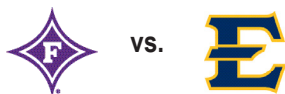

IT'S PALADINS

We're the "Pala-dins", NOT "Pah-ladins", "Pah-ladians", or "Purple" Paladins, just as South Carolina isn't called the "Garnet" Gamecocks or Clemson the "Orange" Tigers.

WHAT'S A PALADIN?

A "Paladin" is a knight on a horse, a paragon of chivalry; a heroic champion; a strong supporter or defender of a cause; and any of the 12 peers of French emperor Charlemagne's court. While history reveals knights were not always mounted men-at-arms, the modern image of a knight, mounted and in full armor, has undoubtedly influenced the concept of Furman's mascot.

WE'VE BEEN PLAYING THIS SPORT A LONG TIME

The 2025 campaign marks the 120th season of football at Furman, which has played 1,196 games (651-508-38) in its history (began in 1889). Furman's 651 victories are tops among all current Southern Conference schools.

SETTING THE SCENE

Coming off a SoCon 31-13 Southern Conference season opening road win over Samford on Saturday, Furman (3-1, 1-0 SoCon) returns home for the first time in almost a month to face East Tennessee State (2-3, 0-1 SoCon) in a 2:00 p.m. ESPN+ streamed contest at Paladin Stadium that will highlight Family Weekend.



Saturday's contest is deemed a "White Out," with fans in attendance encouraged to wear all-white. In addition, Furman will celebrate the 30th anniversary of its 1985 Southern Conference championship and NCAA I-AA national runner-up team that went 12-2 overall and 6-0 in SoCon play. The campaign included 11 consecutive victories, including a 42-20 rout of N.C. State.

SERIES NOTES

Furman holds a 30-9 lead in its series with East Tennessee State and has posted a 7-2 record against the Buccaneers since ETSU rejoined the SoCon in 2016. Furman owns an 18-3 slate in games played in Greenville, including a 16-8 decision in 2023. The Paladins have won the last three clashes, including last year's 24-21 win in Johnson City. The Buccaneers claimed a 19-17 verdict in Paladin Stadium in 2021 but are just 2-14 all-time in the facility since it opened in 1981 when ETSU was the opposition in the stadium inaugural (21-0 Furman win).

LAST TIME OUT

BIRMINGHAM, ALA. (Sept. 27, 2025) — Furman's defense forced three turnovers and registered seven sacks en route to a 31-13 victory over Samford in the Paladins' Southern Conference opener at Pete Hanna Stadium.

The victory, Furman's fourth straight in Birmingham, improved the Paladins to 3-1 overall and 1-0 in league play. The Bulldogs slipped to 0-5 on the season, including 0-3 in SoCon action.

Leading 14-7 late in the second quarter, Furman's defense and special teams came up with game-changing plays. **Raleigh Herbert** batted a Quincy Crittendon pass up in the air, intercepted the ball and raced 47 yards for the pick-six to put the Paladins in front 21-7 with 48 seconds left in the half. Samford marched to the Paladins' 18-yard line, but **Joshua Stoneking** pushed through the middle to block Ty Ippolito's 36-yard field goal attempt as time expired to send Furman into the locker room with a 14-point cushion.

The Paladin defense stuffed Crittendon on a quarterback keeper on fourth-and-two at midfield

on the opening drive of the third quarter, and Furman signal caller **Trey Hedden** followed by engineering a five-play, 50-yard drive that ended with his four-yard touchdown toss to **Ja'Keith Hamilton** to extend the lead to 28-7.

Furman halted Samford on seven of its eight drives in the second half, including a pair of turnovers and two fourth-down stops to secure the victory. Stoneking finished with two of the Paladins' seven sacks while **Demetrius Baldwin** and **Garrison Butler** joined Herbert in creating turnovers with a forced fumble and interception, respectively.

The Paladins' seven quarterback takedowns gave them 16 sacks in the last two games versus Samford.

Hedden completed 28-of-41 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns to pace the Paladins to 377 yards of total offense. Freshman wide receiver **Evan James** caught seven passes for 88 yards and opened the scoring with a 17-yard touchdown run. Kerry King added eight catches for 81 yards. Linebacker **Luke McLaughlin** helped pace the Furman defense with 11 tackles, a sack, and a forced fumble.

