FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO NORTH CAROLINA ON SENIOR NIGHT IN TALLAHASSEE

Florida State, which has won each of its last three games at the Donald L. Tucker Center against North Carolina, plays host to the Tar Heels at The Tuck on Monday, February 27, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. in a nationally televised game on ESPN's Big Monday telecast. The Seminoles' will celebrate the career of senior Cleveland Yates, who was a member of Florida State's 2020 ACC Championship team. The Seminoles defeated Miami on Saturday in Coral Gables, 85-84, on a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by All-ACC and Julius Erving Award candidate Matthew Cleveland to give the Seminoles their fourth AC road victory of the season. The Seminoles have now won at Notre Dame (January 17, 84-71), at Pittsburgh (January 21, 71-64), at Louisville (February 4, 81-78) and at Miami (February 25, 85-84) this season. Following Monday's game against North Carolina, the Seminoles close out the regular season in their first and only game of the regular season against Virginia Tech in Blacksburg on Saturday, March 4, 2023.

SEMINOLES RALLY FROM ACC RECORD 25 POINTS TO DEFEAT MIAMI

Florida State trailed Miami on Saturday at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables by a 50-25 margin with 1:29 remaining in the first half – and rallied to win the game on a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland. After falling behind by 25 points late in the first half on the road in ACC play, the Seminoles outscored the rival Hurricanes by a 60-34 margin over the final 21:29 of the game. The comeback of 25 points against Miami is the largest comeback in ACC history – giving Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff the two largest comeback victories in the incredibly storied history of the ACC. The Seminoles rallied from 24 points down against North Carolina on January 22, 2004, to defeat the Tar Heels by a 90-81 margin at the Donald L Tucker Center. The third-largest comeback in ACC history is a 23-point recovery by Duke against Louisville on February 13, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE'S COMEBACK THE LARGEST IN A WIN IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL IN 2022-23

Florida State's 25-point comeback against Miami to defeat the Hurricanes on their home court by an 85-84 is the largest comeback in a win during the 2022-23 season. The previous largest comeback nationally this season was a 24-point rally by Middle Tennessee State to defeat FIU, 69-58 on February 18, 2023.

BUZZER BEATERS ARE NOTHING NEW FOR MATTHEW CLEVELAND

The incredible buzzer-beating 3-point shot by Matthew Cleveland to propel the Seminoles past Miami was the sophomore All-Star's third career buzzer-beating, game-winning shot of his career. Each of Cleveland's game-winners came as the buzzer sounded to end the game and were all victories for the Seminoles.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Florida State's victory over No. 13/11 Miami marked Leonard Hamilton's NCAA record 56th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team. Hamilton set the record of ongoing record with a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018.

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT 13 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Monday's game against North Carolina having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during its overtime streak, including nine ACC teams.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S SECOND HALF AGAINST MIAMI...

...Florida State outscored the Hurricanes by a 54-30 margin in the second half after being outscored by a 54-31 margin in the first half of the game;

...Florida State shot .677 from the field (21 of 31) in the second half after shooting .375 from the field in the first half (12 of 32);

...Florida State limited Miami to a .379 shooting percentage in the second half (11 of 29) after allowing the Hurricanes to shoot .657 in the first half (23 of 35). The Seminoles held the Hurricanes to fewer than half of their first half field goals made total in the second half as compared to the first half;

...Florida State limited Miami to three 3-point shots in the second half (three of 10, .300) after allowing five 3-point shots in the first half (five of nine, .556);

...Florida State was charged with one second half turnover and held Miami scoreless on points off of turnovers in the second half. The Seminoles outscored Miami by a 10-0 margin on points off of turnovers in the second half after allowing 16 points on 10 first half turnovers;

...Florida State outscored Miami 34-16 in the paint in the second half after being outscored 34-10 in the paint in the first half;

...Florida State outscored Miami by a 14-0 margin on fast break points in the second half after being outscored 18-0 on fast break points in the first half.

SEMINOLES IN THE FINAL 36:33 OF THE GAME AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State closed Saturday's game against Miami by outscoring the Hurricanes by an 83-68 margin in the final 36:33 of the game after the Hurricanes scored 14 of the first 16 points of the game in the first 3:37.

