MEDIA INFORMATION

PRESS BOX: Furman working press facilities are located atop Paladin Stadium and are contained in the upper two levels of the press tower. Part of the fourth level is reserved for radio and television. The top level houses space for sportswriters, home and visiting coaches, public address and game statistics. All floors are serviced by elevator and stairs.

PRESS PASSES: All applications for press passes should be directed to the Sports Information Director and are issued on an individual game basis. Credentials should be requested as early as possible. Passes not furnished by return mail must be picked up in person at the Will-Call' window, located on the first level of the press tower. NO COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS WILL BE ISSUED THROUGH THE SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR.

BROADCAST: Permission to broadcast must be secured at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Line installations are ordered by the individual station through their local telephone companies. Each station will be allocated a booth and four passes. Broadcast booths are located on the fourth floor of the press tower.

SCOUTING: Passes for scouting purposes should be requested at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Each organization will be allocated space, with priority going to schools which Furman and its opponents will be playing the following week.

SERVICES: Programs, complete statistics, running play-by-play accounts and post-game quotes are provided at every Furman contest. Two telephones are available and a telecopier will be on hand on a first-come-first-served basis. Sandwiches and soft drinks are served in the press box. Post-game interviews can be conducted on the field or at the dressing rooms at the north end of the stadium.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photo passes for use on the sidelines are limited to working press photographers only. Pass requests should be made two weeks in advance to the Sports Information Director. Photographers are permitted to work the sidelines (except between the 30 yard lines) and beyond the end zones.

PARKING: Requests for parking spaces should be made as early as possible. Media parking is located adjacent to the press tower.

PALADINS ON RADIO 1982

Jeff Charles and Greg Laetsch will handle the play-by-play and color commentary on the Furman Football Network this season. WGVL Radio will serve as the network flagship station, carrying all the action of every Paladin contest.

Charles, a native of Piqua, Ohio, is in his first season as the "Voice of the Paladins." The 29-year-old Goshen (Ind.) College graduate came to WGVL after serving as sports director at WSB in Atlanta. A veteran of 10 years broadcasting experience, Charles has done play-by-play for University of Illinois football and basketball.

Most recently, Charles has been the "Voice of the Peach Bowl," winning awards from both Associated Press and United Press International. Host of WGVL Sports Talk Nightly, he and his wife, Debby, have a daughter and a son.

Greg Laetsch begins his third year as color commentator on the Paladin radio broadcasts. A 1979 Furman graduate, Laetsch is an Asheville, N.C., native.

A three-year letterman at receiver for the Paladins, Laetsch signed a free agent pact with the Seattle Seahawks of the NFL in 1978. The 23-year-old bachelor was also selected to play in the Canadian-American Bowl. He is presently an account executive with Smith Barney, Harris Upham & Co., of Greenville.

SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR RICK COVINGTON



Rick Covington is in his fifth year as sports information director or at Furman University. A native of Georgetown, Ky., he came to Greenville following a one-year stint at Fort Hays (Kan.) State University. Prior to going to Fort Hays, he served as assistant SID at Morehead (Ky.) State University. Rick holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Morehead State. He and his wife Betty have a son, Richie.

DEFENSIVE ENDS & LINEBACKERS

Gone are third-team All-America Bruce Gheesling and Furman's all-time leading tackler Steve O'Neill. Billy Hall (6-0, 216, Sr.) moves from defensive end back to linebacker. Also returning to linebacker are Buck Coatney (6-0, 193, Jr.), Rock Hurst (6-0, 186, So.) and Ben Browder (6-0, 185, So.). Also competing for linebacking spots will be Pat Deacetis (5-10, 190, So.) and Wes Bowers (6-1, 195, So.).

At end, Felix Andrews (6-2, 226, Sr.), and all-league selection last year, returns, Kevin Quinlan (6-2, 196, Sr.) and Jerrod Smith (6-2, 190, So.) return at end after earning letters last season. Robert Anders (6-0, 190, Jr.) is back after a two-year absence. Norman Schaefer (6-3, 205, So.), Billy Bryan (6-2, 226, So.) and Tommy Davis (6-3, 190, So.) are exptected to vie for spots at end.