Crittendon led the Samford offense by connecting on 28-of-42 passes for 252 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

LAST MEETING

JOHNSON CITY, TENN. (Nov. 16, 2024) — Furman intercepted three ETSU passes, including two in the second half, and quarterback **Trey Hedden** tossed a pair of touchdown passes as the Paladins upset the FCS 21st-ranked Bucs, 24-21, at Greene Stadium.

After ETSU scored a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to grab a 21-14 lead, Hedden tossed a 31-yard scoring strike on a third and six play with 1:36 to go in the quarter to even the game at 21-21. **Billy Lewis** and **Maurice Perkins** intercepted Bucs quarterback Gino English on back-to-back possessions to open the fourth quarter, the second of which led to a 21-yard, go-ahead field goal by senior **Ian Williams** with 9:08 remaining.

Furman's defense forced a three-and-out on ETSU's next offensive possession, allowing the Paladins to take over the ball at their own 24 yard line with 7:18 to go. Hedden led the Paladins on a 14-play drive that resulted on Furman taking a knee to run out the clock and secure its third consecutive win over ETSU.

ETSU outgained the Paladins in total offense 425-282 but committed three turnovers, which led to 10 points for Furman. Hedden completed 23-of-28 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns while Hinton hauled in six passes for 62 yards. **Ethan Harris** totaled three catches for 61 yards and **Ben Ferguson** recorded two catches for 23 yards and a score.

In addition to Lewis and Perkins' second half interceptions, **Caleb Williams** picked off a

second quarter pass by English and returned it 35 yards to setup **Myion Hicks'** two-yard touchdown plunge that gave the Paladins a 14-7 lead at halftime.

Devontae Houston led the ETSU offense with 12 carries for 103 yards and a touchdown, which came on a 64-yard sprint to the end zone in the first half.

PRESEASON POLLS

Furman was a preseason No. 6 pick in a poll conducted by Southern Conference head coaches. The Paladins posted a 3-8 record a year ago, including a 2-5 SoCon mark that produced an eighth-place league finish. ETSU was fourth in the same poll. The Buccaneers went 7-5 overall and 5-3 in SoCon play to tie for third place in the league standings.

FAMILIAR FACES

Two familiar faces to Furman fans will be on ETSU's sidelines this Saturday. **Patrick Covington**, the Buccaneers' first-year offensive line coach and run game coordinator, is a 2006 Furman graduate and two-time All-SoCon and 2005 All-American offensive guard for the Paladins who was recruited and coached by **Clay Hendrix** — at the time Furman's offensive line coach. Covington was a member of Furman's 2004 SoCon championship team and three Paladin squads that advanced to the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Chad Staggs, ETSU's defensive coordinator, was Hendrix's choice to serve as defensive coordinator after he accepted Furman's head coaching reins in 2017. He served in that capacity for two years (2017-18) and helped the Paladins earn an FCS playoff berth his first year and SoCon championship in 2018.

FOUR STRAIGHT IN BIRMINGHAM

Furman's 31-13 Southern Conference season opening win over Samford on Saturday extended the Paladins' winning streak in against the Bulldogs in Birmingham to four games — Furman's longest current active road streak against any league foe.

SACK 'EM UP

Playing a big role in Furman's 31-13 win over Samford was a stout pass rush that racked up seven sacks, which cracked the record book as the sixth (tied) most in program history. The seven takedowns, which came from contributions from eight players, upped the Furman's season tally to 14 thru four games. A year ago the Paladins notched 20 sacks in 11 contests. It also gave Furman 16 sacks in its last two games (wins) against Samford, fronted by nine takedowns recorded in 2023 in a 27-21 Paladin victory in Birmingham.

STONEKING TOPS FCS IN SACKS, TACKLES FOR-LOSS

Redshirt sophomore defensive end **Joshua Stoneking** authored another chapter in his stellar early season body of work on Saturday at Samford, registering six tackles, two sacks, and a blocked field goal on the final play of the first half to send Furman into the locker room with a 21-7 lead. Although not credited with a PBU, his batted pass was intercepted by freshman defensive lineman **Garrison Butler** at the Furman 14 yard line in the game's final minute. Stoneking's two sacks, which fronted the Paladins' solid defensive effort that tallied seven sacks in the 31-13 victory, followed a brilliant performance in Furman's 28-24 win over Campbell (Sept. 13), which saw him tally six tackles, including 4.5 for-loss of 21 yards, 2.5 sacks, and a forced fumble. His final sack, which came on fourth down and with 16 seconds on the clock and Campbell at Furman's 17-yard line, secured the victory and netted him SoCon Defensive Player of the Week honors, as well as FCS Nation Radio National Defensive Player of the Week laurels. Stoneking has 25 tackles, including a FCS leading 6.5 sacks and 10.5 tackles for-loss through four games.

