# Media Information

**PRESS BOX:** Furman's working facilities are located atop Sistine Stadium and include three levels for media accommodations. The roof of the press box is used for film crews. The second level is reserved for radio, television and scouts. The first level is limited to working press and game statistics.

**PRESS PASSES:** All applications for press passes should be directed to the Sports Information Director and are issued on an individual game basis. Credentials should be requested as early as possible. Passes not furnished by return mail must be picked up in person at the "Will-Call" window.

**BROADCAST:** Permission to broadcast rights must be secured at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Line installations are ordered by the individual station through their local telephone companies. Each station is allocated a booth and three passes.

**SCOUTING:** Passes for scouting purposes must be requested at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Two seats are allocated to each organization. Because of limited space, schools which Furman and its opponents will be playing the following week will be seated in the box. Others will have to be seated in the stands.

**SERVICES:** Programs, complete statistics, running play-by-play accounts, and post game quotes are provided at every Paladin contest. Two telephones are available and a telecopier will be on hand on a first come basis. Sandwiches, coffee and soft drinks are served in the press box.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Field passes are limited to working press photographers only. Photographers may work on the photo deck or on either sideline (except between the 35-yard lines) and beyond the end zones. Pass requests should be made at least two weeks in advance to the Sports Information Director.

**PARKING:** Limited parking space is available behind the press box for members of the media on a first come basis.

**SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR:** At Sistine Stadium and all Furman athletic events, your host will be Rick Covington, in his second year as Director of Sports Information at Furman. He's a native of Georgetown, KY, and came to Greenville after a one year stint at Fort Hays (Kans.) State University. Prior to going to Fort Hays, he served as an assistant SID at Morehead (KY) State University. Rick holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Morehead State. He is married to the former Betty Wilson, also of Georgetown.

## The Paladins on Radio 1979

Bill Hogan will again handle the play-by-play duties for the Furman Paladins Football Network to be heard on WGXL-FM this season. Vince Perone, Jr. will provide the expert color commentary for each Furman Paladin contest.

Hogan, a native of Iowa, has been in radio since his graduation from Mount St. Mary's College in Emmitsburg, Md., in 1948. He has owned WLBG radio since 1955, and brings 22 years of play-by-play experience to the Furman broadcasts. Hogan also serves as the play-by-play commentator for the Paladin cagers. He has twice been selected South Carolina Sportscaster of the Year.

Perone, a Greenville native, is a 1975 Furman graduate. Three times named all-Southern Conference, Perone enters his first season as color commentator on the Furman football broadcasts. A local restaurateur, his thorough knowledge of the game will provide interesting and in-depth commentary throughout the season.

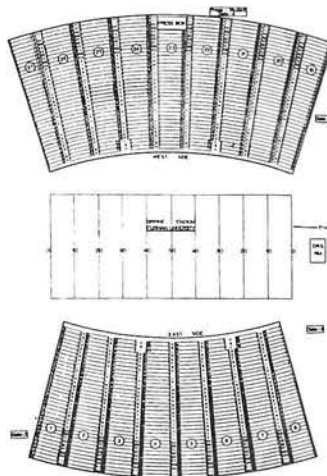

## Sirrine Stadium

Since 1937, Sirrine Stadium has been the home of Furman football. With a capacity of 13,600, the stadium possesses a natural turf of Bermuda grass. It is also the last structure of the old campus, before the university moved to its present location in 1958.



Dressing rooms, concession areas, restrooms, and athletic training facilities are located within the stadium.

Furman also offers such services as a lost-and-found, located at the lower level of the Press Box; an ambulance service, located at the North end of the stadium; a pay telephone on the West side of the stadium; a first aid station manned by the Greenville chapter of the American Red Cross at the South end zone behind the scoreboard; stadium doctors in both East and West grandstands; and doctors anticipating emergency calls during the game can notify the Press Box at the lower level.

The Sirrine Stadium Press Box is located atop the West grandstand and has accommodations for writers and statisticians, radio and television, scouts, and film crews.