ONE SECOND HALF TURNOVER TIES FLORIDA STATE'S SEASON LOW FOR A HALF

Florida State committed one second half turnover – its fewest in a half since committing just one first half turnover in its 81-78 win at Louisville on February 4, 2023. The Seminoles' season-low for turnovers in a game is five (two in the first half and three in the second half) in its 73-72 win over Notre Dame at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (December 21, 2022).

SEMINOLES SHARE THE BASKETBALL IN WIN OVER MIAMI

Led by five assists each by junior Caleb Mills and sophomore Jalen Warley, the Seminoles totaled 18 assist on 33 made baskets in their 85-84 win over Miami on Saturday. It marked the fourth time this season Florida State has earned 18 or more steals in a game. Florida State earned a season-high 23 assists against Wake Forest on January 11, 2023.

FLORIDA STATE EARNS 10 STEALS IN VICTORY OVER MIAMI

Led by four steals by Darin Green Jr., Florida State totaled 10 steals (including eight in the second half) in its 85-84 win over Miami. The Seminoles have earned 25 steals (12.5 spg) in their last two games, with their season-high of 15 coming against Boston College and 10 coming against the Hurricanes. Florida State enters Monday's game against North Carolina ranked sixth in the ACC in steals (185 steals / 6.4 steals per game) and need just 15 steals to reach the 200 plateau for the seventh time in the last eight seasons.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST CURRENT ACC NOS. 1 AND 2

Florida State has two wins (both on the road) against the current first and second place teams in the ACC -- Pittsburgh and Miami. The Seminoles won at Pittsburgh (71-64 at the Peterson Events Center on January 21) and at Miami (85-84 at the Watsco Center on February 25).

FLORIDA STATE HOT FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State shot better than 85 percent from the free throw line (12 of 14, .857 percent) in its victory over Miami on Saturday in Coral Gables. It marked the second consecutive and sixth time this season the Seminoles have shot better than 85 percent from the free throw line in a single game. Florida State shot a perfect 1.000 percent (nine of nine) against Virginia in the John Paul Jones Arena on December 3 in its first ACC game of the 2022-23 season.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FIELD AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State shot a season-high .524 percent from the field as it made a season-high 33 field goals in its 85-84 win over Miami on Saturday. The Seminoles shot .677 percent from the field in the second half (21 of 31) in rallying to defeat the Hurricanes. The Seminoles' school record for an ACC game for field goal percentage is .714 against NC State on January 15, 2021 (41 of 58). The Seminoles have shot better than 50 percent from the field in four different games this season, including their season high of .537 at Wake Forest on January 11, 2022.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH CAROLINA – THE LAST GAME

Cam'ron Fletcher scored a career-high, double-double of 16 points and 10 rebounds, along with a team-high 4 steals while Matthew Cleveland and RayQuan Evans each scored 13 points as the Seminoles fell to North Carolina, 74-94, at the Dean E. Smith Center in Chapel Hill on February 12, 2022. Caleb Love scored 18 points, shooting six of eight from 3-point range. North Carolina led 62-24 at halftime. The Tar Heels were 23-for-31 (74.2%) shooting while Florida State made just 9 of 30 attempts (30%) before intermission. The Seminoles outscored UNC 50-32 in the second half, scoring 17 points off the bench, and 22 points in the paint. Florida State struggled to shoot as they shot 38.8 percent from the field, 47.4 percent from the 3-point line, and 65 percent from the free-throw line. Jalen Warley shot a perfect 2 for 2 from the free-throw line. Evans led the team with four assists, and John Butler tied his season-high of 7 rebounds. Florida State totaled 9 steals this afternoon against the Tar Heels, keeping their lead in the ACC for steals, with 222 this season. North Carolina's Armando Bacot scored 17 points along with 14 rebounds. Brady Manek and RJ Davis helped out offensively, contributing 16 points each.

.818 Sophomore All-ACC and Julius Erving Award candidate Matthew Cleveland is shooting .818 from the free throw line (nine of 11) in the last four games (nine of 11).

.966 Darin Green Jr is shooting .966 from the free throw line (28 of 96) in the last 21 games since Florida State's game against Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on November 30. He was a perfect three of three from the line and scored 20 points in Florida State's victory over Miami on Saturday in Coral Gables.

