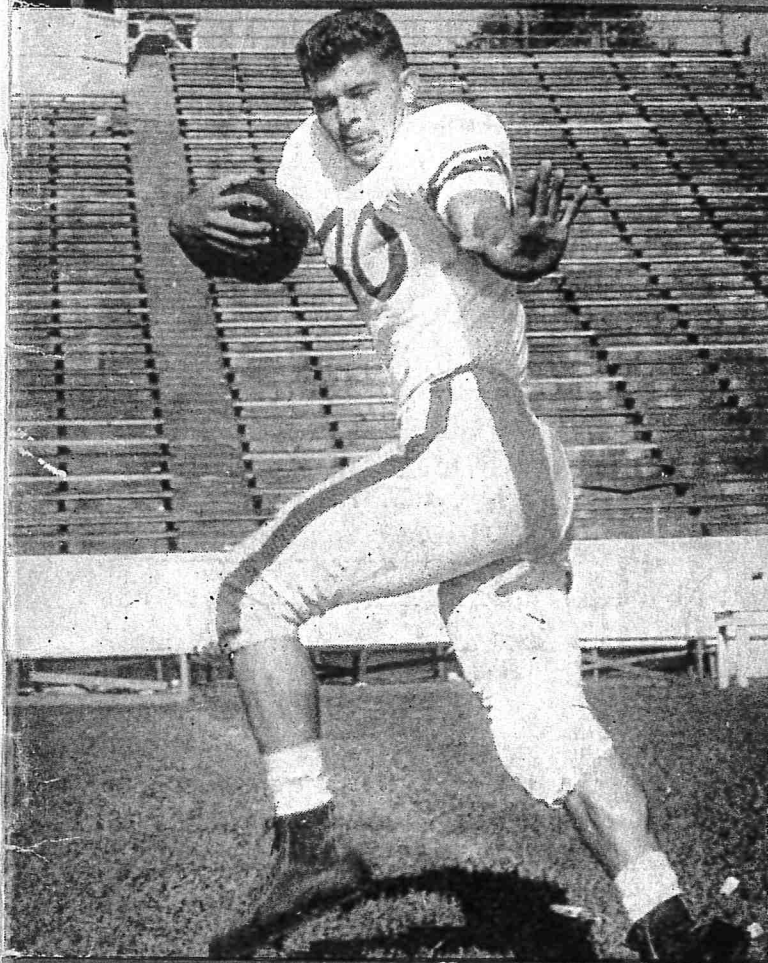

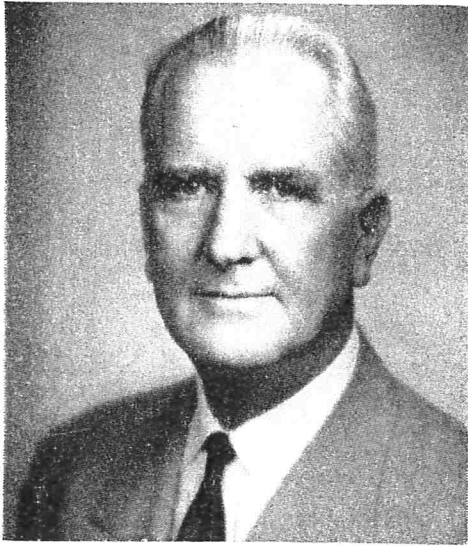

THE PRESIDENT

Dr. John Laney Plyler, now in his 17th year as president of his alma mater, was graduated from Furman in 1913 with magna cum laude honors. He served for three years as a teacher and coach at Greenville High where he produced a state-championship basketball team.

Dr. Plyler rose from private to the rank of second lieutenant as a volunteer in World War I. After the war, he received an LL.B. from Harvard and began the practice of law in Greenville. In 1935, he was chosen Judge of the Greenville County Court. He had been re-elected for a second term when friends persuaded him to become president of Furman.

Under his administration the faculty has been greatly increased in size and academic training and the University has been admitted to the Southern University Conference, the Association of American Colleges, and is now on the approved list of the Association of American Universities and of the American Association of University Women.