# Furman University



Furman University traces its origin to The Furman Academy and Theological Institution authorized in 1825 by the South Carolina Baptist State Convention and opened in 1827 at Edgefield, South Carolina. In 1850 it was chartered Furman University, and over the years has firmly established itself as one of the nation's leading private institutions.

The University is located on a 750-acre wooded campus six miles north of Greenville, and its campus acclaimed one of the most beautiful in the nation. Campus facilities and activities include a 30-acre lake for swimming, boating, and fishing, an 18-hole golf course, 20 tennis courts, a playhouse for experimental drama, a 2,000-seat auditorium, physical activities center, an athletic building and eight playing fields.

Buildings are reinforced concrete, faced with handmade Virginia brick. The contemporary Williamsburg colonial architecture captures much of the flavor of the Old South, adapted to modern needs and usage. The Furman University physical plant is valued at over \$35,000,000 with 22 major buildings completed.

In addition to physical beauty, Furman enjoys an academic reputation which stretches across the nation. The faculty, 86 per cent of whom hold earned doctoral degrees, consists of 138 full-time and 42 part-time professors. The student-faculty ratio of 15:1 allows for individual attention and personal relationships.

The James B. Duke Library, fully air-conditioned, houses over 250,000 volumes. More than 1,500 periodicals are received regularly and the microfilm and record collections are extensive.

Degrees are offered in a wide variety of fields including the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees. The graduate division awards the Master of Arts degree with a major in education and the Master of Science degree with a major in chemistry. A Master of Business Education degree is offered jointly by Furman's Department of Business Administration and the Clemson University College of Industrial Management and Textile Science.

Furman is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Southern University Conference, the Association of American Colleges and the South Carolina Association of Colleges. It is on the approved list of the American Association of University Women and the American Chemical Society, and is a member of the National Association of Schools of Music.

## Dr. John E. Johns

PRESIDENT

During his tenure as President of Furman University, Dr. John E. Johns has become one of the best friends of the athletic program. Dr. Johns, an avid golfer, takes an interest in all athletic pursuits at Furman and often follows the Paladin basketball and football teams on the road.



Johns was president of Stetson University in DeLand, Fla., before returning to Furman, his alma mater, in 1976. He is a 1947 Furman graduate.

Johns had been a member of the Stetson faculty and staff since 1948 before assuming the position of president in 1970. He achieved the rank of full professor in the Department of History and Political Science and served as department chairman. Dr. Johns became business manager at Stetson in 1963 until he was named Vice-President for Finance in 1968.

A native of Ozark, Alabama, Johns is the author of Florida During the Civil War, the state's official publication for its Centennial. He has written articles for *Encyclopedia Britannica*, *Jefferson Encyclopedia*, *The Mississippi Valley Historical Review*, and *Florida Historical Quarterly*.

Johns was a World War II Army Air Corps pilot from 1942-1945, and received the Distinguished Flying Cross.

He graduated cum laude from Furman, receiving the Bradshaw-Feaster Medal for General Excellence. He earned the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of North Carolina. He has been awarded honorary degrees in literature and the humanities by Rollins College, William Jewell College, Furman, and Stetson.

Johns is married to the former Martha Mauney of Shelby, N.C., also a 1947 Furman graduate. Mrs. Johns has been recognized for service to her community and state and for valuable contributions to higher education. The Johns have three sons: John, Jr.; Steven; and Marcus.

## Dr. Francis W. Bonner

VICE PRESIDENT AND PROVOST  
FACULTY CHAIRMAN OF ATHLETICS



Dr. Francis Bonner, who has been Faculty Chairman of Athletics since 1968, came to Furman as Associate Professor of English in 1949. Since 1953, he has been both teacher and administrator, serving consecutively as Dean of the Men's College, Dean of the University, Vice President, and since 1972 as Vice President and Provost. He is chairman of the university's Committee on Athletics and served six years as President of the Southern Conference, an unprecedented length of tenure in that office. He presently serves on the Division I Steering Committee of the NCAA and on the Executive Committee of the Southern Conference.

