MEDIA INFORMATION

PRESS BOX: Furman working press facilities are located atop Paladin Stadium and are contained in the upper two levels of the press tower. Part of the fourth level is reserved for radio and television. The top level houses space for sportswriters, home and visiting coaches, public address, home and visiting game film and game statistics. All floors are serviced by elevator and stairs. The roof of the press tower is used for over-flow television and still photographers.

PRESS PASSES: All applications for working press credentials should be directed to the Sports Information Director and are issued on an individual game basis. Credentials should be requested as early as possible. Passes not furnished by return mail must be picked up in person at the "Will-Call" window, located on the ground level of the press tower. Passes must be displayed at all times during the game and Furman University reserves the right to revoke passes due to misconduct and/or misrepresentation.

COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS: No complimentary tickets will be issued through the Office of Sports Information. All requests must be made directly to the Director of Athletics.

BROADCAST: Permission to broadcast must be secured at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Line installations must be ordered by the individual station through its local telephone companies. Furman University operates a "trade-out" voice coupler for Southern Conference teams and is available to non-conference teams through a line fee. Prior arrangements must be made for the phone. Each station will be allocated a booth and four passes. Broadcast booths are located on the fourth level of the press tower.

SCOUTING: Passes for scouting purposes should be requested at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Each organization will be allocated one seat, with priority going to schools which Furman and its opponents will be playing the following week.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photo passes for use on the sidelines are limited to working press photographers only. Pass requests should be made as early as possible to the Sports Information Director. Photographers are permitted to work the sidelines (except between the 30-yard lines) and beyond the end zones.

PARKING: Requests for parking spaces should be made as early as possible. Special parking needs will be considered whenever possible. Media parking is located adjacent to the press tower.

SERVICES: Game programs, complete statistics, pre-game information including up-to-the minute changes, running play-by-play accounts and post game coach and player quotes are provided at every Furman contest. Two telephones are available following the game and a telecopier will be on hand throughout the day. Sandwiches and soft drinks are served on the fifth level of the press box. Post-game interviews can be conducted both on the field and in the locker rooms at the north end of the stadium. A ten-minute "cooling-off" period will be observed before the locker rooms are opened for members of the media.

FURMAN SPORTS INFORMATION STAFF

Rick Covington is in his sixth year as sports information director at Furman University. A native of Georgetown, Ky., Covington holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Morehead (Ky.) State University. He and his wife, Betty, have a son, Richie, and are expecting their second child in the fall.

Monte Dutton is in his second year as assistant sports information director. A 1980 Furman graduate, Dutton spent one year as a graduate assistant in the sports information office before going to the Greenwood Index Journal. He is a bachelor.



1983 OUTLOOK

Furman University Head Football Coach Dick Sheridan begins his sixth season at the helm and welcomes 47 lettermen, including seven offensive starters, five from the defense and one specialist from a year ago.

Of the losses incurred, eight players earned All-Southern Conference honors during their careers, four were honorable mention All-Americans and eight were four-year letter winners.

Sheridan and his coaching staff have the task of replacing these players and the sixth-year coach feels it will be a challenge to replace people of this quality, with those 21 lettermen playing major roles in capturing three straight conference titles.

The Paladins, 9-3 in 1982, captured their third consecutive Southern Conference title and their fourth in five seasons and hope to become only the second team in league history to win four straight crowns in 1983.

Furman took the conference championship with a 6-1 mark and received an automatic bid to the NCAA I-AA national playoffs. Furman, ranked sixth in I-AA last season and hosted a first round playoff game with South Carolina State, the first meeting between the two schools.

Offensively, the Paladins will be without the services of nine lettermen, including four starters, all missing from the offensive line. On defense, 10 lettermen are missing, six departing starting assignments. Two specialists are also gone from the 1983 roster.

