Jackets Open ACC Tournament vs. FSU

Carrying the momentum of two road wins to close out the regular season, Georgia Tech opens the New Life Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament by facing Florida State at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Greensboro (N.C.) Coliseum. The winner of their game Tuesday will face No. 5 seed Pittsburgh at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday.

Georgia Tech (14-17, 6-14 ACC) is the 13th seed in the tournament but enters the week having won its last three games and five of its last seven conference games. The Yellow Jackets won their first two ACC road games of the season last week, running past Syracuse, 96-76, and defeating Boston College, 73-65, on its Senior Day, which followed an 83-67 victory over Louisville in its final home game on Feb. 25.

Florida State (9-22, 7-13 ACC), the No. 12 seed, started its conference schedule by winning five of nine games, including a 75-64 decision over Georgia Tech on Jan. 7. But the Seminoles have lost nine of 11 since, winning only at Louisville (81-78) on Feb. 4 and at Miami (85-84) on Feb. 25.

Tuesday's game will be televised live on the ACC Network with a live stream of the broadcast available the ESPN app. Radio coverage is on the Georgia Tech Sports Network by Legends Sports, carried in Atlanta on 680 the Fan (680 AM and 93.7 FM), and nationally on SiriusXM satellite radio (channels TBD).

The Tip-Off

• Georgia Tech and Florida State are battling in the ACC Tournament for the fourth time. The Seminoles have won two of the three prior meetings (by a total of three points), but the Yellow Jackets' victory came in the championship game of the 2021 tournament by an 80-75 score in Greensboro.

• Tech has played 28 of its 66 ACC Tournament games at the Greensboro Coliseum, posting an 11-17 record with one championship in 2021 and three runner-up finishes in 1986, 1996 and 2010.

• Tech is 4-12 all-time in Tuesday opening round games at the ACC Tournament and has lost its last four dating back to an 88-85 overtime victory against Clemson in 2016.

• Tech's upswing over the last month of the season has been spurred by the emergence of its two transfers, senior guard **Lance Terry** and senior center **Ja'von Franklin**, who have averaged 14.2 and 14.1 points, respectively, over the last nine games.

• Tech has averaged 75.6 points per game over that stretch, connected on 45.6 percent of its shots from the floor and 39.6 percent of its three-point attempts. The Jackets have averaged 10.3 three-point field goals made.

• Tech's leading scorer, sophomore guard **Miles Kelly**, has averaged 20.2 points and 3.7 rebounds over the Yellow Jackets' last six games, all in double figures, hitting 49.4 percent from the floor and 45.9 percent from three-point range. He has hit 23 three-point field goals over Tech's last four games.

• Over Tech's last eight ACC games, the Yellow Jackets' rotation has shortened to six or seven players, with the five starters playing nearly 85 percent of the minutes.

• At the moment, Tech's offensive efficiency rating as measured by KenPom.com is 104.3, the highest for the Jackets in seven seasons under Josh Pastner.

• Tech's season turnover rate of 10.8 per game is its lowest on record dating back to the 1992-93 season, when turnovers became an official NCAA statistic. The Jackets have turned it over just 9.5 times per game in its last eight ACC games.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 42 ACC Tournaments (did not play in 2020 due to NCAA sanctions), and has a 28-38 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won four championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte), 1993 (Charlotte) and 2021 (Greensboro).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010), 2-5 under Brian Gregory, and 1-3 under Josh Pastner.

Tech did not play in the 2020 tournament while serving an NCAA postseason ban.

V-Shaped Recovery

After sinking to its low point this season with a 43-point loss at home to Duke and a loss at last-place Louisville as the calendar turned to February, Georgia Tech has picked itself up off the deck and won six of its last nine games, five of eight in conference. The turn around began, oddly enough, with a 72-64 loss at NC State on Feb. 4, a game that the Yellow Jackets led inside the final two minutes.

In those six games, Terry has averaged 19.6 points while connecting on 48.8 percent of his field goals, 54.8 percent of his three-point attempts (23-of-42).

Kelly's Hot

While Georgia Tech's two transfers have provided a foundation for a late-season surge, sophomore guard **Miles Kelly** has amplified it with the hottest streak of his career, averaging 20.2 points over Tech's last five ACC games while connecting on 49.1 percent of his field goals and 45.9 percent of his three-point attempts.

Kelly has made five or more three-point field goals in each of his last four games, a feat duplicated by only one other Tech player, **Lewis Clinch** in 2009. No Tech player has made five or more threes in five straight games

Series Notes vs. Florida State

- Florida State snapped a three-game losing streak in the series with a 75-64 win over Tech in Tallahassee in the teams' only scheduled regular-season meeting of the 2022-23 season. The Seminoles have won 16 of the last 21 meetings in the series and hold a 45-32 advantage all-time.
- Since FSU joined the ACC, Tech is 22-31 against the Seminoles. Florida State won the first six in a row, Tech followed

by winning five straight, and is 17-25 against the Seminoles since then.

- In those 53 games, 22 have been decided by four points or less, 33 by fewer than 10 points. One of those games went to double-overtime, which the Yellow Jackets won 111-108 on Feb. 11, 1999 in Tallahassee.

