SEMINOLES BACK AT HOME TO FACE BOSTON COLLEGE AT TUCKER CENTER

Florida State, which has won nine consecutive games at home against Boston College, plays host to the Eagles on Saturday, February 18, 2023, in a 12 Noon tip-off at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The game between the Seminoles and the Eagles is the only game between the two teams during the regular season, and the first between the two teams since a February 21, 2022, meeting in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Florida State's string of nine consecutive victories at home against the Eagles began on February 23, 2008, with a 66-63 victory and continued through the last game played between the two teams at the Tucker Center on March 7, 2020. The Seminoles' 88-62 win over the Eagles in 2020 gave the Seminoles their first outright ACC regular season championship in school history. The ACC Tournament was unfortunately cancelled due to the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic and Florida State earned its second ACC Championship. The Seminoles won their first ACC Championship by winning the ACC Tournament in 2012. Following Saturday's game against Boston College, the Seminoles travel to play at Miami (February 25, 4:00 p.m.) before playing host to their senior night game against North Carolina (February 27, 7:00).

HAMILTON ON NAISMITH HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, is on the 2023 ballot for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

MILLER EARNS FIRST CAREER START; SCORES CAREER-HIGH 12 AT CLEMSON

Freshman Baba Miller, who has played in each of the Seminoles' last 10 games, scored his career-high of 12 points as he played in his career-high of 28 minutes at Clemson on Wednesday night. Miller totaled 12 points, tied his career-high with six rebounds, earned two assists, one steal, and one blocked shot against the Tigers.

CLEVELAND ONE OF SEVEN FROM ACC ON HALL OF FAME STARTING FIVE LISTS

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland is one of only seven players from the ACC named to the Bob Cousy (point guard), Jerry West (shooting guard), Julius Erving (small forward), Karl Malone (power forward) or Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (center) award lists. He is the only ACC player on the top-10 list for the Julius Erving Award.

GREEN JR. NEEDS TO ONE 3-POINT FIELD GOAL MADE TO MOVE INTO FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME TOP 5

Darin Green Jr. enters Saturday's game against Boston College with 79 3-point shots in his first season at Florida State – the sixth-highest single-season total in school history. He needs just one 3-point field goal made to move into Florida State's all-time top-five for 3-point shots made in a single season.

MILLS REACHES CENTURY MARK FOR CAREER STEALS

Junior Caleb Mills earned his 100th career steal (21 at Houston, 79 at Florida State) with one steal at Clemson on Wednesday.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Boston College and win its 10th consecutive home game against the Eagles. The Seminoles have won each of their home games in the series (which began when the Eagles joined the ACC for the 2005-06 season) since earning a 66-63 win at the Tucker Center on February 23, 2008;

...Defeat Boston College and win its 14th game in the series with began on January 14, 2006. The Seminoles have won 13 of the last 18 games in the series since defeating the Eagles for the first time on February 23, 2008;

...Defeat Boston College and win its fourth ACC home game of the season. The Seminoles have defeated Louisville (December 10, 73-55), Notre Dame (December 21, 73-72) and Georgia Tech (January 17, 74-64) at home this season.

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME SINCE 2015

Florida State is 93-17 at home in the last six (plus) seasons (.850 winning percentage) at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have won 93 of their last 110 games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 90 of 107 home games (.841 winning percentage) in the last six seasons (2018 through 2022).

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S HOME WINNING STREAK AGAINST BOSTON COLLEGE

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Boston College having won nine consecutive home games and are 9-1 all-time at home against the Eagles. Florida State's current home winning streak of nine games against Boston College is the longest home winning streak against any ACC team since Florida State joined the ACC for the 1991-92 season. Including a victory over Notre Dame on December 21, 2022, the Seminoles have won seven consecutive home game against Notre Dame and are undefeated against the Fighting Irish (7-0) in the history of the series between the two teams. The Seminoles also won seven consecutive games at the Tucker Center against Wake Forest (March 3, 2011 through February 13, 2021).

SEMINOLES STEALING AGAINST CLEMSON

Led by two steals each by freshmen Cam Corhen and Chandler Jackson, Florida State totaled eight steals by six different players against Clemson on Wednesday night. It marked the sixth time this season and second game in ACC play (11 against Miami on January 21 and eight against Clemson) that the Seminoles totaled eight or more steals in a game. Florida State totaled its season-high of 11 steals against both Siena (November 24) and Miami in the first meeting between the two teams. In two games against Clemson during the regular season, Florida State totaled 15 steals against the Tigers (7.5 spg).

