SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO PITTSBURGH IN SECOND CONSECUTIVE HOME GAME

Florida State, which has won three of its last four games against Pittsburgh, plays host to the Panthers on Saturday, February 11, at 12 Noon inside the Donald L. Tucker Center in the second meeting of the season between the Seminoles and the Panthers. Florida State gained its second of three ACC road wins this season as they defeated Pittsburgh by a 71-64 margin at the Peterson Events Center on January 21. The Seminoles are 3-2 against Pittsburgh in games played at Tuck since the Panthers joined the ACC for the 2013-14 season. The Seminoles' game against the Panthers is their second of two consecutive home games after facing Syracuse at The Tuck on Wednesday night. Following Saturday's game against Pittsburgh, the Seminoles travel to play at Clemson on February 15 before returning home to play host to Boston College in the only meeting between the Seminoles and the Eagles during the regular season on February 18.

FLORIDA STATE CELEBRATES COACHING FOR LITERACY AGAINST PITTSBURGH

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and Associate Head Coach Stan Jones are on the forefront of one of college basketball's great initiatives as the Seminoles have partnered with Coaching for Literacy (CFL) to host their ninth annual Fight for Literacy Game against Pittsburgh on February 18. Coaching for Literacy's Fight for Literacy Games empower coaches, teams, and fans to make a more literate America by participating in awareness efforts, volunteer work and fundraising activities. According to the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), 59 percent of fourth-graders in Florida are not proficient in reading. The Seminoles are doing their part to change that unfortunate statistic. To promote the Fight for Literacy, members of the Seminole coaching staff will wear Coaching for Literacy's Green Pins.

SEMINOLES' CLEVELAND NAMED TO THE JULIUS ERVING AWARD TOP-10 LIST

All-ACC Candidate Matthew Cleveland, the Seminoles' leading scorer with a career-high 14.4 points per game scoring average, has been named as one of the top-10 candidates for the 2023 Julius Erving Award. Sponsored by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame, the award recognizes the best small forward in Division I men's college basketball. Cleveland is the only player from the ACC on the Erving Award top-10 list. Cleveland is a two-time Erving award honoree as he was named to the initial watch list for the award in both his freshman and sophomore seasons. Cleveland is ranked among the ACC's leaders in both conference and non-conference games in both scoring and rebounding.

...Defeat Pittsburgh and gain a sweep of the regular season series between the Seminoles and the Panthers. A victory over the Panthers would give the Seminoles their first two-game regular season sweep of the Panthers in the history of the series which began on February 8, 1973;

...Defeat Pittsburgh and gain their third two-game regular season sweep of the 2022-23 season. The Seminoles have defeated Notre Dame twice (December 21 and January 17) and Louisville twice (December 10 and February 4) already this season;

...Defeat Pittsburgh and gain its third regular season sweep of the 2022-23 season. The Seminoles swept two regular season series during the 2021-22 season (Miami and NC State) and most recently gained three regular season series sweeps during the 2019-20 season with sweeps over Louisville (January 4 at Louisville and February 24 in Tallahassee), Miami (January 18 in Coral Gables and February 8 in Tallahassee) and against and Notre Dame (January 25 in Tallahassee and March 4 in Notre Dame).

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT 13 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Pittsburgh having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during its overtime streak, including nine ACC teams.

FLORIDA STATE FROM 3-POINT RANGE

Led by five 3-point field goals made by sharpshooter Darin Green Jr., Florida State made nine 3-point shots against Syracuse on Wednesday night if Tallahassee. It marked the sixth time this season the Seminoles made nine or more 3-point shots in a game. Coupled with its eight made 3-point field goals against Louisville, the Seminoles have made 17 3-point shots in the last two games – an average of 8.5 3-point field goals made against Louisville (eight in their 81-78 win over Louisville) and nine made against Syracuse. Florida State made 10 of 20 3-point field goals (.500 percent) in its win over Pittsburgh on January 21.