SCHEDULE

The Paladins will face seven conference opponents this season, opening the league campaign on Sept. 24 at home versus Marshall. Furman will take on Davidson again this year, with the game counting as a league contest for the Wildcats, but not for the

Paladins. The Wildcats are competing for the league title for the first time since 1976. The Paladins will travel to Davidson, Oct. 29. Other league games are Virginia Military in Lexington, Oct. 1, Western Carolina on the road, Oct. 15, Appalachian State in Greenville, Oct. 22, East Tennessee State at home on Nov. 5, Tennessee-Chattanooga in Paladin Stadium, Nov. 12 and the season finale with arch-rival The Citadel in Johnson Hagood Stadium, Nov. 19. Johnson Hagood Stadium will also be the site of the NCAA I-AA National Championship the next two years.

Outside the conference, Furman will face South Carolina State in the season opener, Sept. 3, in a rematch of a first round NCAA I-AA playoff contest. The game will be played in Orangeburg. The Paladins will host Carson-Newman in the home opener, Sept. 10, and travel to Georgia Tech, Sept. 17.

OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Gone from last season's backfield are tailback Stephen White and fullback Jim Beddingfield. Both were used in backup roles last season.

Returning will be two-time Southern Conference Player of the Year Stanford Jennings (6-1, 205, Sr.) who rushed for 1,025 yards last year. Also returning at tailback are Robbie Gardner (5-9, 205, So.) and Brian Jager (5-10, 170, So.).

At fullback, Dennis 'Dinky' Williams (6-1, 220, Jr.) returns. The 1981 league Freshman of the Year has been the team's second leading rusher the past two seasons. Also at fullback are Steve Bennett (6-0, 205, Sr.), John Drye (6-0, 208, So.) and Jay Nix (5-0, 185, So.).

David Charpia (6-2, 210, Sr.), the league's top rated passer in 1982 returns at quarterback and will be joined by Drew Norman (6-1, 185, Jr.) and Bobby Lamb (6-0, 180, So.). Also at quarterback is Scott Dillman (6-0, 160, So.).

OFFENSIVE LINE

Gone from the interior line are six lettermen, including four starters. Gone is three-time all-league pick and Jacobs Blocking Trophy winner Mike Coneman at guard, all-league first team center Briggs Traylor, honorable mention all-conference selections Hollis Barton at guard and Bart Heres at tackle.

Returning in 1983 will be Paul Johannessen (6-1, 227, Sr.) and Bernard Durham (6-3, 230, Jr.) after splitting time at tackle last season. Also returning at tackle is Terry Phillips (6-2, 245, So.). Other players competing at tackle are Andrew Bernstein (6-3, 245, So.) and Joe Olliff (6-5, 217, So.). Bernstein lettered on the defensive line in 1981 and missed last season due to injury.

At guard are Dan Sleet (6-2, 236, Sr.) and Brad Merkl (5-9, 230, Jr.). David Taylor (6-1, 220, Jr.) moves to guard after lettering in 1982 at fullback. Greg Hall (6-2, 220, So.) moves over from the defensive front. Also available are Clay Hendrix (5-11, 215, So.) and Mark Landers (5-10, 208, So.).

At center, Jim Edmondson (6-1, 233, Jr.), Gene Reeder (5-11, 215, So.) and Bill Boroff (6-1, 218, So.) will vie for playing time.

RECEIVERS

One of the most inexperienced areas on the team last season, the Paladins lost one member, Robert Capers at flanker, from a year ago. Furman can call on nine lettermen in 1983.

Returning at tight end will be Jack Borders (6-3, 220, Sr.), a honorable mention all-

league choice last year, Steve Coppenger (6-0, 210, So.), Jonathan May (6-4, 225, Jr.) and Jeff Lee (6-2, 204, So.). Also available at tight end will be Zander Clem (6-2, 210, So.) and Dane Howard (6-3, 220, So.).

At wide receiver, Billy Risher (5-11, 170, Sr.) and Dennis Wright (5-11, 180, Sr.) are back for their senior seasons. Both are five-year players after missing a season due to injuries. Also returning at wide receiver are Chas Fox (6-1, 183, Jr.) and Rick Schnabele (5-10, 170, Sr.). John Sorrells (6-0, 176, Sr.) also a backup punter, and Bill Buchanan (5-10, 160, So.) are available for duty.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Missing from last season's defensive line is Steve Mazur, a four-year letterman, along with Billy Bryan and Joe Brookshire.