- Tech is 19-18 against the Seminoles in Atlanta, 3-3 at McCamish Pavilion.

- Tech is 11-19 against Seminoles teams led by head coach **Leonard Hamilton**. Tech is 12-19 against Hamilton overall, with a victory over his Miami team in December of 1997.

- Tech is 11-25 in games played in Tallahassee, including an 8-18 mark at the Donald L. Tucker Civic Center, formerly known as the Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center. The Jackets are 0-5 in Tallahassee with **Josh Pastner** as head coach.

- Tech and Florida State were both members of the old Metro Conference from 1976-78, and the Seminoles won three of those four meetings.

- Florida State has won two of the three ACC Tournament meetings between the schools, but Tech defeated the Seminoles, 80-75, in the championship game of the 2021 tournament. The three games have been decided by a total of eight points.

This Season vs. Florida State

January 7, 2023 in Atlanta - Lance Terry scored a team-high 17 points and Miles Kelly added 16, but Georgia Tech surrendered runs of 11-0 late in the first half and 10-0 early in the second half, falling 75-64 to Florida State at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

Looking to build on the momentum of first ACC win over No. 12 Miami, the Yellow Jackets (8-7, 1-4 ACC) led by as many as nine points in the opening half but could not sustain it. The Seminoles (5-11, 3-2 ACC) made 10 three-point field goals in the game and capitalized on eight second-half turnovers by Tech to win the game.

Tech held a 34-28 advantage at the 4:18 mark on Deivon Smith's running jumper. But the Seminoles put together an 11-0 run to take the lead before Deebo Coleman's layup with 19 seconds to go left the Jackets trailing 39-36 at intermission.

Tech missed its first six field goal attempts of the second half before Terry's driving layup at the 15:57 mark. FSU made four of five attempts and built a 47-40 lead, forcing Tech to call timeout at 15:06. Another 10-0 run by the Seminoles, fueled by four Tech turnovers, expended the lead to 55-40 at the 13:37 mark, forcing the Jackets to take their final timeout of the game.

FSU continued to build its lead to as many as 22 points before the Jackets finished the game by outscoring the Seminoles 14-2. Tech made seven 3s in first half, but none in second until Coleman drained on at the 4:58 mark. By then FSU was up 73-51, its largest lead.

As he did in the first half against Miami Wednesday, Kelly came out hot, scoring 16 of Tech's first 23 points in the game. He hit his first six shots from the floor, including four three-pointers, but he missed his last eight attempts and did not score again.

Matthew Cleveland led the Seminoles with 21 points and 12 rebounds, his fifth straight double-double. Darin Green, after missing all five of his three-point attempts in the first half, made 4-of-6 after intermission and finished with 18 points. Caleb Mills added 13.

Last Time Out

Miles Kelly knocked down a pair of three-point field goals to ignite an 11-0 rally, bringing Georgia Tech back from a nine-point deficit and enabling the Yellow Jackets to capture a 73-65 victory over Boston College Saturday afternoon at the Silvio O. Conte Forum.

Tech (14-17, 6-14 ACC) finished the regular-season with two straight road victories and has won six of its last eight games. The Yellow Jackets, who had already locked in the 13th seed in next week's ACC Tournament, defeated Boston College for the fifth straight time in the series and for the third straight time in Chestnut Hill. The Eagles (15-16, 9-11 ACC) saw their three-game winning streak snapped and will be the No. 10 seed in the ACC Tournament.

The Jackets had fallen behind 55-46 with just under 10 minutes left in the game after BC went on a 13-2 run, and had missed 16 of their last 17 three-point tries. Kelly, who finished the game with 21 points, drained a three on Tech's next possession, then hit another after a BC turnover to bring Tech within 55-52 at the 9:16 mark. **Lance Terry** hit another three to tie the game and made a pair of free throws on back-to-back possessions to put the Yellow Jackets ahead, 57-55, with 6:48 to go.

The teams went back-and-forth for the next five minutes, with two lead changes and two ties before Kelly gave Tech the lead for good (66-63) with another three, this one from NBA range at the 1:46 mark. Sturdivant followed with another three for a 69-63 lead with just under a minute to go, then sealed the game with four straight free throws.

Tech started out by making its first three 3-point tries, missed 16 of its next 17 attempts, then made seven of nine in the final 10 minutes of the game, finishing the game 11-of-29 from distance.

A Make-or-Miss Game

Kelly hit 7-of-14 shots from the floor, including 5-of-11 three-pointers, for his 21 points. Terry scored 17 points, including three three-pointers, and had seven rebounds, and Sturdivant finished with 14 points and four assists. **Ja'von Franklin** had eight points and 15 rebounds, missing a double-double when he went 0-for-2 at the foul line in the final minute.

Atlanta native T.J. Bickerstaff led the Eagles with 15 points, followed by Zackery with 14 and C.J. Penha with 13.

Team Trends

- Georgia Tech finished the regular season winning six of its final nine games, and five of its final eight ACC games.

- Tech finished the regular season by winning back-to-back road games for the first time since beating Miami and Virginia Tech back to back in February of 2021.

- Tech's late-season run lifted the Yellow Jackets from No. 228 in the NCAA NET rankings to No. 177.