MANY HANDS

Eight players played a part in Furman's seven sacks in Saturday's 31-13 win over Samford.

BLOCK THAT KICK

Joshua Stoneking's block of Samford's 36-yard field goal attempt on the final play of the first half of Saturday's game was the first by a Paladin since.....Stoneking blocked a 22-yard field goal attempt in Furman's 48-7 win over Stetson last season.

TIP DRILL PAYS OFF

Linebacker **Raleigh Herbert** delivered perhaps the biggest defensive play in Saturday's 31-13 win over Samford. With Furman leading 14-7 in the final minute of the second quarter and Samford in possession at the Paladin 48, Herbert tipped a Bulldog pass, which we collected at the Samford 47 and sprinted untouched to the end zone with 46 seconds remaining to help send Furman into halftime with a 21-7 advantage. Herbert's pick-six was the second of the season by the Paladins following safety **Taylen Blaylock's** 43-yard return for a score in the season opening, 23-21 win over William & Mary.

MCLAUGHLIN STEPS UP

Linebacker **Luke McLaughlin** has stepped up in notable fashion since moving into the starting lineup against Campbell following a season ending hand injury to **Ryan Earl**. In his first career start against the Camels, he registered a team leading 11 tackles in the 28-24 victory. In his second start versus Samford he paced Furman again with 11 stops, along with a sack and a forced fumble in the Paladins' 31-13 triumph.

FIRST TIME STARTER

Graduate offensive tackle Jaydon Collins became the latest Paladin to make his Furman starting debut when he got the nod in Saturday's 31-13 victory at Samford. Collins, a Wake Forest graduate and Greer, S.C., native, sat out the first three games after sustaining a knee injury early in the preseason.

HEDDEN ON THE MARK, AGAIN

Furman quarterback **Trey Hedden** fashioned another solid performance in the Paladins' 31-13 win over Samford, connecting on 28-of-41 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns (no interceptions). That followed his strong outing in the 28-24 win over Campbell on Sept. 13, when he hit on 26-of-35 passes for a career high 314 yards and two touchdowns (no interceptions). His work versus Campbell, which included touchdown strikes covering 24 and 30 yards, also featured three consecutive second half scoring drives covering 84, 64, and 80 yards and netted him SoCon Offensive Player of the Week honors. The 314 passing yards checks in at 17th in Furman history but is only seventh game the Paladins have won (7-13) among the program's top 20 passing performances. He heads into Saturday's game versus ETSU riding a streak of (88) pass attempts without an interception, dating back to the third quarter of the Presbyterian game. Hedden's 2,795 passing yards rank 18th in program history.

WILLIAMS PICKS UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Furman preseason first team All-America placekicker **Ian Williams** has gotten off to a start befitting his tab as the top kicker in the FCS. He stepped up in a big way in the Paladins' 23-21, season opening win over William & Mary, accounting for all nine Furman second half points with three field goals that rallied Furman from a 21-14 second half deficit. His first field goal covered 50 yards in the third quarter, and he connected from 42 and 32 yards in the fourth period, his final conversion coming with 2:43 remaining for the game winning points. In addition to totaling 11 of Furman's points, he averaged 46.6 yards on five punts, including a long of 61 yards, and tallied five touchbacks on six kickoffs. His work earned him SoCon Special Teams Player of the Week (the fourth of his career) and Stats Perform National Special Teams Player of the Week accolades.

STREAK ENDS BUT EFFECTIVENESS CONTINUES

When Paladin preseason All-American placekicker **Ian Williams** missed a 54-yard field goal attempt on Saturday against Samford, it halted his 12-game streak of made field goals. He later booted a 40-yard field goal and also contributed a solid 43.8 yards on six punts while registering four touchbacks on six kickoffs. Williams career field goal numbers to 49-of-65 (.754). His kickoff touchback percentage (.718), composed of 166 touchbacks on 231 kicks, includes 62-of-73 (.849) over the last 15 games (2024-Present).