All-Southern Conference noseguard Troy Phillips (6-1, 228, Sr.) returns joined by lettermen Kenny Elder (6-2, 230, Jr.) and Eddie Bopp (6-1, 222, So.). Bopp missed 1982 due to injury.

Ricky Moody (6-4, 242, Sr.), an honorable mention all-conference pick last year, will be joined at tackle by Kent Williams (6-4, 230, Sr.), Robert David (6-2, 223, Jr.) and Derrell Kinley (6-5, 245, Jr.). Kinley missed last season with injuries. Also available on the line will be Norman Schaefer (6-4, 235, Jr.), Marc Cleveland (6-1, 239, So.) and Todd Walker (6-5, 234, So.).

DEFENSIVE ENDS & LINEBACKERS

Gone at linebacker is Billy Hall, an All-Southern Conference pick and the team's top tackler a year ago and at defensive end the Paladins are without the services of Felix Andrews, a 1981 all-league pick and Kevin Quinlan.

Returning at linebacker is starter Buck Coatney (6-0, 210, Sr.), the team's second leading tackler last year. Also back at linebacker are Rock Hurst (6-1, 203, Jr.) and Ben Browder (6-1, 206, Jr.). Verdell Patterson (5-11, 200, So.), Kyle Davis (5-11, 211, So.), Pat Deacetis (5-9, 185, Jr.) and Charlie Haislip (6-1, 217, So.) also return.

Robert Anders (6-2, 214, Sr.) returns at end, along with Jerrod Smith (6-2, 195, Jr.). Neal Anderson (6-3, 217, Sr.) moves over from tight end. He played defensive end in 1981. Mitch Gibson (5-10, 210, So.) also is back, along with David Carter (6-2, 206, So.).

SECONDARY

Four lettermen are gone from the defensive backfield. All-league back Gib McEachran, the team's leader in interceptions, Steve Walburn, Brent Sanders and John Zemina are missing from this year's depth chart, after helping set a school mark for interceptions in a season.

Heading the list of five returning lettermen is Kodak I—AA All-America Ernest Gibson (5-11, 185, Sr.) at cornerback. Also returning will be All-Southern Conference choice Mark Bridgman (5-11, 185, Sr.) at free safety, Gary Keller (5-11, 170, Sr.), Brian McCluskey (5-9, 170, Jr.) and Bryan Burns (6-0, 176, Jr.). McCluskey missed last season due to injury. Also back are Dennis Woods (6-0, 175, Jr.), Fred Baber (6-2, 189, So.), Cliff Barfield (6-0, 183, So.), Mark Sims (6-0, 200, Jr.), Benji Motte (5-11, 190, Fr.) and Jerome Norris (6-1, 190, Fr.). Also on hand for duty in the secondary is Karl Moody (6-2, 187, So.), a transfer from Liberty Baptist. Moody played

against the Paladins in 1981 and made 15 tackles in the game. He is the younger brother of defensive tackle Ricky Moody.

SPECIALISTS

Tim Tanguay, the school's record-setting placekicker the past three seasons is gone, along with Scott Smith, who lettered at long snapper in 1982.

Blair Biggerstaff (6-6, 201, Sr.), who has handled the kickoff chores the past two seasons, returns, along with placekickers Keven EsvaI (6-3, 195, So.) and Erik McCarthy (5-11, 183, Jr.).

Mark Bridgman served as punter last year and he, John Sorrells and Terry Phillips are expected to vie for the punting duties.

Robert Anders and Joe Olliff are considered leading candidates, along with Jim Edmondson for the long snapping duties and Drew Norman returns after serving as holder last year.