- Tech has scored 70 points or more in seven of its last eight games (Notre Dame, Wake Forest, Virginia Tech, Florida Tech, Louisville, Syracuse, Boston College), the only exception being its 68-point game at Pittsburgh. The Yellow Jackets are 12-2 this season when scoring 70 or more points (6-2 in the ACC), 2-15 when failing to reach 70.

- Tech has exceeded 100 points per 100 possessions (KenPom offensive efficiency rating) in each of its last eight games, the Yellow Jackets' longest such streak since the 2021 ACC Championship unit did so in its final 10 games.

- Tech also has limited four of its last six opponents under 100 points per 100 possessions defensively.

- Tech continues to lead the ACC in three-point defense and is 17th nationally, allowing 29.8 percent from distance.

- Tech has outshot seven of its last nine opponents from the floor, holding them collectively to 42.8 percent overall, 28.0 percent from three-point range. The Yellow Jackets are 12-2 this season when they have a higher field goal percentage.

- Going back to Tech's Feb. 15 win over Virginia Tech (last six games), Tech has averaged 11.5 three-point field goals per game, making 40.4 percent.

- Over Tech's last eight ACC games, Miles Kelly, Lance Terry, Deebo Coleman and Kyle Sturdivant have combined to hit 41.8 percent (82-of-196) from three-point range.

- Four Tech players (**Miles Kelly** 17.4, **Ja'von Franklin** 14.3, **Lance Terry** 13.6 ppg, **Kyle Sturdivant** 12.6) are averaging double digits in points over the Yellow Jackets' last eight ACC games, and a fifth (Deebo Coleman) is averaging 9.0.

- Tech has assisted on 55.7 percent of its field goals across its last nine games.

- Four or more Yellow Jackets have reached double digits in the scoring column in 16 games this season, and Tech has won 12 of those games.

- Only three Tech players have fouled out of a game this season. The fewest disqualifications by fouls by the Yellow Jackets over the past 57 years (1966-67 to the present) is five, by the 2011-12 and 2015-16 teams.

- Tech has utilized the same starting lineup for nine straight games, winning six of them, the longest stretch of games this season that head coach Josh Pastner has sent out the same

starting five for the opening tip. Tech has used 11 different lineups this season.

- Tech has used only six players in its rotation for its last four games. After having its bench play more than 33 percent of the minutes this season prior to that, Tech's reserves have played only 70 of a possible 800 minutes in the last four games (8.8 percent).

Triple Play

Georgia Tech has connected on 41 three-point field goals in 96 attempts in its last three games (42.7 percent), making 11 or more in each game, including a school-record 18 at Syracuse on Feb. 28. They are the most three-point field goals the Yellow Jackets have made over any three-game stretch in Tech history.

It is the first time Tech has made 10 or more threes in three straight games since the 2001-02 season, when the Jackets turned the trick against Florida State (10), North Carolina (12) and Clemson (11) in consecutive games. It has happened one other time, during the 1995-96 season vs. Duke (10), North Carolina (10) and Western Carolina (10). Tech has never made 10 or more threes in four consecutive games.

Low TO is a Good Thing

Georgia Tech committed just five turnover against Boston College, marking the fifth time this season that the Yellow Jackets have turned it over five times or fewer, including a Tech-record-tying four in a Feb. 21 loss at Pittsburgh. Going back to the 1986-87 season, Tech is on record for only seven games of five or fewer turnovers between then and this season. (*Thanks to Tech radio voice Andy Demetra for pointing this out.*)

Tech's current turnover rate of 10.8 per game exceeds its best on record going back to 1992-93, when turnovers became an official NCAA statistic, ahead of the 11.1-per-game rate established by the Jackets in 2015-16 and 2020-21.

Player Updates

- **Ja'von Franklin** has grabbed 15 rebounds in two straight games, the first time a Tech player has taken 15 or more in back-to-back games since Charles Mitchell had 15 vs. Wake Forest and 19 vs. Clemson back-to-back during the 2015-16 season.

- Franklin has averaged a double-double over the Yellow Jackets' last nine games (14.1 points and 11.9 rebounds). He has hit 63.5 percent of his shots from the floor (54-of-85) in that span, and also has totaled team-highs of 34 assists, 18 blocked shots and 16 steals.

- Franklin has four double-doubles and one triple-double in his last seven games, coming up two points shy of another at Boston College when he missed two free throws in the final minute. He has eight double-doubles (including the triple-double) this season.

- Franklin is the only player to rank in the top 10 in rebound average (7th), steal average (7th) and blocked shot average (5th) in conference games. At 6-7 and 214 pounds, Franklin is out-sized by nearly every ACC center.

- **Lance Terry** has played the full 40 minutes in five of Tech's six ACC wins. At Syracuse, he came out for the final 56 seconds when Tech emptied its bench in the 20-point victory. In those six games, Terry has averaged 19.2 points while connecting on 48.8 percent of his field goals (40-of-82), 54.8 percent of his three-point attempts (23-of-42).

- In nine games since returning from a hamstring injury, Terry has averaged 14.2 points while hitting 45.5 percent of his field goals (46-of-101) and 46.9 percent of his threes (23-of-49). Terry has reached double figures in points seven times in those nine games, including his season-high-matching 24 points at Syracuse.

