Departure from Raleigh will be immediately following the game, with arrival on the Furman campus scheduled for 3 a.m.

MARSHALL (Sept. 22) — Team will depart the Greenville-Spartanburg Airport via Piedmont charter Friday at 9 a.m., with arrival in Huntington at 10 a.m. The Paladins will headquarter at the Holiday Inn Gateway (304/736-8974). COACH DICK SHERIDAN'S COMMENTS

OUTLOOK: Paladins Will Be Hard-Pressed To Repeat As Southern Conference Champs

Furman University head football coach and athletic director Dick Sheridan enters the 1984 season with a feeling of cautious optimism.

Sheridan is optimistic because this team has captured four straight Southern Conference championships and five in his six years as head coach. He is cautious because only six of 22 starters return from a squad that went 10-2-1, reached the Division I-AA national semifinals and turned in a 17-14 upset win over Georgia Tech.

"We've lost 16 starters from last year's team but, even more significant, most of that group contributed to four consecutive conference championships," Sheridan notes. "The challenge we face is in replacing not only the quantity of starters, but the quality of the athletes that graduated."

On the positive side, Sheridan can find little fault with the quality of his returnees. "Our rising senior class has provided exceptional leadership," he says. "Through spring practice and off-season work, all of our athletes realize that we must be improved individually and collectively if we are to be a factor once again in the conference championship race."

The team's returning starters are strong safety Fred Baber, offensive guard Clay Hendrix, linebacker Rock Hurst, offensive tackle Terry Phillips, center Gene Reeder and fullback Dennis "Dinky" Williams.

Among the more eminent starters missing from the 1983 team are record-setting tailback Stanford Jennings (a third-round NFL draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals), cornerback Ernest Gibson (a first-team All-American and sixth-round choice of the New England Patriots), quarterback David Charpia, free safety-punter Mark Bridgman, offensive guard Dan Sleet, offensive tackle Paul Johannessen and linebacker Buck Coatney. Each member of this group made first-team all-conference a year ago.

On offense, it will be difficult for the Paladins to replace the individual performances of Jennings, Charpia and flanker Billy Risher, each of whom are prominently featured in the school record book. However, a number of experienced players do return.

Junior quarterback Bobby Lamb possesses quarterbacking credentials already tested in the heat of varsity action. Last season, when injuries put Charpia on the sidelines for a time, Lamb directed Furman to a 52-7 romp over Carson-Newman and the 17-14 decision over Georgia Tech. A skilled performer on option plays, Lamb appears ready to step in and continue the recent tradition of strong Paladin signal-callers.

Another offensive backfield returnee is fullback Williams, who will likely team with junior tailback Robbie Gardner behind Lamb. Tops on the receiving corps is speedy co-captain and flanker Chas Fox, who caught 28 passes for 555 yards, including one 92-yard TD bomb, in 1983. Three line returnees should provide a good foundation there.

Junior placekicker Keven Esval will be back after setting a school record with his 53 successful extra-point conversions in 55 attempts, but a replacement is needed for graduated punter Bridgman.

Co-captain Hurst at linebacker and free safety Baber are the only likely returnees to the defensive starting cast, so stopping the opposition will be a stiff challenge for the young Paladin defenders this season. The most experienced players returning are ends Mitch Gibson (97 tackles) and Jerrod Smith (44 stops), tackle Robert David and safety Karl Moody.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH & DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS Dick Sheridan

Head football coach since 1978 and serving his second year as Director of Athletics, Dick Sheridan has compiled a remarkable record in both areas.

In six years directing the Paladin football program, Sheridan-coached teams have captured five Southern Conference championships and participated in the I-AA playoffs in each of the university's two seasons of membership in the division. His won-lost record is a remarkable 49-18-2, with the finest winning percentage (.725) in school history.

As athletic director, his accomplishments are equally impressive. He has actively participated in a rapid upgrading of women's athletics, with significant steps taken in scholarship development and revenue production aimed at improving all of Furman's 17-sport program.

Sheridan's five Southern Conference football championships include the last four in a row, a feat equaled only once since the conference was founded in 1921.

"Our goal is to have the best football program in the Southern Conference," Sheridan says. "We've tried to set high goals for our program and to stress the importance of hard work in reaching those goals. We tell our players that, if you give everything you've got and do everything you can possibly do, then you can be proud, no matter what the outcome."