In 1948 he served as president of the South Carolina Baptist Convention. Erskine College honored him in 1939 with the LL.D. degree, and in 1953 he received the LL.D. degree from Wofford College. In 1946-47 he was vice-chairman of Church-Related Colleges in the Southeast and, in 1951-52, president of the South Carolina Association of Colleges. As a member of an 11-man national committee of college presidents named in 1951, he helped work out recommendations on college football which were widely adopted.

The accomplishment which many regard as his greatest, however, has been his successful leadership in the acquisition of the new \$15,000,000 Furman campus. The men are scheduled to move there in 1958 and the women in 1960.

ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR

Dr. Julian H. Scarborough has served as administrative director of Furman since 1954. From December of that year he had the added responsibilities of athletic director until Lyles Alley assumed that position last February.

Prior to 1954, he was president of the Federal Land Bank of Columbia for 20 years. From 1944-51, he also served as president of the Production Credit Corporation.

A native of Summerton, Dr. Scarborough received a B.A. degree from Furman in 1912, and an LL.D. degree in 1949. He studied law at Yale University and George Washington University and holds a B.A. degree from Yale.



During World War I, he served in Europe with the U. S. Army as a first lieutenant.

From 1925-33 Dr. Scarborough was state treasurer of South Carolina and before that he served terms in both the State House of Representatives and the State Senate.

Dr. Scarborough has been a member of the Furman Board of Trustees since 1932 and is past chairman of that group. He is a member and past president of the South Carolina Division of the American Cancer Society.

He is vice-president and director of the State Life Insurance Company of Columbia; director of the State Capital Life Insurance Company, Raleigh, N. C.; and director of the Peoples Bank, Beaufort.

He is also a member of the First Baptist Church of Greenville, Rotary Club, American Legion, Philadelphia Old Guards and the Kentucky Colonels.

In 1943 Dr. Scarborough was selected as "Man of the Year" by The Progressive Farmer magazine for his administration of the Federal Land Bank and its service to the farmers in the Bank's four-state area, the Carolinas, Georgia and Florida.

Dr. Scarborough has played a leading role in business matters dealing with the development of Furman's new campus near Greenville. His cheerful and enthusiastic support of Furman's athletic teams has served as a great inspiration to the players.

ATHLETIC STAFF

LYLES ALLEY Athletic Director

Lyles Alley became athletic director at Furman last February, during his 11th term on the Furman athletic staff.



For two years, prior to his appointment, the football and basketball programs had operated unilaterally under the respective coaches and coordinated with Dr. Julian H. Scarborough, administrative director of the University.

Alley has been Furman's basketball coach since 1945 except for one year. He joined the Furman staff after World War II, as an assistant in football and as head basketball and baseball coach.

He took a leave of absence in 1949-50 to get his master's degree at Columbia University.

From 1953 through 1956, his Furman teams were the national major college scoring champions, setting records in each season. For the 1951-52 season, Furman was awarded the U. S. Rubber Company's trophy as the most improved team in the nation.

Two of his players made first team All-America, Frank Selvy in 1954 and Darrell Floyd in 1955 and 1956.

Alley won 12 letters for football, basketball, track, and baseball as a student at Furman from 1929 to 1933. His high school coaching was done at Taylors, S. C. and Miami, Fla. His football pupils at Miami included Arnold Tucker, Bruce Smith, and Pistol Pete Williams, all later All-Americans.

Alley spent World War II as a Navy officer, emerging as a lieutenant in 1945, when he answered the call to coach his alma mater.

He is a past president of the Southern Conference Basketball Coaches' Assn. On the campus, he is in his 12th year as an instructor in physical education.

HOMER HOBBS Head Football Coach

Homer B. Hobbs began his third season as head football coach at Furman this year and like the others, it was expected to be marked by dogmatic concentration on conditioning and fundamentals.