- **Miles Kelly** has reached double figures in six straight games, averaging 20.2 points and hitting 41-of-83 from the floor (49.4 pct.) and 28-of-61 from three-point range (45.9 pct.). This comes after a stretch in which he scored in double

digits just three times in nine games and averaged 9.8 points.

- Kelly is the first Tech player to make at least five three-point field goals in four consecutive games (6 vs. Pitt, 5 vs. Louisville, 7 vs. Syracuse, 5 vs. Boston College) since Lewis Clinch did so during the 2008-09 season (6 vs. Wake Forest, 6 vs. Clemson, 6 vs. North Carolina, 9 vs. Miami). Clinch's streak ended at four games.

- Kelly's 88.68-percent rate on free throws (47-of-53) is slightly behind the Tech record of 88.73 percent by Anthony Morrow (63-of-71) in 2005-06. Kelly had a streak of 24 straight makes that ended Jan. 17 against NC State.

- **Kyle Sturdivant** has averaged 12.6 points over his last 10 games, having reached double figures in eight of them, including his career high of 20 points at Syracuse. He has made 19-of-47 from three-point range (40.4 pct.) over that stretch.

- Sturdivant has a 38/16 assist/turnover ratio in his last 10 games.

- **Deebo Coleman** has not scored in double figures in any Tech's last five games, but he has an 18/3 assist/turnover ratio across those games.

- **Jalon Moore** is the only Tech reserve to see significant action over Tech's last four games, averaging 16.3 minutes and 5.8 points per game.

Sturdy Sturdivant

Senior point guard **Kyle Sturdivant** has played the best basketball of his career over Georgia Tech's last 10 games, and has become indispensable in the wake of an ankle injury that has sidelined the other Yellow Jacket point guard, Deivon Smith, for the last five games.

The 6-3 native of Norcross, Ga., has averaged 12.6 points over the last 10 games, having reached double figures in eight of them. He has made 19-of-47 from three-point range (40.4 pct.) over that stretch, and has a 38/16 assist/turnover ratio in his last 10 games.

He accomplished Tech's first point/assist double-double in six years when he scored 11 points with 10 assists on Tech's Senior Day victory against Louisville. He scored a career-high 20 points to help the Jackets run away with a 96-76 win at Syracuse.

In Tech's last four games without Smith, Sturdivant has played more than 37 minutes in each game and averaged 15.3 points and 5.5 assists, hitting 48.8 percent of his shots from the floor and 13-of-13 at the free throw line.

Sophomore Boost

Georgia Tech's sophomore class - **Miles Kelly**, **Deebo Coleman** and **Jalon Moore** - who comprised a 2021 signing class ranked 28th in the nation, are expectedly developing into the core group for the Yellow Jackets.

They currently occupy three of the top five spots in scoring on the Jackets' stat sheet, accounting for 44.7 percent of the team's points (45.4 percent in ACC games). They have combined for 43.8 percent of the shots taken from the floor (45.1 percent in ACC games).

Coleman, a Memphis native who was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Florida following his senior year at West Nassau HS, is the highest rated prospect (No. 48) to sign with the Yellow Jackets under Josh Pastner. Kelly, a Stone Mountain, Ga., native who attended Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia following high school, was rated No. 87. Moore was a 3-star prospect out of Birmingham, Ala., ranked No. 120.

Kelly's Leap

The player who has taken the biggest leap from one year to the next this season for Georgia Tech is undoubtedly sophomore Miles Kelly. The 6-6 guard has emerged as one of the ACC's better scorers and one of its top three-point shooters.

Only three players in Tech history have managed to increase their scoring averages by 10 or more points year-over-year, and Kelly is within a reasonable range of becoming the fourth, having raised his norm by 9.7 points from his freshman season.

Kelly's points-per-game improvement in his scoring average is the second-best in the ACC this season.

He also currently has the third-highest scoring increase among Tech sophomores from their freshman seasons.

General Storylines

- **108th season** - Georgia Tech is playing its 108th season of basketball in 2022-23, having compiled an all-time on-court record of 1,435-1,304 (22 wins and one loss from the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons were vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions).

- **Tech in the ACC** - Tech is playing its 44th season as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, having won the conference championship in 1985, 1990, 1993 and 2021. Prior to that, Tech competed in the Metro Conference for three seasons from 1975-78, was an independent from 1964-75, and was a member of the Southeastern Conference for 32 years from 1932-64, winning one title in 1938.

- Tech is playing its seventh season under head coach Josh Pastner, who has built the Tech program based on a "get old and stay old" philosophy, elevating the talent level incrementally through ever-improving high school recruiting and attracting transfers who went to high school in the Atlanta area.

- Tech was projected to finish last in the ACC standings by a vote of the conference's official media panel before the season and finished 13th, the sixth time in seven seasons under Josh Pastner that the Yellow Jackets have finished above their projection.

- Tech's eight returning scholarship players from 2021-22 combined to start 100 games in 2021-22, and logged 53.8 percent of the minutes played.

- Four seniors, all rotation players, completed their Tech careers in 2021-22 and graduated in May. **Michael Devoe** (Ontario c/ippers/G League) and **Jordan Usher** (Turkey) are playing professional basketball. **Khalid Moore** (Fordham) and **Bubba Parham** (Samford) elected to pursue graduate transfer opportunities for their final season of eligibility.