SEMINOLES APPROACHING 200 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE

Led by two made 3-point field goals by freshman Cam Corhen against Clemson on Wednesday night, the Seminoles totaled nine 3-point field goals made against Clemson on Wednesday. It marked the fifth time in ACC play the Seminoles made at least nine 3-point field goals in a game, and the seventh time this season they had found their mark from the bonusphere. The Seminoles have made at least 200 3-point field goals in six of the last seven seasons with 208 long range shots coming in 31 games during the 2021-22 season. The Seminoles' single-season school record for 3-point shots made is 296 for the 2003-04 season – Leonard Hamilton's second season at Florida State.

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT 13 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during its overtime streak, including nine ACC teams.

FLORIDA STATE ASSISTING

Florida State totaled 11 assists on 21 made baskets against Clemson on Wednesday night, and has now earned double figure assists in 23 straight and 26 of 27 games this season. The Seminoles earned their ACC season-high of 23 assists in their 75-64 win over Georgia Tech (January 7).

FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON COLLEGE – THE LAST GAME

Matthew Cleveland scored a team-high 18 points and pulled down a team-high eight rebounds as Florida State fell at Boston College, 71-55, this evening. Cam'Ron Fletcher also scored in double figures with 16 points and contributed a team-high four steals. Fletcher has scored in double figures in a season-high four consecutive games. The Seminoles were down four starters including Malik Osborne (10.0 ppg, 6.9 rpg), Anthony Polite (9.7 ppg, 5.5 rpg), Caleb Mills (12.7 ppg, 2.3 rpg) and Naheem McLeod (4.5 ppg, 2.1 rpg). Florida State was down 32-24 at the half, with Cleveland scoring 10 points and contributing seven of his eight rebounds before intermission. At the start of the second half, RayQuan Evans scored a layup and got the "and one" to bring the Seminoles within five points of Boston College. However, Florida State could not close the gap by any more than that for the remainder of the game. In a game with back and forth scoring droughts, the Seminoles shot .339 from the field and .211 from the three-point line. The Seminoles did not lead at any point this evening. Tanor Ngom had a career-high three steals in contributing to the team total of 10 steals. With 242 total steals and a 9.0 spg average, Florida State continues to lead the ACC in steals.

.692 Sophomore Jalen Warley is shooting .692 from the field (18 of 26) in the last four games. He was a near-perfect nine of 11 from the field in scoring his career-high of 23 points against Pittsburgh on February 11.

.696 Sophomore Naheem McLeod is shooting .696 from the field (16 of 23) in his last four games.

.778 Freshman De'Ante Green is shooting .778 from the field (seven of nine) in the last eight games.

.958 Darin Green Jr. is shooting .958 from the free throw line (23 of 24) in the last 18 games. He made his final five free throw attempts against Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on November 30 and has missed only one attempt since then.

.973 Under Leonard Hamilton, 73 of 75 four-year players (.973 percent) have earned their degrees from Florida State. Caleb Mills is the most recent degree recipient; he earned his degree in July of 2022.

7 Freshman Cam Corhen enters Saturday's game against Boston College having made seven consecutive free throws. He has not missed a free throw attempt since the second half of Florida State's game against NC State on February 1, 2023.

12.8 Junior Caleb Mills has scored in double figures in 14 of the last 17 games and is averaging 12.8 points per game since scoring 16 points in Florida State's win over Louisville in Tallahassee on December 10.

19 Darin Green Jr. has made at least one 3-point field goal in 19 consecutive games – since Florida State's game against Purdue on November 30. He has made at least one shot from the bonusphere in 26 of Florida State's 27 games. He is shooting .382 from the 3-point line (60 of 157) during that span of 19 games.

40 Junior Caleb Mills earned one steal in Florida State's game against Clemson on Wednesday night to bring his season total to a career-high 40 steals. He surpassed last season's total of 39 and enters Saturday's game against Boston College with 100 career steals.

45 Florida State scored a season-high 45 points in the first half of Florida State's 81-78 win over Louisville on February 4.

NOTING CHANDLER JACKSON...

...With three assists in his last two games, he is one of five Seminoles with 30 or more assists. He has earned 32 assists and owns a 1.3 assists per game average while playing in 24 of Florida State's 27 games. The Seminoles are tied for fifth in the ACC with 377 assists and are one of six conference teams with 375 or more assists as a team;

...With a career-high tying two assists against Clemson on Wednesday night, he is now one of five Seminoles with 15 or more steals. He has earned 15 steals with eight coming in his most recent eight games. The Seminoles are ranked seventh in the ACC in steals with 160 steals and a 5.9 steals per game average.

