Furman: Veteran, strong-armed quarterback who returns for his final season as Furman's starting signal caller...should contend for All-Southern Conference honors following almost two seasons of

starting experience...ability to remain healthy is considered a big key to Furman's potential success this fall due to the lack of an experienced backup...heads into the 1996 season ranked seventh on Furman's career passing yards chart (3,349 yards) and fourth in career passing touchdowns (23). **1995** — Fashioned a solid junior season despite being sidelined twice with injuries...was forced from the lineup in Furman's first game, when he sustained a bruised shoulder early in the first half against Georgia Tech...injury caused him to miss Furman's next two games (vs. S.C. State and Wofford)...came back to throw for 280 yards and three touchdowns in leading Furman to a 55-24 win over VMI...performance versus VMI earned him Southern Conference Offensive Player-of-the-Week honors...reaped similar honors the next week after throwing for 174 yards and a score in Furman's 31-21 win over Western Carolina...re-injured his shoulder against Appalachian State and sat out Furman's 24-3 win over The Citadel...returned to start in the Paladins' last four games...in all registered action in eight games and passed for 1,275 yards...led Furman in total offense with 1,232 yards (166.5 ypg)...posted a 137.6 passing efficiency rating — the highest among all league quarterbacks...season included a career long 82-yard touchdown strike to Jody Wade against VMI...captured Furman's Paladin (MVP) Award for the second straight year. **1994** — Put together a good sophomore season after beginning the year as a backup and later moving into the starting lineup following a season ending injury to regular starting quarterback Philly Jones versus William & Mary...came off the bench in the second half against William & Mary and almost led Furman to victory, completing 10-of-16 passes for 148 yards and one touchdown, in addition to running for another score...gained his first career start the next week versus Western Carolina, and passed for 300 yards and two scores, while running for another...outing against Western Carolina netted him Southern Conference Offensive Player-of-the-Week honors...in all started in eight games and completed 127-of-220 passes for 1,674 yards and 13 touchdowns...132.94 passing efficiency ranked second only to Marshall All-Southern Conference quarterback Todd Donnan among league quarterbacks...took home Furman's Paladin (MVP) Award at season's end. **1993** — Furman Freshman-of-the-Year selection...appeared as a backup to starting quarterback Philly Jones in nine games, and threw for 400 yards and two touchdowns, with only one interception...made his first collegiate appearance against Georgia Tech, completing 9-of-15 passes for 91 yards...keyed Furman's 17-3 win over nationally second-ranked Marshall by coming off the bench and directing the Paladins to a pair of brilliant fourth quarter touchdown

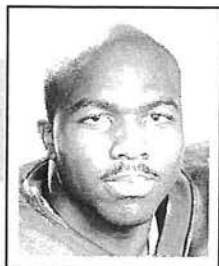

Furman: Outstanding performer who ranks as the premier tight end in the Southern Conference...has twice earned all-conference honors...appears poised to complete his career as one of the best tight ends

in Paladin football history...definite All-America candidate...possesses outstanding hands, mobility, and speed...ran an impressive 4.59 40-yard dash in shorts and ranked among the team's top performers in the weight room in spring testing...tied senior linebacker Daryl Smith for team high honors in the power clean with a lift of 345 pounds...heads into the fall ranked eighth on the school's all-time receptions list with 83...needs only 31 catches this year to break Furman's career receptions record...is just 112 yards shy of cracking the school's Top 10 career receiving yards ledger...will headline what appears to be a solid Paladin receiving corps this fall. **1995** — Ranked second among Paladin receivers with 39 catches for 475 yards and two touchdowns...was named first team All-Southern Conference by league media and second team by conference head coaches...top performance came in a 31-21 win over Western Carolina, when he caught a career high eight passes for 78 yards and one score...other touchdown reception came against Marshall...ranked 10th in the Southern Conference in receiving yards and 11th in receptions. **1994** — Enjoyed a stellar sophomore season in his first year as a starter, catching 32 passes for 447 yards and one touchdown...led all Paladin receivers in receiving yards but finished second to flanker Josh Cole in receptions...earned All-Southern Conference first team honors in voting by the league's head coaches...was a second team all-conference pick by the media...lone touchdown reception of four yards came against The Citadel...helped preserve Furman's 33-21 win over East Tennessee State with a spectacular tackle of the Buccaneers' Mario Hankerson after Hankerson, a strong safety, picked up a Paladin fumble at the Buccaneer 24 and, with a 10-yard lead on Broughton, took off for what appeared to be an easy touchdown just before the half...Broughton, however, ran Hankerson down and tackled him at the Furman 8-yard line, and the Paladin defense held, enabling Furman to escape the first half only down 14-13...joined Furman's basketball team for the 1994-95 season, seeing action in five games. **1993** — Ranked as one of Furman's top surprises, appearing in all 11 games and starting in one contest against Western Carolina in his first season of action as a redshirt freshman...came on strong late in the season, catching nine passes for 94 yards in the final two games...had a season high five receptions for 74 yards against Tennessee-Chattanooga. **1992** — Member of scout team...awarded redshirt and extra year of eligibility.

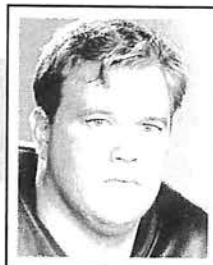

Furman: Veteran performer who returns for his second season as the Paladins' starting weak side tackle...plays with great intensity but is a quiet leader...will team with nose guard Reggie Williams

and strong side tackle Phil Warren in forming an experienced Furman defensive line...boasts excellent quickness and outstanding physical strength...ranked third on the team in spring weight testing, with a combined lift of 1,325 pounds in three exercises: bench press (400), squat (640), and power clean (285)...sat out the 1994 season due to prolonged rehabilitation efforts associated with a wrist injury...condition actually became a problem late in the 1993 campaign, when he was a starter at offensive guard...in addition to starting duty at defensive tackle and offensive guard, has also registered time at linebacker during his collegiate career. **1995** — Returned from injury to start at weak side tackle in eight games...played a key role in Furman's defensive resurgence...sustained a badly sprained ankle early in the South Carolina State game and sat out the next three contests...returned to action against Appalachian State on Oct. 7...tallied a season high nine tackles, a sack, and a fumble recovery against Georgia Southern...in all registered 391 play participations, 35 tackles, four tackles-for-loss, a pair of sacks, and two fumble recoveries. **1994** — Awarded a medical redshirt and extra year of eligibility. **1993** — Enjoyed a solid season as starting right offensive guard in all 11 games...logged 508 plays and posted a season average grade of 1.84 (.764%), with six winning citations...registered a season high mark of 1.92 (.864%) versus The Citadel. **1992** — Began his collegiate career as a linebacker before moving to offensive guard late in the season...registered 89 plays and 14 tackles at linebacker, and 30 plays at offensive guard.