Jackets At-A-Glance

Georgia Tech returned eight players who logged significant playing time during 2021-22, as it looked to replace the scoring punch of **Michael Devoe** and **Jordan Usher**, who combined to average more than 32 points per game in the Yellow Jackets' 12-20 campaign.

Among the eight key letterwinners returning are two starters from the 2021-22 squad, both seniors in 6-3 point guard **Kyle Sturdivant** (7.6 ppg, 2.3 apg) and 6-11 center **Rodney Howard** (6.5 ppg, 5.1 rpg), as well as the backup point guard, 6-1 junior **Deivon Smith** (5.7 ppg, 2.0 apg) and a rising trio of sophomore perimeter players in 6-6 **Dallan "Deebo" Coleman** (6.2 ppg), 6-6 **Miles Kelly** (4.5 ppg) and 6-7 **Jalon Moore** (2.8 ppg). Junior 6-2 guard **Tristan Maxwell** and 6-8 junior forward **Jordan Meka** return to provide additional depth.

Pastner and his staff augmented the eight returnees with a pair of transfers in 6-2 guard **Lance Terry** (14.3 ppg at Gardner-Webb) and 6-7 forward **Ja'von Franklin** (12.2 ppg, 7.8 rpg at South Alabama), and over the summer signed a pair of international players - 6-8 forward **Freds Pauls Bagatskis** from Latvia and 7-foot center **Cyril Martynov** of Canada.

Program Trends

- **Less experienced** - According to KenPom.com, Tech ranks No. 258 nationally in Division I experience (average 1.54 years per player) and No. 148 in minutes continuity (46.8 percent), a measure of playing minutes from 2021-22 carrying over to 2022-23. That's significantly lower than last season's team - No. 162 (average 1.99 years per player) and No. 149 in minutes continuity (52.3 percent), and far below the ACC Championship team of 2021 - No. 4 (2.54 years) and 10 (75.2), respectively.

- **Two fouls in the first half?** No problem. Georgia Tech ranks No. 4 in the nation in two-foul participation at 58.0 percent, a measure of percentage of available minutes played by players with two fouls. No power conference teams rank higher. Yet Tech has had only three players foul out of a game this season. Tech has ranked No. 6 or higher each of the last five years, leading the nation in this category in 2020 and 2021.

- **Bench minutes** - Josh Pastner has expanded his rotation in the last two seasons, ranking No. 186 in minutes played by its reserves (30.9 percent) this season, after coming in at No. 239 (28.4 percent) in 2021-22. Tech's minutes have been spread more evenly than at anytime in Pastner's tenure, with only two players averaging 30 minutes, and nine averaging 11 or more minutes per game.

Pastner's Key Metrics

- **Assists to made field goals:** The Jackets have assisted on 54.0 percent of their field goals this season (56.3 percent in ACC games), and ranks No. 117 in the nation, according to KenPom.com. Tech has been as high as 50 percent in 19 games. Tech's nightly goal is to assist on 60 percent of its made field goals, which Tech has met eight times this season.

- **Free throws made to opponents' attempts:** Tech went 10-of-13 from the free throw line to Boston College's 9-of-11. Tech's goal each night is to make more free throws than the opponent attempts, which it has done in six games. This season, Tech has scored 9.9 points per game from the foul line, just 8.6 per ACC game. Tech has been outscored at the stripe by 4.6 points per ACC game. The Yellow Jackets have scored 14.2 percent of their points at the stripe (No. 344 in the nation), 12.8 percent in ACC games.

- **Turnovers:** Tech has a plus-0.3 turnover margin this season (eight turnovers fewer than its opponents), and has won the turnover battle 16 times in 31 games (three ties), primarily because opponents are committing an average of just 11.1 per game. Tech's turnover rate of 10.8 per game is its best since turnovers have been tracked (1992-93 season). The Jackets are minus-1.2 in ACC games (ACC foes have turned the ball

over just 10.1 times per game). Tech's target is 11 or fewer each night, which it has met 20 times this season (compared to 13 times last season). Under Pastner, when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 59-40. When it has committed more, it is 45-61.

• **Guard rebounding:** Tech's perimeter players grabbed 15 of its 28 defensive rebounds against Boston College and has taken 509 of 763 for the season (66.7 percent), compared to 77.1 percent of the total defensive rebounds last season.

Early Development

The 2021-22 season represented the most extensive college experience that most of the players on Georgia Tech's roster had accumulated. Of the 12 players who saw rotation minutes for Georgia Tech, only seniors **Michael Devoe**, **Jordan Usher**, **Khalid Moore** and **Bubba Parham** had extensive experience entering the season, and all have graduated.

Tech ranks No. 258 in the nation in Division-I experience (1.54 years on average) according to KenPom.com, a metric that takes into account the players' class weighted by minutes played in previous seasons. That ranks 13th in the ACC. Only Syracuse, Duke and Louisville have less experience by that measurement.

Notre Dame (3), Virginia (4), Pittsburgh (17), North Carolina (25), Miami (27), NC State (46) and Wake Forest (60) all have D-I experience averages above 2.5 years.