That is the fashion in which Hobbs learned his own collegiate football, and the three "bowl" teams on which he played at the University of Georgia convinced the Furman mentor of its worth.



Hobbs became the Furman head coach in January, 1955. His appointment marked a return to his native state after four years of college ball, two of professional, and four years as a college assistant coach.

Before coming to Furman, Hobbs was line coach at Navy for three seasons. His work there was climaxed on January 1, 1955, when Navy won the Sugar Bowl game and Hobbs line charges held their opposition scoreless.

His three seasons at Navy as an assistant to Head Coach Eddie Erdelatz gave him an association with one of the most respected and successful coaches on the college scene today.

Hobbs' other year as an assistant was with Head Coach Shug Jordan at Auburn, in what has proved the beginning of Auburn's rise to the role of a nationally respected football powerhouse.

The Furman coach was born in Lexington, S. C., and played high school football there from 1937 through 1940. The University of Georgia beckoned upon his graduation and Hobbs played there as a freshman in the 1941 season, a year which saw Georgia earn an invitation to the Orange Bowl.

World War II interrupted Hobbs' collegiate play for three seasons. He served in the Navy, including two years in the Pacific Theater.

Hobbs returned to Georgia for the 1946 season and Georgia made its way to the Sugar Bowl at its end. The Bull Dogs went to the Gator Bowl his junior year and back to the Orange Bowl his senior year. Hobbs was named as a guard on the All-Southeastern Conference team his senior year.

From Georgia, Hobbs went to the San Francisco '49ers professional team. There he played under Coach Erdelatz, an association which was later to take Hobbs to his Navy line coaching job.

Hobbs also played the 1950 season with San Francisco and joined the Auburn staff in February, 1951.

DAVID (DIXIE) HOWELL

Dixie Howell, Furman's end and defensive line coach, is given much credit for one of the happiest end situations at Furman in years.



It was under his immediate tutelage last season that Dick Pfeiffer, Ray Siminski, Mack Edwards and Tom Avery improved so rapidly.

An Annapolis, Md., native, the 1956 season was Howell's first at Furman. Howell came to Furman after six years as a high school coach, two at Carrollton, Ga., and four at Smyrna, Ga.

He graduated from George Washington in 1950, having played every varsity game except one for four seasons as an end on defense and a guard and blocking back on offense.

Howell was born in Florence, Ala., but shortly moved to Washington, D. C. He was a star guard for Eastern High School. During World War II he spent four years in the Navy.



WILLIAM J. (BILL) CRUTCHFIELD

Bill Crutchfield joined the Furman coaching staff this summer directly from three seasons as head coach of Presbyterian College. During the 1954-55-56 campaigns there, he led P. C. to a record of 13 victories, 14 losses and one tie against an impressive slate of opponents.



Crutchfield has been in the coaching business since 1947, the first of his two years as a graduate assistant to Carl Snavelly at the University of North Carolina. He received his bachelor's degree in 1947 and his master's in 1949, both in physical education.

During his undergraduate days, Crutchfield was a fullback on the Tarheel varsity for two seasons. He coached at Atlantic Christian College during the '49-'50 and '50-'51 seasons, going from there to Mansfield (Ohio) High School when Atlantic Christian dissolved its football program.

He went to Presbyterian as an assistant in 1953, becoming head coach the next season. He was born in Orangeburg and attended high school there.

CHARLES (CHUCK) ROHE

Chuck Rohe is in his first year at Furman, where he will be head coach in track and an assistant in football. Rohe's football duties will be primarily scouting, although he will assist on the field also. He graduated from Mississippi Southern in 1953 and received his master's degree there in 1954. He had championship track teams at Hattiesburg (Miss.) High in 1955 and 1956 and at Mississippi Southern the past spring. He is a native of Chicago.



FURMAN OFFENSE

Furman runs primarily from the split-T, with occasional shifting to the belly series.



TRAINER

Furman's athletic trainer, Lewis (Doc) Martin, is in his third football season here. He monitors the conditioning of athletes of all the teams and helps in the selection of personal equipment.