SEMINOLES ASSISTING

Led by a career-high nine assists from freshman and first-time starter Chandler Jackson, the Seminoles totaled 21 assists against Syracuse. It marked the second time this season the Seminoles totaled 21 or more assists in a game after totaling a season-high 21 assists in their 75-64 win over Georgia Tech (January 17). Florida State has earned double digit assists in 24 of their 25 games with 40 assists (19 at Louisville and 21 against Syracuse) coming in their last two games (20.0 apg). The Seminoles have been extremely consistent in sharing the basketball through the 2022-23 season was an average of 14.2 assists per game at least 17 assists coming in six different games. Florida State earned 12 assists on 25 baskets in its win over Pittsburgh on January 21.

FLORIDA STATE'S OUTSTANDING ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO

Florida State has a 2:1 assist:turnover ratio in his last two games with an incredible 40 assists against just one turnover against Louisville (19 assists and eight turnovers) and Syracuse (21 assists and 12 turnovers). The Seminoles have earned a positive assist:turnover ratio in seven of their last eight games and have been on the underside of the ratio just once in their last 10 games. Florida State was even in the assist:turnover column with 13 assists and 13 turnovers in their win over Pittsburgh on January 21.

ONLY ONE FIRST HALF TURNOVER BY FLORIDA STATE IN VICTORY OVER LOUISVILLE

Florida State was charged with only one turnover in the first half of its 81-78 win over Louisville at the KFC Yum! Center on Saturday. The Seminoles went the first 15:05 of the half without turning the basketball over to the Cardinals. The Seminoles outscored the Cardinals by an 11-0 margin on turnovers in taking a 45-36 lead at the intermission and winning by an 81-78 score.

SEMINOLES GO TO THE OFFENSIVE GLASS AGAINST SYRACUSE

Led by Matthew Cleveland's season-high tying four offensive rebounds against Syracuse, Florida State totaled 11 offensive rebounds and 12 second chance points against Syracuse on Wednesday. It marked the eighth time this season the Seminoles had pulled down double figures in offensive rebounds with a season-high 16 offensive rebounds coming at Virginia on December 3.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE DEFENSIVE...

...Led by two steals each by Caleb Mills and Jalen Warley, the Seminoles totaled seven steals against Syracuse on Wednesday. It marked the fourth time in the last six games the Seminoles have earned seven or more steals in a games. Florida State averages 6.8 steals (41 steals) in its last six games;

...Led by two blocked shots each by Matthew Cleveland and Naheem McLeod, the Seminoles totaled four blocked shots against Syracuse on Wednesday. It marked the fifth time in the last six games the Seminoles had blocked at least four shots in a games. Florida State averages 4.3 blocked shots (26 blocks) in the last six games.

FLORIDA STATE'S IMPROVED BENCH PLAY

Florida State is averaging 17.5 points from its bench players and outscored Pitt (17-4), Miami (24-12), Clemson (22-11) and Syracuse (19-2) from the bench in four of its last six games. The Seminoles' increased bench production marks eight times this season (Mercer, Virginia1, Louisville, Wake Forest, Pitt1, Miami1, Clemson1 and Syracuse) that their bench players had outscored their opponents' bench players. Naheem McLeod scored 16 points off the bench against Syracuse – the most bench points by a Seminole this season and the most since ACC Sixth Man of the Year Matthew Cleveland scored 21 of the bench against North Florida on January 20, 2022.

FLORIDA STATE VS. PITTSBURGH – THE LAST GAME

Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 24 points on seven made field goals, five three pointers and five free throws to lead Florida State to a 71-64 victory over Pittsburgh on January 21, 2023 at the Peterson Events Center. Green Jr. led three Seminoles in double figure scoring; Green, Matthew Cleveland (11 points), and Caleb Mills (11 points) to improve the Seminoles' ACC record to 5-4. Green Jr. scored 24 points on 7-12 shooting from the field and shot 5-8 from the bonusphere. He was perfect from the free-throw line, making all five of his free-throw attempts. Cleveland scored 11 points on 4-7 shooting from the field, but fell two rebounds short of securing his ninth consecutive double-double and matching Reggie Royal's streak during the 1970-71 season. Mills' 11 points marked his tenth consecutive game scoring in double figures. Greg Elliot's early seven points on two-of-two 3-point field goals, helped Pitt jump out to an early 15-5 lead before a 17-2 run by the Seminoles fueled by Mills scoring eight points, and Green Jr scoring five to put the Seminoles ahead 22-17. The Seminoles hot shooting started the first half by shooting six-of-seven (.857 percent) from the bonusphere, allowing them to build a lead that grew to as many as 12 points (39-27). A pair of Pitt free throws cut the lead to ten points, before the half ended (39-29).