A native of Alabama, Dr. Bonner earned the B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Alabama, and Ph.D. degree from the University of North Carolina and did post-doctoral study and research at Harvard. His field is English, with concentration on Chaucer and the medieval period. He is one of the most loyal and enthusiastic Paladin sport fans.

# Dutch Baughman

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Dale Thomas "Dutch" Baughman, became only the third Athletic Director since 1957 at Furman. The appointment was made on June 6.

The 30-year-old Columbus, Ohio, native comes to Furman following two years as Assistant Athletic Director at Northwestern University.

"Dutch" brings an impressive slate of credentials as an athlete, coach and administrator to Furman.

"He is thoroughly knowledgeable about every aspect of athletic administration, including pro-

motion, fund raising, scheduling and the many other duties he will have," said Furman President John E. Johns, in announcing Baughman's appointment. "He is energetic, enthusiastic and has a reputation for hard work."

Baughman holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Ohio State University. He has also completed all doctoral work except the dissertation in athletic administration at Ohio State.

Prior to going to Northwestern, "Dutch" served as an administrative assistant and athletic counselor at OSU. Before that position, he served as a graduate assistant on the Buckeye football staff.

A former Marine Captain, Baughman played football, lacrosse and wrestled at the Columbus school.

He spent one season as a football coach at Worthington (O.) High School upon college graduation.

Listed in the 1978 edition of *Outstanding Young Men of America*, Baughman and his wife, Jacquelyn, have one son; Eric, 1½.

# The Southern Conference

Furman University is a member of the Southern Conference, one of the nation's oldest intercollegiate athletic conferences. The nine-team league is composed of members — Appalachian State, The Citadel, Davidson, East Tennessee State, Furman, Marshall, Tennessee - Chattanooga, Virginia Military Institute, and Western Carolina. East Tennessee State is in its first full year of competition within the conference.

The Southern Conference was formed in 1921 at a meeting of 15 institutions in Atlanta, Georgia. The league initially was known as the Southern Intercollegiate Conference and the following 12 schools were charter members: Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Tech, and Washington & Lee.

The growth of the SIC was rapid and, within a year, Florida, LSU, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tulane, and Vanderbilt were added.

In 1923, the league was officially renamed the Southern Conference. Through the years, other schools were admitted but, in 1932, 13 of the 21 members left the conference to form the Southeastern Conference.

In February 1936, Furman was one of six new members admitted to the Southern Conference, including current members Davidson and The Citadel. In 1953, there was another mass exodus of schools from the league to form the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Southern Conference declares champions in 12 different sports, nine being decided by tournament play. Tournaments have been a popular and profitable method of determining the champions, particularly in basketball, as evidenced by the past two year's tournaments in Roanoke, Virginia, which have been immensely successful. Southern Conference champions in basketball, baseball, and wrestling automatically qualify for participation in NCAA national tournaments. All members of the conference possess NCAA Division 1 status.

Kenneth Germann is the commissioner of the Southern Conference. Dallas Shirley serves as assistant to the commissioner, and supervisor of officials. John Geis directs the service bureau. Furman University vice president Francis W. Bonner served as president of the conference for six years.

The conference annually awards the Commissioner's Cup to the university which accumulates the greatest number of points in championship competition throughout the year.

# Outlook for 1979

## GENERAL ASSESSMENT

The Furman Paladins are coming off one of the finest seasons in the school's history, compiling an 8-3-0 record, while capturing their first Southern Conference football championship. Furman ranked seventh in the nation in total offense last year, while finishing 14th in both rushing offense and scoring offense. But what are the prospects for the 1979 campaign?

Offensively, this year's squad will have to show improvement overall if the Paladins are to be as effective as in 1978. Seven starters are missing from last season, and Sheridan feels not only is it important that the starters are missing, but the quality of those regulars is a big factor. Five received all-conference honors, the sixth has signed with the Seattle Seahawks and the seventh finished third in the voting for the Jacobs Blocking Award. Of the other honors they received, one won the Jacobs Blocking Award and signed with the Dallas Cowboys, while also earning honorable mention all-America honors, along with two other members of the graduating class. Three earned all-league, all-academic laurels and one played in the Canadian-American Bowl Game in Tampa, Fla.