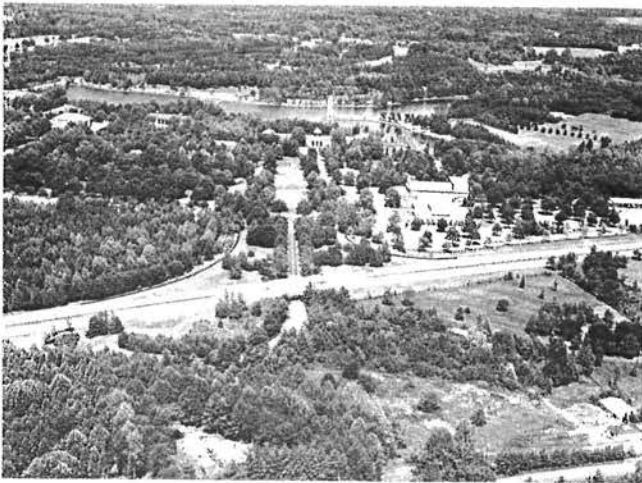

FURMAN UNIVERSITY

Furman University traces its origin to The Furman Academy and Theological Institution authorized in 1825 by the South Carolina Baptist State Convention and opened in 1827 at Edgefield, South Carolina. In 1850 it was chartered Furman University, and over the years has firmly established itself as one of the nation's leading private institutions.

The University is located on a 750-acre wooded campus six miles north of Greenville, and its campus acclaimed one of the most beautiful in the nation. Campus facilities and activities include a 30-acre lake for swimming, boating, and fishing, an 18-hole golf course, 20 tennis courts, a playhouse for experimental drama, a 2,000-seat auditorium, physical activities center, an athletic building, eight playing fields and a 13,200-seat football stadium.

Buildings are reinforced concrete, faced with handmade Virginia brick. The contemporary Williamsburg colonial architecture captures much of the flavor of the Old South, adapted to modern needs and usage. The Furman University physical plant is valued at over \$35,000,000 with 22 major buildings completed.

In addition to physical beauty, Furman enjoys an academic reputation which stretches across the nation. The faculty, 86 percent of whom hold earned doctoral degrees, consists of 138 full-time and 42 part-time professors. The student-faculty ratio of 15:1 allows for individual attention and personal relationships.

The James B. Duke Library, full air-conditioned, houses over 250,000 volumes. More than 1,500 periodicals are received regularly and the microfilm and record collections are extensive.

Degrees are offered in a wide variety of fields including the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of General Studies, and Bachelor of Science degrees. The graduate division awards the Master of Arts degree with a major in education and the Master of Science degree with a major in chemistry. A Master of Business Administration degree is offered jointly by Furman's Department of Business Administration and the Clemson University College of Industrial Management and Textile Science.

Furman is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Southern University Conference, the Association of American Colleges and the South Carolina Association of Colleges. It is on the approved list of the American Association of University Women and the American Chemical Society, and is a member of the National Association of Schools of Music.



DR. JOHN E. JOHNS President

During his tenure as President of Furman University, Dr. John E. Johns has become one of the best friends of the athletic program. Dr. Johns, an avid golfer, takes an interest in all athletic pursuits at Furman and often follows the Paladins basketball and football teams on the road.

Johns was president of Stetson University in DeLand, Fla., before returning to Furman, his alma mater, in 1976. He is a 1947 Furman graduate.

Johns had been a member of the Stetson faculty and staff since 1948 before assuming the position of president in 1970. He achieved the rank of full professor in the Department of History and Political Science and served as department chairman. Dr. Johns became business manager at Stetson in 1963 until he was named Vice President for Finance in 1968.

A native of Ozark, Alabama, Johns is the author of *Florida During the Civil War*, the state's official publication for its Centennial. He has written articles for *Encyclopedia Britannica*, *Jefferson Encyclopedia*, *The Mississippi Valley Historical Review*, and *Florida Historical Quarterly*.

Johns was a World War II Army Air Corps pilot from 1942-1945, and received the Distinguished Flying Cross.

