Furman: Will be looking to return to form after missing all of spring practice due to continuing rehabilitation efforts for an injured knee sustained early last year...if healthy, may rank as Furman's top linebacker and one of the Southern Conference's best...sports excellent size, range, and instincts...got off to a solid start a year ago as Furman's starting strong side linebacker before a knee injury in the

second quarter of the Marshall game (10-7 loss) sidelined him for three games...returned with a 10-tackle outing against William & Mary (38-28 loss) and, despite not being 100 percent, proved to be a key contributor as a backup to Steve Norris in Furman's strong stretch run...ended the season with 75 tackles, six hits-for-losses, and three pass deflections...best overall outing in 1990 came against Tennessee-Chattanooga (38-21 win), when he registered a season high 15 tackles and two tackles-for-loss...shared Furman's Freshman-of-the-Year Award with tailback Carl Tremble after a brilliant 1989 campaign that saw him lead Furman in tackles with 180 stops —the third highest single season tackle total in Paladin football history...in all finished third in the Southern Conference in tackles that year, averaging 12.8 stops per game...notched a career high 20 tackles, interception, and fumble recovery against Youngstown State (42-23 win) in 1989 NCAA I-AA quarterfinal playoff action...originally came to Furman in 1988 but missed almost the entire '88 season after suffering an injury to his left knee (torn cartilage) against Clemson (23-3 loss) in the season opener...underwent two arthroscopic surgery procedures to correct the problem and later gained a medical redshirt...bench pressed 370 pounds and power cleaned 260 pounds in spring testing.