Defensively, Sheridan hopes the unit will be improved, although the quality of the eight players lost will make it difficult to replace them in the lineup. Only four starters were lost, but Sheridan feels they were four of the best athletes on the club. One of the starters signed with the New York Giants as a fullback, one had played three different positions during his career, and another was an all-conference pick two straight sea-

sons. The second-year head coach does feel that the young people acquired a great deal of experience last season, primarily due to injuries that caused lineup shuffles each week. Despite the injury and personnel problems in 1978, the Paladins finished second in scoring defense in the league. To be successful this fall, Sheridan feels the Furman defense needs to stay injury free and reach a level of consistency.

The kicking game will suffer to the effect that Jimmy Kiser has graduated. Kiser served as the punter, punt return man, and the holder on point-after attempts. His departure creates a lot of positions to fill. The Paladins will also be selecting the specialty squads as the season draws closer and Sheridan stated that particular area still poses some question marks.

## SCHEDULE

The 1979 slate will see seven conference opponents, plus Davidson, and foes Clemson, Presbyterian and Wofford. Sheridan feels the conference title race will be even more competitive than last season, when Furman captured a share of the crown on the final day of the season. He feels there is no clear-cut choice for either the top or the bottom positions in 1979.

Outside the league, traditional rivals Presbyterian and Wofford have experience and should be improved, while the season opener versus Clemson is a renewal of what was once a very important state rivalry.

## SPRING DRILLS

Sheridan stated the goals of spring practice were to improve fundamentally as individuals and as a team to get tougher mentally and physically. But he said the Paladins didn't make as much

progress as he had hoped, due to players involved in spring sports, injuries, or rehabilitation of players injured last season. However, some younger players that will be counted on made some progress and improvement.

## OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Fullback is the deepest position on this year's squad. Furman will have Steve Bishop (5-10, 195, Jr.), Sandy Davis (6-1, 200, Sr.), and Mark Taylor (6-0, 205, Jr.) returning. Sheridan has confidence in these young men, who do not have tremendous size, but he feels are quality players.

At quarterback, the Paladins return Southern Conference co-player of the year David Henderson (6-2, 180, Sr.). Redshirt Tim Sorrells (6-2, 170, So.) is a talented player, who with Henderson, Sheridan feels gives Furman two signal callers he wouldn't trade with anyone. Letterman Rich Trotta (6-2, 190, Sr.), Jeff Johnson, and incoming freshmen will compete for the third quarterback spot.

Mike Glenn (5-10, 190, So.) returns after leading the team in scoring last season, along with letterman Ricky Hall (5-11, 180, So.) to give the Paladins a solid one-two punch from the tailback spot. Calvin Harkless, Paul Howes, Bob Hayes and recruits will vie for the remaining spot.

## OFFENSIVE LINE

Stan Stanley (5-11, 200, Sr.) is the only returnee on the line to start for the whole season. Scott Sellers (6-2, 210, Sr.) and Charlie Anderson (6-2, 235, So.) saw considerable action in 1978, with Anderson starting the final half of the season. Joe Holt (6-4, 235, Sr.) and Jay Cory (6-2, 215, Sr.) return for 1979 after being redshirted last season. Bobby Woods (6-3, 215, Sr.),

Steve Lloyd (6-2, 225, So.), Tom Morrish (6-2, 220, Jr.), and Bart Heres (6-2, 225, Fr.) will vie for the center position. Mark Dixon (6-1, 220, Sr.) and Robbie Jackson (6-2, 230, So.) are competing for a tackle spot, with David Braschler (6-2, 215, Jr.) and Hollis Barton (5-11, 210, So.) in the picture at guard.

## RECEIVERS

Five capable people will compete at the two end positions this season. Steve McDougall (6-4, 205, Sr.) underwent knee surgery last year and did not see action last fall. Zach Kelehear (6-5, 215, Jr.), Byron Lee (6-0, 195, So.), Danny Gleason (6-1, 190, Sr.) and Terry Clark (6-3, 215, So.) will also be in competition for the two end positions. At flanker, Mark Grainger (5-10, 175, Jr.), Skip Lax (5-11, 170, Sr.), Joe Davidson (6-2, 175, Jr.) and Brothel Cole (5-11, 160, So.) look to be the top candidates, but freshmen will increase the competition.