He graduated cum laude from Furman, receiving the Bradshaw-Feaster Medal for General Excellence. He earned the M.A., and Ph.D. degrees from the University of North Carolina. He has been awarded honorary degrees in literature and the humanities by Rollins College, William Jewell College, Furman and Stetson.

Johns is married to the former Martha Mauney of Shelby, N.C., also a 1947 Furman graduate. Mrs. Johns has been recognized for service to her community and state and for valuable contributions to higher education. The Johns have three sons, John, Jr.; Steven; Marcus.



DR. FRANCIS W. BONNER Faculty Chairman of Athletics

Dr. Francis Bonner, who has been Faculty Chairman of Athletics since 1968, came to Furman as Associate Professor of English in 1949. Since 1953, he has been both teacher and administrator, serving consecutively as Dean of the Men's College, Dean of the University, Vice President, and from 1972-1982 as Vice President and Provost. He is chairman of the University's Committee on Athletics and served six years as President of the Southern Conference, an unprecedented length of tenure in that office. He presently serves on the prestigious NCAA Council and on the Executive Committee of the Southern Conference. He is an at-large Vice-President of the NCAA.

A native of Alabama, Dr. Bonner earned the B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of North Carolina and did post-doctoral study and research at Harvard. His field is English, with concentration on Chaucer and the medieval period. He is one of the most loyal and enthusiastic Paladin sports fans.

He and his wife, Nilouise, have a daughter and a son.



DUTCH BAUGHMAN

Director of Athletics

Dale Thomas "Dutch" Baughman is in his fifth year as Director of Athletics at Furman.

The Columbus, Ohio, native came to Furman in 1979 following two years as Assistant Athletic Director at Northwestern University.

Dutch owns an impressive slate of credentials as an athlete, coach and administrator.

Furman President John E. Johns said of Baughman, "He is thoroughly knowledgeable about every aspect of athletic administration. He is energetic, enthusiastic and has a reputation for hard work."

Concerned about all student-athletes and programs at Furman, Baughman has worked to give Furman a well-rounded intercollegiate program.

Baughman holds bachelor's and master's degrees from The Ohio State University. He has also completed all work except the dissertation on a doctoral degree in athletic administration at Ohio State.

Prior to going to Northwestern, Dutch served as administrative assistant and athletic counselor at Ohio State. Before that position, he served as a graduate assistant on the Buckeye football staff.

A former Marine captain, Baughman played football, lacrosse and wrestled at Ohio State.

He and his wife Jacquelyn have a son, Eric.

Associate Athletic Director

Eric Hyman is in his second year as Associate Athletic Director at Furman, after spending nine seasons on the Paladin football coaching staff. He assumed his present position in April, 1982.

The 1973 University of North Carolina graduate coached the defensive line, linebackers and defensive ends during his tenure on the Furman grid staff.

A former All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer on the defensive line, Hyman was a member of two ACC championship teams and played in two post-season bowl games with the Tar Heels. He was selected All-South as a senior and was tabbed for the 1973 Hula Bowl. He was drafted by the New Orleans Saints of the National Football League in 1973.

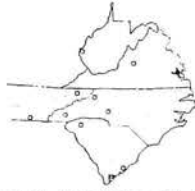

The Southern Conference was formed in 1921 at a meeting of 15 institutions in Atlanta, Georgia. The league initially was known as the Southern Intercollegiate Conference and the following 12 schools were charter members — Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Washington & Lee.

The growth of the SIC was rapid and, within a year, Florida, LSU, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tulane and Vanderbilt were added.

In 1923 the league was officially renamed the Southern Conference. Through the years, other schools were admitted but, in 1932, 13 of the 21 members left the conference to form the Southeastern Conference.

In February 1936, Furman was one of six new members admitted to the Southern Conference, including current members Davidson and The Citadel. In 1953, there was another mass exodus of schools from the league to form the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Southern Conference declares champions in 11 different sports, three being decided by tournament play. Tournaments have been a popular and profitable method of determining the yearly conference basketball champion. Southern Conference champions in basketball, baseball, football and wrestling automatically qualify for participation in NCAA national tournaments. All members of the conference possess NCAA Division I status.