THE EMERGENCE OF EVAN JAMES

Furman appears to have a budding star in true freshman wide receiver **Evan James**, who turned in a dynamic 10-reception, 134-yard, TD performance in the Paladins' 28-24 road win over Campbell on Sept. 13. The 10 catches set a Furman freshman record and included a 30-yard touchdown grab with 4:50 remaining to put the Paladins the lead for good. James' performance versus Campbell netted his Stats Perform National Freshman Player of the Week honors. He has a team leading 32 receptions for 379 yards and two touchdown catches, as well as four rushes for 52 yards and a score thru four games.

LEWIS MAKING PLAYS

Redshirt sophomore **Billy Lewis** has already established himself as a playmaker, and he further burnished that reputation recently against Presbyterian by recording a pair of interceptions to go along with six tackles. His two pickoffs setup a Paladin touchdown and



field goal. A year ago Lewis saw action in 11 games and moved into the starting lineup for the Paladins' last five games. He paced Furman with three interceptions and earned Stats Perform National Freshman of the Week honors after tallying nine tackles, an interception, a forced fumble, and a pass breakup against 21st-ranked East Tennessee State (24-21 win). Lewis, a native of Athens, Ga., and 2024 SoCon All-Freshman Team selection, has a team high five interceptions in his now 15-game (nine starts) Paladin career.

FURMAN NOW 5-11 IN OVERTIME GAMES

Furman's 39-38 overtime loss to Presbyterian dropped the Paladins to 5-11 all-time in extra period contests, including 1-7 in the last eight games.

BLAYLOCK STEPS UP BIG

It didn't take Paladin graduate safety **Taylen Blaylock** long to make a big impression — actually one minute and 34 seconds of clock time in the season opening 23-21 win over William & Mary. That's when Blaylock crossed the goal line to complete a 43-yard interception return to help give Furman the early 7-0 lead. He followed that with two critical defensive plays late in the fourth quarter — the first coming on a third-and-one play at the William & Mary 34 when he burst through the line on a safety blitz to record a four-yard loss. On the next play, he batted down a fourth down pass attempt to give Furman possession on downs with 1:56 remaining. He finished the game with six tackles, including two for-loss, to go along with his pick-six and pass breakup and was recognized as SoCon Defensive Player of the Week.

FIVE PALADINS LAND PRESEASON ALL-SOCON HONORS

Furman placed five players on the preseason All-Southern Conference team, which was announced in late July at the league's media day in Greenville. The selections include four first team picks — offensive tackle **Eli Brasher**, tight end **Jackson Pryor**, linebacker **Ryan Earl**, and placekicker **Ian Williams**. Offensive guard **Luke Petit** garnered second team recognition. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams or players.

WELCOME BACK...

Furman welcomed back several players who were sidelined for much — if not all — of the 2024 season. The most notable return is redshirt junior running back **Jayquan Smith**, who was sidelined after sustaining a knee injury versus The Citadel in 2023 — an injury that kept him out for the 2024 season, in addition to spring practices in both 2024 and '25. Smith had six rushes for 21 yards against William & Mary, including a game clinching eight-yard run on a third-and-three play that gave Furman a first down at the Tribe 15, allowing the Paladins to run out the clock. Graduate tight end **Joshua Burrell** is back after a 2023 season that saw register starts versus Ole Miss and Charleston Southern before he suffered a season ending ankle injury four plays into the CSU contest. His return saw him catch five passes for 26 yards against William & Mary. Two players, safeties **AK Burrell**, a redshirt sophomore, and graduate **Justin Hartwell**, who a year ago were projected to start before injuries in the preseason sidelined them for the year, are also back this fall.

TWINS REUNITED

The 2025 season brings with it a reunion of twins **Joshua** and **Jordan Burrell**, both graduate members of the Paladin program and Blythewood, S.C. products. It's year two in Greenville for Joshua, a tight end and December 2023 graduate of Florida State who saw his 2024 season at Furman end early with an ankle injury. Jordan, meanwhile, is in his first year with the Paladins after playing the last two years at Lenoir-Rhyne prior to graduating last

December. He spent the first two years of his football career at Army-West Point.