SECONDARY

Two starters are missing from the secondary in Jeff Burke and Terry Smith, but 10 lettermen return. Gib McEachran (5-10, 180, Sr.) and Ernest Gibson (5-11, 190, Jr.) return to starting assignments. Also returning are Mark Bridgman (5-11, 180, Jr.), John Zemina (5-11, 183, Sr.), Brent Sanders (6-2, 188, Sr.), Steve Walburn (6-2, 180, Sr.), Gary Keller (5-11, 165, Jr.), Brian McCluskey (5-8, 163, Jr.), Rally Caparas (6-0, 180, Jr.) and Jim Beddingfield (6-1, 200, Sr.), moving from fullback to defensive back. Also on hand at defensive back are Dennis Woods (5-11, 165, So.), Bryan Burns (5-11, 165, So.), Mark Sims (6-0, 183, So.) and Keith Finch (5-11, 175, So.).

SPECIALISTS

Gone are three starters in the specialty unit. Missing are two-time league leading punter John Johnson, snapper Steve Garrison, and holder Jeff Johnson. All-Southern Conference kicker Tim Tanguay (5-11, 167, Sr.) returns for his senior season. Backing up Tanguay are Greg Ross (5-7, 157, Jr.), Erik McCarthy (5-10, 163, So.) and John Thorne (6-2, 195, So.). Vying for snapper duties will be Robert Anders and Hollis Barton, with Jeff Anderson and Drew Norman competing for holder duties. Jim Easterling and Mark Bridgman will fie for the punting chores. Incoming freshmen are exptected to compete for varsity sports in this area.

1982 FURMAN PRACTICE PLANS & FACILITIES

PRESEASON CAMP REPORTING DATES — Freshmen will report on Tuesday, August 10 and the first practice for newcomers will be Wednesday, August 11. Upperclassmen will report for workouts on Saturday, August 14. The first practice with all players will be Monday, August 16.

PRESEASON CAMP PRACTICE SCHEDULE - The Paladins will hold two-a-day workouts during the first two weeks of fall camp, August 16 through August 28. Beginning August 30, the Paladins will practice once per day through the rest of the 1982 season.

FURMAN PRACTICE FACILITIES — The Paladins will use three fields during August camp. All practice fields are adjacent to the Herman W. Lay Physical Activities Center on the west end of the Furman campus. The only scrimmage to be held in Paladin Stadium will be at 2:30 p.m., August 21. During the season, the Paladins will use the two upper fields for workouts. All fields are served by an underground sprinkler system and under the watchful eye and care of Hubert Gardner of the Furman University Physical Plant. The football office would like to thank Mr. Gardner for his attention and care of the practice facilities. Also, a filming tower is located atop the PAC and allows the coaching staff and team to film and videotape practice sessions.

1982 OUTLOOK

Furman University Head Football Coach Dick Sheridan begins his fifth season at the helm and welcomes 53 lettermen, including six offensive starters, seven from the defense and one specialist from a year ago.

The Paladins finished 8-3 on the season, capturing their second consecutive Southern Conference championship, while compiling a 5-2 league mark.

Offensively, the Paladins will miss the services of eight lettermen, including five starters. Defensively, Furman lost 5 lettermen, with four being full-time starters and one a part-time starter. Gone from the specialty unit are four letter winners, including the starting punter, holder and long snapper.

Of the losses the Paladins incurred, seven were All-Southern Conference performers last season, two were named to the league all academic squad and two were signed to free agent contracts in the National Football League. Of the losses on the defense, two stand as the top two tacklers in Furman grid history.

Sheridan and his coaches have the task of replacing these people and the fifth-year coach feels it is a challenge to replace players of this quality. In four seasons, those 17 lettermen not returning played a major role in winning three Southern Conference crowns.

SCHEDULE

The Paladins will face all seven Southern Conference foes this season, opening the league contests on Sept. 18 at Boone, N.C., against Appalachian State. Other league road games include Tenn-Chattanooga (Sept. 25), East Tennessee State (Oct. 23) and Marshall (Nov. 13). Southern Conference teams making the trip to Greenville and Paladin Stadium are Virginia Military (Oct. 2), Western Carolina (Oct. 9) and The Citadel (Nov. 20).