He is averaging 15.8 points scored per game since totaling 17 points against Nebraska on November 27 in the final game of the 2022 ESPN Events Invitational. Cleveland's current double-figure is currently the second longest double-figure scoring streak among all ACC Players. His double-figure scoring streak is the longest by a Seminole since Dwayne Bacon scored in double figures in the first 26 games of the 2016-17 season.

Chandler Jackson made his first career start on Wednesday against Syracuse and responded with seven points and a career-high nine assists in a career-high 26 minutes played. His nine assists were the most by a Seminole player since M.J. Walker totaled 10 assists against Louisville on January 18, 2021. The school record for assists in an ACC game is 13 by Delvon Arrington at Georgia Tech on January 9, 1999.

Freshman Chandler Jackson is averaging 5.3 points (37 total points) and has an assist:turnover ratio of 3.2:1 (16 assists against just five turnovers) in his last seven games since helping lead Florida State over Notre Dame, 84-71, on January 17.

Chandler Jackson's Confidence Increasing With Each Passing Game

Chandler Jackson's career is only just beginning.

Although Jackson has had a slow start to his freshman season due to his thumb injury, he has come on strong.

Growing up in Memphis, Jackson gained the love of basketball from his parents.

His mother, Norrishia Harden, was a basketball player and when Jackson was growing up she would shoot hoops with him. His dad, David Jackson, was a four-year starter on the basketball team at Western Illinois. After his college career was over, David played professionally in France, Italy, and Poland.

Chandler grew up playing and watching basketball, while learning the fundamentals of the game to prepare him for his career at Florida State.

Jackson enjoyed a stellar high school career, and received scholarship offers from many of the nation's top programs.

"I chose Florida State because of the program and the coaches," said Jackson. "Coach Hamilton and Coach Jones, that's who it was. I've been talking to Coach Jones since my sophomore year of high school, so he's been there. Coach Hamilton, he's going to make sure we're taken care of and that's what you're looking for in a coach.

I'm looking for leadership after basketball and after leaving college, and I know he's going to be there for me and for everybody else who comes through here."

In addition to missing a majority of the preseason, Jackson also missed the first three games of the season.

The first game we saw him back on the court after his injury was when Florida State played Florida. As the season continues, we can see he is beginning to gain more confidence and more minutes on the court.

"I had to have surgery, so that set me back. Said Jackson. "I missed all the off-season. Then, I came back and I was not as confident in my game because I had not played basketball for two months. I've grown more confident with every game I've played.

"I want to work on getting more confidence. That's the most important thing. Because you can't really go out there and do anything unless you're confident. Game by game I'm getting better and doing something else."

In the summer before his freshman season, Jackson traveled with his Seminole teammates to Canada for a 10-day trip north of the boarder.

Corhen Seeing More Playing Time Than Expected, Learning On Fly As Freshman

Cameron Corhen picked Florida State in part because the coaching staff has been willing to play freshmen. But he never dreamed he would see this many minutes.

When his roommate, Jaylan Gainey, tore his ACL in preseason practices, Corhen talked to assistant coach Stan Jones and knew immediately he would have a larger role.

"Coach Jones called me in his office," Corhen recalled. "'That's a lot of minutes coming your way. ... I know you're fresh out of high school. You're 18 years old, but it's time for you to grow up.'"

Corhen had to grow up fast. He has averaged 8.6 points and 3.4 rebounds, playing 24 minutes per game, but he has also poured in 16 points in each of his last two games. Corhen leads the team with 39 offensive rebounds, including five in the win at Louisville on Saturday — all of which resulted in put back baskets.