The achievement of athletic excellence is not the entire story, however. Sheridan feels very strongly that Furman athletes should represent the university with class and character. He takes great pride in the fact that his teams have been highly rated by opponents for their sportsmanship and clean-cut appearance.

Since taking over as head football coach, approximately 98 percent of Furman seniors have graduated, with three Paladin players awarded prestigious NCAA post-graduate scholarships in recent years.

On the gridiron, Sheridan has taken the Paladin program to unprecedented heights. Furman had never won a conference football championship prior to his tenure, and the work of the current staff of coaches and players has cultivated a new and vibrant sense of pride in Furman athletics.

Sheridan came to Furman in 1973 as an assistant to Art Baker. He served five years as offensive coordinator before assuming the head coaching responsibilities.

The North Augusta native joined the coaching staff at Eau Claire High School in Columbia, S.C., in 1964 and remained there as assistant football coach and head basketball coach until 1969, winning two conference championships and making the state's Final Four twice in basketball. He then assumed the head football duties at Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School for three seasons, winning the AAAA title in 1971.

Sheridan then moved to Airport High School in West Columbia in 1972 before joining the Furman coaching staff the next year. In his final three seasons as a high school head coach, his teams posted a 32-3 won-lost record and won more games than any team in the state during that period.

A 1964 graduate of the University of South Carolina, Sheridan earned a master's degree in education from USC in 1969. He and his wife, Brenda, have two sons, Bobby and Jon.

ASSISTANT COACHES

STEVE ROBERTSON Assistant Head Coach Defensive Line

Steve Robertson is now in his 12th season lending his valuable expertise to the football program at Furman University.

The personable Robertson serves as Assistant Head Coach and coaches the defensive line. He formerly served 10 years as Furman's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to Assistant Head Coach in 1982. He also assists teams with travel arrangements, handles liaison with professional scouts and coordinates banquets, awards and game organization.

A 1957 graduate of Newberry College, Robertson came to Furman in 1973 after five seasons as defensive coordinator at his alma mater. Before joining the Indian staff, he spent eight seasons at Eau Claire High School in Columbia as assistant and head coach.

Robertson and wife Linda have a son, Ron, and a daughter, Robin.

JIMMY SATTERFIELD Offensive Coordinator Offensive Backs

Also in his 12th year at Furman, Jimmy Satterfield specializes in offensive strategy, and the Paladin offense has consistently been ranked highly in a number of categories since Satterfield became offensive coordinator in 1978.

Along with Dick Sheridan and Steve Robertson, both of whom were longtime colleagues in the high school coaching ranks, Satterfield came to Furman in 1973 as a member of Art Baker's staff.

Before joining the Paladin staff, Satterfield served a highly successful high school coaching tenure. He compiled a 47-9-1 won-lost slate in five seasons at Eau Claire and Irmo high schools. When Irmo captured the upperstate title in 1970, Satterfield was named South Carolina Coach of the Year and also directed the Shrine Bowl team.

A Lancaster native, Satterfield holds bachelor's and master's degrees from South Carolina. He and wife Ann have three children, Shaun, Sydney and Lee.

BOBBY JOHNSON Defensive Coordinator Defensive Backs

Bobby Johnson is in his eighth season on the Paladin coaching staff and second as defensive coordinator.

Johnson, a former ACC All-Academic selection at Clemson, returned to the Furman coaching staff in 1981 after a year as academic adviser at his alma mater. In addition to his coaching duties, Johnson coordinates player admissions, financial aid, housing and academics.

A four-year starter at wide receiver and cornerback at Clemson, Johnson graduated in 1973. At one time or another, he played under Furman coaches Dick Sheridan, Steve Robertson and Jimmy Satterfield while at Eau Claire High School. He also played in the 1968 Shrine Bowl.

Johnson is married to the former Catherine Bonner of Charleston.

TED CAIN Passing Game Coordinator Recruiting Coordinator Receivers

Ted Cain is in his eighth season on the Furman staff, coordinating the passing game and receiving corps.

Cain also serves as recruiting coordinator for the Paladins, handling the distribution of all recruiting information, compiling data on prospects and supervising visits by prospective student-athletes. He also coordinates the junior varsity program, as well as handling charts and statistics along with testing and the summer workouts program.

A 1974 graduate of Furman, Cain served two years as platoon leader in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Ft. Benning, Ga. In his college days, he started for three years at tight end for the Paladins.

An Aiken native, Cain holds a master's degree in education from Furman. He and wife Susan have a son, Matthew.