## DEFENSIVE LINE

Honorable mention all-American Kevin Morgan (6-1, 230, Jr.) returns to a starting role. David Lyle (6-4, 235, Sr.) and Ansel Matthews (6-6, 240, Jr.) are coming back from injuries suffered last season. Scott Kimche (6-2, 220, So.) saw some starting time in 1978 due to injuries in the line. John Hardie and Floyd Swilley will also be in the line picture this fall.

Part-time starters Steve O'Neill (6-0, 205, So.) and Tim Partridge (6-3, 210, So.) return, along with lettermen Jeff Snipes (6-1, 210, Jr.), and Scott Montgomery (6-1, 195, Sr.). Larry Scott and Lance Walton will also be competing for the defensive end job.

Starters Ronnie Cox (6-0, 195, Jr.) and Jerry Scott (6-2, 220,

Jr.) return, with Eddie Allsopp (6-1, 195, Jr.), Bruce Ghesling (6-0, 200, So.) and Greg Guilford (5-11, 190, So.) in competition for spots in the linebacking corps.

In the defensive backfield, Bill Freeman (5-8, 165, Jr.) and Chris Buono (6-0, 185, Jr.) return as starters, with Jeff Burke (5-11, 175, So.) coming back from injury. Bruce Fowler, Randy Sansom, Paul Sorrells, Brent Sanders, Tommy Capps, Chuck Landers, and Tony Edwards will compete for a spot in the secondary.

#### SPECIALTY TEAMS

Record-setter Keith Potter (5-10, 160, So.) returns to handle the point-after and field goal duties. He may also be called on to kick off. Incoming freshmen should give Potter a good run this fall. Chris Horton and Ronnie Cox will battle it out for the punting chores, along with several newcomers. Steve Garrison (6-0, 190, Jr.) and David Middleton (6-2, 220, Jr.) will be counted on to handle the long snaps. Garrison can also be used as a defensive end. Tim Sorrells and Jeff Burke are the most likely choices for holder in 1979. Chris Buono, Mark Grainger and Brothel Cole may see a good deal of action as kick returners. They will also get competition from incoming freshmen.

## Coaching Staff

### HEAD COACH DICK SHERIDAN



In his first year as a college head coach, Dick Sheridan was chosen Southern Conference Coach of the Year, as Furman captured its' first-ever league crown and finished with an 8-3 overall record. The 1978 squad ranked among the top 14 in the nation in three offensive categories and topped the conference in several departments.

These types of achievements are not unexpected by those who know the North Augusta, S.C., native.

Last year when Sheridan assumed the head coaching responsibilities, President John E. Johns had this to say about him.

"We are convinced that Dick Sheridan is the best man to keep our football program moving in the right direction. He has earned the respect and confidence of the entire Furman community." Indeed that confidence was well placed, as the 1964 South Carolina graduate accomplished things

some thought impossible. But his record has been impressive from the start.

Sheridan joined the coaching staff at Eau Claire High School in 1964 and remained there as assistant football coach and head basketball coach until 1969. In three seasons as head basketball coach, his teams produced two conference championships, making the final four twice and finishing runner-up in 1969. He then assumed the head football duties at Orangeburg-Wilkinson High for three seasons, where his 1971 squad finished with a 13-0 record and captured the State 4-A title. That team ranked 12th in the nation and Sheridan was tabbed for Coach of the Year honors.

He then went to Airport High in 1972, before coming to Furman as assistant coach in 1973. In his final three prep seasons, his teams posted a 32-3 win-loss record and won more games during that period than any other team in the state. His four-year head prep coaching record was an amazing 37-8-1.

Before taking over the head coaching duties last season, Sheridan served as offensive coordinator for five seasons.