NO LONGER IN UNIFORM BUT STILL PLUGGED IN

Furman All-SoCon safety **Hugh Ryan** concluded his outstanding playing career in 2023 but is still part of Paladin football's operation, having begun his coaching tenure last year as a defensive assistant working with the safeties and also Paladin special teams.

THREE SCRUBBED GAMES IN HENDRIX ERA

Due to devastating effects of Hurricane Helene last year's Furman-Samford game was canceled, marking the third Paladin contest — all home games — to get canceled in head coach **Clay Hendrix's** eight seasons as head coach. Other games canceled during the Hendrix era include a Sept. 15, 2018, home game versus Colgate, and a Apr. 17, 2021, home contest versus Wofford after the Terriers opted out of the pandemic spring finale. The canceled Colgate game was likely very costly, because the Paladins claimed a share of the 2018 SoCon championship in a 6-4, 6-2 SoCon campaign, but the six wins all but crushed their chances to earn an at-large playoff bid.

NFL PALADINS

Furman has four players on NFL rosters — wide receiver **Ryan Miller '23** of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, cornerback **Micah Robinson '23** of the Green Bay Packers, long snapper **Julian Ashby '24** of the New England Patriots, and tight end **Mason Pline** of the New Orleans Saints. Miller made Tampa Bay's 53-man roster, announced on Tuesday, as did both Robinson with Green Bay and Ashby with New England. Pline is on New Orleans' injured reserve squad after being sidelined in a preseason contest.

Miller, a three-time All-America selection for the Paladins, played in 54 games and made 43 starts during his Paladin tenure (2019-22) on the way to recording 151 receptions (4th in FU history) for 2,146 yards (5th in FU history) and a school career standard 28 touchdown catches. He signed as a free agent with the Buccaneers in spring of 2023.

Robinson was a four-year letterman (2020-23) for the Paladins who saw playing time in 42 games and made 22 starts while registering 103 tackles, five interceptions, and 21 passes defended. As a senior he tallied 34 tackles and two pickoffs in helping the Paladins to a 10-3 record, SoCon championship, and quarterfinal round appearance in the FCS playoffs. After securing his undergraduate degree in communications from Furman, he played the 2024 season at Tulane, where he totaled 33 tackles and a pair of interceptions. He was selected by the Packers the seventh round of the 2025 draft.

Ashby was also a four-year letterman (2020-23) for Furman and one of the school's most highly decorated student-athletes. He received the Dr. John M. Block Academic Award, which is presented to the male senior with the highest highest GPA, and the Dr. Gary Clark Student-Athlete Achievement Award that "recognizes a senior, female or male, who



has embodied throughout their entire Furman career what it truly means to be a Paladin student-athlete through academics, athletics, campus involvement, and community service.”

A summa cum laude graduate with a 3.96 grade point average in physics, he landed both Phil Steele All-America honors and College Sports Coordinators Academic All-America laurels for Division I, encompassing both Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). He handled snapping duties for all Furman PATs, field goals, and punts over his four seasons, successfully executing 412 snaps. He also played a key role in Furman’s 10-3 campaign in 2023 that was highlighted by the Paladins’ SoCon championship and quarterfinal round appearance in the FCS playoffs. Furman finished the campaign ranked sixth in the AFCA FCS Poll.

Ashby played the 2024 season at Vanderbilt, where he saw action in all 13 games and collected the second CSC Academic All-America citation of his collegiate career.

Pline played for Furman in 2023 after graduating from Ferris State. As a Paladin he caught 32 passes and two touchdowns on the way to earning All-SoCon honors. He inked a free agent deal with San Francisco in the spring of 2024 and was on the 49ers’ practice roster all last season before being cut ear earlier this month and signed by the Saints.

Introduced as Furman's new head football coach on December 19, 2016, Clay Hendrix in eight seasons has returned Paladin football to its long respected level of national prominence and securely fixed his winning stamp on a program he has served for 31 years spanning four decades.

The latest evidence of Hendrix's successful work came in 2023 when Furman posted another 10-win season, reeled off eight straight victories, and claimed the program's Southern Conference best 15th championship, thereby clinching the league's FCS playoff berth and first-round bye. After knocking off Chattanooga, 26-7, in a round of 16 clash, the Paladins dropped a 35-28 overtime decision at second-ranked Montana, the eventual national runner-up. Furman completed the season ranked No. 6 in the AFCA final poll — the Paladins' highest finish since 2005.