He was trainer for O'Keefe High five years, going to the University of Georgia in 1952 and coming to Furman in 1955. He is a native of Atlanta.

THE YEAR AHEAD

The 1957 Furman Football Team is expected to be better than either the 1955 or 1956 teams, principally because it will be manned by players who gathered some rather painful experience during those two years.

Except for halfback Jerry Penland, and to some extent fullback Jimmy Grant, the Hurricane this season is not characterized by genuine "name-stars", but Coach Homer Hobbs believes he has something better.

"We are not dependent on one or two boys. What we hope to do for this season is replace a starter with the top reserve without really feeling a loss," he said.

In an elaboration on his remarks, Hobbs said he felt for the first time in his tenure here Furman would have some depth. Some positions, of course, boast more than others. The ends are possibly the strongest position, with tackle and halfback perhaps the greatest problems.

FOR HELP THERE, Furman has the hope that is eternal with colleges using freshmen, the high school boy of last season. And while the coaching staff feels that freshmen will definitely be a part of the Furman campaign of this year, they are not the sole reason Furman expects better things in '57.

"By better, I don't mean we are world-beaters," qualifies Hobbs. "Because of our additional experience, I believe we will make fewer mistakes. I believe we will win some which would have been lost a year ago and play closer ball where against the same team a year ago we would have been beaten badly."

Furman's offensive hopes rest chiefly on a good ground attack. Penland rushed for 579 net yards last year and Grant powered for 366. Quarterback Billy Baker, who completed 41 of 93 passes last season, will help balance the attack and for targets he may have the best set of four ends in the state—Dick Pfeiffer, Ray Siminski, Mack Edwards and Tom Avery, all with two or more letters.

THE MIDDLE OF THE LINE, as the season drew near, was a rather fluid proposition. Don Markofski seemed to have one tackle spot nailed. Virgel Gambrell and Hinton Davis seriously eyed the other.

Some shifting of guards, tackles and centers was perhaps in the offing. Gene Head, a returning starter was definite at one guard. Nick Tzouvelekas was a top contender for the other. In Buddy Walton, returning letter-

man center, the coaches have a first stringer, the only question being whether center or guard.

Baker, who rose from the freshman ranks to guide the Hurricane from quarterback most of the year may not be immovable but he is a known quantity.

Penland, the team captain, has one halfback. Bill Weir opened the year ahead of the pack as Penland's running mate, but his position wasn't clinched. At fullback, Grant has three letters and commensurate experience. Letterman Hicky Horton and a horde of frosh candidates completed the picture.

ENDS

DICK PFEIFER, 21, 6-2, 205, Senior, Hasbrouck Heights, N. J. A starter last season who played but three games because of a knee injury. Pfeifer has been measuring its recuperation against the calendar and should be ready for another starting season. He has lettered for three years; and is alternate captain of the '57 team. He is one of the reasons end is considered one of the strongest team positions. Major is education.

RAY SIMINSKI, 20, 6-2, 195, Junior, Chester, Pa. Led team in pass receiving last season with 7 catches for 83 yards. Considered one of team's really outstanding performers with one year as a starter already behind him and two virtually sure years ahead. His teaming with Pfeifer gives Furman probably state's best pair of ends. Courageous, aggressive and one of most popular players among Furman fans. Business major.

TOM AVERY, 20, 6-0, 180, Junior, Americus, Ga. Teams with Mack Edwards to give depth to end position. Won letters in each of first two seasons and was second leading pass receiver last year. Moved up as a starter after Pfeifer's third-game injury and was a regular thereafter.

MACK EDWARDS, 20, 6-1, 175, Junior, Athens, Ga. His two letter-winning years support statement by Coach Homer Hobbs that as good as first line ends are, Edwards could move up overnight. Caught 4 passes for 85 yards in '56 and has been one of the 1955 frosh who has fulfilled hopes. Major is education.