After being named head coach Sheridan said, "My goal is to develop a program that can consistently win and one in which our players and coaches will do everything possible to be champions for our conference." Up until that time Furman had yet to win a league football championship. Dick Sheridan changed that.

He and his wife Brenda have two sons: Bobby and Jon.

#### FALL PRACTICE PLANS

Freshmen will report for fall drills on Wednesday, August 15, with the returnees checking in Saturday, August 18. Media Day will be held at noon, Thursday, August 30 at the Furman Athletic Department. All players will be available to the media as well as the coaching staff and administration.



#### STEVE ROBERTSON — Defensive Coordinator

Steve Robertson enters his seventh year on the Paladin staff.

Robertson serves as defensive coordinator and administrative assistant for the football program. He also coaches the defensive ends.

As administrative assistant, Steve is responsible for assisting teams with their travel arrangements, liaison between Furman and the pro scouts, and coordinates banquets, awards, and game organization.

Robertson came to Furman in 1973 from Newberry College, where he had served as defensive coordinator since 1968. Prior to that, he spent eight years at Eau Claire High School as assistant and head football coach. He joined the Shamrocks in 1959 and assumed the head coaching duties in 1965.

A former South Carolina High School Coach of the Year, Robertson guided Eau Claire to a 3-A State title in 1967. His three year record at the school was 28-4-1.

Coach Robertson's recruiting area includes southwestern South Carolina, northeastern Georgia and the Jacksonville area of Florida. He also maintains correspondence with schools in New Jersey.

A native of Greer, S.C., Robertson graduated from Newberry after earning All-State and All-Conference honors. He and his wife Linda have two children: Ron and Robin.



#### JIMMY SATTERFIELD — Offensive Coordinator

Jimmy Satterfield will again serve the Paladins as offensive coordinator as he begins his seventh season on the Furman staff.

This fall will also mark his seventh year as offensive backfield coach.

In addition to his coaching duties, the 1962 South Carolina graduate coordinates the Paladin recruiting effort, the acquisition of equipment, the winter workout program and the Furman football camp.

Satterfield came to Furman in 1973 following a highly successful high school coaching tenure. In five seasons at Eau Claire and Irmo High Schools, Satterfield compiled a 47-9-1 won-loss slate. During that period his teams won five conference championships and one Upper State title. In 1970, when Eau Claire captured the Upper State crown, he was named South Carolina High School Coach of the Year and also served as Shrine Bowl coach.

Satterfield, who operates an all-sports camp, Camp Indian Valley, near Swansea, S.C., joined the Eau Claire staff following graduation from USC and assumed head coaching responsibilities in 1968. He remained there until going to Irmo in 1971.

Coach Satterfield's primary recruiting responsibilities include northwestern South Carolina and the Greenville area, and northwestern Georgia.

A Lancaster, S.C. native, Satterfield holds a master's degree in education from South Carolina. He and his wife, Ann, have three children, Shaun, Sidney and Lee.



#### ERIC HYMAN — Defensive Line

Eric Hyman is one of four Paladin coaches beginning his seventh year at Furman. He will direct the defensive line again this season.

The 1973 North Carolina graduate serves as film coordinator and is responsible for the film exchange between teams. He is also in charge of recruiting visits by interested student-athletes during the season.

A former all-ACC performer on the defensive line, he was a member of two conference championship teams and played in two bowl games. Hyman was also selected all-South as a senior and was tabbed for the 1973 Hula Bowl.

Western North Carolina, from Charlotte to the Tennessee line falls into his recruiting responsibility, as well as northern Virginia and some of the Greenville area.

A native of Alexandria, Va., Hyman holds a masters degree in education from Furman. He and his wife Pauline are expecting their first child late this summer.



#### ROBBIE CALDWELL — Offensive Line

Robbie Caldwell returns for his second season as the Paladins' offensive line coach.

The 1975 Paladin Award winner returned to his alma mater last year after a one year coaching stint at Hanahan High School in Charleston.

The 1976 Furman graduate was a four-year letterman and served as a graduate assistant on the football staff in 1976-77.

The Pageland, S.C., native supervises maintenance for the grid program, while also being responsible for winter workout testing and assisting with the weight program.

