blocked for 1,000-yard rushers Brian Jager and Robbie Gardner while at Furman..."Kennet Goldsmith blocks better at the point of attack than any fullback we've ever had here," Satterfield says, "and I say that in full knowledge that we've had some outstanding fullbacks like Steve Bishop, Dinky Williams, and John Drye in our program over the last few years"...is a strong contender for the league's Jacobs Blocking Award and a sneaky fast but strong runner...clocked a 4.58 40-yard dash in the spring...excels at breaking tackles due to solid lower body strength...forces defenses to respect the middle, thus making Furman's option attack more effective...recorded an average grade of 2.03 (2.00 is considered exceptional) in eleven games, totaling 33 knockdowns and 12 rhino blocks last year...his 2.30 grade against VMI (6 knockdowns, 2 rhinos, and 8 broken tackles) was the finest performance and highest grade ever recorded by a Paladin fullback...rushed for 505 yards and five touchdowns in 1987 with best game, yardage-wise, coming in the season opener against South Carolina State (10 carries, 95 yards)...was tabbed by his teammates last year as the squad's Best Offensive Back...has now rushed for 1,127 yards in his Paladin career...was one of only a few freshmen to contribute on Furman's best-ever, 12-2 1985 team that finished as national runnerup, totaling 211 yards on 36 carries that year...will serve as a captain on this year's team along with senior linebacker Jeff Blankenship...member of Furman's 400-Pound Bench Press Club.

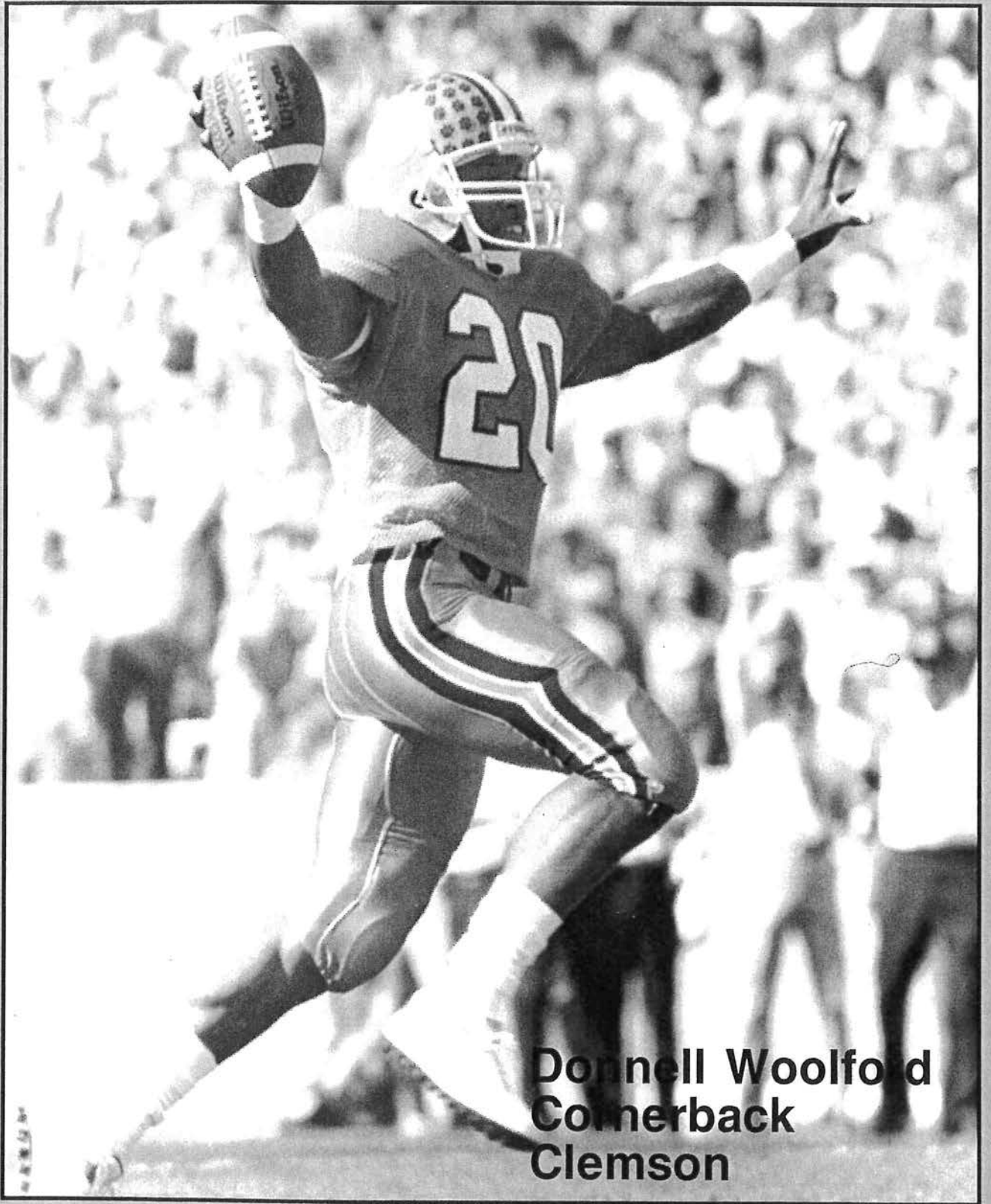

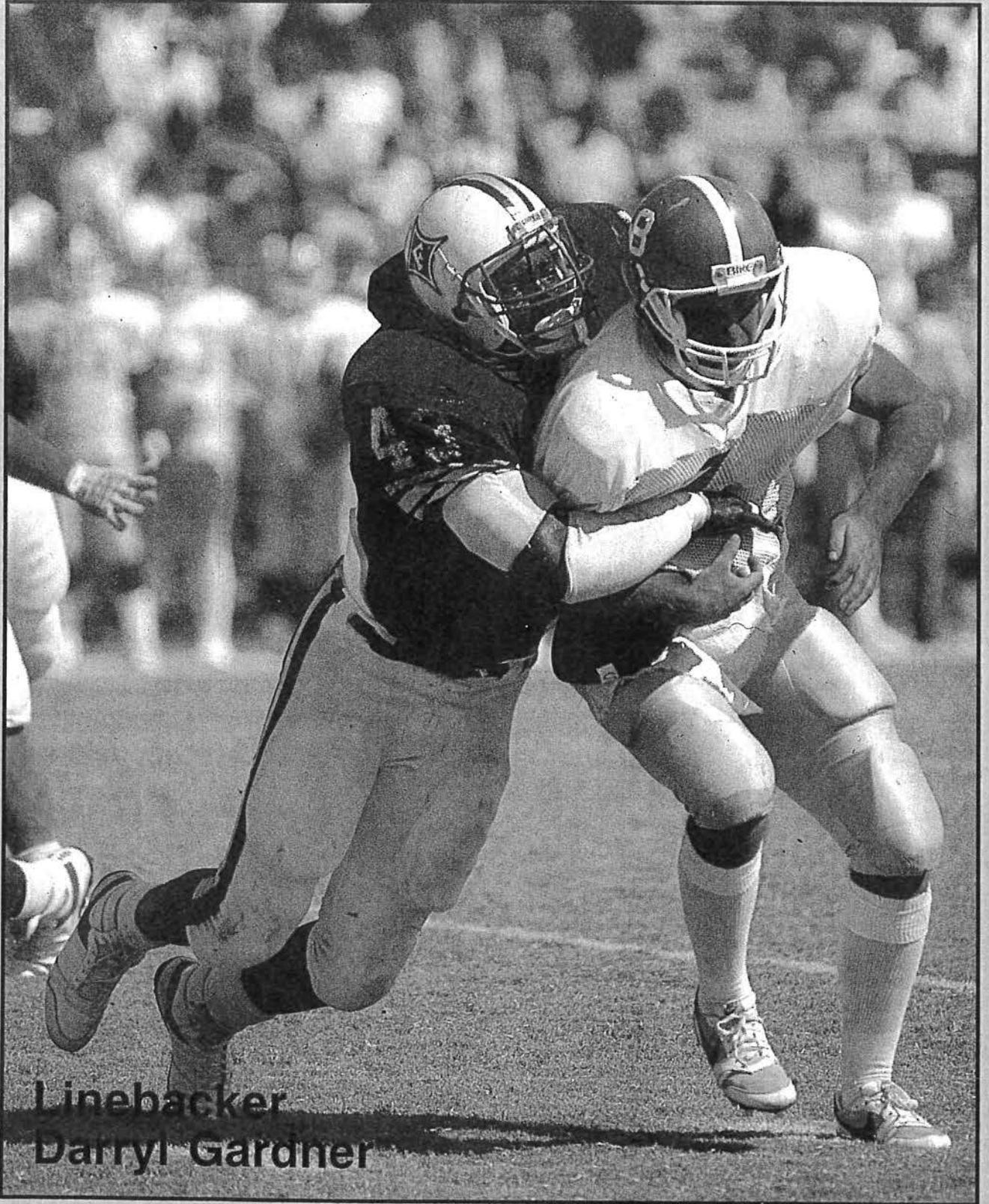