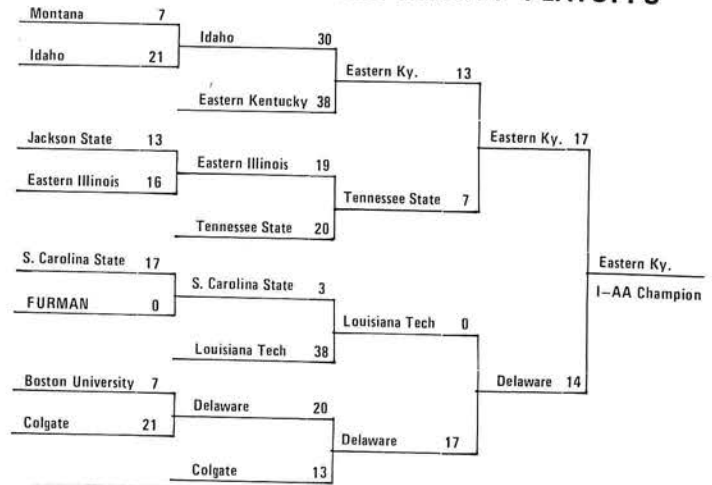
Kenneth Germann is the commissioner of the Southern Conference. Dallas Shirley serves as assistant to the commissioner and supervises officials. John Geis directs the service bureau. Furman University's Dr. Francis W. Bonner served as president of the conference for six years.

The conference annually awards the Commissioner's Cup to the university which accumulates the greatest number of points in championship competition throughout the year.

DICK SHERIDAN
Head Football Coach

In his sixth year as head football coach at Furman University, Dick Sheridan has established himself as one of the nation's outstanding coaches.

Four times in the past five seasons, Sheridan has guided the Paladins to the Southern Conference Championship. In 1978, Sheridan's squad tied Tennessee-Chattanooga for the league crown, then in 1980 his team captured the school's first outright conference title. In 1981, Furman again took the conference grid title and last season became only the

third school in league history to win three consecutive football crowns.

Named **Southern Conference Coach-of-the-Year** in 1978, 1980 and 1982, Sheridan became only the third coach to be coach of the year three times. The **Columbia (S.C.) and Charleston (S.C.) Touchdown Clubs** also recognized him as their top coach in 1978, 1980 and 1981 and the **South Carolina Sportswriters Association** named him **South Carolina Coach-of-the-Year** in 1980.

Named to the position in February of 1978, Sheridan has compiled a 39-16-1 overall record and a 26-7 Southern Conference mark. His first season's record of 8-3 was the best in eight years at Furman and only the second time since 1935 that the Paladins had achieved eight wins in a season. In 1979, the Paladins lost their first five games, only to bounce back to capture five of the final six contests of the season. The lone loss in the final half of the year was a 21-20 defeat by Virginia Military in Lexington. The following week Furman defeated Davidson, 63-55, to set, at that time, an NCAA mark for points scored in a game by two teams (118).

In 1980, Sheridan's charges became only the fourth Furman team since 1902 to win nine or more games in a single year. It was also the best season for the Paladins on the gridiron since 1927, when Furman fashioned a 10-1 record. Following a season-opening loss to nationally ranked North Carolina, the Paladins reeled off a school record-tying eight consecutive wins, including six league victories. Two weeks later, Furman closed the gates to 45-year-old Sistine Stadium with a 28-15 defeat of The Citadel, finishing 9-1-1 and 7-0 in the Southern Conference. The Paladins also extended their unbeaten streak to ten games.

In 1981, Sheridan guided the Paladins to an 8-3 overall record, tying a school mark for victories in a four-year span with 30. Furman took its second straight league crown, defeating Virginia Military in Lexington, 33-21 for the honor. Furman also opened Paladin Stadium with a 21-0 win over East Tennessee State, to keep its stadium-opening day record perfect at 3-0 since 1919.