CHANDLER JACKSON – IN FIRST CAREER START – TOTALS A CAREER-HIGH NINE ASSISTS

Chandler Jackson made his first career start on February 8, 2023 against Syracuse and responded with seven points and a career-high nine assists in a career-high 26 minutes played. The school record for assists in an ACC game is 13 by Delvon Arrington at Georgia Tech on January 9, 1999.

JALEN WARLEY IN HIS LAST FOUR GAMES

Sophomore Jalen Warley is averaging 11.5 points (46 total points) while shooting .692 from the field (18 of 26), .500 from the 3-point arc (three of six) and .700 from the free throw line (seven of 10) in the last four games. He scored his career-high of 23 points (on nine of 11 shooting from the field) against Pittsburgh on February 11 and has made at one 3-point field goal in each of the last three games.

WARLEY RANKED FIFTH IN THE ACC IN ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO

Sophomore Jalen Warley enters Saturday's game against Boston College ranked fifth in the ACC in assists:turnover ratio with a career-best mark of 2.1:1. He has a career-high 93 assists and needs only seven to reach 100 in a single season for the first time in his career. The more important number to Warley is his turnover number which ranks as the fourth lowest in the ACC among prime time players.

Corhen Seeing More Playing Time Than Expected, Learning On Fly As Freshman

Cameron Corhen picked Florida State in part because the coaching staff has been willing to play freshmen. But he never dreamed he would see this many minutes.

When his roommate, Jaylan Gainey, tore his ACL in preseason practices, Corhen talked to assistant coach Stan Jones and knew immediately he would have a larger role.

"Coach Jones called me in his office," Corhen recalled. "'That's a lot of minutes coming your way. ... I know you're fresh out of high school. You're 18 years old, but it's time for you to grow up.'"

Corhen had to grow up fast. He has averaged 8.6 points and 3.4 rebounds, playing 24 minutes per game, but he has also poured in 16 points in each of his last two games. Corhen leads the team with 39 offensive rebounds, including five in the win at Louisville on Saturday — all of which resulted in put back baskets.

FSU (8-16, 5-7 ACC) has been depleted by injuries for a second straight season, including the losses of Gainey and versatile guard Cam'Ron Fletcher as well as the NCAA-mandated 16-game suspension for Baba Miller. While everyone from the coaching staff to fans can dream of what might have been with all three in the rotation from the start, the shorthanded Seminoles have instead had to battle and see how their freshmen develop.

"With young players, you don't want to sit around and have them try to figure out what their status is," Jones said. "I think that's been one of the strengths of working with Coach (Leonard) Hamilton and our staff over the years we're very good on talking kids through their roles and their role evolution. How we think it is starting and how we hope it ends. When that went down with Jaylan being out, you had to try to make sure his mind understood that he wasn't going to have the luxury of just playing a minimal role and dipping his toes in the pool."

It's tough to project which freshmen are ready for what they will face when they make the jump from high school to college athletics. Corhen had some advantages. His dad, Richard, played basketball at Georgia for Hugh Durham from 1981-84. His mom, Kelly, played high school basketball and has helped him with the mental side of athletics. "They have different aspects of being those coaches," Corhen said. "My mom, she's personal and the emotional coach. And my dad, he's a real quiet dude. Doesn't know how to do the other stuff. He just knows basketball. It's like a tag team."

Corhen logging heavy minutes

The 6-foot-10, 225-pound Corhen was a four-star forward who chose FSU over a large number of schools in Sept. 2021. FSU was a good fit and Corhen felt he would play right away.

"I liked the style of play," Corhen said. "They play a lot of dudes. Rotate dudes in. A lot of schools don't even play freshmen. I knew coming here I'd have a chance to get minutes and start going from there."

Corhen played 20 minutes in the season opener, scoring 10 points in a loss to Stetson. But his minutes steadily rose and he became a regular in the starting lineup by mid-December.

"I thought I was coming in six, 10 spot minutes a game," Corhen said. "Which I was fine with. I was cool with coming in slow and building my way up. I feel like I'm just grateful for that opportunity. And that's where my hard work comes from, because I know there's a lot of dudes who wish they could play, a lot of dudes who wish they could have the opportunity. I just have to keep grinding, keep getting better."

Corhen has scored nine or more points in seven of his last eight games. He has also shot 50 percent or better in all but one of those, FSU's road win at Pittsburgh. Corhen is shooting 81 percent from the free-throw line and has often been one of FSU's best rebounders.

Hamilton would rather not play freshmen this many minutes, let alone veterans. His expectations on both ends of the court can wear heavily on players. But FSU freshmen have logged heavy minutes in recent years, from Malik Beasley (29.8 minutes in 2015-16) and Dwayne Bacon (28.8 minutes in 2015-16) to Scottie Barnes (24.8 minutes in 2020-21) and Matthew Cleveland (26.2 minutes in 2021-22).