Outside the conference, Furman will face long-time foe Davidson (Oct. 30) and second time opponent James Madison (Nov. 6), both in Greenville. The Paladins will open the season in Raleigh, N.C., (Sept. 4), with a night game against North Carolina State. The Wolfpack was the

last team Furman defeated in a season-opening encounter in 1976. Also on the slate this season is a visit to Columbia for an afternoon meeting with South Carolina (Oct. 16).

Furman will call on Southern Conference Player-of-the-Year Stanford Jennings (6-1, 192, Jr.), who rushed for a school record 1,168 yards from his tailback spot. Also at tailback are Stephen White (5-11, 188, Sr.), and Chas Fox (6-0, 177, So.).

Southern Conference Freshman-of-the-Year Dennis 'Dinky' Williams (6-1, 217, So.) returns at fullback and will be joined by Steve Bennett (6-0, 200, Jr.) and David Taylor (6-1, 210, So.)

Also manning the guard spots will be Brad Merkl (5-9, 222, So.), Dallas Whitaker (6-3, 215, Jr.), Scott Smith (6-1, 214, So.) and Paul Phillips (5-11, 230, Fr.).

Briggs Traylor (6-1, 205, Sr.) returns at center and will be joined by Paul Foster (6-3, 216, Sr.), King Smith (6-1, 203, Jr.) and Jim Edmondson (6-1, 245, So.).

RECEIVERS

One of the most experienced areas a year ago, Furman's receiving corps in 1982 will be one of the youngest on the squad. Gone are starters Terry Clark and two-time all-league end Byron Lee.

At tight end, juniors Danny Gaines (6-1, 215, Jr.), Jack Borders (6-3, 196, Jr.), Steve Greenleaf (6-0, 199, Jr.), Neal Anderson (6-3, 210, Jr.) and Blair Biggerstaff (6-5, 197, Jr.) will be called on, along with sophomore Jonathan May (6-4, 201, So.) and freshman Jim Easterling (6-3, 200, Fr.). Gaines, Greenleaf and Easterling play both tight and split end.



FURMAN UNIVERSITY

Furman University traces its origin to The Furman Academy and Theological Institution authorized in 1825 by the South Carolina Baptist State Convention and opened in 1827 at Edgefield, South Carolina. In 1850 it was chartered Furman University, and over the years has firmly established itself as one of the nation's leading private institutions.

The University is located on a 750-acre wooded campus six miles north of Greenville, and its campus acclaimed one of the most beautiful in the nation. Campus facilities and activities include a 30-acre lake for swimming, boating, and fishing, an 18-hole golf course, 20 tennis courts, a playhouse for experimental drama, a 2,000-seat auditorium, physical activities center, an athletic building, eight playing fields and a 13,200-seat football stadium.

Buildings are reinforced concrete, faced with handmade Virginia brick. The contemporary Williamsburg colonial architecture captures much of the flavor of the Old South, adapted to modern needs and usage. The Furman University physical plant is valued at over \$35,000,000 with 22 major buildings completed.

In addition to physical beauty, Furman enjoys an academic reputation which stretches across the nation. The faculty, 86 percent of whom hold earned doctoral degrees, consists of 138 full-time and 42 part-time professors. The student-faculty ratio of 15:1 allows for individual attention and personal relationships.

The James B. Duke Library, fully air-conditioned, houses over 250,000 volumes. More than 1,500 periodicals are received regularly and the microfilm and record collections are extensive.

Degrees are offered in a wide variety of fields including the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of General Studies, and Bachelor of Science degrees. The graduate division awards the Master of Arts degree with a major in education and the Master of Science degree with a major in chemistry. A Master of Business Administration degree is offered jointly by Furman's Department of Business Administration and the Clemson University College of Industiral Management and Textile Science.

Furman is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Southern University Conference, the Association of American Colleges and the South Carolina Association of Colleges. It is on the approved list of the American Association of University Women and the American Chemical Society, and is a member of the National Association of Schools of Music.

During his tenure as President of Furman University, Dr. John E. Johns has become one c the best friends of the athletic program. Dr. Johns, an avid golfer, takes an interest in all athleti pursuits at Furman and often follows the Paladin basketball and football teams on the road

Johns was president of Stetson University in DeLand, Fla., before returning to Furman, his alm mater, in 1976. He is a 1947 Furman graduate.