Tech's top eight returning players combined to start only 69 games last season, **Kyle Sturdivant** and **Rodney Howard** combined for 53 of those starts after having started a total of 12 games previously.

Incoming transfers **Ja'von Franklin** and **Lance Terry** started 31 games each last season at South Alabama and Gardner-Webb, respectively, but only six combined before that. They represent the top two career scorers on the Yellow Jackets roster - Terry beginning the season with 598 points and Franklin with 419. Sturdivant was Tech's top returning scorer with 376.

Wire-to-Wire

Though he employed a tight playing rotation in his first five seasons at Georgia Tech, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons, head coach Josh Pastner has expanded his rotation since the beginning of last season, utilizing nine players on a regular basis, sometimes 10, reflecting deeper talent on the Tech roster.

Only one of Pastner's Tech teams (2018-19) has ranked higher in bench minutes than this year's squad - No. 186 nationally at 30.9 percent, and Tech's rate is above the national average for the second time in Pastner's tenure.

Tech's minutes have been spread more evenly this season than at anytime in Pastner's term; only two players average as many as 30 minutes per game, and nine average more than 11.

However, over Tech's last eight ACC games, the rotation

has shortened to 6 or 7 players, with the five starters playing nearly 93 percent of the minutes.

A Yellow Jacket played all 40 minutes of a game seven times this season (Lance Terry vs. Miami, Notre Dame, Virginia Tech, Louisville, Boston College; Deebo Coleman vs. Syracuse and Pitt, Ja'von Franklin vs. Pitt). Miles Kelly is the highest ranked Tech player in usage rate (80.3 pct., No. 293 nationally), according to KenPom.com. For comparison, Jose Alvarado had a 90.5-percent usage rate and ranked 24th nationally in 2020-21, and Michael Devoe had an 82.5-percent usage rate and ranked No. 188 last season.

Also, Tech's bench has contributed more points than its opponent in 16 of 29 games this season, and ranks No. 3 in the ACC in that stat at 18.7 points per game.

Extending its Range

Georgia Tech has lived and succeeded by playing excellent defense during its time under Josh Pastner, and also has steadily improved offensively over that time as the Yellow Jackets acquired better outside shooters.

Tech has posted its highest national rankings the last two-plus seasons in both percentage of field goal attempts taken from beyond the three-point arc and in percentage of points scored on three-pointers.

Assisted Living

Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner preached and prodded his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals.

Until the current season, Tech has consistently been above the national average and maintained a high rate in ACC games. The Yellow Jackets finished the 2021-22 season ranked No. 122 at 53.1 percent. The Jackets finished the 2020-21 season No. 53 nationally at 57.1 percent and held the second-highest mark in ACC games only (58.8 pct.).

Tech has improved its assist/made FG ratio in conference play this year, assisting on 56.2 percent of made field goals this season (No. 4 in the ACC).

Build the Wall

Due to its ability to play creative versions of both zone and man-to-man to keep opponents off-balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its mixture of defenses to win games over Josh Pastner's tenure at Tech.

Tech, which lacks frontcourt size (only one rotation player taller than 6-7), currently sits at No. 139 (104.1 points per 100 possessions), according to KenPom.com, its lowest ranking and highest efficiency rating since the website began tracking in 1997.

Tech has, however, limited three of its last four foes under 100 points per 100 possessions, and continues to lead the ACC in three-point percentage defense and ranks No. 17 nationally.

Building Depth

The upward progress of Georgia Tech's program is evident in the development of its recruiting classes under head coach Josh Pastner, each of whom has played significant minutes and made significant contributions on the ACC level. Though not highly-rated in terms of rankings, the players have a wide range of skills and have developed into consistent conference-level performers for the next couple of years.

Evidence of that is apparent in the fact that Pastner has consistently played eight to 10 players in his rotation during the 2021-22 season after generally keeping Tech's rotation to no more than seven or eight in his first five seasons. Eight Yellow Jackets averaged double-digit minutes in ACC play this season.

a. The 2017-18 class of Jose Alvarado, Evan Cole and Moses Wright combined to start 205 games (Cole graduated and transferred after the 2020-21 season). Alvarado and Wright started every game of the 2020-21 season (except for the NCAA Tournament game against Loyola which Wright missed) and were the Jackets' top two scorers and played

the most minutes. Wright became Georgia Tech's first ACC Player of the Year since 1990, and Alvarado was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year.

b. The 2018-19 class of Michael Devoe, Khalid Moore and Kristian Sjolund combined to start 213 games (Sjolund redshirted before transferring to UTEP after the 2019-20 season). Devoe started 106 games over his four seasons, was the Jackets' No. 3 scorer in 2020-21 and No. 1 in 2021-22, was named the ACC Tournament MVP in 2021 and third-team All-ACC in 2021-22. Moore started 63 games in his career and was a key contributor in ways that don't always show up in the box score.

c. James Banks III, who transferred from Texas, and Jordan Usher, a transfer from Southern California, started 54 games, contributed 17.7 points, 12.0 rebounds and played 56.2 minutes per game in 2019-20. Banks moved on to play professionally and is in the G League with the Dallas Mavericks affiliate in Texas, while Usher started all but one game over two-plus seasons and was the Jackets' No. 2 scorer in 2021-22.

d. Next up - Tech's 2021 signing class of Deebo Coleman, Miles Kelly and Jalon Moore, a class ranked as high as No. 28 nationally, served notice as the core of the team the next few years. They combined to average 40 minutes and 8.3 points per game in 2021-22, and are averaging 83 minutes and 33.7 points per game combined this season.