The FCS playoff appearance in 2023 marked the fourth for the Paladins under Hendrix, who has compiled a 54-37 overall (.593) record and 42-21 (.651) SoCon worksheet as a head coach.

Furman's success under Hendrix, honored in 2023 as SoCon and AFCA Region II Coach of the Year, has been the product of many factors, including solid recruiting and player development/retention. That season five Paladins earned All-America honors and 19 players landed All-SoCon laurels, led by league offensive player of the year, quarterback Tyler Huff, and Jacobs Blocking Award recipient, offensive guard Jacob Johanning. In addition, two Paladins — Johanning and tight end Mason Pline — signed free agent contracts with the Las Vegas Raiders and San Francisco 49ers, respectively. This past spring two other program graduates, long snapper Julian Ashby and cornerback, Micah Robinson, were seventh round draft selections of the New England Patriots and Green Bay Packers, respectively.

In addition to on-the-field accolades, Furman registered impressive performances in other areas, including Huff capturing the prestigious Armed Forces Merit Award, as selected by the Football Writers Association of America. Approximately 60 percent

of the program's student-athletes over the last two years have earned SoCon Academic Honor Roll recognition, and Paladin football has remained a major factor in ranking among the nation's best in NCAA Academic Performance Rating (APR) and Graduation Success Rate (GSR) metrics.

Furman's results under Hendrix have extended his winning legacy, evidenced in the fact that in now 43 years of collegiate football, spanning his years as a player, assistant coach, and head coach, he has been part of 35 winning teams that have combined to go 336-188-3 (.640).

Hendrix returned to his alma mater in Dec. of 2016, following a decade as an assistant coach at the United States Air Force Academy. In his first season at the helm, he engineered Furman to an 8-5 campaign and FCS playoff appearance, improving on a three-win 2016 season and defying a preseason No. 7 SoCon tab by playing for a share of the league title in the regular season finale en route to finishing as a consensus No. 20 in two major FCS polls — a body of work that netted him SoCon Coach of the Year honors.

In 2018 Furman took another step under Hendrix's guidance, overcoming an 0-3 start and having its home opener against Colgate canceled due to Hurricane Florence by winning six of its final seven games, including a 34-14 triumph over FCS No. 4 Wofford. The Paladins' 35-30 road victory over Mercer in the regular season finale secured a 6-4 record and share of the program's 14th SoCon championship — the most by any school in league history.

In 2019 the Paladins delivered again, posting an 8-5 record and earning an at-large bid to the FCS

playoffs and AFCA No. 19 final national ranking.

After navigating through the pandemic season of 2020, Hendrix's 2021 squad won its final two games to finish 6-5 and set the stage for the 10-3 campaign in 2022 — the program's best since 2005. Furman paced the FCS in turnovers gained (29) and blocked kicks (10) in 2022, and produced the first three-time All-American in program history in tight end Ryan Miller, now with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

That Hendrix has orchestrated an impressive rebound of Paladin football was just what Furman football supporters envisioned when he was named the 23rd head coach in program history, which dates from 1889.

While at Air Force, where he coached the offensive line and served as offensive coordinator for five seasons, as well as associate head coach over the final seven campaigns, Hendrix played a pivotal role in the Falcons producing some of the top rushing attacks in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). That productivity translated into a 77-53 record (.592), nine bowl game appearances, and four Commander-in-Chief Trophies, which is awarded annually based on head-to-head results among the three service academies.

Air Force led the Mountain West Conference (MWC) in rushing and ranked in the top 10 nationally eight times in the last 10 years due, in part, to the quality work of Hendrix-directed offensive lines. All told 19 Falcon offensive linemen garnered all-conference recognition and 21 players under Hendrix's guidance landed Academic All-MWC honors during his tenure in Colorado Springs.

In 2016 Air Force posted a 10-3 record and 5-3





mark in the MWC, won its fourth Commander-in-Chief Trophy this decade, and defeated South Alabama in the Arizona Bowl following a 27-20 win over 19th-ranked Boise State on Nov. 25. The Falcons ranked third nationally in rushing offense (322.8 ypg), seventh in FBS in third down conversion percentage (51.4), and averaged over 451.4 yards per game in total offense along with 34.3 points per game.