FSU (8-16, 5-7 ACC) has been depleted by injuries for a second straight season, including the losses of Gainey and versatile guard Cam'Ron Fletcher as well as the NCAA-mandated 16-game suspension for Baba Miller. While everyone from the coaching staff to fans can dream of what might have been with all three in the rotation from the start, the shorthanded Seminoles have instead had to battle and see how their freshmen develop.

"With young players, you don't want to sit around and have them try to figure out what their status is," Jones said. "I think that's been one of the strengths of working with Coach (Leonard) Hamilton and our staff over the years we're very good on talking kids through their roles and their role evolvement. How we think it is starting and how we hope it ends. When that went down with Jaylan being out, you had to try to make sure his mind understood that he wasn't going to have the luxury of just playing a minimal role and dipping his toes in the pool."

It's tough to project which freshmen are ready for what they will face when they make the jump from high school to college athletics. Corhen had some advantages. His dad, Richard, played basketball at Georgia for Hugh Durham from 1981-84. His mom, Kelly, played high school basketball and has helped him with the mental side of athletics. "They have different aspects of being those coaches," Corhen said. "My mom, she's personal and the emotional coach. And my dad, he's a real quiet dude. Doesn't know how to do the other stuff. He just knows basketball. It's like a tag team."

Corhen logging heavy minutes

The 6-foot-10, 225-pound Corhen was a four-star forward who chose FSU over a large number of schools in Sept. 2021. FSU was a good fit and Corhen felt he would play right away.

"I liked the style of play," Corhen said. "They play a lot of dues. Rotate dudes in. A lot of schools don't even play freshmen. I knew coming here I'd have a chance to get minutes and start going from there."

Corhen played 20 minutes in the season opener, scoring 10 points in a loss to Stetson. But his minutes steadily rose and he became a regular in the starting lineup by mid-December.

"I thought I was coming in six, 10 spot minutes a game," Corhen said. "Which I was fine with. I was cool with coming in slow and building my way up. I feel like I'm just grateful for that opportunity. And that's where my hard work comes from, because I know there's a lot of dudes who wish they could play, a lot of dudes who wish they could have the opportunity. I just have to keep grinding, keep getting better."

Corhen has scored nine or more points in seven of his last eight games. He has also shot 50 percent or better in all but one of those, FSU's road win at Pittsburgh. Corhen is shooting 81 percent from the free-throw line and has often been one of FSU's best rebounders.

Hamilton would rather not play freshmen this many minutes, let alone veterans. His expectations on both ends of the court can wear heavily on players. But FSU freshmen have logged heavy minutes in recent years, from Malik Beasley (29.8 minutes in 2015-16) and Dwayne Bacon (28.8 minutes in 2015-16) to Scottie Barnes (24.8 minutes in 2020-21) and Matthew Cleveland (26.2 minutes in 2021-22).

But a player that FSU coaches compare Corhen often to, Mfiondu Kabengele, was able to take a redshirt season. Corhen averages 24 minutes per game but he has played 29 or more in minutes in nine games this season, which is quite the load for a big man.

"Very few freshmen come into this league without having to make some adjustments," Hamilton said. "And when you're in a situation like Cam has been where he basically has been the guy playing 30 minutes a game, that's not as easy for them to adjust to at this level as maybe it would be if you have enough depth on your team. There's nothing unusual about him not being quite as consistent but I do feel his effort has been good. Different schemes cause him more challenges because he's adjusting to playing at this level in the ACC."

Comparisons to Kabengele

Corhen's 3-point shot is a work in progress, although the heavy minutes have impacted the accuracy of his shot.

Corhen has often been compared to Kabengele, a stretch 4 (forward) who developed his all-around game, was an ACC Sixth Man of the Year and was selected as a first-round pick in 2019. Thinking about the five offensive rebounds in the win at Louisville and the resulting 10 points, Corhen sees those as second-chance opportunities but also aspects of Kabengele's game that he's observed on film.