Five-Star Player Development

Notable player development successes over the past four seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers, Tadic Jackson, Abdoulaye Gueye, James Banks III, Jose Alvarado, Moses Wright and Michael Devoe, who maximized their skill sets and their production under the current coaching staff.

Josh Okogie went from being ranked 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. Gueye, a 6-9 forward, developed from a project player into an ACC-level contributor in the first two seasons with the current staff, and is now in his fourth season with the Minnesota Timberwolves. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston had similar statistical numbers at the ACC level as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh, and is now playing professionally overseas.

James Banks III, a 6-10 center, made the ACC's All-Defensive team twice in two years and finished his career No. 8 in blocked shots at Tech.

Jose Alvarado, a three-star guard out of Brooklyn, N.Y., who started as a freshman, improved his scoring, shooting and ballhandling every year as a Yellow Jacket, finishing his career with 1,429 points and ranking among the top 10 in Tech history in assists, steals and three-point field goals. He became the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year and a second-team All-ACC choice in 2021, and is now on the roster of the NBA's New Orleans Pelicans.

Moses Wright, an unheralded and unrated prospect from Raleigh, N.C., became a stalwart in the Tech lineup as a junior and the ACC Player of the Year as a senior. The 6-9 forward was Tech's leading scorer and rebounder on an ACC Championship squad and also made the conference all-defensive team. He was signed to the Los Angeles Clippers G League affiliate as

Miami was the last team to play Tech there, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

a free agent, then signed a two-way contract with the Dallas Mavericks midway through the 2021-22 season.

Michael Devoe, a four-star prospect out of Orlando, Fla., came to Tech as a heralded scorer and outside shooter, but developed into a much more rounded player by his senior year, when he led the Jackets in scoring and assists and was the team's third-leading rebounder and second-leading steal artist. As a senior, he was one of only nine players in Division I to average 17.9 points, 4.9 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.4 steals. Devoe played in the L.A. Clippers' summer league team and currently plays for its G League team.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have worked to make McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2016-17, including a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 37-29 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 9-11 mark against ranked opponents.

Tech is 80-42 at McCamish Pavilion under Pastner, 123-68 since the building opened for the 2012-13 season.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech has played 10 seasons in McCamish Pavilion, which was essentially brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

Three Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 46 draft picks overall. A total of 42 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Three former Georgia Tech players opened the 2022-23 season on NBA rosters - Jose Alvarado in his second season with the New Orleans Pelicans, Josh Okogie in his first season with the Phoenix Suns after playing four years in Minnesota, and Thaddeus Young, a 15-year NBA veteran beginning his first full season with the Toronto Raptors.

Derrick Favors, a 10-year NBA veteran who found himself a free agent at the beginning of the 2022-23 season, signed a 10-day contract with the Atlanta Hawks on Jan. 11 and re-entered free agency when it expired.

Moses Wright, who was on the Dallas Mavericks roster last season, signed a contract to play in China and is enjoying a successful season there.

Two other former Yellow Jackets are on G League rosters. Former center James Banks III is a member of the Texas Legends, the Mavericks' affiliate. while Michael Devoe, who graduated from Tech last spring, plays for the Ontario (Calif.) Clippers.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated, with the exception 2019 senior Ben Lammers, who is playing pro ball overseas and needs to complete one course, and 2021 senior Jose Alvarado, who likewise needs to complete one course

Eleven different Georgia Tech players have made the ACC All-Academic team since it was established in 2011, with Marcus Georges-Hunt and Tadic Jackson making it twice.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Tournament 17 times in its history. Sixteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present, 10 under Bobby Cremins and five under Paul Hewitt.

The most recent was 2021, when the Yellow Jackets won the ACC Championship and earned an automatic bid, then fell 71-60 to Loyola Chicago in the opening round of the Midwest Regional.

That ended an 11-year hiatus from the NCAA Tournament that dated back to 2010, when the Yellow Jackets defeated Oklahoma State in the first round before losing to Ohio State in the round of 32 of the Midwest Regional.

Tech has a record of 23-17 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were Tech's' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93.

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 17 previous NCAA Tournament appearances.

BIO UPDATES

Head Coach Josh Pastner • 7th season at Tech

After leading Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, Josh Pastner became Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016 and within a five-year period, returned the Yellow Jackets to the NCAA Tournament and coached the program to its first Atlantic Coast Conference championship in 28 years.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has established the Yellow Jackets as one of the top defensive teams in the nation year-in and year-out, while he and his staff have steadily improved the team's offense to be ranked in the top half of the ACC. Those efforts, as well as improving efforts in recruiting, produced Georgia Tech's first ACC Championship since 1993 and its first berth in the NCAA Tournament in 11 years in the 2020-21 season.

Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been numerous wins, high excitement and 13 sellouts in four pre-pandemic seasons at McCamish Pavilion, and a school-record 11 consecutive home ACC wins over the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons.