The victory over Boise State represented the final win in an impressive list of Air Force triumphs with Hendrix on staff. In 2014 the Falcons defeated 21st-ranked Colorado State (27-24) during the regular season and knocked off Western Michigan (38-24) in the Idaho Potato Bowl to complete a 10-3 campaign. In 2010 Air Force downed Georgia Tech (14-7) in the Independence Bowl, a year after beating 25th-ranked Houston (45-20) in the Armed Forces Bowl. In his first season there, the Falcons handed Notre Dame its biggest setback (41-24) to a service academy since 1963.

Hendrix paved his way to Air Force with an exemplary 19-year record of accomplishment as an assistant coach at Furman, where he served as offensive line coach each year, recruiting coordinator for three seasons, and assistant head coach over his final five campaigns. From 1988-2006 he helped the Paladins post a 155-77-1 record (.667), including a 100-45 Southern Conference mark (.690) that led to six league championships, 11 NCAA FC S (formerly I-AA) playoff appearances, a national runner-up finish in 2001, and the 1988 national championship — the first by a SoCon member school and a private university in FCS history.

Over his final eight seasons on the Paladin staff (1999-06), Furman registered a 73-28 record (.723) and 47-14 worksheet (.770) against SoCon competition en route to three league championships, seven FCS playoff berths, 2001 national runner-up campaign, and seven top 10 final national rankings.

Hendrix-directed offensive lines and powerful rushing attacks were central in one of the greatest eras in Furman history. In 1999 Furman knocked off North Carolina (28-3) on the strength of a 177-yard rushing performance by tailback Louis Ivory, and in 2000 averaged a school record 307.1 yards per game rushing to spearhead Ivory's run to the Walter Payton Award, the FCS equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. The next year a Paladin line featuring three All-Americans keyed a 12-3 campaign, highlighted by a 24-17 playoff semifinal road win over Georgia Southern that halted the Eagles' NCAA record 39-game home winning streak.

In 2005 a potent Paladin ground game was central to Furman scoring 64 touchdowns and averaging 470.0 yards per game — both school standards.

In recognition terms, 25 Hendrix-coached players earned first team all-conference honors and 13 garnered All-America laurels during his Paladin assistant coaching tenure. In addition, five products — center Steve Duggan (1990), guard Ben Hall (1999), tackle Josh Moore (2000), tackle Donnie Littlejohn (2001), and tackle Ben Bainbridge (2004) — captured the SoCon's Jacobs Blocking Award. A sixth recipient,

tackle Joel Bell, who was recruited and developed by Hendrix, garnered the award in 2008 and was inducted into the university's athletic hall of fame in 2022. Tackle Matthew Schmidt became the seventh Hendrix player to land the prestigious Jacobs Blocking Award in 2017, and guard Jacob Johanning selection in 2023 made it eight honorees.

Four of Furman's SoCon leading 15 Academic All-Americans — guards Eric Walter (1990 & '91), Adi Filipovic (2006), and Julian Ashby (2023) — are Hendrix products.

A native of Commerce, Ga., where he was a three-sport standout in football, wrestling, and golf as a prep, he starred as an offensive guard on the gridiron, helping Commerce High School to a 13-1 record and 1981 Class 2A state championship.

He came to Furman in 1982 on scholarship under head coach Dick Sheridan and over the next four years, including three seasons as a starter under the tutelage of offensive line coach Robbie Caldwell, played a role in the Paladins posting a 39-10-1 record, winning SoCon championships in 1982, '83, and '85, and finishing as national runner-up his senior year — a season that netted him all-state recognition. Furman also recorded impressive wins over South Carolina (1982), Georgia Tech (1983), and North Carolina State (1984 & '85) during his playing tenure.

Following graduation in 1986, he joined Sheridan's staff at N.C. State for the 1986 and '87 seasons — the first of which featured a Peach Bowl appearance. The Wolfpack beat ACC regular season cham-

pion Clemson in 1986 and the seventh-ranked Tigers again the following year.

He returned to Furman in 1988 as offensive line coach under head coach Jimmy Satterfield, and his influence quickly led to success as Furman registered a 13-2 record and claimed the NCAA FCS championship with a 17-12 triumph over Georgia Southern — the first national title by a SoCon school and first by a private institution in division history.

He and his wife, LeeAnn Hedgpeh '90 of Taylors, S.C., have two sons, Cal and Mac.
