, he also talked about what means the most to him in the grand scheme of his life and career.

"In our world, you guys recognize us for wins and losses," Hamilton said. "That's how we can keep our jobs, that's how we can get recognized. ... But in reality, we have so much more responsibility than winning games. You take a teenager and are ushering him into young adulthood. You're taking them at the most impressionable, most vulnerable time of their lives, and you're trying to get them to grow up in a four-year period that they're working with you. And that's what we focus on every day.

"Now, the byproduct is that hopefully we'll win enough games. But in reality, the fact that we've only had two guys not graduate, in my opinion is much more important to us than 600 wins."

I'm not sure there's a quote that could sum up who Leonard Hamilton is better than this one.

And while I have no idea how much longer he'll be here or how many more milestones he'll reach, I do know that Leonard Hamilton should absolutely never be defined simply by how many games he has won. Not even 600 (ahem, 622) of them.

Matthew Cleveland pulled down eight rebounds and Naheem McLeod added a career-high six blocks as the Seminoles secured their first ACC win of the season. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Matthew Cleveland scored a team-high 19 points on six made field goals and four free throws, and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to a 73-72 victory over Notre Dame in the Donald L Tucker Center. The win upped the Seminoles record in conference play to 2-1. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring - Caleb Mills (18 points) and Cam Corhen (18 points) - as Florida State won for the third time in four games. Freshman Cam Corhen eclipsed his career high as he scored on a jumper with 11:39 remaining in the second half to give him 16 points. Corhen finished the game with 18 points while also adding seven rebounds. Cleveland totaled his 19 points on six of 10 shooting from the field and added 12 rebounds. Game 16 -- Florida State 75, Georgia Tech 64

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Matthew Cleveland earned his fifth consecutive double double of the season with 21 points and 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to its third ACC win of the season with a 75-64 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring with Darin Green Jr. (18 points) and Caleb Mills (13 points) with all three scoring 13 points or more. Florida State's victory against Georgia Tech marked Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's 600th career win, and 400th at Florida State. He is the active wins leader in the ACC, and only the fifth coach to win at least 400 games as an ACC head coach.