.973 Under Leonard Hamilton, 73 of 75 four-year players (.973 percent) have earned their degrees from Florida State. Caleb Mills is the most recent degree recipient; he earned his degree in July of 2022.

1.3 Freshman Chandler Jackson has four steals in his last three games, including two at Clemson (February 15) and is averaging 1.3 steals per game in that span of four games.

Coach Leonard Hamilton: 'The Worse the Program, the More I Became Interested'

Hamilton, the Florida State men's basketball coach, was presented with the Joe Lapchick Character Award in New York last week.

Leonard Hamilton was on the ninth floor of the stately New York Athletic Club with its million-dollar views over Central Park, accepting the Joe Lapchick Character Award at a luncheon on Friday. Outside, a chauffeur waited to whisk him across the Hudson River to a private plane that would deliver the Florida State men's basketball coach back to Tallahassee, Fla.

It was quite the departure from his first visit to New York.

That came 50 years ago, when Hamilton was a wet-behind-the-ears assistant coach at Austin Peay State University in Tennessee. Hamilton walked to the La Guardia Airport car rental counter only to discover that he could not pay cash for a car — and he did not have a credit card. So he jumped in a cab and asked the driver to take him to the cheapest hotel he could find near a gym in Brooklyn.

When Hamilton got to the gym, he heard other coaches talking about a hot prospect from the neighborhood. So he pulled aside Rodney Parker, a street basketball consigliere whom any recruiter in the city had better get to know, and asked if he could introduce him to this phenom. The next night, they went to the prospect's apartment a little before he was expected home at 7. His mother answered the door. They talked and talked, Hamilton turning on the charm.

After a while, Parker left, and they talked some more.

Sometime after midnight, when the mother excused herself to use the bathroom, Hamilton turned the clock back a couple of hours lest she ask him to leave. When she went to the bathroom again, he pulled the blinds down, lest she discover the sun would soon be peeking through. Finally, just around 7 a.m., in walked a sinewy 6-foot-5 teenager with a bushy Afro and a sly grin.

Immediately, Hamilton hit it off with James Williams, whom everyone knew as Fly.

"I was following him around playing All-Star games," Hamilton said. "Nobody knew me, and I never wore anything with Austin Peay on it, so Fly, being the jokester that he was, told everybody I was his cousin. I actually sat in on two recruiting meetings with other schools. He said, 'I can't talk with anybody without my cuz.'"

Austin Peay, which had finished last in the Ohio Valley Conference the previous season, nearly reached the Mideast regional final of the N.C.A.A. men's tournament in 1973, losing in overtime to Kentucky.

Hamilton, 74, was the first Black player at the University of Tennessee at Martin and the first Black coach in the Southeastern Conference when he was hired as an assistant at Kentucky in 1974. He is getting ready for his 21st season at Florida State, where he has coached six first-round draft picks since 2016 — including the reigning N.B.A. rookie of the year, Scottie Barnes — and where 73 of the 75 players who have completed their eligibility have graduated.

He spoke to The New York Times last week about growing up in the segregated South, taking on reclamation projects, why he doesn't think about the what-ifs of the pandemic and when he'll retire.

You quit coaching when you were told Austin Peay would not hire a Black head coach, right?

It wasn't quite like that. I went to talk to the university president when I thought Coach (Lake) Kelly might leave to see if there was a chance I could replace him. He said he was retiring in a couple years and nothing would make him happier than for me to be the coach at Austin Peay. Politically, he said he didn't know if he was strong enough to get it done. He was being honest with me, but that cut my guts out.

So you quit?

I got a job at Dow Chemicals. My first day on the job, I got a call from Joe Hall (the Kentucky coach), who had become aware of me because we almost beat them. Near the end of my interview, I said, "I'm going to tell you four things: I'll be loyal to you, nobody will outwork me, you'll have players, and I won't get you in trouble. But if you're not going to offer me the job, I'm going to go back to Charlotte and be the No. 1 chemicals salesman in the country."

You spent 12 years as an assistant at Kentucky (winning the 1978 championship with the team), but your head coaching jobs have been at places that were not exactly blue bloods. Oklahoma State hadn't won an N.C.A.A. tournament game in more than two decades; Miami had recently resurrected its program 15 years after dropping it; and Florida State had always been a football school. Is that a coincidence?