WOODY STEWART, 19, 6-1, 180, Sophomore, Jefferson, Ga. Gives added depth at end and played sufficiently to win letter as a freshman. Main trouble is too many good ends already on hand when he arrived. Pitcher on baseball team. Major is business administration.

GARY POWERS, 19, 6-2, 185, Sophomore, Macon, Ga. Has an uphill battle to elevate himself among the end ranks. Proved himself a good pass receiver last year with four catches for 26 yards. May see more action with a season of varsity experience behind him.

MIKE TOBIN, 17, 6-2, 210, Freshman, St. Clair, Pa. All-state end in Pennsylvania last season, scoring 32 points. Won four letters each in football, basketball and baseball.

ENDS

JACKIE RUSSELL, 18, 6-4, 195, Freshman, Copperhill, Tenn. Made honorable mention for all-East Tennessee at Copper Basin High. Scored 54 points last year and had unusually high academic rating.

BILL LAUBACH, 17, 6-1, 200, Freshman, Berwick, Pa. Made all conference with Berwick High last year and regarded as strong defensive man. Played two years of high school ball.

TACKLES

DON MARKOFSKI, 20, 6-0, 220, Junior, Chester, Pa. One of the bright lights in a position that Coach Homer Hobbs considers one of his problems, Markofski is regarded as a virtually sure starter. He has won two letters in two varsity seasons. A strong defensive man in addition to being a good blocker.

HINTON DAVIS, 19, 6-1, 210, Sophomore, Savannah, Ga. A versatile lineman, Davis was used at guard last year, starting several games toward the end of the season. This year, however, Coach Homer Hobbs indicated he would probably use him at tackle. The move would be a step toward strengthening the tackle positions, although it appeared possible that Davis would see service in both positions.

VIRGIL GAMBRELL, 19, 6-3, 215, Sophomore, Blacksburg, S. C. Although Gambrell did not win a letter as a freshman, he was listed by the Furman staff as one of its top three candidates for the two tackle positions. The coaches were impressed not only by his determination to crack the lineup but by his all-round performance in spring practice.

JOHNNY HERRINGTON, 26, 6-0, 225, Freshman, Union, Miss. A veteran of Army service whom the coaching staff rates very highly. Was named to the 1954 all-European team while playing football in Germany. Did not play varsity football for Union High.

JONES BENNETT, 18, 6-0, 205, Freshman, Lithia Springs, Ga. Made Georgia's Class AA all-state team at tackle and was captain of the 1956 Douglas County High team. Won sportsmanship award and named county's most valuable lineman.

TACKLES

TOMMY BLAIR, 19, 6-2, 185, Sophomore, Atlanta, Ga. Found experienced linemen ahead of him in freshman season and saw limited play. With year of college practice field combat behind him, may be ready for more extensive use. Business major.

JONES BENNETT, 18, 6-0, 205, Lithia Springs, Ga. Made Georgia's Class AA all-state team at tackle and was captain of the 1956 Douglas County High team. Won sportsmanship award and named county's most valuable lineman.

JOE MONTI, 18, 6-1, 230, Freshman, Minersville, Pa. A fullback and end in high school, but his size and sheer ability cause Furman staff to regard him as top-flight tackle prospect. Won letters in football, basketball, baseball.

JOE OLLIFF, JR., 18, 6-2, 205, Freshman, Statesboro, Ga. Made Georgia's Class A all-state team after Statesboro won Class A championship. Also two letters in basketball. Will study business.

CLIFF HURSEY, 22, 6-0, 210, Freshman, Darlington, S. C. Made impressive showing in spring practice and regarded as topflight reserve candidate this season.

BOBBY HOWARD, 19, 5-11, 210, Freshman, Greer, S. C. An outstanding player on an outstanding Greer team last season. Needs experience but could be a topflight college player in a couple of seasons.

DONALD EVANS, 21, 6-1, 195, Freshman, Toccoa, Ga. An 11-region high school tackle in 1953 who had a delayed start in college. Played four years, winning two letters at Toccoa High.