"Coach Jones always compares me to Mfiondu Kabengele," Corhen said. "And that's what he really did. A lot of it was offensive rebounding and get off block outs. I watch a lot of videos on him to figure out how to get easy points like that. Those are free points."

Jones and the staff have pushed Corhen to watch film of Kabengele for years.

"We've encouraged that since we were recruiting him," Jones said. "If not the top, he's in the top two or three guys in terms of amount of film they watch on their own without being asked to by coaches. I can see him, if he doesn't change his approach to the game, really having big jumps from year to year as it goes through his career."

The challenges for Corhen to round out his game are evident. He's just six of 26 (23.1 percent) from 3-point range, although he does have a good-looking jump shot. Part of the issue, Corhen and coaches admit, are the heavy minutes.

"I'm not shooting the ball as well as I usually have in the past," Corhen said. "I'm scoring other ways. The legs aspect of it. Switching one through five, I could guard the ball for 20 seconds, then my legs are dead, then I got to go shoot the ball. I have to adjust to that. I'm trying to work on my conditioning as well as shooting in practice."

Switching one through five is an adjustment for Corhen, who is being asked to do things that a veteran has done in past seasons. While a forward like Malik Osborne excelled in defending everyone from a point guard to a center, Corhen has had to learn as a freshman for extended periods of time.

"It was definitely an adjustment but I feel like I adjusted pretty good just because, for a big man, I have quick feet," Corhen said. "So it wasn't the quickness aspect. It was just the mental part about it that threw me off. I feel like I'm adjusting pretty well."

Gainey is Corhen's roommate and has also helped with aspects of his game and teaching the freshman how to get in better positioning to block shots.

"He's an older, mature dude," Corhen said. "He is a great shot blocker. I ask him for tips about that because I'm trying to improve my defense, my shot blocking. He helps me a lot."

Optimism for FSU's finish

Hamilton said a few weeks back that the Seminoles have been consistently inconsistent. That's in large part a result of the injuries as well as a competitive middle of the ACC, where FSU is among five teams with between six and eight league wins. That also includes blue bloods like Duke and North Carolina, as well as Syracuse. The Orange are 14-10, 7-6 ACC going into Wednesday's game at FSU (7 p.m. on ACC Network).

FSU has battled often, especially on the road in picking up back-to-back wins over Notre Dame and Pittsburgh. The Seminoles have also started flat in games, notably the three straight losses to Miami, Clemson and at NC State. A late lead at Louisville also nearly slipped away on Saturday.

"I think we may have taken too much out of that thinking we're better than what we were," Corhen said. "Because we came back and then Miami came in and beat us. We have to stay level-headed."

Corhen is optimistic about how FSU can finish. With seven regular-season games left, he wants to see the Seminoles secure one of the top nine spots going into the ACC Tournament to avoid playing five games in five days. From there anything can happen, Corhen thinks.

"I feel like if we get four games in four days we can win the ACC Tournament and get a bid for March Madness," Corhen said. "We just want to finish strong. ... I feel like we've shown that we can compete with any team in the ACC, even any team in the country. I do believe we can do that."

That is a bold statement considering what the Seminoles have been through this season. But if there are reasons to be encouraged about where the program is going, maybe not this March but in 2023-24, it's because of freshmen like Corhen who are earning early playing time — far more than expected — and learning as they go.

"He's grown his game," Jones said. "I think everybody can see he's added some versatility to spots he scores on consistently. He's extending his range, which we always felt like he had a potential to do that. And he's growing up from an emotional and a maturity perspective. He's still 18 years old."

LOUISVILLE, Ky. -- Cameron Corhen scored a team-high 16 points on seven made field goals and two free throws to lead Florida State to an 81-78 victory over the Louisville Cardinals at the KFC YUM! Center. Corhen led five Seminoles in double figure scoring -- Corhen, Matthew Cleveland (15 points), Jalen Warley (14 points), Darin Green Jr. (12 points), and Caleb Mills (11 points) to help Florida State earn its sixth conference win of the season. Corhen led the Seminoles for the second game in a row in scoring. His 16 points at Louisville put him in double figures for the eighth time in his first collegiate season.