In 1982, Furman again tied the school record with eight straight wins, including a 28-23 victory over South Carolina in Columbia before a crowd of 56,244. The Paladins finished the regular season with a 9-2 record and 6-1 league mark. The 39 wins in a five-year span also tied a school record. With its third consecutive Southern Conference title, Furman accepted an automatic bid to the NCAA I-AA Playoffs and hosted South Carolina State in the first round. The Bulldogs took a 17-0 decision in Paladin Stadium, with Furman closing out the year with a 9-3 record.

Sheridan-coached teams have made their way into the NCAA statistical rankings as well. In his first campaign, the Paladins were included in the top 14 in the country in

three offensive categories, leading the Southern Conference in total offense and rushing. In 1980, the Paladins ranked eighth in rushing offense, while finishing in the top 25 in rushing defense and scoring offense. Furman also topped the league in rushing defense and scoring defense that season. In 1981, Furman was 16th in the nation in rushing and led the conference in rushing and scoring defense. In 1982, Furman's first in the NCAA I-AA, the Paladins were second in rushing offense, eighth in scoring defense and turnover margin, ninth in total offense, 17th in total defense and had the best single-game rushing performance in the nation.

Sheridan came to Furman in 1973 as an assistant to Art Baker. He served five years as offensive coordinator before assuming the head coaching responsibilities.

The North Augusta, S.C., native joined the coaching staff at Eau Claire High School in Columbia, S.C., in 1964 and remained there as assistant football coach and head basketball coach until 1969. In three seasons as head basketball coach, his teams produced two conference championships and made the state "final four" twice, finishing second in 1969. He then assumed the head football duties at Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School for three seasons, where his 1971 squad finished with a 13-0 record and the State AAAA title. That team ranked 12th in the nation and Sheridan was named **South Carolina Coach-of-the-Year**.

He then moved to Airport High School, in West Columbia, S.C., in 1972, before joining the Furman coaching staff. In his final three seasons as a high school head coach, his teams posted a 32-3 won-lost record and won more games during that period than any other team in South Carolina. His four-year prep record was an amazing 37-8-1.

A member of the **Rawlings Sporting Goods Coaches Advisory Staff**, he is director of the **Dick Sheridan Quarterback and Receiver School** and the **Dick Sheridan Offensive Linemen School**, held each summer at Furman, featuring instruction by outstanding college coaches and several National Football League players.

A 1964 University of South Carolina graduate, Sheridan earned a master's degree in education from USC in 1969. He and his wife, Brenda, have two sons, Bobby and Jon.

Sheridan's coaching philosophy at Furman: "Our goal is to have the best football program in the Southern Conference. We will do our best to produce consistently successful teams that represent Furman University with class and with an obvious desire to excel."

JIMMY SATTERFIELD
Offensive Coordinator
Offensive Backs

Jimmy Satterfield is in his 11th season on the Paladin staff. He will again serve as offensive coordinator and will direct the offensive backs.

In addition to his coaching duties, the 1962 University of South Carolina graduate coordinates the off-season program and the acquisition of equipment for the Paladins.

Satterfield came to Furman in 1973 following a highly successful high school coaching tenure. In five seasons at Eau Claire and Irmo High Schools, Satterfield compiled a 47-9-1 won-lost slate. During that period his teams won five conference championships and one Upper State title. Defensive Backs

Bobby Johnson is in his seventh year on the Paladin coaching staff and his first as defensive coordinator. He will again handle the defensive secondary. A native of Columbia, S.C., Johnson holds a master's degree from Furman and is married to the former Catherine Bonner of Charleston.

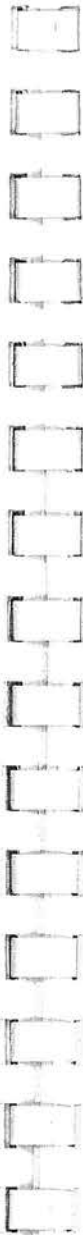
TED CAIN

A 1976 Furman graduate, Caldwell was a four-year letterman and served as team captain during his senior season. He also served as a graduate assistant on the football staff in 1976-77.