But a player that FSU coaches compare Corhen often to, Mfiondu Kabengele, was able to take a redshirt season. Corhen averages 24 minutes per game but he has played 29 or more in minutes in nine games this season, which is quite the load for a big man.

"Very few freshmen come into this league without having to make some adjustments," Hamilton said. "And when you're in a situation like Cam has been where he basically has been the guy playing 30 minutes a game, that's not as easy for them to adjust to at this level as maybe it would be if you have enough depth on your team. There's nothing unusual about him not being quite as consistent but I do feel his effort has been good. Different schemes cause him more challenges because he's adjusting to playing at this level in the ACC."

Comparisons to Kabengele

Corhen's 3-point shot is a work in progress, although the heavy minutes have impacted the accuracy of his shot.

Corhen has often been compared to Kabengele, a stretch 4 (forward) who developed his all-around game, was an ACC Sixth Man of the Year and was selected as a first-round pick in 2019. Thinking about the five offensive rebounds in the win at Louisville and the resulting 10 points, Corhen sees those as second-chance opportunities but also aspects of Kabengele's game that he's observed on film.

"Coach Jones always compares me to Mfiondu Kabengele," Corhen said. "And that's what he really did. A lot of it was offensive rebounding and get off block outs. I watch a lot of videos on him to figure out how to get easy points like that. Those are free points."

Jones and the staff have pushed Corhen to watch film of Kabengele for years.

"We've encouraged that since we were recruiting him," Jones said. "If not the top, he's in the top two or three guys in terms of amount of film they watch on their own without being asked to by coaches. I can see him, if he doesn't change his approach to the game, really having big jumps from year to year as it goes through his career."

The challenges for Corhen to round out his game are evident. He's just six of 26 (23.1 percent) from 3-point range, although he does have a good-looking jump shot. Part of the issue, Corhen and coaches admit, are the heavy minutes.

"I'm not shooting the ball as well as I usually have in the past," Corhen said. "I'm scoring other ways. The legs aspect of it. Switching one through five, I could guard the ball for 20 seconds, then my legs are dead, then I got to go shoot the ball. I have to adjust to that. I'm trying to work on my conditioning as well as shooting in practice."

Switching one through five is an adjustment for Corhen, who is being asked to do things that a veteran has done in past seasons. While a forward like Malik Osborne excelled in defending everyone from a point guard to a center, Corhen has had to learn as a freshman for extended periods of time.

"It was definitely an adjustment but I feel like I adjusted pretty good just because, for a big man, I have quick feet," Corhen said. "So it wasn't the quickness aspect. It was just the mental part about it that threw me off. I feel like I'm adjusting pretty well."

Gainey is Corhen's roommate and has also helped with aspects of his game and teaching the freshman how to get in better positioning to block shots.

"He's an older, mature dude," Corhen said. "He is a great shot blocker. I ask him for tips about that because I'm trying to improve my defense, my shot blocking. He helps me a lot."

Optimism for FSU's finish

Hamilton said a few weeks back that the Seminoles have been consistently inconsistent. That's in large part a result of the injuries as well as a competitive middle of the ACC, where FSU is among five teams with between six and eight league wins. That also includes blue bloods like Duke and North Carolina, as well as Syracuse. The Orange are 14-10, 7-6 ACC going into Wednesday's game at FSU (7 p.m. on ACC Network).

FSU has battled often, especially on the road in picking up back-to-back wins over Notre Dame and Pittsburgh. The Seminoles have also started flat in games, notably the three straight losses to Miami, Clemson and at NC State. A late lead at Louisville also nearly slipped away on Saturday.

"I think we may have taken too much out of that thinking we're better than what we were," Corhen said. "Because we came back and then Miami came in and beat us. We have to stay level-headed."

Corhen is optimistic about how FSU can finish. With seven regular-season games left, he wants to see the Seminoles secure one of the top nine spots going into the ACC Tournament to avoid playing five games in five days. From there anything can happen, Corhen thinks.

"I feel like if we get four games in four days we can win the ACC Tournament and get a bid for March Madness," Corhen said. "We just want to finish strong. ... I feel like we've shown that we can compete with any team in the ACC, even any team in the country. I do believe we can do that."

That is a bold statement considering what the Seminoles have been through this season. But if there are reasons to be encouraged about where the program is going, maybe not this March but in 2023-24, it's because of freshmen like Corhen who are earning early playing time — far more than expected — and learning as they go.

"He's grown his game," Jones said. "I think everybody can see he's added some versatility to spots he scores on consistently. He's extending his range, which we always felt like he had a potential to do that. And he's growing up from an emotional and a maturity perspective. He's still 18 years old."