Johns had been a member of the Stetson facult and staff since 1948 before assuming the position of president in 1970. He achieved the rank of fu professor in the Department of History and Polit cal Science and served as department chairman. Di Johns became business manager at Stetson in 196 until he was named Vice-President for Finance in 1968

A native of Ozark, Alabama, Johns is the autho of Florida During the Civil War, the state's officia publication for its Centennial. He has written ar ticles for Encyclopedia Britannica, Jefferson Ency clopedia, The Mississippi Valley Historical Review and Florida Historical Quarterly.

Johns was a World War II Army Air Corps pilo from 1942-1945, and received the Distinguished Flying Cross.

He graduated cum laude from Furman, receiving the Bradshaw-Feaster Medal for General Excellence. He earned the M.A., and Ph.D. degrees from the University of North Carolina. He has been awarded honorary degrees in literature and the humanities by Rollins College, William Jewell College, Furman and Stetson.

Johns is married to the former Martha Mauney of Shelby, N.C., also a 1947 Furman graduate. Mrs. Johns has been recognized for service to her community and state and for valuable contributions to higher education. The Johns have three sons, John, Jr.; Steven; Marcus.

FACULTY CHAIRMAN OF ATHLETICS



Dr. Francis Bonner, who has been Faculty Chairman of Ath DR. FRANCIS W. BONNER letics since 1968, came to Furman as Associate Professor of English in 1949. Since 1953, he has been both teacher and administrator, serving consecutively as Dean of the Men's College Dean of the University, Vice President, and from 1972-1982 as Vice President and Provost. He is chairman of the University's Committee on Athletics and served six years as President of the Southern Conference, an unprecedented length of tenure in tha office. He presently serves on the prestigious NCAA Counci and on the Executive Committee of the Southern Conference He is an at-large Vice-President of the NCAA.

A native of Alabama, Dr. Bonner earned the B.A. and M.A degrees from the University of Alabama, and Ph.D degree from the University of North Carolina and did post-doctoral study and research at Harvard. His field is English, with concentration on Chaucer and the medieval period. He is one of the most loyal and enthusiastic Paladin sports fans.

He and his wife, Nilaouise, have a daughter and a son.

Dale Thomas "Dutch" Baughman is in his fourth year as Director of Athletics at Furman. The Columbus, Ohio native came to Furman in 1979 following two years as Assistant Athletic Director at Northwestern University.

"Dutch" owns an impressive slate of credentials as an athlete, coach and administrator.

"He is thoroughly knowledgeable about every aspect of athletic administration including promotion, fund raising, scheduling and the many other duties he will have," said Furman President John E. Johns, in announcing Baughman's appointment. "He is energetic, enthusiastic and has a reputation for hard work."

Baughman holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Ohio State University. He has also completed all doctoral work except the dissertation in athletic administration at Ohio State.

Prior to going to Northwestern, "Dutch" served as an administrative assistant and athletic counselor at OSU. Before that position, he served as a graduate assistant on the Buckeye football staff.

A former Marine Captain, Baughman played football, lacrosse and wrestled at the Columbus school.

Eric Hyman is in his first year as Associate Athletic Director at Furman. A member of the Furman football coaching staff for nine seasons, Hyman assumed his pressent position in April, 1982.

The 1973 University of North Carolina graduate coached the defensive line, linebackers and defensive ends during his tenure on the Paladin grid staff.

A former All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer on the defensive line, Hyman was a member of two league championship teams and played in two bowl games with the Tar Heels. He was selected All-South as a senior and was tabbed for the 1973 Hula Bowl. He was drafted by the New Orleans Saints of the National Football League in 1973.

THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE



Furman University is a member of the Southern Conference, one of the nation's oldest intercollegiate athletic conferences. The nine-team league is composed of members — Appalachian State, The Citadel, Davidson, East Tennessee State, Furman, Marshall, Tennessee-Chattanooga, Virginia Military Institute, and Western Carolina.