ROBERT MARTIN, 18, 5-10, 175, Freshman, Shamokn, Ohio. An end in high school last season, but because of height, may be switched at Furman. Played blocking back in '55. Won 10 letters, three each in baseball and track, two in football and gymnastics.

GORDON SEAY, 18, 6-4, 180, Freshman, Greenville, S. C. A standout end on Paris High's District champions last season. His defensive play was given much credit for their unbeaten regular season.

JAMES HOFFMAN, 18, 6-1, 190, Freshman, Wheeling, Ill. Played tackle and end at Arlington Heights High School. Won two letters each in football and track. Named to the all-conference team.

JERRY INGRUM, 19, 6-1, 189, Freshman, Opelika, Ala. Was team captain and all-county as an end and his agility is expected to be big advantage as a guard. Won letters in football, basketball and baseball.

GUARDS

BUDDY WALTON, 20, 6-2, 205, Junior, Atlanta, Ga. A two-year letterman even though cast behind team captain and pro draftee center Bobby Jennings last season. Odds-on favorite to start at guard or center and play most of the way. Described by coaching staff as strong both offensively and defensively and as one of the top four football players on the team. Physical education major.

GENE HEAD, 23, 6-0, 190, Junior, Central, S. C. A regular guard last year and top man of the returning guard corps. Has won two letters. Made several all-star teams while in the Army. Even while injured last season was a highly effective lineman with defense as his specialty. Major is physical education.

NICK TZOUVELEKAS, 21, 5-11, 195, Senior, Greenville, S. C. Named to the Scholastic All-Southern of American People's Encyclopedia for 1956, based on football and academic achievement. A two-time letterman with a good pre-season shot at starting spot. Played high school ball in Greenville. Business major.

GEORGE HARRISON, 20, 5-11, 195, Junior, Phenix City, Ala. Two letters in two seasons and a veteran even as a junior. He will press the favored guards for a starting role or offer able relief. Most valuable asset is blocking.

BERLLIE GREESON, 19, 5-11, 194, Freshman, Chatsworth, Ga. Named most valuable lineman last season at Murray County High. Also lettered in baseball and was a B student.

GUARDS

PAUL KAROLCHYK, 18, 6-0, 204, Freshman, Larksville, Pa. Played in Pennsylvania East-West high school game as a center. Three letters for football and a B plus academic average. May be center.

RICHE ROBERTSON, 17, 6-1, 205, Freshman, Greer, S. C. Made the all-county class A team as a guard from Blue Ridge High last season. Has also played fullback and ran relay in track.

CENTERS

JIM BOROFF, 23, 6-1, 205, Sophomore, Lima, Ohio. A topflight reserve who played center enough even behind Jennings and Walton to win letter last season. Roving lineman who does best work on defense. As a frosh lefthander on baseball team last season was number two Furman pitcher, winning 3, losing 5. Navy veteran.

BOBBY AIKEN, 19, 6-1, 210, Sophomore, Decatur, Ga. In the revamping of the line situation, Aiken could prove himself sufficiently in the early weeks of practice to win a starting berth and appeared almost sure to be in for early relief duty. One who is being counted heavily to come through and strengthen a line damaged by graduation at end of last season.

LEO BLAND, 23, 6-5, 250, Sophomore, Akron, Ohio. A Marine veteran who at times was so effective during spring training that he was run with starting eleven. A giant even by college football standards, could be a fine lineman if he adapts his potential to varsity competition.

GEORGE ELIADES, 21, 5-11, 205, Junior, Washington, D. C. Despite injuries, has won two letters in two seasons. Will play extensively even if a reserve. Quick mover on offense. Major subject is history.

Florida State University's football picture this fall is painted in contrasting colors. There are some extremely strong positions and some very questionable ones.

But for the sake of convenience, the Seminoles can be boiled down to having a fairly good first team and a rather inexperienced and as yet unproven second unit.

The strongest FSU positions are the ends and center. All-America end candidate Ron Schomburger and Bob Nellums give the Seminoles one of the toughest pairs of flankmen in the south.