Six of his players — guards Josh Okogie, Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe, as well as frontcourt players Ben Lammers, James Banks III and Moses Wright — have earned ACC honors during his tenure. Wright was named the ACC Player of the Year, Tech's first since 1990, and Alvarado the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year in the 2020-21 season. Okogie, in particular, developed from an under-the-radar high school prospect into a highly-regarded NBA prospect, having played three years in the league, while Lammers and Banks have gone on to play professionally overseas. Alvarado and Wright, though undrafted following their senior seasons, wound up on NBA rosters in the 2021-22 season.

In his fifth year at the helm in 2020-21, Pastner guided Georgia Tech to the ACC Championship, the Yellow Jackets' first since 1993, and a berth in the NCAA Tournament, the first since 2010. The Jackets also earned their highest regular-season ACC finish and tournament seed (4th for both) since the program's national-runner-up team in 2004. Tech's 17-9 overall record was its best by winning percentage since 2004, and its 11-6 ACC record was the fourth-highest by winning percentage in the program's 42-year history in the conference. Tech achieved its highest rankings under Pastner in such categories as offensive efficiency, scoring, field goal percentage, three-point percentage and fewest turnovers, while maintaining its high level of play on the defensive end of the court.

That came on the heels of a successful 2019-20 campaign, in which the Yellow Jackets posted a 17-14 record, winning nine of its last 12 games, including six of the last seven. Tech finished with the program's first winning ACC record since 2004, its highest ACC finish since 2005 (fifth) and its most conference victories (11-9 record) since 1996.

Pastner, 45, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan), three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper, and a newborn son, Cason.

Coaching Staff

ANTHONY WILKINS

Associate Head Coach • 5th season at Tech

Anthony Wilkins, an Atlanta native who spent the past five seasons on the coaching staff at Tulane University, joined Georgia Tech's basketball staff in June of 2018.

Wilkins, 43, served as an assistant coach for four seasons at Tulane after serving as director of basketball operations during his first year with the Green Wave. At Tulane, Wilkins handled game strategy and scout prep responsibilities along with player development and recruiting duties. He also had six years of professional playing experience prior to entering the coaching world.

Focusing his on-court efforts with Tech's offense, the Yellow Jackets have made significant strides in his three seasons on The Flats, helping elevate the Jackets into the top half of the ACC in scoring, field goal percentage, three-point shooting and ballhandling. In 2020-21, Tech achieved its highest national ranking on offensive efficiency (23rd according to KenPom.com), and its highest ACC rankings in scoring (6th), field goal percentage (2nd), three-point percentage (3rd) and fewest turnovers (3rd). He helped develop Tech's guard tandem of Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe into two of the ACC's top 10 scorers, and is credited with developing the perimeter skills of Moses Wright, the ACC Player of the year in 2021.

JULIAN SWARTZ

Assistant Coach • 7th season at Tech

A 21-year coaching veteran, including 13 years on the NCAA Division I level, Julian Swartz was named an assistant coach on Josh Pastner's staff in August of 2018.

Swartz, 43, is responsible for on-court development of Tech players and focuses his efforts on the Yellow Jackets' defensive schemes as well as handle recruiting responsibilities. He helped guide Tech's defense to a national ranking of No. 37 in efficiency in 2018-19 and No. 17 in 2019-20, according to KenPom.com, and the Yellow Jackets also ranked among the top 15 in effective field goal percentage and three-point defense. In 2020-21, Tech used its trademark defenses in a completely different way, becoming the top team in the ACC and one of the best in the nation in forcing turnovers and steals to boost its offense.

Swartz's recruiting efforts have been central to the Jackets' last two recruiting classes, and he has been ranked No. 6 among college basketball recruiters by 247Sports. Tech's 2021 class of guards Dallen "Deebo" Coleman and Miles Kelly and forward Jalon Moore was ranked the 15th-best in the nation.

BRIAN ESKILDSEN

Assistant Coach • 1st season at Tech

Brian Eskildsen, who helped Harvard to three Ivy League championships, a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2015 and NIT berths in 2018 and 2019, joined Georgia Tech's men's basketball staff as assistant coach in June, 2022.

A 13-year veteran in Division I basketball, Eskildsen has spent his entire career working at high-level academic institutions that enjoyed success, including Rice and Stanford before landing at Harvard.

Eskildsen, 34, spent eight seasons at the Ivy League institution under head coach Tommy Amaker, helping the Crimson capture conference championships in 2015, 2018 and 2019. Harvard was in position to win another Ancient Eight title and a potential NCAA Tournament bid in 2020, compiling a 21-8 record and a runner-up finish in the Ivy regular season before COVID-19 abruptly ended that season.

During his time in Cambridge, eight Harvard players earned All-Ivy League recognition, three of them more than once, and the Crimson scored power conference wins over Auburn, Brigham Young, California, Georgetown and Texas A&M. Harvard averaged nearly 18 wins per season (not counting the cancelled 2020-21 season), winning 18 or more games five times and winning 10 or more Ivy games five times.

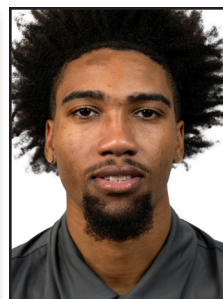