The Southern Conference was formed in 1921 at a meeting of 15 institutions in Atlanta, Georgia. The league initially was known as the Southern Intercollegiate Conference and the following 12 schools were charter members: Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Tech, and Washington & Lee.

The growth of the SIC was rapid and, within a year, Florida, LSU, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tulane, and Vanderbilt were added.

In 1923, the league was officially renamed the Southern Conference. Through the years, other schools were admitted but, in 1932, 13 of the 21 members left the conference to form the Southeastern Conference.

In February 1936, Furman was one of six new members admitted to the Southern Conference, including current members Davidson and The Citadel. In 1953, there was another mass exodus of schools from the league to form the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Southern Conference declares champions in 11 different sports, one being decided by tournament play. Tournaments have been a popular and profitable method of determining the yearly conference basketball champion. Southern Conference champions in basketball, baseball, and wrestling automatically qualify for participation in NCAA national tournaments. All members of the conference possess NCAA Division I status.

Kenneth Germann is the commissioner of the Southern Conference. Dallas Shirley serves as assistant to the Commissioner, and supervisor of officials. John Geis directs the service bureau. Furman University Vice President Francis W. Bonner served as president of the conference for six years.

The conference annually awards the Commissioner's Cup to the university which accumulates the greatest number of points in championship competition throughout the year.

DICK SHERIDAN - Head Football Coach





Now in his fifth year as head football coach at Furman University, Dick Sheridan has established himself as one of the nation's outstanding coaches.

Three times in the past four seasons, Sheridan has guided the Paladins to the top of the Southern Conference. In 1978, Sheridan's squad tied Tenn-Chattanooga for the league crown, then in 1980 his team captured the school's first outright conference football title and last season made it two championships in a row with an 8-3 overall mark and a 5-2 league finish. In 1978 and 1980 Sheridan was tabbed Southern Conference Coach-of-the-Year. The Columbia (S.C.) and Charleston (S.C.) Touchdown Clubs also recognized him as their top coach in 1978 and 1980. For his efforts in 1980, he also earned South Carolina Coach-of-the-Year honors from the South Carolina Sportswriters Association.

Named to the position in February of 1978, Sheridan has compiled a 30-13-1 overall record and a 20-6 Southern Conference mark. His first season's record of 8-3 was the best in eight years at Furman and only the second time since 1935 that the Paladins had achieved eight wins in a season. In 1979, the Paladins lost their first five games, only to bounce back to capture five of the final six games of the season. The lone loss in the final half of the year was a 21-20 defeat by Virginia Military in Lexington, Va. The following week, Furman defeated Davidson, 63-55, to set, at that time, an NCAA mark for most points scored in a game by two teams (118).

In 1980, Sheridan's charges became only the fourth Furman team since 1902 to win nine or more games in a single year. It was also the best season for the Paladins on the gridiron since 1927, when Furman fashioned a 10-1 record. Following a season-opening loss to nationally-ranked North Carolina, the Paladins reeled off a school record-tying eight consecutive wins, including six league victories. Two weeks later, Furman closed the gates to 45-year old Sirrine Stadium with a 28-15 defeat of arch-rival The Citadel, finishing 9-1-1 and 7-0 in Southern Conference action. The Paladins also extended their undefeated streak to ten games.

In 1981, Sheridan guided the Paladins to an 8-3 overall record, tying the school mark for victories in a four-year span with 30. Furman took its second consecutive league crown, defeating Virginia Military in Lexington, in November, 33-21, for the honor. Furman opened Paladin Stadium with a 21-0 win over East Tennessee State, to keep its stadium opening day record perfect at 3-0 since 1919.

Sheridan-coached teams have made their way into the NCAA statistical rankings as well. In his first campaign, the Paladins were included in the top 14 in the country in three offensive categories, leading the Southern Conference in total offense and rushing. In 1980, the Paladins ranked eighth in rushing offense, while finishing in the top 25 in rushing defense and scoring

offense. Furman also topped the league in rushing defense and scoring defense that season. In 1981, the Paladins were 16th in the nation in rushing offense and led the conference in rushing and scoring defense.

Sheridan came to Furman in 1972 as an assistant to Art Baker. He served five seasons as offensive coordinator before assuming the head coaching responsibilities.