His primary recruiting area includes eastern North Carolina, northeast South Carolina, Washington, D.C., and the Baltimore area. Caldwell also handles all correspondence with high schools in New York and New England. He also recruits some of the Greenville area.

In addition to coaching the offensive line, Caldwell also handles the extra point and field goal teams. He is a bachelor.



**TED CAIN — Receivers**

Ted Cain begins his third season on the Furman grid staff. His coaching responsibility will be the Paladin receivers.

Cain, who also serves as coordinator of the junior varsity program, is in charge of all charts and statistics, and handles testing and the summer workout program.

A 1974 Furman graduate, Cain served two years as platoon leader in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Fort Benning, Ga., he was a three-year starter at tight end for the Paladins.

Cain's primary recruiting area includes north and southwest Atlanta, Macon and Columbus to the Florida line, including Tallahassee and the Panhandle. Tampa, St. Petersburg and Clearwater also come under his coverage. In Alabama, he recruits Montgomery and maintains correspondence with other schools in the state.

The Aiken, S.C., native was a three-sport letterman at Aiken High School. Cain is a bachelor.



**KEN PETTUS — Linebackers**

Ken Pettus begins his fourth season at Furman and will direct the linebackers this fall. Pettus returned to the coaching staff last year, after having served in 1973 and 1974.

In addition to his coaching duties, he supervises the weight program and coordinates the Furman football radio network, as well as organizing the football managers.

A former small college all-America selection at Newberry College, Pettus was named the Carolinas Conference Lineman of the Year as a Junior and was chosen all-state in his senior season.

He received all-America, all-state and all-South honors for Stick Moore at Greenville High School.

Recruiting responsibilities for Pettus include Atlanta to Chattanooga and northern Florida, from Lake City to Melbourne. He also recruits Birmingham and maintains correspondence with high schools in Pennsylvania.

Pettus has a master's degree in education from Furman and is married to the former Jan Griffin of Gainesville, Florida.



**BOBBY JOHNSON — Defensive Backs**

Bobby Johnson enters his fourth season on the Furman staff and will again handle the coaching of the defensive backfield.

He also coordinates player admissions, financial aid, academics and housing for Paladin gridders.

A former all-ACC academic team selection at Clemson, Johnson was a four-year starter at wide receiver and cornerback, graduating in 1973.

The 1968 4-A Lineman of the Year at Eau Claire High School, he, at one time or another, played for three current Paladin coaches — Dick Sheridan, Steve Robertson and Jimmy Satterfield. Johnson also played in the 1968 Shrine Bowl.

Recruiting responsibilities find Johnson in southeastern South Carolina, from Columbia to Charleston, south to Beaufort, plus the Aiken and Augusta areas. He also covers the Knoxville area and greater Miami.

The Columbia, S.C., native is married to the former Catherine Bonner of Charleston.



**RAY PARLIER — Head Athletic Trainer**

Ray Parlier is in his fourth year as Furman's full-time athletic trainer.

Parlier came to Furman after serving as assistant trainer and head basketball trainer at Georgia Tech, where he was responsible for the rehabilitation program. Prior to going to Georgia Tech, he was graduate and student assistant trainer at East Tennessee State for five years. Parlier worked with the New York Yankees Rookie League club, managed by Steve Hamilton, as head trainer. He also served as trainer for the Georgia High School All-Stars two years. He has also aided the Atlanta Falcons in the pre-season since 1976.

As head trainer, he is responsible for the physical health of all Furman athletes. # Year-By-Year Scores

Furman University had student football teams of a somewhat unorganized nature before 1900. Harold Claassen's Encyclopedia of Football lists an 1891 game in which Duke defeated Furman 96-0. Also, the University of South Carolina football brochure lists its first football victory as a 14-6 win over Furman in 1896. The first schedule (and results) that recent research has revealed was in 1902. Down through the years football has been an important part of the Furman athletic program, and indeed, of the University itself. Of necessity, there have been two periods when football was not played. No inter-collegiate games were played from 1903 through 1912 — because of University administrative action — and no games were played during World War II.