Schomburger made four all opponent teams last year and is team captain this fall. Nellums led the team in scoring with 31 points last fall though he played only four games.

Center Troy Barnes, a three year veteran has returned and behind him is a 205 pound sophomore, Paul Slaton. Slaton is regarded as the best of the Seminoles' second year men.

Regulars Bill Musselman and George Boyer, 212 and 230 pounds respectively, have returned to give FSU a strong first unit at tackle. But behind them are two inexperienced sophomores.

At guards, FSU has started completely anew. The four top men at these positions on the 1956 team graduated leaving sophomores and inexperienced juniors to bear the load.

The backfield has changed, too, but it's probably somewhere near the strength of the 1956 team. Bob Renn, who was the leading groundgainer at left halfback last year, has switched to quarterback.

Stan Dobosz has moved in as the regular left halfback and the fullback is Eddie Johnson. The right halfbacks are Buddy Reynolds and Billy Weaver.

The football picture at Villanova is the brightest in years. The 1956 record of 5-4 was the first winning season since 1952 and the forthcoming season shapes up to be an even better one. For the first time in four years head coach Frank Reagan has a solid core of experienced seniors forming the nucleus of the squad.

An all senior backfield has speed and experience. Only left half-back Davey Parr, one of the squad's speediest backs, was not a starter last year. The others, quarterback Billy Magee a 2 year regular, right halfback Rick Sapienza and fullback Jack Devereaux started in most of the nine games.

Reagan is counting on two outstanding sophomores to add depth to the backfield. Al Musca, a halfback switched to signal caller is certain to give Magee and junior Jim Grazione competition. Another newcomer, Leon Horin looks as if he may be seeing plenty of action before the season is over.

The line centers around seniors Don Luzzi, a tackle and Eddie Michaels, a guard. Luzzi is a potential All-American measuring 6-0 and 225. He is considered one of the best tackles in Villanova's history. Last year, Warren Giese's first season as head coach of South Carolina's Gamecocks, he had a team dominated by sophomores.

This year, he says the team has even less experience.

"We've less game-time experience in six of the 11 starting posts," he says, "But the team speed is about the same. Perhaps there's a shade more speed at tackle."

Last season, Giese indicated that his raw talent had fine spirit, and that such cooperation would go a long way toward making up for the inexperience.

The Gamecocks came through with seven victories and but three defeats. They never won a game by more than two touchdowns and never lost by more than one.

Bobby Bunch, who Red Shirted last year, and Stan Spears, another bohunk, are neck-and-neck for the position.

1957-58 BASKETBALL

When Furman's football playing season is one month and one-day old, Lyles Alley will signal the 1957-58 basketball team onto the practice floor. It will be the 12th under his guidance at Furman.

Forming its nucleus will be three returning regulars distributed right down the line. All-Southern Conference guard Dick Wright, center Steve Ross and forward Byron Pinson will be in defense of their roles of last season.

Wright, a 5-11 junior, scored 20.2 points per game last season and Pinson (6-3) was second high on the team with 13.9. Ross (6-9) averaged 10.1.

Riding hard for the two other starting roles will be 6-6 sophomore Tom Conard for a forward and J. C. Rhine and Steve Benya for a guard. As has been the case before (Pinson last season) an outstanding freshman could grab one of the starting berths.

By mid-January, the fight for first team will be even tougher, for as of the second semester, Edd Selvy becomes eligible and he has shown every indication of commandeering a starting guard berth at the earliest permissible date.

There will probably be only one senior on this year's team, reserve Harvard Riddle, which means the unit that finally emerges this year could well be a two-year team.

Furman lost six men from the 1957 team, including workhorse Jim Herring and regular Bill Gaines. Varsity returnees, besides those already mentioned, include Larry Bass and Ronnie Salyer. Best of the candidates from last year's frosh team is David Shepard.

The Paladins' schedule this season includes national champion North Carolina and 12 Southern Conference games along with the traditional battles against Clemson and South Carolina.