ROBBIE CALDWELL Athletic Strength Coordinator Offensive Line

Robbie Caldwell is in his seventh year as the Paladins' offensive line coach and his second as strength and conditioning coordinator for the entire Furman athletic department.

The 1975 Paladin Award winner returned to his alma mater in 1978 after a one-year coaching stint at Hanahan High School near Charleston. A 1976 Furman graduate, Caldwell is a former four-year letterman and team captain at center.

As offensive line coach, Caldwell has coached two Jacobs Blocking Trophy winners and four All-Americans. He supervises maintenance for the grid program, while also being responsible for the weight program, training table and field equipment.

A Pageland native, Caldwell is a bachelor.

KEN PETTUS Special Teams Coordinator Linebackers

Ken Pettus returns to the Furman coaching staff after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Dunwoody, Ga., High School.

Pettus previously served on the Paladin coaching staff in 1973-74 as a graduate assistant and 1978-80 as full-time assistant. In addition to his duties as special teams coordinator and linebackers coach, he oversees equipment purchases and student managers.

A former small college All-America selection at Newberry College, Pettus also played his high school football at Greenville High School for Coach Slick Moore.

Pettus has a master's degree in education from Furman. He is married to the former Jan Griffin of Gainesville, Fla.

JEFF SNIPES
Defensive Ends

Having made a successful transition from the playing field to the sidelines, Jeff Snipes is in his third season coaching the defensive ends at his alma mater.

A native of Belton, Snipes was a two-time All-Southern Conference selection at defensive end for the Paladins. He was an Associated Press honorable mention All-America selection in 1980 and was the leading vote-getter on the all-conference squad that year.

FURMAN UNIVERSITY

Furman University enjoys a reputation for all-around excellence that is unique for a school of only 2,500 students.

Last year the university was prominently featured in an evaluation of American colleges and universities commissioned by U.S. News & World Report. In that study, Furman was rated third among comprehensive universities east of the Mississippi River in academic excellence.

Furman also boasts a fine athletic program. The Paladin football program reached the national semifinals in NCAA Division I-AA last season, and the women's golf program finished third in the Division I national championships. Among other programs that achieved prominence in national rankings and Southern Conference standings were women's swimming, women's tennis, men's golf, soccer and men's swimming.

Founded in 1826, Furman is one of America's 64 oldest colleges and the oldest affiliated with the Southern Baptist denomination. Generously supported by South Carolina Baptists, it is also a major beneficiary of the Duke Endowment.

The university is located on a 750-acre wooded campus six miles north of Greenville, its campus acclaimed as one of the nation's most beautiful. Campus facilities include a 30-acre lake for swimming, boating and fishing, an 18-hole championship golf course, 20 tennis courts, a playhouse for experimental drama, a 2,000-seat auditorium, physical activities center, an athletic building, eight playing fields and a 13,200-seat football stadium.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Press Box: Furman working press facilities are located atop the home stands at Paladin Stadium and are contained in the upper two levels of the press tower. Part of the fourth level is reserved for radio and television. The top level houses space for sportswriters, home and visiting coaches, public address, home and visiting game film and game statistics crews. All floors are serviced by elevator and stairs.

Press Passes: All applications for working press credentials should be directed to the Sports Information Director and are issued on an individual game basis. Passes not furnished by return mail must be picked up in person at the "Will-Call" window, located on the ground level of the press tower.

Broadcast Rights: Permission to broadcast must be secured at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Furman University operates a "trade-out" voice coupler for Southern Conference teams and is available to non-conference teams through a line fee. Prior arrangements must be made for the phone. Each station will be allocated a booth and four passes. Broadcast booths are located on level four of the press tower.

Scouting: Passes for scouting purposes should be requested at least two weeks in advance. Each organization will be allocated one seat on a space available basis.

Photographers: Photo passes are limited to working press photographers only. Photographers are permitted to work the sidelines (except between the 30-yard lines) and beyond the end zones.

Parking: Requests for parking should be made as early as possible. Media parking is located adjacent to the press tower.

Services: Game programs, complete statistics, pre-game information, running play-by-play and post-game coaches' quotes are provided at every Furman contest. Telephones are available after the game and a telecopier will be available throughout the day. Sandwiches and soft drinks are served on the fifth level of the press box. Post-game interviews can be conducted both on the field and in the locker rooms at the north end of the stadium. A 10-minute "cooling off" period will be observed before the locker rooms are opened for members of the media.

BEST TIME TO REACH COACH SHERIDAN