The North Augusta, S.C., native joined the coaching staff at Eau Claire High School in Columbia, S.C., in 1964 and remained there as assistant football coach and head basketball coach until 1969. In three seasons as head basketball coach, his teams produced two conference championships and the state 'final four' twice, finishing second in 1969. He then assumed the head football duties at Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School for three seasons, where his 1971 squad finished with a 13-0 record and the State AAA title. That team ranked 12th in the nation and Sheridan was named South Carolina Coach-of-the-Year.

He then moved to Airport High School, in West Columbia, S.C., in 1972, before joining the Furman coaching staff. In his final three seasons as a high school head coach, his teams posted a 32-3 won-lost record and won more games during that period than any other team in South Carolina. His four-year prep record was an amazing 37-8-1.

A member of the Rawlings Sporting Goods Coaches Advisory Staff, he is director of the Dick Sheridan Quarterback and Receiver School, held each summer at Furman, featuring instruction by outstanding college coaches and several NFL quarterbacks and receivers.



FURMAN'S PALADIN STADIUM



Furman's Paladin Stadium, nestled beautifully on the campus with a scenic view of Paris Mountain, is the football home for the Paladins. The 13,200-seat facility was opened in 1981, replacing Sirrine Stadium, site for Furman football for 45 years.

Paladin Stadium is the third such facility for the Paladins since 1919. Manly Field, completed in 1919, was christened with a 7-6 victory over Wofford. In 1923, Manly Field seating was expanded to 8,000. Furman's final contest in Manly Field was a 20-9 win over Mercer in 1936.

Furman moved to newly constructed Sirrine Stadium for the sixth game of the season in 1936 and defeated Davidson 14-13. Just over 45 years later, the Paladins closed the gates to Sirrine with a 28-15 victory over arch-rival The Citadel and its first outright Southern Conference Championship.

Furman opened Paladin Stadium the same way it did Manly and Sirrine, winning the first intercollegiate contest played within its boundaries. The Paladins defeated East Tennessee State, 21-0. And in its first season of play, Paladin Stadium served as the home turf of the Southern Conference Champions.

From initial grading to completion, Paladin Stadium took two years to be realized at a cost of approximately \$2 million.

The home grandstand contains aluminum plank seating for 10,000, including over 1,000 with with permanent back rests. The visitor's side of the stadium will accommodate over 3,000.

The entire project was designed and developed to include the most convenient provisions possible for the handicapped. Handicap seating is located in Section 1 and a special parking-area located immediately adjacent to the special seating area. Restrooms were designed to easily accommodate the handicapped.

All restroom buildings (two on the home side and one on the visitor's) have provisions for both men and women.

Another feature of Paladin Stadium is the five-story press tower. Level 1 houses concession areas and ticket windows. The third floor of the press tower is used by the Furman Paladin Club, the athletic fundraising arm of the university, for pre and post game activities, and is serviced with a private porthole to stadium seating. On the fourth floor can be found the President's Box for his guests of the University and also includes two radio booths and an area for

television sportographers. Sportswriters, scouts, coaches, public address and team film crews is located on Level 5. All floors are serviced by an elevator and stairs and restroom facilities are located on each level.

Construction of the project was handled by Farley Construction Company of Columbia, S.C., and work continued through the summer of 1981 in order to complete the fourth and fifth phases of the stadium, to include the fieldhouse and lights.

The fieldhouse, located at the stadium's north end, contains the visitor's dressing room, an officials room which includes separate shower and toilet facilities, a visiting coaches room, and training rooms for both the visitors and home teams. Also included is a large area for pre-game and halftime, along with special meetings, for the Paladins.

Lighting of the field will be provided by 92 fixtures on four poles, two on each side of the stadium, with a maintained candle power of 60 at midfield.

The scoreboard, provided by Pepsi-Cola Bottling Company of Greenville, gives spectators complete display of game information. Located in the South end zone, the electronic board is located 15 feet above ground and measures 17 feet high and 35 feet long.

Paladin Stadium parking is located adjacent to the facility and can accommodate 3,200 cars. The stadium is accessible by Duncan Chapel Road and U.S. 25.

The playing field is hybrid Bermuda and landscaping at the stadium is in line with the design and architecture of the entire university.