FURMAN'S PALADIN STADIUM



Furman's Paladin Stadium, nestled beautifully on the campus with a scenic view of Paris Mountain, is the football home for the Paladins. The 13,200-seat facility was opened in 1981, replacing SIRRINE Stadium, site for Furman football for 45 years.

Paladin Stadium is the third such facility for the Paladins since 1919. Manly Field, completed in 1919, was christened with a 7-6 victory over Wofford. In 1923, Manly Field seating was expanded to 8,000. Furman's final contest in Manly Field was a 20-9 win over Mercer in 1936.

Furman moved to newly constructed SIRRINE Stadium for the sixth game of the season in 1936 and defeated Davidson 14-13. Just over 45 years later, the Paladins closed the gates to SIRRINE with a 28-15 victory over arch-rival The Citadel and its first outright Southern Conference Championship.

Furman opened Paladin Stadium the same way it did Manly and SIRRINE, winning the first intercollegiate contest played within its boundaries. The Paladins defeated East Tennessee State, 21-0. And in its first two seasons, Paladin Stadium served as the home turf of the Southern Conference Champions.

From initial grading to completion, Paladin Stadium took two years to be realized at a cost of approximately \$2 million.

The home grandstand contains aluminum plank seating for 10,000, including over 1,000 with permanent back rests. The visitor's side of the stadium will accommodate over 3,000.

The entire project was designed and developed to include the most convenient provisions possible for the handicapped. Handicap seating is located in Section 1 and a special parking area located immediately adjacent to the special seating area. Restrooms were designed to easily accommodate the handicapped.

All restroom buildings (two on the home side and one on the visitor's) have provisions for both men and women.

Another feature of Paladin Stadium is the five-story press tower. Level 1 houses concession areas and ticket windows. The third floor of the press tower is used by the Furman Paladin Club, the athletic fundraising arm of the university, for pre and post game activities, and is serviced with a private porthole to stadium seating. On the fourth floor can be found the President's Box for his guests of the University and also includes two radio booths and an area for

television sportographers. Sportswriters, scouts, coaches, public address and team film crews is located on Level 5. All floors are serviced by an elevator and stairs and restroom facilities are located on each level.

Construction of the project was handled by **Farley Construction Company of Columbia, S.C.**, and work continued through the summer of 1981 in order to complete the fourth and fifth phases of the stadium, to include the fieldhouse and lights.

The fieldhouse, located at the stadium's north end, contains the visitor's dressing room, an officials room which includes separate shower and toilet facilities, a visiting coaches room, and training rooms for both the visitors and home teams. Also included is a large area for pre-game and halftime, along with special meetings, for the Paladins.

Lighting of the field will be provided by 92 fixtures on four poles, two on each side of the stadium, with a maintained candle power of 60 at midfield.

The scoreboard, provided by **Pepsi-Cola Bottling Company of Greenville**, gives spectators complete display of game information. Located in the South end zone, the electronic board is located 15 feet above ground and measures 17 feet high and 35 feet long.

Paladin Stadium parking is located adjacent to the facility and can accommodate 3,200 cars. The stadium is accessible by Duncan Chapel Road and U.S. 25.

The playing field is hybrid Bermuda and landscaping at the stadium is in line with the design and-architecture of the entire university.

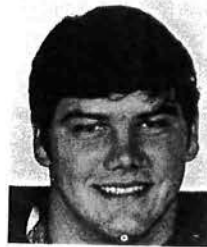

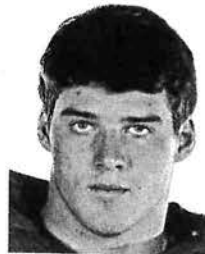

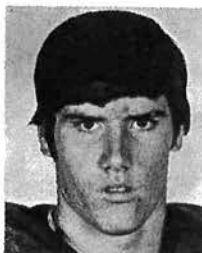