As an assistant coach, like most young coaches, I was dreaming. I wanted to be somewhere that had good facilities, was in the vicinity of good players and that had won. I wanted to find one of those good, cushy jobs where I could really go to work. But then it's almost like God slapped me on both sides of my face and said, "Those programs don't need you." It was almost like a vision — if you're going to make a name in this business, you're going to have to go somewhere that is extremely challenging. The worse the program, the more I became interested. That would be a way for me to earn my stripes.

How much did your upbringing in Gastonia, N.C., prepare you for that, having to make do with less?

There were eight of us living in a two-bedroom house. Our bathroom was on the back porch, there was no hot and cold running water. I took my bath in a tin tub. Everybody in our neighborhood lived that way. This was an era when we were still drinking out of a colored water fountain, using a colored bathroom, sitting in the back of the bus. We lived 30 or 40 yards from my church — Mount Zion Baptist, at the corner of Allison and Morris, where everybody is somebody and Christ is all. I could hear the piano from our back porch, and if the doors were open, we were there. It gave me a moral compass. All of those circumstances, even the negative part of segregation, prepared me mentally. It gave me a toughness, a desire, a will to fight and a determination to try to overcome challenges.

Last year, Gaston College, the community college you attended in your hometown, resurrected its athletic program after 50 years, bringing back five sports, including men's basketball. You urged the college's board of trustees to do this. Why?

Most Blacks in that time got their education through the G.I. Bill, so that's what I was going to do in 1966 — join the Army. My mother went to school up to the seventh grade, my father went to the ninth grade. The coach convinced me I could always join the Army but this would be a good experience. And he was right. Gaston College meant so much to me because I was a guy who needed some direction. I needed small classrooms. I needed the relationships. I needed that environment. Every Wednesday night, my coach would take me to Howard Johnson's. He was teaching me how to eat pasta. He wanted me to take the fork and the spoon and curl it up, which made no sense to me. It helped prepare me to go to Tennessee-Martin. I had three younger brothers and a sister who looked to me for leadership. Getting my degree set the table for them.

In 2020, Florida State was 26-5, A.C.C. champions, ranked fourth and picked by some to get to the Final Four, where you have never been. Then the pandemic hit and the N.C.A.A. tournament was canceled. How often do you think about what might have been?

I don't. When you think about the negative effect that continuing to play those games could have had on a lot of people, me standing up there saying "I'm No. 1" pales in comparison. I would have loved to have played for a championship, but the most important thing is it was the right decision to make.

In the past two years, Roy Williams retired at North Carolina, Mike Krzyzewski retired at Duke and Jay Wright retired at Villanova. You turned 74 last month, you just had hip replacement surgery, and you coached with a ruptured Achilles' tendon in last year's N.C.A.A. tournament. How long do you want to coach?

This is my ministry. This is my calling. This is what I'm built for — to help young people fulfill their dreams. I don't play golf. I don't hunt. I don't fish. I'm boring. I always tell my staff that if I don't come out of the locker room and go to the wrong bench, then I'm going to stay here.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Matthew Cleveland scored a team-high 19 points on six made field goals and four free throws, and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to a 73-72 victory over Notre Dame in the Donald L Tucker Center. CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- Florida State's Matthew Cleveland made a well-contested 3-point shot at the buzzer to give Florida State an 85-84 win over Miami after being down by 25 points in the first half. Cleveland's heroics came directly after a Jordan Miller 3-point shot off of an inbound play that gave the Hurricanes an 84-82 lead. Cleveland than inbounded the ball to guard Jalen Warley and got the ball back as he crossed halfcourt before launching his second career buzzer-beating 3-point game-winning shot. The sophomore also beat Virginia on a nearly-identical shot in Charlottesville during his freshman season. The Seminoles' 25-point comeback is the largest in the history of the storied Atlantic Coast Conference. The Seminoles trailed by 25 -- 50-25 -- after Jordan Miller made a free throw to extend the Hurricanes' lead. From that point on, the Seminoles outscored Miami on its home court by a 60-34 margin (6-4 to close the first half and 54-30 in the second half to gain the improbable victory. The Seminoles committed one second half turnover, shot .667 percent from the field (21 of 31) and .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) to earn their fifth consecutive win on Miami's home court.
